CURRENT SITUATION

Situation Summary:	Firefighters worked aggressively through the day to build containment lines around the Carr Fire. Continued hot dry weather is forecasted for the remainder of the weekend with triple digit temperatures. The winds, high temperatures and dry vegetation still have the potential to fuel fire growth. The number of damaged and destroyed structures reflected may change.
