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CMA Awards Stumble Toward 'Harmony' In Tumultuous Times



Brothers Osborne and **Chris Stapleton** took two trophies apiece and a lip-syncing **Garth Brooks** ended the telecast by picking up the sixth entertainer of the year win in his career, but the most impactful statement at the 51st annual Country

Music Association Awards on Nov. 8 was less about winners and losers at the ballot than about winning and losing in a difficult cultural era.

Held barely two months after a series of devastating hurricanes and five weeks after the massacre of 58 people at the Route 91 Harvest Festival in Las Vegas, the awards fell squarely on the one-year anniversary of **Donald Trump**'s election. That divisive political event has been followed over the last 12 months by an upsurge in white-supremacist demonstrations, investigations into

potentially treasonous collusion between the administration and Russia, brinksmanship with North Korea leading to fears of World War III, bickering about taking a knee during the national anthem and a series of sexual abuse-of-power allegations against elected officials, Hollywood executives and one Music Row figure: Webster PR founder Kirt Webster.

If that volume of disorder isn't enough, add in the deaths of three Country Music Hall of Fame members—Glen Campbell, Don Williams and former CMA executive director Jo Walker-Meador—plus the tragic helicopter accident that took the life

of **Montgomery Gentry**'s **Troy Gentry**, and you have a country community on emotional edge.

The CMA telecast reflected that mood well. **Eric Church** opened with a somber, a cappella reading of "Amazing Grace,"

co-host Carrie Underwood broke down in the middle of the hymn "Softly & Tenderly" as the faces of the Las Vegas victims appeared on the screen, and Keith Urban debuted "Female," a song intended to uplift women at a time when they are rebelling against male domination by some men in power.

"Tonight should be about harmony,"
Karen Fairchild pleaded as Little Big
Town copped vocal group of the year
a record-tying sixth straight time.
"It should be about what we can do
together to change things. Kindness is

an attractive quality. We actually could change the way things are going. We just have to step out and be together."

The CMA unintentionally amplified the tense atmosphere when it issued new media guidelines in advance of the broadcast, threatening to escort journalists off the red carpet if they prodded artists about social and political controversies. Co-host **Brad Paisley** publicly repudiated the mandate, and it was rescinded within 24 hours. Given the tone of the telecast, that CMA dictate was at odds with the actual on-air product (CMA did not respond by press time to an interview request

from last week), and the temporary ban seemed to spur on more controversy. Several journalists indicated they had not thought to ask about politics on the carpet until the guidelines forbade it, and Paisley and Underwood openly mocked the decision in their monologue. Their humor arguably reached its peak when they turned Underwood's "Before He Cheats" into a satire about President Trump's much-derided communication approach, singing: "Maybe next time he'll think before he tweets."

The winners list leaned heavily on familiar faces. Miranda Lambert snagged female vocalist for the seventh time in eight years, now-pop singer Taylor Swift enhanced her country reputation when her composition "Better Man" earned song of the year, and Urban collected single with "Blue Ain't Your Color." Guitarist Mac McAnally tied the late Chet Atkins by winning musician for the ninth time in his career. And Campbell, whose final years increased awareness of Alzheimer's disease, earned his first CMA award in 49 years when his Willie Nelson collaboration "Funny How Time Slips Away" took musical event.

Jon Pardi, who released his first single five years ago, was the freshest face among the winners, walking off with new artist of the year and declaring it a sign that the genre continues to respect its history. "You can still be traditional and win," he said in the press room.

Meanwhile, Brothers Osborne cited country's tradition in encouraging the genre's artists to speak out on issues they feel passionately about. The Osbornes took vocal duo for a second straight year and collected the music video trophy for "It Ain't My Fault," a clip that proved extraordinarily ironic, given the CMA's temporary ban. It lampoons four presidents — Trump, Barack Obama, George W. Bush and Bill Clinton — and was ironically co-written with songwriter Lee Thomas Miller ("I'm Still a Guy," "Southern Girl"), who has filed documents with the Federal Election Commission that would allow him to run for U.S. Congress.

"Right now, everyone's so scared to get a little political or say anything," said **T.J. Osborne** backstage. "**Merle Haggard**, all those guys, they were so badass because they spoke up ... They were true artists that said things that mattered to people. I think that absolutely is the coolest thing about country music. It's been a little lost lately. We hope we can bring it back."

When it was all said and done, some media criticized the CMA for not taking politics farther on the telecast, but other media and citizen-penned letters to the editor took it to task for being too heavy-handed. Given that balance among responses, the organization probably got the show's tone right, even if it stumbled with the red-carpet threat leading into the night.

 $Stapleton-who scored \ his third straight male vocalist trophy and pocketed album of the year for \textit{From A Room: Volume 1}, a project that liberally embraces heavy topics—summarized that viewpoint well.$

"It was a beautiful show, it was well-put-together, the tributes were well done, and it's a proud thing to get to be a part of a show that does something that well at a sensitive time," he told media. "I couldn't be prouder to have gotten to witness it and be a member of the community."

Shelton's Top Bow, Combs 'Pours' It On, Pearce Rules Radio



Blake Shelton earns his sixth Top Country Albums No. 1, all of which have debuted at the summit, as *Texoma Shore* (Warner Bros./Warner Music Nashville) arrives atop the chart dated Nov. 25, earning 63,000 equivalent album units in the week ending Nov. 9, according to Nielsen Music. Of that sum, 55,000 were in traditional album sales. On the all-genre Billboard 200, the set starts at No. 4, marking his 11th top 10.

The release follows If I'm Honest, which launched at No. 1 on Top Country Al-

bums and No. 3 on the Billboard 200 (June 11, 2016; 170,000 units, with 153,000 in traditional sales).

Shelton entered the Top Country Albums penthouse for the first time with EP All About Tonight (2010) and followed with Red River Blue (2011), Based on a True Story... (2013) and Bringing Back the Sunshine (2014).

'RAINS' REIGNS Luke Combs' "When It Rains It Pours" (River House/Columbia Nashville) ascends 2-1 on Hot Country Songs, marking his first leader on the ranking, which blends streaming, airplay and sales data.

"Rains" is the second single from Combs' LP *This One's* for You, which bowed atop the June 24 Top Country Albums chart (43,000 units). Debut single "Hurricane" peaked at No. 3 on Hot Country Songs and led Country Airplay for two weeks beginning May 27.

"Rains" rises by 6 percent to 9.6 million U.S. streams, as it holds at its No. 2 peak on Country Streaming Songs. On Country Airplay, where it ruled for two weeks beginning Nov. 4, it remains in the top five (2-4; down 9 percent to 39.9 million in audience). It drops 3-8 on Country Digital Song Sales but gains by 6 percent to 14,000 sold.

ACTUALLY, IT'S PRETTY BIG For just the third time in almost 12 years, a woman's debut single tops *Billboard*'s Country Airplay chart. In its 35th frame, **Carly Pearce**'s "Every Little Thing" (Big Machine) romps 3-1, increasing 10 percent to 44.7 million audience impressions. On Hot Country Songs, it holds at No. 7 (after reaching No. 5).

Pearce's co-written ballad is from her debut full-length, which debuted and peaked at No. 4 on Top Country Albums (Nov. 4;15,000).

"Thing" marks the first career-opening Country Airplay No. 1 by a solo woman since **Kelsea Ballerini**'s "Love Me Like You Mean It," which topped the July 4, 2015, chart. Prior to Ballerini, nine years had passed since **Carrie Underwood** arrived with her first single officially promoted to country radio, "Jesus, Take the Wheel," which began a six-week reign on Jan. 21, 2006.

"You work so hard, dreaming and praying you'll be able to do this professionally in any capacity," Pearce tells *Billboard*. "To have ["Thing"] come from such a real place in my life and to have done what it's done is indescribable. To be alongside Carrie and Kelsea is the greatest honor. All I've ever wanted to do is sing country music. Every dream is coming true."


TOP 10 STARTS Speaking of **Kelsea Ballerini**, her second LP, *Unapologetically* (Black River), opens at No. 3 on Top Country Albums, earning 44,000 units in its first week (with 35,000 in traditional album sales). *Unapologetically* marks the singersongwriter's best start on the chart; her debut full-length, *The First Time*, began at No. 4 on June 6, 2015, with 13,000 sold.

Concurrently on Top Country Albums, **Kid Rock** makes his first appearance with his Southern rock/country set *Sweet*

Southern Sugar (Top Dog/BMG/Broken Bow Music Group), new at No. 4 (43,000 units). Two of its tracks have hit Hot Country Songs: "Po-Dunk" (No. 27, August) and "Tennessee Mountain Top" (No. 36, September). Rock reached a No. 4 Hot Country Songs peak in 2008 with the No. 4 smash "All Summer Long," which rose to No. 3 on the all-genre Radio Songs chart, boosted by heavy pop airplay.

Also new in the Top Country Albums top 10 is **Lee Brice**'s self-titled LP (Curb), which arrives at No. 7 (15,000), marking his fourth top 10.

'BUZZ' CUT Eric Church scores his 13th Country Airplay top 10, as "Round Here Buzz" (EMI Nashville) pushes 12-10 (27.8 million, up 6 percent). It's his second top 10 of 2017, following the **Rhiannon Giddens**-assisted "Kill a Word" (No. 6, April). ●



FAMILIAR VICTORS AT ASCAP, BMI

Ashley Gorley and **Ross Copperman** did significant repeat business during the performing-rights organizations' annual country songwriter awards the week of Nov. 6.

Gorley ("Dirt on My Boots," "You Should Be Here") claimed ASCAP's country songwriter of the year medallion for the fourth straight time on Nov. 6 and became the first person to earn it five times. The next night, Copperman ("Noise," "I Know Somebody") took the same honor from BMI after winning it in 2016 and taking most-performed song in 2015 with "Beat of the Music."

"Songwriter of the year is one of those things you dream of when you first move to town, but you don't think you'd ever be able to do it," said Copperman on the BMI red carpet.

"I've got to, first of all, thank God for way more friends and way more blessings than I deserve," said Gorley while accepting his ASCAP award.

Publisher of the year featured its own repeat victors. Warner/Chappell logged 24 of ASCAP's most-performed titles to grab its fifth straight title, while Sony/ATV had 26 of BMI's 50 copyrights, reigning a record-setting 16th straight year.

Both agencies awarded song of the year to compositions that featured a mix of Nashville- and Los Angeles-based writers. The **Dierks Bentley** hit "Somewhere on a Beach" swiped the ASCAP honor for two of its five authors, Music City's **Josh Mirenda** and California's **Dave Kuncio**. ("Beach" was a repeat, too, having won SESAC's country song of the year in 2016.) The **Florida Georgia Line** recording "H.O.L.Y." nabbed country song at BMI for **busbee** and **Nate Cyphert**, who both split time between Nashville and L.A.

Keith Urban repeated as an influence on both performance rosters. He played an album cut—"You Won," from *Golden Road*—during a celebration of ASCAP Legend **Rodney Crowell**, then watched **Maren Morris** reprise his own "But for the Grace of God" the next night when Urban was named a BMI Champion.

Kelsea Ballerini and **Bob DiPiero** also earned significant recognition during the events, which followed the SESAC Nashville Music Awards, presented Nov. 5. Go <u>here</u> for the full ASCAP story and <u>here</u> for the complete BMI recap.



Chris Lane Brings Tori Kelly To Country With 'Take Back Home Girl'

She has landed three songs inside the top 25 on the *Billboard* Mainstream Top 40 since the 2015 release of her debut album, *Unbreakable Smile*, but **Tori Kelly** has been flirting with country music all along.

Surprise appearances have led to concert collaborations with **Kelsea Ballerini**, **Hunter Hayes** and **Little Big Town**. Additionally, Kelly added her vocals to a remix of the **Thomas Rhett** single "Die a Happy Man."

"I've always loved country music, but I've never fully gone in on a country song," says Kelly.

That changes with "Take Back Home Girl," a collaboration with **Chris Lane** that Big Loud released to country radio via PlayMPE on Oct. 9. It expands Kelly's artistic footprint, but it also fulfills a goal for Lane, who was playing

Kelly's online performances for producer **Joey Moi** (**Florida Georgia Line**, **Jake Owen**) even before *Unbreakable* broke out.

"I didn't really know her," says Lane. "I've just been a fan of hers for a while now, and I've always wanted to do a duet with her."

"Take Back Home Girl" was an ideal vehicle for that. Her manager, SB Projects founder **Scooter Braun**, sent her the core recording of the song, but told her nothing about its background, instead trusting her to make a call based solely on the music's quality.

"It wasn't about the name," she says, acknowledging she was not previously aware of Lane. "It was just, 'OK, is this a good song? Is this a good voice?' I was a fan immediately."

Women in general are likely to feel a connection with "Take Back Home Girl," a song that celebrates a female with long-term value.

"There's a difference between hot and beautiful," says songwriter **Josh Miller** ("More Girls Like You"). "I'm 30 right now — just turned 30 recently — and you get to a place where those things are important to you. Family is important, and you want to meet a woman, or a girl, that you can take home to mom, take home to dad; you can be proud."

Miller knows that experience firsthand. He took his girlfriend back home to Jackson, Tenn., in 2016, and he liked the idea of writing a song about a "take-back-home girl." He introduced that concept within two weeks during a co-write with Hillary Lindsey ("Legends," "Blue Ain't Your Color"). They worked on something else instead, but two days later, Lindsey brought it up again at another writing session at the Berry Hill studio of Miller's "More Girls Like You" co-writer, producer David Garcia (tobyMac, Colton Dixon). The ball started rolling as they convened with a guitar around a fire pit behind the building.

"Josh started playing a couple chords, Hillary started singing what ultimately became the end of the chorus, and we went back inside," says Garcia. "We're like, 'Yeah, this is good. Let's chase this.'"

Garcia assembled tracks as they went along, with the chorus arriving first. They used the same chord structure for the verses, and the first verse worked almost like a movie script, employing scene-setting snatches rather than full sentences: "Duffle bag, backseat/My dash, your feet."

"Sometimes when I'm writing, I like to think from a video standpoint," says Miller. "What would the scene look like? Kind of show and don't tell."

"It had a lot of great country images in it," says Lane of that opening stanza. "I feel like the first verse kind of sets the second verse up, but the second verse is the verse that really brings it home for me. That's the verse that takes me back to high-school football and Friday night under the lights."

The chorus would underscore the old-fashioned, small-town values at the homestead, found "down a no-lane road" at a hill "where the wild things grow."

The latter line plays off **Maurice Sendak**'s imaginative 1963 children's book *Where the Wild Things Are*, and though the writers discussed the connection in the room, it wasn't essential to understanding the line.

"Where the wild things grow—whether that's corn, that's trees, that's grass, that's weeds, that's where it is," says Miller.

Garcia produced the demo that day, geared to a solo male performance, with the same sort of spare guitar that populates **Justin Bieber**'s "Love Yourself," and they coaxed Lindsey to layer in significant harmonies. Garcia purposely applied a slowly evolving production.

"Sometimes blowing up a demo can distract from the song, and other times it can be like the perfect jeans and T-shirt," he says. "It's just kind of a gut instinct."

Big Loud partner **Seth England** was attuned to the song's potential and passed it along to Lane, who was also up for it. The demo's bare-bones approach left a lot of room for Moi to play, and it took some time to unlock the right texture for a radio-friendly country single.

"I was building it, like, first chorus was down and next chorus was big, and then I was sort of experimenting where all the choruses are down and the verses were up," says Moi. "It was all mellow in the demo, so it left so much to the imagination. Finally in the end, I just kind of stumbled on a [solution]: I put all the choruses at band level."

Drummer **Nir Z** helped find the right mix of real and programmed drums, and **Ilya Toshinsky** replayed the demo's spacious guitar hook with a dirtier tone. The vocal was comparatively easy for Lane, who sang it in his natural register, rather than falsetto.

"Thave enough songs with falsetto in them to last me quite some time now," he says, "so I might as well start recording some songs that don't make it so hard to sing every night live."

When Kelly came onboard, the original intent was only to have her sing harmonies and ad-libs. Lane joined Moi for the overdub session at Los Angeles' Sunset Marquis, the same studio where **Backstreet Boys** cut vocals for FGL's "God, Your Mama, and Me." Her biggest challenge was knowing where to stop.

"It's kind of like a balance whenever I'm doing a feature," she says. "I definitely want to have my own stamp on the song, but there's also that element of like, 'OK, let's not get too carried away."

She was also more involved than most vocalists in determining which pieces of her performances made the final version.

"She's a real, true, passionate, classically trained vocalist who still takes lessons and does it because she loves it," says Moi. "She knew the part inside out and knew immediately if it was a good take and it was the one she wanted to use. She was really dialed in."

After that first session, they decided to expand her role in the second verse, so Miller and Lindsey rewrote it to accommodate a female voice. Kelly did that part on her own, at Los Angeles' Westlake Recording Studios.

There was never a question that "Take Back Home Girl" would be the first single from Lane's sophomore album, which is still in production. It debuted at No. 57 on the Country Airplay chart dated Oct. 28, and moves to No. 39 in its fifth week. Its development is appropriate, too: Lane bringing Kelly's performance to his home in the country genre mirrors the pride generated by Miller's real-life take-back-home girl.

"You're wanting to show her off," says Lane, "because you feel lucky that you have her." •

RANKINGS

Country Airplay is ranked by total audience impressions for the week ending Sunday based on monitored airplay of 149 stations by Nielsen BDS. Audience totals on the chart are derived, in part, using certain Arbitron Inc. copyrighted Persons 12+ audience estimates (under license © 2017, Arbitron Inc.) Country Indicator is tabulated using reported playlists and Nielsen BDS-monitored airplay at 106 stations, ranked by total plays.

BULLETS

 Awarded on Country Airplay to titles gaining audience or remaining flat from the previous week. A song will also receive a bullet if its percentage loss in audience does not exceed the percentage of monitored station downtime for the format. Titles that decline in audience but increase in detections will also receive a bullet if the total audience erosion for the week does not exceed 3%. Bullets are awarded on Country Indicator to titles gaining plays or remaining flat from the previous week.

TIES

On Country Airplay, if two songs are tied in total audience, the song with the larger increase in audience is placed first. On Country Indicator, if two songs are tied in total plays, the song with the larger increase in plays is placed first.

RECURRENTS

On Country Airplay, descending titles below No. 10 in either audience or detections are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks, provided that they are not still

gaining enough audience points to bullet or if they rank below No. 10 and post a third consecutive week of (non-bulleted) audience decline, regardless of total chart weeks. On Country Indicator, descending, non-bulleted titles below No. 10 are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks or if they post a third consecutive week of decline in plays after 10 weeks.

HOT SHOT DEBUT

Awarded to the highest-ranking new entry on Country Airplay and Country Indicator, respectively.

The total number of new adds officially reported to Billboard by each reporting station, or by an automatic-add threshold (seven plays for the first time in a chart tracking week, according to Nielsen BDS) for stations that do not report adds.

MOST INCREASED AUDIENCE/ PLAYS

Most Increased Audience on Country Airplay and Most Increased Plays on Country Indicator list the songs with the greatest week-to-week increases in total audience or plays, respectively.

AIRPOWER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles ranking inside top 20 in plays and audience rankings for the first time, with increases in both plays and audience.

BREAKER

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26 Years Ago Garth Brooks Reigned With A Billy Joel Ballad

In 1991, "Shameless" became Brooks' seventh Hot Country Songs No. 1 On Nov. 16, 1991, **Garth Brooks'** version of **Billy Joel**'s "Shameless" soared 4-1 on Hot Country Songs. Leading for two weeks, the song became Brooks' seventh of 19 No. 1s. The track was the second single from *Ropin' the Wind*, his first of nine No. 1 albums on the Billboard 200, the most by any country act.

On Nov. 14, Brooks will release the first of a five-part multimedia series, *The Anthology Part I: The First Five Years*. In the liner notes, he muses that he wanted to record "Shameless" after hearing it on Joel's 1989 LP *Storm Front*, feeling that it was "sex on a record." He adds that of the five singles from Ropin', "Shameless" was "the scary one," in part because he worried that the wailing vocals of his now-wife, **Trisha Yearwood**, at the end could be a challenge at country radio.

Atthe Country Music Association Awards on Sept. 28, 1991, Brooks performed "Shameless" and won four trophies, including his first for entertainer of the year. At this year's 51st CMAs (which aired Nov. 8), Brooks, 55, scored the coveted honor for a record-extending sixth time.
