MEDIA POLICIES

All media requests for interviews with St. John's Baseball players and coaches should be directed to Senior Assistant Director Andrew O'Connell 24 hours in advance.

The best time for in-season interviews, either in person or on the phone, is prior to or following practice. Interviews conducted prior to or following practice should be held to a brief Q & A session. With advanced notice, interviews with players can be arranged for other hours.

Calling players at home or on cell phones without permission from the St. John's Athletic Communications office will not be tolerated. The players' dorms, training room and weight room are also off limits.

The St. John's locker room is closed to the media following the game. The team is allowed the customary 10-minute cooling off period and time with the coaching staff to meet with the team after each game.

The St. John's Athletic Communications staff will secure coach and student-athletes

for postgame interviews that will be held on the field.

The only pregame interviews allowed on game days will be for St. John's radio, and local or national television productions. No game day interviews will be allowed unless specifically requested for televised games.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Credential requests must be made by sports editors or sports directors on official letterhead no later than five days prior to an event. They should be sent to the Athletic Communications Office, Room 157 Carnesecca Arena, St. John's University, 8000 Utopia Parkway, Queens, NY 11439. They also may be faxed to 718-969-8468 or emailed to Andrew O'Connell at occonnela@stjohns.edu.

Credentials are not transferable and are subject to immediate revocation if transferred to non-working members of a media outlet.

St. John's University and the NCAA prohibit the issuance of credentials to representatives of an organization that regularly publishes

gambling information, such as "tout sheets" or "tip sheets."

Web sites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are allowed to post anonymous information or rumors are ineligible for credentials or access to media functions. If a news-gathering medium has an online site that sponsors these anonymous forums, they may continue to request credentials under their traditional medium, but will not be granted additional passes or access for online staff.

ED BLANKMEYER

Head Coach • Seton Hall '76 • 23rd Season At St. John's

The winningest coach in St. John's baseball history, head coach Ed Blankmeyer enters his 23rd season at the helm of the Red Storm baseball program in 2018 with an all-time record of 758-460-4, good enough for a .622 winning percentage. Blankmeyer has guided the Red Storm to four BIG EAST Tournament crowns as well as five BIG EAST regular season titles, and has led the squad to the NCAA Tournament 10 times, including one NCAA Super Regional appearance.

Also the winningest coach in the history of BIG EAST play with 323 conference victories, Blankmeyer has earned BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors a conference-record seven times and has been named the ABCA Northeast Region Coach of the Year four times. Blankmeyer, who has guided St. John's to eight 40-win seasons, has had 111 All-BIG EAST selections and has seen 80 of his players drafted and/or signed to professional contracts.

In January of 2018, Blankmeyer became the third head coach in St. John's history to be enshrined in the ABCA Hall of Fame, joining his predecessors Joe Russo and Jack Kaiser.

Blankmeyer also served a one-year term as the president of the ABCA in 2015.

With a talented veteran core and a promising crew of newcomers, Blankmeyer led the Red Storm to one of its best seasons in program history in 2017. The Johnnies tallied a record of 42-13, just one win shy of the program high-water mark for victories in a single campaign. With a 40-9 mark entering postseason play, the Johnnies also became just the second St. John's team to ever eclipse the 40-win mark before the end of the regular season. In addition to earning BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors for a league-record seventh time, Blankmeyer also saw eight of his players earn All-BIG EAST distinction, including seven First Team selections. Headlining that class was Sean Mooney, who became just the second player in the history of the conference to be named the BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year and Freshman of the Year simultaneously. For their efforts, the Johnnies were rewarded with a selection to the Clemson Regional, the program's 36th NCAA appearance.

Blankmeyer saw two of his players earn major

awards at the conclusion of the 2016 season, as Thomas Hackimer was named the BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year and Josh Shaw earned BIG EAST Freshman of the Year accolades. Michael Donadio was also named to the All-BIG EAST First Team, while Troy Dixon earned Second Team All-BIG EAST honors. Hackimer (Fourth Round-Minnesota Twins) and Blankmeyer's son, Ty, (36th Round- Cincinnati Reds) were selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, while Joey Graziano signed a free agent contract with the Tampa Bay Rays and Joe Napolitano was signed by the Mets.

As part of a 2015 season that was capped by a finish as NCAA Regional Finalists, St. John's went 41-16 and swept both the BIG EAST regular season and Tournament titles. Blankmeyer earned BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors for the sixth time, while BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year Ryan McCormick matched a 47-year old program-record with 11 wins en route to earning All-America honors from both the American Baseball Coaches Association and Collegiate Baseball. Thomas Hackimer also garnered All-America honors from the ABCA after setting a program-

record with 15 saves. McCormick, Hackimer and Alex Caruso were each unanimous first team All-BIG EAST choices as the Red Storm set a new program-record with 11 All-BIG EAST selections, including eight total first team honorees. The Red Storm posted a 15-game winning streak, the longest for the program since 1977, and matched a program-record with six players drafted, including Cody Stashak (13th round), Matt Clancy (13th), Hackimer (15th), McCormick (16th), Tyler Sanchez (17th) and Alex Katz (27th).

Blankmeyer also made his second and third coaching stints with USA Baseball in 2016, serving as manager of the Collegiate National Team in the summer and acting as an assistant coach for the Premier12 squad in the fall. Highlighted by series wins against both Chinese Taipei and Cuba as well as the first-ever no-hitter tossed against the Cuban National Team in international play, Blankmeyer led the CNT to a 9-8 overall record. As part of a Premier12 coaching staff led by manager Willie Randolph, Blankmeyer helped guide Team USA to a 5-3 record and a silver medal at the inaugural WBSC Premier12, a global championship made up of the top 12 countries in the WBSC Baseball World Rankings.

Blankmeyer reached a pair of milestones during the 2013 season as the skipper recorded his 600th win and also became the winningest coach in St. John's baseball history with win No. 612. With a young pitching staff comprised of 10 freshmen, tied for the third-most in the country, the Red Storm made its 10th-consecutive BIG EAST Tournament appearance and finished 23-35. Three players earned All-BIG EAST honors, including Freshman All-American Ryan Horstman, ABCA All-Region honoree Frank Schwindel and Zach Lauricella. St. John's also had a total of five players selected in the MLB Draft for the second-straight season as Horstman (fourth round) highlighted a draft class that also included James Lomangino (14th round), Frank Schwindel (18th), Sean Hagan (31st) and Danny Bethea (34th).

St. John's made its third-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, 34th overall, in 2012 and reached the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time in program history to cap a 40-23 season that also featured the first NCAA Regional crown for the squad since 1980. In a season rife with accomplishments, the Red Storm also won both the BIG EAST Tournament and regular season championships in the same season for the first time in program-history. Blankmeyer earned BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors for a conference-record fifth time and four players earned All-BIG EAST honors, including a pair of first team selections in Jeremy Baltz and Sean Hagan. Baltz, the first BIG EAST player to earn three first team

All-Conference selections since 2002-04, and Matt Wessinger each earned All-America honors and were joined by Sean Hagan and Sean O'Hare as ABCA All-Region selections. Baltz was drafted in the second round (68th overall) and Wessinger was selected in the fifth round (168th overall) to become the highest pair of Red Storm draft picks since 1998. Matt Carasiti (198th overall) and Kyle Hansen (201st overall) were both taken in the sixth round to give St. John's four selections in the top six rounds for the first time in program-history, while Hagan was drafted in the 29th round (880th overall).

St. John's finished 36-22 (18-8) in 2011 and earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, its 33rd appearance overall and sixth in the last eight seasons, following second place finishes in both the BIG EAST Tournament and BIG EAST regular season. The Red Storm had four All-BIG EAST selections, including a conference-best three first team selections. All-American, Brooks Wallace Award Finalist, first team All-Region honoree and first team All-BIG EAST selection Joe Panik was drafted by the San Francisco Giants in the first round (29th overall) of the 2011 MLB Draft, the Red Storm's highest selection since Craig Hansen was picked 26th overall in 2005. Paul Karmas, who became the program's new all-time hit king during the season, and Matt Wessinger were also drafted, while Joe Witkowski signed a free agent contract.

In a season in which Blankmeyer notched his 500th career victory, St. John's set a new school-record with 43 wins in 2010 and won a conference-record sixth BIG EAST Tournament crown. The team also made the 32nd NCAA Tournament appearance in program history and reached the Charlottesville Regional finals. The squad was paced by an offense that set new school-records in runs scored (493), hits (750), doubles (150) and RBI (457), and a pitching staff that set a new mark for strikeouts (455). The NCBWA National Freshman Hitter of the Year, the Louisville Slugger Freshman Player of the Year and the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year, Jeremy Baltz became the first consensus All-American in school history after earning All-America honors from Baseball America (first team), the ABCA (second team), Louisville Slugger (second team) and the NCBWA (second team). Baltz, who led the nation's freshmen in both home runs and RBI, and classmate Kyle Hansen, who earned 2010 BIG EAST Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors, each earned Freshman All-America accolades and five players were All-BIG EAST selections. Four players--Daniel Burawa, Bruce Kern, Greg Hopkins and Ryan Cole--were selected in the 2010 MLB Draft, while Red Storm alumni

Rob Delaney and Anthony Varvaro each made their MLB debuts.

Blankmeyer spent the summer of 2010 as an assistant coach of the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team. The squad finished their summer tour with a 16-3 record and won the silver medal at the V FISU World University Baseball Championships in Tokyo, Japan.

St. John's reached the BIG EAST Tournament for the sixth-straight year in 2009 and finished the season 30-22. A prolific offense set new school-records in batting average (.349), runs scored (473), RBI (440) and doubles (149). Five players earned All-BIG EAST honors and juniors Brian Kemp and Tim Morris were both drafted in the 2009 MLB Draft. Morris, who batted .415, set a new-school record for runs scored (69) and became the second player in school history to reach 90 hits in a season, earned third team All-America honors, while Joe Panik earned second team freshman All-America honors from the NCBWA. The team also played in front of the seventh-largest regular season crowd in NCAA baseball history (22,397) in the first-ever game at Citi Field, the new home of the New York Mets.

The Red Storm won a then school-record 42 games in 2008 to reach the 40-win plateau for the fourth-consecutive season. The squad also won its second-straight BIG EAST regular season crown and earned a bid to the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight season. Eight players earned All-BIG EAST accolades and George Brown became the program's fourth BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year. Brown was also named a second-team All-American, while Paul Karmas earned freshman All-America accolades. For the second season in a row and the third time in four seasons, Blankmeyer earned both BIG EAST and Northeast Region coach of the year honors. Five players, including four juniors, were drafted as Scott Barnes was taken in the 8th round and Justin Gutsie, Jared Yecker, George Brown and Colin Lynch were also selected. Utilizing a superb mix of pitching and offense, the 2007 Red Storm won 40 games for the third-straight season, won the BIG EAST regular season title and earned a bid to the NCAA Tournament via the Myrtle Beach Regional. For the second-straight season, the Red Storm was the only team in the country to finish in the top 10 nationally in both team batting average (seventh) and team ERA (tenth). A school record eight players earned All-BIG EAST honors, while Ryan Mahoney was named to the ABCA All-Northeast Region second team and Brian Kemp earned freshman All-America honors. Blankmeyer himself earned both BIG EAST and Northeast Region coach of the year honors for the second time in three seasons. The squad also saw three

players sign professional contracts as Anthony Smith was drafted and both Sam DeLuca and Brendan Monaghan signed free agent deals.

Despite losing seven players to professional baseball in 2005, the 2006 Red Storm won 40 games for the second season in a row and was a victory away from the BIG EAST Championship game. St. John's finished among the top 10 nationally in both team batting average (eighth) and earned run average (fifth). Will Vogl, who earned first team All-BIG EAST and third team All-America honors, and Rob Delaney each signed professional contracts to give Blankmeyer nine signings in a two-year span. A record seven players signed in 2005, including six selections in the Major League Baseball Draft. Reliever Craig Hansen headlined that list by being selected with the 26th overall pick by the Boston Red Sox. Anthony Varvaro, Greg Thomson, P.J. Antoniato, Joe Burke, Anthony Sullivan were also drafted, while Jim Wladyka signed as a free agent. It was that group of players that helped the squad finished 41-18 (19-4) to break a 27-year old school-record for wins in a single season. Blankmeyer earned his second-straight Northeast Coach of the Year honor as the Red Storm captured the BIG EAST regular season crown and reached the NCAA Tournament.

Picked to finish seventh in the league prior to the 2004 season, the team posted a 17-9 conference record to finish second in the league. St. John's finished 37-23 overall and advanced to the NCAA Tournament as an at-large participant.

Blankmeyer was hired on Feb. 1, 1996, just five weeks before the season began, and led the Red Storm to a 26-18 record - an astonishing task,

considering he had to evaluate his talent from indoor workouts and put a team on the field for the first time without ever having seen it play. Blankmeyer earned BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors after the Red Storm finished 14-10 in league play and finished third in the conference tournament.

The very next season, the skipper guided the Red Storm to its first NCAA Regional appearance in five years and won the school's fifth BIG EAST Tournament Championship. The team finished 35-17, including a 16-7 conference record, to post the program's most wins since 1986. Despite losing his starting rotation to the 1997 MLB Draft, Blankmeyer still managed to lead his 1998 squad to a 28-17-1 record and an appearance in the conference postseason tournament. Blankmeyer had three players earn All-America honors, (Kevin McGerry, Keith Stamler and Mike Dzurilla) and as a result of his achievements, he was invited to participate in the NCAA Y.E.S. Clinic held in Omaha, Neb., during the 1998 College World Series.

Prior to the 2001 season, Blankmeyer and the University oversaw the construction of The Ballpark at St. John's, a first-class facility equipped with an electronic scoreboard, press box, lighting and a public address system.

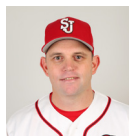
An excellent recruiter, Blankmeyer has coached more than 100 players that have gone on to play professional baseball, including major leaguers Mo Vaughn (1995 American League MVP), Craig Biggio, Matt Morris, John Valentin, Rob Delaney, Craig Hansen and 2014 World Series Champion Joe Panik. In addition to his duties in the dugout, Blankmeyer has also been heavily involved in the management of collegiate baseball off the field.

Prior to the 2008 season, Blankmeyer was appointed as a conference representative for the NCAA Baseball Selection Committee and was also named an ABCA Division I Eastern Regional chairman. Blankmeyer represented the ABCA at the 2007 MLB winter meetings in Nashville, Tenn., to discuss collegiate and professional baseball issues and was appointed to the American Baseball Coaches Association Editorial Committee and named President of the BIG EAST Baseball Coaches Committee prior to the 2006 season.

An outstanding second baseman in his own right, Blankmeyer played four seasons at Seton Hall, hitting .320, with 152 hits and 66 stolen bases. He co-captained the 1976 Pirate team that went on to play in the NCAA Northeast Regional and was the starting second baseman for both the 1974 and 1975 Seton Hall squads that played in the College World Series. He was the Atlantic Collegiate League Most Valuable Player in 1975. Blankmeyer earned Academic All-America honors during his tour at Seton Hall and graduated in 1976. Following his graduation, he was a 21st-round pick of the Baltimore Orioles and spent one season in the Orioles farm system before beginning his coaching career. Blankmeyer has been inducted into both the Seton Hall and North Shore High School Halls of Fame.

17th Season at St. John's

Mike Hampton enters his 17th season at St. John's as the program's recruiting coordinator and hitting coach in 2018. A former collegiate All-American and fourth round draft choice, Hampton's keen eye for talent has given St. John's a presence in every level of competitive baseball.

Hampton has recruited six Major Leaguers, including first round draft pick and World Series champion Joe Panik, and has seen 60 players drafted or signed to professional contracts in his tenure.

In 2017, Hampton helped the Red Storm form one of the nation's most feared offensive units, as the team finished third nationally in batting average (.323), 17th in scoring average (7.4 runs per game) and fourth in winning percentage (.764). At the conclusion of the season, three Johnnies heard their names called in the draft, as Jesse Berardi was taken by the Indians in the 10th round, Troy Dixon was selected by the Mariners in the 20th and Michael Donadio was grabbed by the Marlins in the 30th. Two more Johnnies, Ryan McAuliffe and Kyle Cunningham, signed free agent contracts with the Mets and Rockies, respectively.

Two Johnnies were drafted in the summer of 2016, as Thomas Hackimer was taken in the fourth round by the Minnesota Twins before Ty Blankmeyer was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 36th round. Hampton also helped mentor BIG EAST Freshman of the Year Josh Shaw, the fifth player in program history to earn the honor.

A program-record-tying six players were taken in the 2015 MLB Draft, including five that were drafted in the top 498 picks. St. John's also had a program-record 11 All-BIG EAST selections, a total that featured eight first team honorees. Alex Caruso posted a league-leading .382 average as a Red Storm player won the BIG EAST batting title for the second-straight season.

Hampton guided an offense in 2014 that ranked ninth nationally in on-base percentage (.393), 20th in scoring (6.4 runs per game) and 23rd in batting average (.296). Freshman All-American Michael Donadio was also a first team All-BIG EAST choice and earned BIG EAST Rookie of the Year accolades. Robbie Knightes, who ranked eighth in the nation and won the batting BIG EAST batting title with a .399 average, also earned both Freshman All-

American and second team All-BIG EAST honors.

St. John's had five players selected in the 2013 MLB Draft, including a fourth round pick in Ryan Horstman. The five-man 2013 draft class came just one season after St. John's also had five players taken in the 2012 MLB Draft, including four in the top six rounds. Jeremy Baltz, the second two-time All-American in program-history and the first BIG EAST player since 2002-04 to earn three first team All-Conference selections, highlighted the 2012 draft class with a second round selection.

All-American and eventual World Series Champion Joe Panik, a first round selection of the San Francisco Giants, highlighted a group of four players that went on to play professionally in 2011. St. John's had four players drafted in 2010 and had two 2009 draft picks after a five-man 2008 draft class that featured future Major Leaguer Scott Barnes, who was drafted by the Giants in the eighth round.

Future Major Leaguer Rob Delaney signed as an undrafted free agent in 2006 and a record seven players were signed to professional contracts in 2005, including a then-record six selected in the MLB Draft. Among the players selected that season were two future Major Leaguers: first rounder Craig Hansen and 12th round pick Anthony Varvaro.

St. John's set new school-records in runs (473), hits (750), RBI (457) and doubles (150) in 2010 as a prolific offense helped the squad win a program-record 43 games. Jeremy Baltz earned NCBWA National Freshman Hitter of the Year honors and was named the Louisville Slugger National Freshman Player of the Year after leading the nation's freshman, and setting new single-season school-records, in both home runs (24) and RBI (85). The second consensus All-American in school-history, Baltz and classmate Kyle Hansen each earned Freshman All-American honors to give St. John's at least one freshman

All-American in four-straight seasons.

The offense ranked sixth in the country with a school-record .349 batting average in 2009. For a third-straight season, St. John's had a freshman All-American as Joe Panik earned the accolades after a rookie campaign in which the shortstop batted .332 with 11 doubles, five home runs and 47 RBI. Tim Morris also earned third team All-America honors and first team All-BIG EAST accolades after batting .415 with 17 doubles, 12 home runs and 62 RBI.

Led by eight All-BIG EAST selections, the 2008 team finished 42-16 to set what was then a program-record for victories. For the second-straight season, the Red Storm had a Freshman All-American as Paul Karmas earned the honors after batting .312 and leading the team in both doubles (17) and RBI (45).

St. John's finished seventh in the country in average (.326) and 12th in the country in scoring in 2007, while Brian Kemp earned Freshman All-America honors after batting .348 with a team-best 53 runs and 25 stolen bases. The 2006 squad ranked eighth in the country with a .328 batting

Hampton came to St. John's from BIG EAST Conference rival West Virginia, where he served as the Mountaineers hitting coach from 2000-01. He spent the 1999 season as a volunteer assistant on Jack Leggett's staff at Clemson.

Prior to his stay at Clemson, Hampton played professionally in the Cincinnati Reds organization and advanced to High-A before retiring due to injury.

A fourth-round draft choice by the Reds, Hampton was an All-American third baseman for Leggett at Clemson, helping the Tigers to a 57-18 record and the nation's No. 1 ranking for a portion of the 1994 season.

A native of Colorado Springs, Colo., Hampton spent the summer of 2001 in the Coastal Plain League as the head coach for the Wilmington Sharks and the summer of 1999 as an assistant for the Thomasville Hi-Toms, also of the CPL.

Hampton earned his master's degree in athletic coaching education from West Virginia in 2001, and his bachelor's degree in biological science from Clemson in 1997.

Pitching Coach
St. John's '09
First Season At St. John's

Less than a decade removed from claiming BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year honors as the ace of the Red Storm staff, George Brown enters his first year as the Red Storm's pitching coach in 2018.

"I'm excited to have George Brown back as our new pitching coach," said Blankmeyer. "George had an outstanding career here at St. John's and has professional experience as well as an outstanding coaching resume. He will no doubt do an exceptional job with our pitching staff."

In his four years as a student-athlete at St. John's, Brown put together a record of 22-3 and is one of just three pitchers in program history alongside Frank Viola and Michael O'Connor to record at least 20 wins and fewer than five losses. In addition, Brown, whose 22 wins rank fourth in school history, was part of the only four-year class in St. John's history to win 40 or more games in each of its four campaigns.

A 27th Round pick of the St. Louis Cardinals in the 2008 MLB Draft, Brown played three seasons in the organization before seeing his career cut short due to injury, rising as high as Class-A Advanced for the 2009 and 2010 campaigns.

A team captain on the 2008 squad that won a then-school record 42 games and claimed the

BIG EAST Regular Season Championship, Brown captured the conference's top pitching honor after going 9-1 with a 2.91 ERA in 14 appearances, all of which were starts, while registering 59 strikeouts and just 12 walks. The Syracuse, N.Y., native earned a pair of All-America honors that season, finding spots on both the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and Collegiate Baseball All-America Second Teams. A standout in the classroom as well, Brown was also named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team.

In his first year as a starter in 2007, Brown went 6-2 with a 3.09 ERA, which was remarkably his highest single-season ERA as a Johnny.

As a freshman and sophomore, Brown was used primarily as a reliever, going 5-0 with a 2.14 ERA as a sophomore after compiling a 2-0 record with a 2.82 ERA in his rookie campaign.

Prior to his arrival back in Queens, Brown spent the past two years on Matt Senk's staff at Stony Brook, guiding the Seawolves to a pair of successful seasons. In his first year with the Seawolves, the team made it to the championship round of the America East Tournament before falling to top-seeded Binghamton.

Brown guided rookie right-hander Brian Herrmann to spots on the Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-America Team and All-America East First Team in 2017. In his first year on staff with the Seawolves, Brown helped right-hander Bret Clarke garner America East Rookie of the Year accolades.

Before his stint at Stony Brook, Brown spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Monmouth and one year as a pitching coach/recruiting coordinator at Siena.

Josh Ake, a former student-athlete at the University of Oklahoma, signed onto Ed Blankmeyer's staff as a volunteer assistant for the 2018 campaign.

A two-year member of the Sooners, Ake made 83 appearances and 59 starts, primarily at second base. Ake saw a significant rise in production between his junior and senior seasons in Norman, bumping his batting average by nearly 30 points and more than doubling his output in hits, runs scored, RBIs, doubles and home runs. In addition to his accolades on the field, Ake was also named to the Big 12 All-Academic First Team in 2015.

Following the conclusion of his playing career, Ake stayed on with the Sooners as an undergraduate assistant for the 2016 campaign.

After beginning his collegiate career at the University of North Carolina, Ake transferred to Howard College in Big Spring, Texas, for his sophomore season, hitting .278 with 15 runs scored and 10 RBIs in 36 games.

A native of Readington, N.J., Ake graduated from Hunterdon Central High School as the program's all-time leader in hits and runs scored and led the team to a pair of state titles. Following his senior season, Ake was drafted in the 29th round, 882nd overall, by the New York Mets. Perfect Game rated Ake as the no. 4 player in his class in the state of New Jersey.

Paul Jacobson begins his first year on the St. John's staff in 2017-18 as the program's director of baseball operations.

A 2016 graduate of South Dakota State University with a degree in business economics, Jacobson was a four-year standout for the Jackrabbits baseball team, ranking third all-time in program history with 215 games played. A team captain and All-Summit League honoree his senior year after leading the team with 25 extra-base hits and 20 stolen bases, Jacobson also ranks in the top 10 in SDSU history in both doubles and stolen bases.

An immediate impact player in Brookings, Jacobson helped the Jackrabbits claim the Summit League Championship and advance to the NCAA Eugene Regional as a freshman in 2013, starting 47 games and hitting .293 with 15 doubles and a team-best 10 swiped bags.

Also a leader in the classroom, Jacobson was a Summit League Distinguished Scholar during his tenure at SDSU.

A native of Dakota Dunes, S.D., Jacobson excelled as a multi-sport star at Bishop Heelan High School in Sioux City, Iowa, serving as a team captain in four different sports. A first-team all-state selection in both baseball and football, Jacobson hit nearly .500 in each of his final two years on the diamond while setting single-game and single-season school records for touchdown passes on the gridiron. Jacobson also played on two state championship basketball teams and competed on a state title track & field squad.
