# Match highlights

#### Croatia - England

- Croatia became the 13th country and tenth European one to reach a World Cup Final. England haven't reached the decider for 52 years.
- Three consecutive Croatia games have now gone to extra-time, the second time this has happened in the World Cup after England played three straight 120-minute matches in 1990.
- Croatia have scored in ten consecutive World Cup matches and are unbeaten in their last six.
- Kieran Trippier's fifth-minute goal was the fourth fastest in a World Cup semi-final. The earliest was Arne Nyberg's 35-second effort for Sweden against Hungary in 1938.
- Luka Modric is now the joint-most-capped Croatian in the World Cup alongside Dario Simic (all 11 appearances).
- Croatia-England was the ninth World Cup semi-final that went to extra-time and the fourth decided in it, with the other five going to penalties.
- The semi-final scores of 1-0 and 2-1 are the same as they were in 1994, when Brazil beat Sweden 1-0 and Italy defeated Bulgaria 2-1.

# On this day in the past

#### 1966

Franz Beckenbauer bags a brace that contributes to Germany FR's 5-0 triumph over Switzerland, on the same day that Brazil's Garrincha scores the last of his five World Cup goals in a 2-0 win over Bulgaria.

#### 1998

Zinédine Zidane's double and a late strike by Emmanuel Petit help France beat Brazil 3-0 at the Stade de France in Saint-Denis to win their first FIFA World Cup.





## Metro to Moscow

A 33-stop journey through Russian and Soviet football history as we countdown towards the FIFA World Cup Final at the Luzhniki on July 15th.

#### 3 days to the FINAL

3 goals scored by USSR striker Igor Belanov in the quarter-final of the 1986 FIFA World Cup in Mexico were not enough to overcome Belgian, who sensationally won 4-3 against Valery Lobanovsky's side, then considered one of the best national teams in the world. Nevertheless, the individual performances of the Dynamo Kyiv player inspired many, while Belanov was voted European Footballer of the Year that same year and remains a World Cup legend to this day. Belanov and Swiss striker Josef Hugi are the only players in World Cup history to have scored a hat-trick in a loss at the tournament.



Participations Best achievement 1 + 8 (as Czechoslovakia) (1934, 1938, 1954, 1958, 1962, 1970, 1982, 1990, 2006) Runners-up in 1934, 1962 (as Czechoslovakia)

In their only participation as Czech Republic in 2006, the team were eliminated in the group round after collecting one win over USA plus two losses to Ghana and eventual world champions Italy.







Oldrich Nejedly (below) was the top scorer in the 1934 showpiece with five goals.





## **Switching Roles**

Nine of the coaches competing in Russia 2018 have playing experience in the FIFA World Cup. They will feature in our Stats of the Day together with other players/managers who have shaped the competition's history.

#### **ZICO**

A classic Brazilian No10 with a remarkable knack for scoring, Zico played in three FIFA World Cups between 1978 and 1986, racking up 14 appearances and five goals (including four in the 1982 edition). His best placing was third in 1978. In his last World Cup match, a penalty shoot-out loss to France in the 1986 quarter-finals, Zico had a spot kick saved by Joel Bats with the scores poised at 1-1 and a quarter-hour of regular time remaining. Twenty years later, he returned to the global showpiece in Germany as coach of Japan, only to see them crash out in the group phase after losing 4-1 to his native Brazil.







#### 1966

#### Telegram sent to FIFA by a Germany FR fan after the 1966 World Cup Final

Goal-line technology made its debut at the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil, ending nearly half a century of feverish debate. Geoff Hurst's second goal in the 1966 World Cup Final between England and Germany FR brought the issue of whether the ball had crossed the line on to the front pages of the newspapers for the first time. Has there ever been a more controversial goal? The day after the 1966 Final, this telegram was delivered to the FIFA office at Wembley Stadium suggesting that "questionable" goals be subjected to analysis by slow-motion replays. Herr Mollenkopf from the small Bavarian village of Treffensbuch, who sent it, would no doubt be pleased that 48 years later his suggestion finally came to fruition.
