Houndstooth Beanie

Materials

Yarn: Cascade Heritage Solid (MC)
Cascade Heritage Paints (CC)
Approximately 186 yards

Needles: Double pointed needles in US-2 and US-3

Miscellaneous: Stitch markers

Finished Measurements

Circumference: fits women's head 21" – 22"

Height: approximately 8"

Gauge

32 stitches x 44 rows = 4" in 2x2 ribbing on size US-2

32 stitches x 33 rows = 4" in stockinette on US-3

Notes

This hat is worked with two balls of yarn simultaneously. The easiest way I found to do this is put each ball into a separate plastic bag, mark one A and one B.

To prevent the hat from puckering, if the carried yarn will be further than four stitches I wrap the carried yarn once over the top of the working yarn on the third stitch.

Sizing

For a larger circumference, add stitches in multiples of 8. For a taller hat, add rows in multiples of 10.

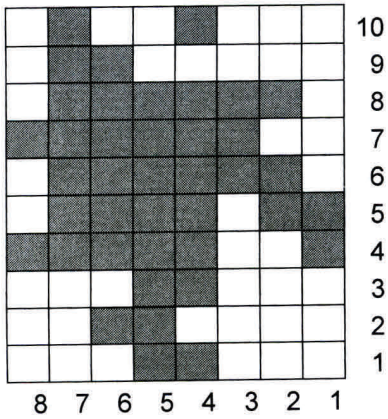
Stitches

2x2 Ribbing: *K2, P2

Pattern Directions

Using the smaller needles (US-2) cast on 160 stitches; divide evenly on needles. Place a marker to show the beginning of your round. Using with MC work in 2x2 ribbing (as listed above) for 11 rows.

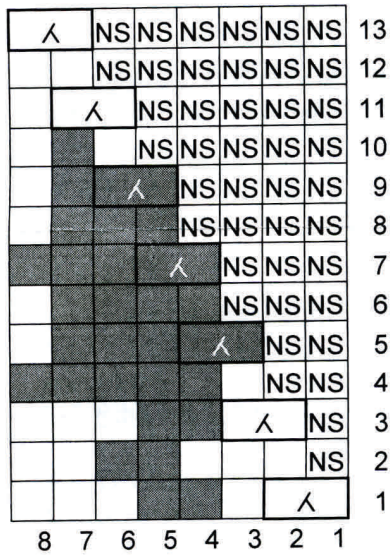
Change to large needles (US-3), and start the Houndstooth Chart. Work 20 repeats of the pattern per row. Work 4 repeats of the entire chart (40 rows). Chart is worked in stockinette stitch and read right to left on all rows. Continue with chart for a taller hat.

Shape Crown

When starting the crown shaping, use this chart instead of the previous one. Repeat Row 13 one additional time, two times total. This will leave you with 5 stitches. Cut yarn and pull through remaining stitches.

Houndstooth Mitts

Materials

Yarn: Cascade Heritage Solid (MC)
Cascade Heritage Paints (CC)
Approximately 155 yards total for fingerless
Approximately 186 yards for individual fingers

Needles: Double pointed needles in US-2 and US-3

Miscellaneous: Stitch markers

Finished Measurements

Small

Length: approximately 7½"

Width: approximately 7" around the knuckles (without thumb)

Medium (this size is show in the parenthesis)

Length: approximately 7½"

Width: approximately 8" around the knuckles (without thumb)

Gauge

32 stitches x 44 rows = 4" in 2x2 ribbing on size US-2

32 stitches x 33 rows = 4" in stockinette on US-3

Notes

These mitts are worked with two balls of yarn simultaneously. The easiest way I found to do this is put each ball into a separate plastic bag, mark one A and one B.

To prevent the mitts from puckering, if the carried yarn will be further than four stitches I wrap the carried yarn once over the top of the working yarn on the third stitch.

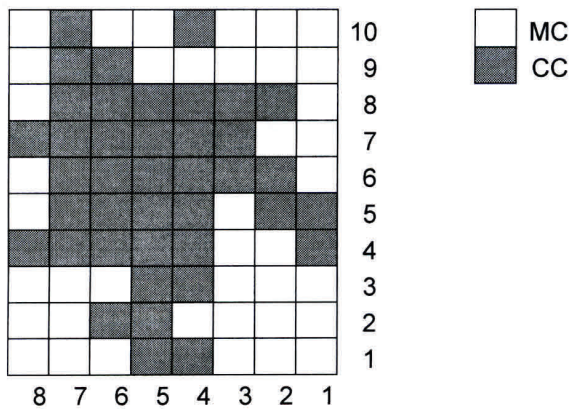
Stitches

2x2 Ribbing: *K2 , P2

Pattern Directions

Using the smaller needles (US-2) cast on 56 (64) stitches; divide evenly on needles. Place a marker to show the beginning of your round. Using with MC work in 2x2 ribbing for 11 rows.

Change to large needles (US-3), and start the Houndstooth Chart. Work 7 (8) repeats of the pattern per row. Chart is worked in stockinette stitch and read left to right on all rows.



Options

THUMBS

Thumbs can be worked without or without a gusset.

WITHOUT GUSSET

Continue working the chart for 40 rows (4 complete repeats). On the next round, knit the first 8 stitches using waste yarn, place these stitches back onto the left needle. Work these stitches again in working yarn. Continue working the remainder of the chart. This will give you 5 total repeats of the chart.

Cut the CC yarn. Begin fingers.

Working the Thumb

Carefully remove the waste yarn and pick up the stitches 7 on the top and 8 on the bottom. Be careful when picking up the top stitches, you may have 1 or 2 that were wrapped, just make sure you have the correct stitch count before proceeding.

K8 on the bottom. Pick up 5 stitches in the gap. K7 on the top. Pick up 4 stitches in the gap. Join in the round.

Work 2x2 Ribbing, in the round for 11 rows. BO, cut yarn.

WITH GUSSET

All stitches for the gusset will be worked in the MC yarn.

Continue working the chart for 20 rows (2 complete repeats). Beginning with the next round following gusset pattern below. Continue working the stitches on either side of the markers, and on all other needles as established in the chart.

FOR NEEDLE 1 ONLY:

- Round 1* Work 7 stitches of Chart, knit into the front back of the next two stitches (last & first stitch of chart), work remaining 7 stitches of chart
- Round 2* Work 8 stitches of chart, PM, M1, K2, M1, PM, work 8 stitches of chart
- Round 3* SM K4, SM

Place the 18 gusset stitches onto waste yarn.

Continuing working the final 6 rows of the chart.

Cut the CC yarn. Begin fingers.

Working the Thumb

Place the 18 thumb stitches onto small DPN (US-2). Working in 2x2 Ribbing, pick up 6 stitches in the gap. Work 8 rows. BO, cut yarn.

FINGERS

Fingers can be worked individual or as a continuation of the mitt.

CONTINUATION

After cutting the CC yarn, switch back to the smaller needles (US-2); continue in 2x2 Ribbing for 11 rows. BO, cut yarn, and weave in your ends.

INDIVIDUAL

After cutting the CC yarn, switch back to the smaller needles (US-2); continue in 2x2 Ribbing for 8 rows.

Next Round: Work 2x2 Ribbing over 22 (34) stitches.

****NOTE****

All Cast-On stitches from this point need be cast-on using the backwards loop method and will be Knit stitches only (not ribbed).

Pinky Finger

The next 12 (14) stitches will be for the Pinky Finger, place all other stitches onto waste yarn. Move the 12 (14) stitches onto DPN. Knit across these 12 (14) stitches. CO 5 (4), join in the round. Work 5 rows. BO, cut yarn.

Palm Continued

Place the remaining 44 (50) stitches back onto your needles. Begin working 2x2 Ribbing, starting at the stitches closest to the thumb, pick up 5 (4) stitches from the cast-on edge of the Pinky finger. Work 5 rounds.

Ring Finger

This finger will use the 5 (4) stitches picked up from the pinky and the 5 (6) stitches before and after them, place all other stitches on waste yarn. Knit all stitches, including the 5 (4) from the Pinky. At the space between the front stitches and the back stitches, CO another 5 (4) stitches, join in the round. Work 5 rounds. BO, cut yarn.

Index Finger

Place 7 (8) stitches from the front on one DPN, pick up 5 (4) stitches from the cast-on edge of the ring finger on one DPN, place 7 (8) stitches from the back on one DPN, CO 3 (2) stitches, join in the round. Work 5 rounds. BO, cut yarn.

Pointer Finger

Place remaining 18 stitches on DPN; pick up 2 stitches from the cast-on edge. Work 5 rounds. BO, cut yarn.
