School Report (SR)

(1) Our School

Our school is located near the Chai Wan Park and has a site area of 6900 *meter sq*. It is a pleasant environment adorned with surrounding greenery. Besides, the 7-story building is endowed with spacious playgrounds and open areas. There are 26 air-conditioned classrooms, over 20 special rooms, a hall, 2 basketball courts, a cricket court and 2 covered playgrounds.

IKTMC is revered for its multicultural student composition which includes students from Malaysia, India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Philippines, Iran, Indonesia, Saudi Arabia, China, Yemen and so forth.

Some students have entered into prestigious universities in Hong Kong including the University of Hong Kong, the University of Science and Technology as well as the City University of Hong Kong and others; others have entered into renowned universities abroad such as the University of Central Lancashire (UK), the University of Oxford, and the University of London.

(2) Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns

Priority Task 1: To provide a supportive environment to ensure quality teaching and learning

Achievements

- 1. English, Mathematics and Integrated Science: a good number of peer lesson observation and collaborative lesson preparation were conducted.
- Liberal Studies and Chinese: we conducted more co-teaching so that teachers had more support from one and other, which allowed better quality of teaching and learning.
- 3. Mathematics Department, English Department, Combined Science and media team produced few clips by teachers and/ or students in various topics. Responses from both teachers and students were positive. They felt that teaching and learning becoming more interesting and easy.

- Peer observation conducted in the same level is difficult for Mathematics, Chinese
 Language and ICT as classes conduct at the same time. It is suggested that they can
 do it across the levels in the coming academic year.
- 2. Strong co-operation between DCC and form management is important for helping students develop good habits and discipline. Therefore, it is suggested that they should continue this co-operation.
- 3. A good video can easily arouse students' interest in learning; therefore, more video clips should be made in the future to facilitate effective learning and teaching.
- 4. The networking system should be improved.

Achievements

- Different approaches were used by different subject teachers such as group discussion, project learning, short presentations, debate, role play, outside classroom learning and competition, etc.
- 2. Many students discover that learning is interesting and fun. Since they are more engaged in the learning process, they learn more and gain confidence in themselves. In addition, students become more attentive and more willing to participate in the lessons. Instead of relying on teachers, students now become more active and can search for the knowledge by themselves. Besides the textbook knowledge, students also learn other skills such as collaborative skills and communication skills.
- 3. Different e-learning facilities, platforms and resources were arranged to facilitate teaching and learning. They are as follows:
 - a. E-books can be accessed through our school website.
 - b. Students can use computers and i-pads in the school library to read e-books and/or access any e-learning resources from the internet.
 - c. In the Chinese subject, some S1 to S3 students were selected to join the "An Online Platform for Learning Chinese as a Second Language" program organized by the Caritas Institute of Higher Education.
 - d. Facebook, Whatsapp groups were used to facilitate discussion and learning.
 - e. Various websites and Youtube are used in teaching.
- 4. For Chinese Department: Reading scheme was carried out for S1, S2, S5 and S6 students intensively. Reading materials included reading passages, newspaper articles, etc. Students are required to complete simplified or detailed books reports.
- 5. For English Department: Reading schedule was conducted from S1 to S6. S1 to S3 students were required to complete simplified or detailed book reports and/or oral report. As for S4 to S6 students were required to complete analytical report. Students from 4C, 5D and 6A also took turn to give oral reports on news articles of their interest in the oral lessons.
- 6. The Library Reading Star Contest: S1 and S2 students were required to attend the reading scheme and other forms can join it voluntarily. Every participant student had a reading portfolio to keep his/her reading record. Students would be awarded if they reached different levels of the scheme.

Achievements

The table below shows the comparison of the average reading marks in 2015/2016 and 2016/2017.

From the statistics, it showed that students love reading more than last year.

- 7. Newspapers were arranged for reading during the class teacher period twice a week.
- 8. We had invited (i) outstanding alumni who are working in different government departments, business sectors and (ii) successful speakers to give talks regarding career planning, study skills, time management, further study opportunities in local and overseas universities, etc. to our students.
- 9. Teachers attended seminars in order to update their knowledge about curriculum development, classroom management, and teaching strategies. Internal sharing was conducted after attending external seminars. Resources were uploaded to aero drive for sharing.

- 1. Teachers should encourage students to arouse and/ or develop their innovation and creativity through learning.
- 2. Close monitoring is required for group discussion and group work in order to ensure that students are on the right track and involving in learning.

- 3. Different strategies can be used in teaching different classes/ students depending on their needs and learning attitudes.
- 4. Students were attentive and enjoy learning when the e-learning materials were used in teaching.
- 5. Some students find reading E-books interesting because besides reading by their own, students can also listen to the pronunciation of words, paragraphs or even the whole book. Therefore, students can learn English and Chinese more lively and efficiently.
- 6. Some students are weak in searching information from the internet, some guidance should be provided.
- 7. The school hardware and software should be further improved or upgraded.
- 8. Some textbook publishers allow students to download apps into i-pads to do online questions resources for self-learning. However, only few students have their own i-pads.
- 9. Only 3 i-pads are available in the library, it is suggested that more i-pads should be purchased.
- 10. Students' writing skill, presentation skills and analytical skills were improved. However, different students have different abilities. Some prefer oral report, but some prefer written reports.
- 11. Students are relatively weak in reading. We will set up a reading club to encourage students to develop a reading habit.
- 12. In order to cultivate a good reading habit, it is suggested that class teachers can also encourage students to read more.
- 13. It is also suggested that smart cards may also be used to reward the students whenever they have accumulated a certain point.
- 14. It is suggested that i-pads can also be used to promote students reading.
- 15. Sharing from Alumni can boost up sudents' confidence in their studies and their future. Therefore, we can invite more alumni to give sharing with our students.
- 16. Students also welcomed inviting people who achieved excellent results in HKDSE to share their study skills and habits with them.

Reflection

- 17. Colleagues should be reminded that internal sharing after attending an external seminar can also be recorded in their training record; it can further encourage colleagues for attending seminars and conducting internal sharing.
- 18. Panel Conveners should include the staff development item in the agenda of their subject meetings and should make an appropriate staff training record in their subject minutes.

Priority Task 3: To build up positive value among students and strengthen Home-School Cooperation

Achievements

- 1. Through talks in School Assembly, seminars on Friday Prayer and various program conducted by DCC and Moral and Civic Education Committee, there was a general improvement in students' responsibility and politeness. It was reflected by more punctual in attending school and general improvement in campus cleanliness.
- 2. Extra staff was arranged for counseling.
- 3. More varieties of activities were organized during lunch time, after school and OLE periods.
- 4. Students' manners were improved. In general, students exhibited good behavior. Students have better sense of belonging to school and majority of them love coming to school.
- 5. The communication between school and parents has been improved steadily. The number of parents attending Parent Night, PTA picnic and other school function has increased significantly compare to previous years.
- 6. The SMS services also enhanced better communication of messages. Parents are more aware of school policy in term of our academic expectation and discouragement of taking long holiday etc.

- More co-operation between DCC, form management, Moral and Civic Education Committee
 and Islamic Affair Committee is important for further strengthening students' responsibility
 and sense of belong towards the school
- More proactive counseling activities should be organized to tackle students' problem in its earlier stage.
- 3. SMS services can be widely used to inform parents about important activities, messages, etc.
- 4. The mobile apps should be further promoted to parents so that parents can be more aware of students' development in school.

(3) Our Learning and Teaching

Cultural Harmony

Cultural harmony among the children of Chinese origin and those from other ethnic minorities in Hong Kong is highly promoted in IKTMC. Local and newly arrived students are welcome to apply for admission in our college. Our school provides ample opportunities for Chinese and non-Chinese students to interact with one another. Through students' daily interaction, they can improve both English and Chinese language abilities and master both languages with ease.

School-based Curriculum

Our school strive to stretch the potential of every student with due emphasis on developing their generic skills. Our teaching approach is geared to the diverse needs and interests of the students for more effective learning and teaching.

For junior forms, we focus on building a firm foundation in Chinese, English, Mathematics, and Liberal Studies. Our native English speaking teachers provide a rich environment for English language acquisition. We encourage students from different cultural backgrounds to communicate in English. Moreover, after-school homework tutorials with English, Mathematics, and



Chinese enhancement classes are arranged for junior students to help them build up a good foundation in these fields of study.

For senior forms, we aim at providing a broad-based DSE curriculum to develop students' potential. In addition, students can also participate in Applied Learning Programs organized by other institutions or organizations.

S5 and S6 Extra Classes

In order to well prepare students to achieve better results in the HKDSE Examination, S5 and S6 students are required to attend summer classes for 2 weeks in August. In addition, during the normal school days, S6 students are required to attend an extra class (the 10th lesson) after school dismisses.

Reading Scheme

Reading is the bedrock for students to develop their writing skills and abilities. In addition, a good reading habit can motivate students to be self-directed learners. Therefore, "Morning Reading Program" is held on every Monday and Wednesday morning. Further, students can also read E-books on our school website. Last but not least, the "Reading Star Contest" is organized by the library to encourage students' good reading habits.

Chinese Language

GCSE / GCE (AS) Examination

A school-based Chinese Curriculum is designed for Non-Chinese speaking students in order to prepare them for the GCSE, GCE Chinese Exam or HKDSE Chinese Exam.

Last year, 87 students took the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) Chinese Exams. More than 60% of the students passed, among these, 20% of the students achieved level A* or A. More specifically, in Paper 1 the Listening section, 50% of the students attained level A* or A; while in Paper 3 the Reading section, 30% of them attained level A* or A.

In addition, 32 students attended the General Certificate of Education (GCE) Exams in AS Level Chinese last year. Among these, 2 students attained overall Grade A, 12 students attained level A in Paper 1 Speaking, and 17 students attained level B.

Professional Support

The Chinese Panel participates in a support program launched by the Education Bureau (EDB) Language Learning Support Section, through which we have regular meetings with the supporting teacher from EDB. This is the second year for us to work with the EDB to try out some new teaching plans and lessons.

This year, some NCS from S1 to S3 joined "An Online Platform for Learning Chinese as a Second Language" program which was run by The Caritas Institute of Higher Education. NCS can complete reading comprehension exercises on the Internet. This can provide more opportunities for them to acquire and improve Chinese language.

Chinese Week (23 January to 26 January 2017)

Activities include:

- Poster Design Competition, Chinese Penmanship Competition, New Year
 Paper Cutting, Red Pocket Decoration, Chinese Calligraphy, Chinese
 Food Festival, and Chinese Tongue Twister Competition.

- b. A visit to the Victoria Park New Year Fair.
- c. S5 students visited Wan Chai Cultural and Heritage Trail; they walked along Tai Yuen Street, the "Blue House", the Old Wan Chai Post Office, and the Lee Tung Avenue. The tour provided them more understanding on the new and old culture in and around Wan Chai.

External Competitions

A total of 35 students participated in the NCS Chinese Penmanship Competition, which was organized by Kan Han Educational Services Limited. S6 Rahman Safaq Anse won the Champion. S5 Khan Sabira won the 2nd Runner-up. and there were 5 students receiving

This year a total of 19 students participated in the 68th Speech Festival and achieved an excellent result. 6 of them received the merit award and 5 of them received the proficiency award. This is our first year to nominate students to participate in pairs for Duologue Category. Both teams received more than 80 marks. For non-Chinese speaking students, the results are amazing.

English Language

Drama provides an excellent platform for students to develop their English skills. When students are submerged in a fun activity, they are more open to acquire new concepts and are able to learn with efficiency.






Through lively learning experience and appreciation of arts, our English Literature students were consumed by a love for a drama performance.

Mathematics

A number of specific teaching plans and activities were carried out in this school year. They were as follows:

Teaching Strategy

1. 'Supporting the learning and teaching of mathematics for non-Chinese speaking students in secondary schools'

This program was organized by Education Bureau in which we worked with the Department of Mathematics Education of the University of Hong Kong to design lesson plans for our S2 students. Different teaching strategies and activities were applied in the lessons. Our students benefited a lot from these lessons and they have shown a more positive attitude towards mathematics learning.

2. Teaching and learning activities are based on Students' need

- a. Students were grouped according to their diverse abilities.
- **b.** School basic materials are designed to cater for the needs of students with different learning abilities.
- **c.** Remedial and enhancement classes were provided for students.
- **d.** Different arrangements were organized for S3 students to prepare for the TSA including the design of worksheets, the format of tests and examinations, and extra practices after examinations.

Organized Activities

1. Learning Math through Cross-Curricular Collaboration Program

The activities aimed to provide students with opportunities to improve their ability of inquiry, communication, reasoning and conceptualization of mathematical concepts. Activities co-organized with the Arts Department were as follows:,

- i) Three-dimensional origami model production design,
- ii) Mathematical and Science Week Poster Design,
- iii) Plane geometry tessellation design,
- iv) Two-dimensional graphics card design, and



Liberal Studies

Liberal Studies Department has attained extraordinary progress in facilitating student-centered learning in this school year.

As the Liberal Studies are related to the current events, in addition to the provided textbooks, our teachers may design their own materials as a supplement.

We have made very good use of debate in many classes and direct students to prepare in groups. Learning has thus become more competitive and entertaining, and students were more proactive in looking for evidences to form supporting arguments and counter arguments. The motions included: 'Will China become a superpower in the mid 21st century?', 'Should Hong Kong government legislate young adults to financially support their retired parents?' as well as 'Should Hong Kong withdraw from the United Nations Convention against Torture so as to prevent false asylum seekers?'



We have also participated in a variety of activities to intrigue learning interest, including a workshop at Oxfam Interactive Education Centre to understand more about climatic changes, and a seafaring journey hosted by Plastic Free Seas to understand Marine ecology and pollution in Hong Kong. We also invited Mr. Pong Yat Ming (the one in the stripe T-shirt) to discuss some feasible medium-scale government policies to alleviate poverty.



To facilitate our S6 students doing their best in the public exam, we had wonderful teamwork to provide tutorials to polish their exam skills. Some joined Mock Exam organized by Hong Kong Economic Journal held in November 2016. We have invited a 5** achiever, Mr. Eric Tang (the young man in blue pullover) to share with us his tips in both

study and exam preparation.



(4) Support for Student Development




