Message from Bruno GOZZELINO - WMRA President

First of all I am pleased to report that the WMRA relationship with the IAAF continues to be a solid one. Both IAAF and WMRA are happy that WMRA has brought on board Pierre Weiss as an Honorary WMRA Council Member.

2013 is an exciting time for the WMRA with the new WMRA Constitution approved by the Monegasque Government.

WMRA is grateful to IAAF President, Lamine Diack for dealing with all the necessary documents and especially to Pierre Weiss for his assistance in the process. This new constitution recognises Monaco as the official "home" and headquarters of the WMRA.

It is also a pleasure to report that the IAAF financial grant to WMRA has been increased this year and WMRA grateful expresses Lamine thanks to Diack, IAAF President, Essar Gabriel, General Secretary, Paul Hardy, Competitions Director and Sean Wallace-IAAF Jones, Senior Manager for their full support of **WMRA** activities.

WMRA Treasurer, Nancy Hobbs with agreement of WMRA Council, has introduced a new system for the payment of the WMRA annual

fee. This is another important aspect for improving WMRA activities.

WMRA will continue its strong fight against doping. In a few years there had been three positive cases for medallist athletes in the WMRA World Mountain Running Championships (one) and the EAA European Championships (two) respectively. An important step had been taken by the LOC, FIDAL and IAAF at last years' World championships in Italy where 50 athletes were subject to 'Blood Control' blood testing procedures. In particular a great job had been done by Doctor Giuseppe Fischetto and his staff. The data results from Italy had been collated and the long term tracking of blood levels will be followed by IAAF as the 'biological passport of the athletes'.

This again would take place at the World Championships in Poland this year.

WMRA has prepared a new rule to appear in the IAAF rule book. The proposed rule from the WMRA Council is intended as a guide and incentive to assist countries to further develop Mountain running as well as defining the technical system and organisational requirements for World Mountain Running Championships, Continental and National Championships. WMRA hopes that under IAAF procedures this rule will be given full approval by IAAF during 2013.

Preparations are now underway for the election this year of

WMRA officials, to confirm the actual structure of the Council for the forthcoming years ahead. I would like to thank all the current WMRA Council members plus Adrian Woods, WMRA Consultant, for their strong support.

WMRA once again will be looking to increase sponsorship (thanking Erhan Basoglu) and to work with the LOC's

to increase the prize money available for mountain races, starting with the GP races (with exception of the World Championships race).

WMRA is continually updating statistics on mountain running and increasing coverage activities its Ωf on the WMRA webpage (thanking Tomo Sarf), most recently electronic addition of Newsletters from previous years.

WMRA continues to have good relationships with IAAF, all six Area Continental areas and an increasing number of National Athletic Federations.

Finally, 2012 will be seen as a very positive evaluation of the development of World Mountain running with a record of 40 countries present at the World Championships in Italy, great participation at the Long Distance

Challenge and Masters World Championships but perhaps most importantly was the continued development and success of our young participants at the International Youth Cup.

2013 will see some important WMRA events in the WMRA Calendar with exciting organisational and technical profiles; the World Championships and Long Distance Challenge in Poland, Master Championships in Czech Republic and the International Youth Cup in France are all competitions where WMRA Council members (in particular Galia Puhaleva, Wolfgang Munzel, Tomo Sarf and Pierre Weiss) are involved in supporting and working together with the LOC's and National Athletic Federations to ensure their success!

Looking to the future - the great "challenge" will be to organise the World Championships in 2014 in Africa. This achievement would mean that the World Championships will have been hosted by all five continents: Oceania - New Zealand; Asia - Malaysia, America - Anchorage; Europe – many Countries!

For 2015 and beyond WMRA has received interest from enthusiastic Federations interested in hosting the World Championships and other important WMRA events, so WMRA remains optimistic.



MESSAGE FROM LAMINE DIACK -IAAF PRESIDENT

It gives me great pleasure to write my annual address for the WMRA Newsletter and to look forward to another exciting year of WMRA competition.

With a record 40 nations competing in the 28th edition of the World Mountain Running Championships which took place in 2012 in



With Eritrea and Uganda taking team titles, mixing it with the established squads from the USA and Europe it is clear in the elite divisions of Mountain Running at least that the traditional heartlands no longer dominate the medal table as they once did. That is of course natural in a sport which is developing its appeal so fast globally.

Another significant step in Mountain Running's development seen in Ponte di Legno was the enhanced anti-doping control programme which led to over 50 runners being blood tested. This was the first step in the establishment of biological passports for mountain running's elite competitors.

The host venue for the World Mountain Running Championships will also soon go through a seismic change, when the 2014 World Championships are staged in Obudu, Nigeria, making Africa the fifth continent to host the world event for mountain running.

This year the World Mountain Running Championships moves east, held on Sunday 8 September in the Polish town of Krynica Zdrój. Famous as a spa resort, the town is situated in the mountains of southern Poland at 560-720m above sea level among picturesque valleys which will provide the perfect setting for the championships. I wish all athletes, officials, media and fans associated with this exciting and exhilarating athletics discipline whether at Championship or Grand Prix, international or domestic competition level, a wonderfully successful 2013.

9th World Long Distance Mountain Running Challenge



Jungfrau Marathon, Interlaken, Switzerland 8th – 9th September 2012

The Jungfrau Marathon in Interlaken, Switzerland made a great location for the 9th WMRA World Long Distance Mountain Running Challenge. 6,317 runners finished the 20th edition of the historic event (a record number of participants) and over the entire route a reported 50,000 people watched this unique race. With all of these attributes and when you add in the altitude gain of over 1,829 meters (6,000'), this event is regarded as Europe's toughest mountain marathon.

The weekend's racing was split into two days, with the ladies running on the Saturday and the men on the Sunday, with both undertaking the same route. It was Saturday's women's race which provided the USA with plenty to cheer about, as Stevie Kremer took the World title in 3:22:42, the fastest time for almost 10 years. Though not part of the USA team, Kremer saw some impressive Team US performances which led to team gold, led by Kim Dobson in third place. Individual Silver medal went to Austria's Sabine Reiner.

The 2011 Jungfrau winner Markus Hohenwarter (Austria) took it on in the men's race as the runners hit the mountain and held the lead to win in 2:59:42, with 2011 WLDMRC Champion Mitja Kosovelj (Slovenia) absolutely storming through the field to take silver. Kenya's Hosea Tuei took the bronze with Switzerland winning the team title. Full results on results page of www.wmra.org

11th European Mountain Running Championships



Denizli-Pamukkale, Turkey 7th July 2012



Turkey's Ahmet Arslan took his sixth successive European Mountain Running Championships title on home soil in Denizli-Pamukkale, covering the 12.2km course in 49.46. Arslan, still only 26, remains unbeaten at the event since he made his debut in 2007.

Conditions were hot and the route held on a fast up and down course in the historic Pamukkale heritage site, with around 240m of ascent negotiated on a 4km lap. The men's 3 lap race was held in temperatures above 30 degrees involving an assent of ancient stairs and running through small forests. Ahmet Arslan (TUR) looked majestic as he controlled the race from the front to take the title ahead of team mate Ercan Muslu (TUR). In third place was lonut Alin Zinca (ROU).

Close behind came the Italian team in positions 4th (Gabriele Abate), 5th (Marco De Gasperi) and 7th (Xavier Chevrier)

which proved enough to win the team competition ahead of Turkey (19) and France (48).

The women's race saw a strong start from the team from (GBR) as Mary Wilkinson and Emma Clayton completed the first circuit the fastest. It was the second climb where strongest runners came through and this was Monika Furholz (SUI) who came first, 9 seconds of Nadezhda ahead Leshchinskaia (RUS) with

Pavla Schorna Matyasova (CZE) 4 seconds behind. The winners of the team award were Great Britain with 20 points as Italy just headed Russia with the same points.

The Junior Men's race saw another dominant display by Turkey with Individual Gold and Silver going to Ahmet Ozrek (TUR) and Mazlum Aydemir (TUR). Anton Palzer (GER) took bronze medal.

Mazlum Aydemir was later disqualified which saw Anton Palzer (GER) move into the Silver medal positon and Vitaly Lagushin (RUS) into Bronze. Team awards saw Turkey again take the Gold medal ahead of Russia and the Czech Republic. The Junior Women's was dominated by Annabel Mason (GBR). Eytemis (TUR) took Silver with Cesminaz Yilmaz (TUR) winning the bronze medal. The team event saw 5 points for both GBR and TUR with Turkey taking the title as the last

runner was in position 3rd ahead of the GBR runner Melanie Hyder in 4th. Bulgaria took the bronze team medals.

At the closing ceremony Memhet Terzi, President Turkish **Athletics** of Federation, through Milz. Christian EΑ General Director, passed the EA flag to Dobromir Karamarinov, Bulgarian Athletics Federation who will host the event in 2013.












































28th World Mountain Running Championships

Temù - Ponte di Legno / Tonale (Valle Camonica), Italy 2nd September 2012



A record 40 nations competed in the 28th World Mountain Running Championships 2012 in Ponte di Legno, Italy with eleven nations earning medals in the four events.

The LOC from the Italian villages of Temu, Tonale and Ponte di Legno were impressive with their quality of course and hospitality. This was the seventh time that World Mountain Running Championships were held in Italy.

In the men's race Perto Mamo, along with team mate Azeria Teklay and Russia's Andrey Safronov, quickly established an early lead as the race emerged from the town of Ponte di Legno and started on the mountain ascent. From here on Mamo took command and extended his lead to finish,

winning in 1:01:34 a full 73 seconds ahead of Teklay, with Safronov claiming an excellent bronze in 1:03:06. The Eritreans also took team gold.

Andrea Mayr, Austrian winner of the 2010 world title and WMRA Grand Prix prevailed to win the women's race in 46:35, almost 30 seconds up on Italy's Valentina Belotti who took the silver, with the US' Morgan Aritola taking the bronze and leading the USA team to a

glorious victory in the team race. The USA team were the strongest team taking gold with 3 athletes in the top 10. Second place went to Italy with Switzerland in third.

The Junior Men's race saw a strong performance from Uganda's Michael Cherop who was chased all the way by Adem Karagoz (TUR). The bronze medal went to Sommez Dag (TUR) just 10 seconds ahead of Moses Kurong (UGA). The team race was won by Uganda with second place going to Turkey and Italy third.

The leader of the Junior Women's race, Sevilay Eytemis (TUR) held on for a 39-second victory from a fast finishing Julia Lettl (GER) with 2011 champion Lea Einfalt (SLO) taking the

bronze medal ahead of 2012 European champion Annabel Mason (GB).

expected the team competition was very close between Great Britain and Turkev. with the gold medals going to Turkey (9), one point ahead of the British team. Germany took the bronze team medal.



7th WMRA International Youth Cup

Glendalough, Ireland 24th June 2012

The 7th staging of the WMRA International Youth Cup was held in Glendalough Ireland, the course set against a backdrop of the Upper Lake . This was the first occasion that Ireland had hosted a major international mountain running event and it represented a further stage in the development of mountain running for this younger age group (16-17 year olds).

Nine countries entered the competition with Ireland, Russia, and Wales fielding two boys' teams and Ireland and Russia entering two girls' teams.

Over breakfast on Sunday, the sun emerged and with it a day of fine weather for the runners and spectators.

The girls had a short run-in of 110 metres followed by two laps of 1660m each for a total distance of 3540m with 190 metres of ascent. At the end of the first lap Ksenia Makhneva (RUS) led by around 10 metres from Sarah Hodgson (ENG) and Clare McCarthy (IRE). Caitriona Graves (SCO) was in fourth followed by Sara Jesenko (SLO), Chiara Spagnoli (ITA), Alina Subbotina (RUS B), and Weronika Pyzik (POL). The pace was fast and was likely to bring the steepish climb into play on the last lap for anyone who started too fast. Emerging into the finishing run-in Pyzik had moved through from eight into the lead with Hodgson and Makhneva on her heels. Despite a fierce battle up the home straight Pyzik held on for a narrow win from Hodgson with Makhneva two seconds behind the winner.

With the calculations done the host country had won by eight points from Italy (37) and Russia (37).

The boys' race had three laps covering a total of 5200 metres. The 2011 silver medallist Konstantin Galiullin (RUS) was the favourite but in this age group there are many unknown athletes in the shadows. Six runners were bunched together at the end of the first lap with Galiullin leading from Nadir Cavagna (ITA), Yemanebehran Crippa (ITA), Gwynant Jones (WAL), Patryk Lachowski (POL), and Andrew Lawler (SCO). The first Irish runner Killian Mooney was ten metres back after recovering quickly from a fall on the first lap. At the end of lap two, the race was down to two runners as Crippa and Galiullin had gone clear and were still looking like they had kept something for the last lap. James Hall (ENG) had worked his way through from ninth to third, ahead of Cavagna, and ominously the third Italian runner, Danilo Gritti, had moved through from tenth to fifth. The places remained largely unchanged on the final lap except for Crippa opening a clear winning margin of 21 seconds from Galiullin and Cavagna.

The Italian runners were convincing winners of the team title with an exceptionally strong performance.



12th WMRA/WMA Masters World Mountain Running Championships

Bühlertal, Germany 19th May 2012



1018 runners completed the 12th WMRA/WMA World Master Mountain Running Championships in Germany. This was the first time that more than one thousand runners have arrived at the finish line in this Competition. This record of runners with 802 men and 216 women signified the great success of this event organized by LOC of Buhlertal.

In the male categories Aurelio Moscato (ITA - M60), Leonid Tikhonov (RUS - M55), Claudio Amati (ITA - M50) retained the world titles won last year in Italy, new champions were Andrea Unterkircher (AUT - M75), Peter Lessing (GER - M70), Albert Anderegg (SUI - M65), Stefan Hinze (GER - M45), Carsten Brod (GER - M40), Matthias Hecktor (GER - M35).

In the female categories Maria Marcibalova (SVK - W75), Lilo Charlotte Plener (GER - W65), Blanka Paulu (CZE - W55), Marie-Luise Heilig-Duventaster (GER - W50), retained the world title won last year in Italy and Ivana Sekyrova (CZE - W40) last year's winner in W35 this year won the W40. Ingrid Hoffmann (GER - W70), Annamaria Galbani (ITA - W60), Josefa Mathies (GER - W45) and Julia Brod (GER -W35) were the new champions this year.

The total medals won by Germany were 43 (20 gold, 13 silver and 10 bronze); in second position was Italy with a total of 20 medals (4 gold, 11 silver and 5 bronze), third was the Czech Republic with 5 medals (2 gold and 3 bronze).






9th NACAC (North American) Mountain Running Championships

Runners from five South American Countries MEN competed at the 7th CONSUDATLE Mountain Running Championships at Canon of Chicamocha in Aratoca, Santader Region Athletes from Argentina, of Columbia. Brazil, Ecuador, Venezuela and host Country Colombia were present.

The Senior Men's race winner was Colombian, Jacinto Lopez (46.39), one minute in front of John Jairo Vargas, also from Colombia (47.38), whilst bronze medalist was Venezuelan athlete, Pedro Puentes (50.03).

4th African Mountain Running Championships

(8th Obudu Ranch International Mountain Race)
Obudu Ranch Park, Cross River State, Nigeria
26th November 2012

Ethiopian runners took 4 gold medals plus 1 silver and 2 bronze medals at the 4th African Mountain Running Championships held in conjunction with the 8th Obudu Ranch International Mountain Race, Cross River State, Nigeria. Uganda won 2 silver medals, one individual and one team in the men's race and Nigeria a silver medal in the women team Championships and one bronze medal for the men's team.

Abebe Dinkesa in the Men's race and Etenesh Diro Neda in the Women's race won the title of African Champion and also the 8th Obudu International mountain race, receiving 50.000,00 USD for their victories. Ethiopian winners of the 2011 race, Mesfin Hunegnaewai in the Men's and Yalew Genet in the Women's both failed to finish this year's race.

Abebe Dinkesa won the race for the third time in 1hour 1 minute and 58 seconds after an exciting battle with Kenyan Ondara MacDonard and at the finish the gap between these two runners was only 30 seconds. Third place in the race was Kenyan Robert Chemosin in 1.03:24.

Etenesh Diro Neda was a clear winner of the Women's race in a time of 1hour and 3 seconds, in front a group of Kenyan runners formed by Rita Jeptoo Bisuenei, second with a time of 1.02:45, and Paskalia Kipoech third in 1.04:02.

The new track for the 12.6 km race had been well prepared under direction of WMRA Council member Erhan Basoglu, with his staff formed by Babac Hasan (Member of EA Mountain Running Commission), Erkan Sakarya and Osman Akyuz and by 80 Nigerian workers.

4th Balkan Mountain Running Championships

Nova Zagora, Bulgaria 7th June 2012

Turkey dominated the 4th Balkan Mountain Running Championships 2012 held in Nova Zagora, Bulgaria with 12 medals. There were 7 gold, 2 silver and 3 bronze medals won by Turkish runners with Gold medals in all four team categories and three individual titles!

Romania took the only one gold medal lost by Turkey and in total Romania was the second nation in the medal table with 6 medals in total. Host Country Bulgaria also celebrated with 6 medals: 5 silver and 1 bronze. Seven Balkan Countries were present at the event: Turkey, Romania, Bulgaria, Albania, FYR of Macedonia, Serbia and Greece sent their runners to the competition. It was the first time for Albania to take part in Balkan Mountain Running championships.

In the Senior Men's race Turkish runner Mehmet Akkoyun won the title of Balkan Mountain Running Champion 2012 ahead of

Bulgarian Nikolov Kiril and bronze medal winner Ercan Muslu also of Turkey.

In the Senior Women's race, Romanian Denisa Ionela Dragomir became Balkan Mountain Running Champion 2012 in front of Turkish runners Yasemin Can and Yagmur Tarhan. Runners from three different Countries won medals in the Junior Women's race: gold for Cesminaz Yilmaz Turkey, silver for Mircheva Militca Bulgaria and bronze for Rus Rebecca Romania.

Turkey totally dominated the Junior Men's race with their four athletes taking the top four positions. Suat Karabulak won the title of Balkan Mountain Running Champion 2012, Serkan Demir got the silver medal and the bronze went to Ozan Iskey one minute behind.









