THE PBR STORY

Headquartered in Pueblo, Colo., the Professional Bull Riders was created in 1992 by a group of 20 visionary bull riders who broke away from the traditional rodeo scene. The group was seeking mainstream attention for the sport of professional bull riding, the most popular sport at a rodeo.

"We wanted to create a better product for the fans, so that when they tuned in they were seeing the best of the best every time," said PBR co-founder and nine-time World Champion Ty Murray. "Expectations have been exceeded immensely and the fact that this sport continues to grow is a gratifying notion, one that supports all the hard work and dedication of every member of the PBR."

The founders believed that bull riding deserved to be in the limelight and that it could succeed as a standalone sport. Each rider invested a hardearned \$1,000, some borrowing from family and friends, to start the PBR.

"This is the only sport in the world that I can take ANYONE to see, whether they know anything about it or not, and I guarantee you that they won't be able to take their eyes off of it," says Murray.

In 2007, Spire Capital Partners finalized a deal with the PBR Board of Directors to acquire the interests of many of the retired founding riders and invest in the growth of the organization. Those first 20 bull riders had turned their \$1,000 into millions.

In May 2015, the PBR was acquired completely by WME|IMG, the global leader in sports, entertainment, media and fashion.

More than 600 bull riders from the United States, Australia, Brazil, Canada, and Mexico hold PBR memberships. They compete in more than 300 bull riding events each year on either the nationally-televised Built Ford Tough Series, the BlueDEF Tour, or the Touring Pro Division, the developmental tour of the PBR. There are also tours in Australia, Brazil, Canada and Mexico. The ultimate goal is to qualify for the Built Ford Tough World Finals in Las Vegas, the richest bull riding event on the planet, with the winner receiving the World Championship buckle and a \$1 million bonus.

The 20 original founders took a serious gamble when they pooled their limited resources to fund the grassroots operation, but the risk has certainly paid off. Investors like Spire Capital Partners and WME|IMG, and partnerships with Ford, Wrangler, Jack Daniel's, Dickies®, and the city of Las Vegas have helped the PBR annually award more than \$10 million.

The success of the PBR has made it one of the most prolific sports on television. The elite Built Ford Tough Series is televised every week on CBS, CBS Sports Network and networks around the world, and PBR broadcasts reach more than half a billion households in 40 nations and territories.

The combination of raw sport and quality entertainment has propelled live attendance growth as well. Annual attendance of more than 3 million fans each season, compared to 310,000 in 1995, indicates that the PBR is making an indelible impression.

The PBR has rapidly transformed one of the fastest-growing sports in America into a worldwide phenomenon. Capitalizing on the popularity of bull riding around the world, the PBR has attracted many international athletes who have traveled to the United States to compete exclusively in the PBR.

- The 2013 PBR World Finals was nominated for Best Single Sport Event by the SportsTravel Awards alongside the Boston Marathon, the NBA All-Star Game, Super Bowl XLVIII and the NHL Winter Classic.
- The PBR's 2014 Monster Energy Bulls on the Beach was nominated by the SportsTravel Awards as the Best New Sports event alongside the College Football Playoff National Championship, USA Cycling Fat Bike National Championship, USA Ultimate Beach Championships and U.S. Bowling Congress mixed.
- 600+ bull riders compete in PBR-sanctioned competitions in Australia, Brazil, Canada, Mexico and the United States.
- The BFTS has visited 94 cities overall since it began, making the most stops in California. California has hosted 48 Built Ford Tough Series events.
- PBR trucks travel an average of 32,000 miles each year/season across the country, equaling approximately 500 hours of driving (not including stops).
- Bushwacker's buckoff streak of 42 riders is the longest of any Built Ford Tough Series bull.

- In 1995, more than 310,000 fans attended PBR events across the nation. Today the PBR attracts more than 3 million live event attendees each year.
- 750 tons of dirt are brought into each arena, which equals 1,500,000 pounds of dirt.
- On the Built Ford Tough Series there have been more than 147,796 outs since the beginning of the PBR.
- Roughly 120,000 pounds of bull are brought to each arena on a weekly basis (based on a two-day event).
- The PBR conducts more than 300 bull riding events per year in which riders can compete between the elite Built Ford Tough Series, the BlueDEF Tour, the Touring Pro Division, and the PBR International circuits (PBR Australia, PBR Brazil, PBR Canada and PBR Mexico).
- A bull rider must be 18 years of age to purchase a PBR membership. After he purchases the PBR membership he will receive a riding permit. This riding permit will give him the ability to enter the Touring Pro Division. Once he wins \$2,500 in prize money he will be upgraded from permit status to cardholder status, however, he has to continue to win at least \$2,500 each year to maintain his cardholder status.
- While the arena size depends upon the size and shape of the hosting venue,
 a PBR arena typically averages 85 feet by 140 feet. The steel bucking chutes,
 panels, gates and posts that encircle the arena collectively weigh 50,000 pounds
 and, when assembled, equal 1,800 feet or six football fields worth of connected
 steel. The steel materials travel from event to event on a 53-foot long flatbed
 trailer pulled by a semi-truck.
- Bulls begin bucking at 2-3 years of age. Though a bucking bull is often in his prime as an athlete around age five or six, many bulls buck past the age of 10.
- The PBR World Champion annually is presented with the coveted PBR World Champion's gold buckle, the ultimate symbol of achievement in bull riding. The custom-made belt buckle is valued at more than \$10,000.
- One of the most anticipated parts of any Built Ford Tough Series event is its
 opening ceremony, a multi-media production that incorporates elaborate props,
 stage lighting, video, music and pyrotechnics. The production typically runs 15
 minutes and costs roughly \$750 per minute.
- Luke Snyder, the reigning Ironman of the PBR, competed in 275 consecutive events, a streak that began when he debuted on the Built Ford Tough Series in 2001 and ended in 2010 when he was not ranked high enough to qualify for the Iron Cowboy Invitational in Arlington, Texas.
- Joao Ricardo Vieira earned the most money ever by a rookie in 2013 at almost \$470,000 on his way to being named Rookie of the Year.

TELEVISION PRODUCTION

Professional Bull Riders Built Ford Tough Series telecasts are produced for the PBR under a multi-year agreement with David Neal Productions, a Los Angeles-based production company led by 34-time Emmy® Award winner and Peabody Award winner David Neal, who serves as executive producer.

Hired when the PBR brought television production in house in 2011, Neal has enhanced the broadcasts with an emphasis on bringing the stories of both the riders and the bulls to life. Neal introduced other coverage improvements including microphones on riders and the "Truth Booth" camera for rider comments.

Neal created his company, David Neal Productions, in the summer of 2010, bringing his storied reputation as one of sports television's leading producers and executives to Los Angeles with a focus on live events and non-fiction programming. Neal produced and directed "Backstage Live at the Emmys" as part of the 62nd Annual Primetime Emmy® Awards telecast.

The former NBC Sports executive producer and NBC Olympics Executive VP has won 32 Sports Emmy® Awards and two Primetime Emmy® Awards, while receiving a prestigious Peabody Award for NBC's coverage of the Opening Ceremony of the Beijing Olympics.

During his 30-year career with NBC Sports and Olympics, Neal was responsible for some of the network's most memorable broadcasts. He produced the Opening Ceremony and NBC's primetime show during the 2008 Beijing Olympics, which was the mostwatched event in U.S. television history with 215 million viewers, and the Opening Ceremony for the Vancouver Olympics, which drew an audience of 67.5 million, making it the most-

watched non-U.S. Opening Ceremony in American television history.

Nine-time Emmy® Award winner Carlos **NeMolina** returns for his sixth season as coordinating producer for BFTS events. He has more than 26 years of experience, including 16 with NBC Sports. He has worked seven Olympics. winning five Emmy® Awards. The graduate of Syracuse won two Emmy® Awards for NBA broadcasts, and also won for his work with NASCAR and the World Track and Field Championships. He has worked five Stanley Cup Finals and three Winter Classic broadcasts. He also worked three Olympic hockey tournaments, including the gold medal game between the United States and Canada in 2010. DeMolina has been involved in the production of three Super Bowls, four NBA All-Star Games, three World Series, and most recently worked on the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup on FOX. He has also worked three NBA Finals and six NASCAR seasons while also working boxing, lacrosse, and tennis. Aside from his work with PBR, DeMolina currently serves as a Producer on Showtime's Inside The NFL, College Hockey on CBS Sports Network, and MLS Soccer.

Brian Douglas returns for his sixth season as director for BFTS events. He has more than 31 years of experience. including 12 as head of television production for the Winter Olympic Games. His production team earned countless awards from the International Olympic Committee for innovative technological advancements and award-winning coverage schemes. The freelance director has been involved in coverage of the NBA, Major League Baseball, Winter Olympics, Summer Olympics, and countless NCAA events. He has also worked with a multitude of international events ranging from

Biathlon to Tae Kwon Do. He spent nine years as director of broadcasting, overseeing television and radio, for the Utah Jazz of the NBA. He was also responsible for overseeing the company's television station, which also broadcast all University of Utah sports. Douglas began his career in television at KUTV, the local NBC affiliate in Salt Lake City.

Rounding out the production team is creative director **Cory Kelley**. He is the owner of ChromaZone Productions Inc., a leader in sports and entertainment post-production, located in Nashville, Tenn., and an Emmy® Award nominated storyteller.

THE PBR ON TELEVISION

The PBR ranks among the most prolific sports on television.

In 2013 the PBR developed a relationship with CBS Sports and CBS Sports Network. In 2014 the agreement was extended, making CBS Sports and CBS Sports Network the primary television partners of the PBR for several years.

CBS Sports Network and CBS began broadcasting PBR Built Ford Tough Series events in 2012 as part of a split package with NBC and NBC Sports Network.

Despite having fewer broadcasts, the PBR saw an increase of more than 20 percent in the total number of viewers in 2012 as compared to 2011. The growth was fueled by a strong commitment from CBS Sports Network, as well as an increased number of CBS broadcasts that received strong ratings.

In 2015, CBS Sports Network televised 27 event dates during the regular season, as well as all five rounds of the Built Ford Tough World Finals, while CBS broadcasted 14 special events/rounds of competition.

The first of the two highest-rated events in 2015 was a 1.6 with 1.87 HH and 2.4

plus million viewers tuning in on Oct. 4th for the event in Tucson, Arizona. It was the most-watched PBR event on CBS in more than four years. The second highest-rated broadcast of the year was the Sept 20th airing of the BFTS from Charlotte, North Carolina, which garnered a 1.2 rating with 1.42 HH and 1.8 plus million viewers.

In 2016 there will be more than 400 hours of coverage of the PBR's elite Built Ford Tough Series, including 100 hours of live coverage on CBS Sports Network. There will be a total of 50 events broadcast on CBS and CBS Sports Network with supplemental online broadcasts.

CBS Sports Network will televise 36 rounds of competition across 27 events, while CBS will televise 14 events, including bull riding action from the PBR Majors at Madison Square Garden in New York City, AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, Las Vegas Village in Las Vegas, and Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tennessee.

CBS coverage also will include the popular PBR 15/15 Bucking Battles, featuring the Top 15 riders in the world competing against the Top 15 bulls.

The PBR also has 37 international broadcast partners in 114 territories, and is available in half a billion households worldwide.

PURE PBR BROADCASTS

The PURE PBR broadcasts provide a new approach to PBR coverage, including everything from candid moments between rides to various opportunities for the broadcasters to not only explain, but also visually illustrate the point they're trying to make. PBR commentators take viewers inside the world of the PBR, spending one-on-one time with riders before their rides and giving viewers a chance to listen in on the one-of-a-kind conversation.

TELEVISION BROADCASTERS





CRAIG HUMMER - Returning for his 11th season as the play-by-play broadcaster is Craig Hummer, Emmy-nominated, Hummer brings 17 years of experience, covering more than 50 different sports for network, cable and syndicated shows worldwide. Hummer was a member of the broadcast team for every NBC Olympics from 2004-2012, and has done play-by-play coverage for sports as varied as fencing to figure skating. He hosted pre-Olympic shows for Universal Sports for the 2012 London Games and is part of the team for the 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi, From 2004-2012, he either hosted or reported at the Tour de France for OLN, VERSUS, NBC Sports Network, or CBS Sports.

JUSTIN MCBRIDE - Two-time PBR World Champion Justin McBride has worked as a color commentator for the past seven seasons. He won \$5.1 million during his PBR career, which is the third most earned by any Western athlete in history. McBride was inducted into the PBR Ring of Honor in 2008, and holds the PBR record for event wins in a season with eight in 2007.



TY MURRAY - Nine-time World Champion and PBR co-founder Ty Murray has worked on PBR broadcasts since 2007. He was inducted into the PBR Ring of Honor in 2002 and three times was runner-up for the PBR World Championship. Murray, who was inducted into the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame in 2000, won seven PRCA World Champion all-around titles and two PRCA World Champion bull riding titles. He was a member of the PBR Board of Directors from 1992 to 2015.



JIW. HART - J.W. Hart was inducted into the PBR Ring of Honor in 2008 and that was also the year he began working on the PBR TV broadcasts. He won the World Finals Event in 2002 and was the Rookie of the Year in 1995. He was nicknamed "Iron Man" after competing in a record 197 consecutive PBR events (a record since broken by Luke Snyder) from 1994-2003. He earned more than \$1.3 million during his career.



LEAH GARCIA - Leah Garcia has been the behind-the-chutes sideline reporter for the PBR since 2004. Raised on a ranch in Northern California, Leah competed on the rodeo circuit during her junior, high school, and collegiate years. Leah won several all-around and event titles and twice qualified for the College National Finals Rodeo. She began working in television in 1998 and has covered extreme sports, rodeo, and bull riding.



SHORTY GORHAM - Beginning in 2011, Dickies® Bullfighter Shorty Gorham has been an on-air commentator for all PBR broadcasts, a truly unique role for an active participant in a professional sport. He joined the PBR in 2006, and has been voted to work the Built Ford Tough World Finals each of the last ten years. Gorham instructed contestants on the NBC television show "America's Toughest Jobs" in 2008, and in 2009 and 2010 he hosted VERSUS' "Best of the West."

FLINT RASMUSSEN

Funnyman & World Champion Barrel Man

As the official entertainer of the Professional Bull Riders since 1998, it is Flint Rasmussen's job to keep the crowd engaged during lulls in the action or during commercial breaks.

He does it through a combination of athletic talent and a natural flair for entertainment. Rasmussen captivates fans young and old every night with his quick wit, comical stunts and dance moves.

"As a kid, I would dream about entertaining people," says Rasmussen. "I'd take a tennis racket and turn on some music and play it like a quitar."

Rasmussen was an all-state football player and track star in high school as well as playing in the band and being a member of the choir.

He was awarded his bachelor's degree in education from Western Montana College and was a high school math and history teacher before stepping into the barrel. Before beginning his exclusive association with the PBR, Rasmussen was the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo barrel man and PRCA Rodeo Clown of the Year eight times. He was selected to work the Canadian National Finals Rodeo four times and the National Circuit Finals three times.

He lives in Choteau, Mont., with his wife, Katie, and their daughters, Shelby Rae and Paige. Rasmussen finds time to regularly participate in community activities, including speaking at area schools.

"Most people don't get to do what they dreamed of doing as a child," says Rasmussen. "I feel pretty lucky that I grew up to live my dream. This kind of work actually doesn't feel like working at all."



THE **PBR** ANNOUNCERS

ARENA ANNOUNCERS

Fans in the arena at PBR events know that they won't miss a minute of the action thanks to veteran announcers Brandon Bates, Clint Adkins and Matt West. In addition to announcing the riders and bulls and the ride scores, the in-arena announcers also provide interesting facts and anecdotes.

Bates announced his first PBR event in 2001 and his first PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals in 2003. The native of Zachary, La., began announcing when he was 17 years old and has done a great deal of radio and television work. He is host and executive producer of Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation's television show "Team Elk," which was formerly "The Elk Chronicles," on the Outdoor Channel. He lives in Edmond, Okla., with his wife, Ashly, and their daughter, Zeyda.

Adkins has announced PBR events since the late 1990s and moved up to the Built Ford Tough Series in 2006. His career as a bareback rider concluded in the mid-1990s. He began announcing events in Trinity, Texas, and gained experience at events in Texas, Louisiana, and Mississippi. The accomplished bass angler and his wife, Jodi, live near Huntsville, Texas, with their daughters, Riley and Emily.

West announces BlueDEF Tour and Touring Pro Division events across the country and has also worked PBR events in Australia and Canada. The Oklahoma native has worked several regular season Built Ford Tough Series events as well as the Built Ford Tough World Finals. He also announces rodeos and has expanded into non-rodeo events, as well as doing work as a commercial voice talent and work in television.

THE **PBR** BULLFIGHTERS

DICKIES® BULLFIGHTERS

As if facing a rampaging 1,800-pound animal for 8 seconds isn't daunting enough, how about doing it for more than six hours a weekend and being responsible for the safety of the world's top bull riders? That is just another day at the office for the Dickies® Bullfighters. The Secret Service of the PBR, these men regularly place their bodies in front of heads, horns, and hooves to protect the bull riders: Shorty Gorham of Cotulla, Texas; Jesse Byrne of Okotoks, Alberta; Frank Newsom of Paoli, Okla.; and Cody Webster of Wayne, Okla.

DICKIES® BULLFIGHTERS UNIFORMS

The bullfighter's uniform has changed over the years. The oversized clothing, which lent itself to the "clown" role, has evolved into a jersey and shorts.

The Dickies® Bullfighters loose-fitting uniform allows maximum movement. The size and fit also serve another purpose - making the bullfighter a bigger target. As Frank Newsom says, "the bull might think he's got you, when he's just got your shorts."

The vest worn by bullfighters is different than the one worn by bull riders. It is worn underneath the jersey and features a hard plastic outer shell on the front and back. The vest also has breakaway construction in the event the bullfighter is hooked. Underneath the shorts the bullfighters wear a padded girdle that has both foam and plastic padding.



SHORTY GORHAM

Shorty Gorham joined the PBR Dickies® Bullfighters in 2006, and has been voted by the riders to work the Built Ford Tough World Finals each of the last 10 years. The 5-10, 175-pound Gorham began fighting bulls when he was 14 years old. He is in his 17th season as a professional and has worked the National Finals Rodeo two times. Gorham instructed contestants on NBC television show "America's Toughest Jobs" in 2008. He taught 12-time Pro Bowl linebacker Junior Seau on VERSUS' "Sports Jobs with Junior Seau" in 2009, and in 2009 and 2010 he hosted VERSUS' "Best of the West." His father-in-law is 2007 PBR Ring of Honor inductee Phil Lyne, who won two PRCA world all-around titles. Raised in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., Gorham lives in Cotulla, Texas, with his wife, Amanda, and their children, Tanner and London.

FRANK NEWSOM

Frank Newsom is in his 17th season as a member of the PBR Dickies° Bullfighters. He has been voted by the riders to work the Built Ford Tough World Finals each of the last 11 years and 13 times overall. The 5-9 and 206-pound Newsom began his career when he was 17 years old, and is in his 23rd year of fighting bulls. He was chosen to work at the National Finals Rodeo in 1997 and 1998. He instructed contestants on NBC television show "America's Toughest Jobs" in 2008. Newsom and his wife, Dea, live in Paoli, Okla., with their children, Hunter, Kadence and Regyn.

JESSE BYRNE

Jesse Byrne joined the PBR Dickies® Bullfighters in 2008. He became the first Canadian selected by the riders to work the Built Ford Tough World Finals when he was selected as an alternate in 2008. The 5-11, 145-pound Byrne has been chosen to work the World Finals every year since then. Byrne, who will turn 30 in February, is from Prince Albert, Saskatoon, but now lives in Okotoks, Alberta. He was selected to work the PBR Canada Finals six years in a row. He rode bulls in junior events, but at the age of 16 decided that he would prefer to be a bullfighter. His father, Ryan, is the only Canadian bullfighter selected to work the National Finals Rodeo, earning the honor in 1986. His brother, Tanner, finished the 2015 PBR season as the top performing Canadian at No. 8.

CODY WEBSTER

Cody Webster earned his first opportunity to work the Built Ford Tough World Finals in 2014. The 22-year-old has been a prodigy of Frank Newsom's since he was 11 years old. Webster was also selected to work his first NFR in December 2014. He will get more chances to work Built Ford Tough events as he will be the fourth bullfighter for the 2016 season. He currently lives in Wayne, Oklahoma.

THE **PBR** BELT BUCKLE

Since Western riding sports began, the "trophy" of choice has been the belt buckle.

It is the ultimate symbol of achievement and is worn with pride by those athletes talented enough to earn it.

On the Built Ford Tough Series, buckles are awarded to each regular-season event winner, each PBR World Finals round winner, the PBR World Finals event winner and the PBR World Champion.

The custom buckle for each Built Ford Tough Series event is created by Montana Silversmiths, the official silversmiths of the PBR.

Regular-season event buckles are valued at a minimum of \$1,000, while the buckle awarded to the PBR World Champion is valued at more than \$10.000.

THE PBR Cup

The PBR Cup is a traveling monument to the best riders in the world.

Each year a gold buckle is added, inscribed with the name of the new PBR World Champion, immortalizing the winner forever.

Crafted from silver, gold and precious stones and perched atop a solid marble base, the PBR Cup is valued at more than \$250,000.





THE **PBR** SPORTS MEDECINE TEAM



DR. TANDY FREEMAN

Dr. Tandy Freeman has been the official on-site doctor for the Professional Bull Riders since 1995. Freeman earned his medical degree from the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School after receiving a bachelor's in biology from Baylor University. Following internship and residency training in general and orthopedic surgery in Utah and Texas, Freeman completed a fellowship in sports medicine in Alabama and then went into practice in Dallas joining J. Pat Evans, M.D., founder of the sports medicine team for the PRCA. Freeman's patients include recreational and high school, as

well as college and professional athletes. He was the team physician for the Dallas Mavericks of the NBA for five years and is the head physician for the NFR. Freeman was named as one of Texas Monthly's Super Doctors in 2008-2013. He was the Texas Rodeo Cowboy Hall of Fame Western Heritage Award Inductee in 2008, the Texas Circuit Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association Man of the Year in 2004, Resistol's Rodeo Man of the Year in 2010, the recipient of the Lane Frost Award in 2012 and was inducted into the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame in 2013.

SPORTS MEDICINE TEAM

Veteran athletic trainer Rich Blyn leads the Professional Bull Riders Sports Medicine Team. Blyn, Peter Wang, Tony Marek, Dave Edwards, and a national network of trainers are on site to ensure that PBR riders receive the best possible care before, during and after every Built Ford Tough Series event.

Blyn has been with the PBR since its second year. He has been a Certified Athletic Trainer since 1989, working at the high school, college and professional levels, including as a member of the sports medicine team for the PRCA. He and his wife, Liane, own and operate Athletic Based Training, a sports performance facility in Holliston, Mass., where athletes from junior high to professional levels work to improve strength, speed and agility training. Blyn was awarded his bachelor's degree in exercise science from California State University, Dominguez Hills, and his master's degree in sports medicine from the University of Nevada, Reno.

The PBR is thrilled to introduce you to the toughest sport on dirt – bull riding.

There is nothing ordinary about the PBR or its athletes. So, hang on tight...at least for 8 seconds!

RIDE SCORE

Each ride is worth up to 100 points: 50 points for the bull and 50 points for the rider if he successfully rides the bull for 8 seconds. Four judges award up to 25 points each to the rider and the bull. All four of the judges' scores are combined and then divided by two for the official score.

Half of the 100 points possible is based on the performance of the bull and how difficult he is to ride. Judges look for bulls with speed, power, and drop in the front end; kick in the back end, direction changes and body rolls. A body roll occurs when a bull is in the air and kicks either his hind hooves or all four hooves to the side. The more of these characteristics a bull displays during a ride, the higher the degree of difficulty. Judges are allowed to award a cowboy a "re-ride" if they feel the bull did not perform at the level of other bulls in the competition and did not give the rider a fair chance to earn a high score.

The other half of the 100 points is based on how adept the rider is. Judges look for constant control and good body position throughout the ride. Spurring the bull is not required, but extra style points are awarded for doing so.

The rider must stay aboard the bull for 8 seconds to receive a score. The clock begins when the bull's shoulder or hip crosses the plane of the bucking chutes and stops when the bull rider's hand comes out of the rope or he touches the ground. The bull rider must ride with one hand and is disqualified if he touches himself or the bull during the 8-second ride.

Rides of 90 points or higher are considered outstanding. The highest score in PBR history is 96.5 points. Bubba Dunn set the record on Promise Land at Tampa, Fla., in 1999. Chris Shivers tied the mark on Jim Jam at Tampa in 2000 and on Dillinger at the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals in 2001. The last rider to tie the record was Michael Gaffney at Nampa, Idaho, in 2004.

JUDGES

Each Built Ford Tough Series event has four judges who each have 50 points (25 points for the bull and 25 points for the rider) to distribute on each ride. The scores from each of the four judges are added together then divided by two to determine the rider's total score. Judges are hired by PBR administration using strict and extensive qualifications.

THE **PBR** BULL RIDING BASICS

BUILT FORD TOUGH SERIES SCORING:

The PBR Built Ford Tough World Champion is the best – the winningest - bull rider of the season and thereby accumulates the most world points during the regular season and the Built Ford Tough World Finals.

Prior to 2015, the PBR points system was based on ensuring that the most consistent rider was rewarded by becoming the PBR World Champion. It has, however, always been the intent of the PBR's founders that the bull rider who consistently wins the most is the one who should win events and ultimately the world championship. Therefore, starting with the 2015 PBR season, the sport has adopted

a restructured points system. The new points system rewards bull riders who perform at the highest level of the sport both within individual events and throughout the season on all of the PBR's tours – Built Ford Tough Series, 15/15 Bucking Battles, BlueDEF Tour, Touring Pro Division and international tours in Australia. Brazil. Canada and Mexico.

While the ride scores will determine placement in each round of an event and in the event aggregate, to determine both event and world standings, they will no longer be included in the PBR world standings points totals.

The points system prior to 2015 is below.

BUILT FORD TOUGH WORLD FINALS SCORING

The PBR World Finals points system was modified in 2004 to ensure that the PBR World Champion was not determined prior to the World Finals. It gave virtually all of the riders in the Top 10 at least a mathematical chance of becoming the PBR World Champion.

A new points system has been instituted in 2015 which not only makes the race for the world title very competitive; it also places the emphasis on the most important achievement in sports – winning.

Below are the new and old points systems for comparison:

WORLD FINALS QUALIFICATION

Riders qualify for the Professional Bull Riders Built Ford Tough World Finals based on PBR World Standings Points earned during the season on all of the PBR's tours: Built Ford Tough Series, BlueDEF Tour, Touring Pro Division, and PBR international tours in Australia, Brazil, Canada and Mexico.

The Top 35 ranked men, based on PBR World Standings Points earned during a season, will compete at the PBR World Finals. The PBR's BlueDEF Tour Champion, the Top 3 highest-ranked finishers at the BlueDEF Tour Finals and the highest finishing international rider at the BlueDEF Tour Finals will also have an opportunity to compete at the PBR World Finals.

PROFESSIONAL BULL RIDER'S GEAR

1. Headgear - Cowboy Hat or Helmet Wearing a cowboy hat is primarily traditional, however helmets with protective facemasks are being worn by more and more bull riders. Helmets shield the head from threatening blows. Facemasks protect both the face and jaw.

Some riders feel that the helmet and facemask restrict their vision. Others think the added weight upsets their balance and timing. Those that wear them are grateful for the added protection they provide.

Often riders will wear a helmet or facemask after a serious head, face or jaw injury.

Choosing a hat or helmet used to be a matter of preference. However, beginning with the 2013 season, any contestant born on or after October 15, 1994 is required to wear a protective helmet deemed by the contestant, in the contestant's professional opinion as a professional bull rider, to be suitable and appropriate for use in the sport of professional bull riding. It must be worn at all times while in the bucking chutes and /or while present in the immediate competition area (e.g. on the dirt) of any PBR sanctioned event. The contestant shall be prohibited from competing in any PBR sanctioned event without wearing such helmet.

2. Protective Vest

Every bull rider must wear the protective vest which has dramatically reduced the number of internal injuries. Developed by PBR Livestock Director and co-founder Cody Lambert, the vest absorbs shock and dissipates blows while protecting the torso from direct contact with the bull's hooves and horns.

3. Glove

A bull rider wears a glove on his riding hand. The leather glove, which protects both the hand and fingers, is secured around the wrist with tape to keep it from being torn from the rider's hand by the tremendous force of the bull.

4. Rosin

Each bull rider carries a container of rosin, a sticky substance that provides a little extra grip. Every rider has his own preference and recipe for rosin, typically adding saddle soap or Neutrogena soap.

5. Chaps [pronounced shaps]


Each pair of chaps is custom-made. They reflect a rider's personality while also displaying sponsor logos. Chaps can also provide some protection, particularly in the chute.

6. Bull Rope

Braided from nylon or grass, the bull rope is placed around the bull's chest behind his front legs. The flat rope has a handle braided into it, constructed partially of leather, which is the bull rider's only anchor for the duration of his ride. The rider runs the rope through his fingers and grips it to keep it tight around the bull.

There are two varieties of bull ropes, American and Brazilian. The Brazilian version is slightly stiffer and is pulled from the opposite side, meaning a rider using his right hand would have his rope pulled from the left side. The same rider using an American rope would have it pulled from the right side.

Bull ropes typically last one season,

although some riders do replace them on a more frequent basis.

At the bottom of the rope hangs a metal bell designed to give the rope some weight so that it will fall off the bull as soon as the rider is bucked off or dismounts the animal. The bell has smooth, round edges and does not harm the bull in any way.

7. Boots

Bull riders wear boots that have a special ridge on the heel which helps their spurs stay in place. Some riders wear a traditional pull-on boot while others prefer a lace-up boot. Some of the riders who wear pull-on boots will tie them on to prevent them from being pulled off during the ride.

8. Spurs

Spurs help the cowboy stay in position on a bull. The rowels are dull so they don't injure or cut the skin of the bull. The spurring action displays the level of complete control the cowboy possesses during the ride.

ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT:

Protective Cup

While hard to believe, bull riders do not wear protective cups. Riders typically wear tight spandex girdles or bicycle shorts.

Mouthpiece

Bull riders wear a protective mouthpiece to help reduce the risk of damage to their teeth, resulting from the jarring action of the bull bucking and from impact with the bull or the ground.

American Bucking Bull, Incorporated [ABBI]

Due to the popularity of the sport of professional bull riding and the celebrity of the bucking bulls themselves, the PBR developed the official bucking bred cattle registry, American Bucking Bull, Inc. ABBI offers valuable incentives to breeders and preserves the lineage of the top PBR bulls.

Announcer

The announcer explains the action and provides statistics on bulls, riders and stock contractors to fans attending a live event. The current PBR Built Ford Tough Series announcers are Brandon Bates and Clint Adkins.

Arena

The arena is the area where the bull riding takes place. The size depends on the venue, but the average size for a Built Ford Tough Series event is 85 feet by 140 feet. The bucking chutes, panels, gates and posts that comprise the arena weigh approximately 50,000 pounds and are equal in length to six football fields (1,800 feet). The materials are transported from event to event.

Arena Director

The arena director is responsible for maintaining the flow of the event by balancing the production and competition, and, during televised events, the commercial breaks. The current arena director is Jerome Robinson.

Average

The "average" or "aggregate" represents the total ride score of the bull riders at an event. "Winning the average" means the bull rider finished the event with the highest total ride score.

Away from His Hand

A term used by bull riders to describe the situation when a bull spins in the opposite direction of their riding hand. For example, a right-handed bull rider on a bull that spins to the left is riding a bull "away from his hand."

Back Pens

Located behind the arena bucking chutes, this maze of steel panels serves as the holding area for bulls before and after competition.

Bell

See bull rope.

Belt Buckle

See gold buckle.

BlueDEF Tour

The expansion tour of the PBR featuring the newest stars of the PBR competing alongside the stars of the Built Ford Tough Series for PBR World Standing Points.

The BlueDEF Tour feeds the Built Ford Tough Series with new talent – the winner of each BlueDEF Tour event gets the opportunity to compete at a Built Ford Tough Series event to earn the points necessary to remain on the elite tour.

Bodacious

One of the most famous bulls in history, the 1,900-pound Charbray gained notoriety for injuring some of the PBR's most talented riders, including 1995 PBR World Champion Tuff Hedeman in the final round of the 1995 PBR World Finals. Several jumps into the ride, Hedeman suffered multiple fractures after his face collided with the back of Bodacious' head. Owned by Texas stock contractor Sammy Adams, Bodacious was retired

from competition in December 1995 and died of natural causes in 2000 at the age of 12.

Breeding Programs

For years, finding a good bucking bull was a frustrating matter of chance for stock contractors, since a bull will only buck if he has the innate desire and natural instinct to do so. The introduction of breeding programs has proven that genetics are the main factor in determining a bull's desire and ability to buck, and science has made the business of owning bucking bulls one of patience and money as opposed to luck.

Buck Off

If a rider is thrown from the bull before the required 8 seconds, he has bucked off and does not earn a score. If used as a noun or adjective it is "buckoff," e.g., "This rider has had nine buckoffs in a row," versus "This bull will buck off 90 percent of his riders."

Bucking Chute

See chute

Built Ford Tough Series

The major-league tour of the Professional Bull Riders, featuring the Top 35 bull riders based on PBR World Standings Points. For the first five events of 2016, the men competing will be the Top 35 men who qualified for the 2015 PBR World Finals. After the fifth event, the Top 35 men in the PBR World Standings will compete weekly.

Built Ford Tough Championship Round

The 15 riders with the highest cumulative scores following the first two rounds of a two-day event or the first three rounds of a three-day event at each Built Ford Tough Series event

will advance to the Built Ford Tough Championship Round where they will face the event's most difficult bulls as determined by the PBR livestock director.

Built Ford Tough World Finals Event Champion

The bull rider who has earned the most PBR World Standings Points at the Built Ford Tough World Finals will be declared the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals Event Champion.

Bull

Bulls that compete in the PBR come in a variety of shapes, sizes and colors. Each has a distinct personality and traits that make him unique. Bucking bulls are in their athletic prime around 5 or 6 years old; however, many buck past the age of 10. When retired from competition, most bulls are used as sires in breeding programs.

Bull Rope

Wrapped around the chest of the bull, directly behind the animal's front legs, the bull rope is what the bull rider grips during the ride. The rope is never tied and is only kept in place by the rider's closed hand. Each rope has a metal bell to provide weight and allow the rope to slide from the bull as soon as the rider releases his hand, either by design while dismounting or when bucked off.

Bushwacker

The three-time PBR World Champion bull (2014, 2013, 2011) who holds the record for longest buck off streak in PBR history at 42 buckoffs. In 2013 J.B. Mauney successfully rode him in Tulsa Oklahoma, during his ninth attempt for 95.25 points. It was the first time Bushwacker had been ridden in four years. Bushwacker retired in 2014 after

the 2014 PBR World Finals. As only the second bull ever to win the title of PBR World Champion three times, Bushwacker is considered the greatest bull in PBR history.

Change Directions

This is defined as when the bull moves in a different direction, either forward or backward or side to side. Occasionally, an announcer will say a bull has "changed directions" when he changes the direction in which he is spinning.

Chute

Each bull ride originates from a gated steel box called a chute. The bull rider and the bull remain in their designated chute until the arena is clear and the rider has strapped his hand into his bull rope. When the rider is ready he nods his head, signaling the gate man to open the chute gate, releasing the bull and allowing the ride to begin.

Chute Boss

The chute boss works closely with the arena director, helping with the flow of the event by making sure the riders are prompt in their set up and don't spend too much time in the chute prior to riding.

Cover

If a rider covers his bull it means that he has successfully stayed aboard for 8 seconds and earned a score.

Dickies® Bullfighters

The Dickies® Bullfighters distract the bull away from a rider who has been bucked off or who has dismounted following an 8-second ride. The Dickies® Bullfighters allow the rider to get back onto his feet and out of

harm's way.

Nink

Sometimes a rider leaves the chute on a bull that neither bucks nor spins. This is a bad bull, called a "dink".

Dillinger

One of the most recognizable bulls, this black, white-faced bull owned by Herrington Cattle Co. became the first two-time PBR World Champion Bull, earning the honor in 2000 and 2001.

Dismount

The bull ride is complete either when the bull rider has met the 8-second requirement or when he is bucked off. Bull riders who are still in control when the 8-second buzzer sounds must dismount, getting off the bull as safely as possible. A bull rider typically uses his free hand to release his riding hand, and then flings himself off as the bull is kicking, using the momentum of the kick to propel his body away from the bull. If possible, the rider will wait until the bull is moving or spinning away from his riding hand at which point he will dismount in the direction of his riding hand.

Disqualified

Bull riders will be disqualified, and will not receive a score, if they touch the bull or themselves with a free hand or arm during the ride, or if the riding hand comes free from the bull rope before satisfying the 8-second requirement.

Doctor Release

In order to withdraw from a PBR event due to injury without any penalty, a rider must submit written proof from a physician stating that his injury prohibits him from competing. Once a rider submits a doctor release, he is ineligible to compete in any PBR competition for 10 days.

Down in the Well

The situation where a bull is spinning in one direction and the force pulls the rider down the side of the bull and into the motion's vortex. This dangerous scenario often results in a bull rider getting hung up on the bull.

Draft

The PBR has implemented a draft system at Built Ford Tough Series events whereby the riders choose the bull that they will ride during the Built Ford Tough Championship Round as opposed to the selection being determined by a random draw. The order of the draft is determined by the event standings, with the leader selecting first, and the choices proceeding through the 15th ranked rider.

Draw

The list of bull riders and the bulls with which they are randomly paired is called the draw. The draw for Built Ford Tough Series events is typically created by computer on Wednesday prior to an event. If a bull rider says he has a good draw, it means he is happy with the bull that has been selected for him to ride.

8 Seconds

Eight seconds is the amount of time a bull rider must stay aboard his bull to receive a score. "8 Seconds" is also a movie about World Champion bull rider Lane Frost, who was fatally injured at the 1989 Cheyenne Frontier Days in Wyoming. Additionally, 8 Seconds is the official souvenir program sold at Built Ford Tough Series events.

Enter

Bull riders must contact the PBR and officially enter an event before they are allowed to compete.

Entertainer

The entertainer, formerly referred to as the barrel man, entertains the crowd using comical dialogue and dances, when bulls are being loaded and during television commercial breaks and intermissions. In years past, the barrel man was an active protection bullfighter who specialized in using a barrel placed in the arena to protect himself and downed riders unable to reach the safety of the fence. Over time, barrel men assumed most of the comical duties of what were then called "rodeo clowns." Today, the entertainer's duties are exclusively performance related, though the barrel itself is still used for safety purposes. Flint Rasmussen is the PBR's current Entertainer

Fades

If a bull fades it means that it moves backwards while simultaneously spinning or bucking, often in more than one direction.

Flank Man

The person who fits the flank strap onto the bull, and, if necessary, tightens it as the bull exits the chute. Bulls respond in different ways to flank straps, so the flank man must know the bull's tendencies to ensure he does not have the strap too tight or too loose. The flank man is often the stock contractor who owns the bull or someone who works for the contractor.

Flank Strap

A cloth strap, often lined with sheep's wool, wrapped around the flank of a bull, similar to a person's belt. Its purpose is to enhance the bull's natural bucking motion, encouraging the animal to extend his hind legs while trying to get the rider onto the ground. The flank strap is never placed around the bull's genitals. There are never sharp or foreign objects placed between the strap and the animal. If the flank strap is pulled too tight it restricts the bull's motion. The flank strap is designed for quick release and is removed immediately after the bull exits the arena.

Foul

If something happens during the ride that gives the bull an unfair advantage over the bull rider, it is considered a foul and the rider is given the option of another ride. Examples of fouls include the bull making contact with the bucking chute at the beginning of the ride, or if the flank strap falls off before the ride has been completed.

Free Hand

The hand that is not used to grip the bull rope, it must stay in the air throughout the ride. If the free hand makes contact with the bull or with the bull rider before 8 seconds elapse, the rider will be disqualified and will not receive a score.

Freight Trained

If, after the rider has dismounted or is bucked off, a bull decides to run over the rider, the bullfighter or the entertainer, the victim has been "freight trained".

Gate Man

Positioned in front of the chute from

which the ride is about to begin, the gate man begins the ride by pulling a rope tied to the chute gate which opens the gate on the bull rider's cue. The gate man is responsible for quickly opening the gate as wide as possible while getting out of the way as the bull and bull rider exit the chute.

Glove

Bull riders wear a thick, soft leather glove designed to protect them from rope burns while letting them grip their bull rope.

Gold Buckle

The PBR World Champion is presented with a custom-made gold buckle which is the ultimate symbol of achievement and valued at more than \$10,000.

Glen Keeley Award

Presented to the Canadian bull rider who earns the most money during the season, the award is presented in memory of Glen Keeley, a Canadian bull rider who was fatally injured on March 24, 2000, during a PBR event in Albuquerque, N.M.

Head Hunter

A bull that is constantly looking for a two-legged target to hit is called a "head hunter".

Honest Bucker

While it is unusual, a bull that bucks the same way every time out of the chute is known as an "honest bucker".

Hook, hooked, hooking

This occurs when a bull strikes a bull rider or a bullfighter with his horns.

Hung Up

If a rider is unable to free his hand from his bull rope when dismounting, he is hung up, and often requires the assistance of bullfighters to release him. Proper usage is to refer to a rider being "hung up on" a bull, though bull riders will sometimes use the term "hung up to" a bull.

Into His Hand

The scenario where a bull spins in the same direction of the rider's riding hand. For example, if a right-handed rider is on a bull that spins to the right then he is riding a bull "into his hand."

Judges

The score for each bull rider is determined by a group of judges, who are hired by the PBR administration using strict and extensive qualifications. Each Built Ford Tough Series event has four judges, who each have 50 points (25 points for the bull and 25 points for the rider) to distribute on each ride. The scores from each of the four judges are added together then divided by two to determine the rider's total score.

Kissing the Bull

A bucking bull is very dangerous, and when the back of the bull's head meets the face of the rider, the rider has "kissed the bull".

Lane Frost/Brent Thurman Award

This award is presented to the bull rider with the highest-scored ride at the Built Ford Tough World Finals. The award is named in memory of Lane Frost, who was fatally injured at the 1989 Cheyenne Frontier Days in Wyoming, and Brent Thurman, who suffered fatal injuries at the 1994 National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas.

Left-Hand Delivery

When the chute gate opens to the bull and bull rider's left.

Little Yellow Jacket

The first three-time World Champion Bull, Little Yellow Jacket won the award in 2002, 2003 and 2004 before retiring in 2005. He made history in 2003 at the World Arena in Colorado Springs when he bucked off Chris Shivers in less than two seconds, preventing the two-time PBR World Champion from collecting a \$1 million bonus presented by Ford Trucks while earning his owners \$50,000. The famous bull was 15 years old when he passed away in 2011.

Livestock Director

Responsible for determining the bulls used at each event, this individual works with stock contractors nationwide to ensure that the highest-caliber bucking bulls are used in PBR competition. Founder and Ring of Honor member Cody Lambert is the livestock director for the PBR.

Minimum Age

Bull riders must be 18 years old to become a PBR member.

Muley

A term used to describe a bull without horns.

Officials

See Judges

Professional Bull Riders Headquarters

The Professional Bull Riders headquarters has been located in Pueblo, Colo. since 2007. The PBR has more than 100 full-time employees in Pueblo, at its international offices in Australia, Brazil, Canada and Mexico, and on the road at the hundreds of PBR-sanctioned events.

THE PBR GLOSSARY

PBR Major

The PBR Major is an event which takes place during the regular Built Ford Tough Series season, has a unique format, offers increased points and bonus money, and is aired on CBS Television Network. The PBR Majors in 2016 include the events in New York, New York; Arlington, Texas; Las Vegas, Nevada; and Nashville, Tennessee. These events make up the PBR Grand Slam Series.

PBR World Champion

The bull rider with the most PBR World Standings Points at the conclusion of the PBR regular season and the Built Ford Tough World Finals will be declared the PBR World Champion.

PBR World Champion Bull/Mikel Moreno Award

Each year, prior to the Built Ford Tough World Finals, the candidates for World Champion Bull/Mikel Moreno Award are determined in a vote by the Top 35 bull riders. The PBR World Champion Bull/ Mikel Moreno Award winner is the finalist who accumulates the highest total bull score during the PBR World Finals. The award is named in memory of stock contractor and PBR pickup man Julio Moreno's son, Mikel Moreno, who passed away from leukemia in 2006.

PBR World Standings

The overall season ranking is determined by PBR World Standings Points. Each rider begins the season with zero points. Points are accumulated beginning with the first event of the season, including BlueDEF Tour, Touring Pro Division and international events, continuing through the Built Ford Tough World Finals.

PBR World Standings Points

PBR World Standings Points are awarded as a result of placement in rounds (BFTS events only) and in the event average, and can be earned at all PBR events: Built Ford Tough Series, BlueDEF Tour, Touring Pro Division and International, as well as minor special events.

PBR.com

The official website of the Professional Bull Riders is updated daily and includes press releases, feature stories, schedules, statistics, standings, video and more. It also allows visitors to search for specific bull riders and bulls.

Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association [PRCA]

The Professional Rodeo Cowboys
Association (PRCA) is the sanctioning
body for rodeo events throughout the
United States. Though a handful of PBR
bull riders also hold memberships in
PRCA, the PBR is not affiliated with the
PRCA or its sanctioned events.

Qualified Ride

If a rider reaches 8 seconds without being disqualified, he has completed a qualified ride and therefore earns a score.

Rank

If a bull is difficult to ride, he is called rank.

Re-ride

A judge may give a rider a re-ride if he feels that the bull did not perform at a level comparable to the other bulls in the competition and therefore did not give the bull rider a fair chance to earn a high score. Potential re-ride bulls are selected prior to the event.

Riding High Ministries

A traveling ministry for Christian bull riders whose involvement in competition prevents them from attending worship services in their hometown. Riding High Ministries organizes church services for bull riders during most Built Ford Tough Series events. Open to all riders, staff and the public, the services are usually conducted at the host venue on the second morning of BFTS events.

Rider Relief Fund

Established in 1999, the Rider Relief Fund provides financial aid to bull riders who are unable to compete due to injury. Resistol pledged more than \$1 million to create the non-profit fund that provides assistance to professional, college and high school bull riders and bullfighters who are injured during competition. In addition to personal contributions and corporate sponsorships, funds are generated through annual fund raisers including various events, sport tournaments, live and silent auctions and a celebrity poker tournament at the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals.

Regular Season

The Built Ford Tough Series regular season begins in January and concludes in November. The season usually opens in New York at the world famous Madison Square Garden. The season will conclude in Las Vegas with the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals.

Riding Hand

The hand that a bull rider uses to grip his bull rope.

Right-Hand Delivery

When the chute gate opens to the bull and bull rider's right.

Rookie of the Year

The Rookie of the Year award is presented to the bull rider who earns the most World Standings Points during his first PBR season. In 2013 the determining factor changed from the most money earned to the most points earned.

Slap

If a rider makes contact with the bull with his free hand during a ride it is called a slap and he is disqualified and does not receive a score.

Spinner

If a bull's bucking pattern includes him spinning in a tight circle throughout the ride, he is referred to as a spinner.

Spurs

Bull riders' spurs must have dull, loosely-locked rowels – the wheel-like part that comes in contact with the animal. Spurs, which help a rider maintain his balance by providing extra grip with his feet, do not cut or scratch a bull, whose hide is seven times thicker than human skin.

Stock Contractor

The people who own and lease bulls are called stock contractors. Built Ford Tough Series events feature 80-90 bulls. Depending on the location and duration of the event, the bulls will be provided by 10 or more stock contractors.

Stock Contractor of the Year

Determined in a vote of the Top 35 bull riders in the world, the Stock Contractor of the Year is the individual who consistently supplies the highest-quality bucking bulls at PBR events.

THE PBR GLOSSARY

Sucks Back

A bull that bucks in one direction then instantly switches to the opposite direction is known to "suck back".

Turn Back

If a bull heads one way and then makes a sharp move in the opposite direction, it is called a turn back.

Turn Out

If a bull rider enters a competition and elects not to compete for reasons other than injury, then he has turned out, often forfeiting his entry fee. Built Ford Tough Series riders who turn out of competition are subject to strict fines to ensure that the world's best riders compete at every Built Ford Tough Series event.

Union Bull

If a bull bucks for only 8 seconds and then quits at the whistle, he becomes known as a "union bull".

Vest

Developed by PBR founder and Ring of Honor inductee Cody Lambert, the protective vest must be worn by every PBR rider. Designed to prevent injury, it helps disperse pressure and protects bones and internal organs which are otherwise vulnerable.

Wreck

When a rider is bucked off, then subsequently horned and/or stomped by the bull, he has been involved in a "wreck".



The Professional Bull Riders bring the "Toughest Sport on Dirt" to major arenas across the United States with the nationally-televised Built Ford Tough Series, featuring the Top 35 bull riders in the world, the BlueDEF Velocity Tour, and the Touring Pro Division, the PBR's development tours.

Each event pits the best bull riders against the top bovine athletes in the world during two hours of heart-pounding, bone-crushing, edge-of-your-seat excitement from the thrills and spills, rock 'n' roll music and pyrotechnics of the show. It's entertainment and sports talent rolled into one and unrivaled by any other major-league sport.

BUILT FORD TOUGH SERIES:

The Built Ford Tough Series is the nationallytelevised, elite tour of the PBR featuring the world's Top 35 bull riders going head-to-head against the fiercest bucking bulls on the planet.

In 2015 the series will make 27 stops in 18 states, opening at the Royal Farms Arena in Baltimore, Maryland on Jan. 2-3. It will conclude in Las Vegas with the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals, the richest bull riding event in the world,



awarding nearly \$2.2 million in prize money, including the \$1 million bonus to the PBR World Champion, who also receives the coveted \$10,000 championship belt buckle.

During a regular-season BFTS two-day event, each of the 35 riders will ride in one round each day - Round 1 and Round 2. Following Round 2, the riders with the 15 highest two-round total scores will advance to the Built Ford Tough Championship Round where they will each ride one more bull. The overall event winner will be the rider with the highest combined score from all three rounds.

For a standard three-day event, each of the 35 riders will ride in one round each day - Round 1, Round 2 and Round 3. Following Round 3, the riders with the 15 highest three-round total scores will advance to the Built Ford Tough Championship Round where they will each ride one more bull. The overall event winner will be the rider with the highest combined score from all three rounds.

PBR MAJORS

Four events on the Built Ford Tough Series are considered PBR Majors – New York City; Arlington, Texas; Las Vegas; and Nashville, Tennessee. These events offer unique formats, bonus bulls and increased prize money and are broadcast on CBS Television Network. They make up the PBR Grand Slam Series.


15/15 BUCKING BATTLE

The BlueDEF Tour brings the excitement and talent of the PBR that fans have come to expect from the leader in the sport of bull riding to cities across the U.S. that are not currently included on the Built Ford Tough Series (BFTS) schedule. The tour is 100% produced and operated by PBR, providing fans the highest quality experience available. In 2016 the BDT will visit approximately 25 cities, including the BlueDEF Tour Finals.

The BDT is the primary and most important qualifying series for bull riders to earn valuable points needed to qualify for the BFTS and ultimately the PBR World Finals. Additionally, every winner of a BDT regular season event will be seeded at one BFTS event during each season, providing yet another avenue for the PBR's top talent to increase their position in the overall world standings.

The BlueDEF Tour Finals will be featured as the last event of the season to take place just prior to the PBR World Finals each year. The Top 35 riders from the BDT along with qualifying representatives from PBR's International territories including Australia, Brazil, Canada and Mexico will compete for the final five positions available at the PBR World Finals making it the most important event on the schedule outside of the PBR World Finals itself.



TOURING PRO DIVISION:

The Touring Pro Division is the developmental tour of the PBR where both established veterans and newcomers to the professional ranks compete against some of the most famous bucking bulls in the sport. The TPD gives riders the opportunity to compete in PBR-sanctioned events while earning points to qualify for the BlueDEF Tour and ultimately the Built Ford Tough Series.

More than 100 TPD events are sanctioned annually by the PBR, awarding almost \$3 million in prize money.

The standard one-day TPD format has 35 contestants; each will ride one bull in Round 1. The Top 10 riders advance to the championship round to compete on one more bull each. The overall event winner is the rider with the highest combined score on two bulls.

Two-day TPD events will take up to 70 contestants with 35 riders competing each day. The Top 10 riders each day advance to the championship round to compete on one more bull each. The overall event winner is the rider with the highest combined score on two bulls.



Personal

As a kid, Eduardo would watch rodeos on TV and told himself that one day he would ride bulls. He started getting on bulls at a ranch where he used to work. Fast forward to 2013. The 25-year-old Brazilian made his debut on the Built Ford Tough Series that year and has remained on the tour ever since. Eduardo mentions he looks up to two-time PBR World Champion Justin McBride for his riding style and believes Justin had perfect form while riding. However, Eduardo also admires three-time PBR World Champion Silvano Alves and two-time PBR World Champion J.B. Mauney. When he is in the United States, Eduardo says he goes to the gym and enjoys roping to stay in shape, and while he is in Brazil he goes to church and ropes. While he travels to every event with Alves and 2012 PBR Rookie of the Year Emilio Resende, Eduardo spends his down time calling his daughters and talking to them on the phone. He also spends most of his time before events reading the bible. He says his family – his wife and two daughters – supports him a lot and never lets him lose hope or stop working for what he wants. They have always helped him since the beginning. His worst injury took place when a bull head-butted him and broke his nose and chin. While injuries are inevitable, Eduardo also reflected on the best part of his bull riding career, which is now – being able to cover difficult bulls that no one believed he could handle and proving to himself and everyone else that he is able to earn round wins and even Built Ford Tough Series event wins.


Robson Aragao did not ride bulls when he was young child; Robson did not get on his first bull until he was 20 years old. Despite his grandfather and uncle being bull riders, he began his career as a bronc rider and then moved to bulls. He credits learning about bull riding from Fabricio Alves. Robson cites his initial meeting with Alves at a local bull riding as his inspiration. He had no money to pay for a hotel so he slept outside the arena, he woke up the next morning and saw that another rider had camped next to him and when they began to talk, Robson realized it was his idol, Alves. Personal

Growing up on a ranch led Rubens to train on calves, but once he went to the city and saw a rodeo, he began getting on bulls. He does a lot of ranch work to this day, working with cattle, horseback riding, while also hunting and fishing when he's not competing at events. Before a bull riding event, Rubens prepares by going to the gym, running, strength training and doing a lot of stretching. He mentally prepares by reading his bible and with prayers. His family - his wife Daniela and their daughter Yasmin - also provide a lot of support which helps him mentally. The 32-year-old recalls his worst injury happening back in 2012 when he suffered from pelvic distention and had to move back to Brazil to recover. He then tried to ride again but ended up dislocating his shoulder which he had surgery on and four months after that attempted to ride once more. One month later he broke his leg in seven places, leading to another surgery and eight more months of recovery. Rubens travels to most events with Joao Ricardo Vieira, Valdiron de Oliveira, Fabiano Vieira and Kaique Pacheco, and you can find him hanging out with Valdiron and Kaigue at events. He mentions that Valdiron, Kaigue, Fabiano, Joao, Guilherme Marchi and Robson Palermo are all people he looks up to because they have always treated him the same way inside and outside of the PBR.

Bonner's father rode bulls for 20 years so he credits him with teaching him how to ride. He started riding steers when he was 10 years old and worked his way through junior bulls, etc. Bonner adds that Dustin Elliott, Matt Austin and Brian Richardson each played a key role in his early career, helping him get started. He also looks up to three-time PBR World Champion Adriano Moraes, 1997 PBR World Champion Michael Gaffney and nine-time World Champion PBR co-founder Ty Murray. Bonner's worst injury took place at an event in 2008 when he tore his bicep, causing him to be out of competition for almost a year. Growing up on Indian land and nicknamed "Cherokee Kid," Ryan began riding when he was 9 years old. He fashioned his style after his father, whom he watched ride while growing up, and credits three-time World Champion Adriano Moraes for helping with his adjustment to the BFTS. 



Mason began his career as a bull rider when he was three years old on his family's farm. He said they used to have a bunch of milk calves and his dad would put him on them, then he started going to junior rodeos and such when he was a little older. Although he did not compete at any high school rodeos as a teenager, he instead competed in amateur bull ridings throughout the Midwest, starting at the age of 15 - just two years after getting on his first bovine. Unsurprisingly, the two-time PBR World Champion says one of his most memorable rides ever was conquering the virtually un-ridden Bushwacker in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in August 2013 on his ninth attempt at riding the World Champion Bull. Then, after a big win like that, J.B. heads to a steakhouse for a juicy steak which is always his post competition meal of choice. He ranks third in career 90-point rides with 65, and leads in career earnings with \$6,683,283. Since switching from wearing a helmet to a hat in 2013, J.B. says he now smashes about four to five hats per season. Though he usually changes to black felt in the winter, his straw hat has been working so well for him, that he's contemplating wearing it year round. A real rodeo cowboy who started at the age of 3, his family tried to push him in the direction of roping, but after riding his first bull at age 13 he knew he was hooked. One thing you won't ever see J.B. doing, however, is wearing yellow or laying his hat on the bed, these are two rules he says his dad taught him to live by to avoid bad luck.

As he got older, Jay would attend rodeos with his father. They knew one of the stock contractors really well so he would put a roping steer in with the bulls for Jay in the bull riding event. Once he was old enough he got his International Pro Rodeo Association card and hit the ground winning and doing well. 



When Robson was 8 years old, his mom bought him a VCR tape from a rodeo in Brazil. Robson watched it over and over again, paying attention to every movement each bull rider would make. He would imitate it on the couch at his house and then on steers. It wasn't until he was 15 years old that he began riding bulls, teaching himself how to ride bulls just by watching the video tape. Overall, he won his first event in Rio Branco, Acre, receiving a motorcycle as a prize, equivalent to several months of working with his dad. He finished first in 16 rodeos, was Top 5 in another 25 rodeos, won 11 motorcycles, a car, and a truck on his way to becoming the 2005 Brazilian Bull Riding Champion. After winning the Brazilian title, Robson decided to look for new challenges and moved to the U.S. in 2006. Despite the culture shock, language barrier and differences between the rodeos in Brazil and the U.S. (bulls, spurs, rules), Palermo has won 10 BFTS events and is the only rider to win the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals event three times (2008, 2011, 2012). He ranks 10th in PBR career earnings with \$2,484,665, including \$1,139,591 at the Built Ford Tough World Finals. He and his wife Priscila have a daughter, Gabriela, and two sons, Mateus and Lucas. Robson also has a daughter, Vitória, who lives in Brazil with her mother.

Although he's not exactly sure how he got into bull riding, Justin says his older brother rides bulls and his dad used to ride bulls when he was younger, so it's probably something he's grown up wanting to do. He added that he first started going to rodeos full time he was about 16 years old. A welder by trade, Justin says he also works with horses and cattle - he likes dealing with them more than people - but he doesn't do much outside of bull riding. He travels with his brother to every event when in Australia, and travels with Lachlan Richardson and Dave Mason when he's in the states. During an event, Justin likes to find his own space to warm up, stretch and get a little bit of peace and quiet to gather his thoughts. During the week he will prepare by doing drills on stationary barrels or get on a couple practice bulls, to help him keep that feel for riding. He looks up to Australian bull riders Troy Dunn and Brendon Clark, because they blazed the trail for a lot of Australians with what they achieved. Justin's best moment in bull riding was being able to compete at the PBR World Finals this year with all the guys he grew up watching on TV in Australia. He said to be riding with them at the World Finals was unreal.



Riding since he was 3 and big bulls since he was 15, Shane's mother insisted he wear a helmet the first time he rode and he has never competed without one. The winner of the Washington High School allaround title in 2003, he earned a scholarship to Northwest College in Powell, Wyoming. He says his most memorable ride happened in 2006 at the Yakima Touring Pro division when he rode Stoney - a bull that killed one of his friends - for 92 points. 





The missing rider's name was still on the draw, so Fabiano said he was that guy and ended up being the event champion under the other rider's name. Although he angered the event organizer, Fabiano earned the prize money and started receiving invitations to more events because the organizer believed that Fabiano had a future in the sport. This was just the beginning of Fabiano's professional career. In order to prepare for competitions he tries to eat well and hit the gym. In addition to riding, which is his favorite thing to do, he enjoys roping and fishing. He says his family is his life, foundation, strength and joy. His two daughters and his wife give him the strength to never give up during difficult times. Fabiano has always admired Brazilian bull rider Sydney Suzino Mary because at almost 40 years of age he's still an excellent rider and a champion in Brazil.




Cody didn't start his journey as a bull rider like most of the cowboys he's surrounded by. This Oklahoma native would watch bull riding on TV as a kid but never thought he'd be able to do it, even though he loved it, because no one in his family had done it before. He got on his first "big bull" at the age of 14 – he and his twin brother were riding alongside guys who were in their 20's. Cody added that they learned the downside to bull riding pretty quickly as they faced the tougher bulls at a very young age. He and his brother had no equipment in the beginning as they tried to keep their new hobby a secret from their parents by building a make-shift pen in one of their pastures that was out of site, receiving hand-me-down ropes, spurs, and using work gloves, etc., just to do what they loved most. They eventually couldn't hide it any longer once Cody got hurt. His parents eventually agreed to let a man who worked for Cody's dad and also rode bulls teach them how to ride properly. The now 24-year-old says his role model is, "Definitely Justin McBride, because he ain't scared of nothing." He also recalls his proudest moment in bull riding was winning the St. Paul, Oregon, and Pendleton, Oregon, Touring Pro Division events within two days of each other in 2013. Pendleton also included his most memorable ride, posting 91 points on Jeff Robinson's Evel Knievel in the short-go to nail down his victory.

SWEET PRO'S LONG JOHN 2015 PBR WORLD CHAMPION BULL

He first came to the attention of the world's best bull riders in 2014 when he won more than \$200,000 on his way to becoming the ABBI (American Bucking Bull, Inc.) World Finals Classic Champion – the best of the 3- and 4-year old bulls for the year. Then, Sweet Pro's Long John (D&H Cattle Co.) won the Salem Nationalease High-Marked Bull award at the third event on the 2015 Built Ford Tough Series in Oklahoma City and continued to aggressively challenge his opponents each time he left the chutes for the rest of the year.

Long John was the high-marked bull more than any other in 2015, achieving the honor at five BFTS events: Oklahoma City; Billings, Montana; Colorado Springs, Colorado; Tulsa, Oklahoma; and Thackerville, Oklahoma.

He posted 10 scores of 45 points or better during his 14 outs for the season, and received the highest bull score of the entire season – 47.25 points – when he tossed Fabiano Vieira in the Built Ford Tough Championship Round of the 2015 PBR World Finals to win the 2015 World Champion Bull title. He was perfect at the event, also dumping Alexandre Cardozo in 2.72 seconds for a bull score of 45.25 points during Round 2.

The PBR bull riders are polled each year before the World Finals to determine which bulls will be in contention for the title at the World Finals; Long John was the leader in the polls with 74.7 percent of the votes cast.

Seven bulls were in contention for the 2015 title: Sweet Pro's Long John, Smooth Operator, Roy, Jared Allen's Air Time, Stone Sober, Jeremiah and Bruiser. The highest cumulative bull score after two outs at the World Finals is the winner. In 2015, it was Sweet Pro's Long John.

Sweet Pro's Long John (D&H Cattle Co.), Jared Allen's Air Time (Jared Allen's Pro Bull Team), Smooth Operator (Dakota Rodeo-Berger/Struve), Roy (Julio Moreno Bucking Bulls), Bruiser (D&H Cattle Co.), Stone Sober (D&H Cattle Co.) and Jeremiah (Square Up-Smets/Dodson) were the top bull contenders for the 2015 PBR World Champion bull. Selected in a vote by the Top 35 bull riders in the world, each bull competed on the Built Ford Tough Series (BFTS) in 2015 and displayed what it takes to be classified a world champion.

Sweet Pro's Long John was the high-marked bull at six events in 2015 and finished the season with an average bull score of 45.43. He made 14 outs in 2015 and has 28 for his career with an average career buckoff rate of 84 percent. J.W. Harris and J.B. Mauney each closed out the regular season with rides of 90.25 and 92.25 points respectively, on the big bull but Long John bucked off both Alexandre Cardozo and Fabiano Vieira during World Finals to win the season title.

A World Champion bull contender in 2014 as well, Air Time dispatched all 10 of the riders he faced last season, including dumping both 2013 PBR World Champion J.B. Mauney and 2010 World Champion Renato Nunes, twice. He had an average bull score of 45.05 points and posted one of the highest bull scores of 2015, 47 points, at the World Finals while earning high-marked bull of the event three times in 2015.

In 2015, riders were 0-for-8 against Roy, who holds a 90 percent career buckoff rate. Last season marked the second time Roy was named a top bull contender. Roy has been ridden just twice in his career, facing 17 riders total on the BFTS. He was the high-marked bull at two events in 2015, earning a career-high 46.25 points in Las Vegas during Last Cowboy Standing in May. The big white bovine is the half-brother to three-time PBR World Champion bull, Bushwacker.



SMOOTH OPERATOR

Making 17 appearances in 2015, Smooth Operator has been ridden only once in his two-year BFTS career for a 97.22 percent buckoff rate. Guilherme Marchi, the 2008 World Champion, is the only rider to cover the spotted bovine as he notched 83.5 points on him in Billings, Montana, in 2015. Smooth Operator has a 24-1 BFTS record.



BRUISER

In 2015 Bruiser wa the opportunity to be the first bull ever named a PBR World Champion bull as well as an ABBI Classic Champion. He had an average bull score of 45.22 points and a buckoff rate of 85.71 percent, tossing all but two of the nine riders he faced. Bruiser was the highmarked bull of the Springfield, Missouri, event with a season-high score of 46.25 points.



STONE SOBER

Stone Sober was not ridden in 2015, going 7-0 for the season. In 31 outs during his four-year BFTS career, the bovine has been ridden just once, by Emilio Resende for 88 points in Oklahoma City in 2013. He finshed the season with a 96.83 career buckoff percentage and a 44.02 average bull score. He was named the high-marked bull twice in 2015 — in Kansas City (46.25 points) and Thackerville (45.25 points).

PBR WORLD CHAMPION BULLS/MIKEL MORENO BULL OF THE WORLD FINALS

Each year before the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals, the world's top bull riders vote to determine the candidates for PBR World Champion Bull. The World Champion Bull is the finalist who accumulates the highest total bull score during the PBR World Finals. In 2007 this award also become known as the Mikel Moreno Bull of the World Finals named in honor of Mikel Moreno who lost his battle with leukemia in 2006. Mikel's father, Julio Moreno, is a PBR stock contractor who also occasionally works Built Ford Tough Series events as a pickup man and owns three-time PBR World Champion Bull Bushwacker.

STOCK CONTRACTORS

The Professional Bull Riders uses more than 100 different stock contractors across the United States with each contractor on average owning 20-200 bulls.

The PBR has set high standards for each stock contractor and their bucking bulls, who need to maintain a certain caliber to ensure that they are in top shape to perform.

PBR Livestock Director Cody Lambert travels across the United States and hand picks bulls for each nationally-televised Built Ford Tough Series event, the BlueDEF Tour, and the Touring Pro Division. Each BFTS event will utilize eight to 15 contractors depending upon on the location and most importantly the quality of the stock. Each contractor supplies approximately seven to eight bulls per event. Bulls arrive at least 24 hours before the event, allowing them to become acclimated while also being given the opportunity to rest and become nourished and hydrated before the competition.

The Stock Contractor of the Year is determined by a vote of the Top 35 bull riders in the world.

PBR ON ANIMAL WELFARE

There are two great athletes in every 8-second ride, the bull rider and THE BULL.

In the PBR, the bulls are treated with as much respect as, if not more than, the human athletes who ride them. The PBR's Animal Welfare Policy exemplifies the great regard in which everyone associated with the organization holds these athletes, as well as explains the care they receive as professional athletes.

WELFARE AND TREATMENT OF PBR'S ANIMAL ATHLETES POLICY:

The Professional Bull Riders is fully committed to ensuring the health, safety, welfare and respect of each bovine athlete that enters a PBR arena. The care and treatment of PBR bulls is a top priority to those who govern and/or participate in PBR events. The organization operates under a no tolerance policy for any mistreatment of an animal associated with the PBR.

PBR SAFETY & WELFARE MEASURES

PBR has proactively initiated and implemented a number of measures designed to foster and support the welfare of our bovine athletes.

- PBR redesigned the traditional rodeo bucking chute to improve rider and bull safety. Since its implementation, the design has eliminated leg injuries suffered by bulls in the bucking chutes, which is the most common form of injury.
- PBR redesigned the traditional rodeo lead-up alleys and holding areas to further mitigate the risk of injuries to the bulls.
- With the sport's stock contractors, the PBR established guidelines for the transportation of bulls to and from events, including but not limited to:
- Bulls ride in trailers with air-ride suspensions to reduce the risk of injury during transportation.
- Bulls are hauled for no more than 10 hours at a time and given an equal amount of time to rest before resuming travel.
- In each city in which an event is conducted, bulls are housed at local ranch facilities with the proper pen size and space per bull. Bulls are trucked from the local facility to the event venue and back each day.
- There are approximately 60 bulls at a one-day event, 90 bulls at a two-day event and 110 bulls at a three-day event. A bull bucks only one time per day and no more than two times at a typical event. Approximately 30-40 of the bulls at a typical two-day event will buck only once.

The welfare of PBR's animal athletes is a higher priority than any other consideration when making decisions with respect to the animals' well-being, including the financial impact of those decisions. In November 2006, the PBR held an event in Hawaii, the Hawaii All-Star. The PBR had the option to ship bulls to Hawaii via boat which would have taken seven days, but also cost considerably less than other alternatives. Instead, the PBR determined that the welfare of the animals would be compromised during such a journey, therefore it invested nearly



\$350,000, compared to less than \$100,000 if shipped by sea, to fly the necessary bulls to Hawaii for the event in special, customized containers.

The value of the bulls to the stock contractors who own and breed them and to the PBR helps ensure that every effort and safeguard is in place to protect the bulls from any mistreatment or situation that would adversely affect their quality of life, ability to continue competing or their futures as breeding bulls. Many of the bulls currently bucking on PBR tours are valued at approximately six-figures; the owner of PBR's greatest bull, Bushwacker, was offered \$1 million for his three-time World Champion bull.

CARE OF THE ANIMAL ATHLETES

- Bulls receive about 10-15 pounds of a special blend of a high-protein grain ration per day. The blend varies depending on the bull's needs and the stock contractor.
- Bulls receive approximately 15 pounds of high-quality hay per day.
- Many bulls receive a B-12 complex vitamin shot monthly as well as nutritional supplements.
- Bulls receive a health inspection any time they have to cross state lines per federal, state and city regulations.
- Bulls are only allowed to travel a maximum of 10 hours per day. After 10 hours,

the bulls are rested for 12-14 hours.

- Bulls stand in 6-10 inches of sawdust shavings during transport for their comfort.
- Each stock contractor has a local veterinarian on call for their bulls.
- Many bulls also receive chiropractic care and acupuncture as needed to keep them in top shape and feeling great.



BUCKING BULLS Q&A

Like humans, PBR bucking bulls come in an array of shapes, sizes, and colors, and like humans, their own personalities and talents make them unique. The PBR has a vast number of championship-caliber bulls that compete on the PBR's multi-tiered tour structure. The bulls receive impeccable treatment and are often considered to be a "member of the family."

Here are some frequently-asked questions about the welfare of PBR bucking bulls and the equipment used in professional bull riding.

Q: Can any bull compete in a PBR event?

A: Not every bull can compete in a PBR event. Saying any bull is suitable for PBR competition is like saying that any human athlete is fit enough to compete in the Olympic Games. PBR bulls are the highest-caliber bucking bulls in the business. Many are products of elite breeding programs that for years have been fine-tuning the important role that genetics play in producing a great bucking bull. A majority of PBR bulls are bred and born to compete in the PBR arena.

Q: What does the average bull weigh?

A: The average PBR bucking bull weighs approximately 1,600-1,700 pounds. PBR bucking bulls very rarely weigh less than 1,200 pounds but can weigh as much as 2,000-2,200 pounds.

0: What does a bull eat?

A: Bulls eat high-protein feed and high-quality hay. High-protein feed helps the bulls keep their strength and endurance. High-quality hay provides nutrients that help keep a bull healthy.

Q: Where do bulls live?

A: The bulls live on large ranches where they get plenty of air and exercise. There are many ranches from coast-to-coast across North America.

Q: What is the average PBR bull worth?

A: The monetary value of a bucking bull depends greatly upon his proven performance in the arena; however, most PBR bulls are worth at least \$10,000, with a few boasting values of more than \$500,000. An animal, which is a proven sire of other quality bucking bulls, becomes even more valuable.

A PBR bull is ranked just like the PBR bull riders. When a bull consistently receives high marks, his value increases. The higher the ranking in areas such as overall performance, buckoff percentage, and average rider score, the higher the conceivable price tag.

Q: What is the lifespan of a bucking bull?

A: Bucking bulls often live well into their teens, which would be considered geriatric for any bull. Though a bucking bull may often be in his prime as an athlete around age 5 or 6, many bulls buck past the age of 10. When they retire

from competition they're often used as sires in bucking bull breeding programs.

0: What makes a bull buck?

A: The bull's bucking has absolutely nothing to do with irritation to the genitals.

The success of bucking bull breeding programs around the world has proven that genetics are the main factor in determining a bull's desire and ability to buck.

The American Bucking Bull is now a recognized breed of cattle, thanks to the PBR and ABBI (American Bucking Bull Inc.). ABBI has over 160,000 animals with bucking bull genetics registered in its database.

The bulls will kick out their hind legs at the height of their bucking action in an effort to dislodge the flank rope that encircles their body. The flank strap helps create a more uniform, less erratic bucking performance. The flank strap is positioned around the bull's flank, in front of their hips. Care is taken to ensure that the genitals are not involved; the flank strap never comes in contact with the bull's genitals.

Q: What is a bull rope?

A: The bull rope is what the bull rider holds on to throughout his ride. It is wrapped around the chest of the bull directly behind the animal's front legs. At the bottom of the rope hangs a metal bell designed to give the rope some weight so that it will fall off the bull as soon as the rider is bucked off or dismounts the animal. The bell has smooth, round edges and does not harm the bull in any way.

Q: What is the difference between a Conventional and a Brazilian bull rope?

A: The most apparent difference is that the ropes are pulled from opposite sides. The Conventional rope is pulled from the riding hand side while the Brazilian rope is pulled from the free hand side.

There are also subtle differences in the way the ropes are braided. With a conventional bull rope, the loop (the knotted part of the rope used for adjustment) is on the free hand side of the handle while the tail (the portion of rope that is run through the loop and back to the hand) is on the riding hand side of the handle. The Brazilian rope is braided with the loop on the riding hand side and the tail on the free hand side. The style used is the one which the rider feels gives them the best grip. Neither style harms the bull in any way.

Q: Do the spurs worn by a bull rider cut or scratch a bull?

A: Bull riders wear spurs that are required to have dull, loosely locked rowels (the wheel-like part of the spur that comes into contact with the animal). The spurs help a rider maintain his balance by giving him added grip with his feet. The spurs do not cut or scratch a bull's hide, which is seven times thicker than a human's skin.

Q: How many miles do bulls travel on the PBR circuit?

A: The PBR has an extensive network of stock contractors located in all parts of North America, therefore the best bulls in the country are provided for each event

regardless of location. The bulls arrive at the arena at least 24 hours prior to an event which helps ensure that they are acclimated, rested, well-fed and hydrated prior to competition.

Q: Is there a veterinarian on site at all PBR events?

A: There is always a designated veterinarian assigned to the PBR's Built Ford Tough Series events either on site or on call. If there appears to be a sick or injured bull at an event, the veterinarian is notified immediately. Health papers are also required on all animals arriving at an event. They are inspected as they are unloaded prior to competition.

PBR stock contractors treat their bulls with respect because they are a huge investment. These animals are truly gifted, so they are given the absolute best care available.

BULL INJURIES:

It is extremely rare that a PBR bull is injured as a result of its performance, however bulls that suffer a career-ending injury are retired to stud and live the balance of their lives as healthy, fully capable breeding bulls. While their injuries may prevent them from competing at the PBR level as a bucking athlete, they do not impede their quality of life or ability to function

PBR POLICY FOR INJURED BULLS:

- At Built Ford Tough Series events there is a vet on site or on call at all times during the performances.
- In most cases involving bulls suffering an injury in the arena, they are able to leave on their own.
- In the case of a bull not being able to leave under his own power, PBR has the ability to assist and insure a safe departure of the injured bull.
- At all Built Ford Tough Series events, a sled is available upon which the bull is secured and taken from the arena, usually by a skid steer.
- After an injured bull has exited the arena, he is put on a trailer and taken to the veterinarian's office or bull housing for further evaluation.
- In the case of serious injuries requiring assisted help from outside the arena, updates to the bull's condition will be released to the public upon PBR's approval.

AMERICAN BUCKING BULL, INCORPORATED [ABBI]

Due to the explosive growth of the sport of professional bull riding and the increasing popularity of the bucking bull athletes themselves, PBR and a group of stock contractors formed American Bucking Bull, Inc. (ABBI) just over a decade ago.

ABBI is the largest bucking cattle registry in the world with more than 170,000 animals that are DNA verified in its organization. These animals are recognized as being part of a unique breed called American Bucking Bull and registered bulls can compete at ABBI events for prize money. As breeding bucking bulls has become more of a science, their buck-off rate against the cowboys has risen.

The formation of ABBI as a separate entity has added a whole new dimension to the sport. The ABBI offers valuable incentives to bull breeders, while tracking and preserving the lineage of today's top PBR and ABBI bulls.

The ABBI sanctions and produces marquee events for bucking bull breeders, including the Classic World Finals and the Futurity World Finals, which both began in 2004. ABBI paid over \$3 million to bucking bulls in 2015. Superstar animals such as three-time PBR World Champion Bull Bushwacker began their careers competing at ABBI events.

The ABBI Classic World Finals features the top Classic (3- and 4-year-old) bulls competing for a grand prize of \$200,000. It is held in conjunction with the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

O: What is an ABBI Classic event?

A: An ABBI Classic event is an event which is open to ABBI registered 3- and 4-year-old bulls, typically held in conjunction with a PBR-sanctioned event. The bulls are ridden by cowboys and the bulls receive scores by a panel of ABBI judges. These scores are independent of the score the cowboy receives, with a score of 100 being perfect. Any bull score in the 90s is considered to be outstanding.

Q: What is an ABBI Futurity event?

A: It is an event open to ABBI registered 2-year-old bulls. Rather than a rider, each bull has a 25-pound box (dummy) on his back which is released via remote control at 4 seconds. ABBI judges award the animal a score based on his performance during the 4 seconds.

Q: What is the American Heritage Futurity Event?

A: The ABBI American Heritage is a Futurity event held each spring. It is a unique event in which animals are entered into the system as calves and sustaining payments are made in the years leading up to the event. The payout depends on how many animals are entered each year, but the winner typically earns around \$100,000, however, it isn't unusual for close to half a million dollars total to be paid in prize money.

O: What is Back Seat Buckers?

A: Back Seat Buckers is the PBR and ABBI's turnkey bull ownership program. Back Seat Buckers allows anyone to become a stock contractor and own a bucking bull. The bulls compete against each other for hundreds of thousands of dollars in prize

money. Competitions are held in conjunction with PBR Built Ford Tough Series events. The bulls in the program are housed at a special facility in Texas where they are trained and cared for by some of the best bull handlers in the business. Owners in the program have ranged from PBR fans to celebrities such as Boomer Esiason, Reggie Jackson, Wayne Gretzky, John Elway, NY Giants player Bear Pascoe, UFC star Donald "Cowboy" Cerrone and country superstar Jerrod Niemann.

Q: How does the ABBI register animals?

A: Breeders submit an application with information such as date of birth and potential parentage and a DNA sample (blood or tail hair). Following verification of parentage using the sample, the animal is issued a registration certificate. The registration certificate is entered into the ABBI database with the verified parentage and DNA profile.

O: What is the Classic World Finals?

A: Held in conjunction with the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals, the ABBI's Top 3- and 4-year-old bulls, (based upon the regular season standings) compete for a grand prize of \$200,000. The total payout for the World Bucking Bull Classic is more than \$400,000.

Q: Can females be registered with the ABBI?

A: It is essential that females be registered to ensure the complete genetic record of a bucking bull is preserved. Also, many breeders believe that the dam (mother) is as important as the sire (father), if not more so, in producing a great bucking bull.

O: Who owns the ABBI?

A: The PBR owns 50 percent of ABBI with the remainder owned by a group of breeders and stock contractors who purchased interest in the organization when it was created.

Q: What makes an American Bucking Bull buck?

A: The success of bucking bull breeding programs around the world, with managed and deliberate mating sessions, has proven that genetics are the most prevalent factor in determining a bull's desire and ability to buck. Bucking is a natural instinct; a bull can't be made to buck.

Careful selective breeding has encouraged this natural behavior in certain genetic lines. The American Bucking Bull breed as a whole has been improved as breeders select bulls for their athleticism, bucking desire ("heart") and confirmation.

WORLD BUCKING BULL CLASSIC CHAMPION

The World Finals Classic Champion is the ABBI registered 3- or 4-year-old bull who wins the World Finals Classic Event. Bulls qualify for the Finals based on money accumulated during the regular season at ABBI Classic Events, which are held in conjunction with PBR events. The winner is the bull with the highest aggregate two-round score after competing during the two ABBI Classic Rounds of the PBR World Finals.

PBR MILESTONES

During the last 23 years, the PBR has seen a few record-breaking performances and achieved several notable milestones which decidedly define it as the Toughest Sport on Dirt!

J.B. Mauney became the \$6 million dollar man after winning his second PBR World Championship. With the win, Mauney became the richest athlete in western sports history with total career earnings of \$6,708,492.

Silvano Alves sets consecutive rides record [2015]

One year after J.B. Mauney broke a record for consecutive rides that had stood for 16 years with 16 qualified rides, three-time PBR World Champion Silvano Alves shattered the recored by stringing together 24 consecutive BFTS qualified rides. The streak began in Oct., 2014 in Biloxi, Mississippi, and ended in Jan. 2015 during Round 1 of the Oklahoma City BFTS event when Big Dip (Brewer Bucking Bulls/Shane Ludemann) bucked him off after only 2.65 seconds.

Silvano Alves reached \$4 & \$5 million faster than any rider in history Silvano Alves reached \$4 and \$5 million after winning his third PBR World Championship in 2014, achieving the milestone faster than any rider in history – 131 events and 54 months. Alves also surpassed Justin McBride in career earnings and became the richest athlete in Western sports history at that time.

Guilherme Marchi rides 500 bulls [2014]

In March at the PBR's Bass Pro Chute Out in Phoenix, Arizona, Guilherme Marchi successfully covered his 500th PBR bull with an 84-point effort on Pandora's Pyxis (Jeff Robinson Bucking Bulls). The feat took him 10 years (he debuted on the PBR in 2004) and the tally is growing with each event. At the time of printing he sits at 521 successful rides.

J.B. Mauney makes greatest comeback in PBR history to win his first PBR World Championship [2013] J.B. Mauney began the second half of the 2013 Built Ford Tough Series ranked No. 10 and 3,056 points behind No. 1 Silvano Alves, who looked certain to win his third consecutive World Championship title. Mauney then won five of the nine remaining BFTS events in the season, winning the last three consecutively; then rode every bull at the World Finals, winning four of the six rounds to capture the World Finals title – his fourth consecutive win – and passed Alves to win the PBR World Championship by 977.75 points. It was the greatest comeback in PBR history.

Bushwacker breaks and sets consecutive buckoff streak [2013]

In 2013 Julio Moreno's World Champion Bull Bushwacker broke the previous Built Ford Tough Series buckoff streak record of 35 consecutive buckoffs (set by D&H Cattle Company's Silver Wings) and extended it to 42 until it was ended in Tulsa, Okla. The streak ran from 2009 until 2013. ESPN The Magazine featured the champion bull in its Body Issue that year as the "baddest body in sports." It was the first time the magazine had featured an animal in the issue.

Streak-slayer J.B. Mauney rides the "unridable" Bushwacker [2013]

In his ninth career attempt, J.B. Mauney successfully covered the "unridable" 2011 PBR World Champion Bull Bushwacker for 95.25 points at the Express Employment

Professionals Classic in Tulsa, Okla., on August 17, 2013, to end the champion bull's Built Ford Tough Series buckoff record at 42.

Robson Palermo becomes first three-time and back-to-back World Finals event winner [2012] Robson won the Built Ford Tough World Finals event title in 2012, becoming the first rider to win it in back-to-back seasons and the first to earn the title three times. Palermo also won the World Finals title in 2008 and 2011.

Alves becomes first back-to-back PBR World Champion in history [2012]

Silvano Alves won his second PBR World Championship in 2012, becoming the first rider in history to win back-to-back titles.

Alves reached \$2 million & \$3 million faster than any rider in history [2012]

Silvano Alves reached \$2 and \$3 million after winning the PBR World Championship in 2012, achieving the milestone faster than any rider in history – 76 events and 30 months.

Alves reaches \$1 million faster than any rider in history [2011]

Silvano Alves reached \$1 million faster than any bull rider in history, achieving the milestone in 18 months and 47 events. He earned \$783,544 in event prize money, including \$544,169 in the regular season and \$239,375 at the World Finals, and received the \$1 million bonus for winning the 2011 PBR World Championship.

Alves is first to win World Championship in season following Rookie of Year title win [2011] Silvano Alves became the first rider to win the PBR World Championship in the season immediately after earning PBR Rookie of the Year honors. He won the World Championship in 2011 by more than 2,400 points, and took home \$1,456,964. He was ranked No. 1 during the last 10 weeks of the regular season, and had three wins, including in the regular season finale. He finished third and earned \$93,875 at the World Finals. Alves won the Rookie of the Year award in 2010 with \$321,580. He competed in 17 of 32 regular season events, winning three times, and finished second at the World Finals, riding five of six bulls and earning \$140,500. Kody Lostroh and J.B. Mauney are the only other riders to be both Rookie of the Year and World Champion; Lostroh - Rookie of the Year (2005), PBR World Champion (2009); Mauney - Rookie of the year (2006), PBR World Champion (2013 and 2015).

Event and World Finals Winners

There have been 4 riders total who have won both the World Championshiop and the World Finals Event title in the same year. Lee 2004, Nunes 2010, Mauney 2013, Alves 2014.

"Last Cowboy Standing" Snyder takes home \$216,500 in first pay-per-view event [2011] Luke Snyder took home the second-highest one-day payout in PBR history when he won the "Last Cowboy Standing" title in April 2011. Snyder's win was witnessed by a sellout crowd at the Mandalay Bay Events Center in Las Vegas and a pay-per-view audience. The first-ever progressive elimination event had each of the Top 40 bull riders riding in Round 1. Riders who reached 8 seconds advanced to the next round. The elimination format continued until only Snyder remained. It was a pay-per-view event because PBR broadcast partner VERSUS was unable to air the event

because of the National Hockey League playoffs.

Nunes makes history at the 2010 PBR World Finals [2010]

Renato Nunes became only the second rider ever to win both the PBR World Championship and the World Finals event in the same year in 2010. Entering the Finals at No. 3 in the standings, Nunes rode his first four bulls to move into first place and finished the event riding five of six bulls. He earned more than \$1.3 million from the Finals, which is the richest bull riding event in the world, to finish the season with \$1.6 million, increasing his career earnings to more than \$2.5 million.

Bulls on Broadway [2010]

Getting New Yorkers to stop and stare is not an easy task, but the PBR did just that on Oct. 15, 2010, with the Top 10 bull riders in the world competing outdoors in Times Square. Thousands lined the streets to watch the action in the arena and on video screens around Broadway and Seventh Avenue. The "Built Ford Tough Road to Vegas presented by Cooper Tires" was broadcast nationally by CBS.

\$100 million milestone reached in Nashville [2010]

The PBR surpassed \$100 million in prize money awarded in 2010 at the Jack Daniel's Invitational in Nashville, Tenn. Before the PBR was formed in 1992, topranked bull riders might have earned \$100,000 in a season, with no rider reaching \$1 million during his entire career, including eight-time world champion Donnie Gay. Today, more than 28 bull riders have earned over \$1 million, and in each of the last nine years, 20 or more riders have earned over \$100,000.

Record crowd watches Oliveira take home largest payday in history at "Iron Cowboy" [2010] The inaugural "Iron Cowboy" at AT&T Stadium (formerly Cowboys Stadium) on Feb. 20, 2010, produced PBR records for largest single-day attendance (46,500) and largest one-day payout to one rider (\$260,000). Valdiron de Oliveira defeated 23 other riders in the PBR's first head-to-head bracket event.

"Titanium Tough" breaks consecutive events record with 275 [2010]

Luke "Titanium Tough" Snyder competed in 275 consecutive events, a streak that began when he debuted on the Built Ford Tough Series in 2001 and ended in 2010 when he was not ranked high enough to qualify for the Iron Cowboy Invitational.

Mauney becomes first man to ride every bull at World Finals [2009] - and repeats in 2013 J.B. Mauney became the first rider in history to stay on all eight bulls at the Built Ford Tough World Finals in 2009. He won the World Finals event title and \$343,000 while capturing the Lane Frost/Brent Thurman Award for having the highest-marked ride of the Finals for the third year in a row.

In 2013, en route to winning his first PBR World Championship, Mauney rode every bull at the World Finals for a second time to win the event title, \$385,500 and the Lane Frost/Brent Thurman Award for his 93.75-point ride on Smackdown (Dakota Rodeo/Chad Berger/Clay Struve/Julie Rosen).

McBride breaks season earnings record again [2007]

Justin McBride won his second PBR World Championship and set the single-season

earnings record with \$1,835,321. He won a record eight Built Ford Tough Series events and the AlphaTrade National Champion Title. He rode the AlphaTrade National Champion Bonus Bull, and won the BFTS 90-Point Ride Bonus with 10 rides of 90 points or more. McBride broke his own single-season earnings record by \$356,000 while becoming the first bull rider to reach \$4 million in career earnings.

McBride breaks record with eight event wins [2007]

Justin McBride won eight BFTS event titles in 2007 and went on to win his second PBR World Championship.

McBride breaks record for richest bull ride [2007]

Justin McBride won \$200,000 on Frontier, Teague and comedian Ron White's bull, Scene of the Crash, in the AlphaTrade National Champion Bounty Bull Bonus ride at the 2007 Rocky Boots Invitational in Columbus, Ohio.

Moraes wins third PBR World Championship [2006]

Adriano Moraes reached a pair of milestones in 2006, becoming the first threetime PBR World Champion and the career earnings leader with \$3,504,344.

McBride eclipses season earnings record [2005]

Justin McBride won his first PBR World Championship and broke the single-season earnings record in 2005 with \$1,479,231.

Lee is first to win PBR World Finals and PBR World Championship in the same year [2004]

In 2004 Mike Lee became the first rider to win the PBR Built Ford Tough World Finals and the PBR World Championship in the same year. Lee set the record for money earned at a World Finals event with \$313,300, and the record for money earned in a single season with \$1,453,326, including the \$1 million Built Ford Tough Million Dollar Bonus.

White "three-peats" in Albuquerque [2004]

Mike White set a record for consecutive event wins when he won the Ty Murray Invitational in Albuquerque, N.M., for the third year in a row in 2004.

Shivers wins first \$1 million bonus for being World Champion [2003]

Chris Shivers captured the 2003 PBR World Championship on Nov. 9, 2003, and earned the first Built Ford Tough Million Dollar Bonus presented by Bud Light.

Shivers vs. Little Yellow Jacket for \$1 million [2003]

History was made in 2003 at the World Arena in Colorado Springs, Colorado when Chris Shivers, who was required to meet a series of prequalification challenges, faced Little Yellow Jacket in the Bud Light Million Dollar Bounty presented by Ford Trucks. Little Yellow Jacket came out of the chute, leapt high and dropped low, knocking Shivers forward, out of balance and into the dirt after only 1.50 seconds. Shivers lay on his side as Little Yellow Jacket paraded around the arena victorious.

"Ironman" sets consecutive events record with 197 appearances [2003]

J.W. Hart competed in a record 197 consecutive events, beginning with his first event in 1994 and continuing until 2003 when an injury at a Challenger Tour Event prevented him from competing.

Washburn wins event record \$125,210 and rides unridden Hammer twice [2003]

Owen Washburn won a record \$125,210 at the 2003 Horseshoe Louisiana Shoot Out. The total included \$90,000 from a Shoot Out Bonus Round where he became the first man in 24 outs to ride Sharp & Zaunbrecher's Hammer. Washburn rode the infamous bull a second time in the final round to win the event. Hammer entered the event unridden in 23 outs

Sharp wins big in Fort Worth [2002]

Jim Sharp earned a record \$120,720 at the Tuff Hedeman Championship Challenge in Fort Worth, Texas, on Mar. 10, 2002. The total included \$85,000 from the Mossy Oak Shoot Out Bonus where he rode Herrington Cattle Company's Dillinger for 95.5 points.

Moraes becomes first two-time World Champion [2001]

Adriano Moraes won the first PBR World Championship in 1994 and became the first two-time World Champion in 2001. Chris Shivers became the second two-time winner with titles in 2000 and 2003, while Justin McBride accomplished the feat in 2005 and 2007. Silvano Alves won his first two championships in 2011 and 2012. J.B. Mauney was the most recent 2-time winner (2013 & 2015).

Coleman collects record \$100,000 Shoot Out Bonus [2001]

Considered the first documented richest 8 seconds in bull riding history, Ross Coleman won \$100,000 in the Shoot Out Bonus ride on Jerry Nelson's bull, Tuff-E-Nuff, in Columbus, Ohio, in 2001.

Hart sets record with six event wins [1999]

Cody Hart set the PBR record with six BFTS event wins in 1999 and went on to become the PBR World Champion. Justin McBride tied the record in 2005 en route to capturing his first PBR World Championship, as did J.B. Mauney in 2013 when he earned his first PBR World Championship.

96.5 is highest ride in history [1999]

Bubba Dunn set the PBR record with 96.5 points on Terry Williams' bull, Promise Land, en route to the event win and \$23,252 at Tampa, Fla., in 1999. Chris Shivers then tied the record twice: at Tampa in 2000 on Logan and Williams' bull, Jim Jam, and at the 2001 Built Ford Tough World Finals on Herrington Cattle Company's bull, Dillinger. Michael Gaffney tied the record in 2004 on three-time PBR World Champion bull Little Yellow Jacket at Nampa, Idaho.
