



The career of Y. G. Srimati—classical singer, musician, dancer and painter—represents a continuum in which each of these skills and experiences merged, influencing and pollinating each other.

Born in Mysore in 1926, Srimati was part of the generation much influenced by the rediscovery of a classical Sanskrit legacy devoted to the visual arts. Soon swept up in the nationalist movement for an independent India, she was deeply moved by the time she spent with Gandhi. For the young Srimati, the explicit referencing of the past and of religious subjects came together in an unparalleled way, driven by the explosive atmosphere of an India in the final push to independence. This experience gave form and meaning to her art, and largely defined her style.

As John Guy demonstrates in this sumptuous volume, as a painter of the mid- and later $20^{\rm th}$ century, Y. G. Srimati embodied a traditionalist position, steadfast in her vision of an Indian style, one which resonated with those who knew India best.

John Guy is the Florence and Herbert Irving Curator of South and Southeast Asian Art at The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York. He previously served for 22 years as Senior Curator of Indian Art at the Victoria and Albert Museum, London, and has authored many major publications, including *Arts of India: 1550– 1900* (V&A 1990), *Indian Art and Connoisseurship* (1995, ed.), *Vietnamese Ceramics: A Separate Tradition* (1998), *Woven Cargoes: Indian Textiles in the East* (1998), *Wonder of the Age: Master Painters of India* (MMA 2012), *Interwoven Globe: The Worldwide Textile Trade, 1500–1800* (MMA 2013) and *Lost Kingdoms: Hindu-Buddhist Sculpture of Early Southeast Asia* (MMA 2014).

The curator of the Kochi-Muziris Biennale in 2014, his work has been exhibited widely at museums and institutions worldwide. His vast oeuvre—spanning painting, photography, sculpture, and installation—reveals his commitment to unveiling the meditative concerns of the self, often simultaneously situating the metropolis while also relating to the cosmic.

This specially commissioned monograph commemorates a retrospective exhibition at the National Gallery of Modern Art, New Delhi, in 2017. A collection of illustrations will map the contours of Kallat's expansive corpus of artworks, exhibition displays and found imagery, exploring the visual culture from which the artist initiates his wideranging processes and activates an accumulating personal archive.

It operates under influences from sociology, design, engineering, landscape, anthropology, urbanism and civic practice in order to impose its will on the nature of space. This monograph, the second in the series, is a comprehensive record of the work of Piero and Gloria Cicionesi, whose architectural legacy translates Auroville's philosophy of community living into built form.

In 1968, plunged upon arrival into designing buildings on a barren red plateau, their deep engagement with the philosophy of Auroville resulted in the construction of several communal living spaces, with a spatial sense that is simple, modern and timeless. The Matrimandir, the spiritual heart of Auroville, was built and executed by Piero. Completed in 1992, it shows his mathematical genius and his sense of perfection and material detailing, sharpened in the democratic, collective milieu of Auroville. Gloria's projects, such as the residential and community living spaces she designed, display her concerns about the comfort and security of an ageing population, as well as her willingness to experiment with newer, more sustainable materials.



This engulfed void known as the courtyard lies at the genesis of urban dwellings in India. In this book the author traces the metaphysical, mythical, socio-cultural, environmental and spatial roles of the courtyard in the domestic architecture of India—from early civilization and Vedic times to Islamic and colonial influences.

This book documents traditional courtyard dwelling types across India within diverse climatic, cultural as well as geographic zones such as West (Gujarat, Rajasthan, Maharashtra), South (Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Goa), East (Bihar, West Bengal), Central (Madhya Pradesh) and North (Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Jammu and Kashmir).

A billion lives depend on the waters of the Himalayas; sixty million live in this mountain range, while the rest live in its foothills, on the plains of the Indian subcontinent. For them, the Himalayas are a providential water tower. Despite their astonishing diversity, all these peoples share the common belief that this is a "Sacred Land", and this mountain range is, above all, the "Abode of Snow" where pure water springs, rivers gush and lakes are crystal-clear. In this mosaic of peoples, languages, religions and lands, water plays a vital part in the geographical distribution of the various ethnic groups, their social organization and the way they see themselves.

With its stunning photographs and embedded videos, this volume offers an anthropological insight into the various bonds formed between man and water in the Himalayas. 



Abdur Rahim Khan-i-Khanan (1556–1627), referred to in Mughal records as the 'noble of nobles', was one of the Nine Gems of Emperor Akbar's court. An unmatched soldier and statesman, Rahim served the Mughal emperors Akbar and Jahangir, and commanded Shah Jahan's imperial army on the battlefield. A poet of rare skill, he wrote poems in Persian, Sanskrit and Hindavi, with metaphors ranging from Giridhar to Ganga, and with humanist ideals expounded in precise and concise *matras* of *dohas* and *barvais*.


This book—published alongside a cultural festival of the same name that included an exhibition, concerts, plays and lectures is the first to capture the manifold attributes of Rahim in a single, richly illustrated volume. The accompanying music CD contains a remarkable selection of Rahim's verses, also documented with translation in the second part of this volume, set to music with *ragas* and vernacular symphonies, performed for the first time by select folk and classical artists especially commissioned for the festival. 





Ganesh Pyne was one of the foremost exponents of the Bengal School of Art. This publication brings together 68 of his key artworks to trace his artistic evolution, from the shy child who devoured Abanindranath Tagore's stories and paintings, to the youngster traumatised by the Partition of India. These early events would reveal their influence through the dark imagery and stark symbolism of his canvases. Pranabranjan Ray's sensitive essay explores how the apprehension and premonition of death conditioned Pyne's creative gaze and personal idiom, sublimating painful lived experience into powerful works of art.

Ganesh Haloi (1936), an artist of the 20th century, born in Jamalpur, Mymensingh (now in Bangladesh) moved to Calcutta after the Partition in 1950. In his life practice, Ganesh Haloi has cultivated a singular vocabulary of abstraction and landscape. *Ganesh Haloi: The Feeling Eye* documents his latest explorations of gouache on paper through images and thoughtful writings that reverberate with his artistic practice. But the entire range of Ghose's oeuvre testifies a more diverse formal quest that goes well beyond the celebratory.

Sen's fiction which is at the same time balletic and precise, poetic and minimalist, stylized and wise, combines the virtual and visual—conveys the intensely special magic of monsoon rains as felt in the Indian subcontinent.

Sudeep Sen, editor of Atlas and editorial director of Aark Arts, is the 2004 recipient of the prestigious 'Pleiades' honour at the world's oldest poetry festival—the Struga Poetry Evenings, Macedonia.
