Symeon C. Symeonides is the Alex L. Parks Distinguished Professor of Law and Dean Emeritus at Willamette University, in Salem, Oregon, USA. His courses and research areas are Conflict of Laws, Transnational Litigation and Arbitration, and Comparative Law. He holds two law degrees *summa cum laude* from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece, an LL.M. and an S.J.D. from Harvard, and three honorary doctorates. He has taught at Thessaloniki, Louisiana State University, Tulane, Loyola (New Orleans), Paris-I (Sorbonne), Paris-V (Descartes), Aix-en-Provence, Louvain-la-Neuve, New York University, and The Hague Academy of International Law.

He has published 27 books and more than 120 articles, some of which appear in Chinese, French, German, Greek, Italian, or Spanish. Reviewers have called him "the world's leading expert on comparative conflicts law," "a conflicts-law giant," and "the father of codification," and his publications "brilliant," "engrossing," "masterful," and "indispensable." His work has been honored with four scholarly prizes and cited by the supreme courts of the United States, the United Kingdom, and Israel (22 times). He has drafted private international law codifications for three states, participated in drafting two international conventions, and provided legislative advice to four countries. He is president of the International Association of Legal Science, past President of the American Society of Comparative Law, and the recipient of a Lifetime Achievement Award.
