Woman's Work Book' is never done

At first she was constantly observing. Then, with each succeeding year, she became more and more disturbed. Finally, she decided she could stand it no more. So she took some action.

"People needed a book that leveled with them." said Gonnie Siegel. The issue that concerns Ms. Siegel is equal employment opportunities and conditions for women. Coming as a direct outgrowth of her concern is Ms. Siegel's first book, "Woman's Work Book", coauthored by Karin Abarbanel. Published in the fall. 1975, the book is now in its second printing.

Ms. Siegel, a resident of Bedford, says women are caught in a traditional bind when seeking a job."If you are young, employers think you'll have kids and leave. If you're trying to reenter the market, you're too old," she said.

ONE OF THE ten founders of Westchester-National Organization for Women (NOW), and presently chairwoman of Westchester **Business and Industry Task** Force, Ms. Siegel has had ample opportunity to view job discrimination against women. She says that a great many problems arise from women's attitudes about themselves.

"Expectations are too she emphasized. said Ms. Siegel. "I'm really interested in the

According to Ms. Siegel, the thrust of her book is to explain to women looking for jobs, the reality of the job market coupled with what to do. Leaning forward in her chair, she becomes more in-tense. She says when she addressed women's groups they would become enraged with her. "It was rough for me. It's no fun being the object of hostility. I think of those early feminists and how they persevered.

FREELY CALLING herself a feminist, Ms. Siegel says she has encountered no opposition from her own family. "My husband is very supportive. He doesn't have to prove anything."

She is also very concerned about the housewife who seems endlessly tied to her children. "I don't care how much you love your kids, if your mind is percolating you'll discover there are other thing to do," she said. "Being a housewife is not a job. It's a condition
