Outline Description The architect of the parish church is Gerolamo Cassar. It is believed that the church dates to two different periods: to c.1600 and to c.1660s.

Property Description

Property Function

The facade is a two-towered tiered facade that ends with two-towered belfries. The lower part of the facade, said to be the oldest part, has a series of impost flat Tuscan pilasters that helps divide the entire structure into three bays. The two lateral bays have a rectangular opening for the door that is capped with a round pediment and a life-size niche. On the second tier the architectural program repeats itself however ending with a wide blank entablature. The bay terminates with a square bell tower. The central bay is the focal point for the viewer. It incorporates a balustrade balcony, which is held up by two round columns and two scrolled mensulas. The central bay terminates with a broken aedicule and a Cross.


