



CARLTON LE WILLOWS TECHNICAL GRAMMAR SCHOOL

The school has been designed to accommodate 510 pupils, including a sixth form of 60. It stands on a commanding campus site of 45 acres, which at present is shared by Carlton le Willows Grammar School, but for which a third secondary school is planned at a later date.

ACCOMMODATION At the heart of the school is a two-storey block incorporating assembly hall, library, and administrative offices. To the east of the assembly hall, forming three sides of a courtyard, stands the two-storey classroom block, which includes four dining classrooms on the ground floor served by two kitchens. Radiating from the centre of the school are three single-storey blocks:—(1) changing rooms, gymnasium, and covered games area; (2) music room and science laboratories; (3) practical rooms for art and craft, metal and woodwork, technical drawing, housecraft and needlework.

DESIGN The school has been built in the C.L.A.S.P. system of construction which is based on the maximum use of factory made components assembled on site. The light and flexible steel framework, standing on a five inch reinforced concrete slab, is designed to withstand the effects of any ground movement caused by mining subsidence.

External walls consist of timber window frames, containing glazed or vitreous enamel panels, and concrete cladding. Internal partitions are six inches thick and formed of two skins of plasterboard panels with honeycombed paper core. The roofing and first floor construction are of timber; ceilings are suspended and consist of either plasterboard or fibrous plaster panels.

CONTRACT Construction of the school was completed in September, 1962, after only 18 months' work. Contractors were J. Searson Limited of Sutton-in-Ashfield, and the gross cost of the building work amounted to £202,310.

OFFICIAL OPENING CEREMONY

The Official Opening Ceremony will be performed in the School Hall at 3 p.m. on Friday, 22nd November, 1963, by Mr. Willoughby R. Norman, Chairman of Boots Pure Drug Company Limited.
