RESOLUTIONS

adopted by the ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL during its resumed twentieth session from 5 to 15 December 1955

592 (XX). International machinery for trade co-operation

The Economic and Social Council,

Having in mind the efforts already made and measures undertaken as well as those projected for the establishment of international machinery for assisting in the expansion of world trade,

Considering the increasing need and wide-spread desire for having international machinery, within the framework of the United Nations, to facilitate the development of international trade,

Requests the Secretary-General to prepare a report on international procedures and bodies concerned with the development of trade co-operation and to transmit it to Member States by 30 April 1956 or as soon as possible thereafter.

593 (XX). Report of the Economic Commission for Latin America (sixth session)

The Economic and Social Council

1. Takes note of the report of the Economic Commission for Latin America (sixth session);¹

2. Considers that the work programme of the Commission as established at the sixth session² held at Bogotá, Colombia, from 29 August to 16 September 1955, is of primary importance for the economic development of Latin America;

3. *Endorses* the priorities allocated by the Commission to the individual work projects.

594 (XX). Question of the admission of new members to the Economic Commission for Europe

The Economic and Social Council,

Considering that the Federal Republic of Germany is a member of various specialized agencies of the United Nations,

Considering that the presence of the Federal Republic of Germany in the Economic Commission for Europe would further the unity of purpose of that Commission, 1. Decides to amend paragraph 7 of the terms of reference of the Economic Commission for Europe³ to include the Federal Republic of Germany as a member of the Commission, provided that the said State applies for such membership and agrees to contribute annually such equitable amounts as the General Assembly shall assess from time to time in accordance with procedures established by the General Assembly in similar cases;

2. *Requests* the Secretary-General to undertake such consultations and further steps as may be required to obtain the agreement of the Federal Republic of Germany and the General Assembly to the inclusion of the contributions of the said State in the United Nations budget.

595 (XX). Question of the terms of reference of the Economic, Employment and Development Commission

The Economic and Social Council,

Recalling its decision at the thirteenth session to discontinue the Economic, Employment and Development Commission until 31 December 1954,⁴ and its subsequent decision at the eighteenth session by which the Secretary-General was requested to submit a report bearing on the question of the terms of reference of the Commission,⁵

Having noted the report of the Secretary-General,6

Bearing in mind its resolution 557 (XVIII) on the organization and operation of the Council and its commissions,

Believing that while the Commission has done valuable work in the past, its functions are at present adequately performed by the Council itself with the assistance of the Secretariat and, under the supervision of the Council, by the Council's committees, regional commissions and other subsidiary organs or ad hoc bodies established by the Council,

Decides not to reactivate the Commission at present.

Question of the celebration of the tenth anniversary of the Council

At its 895th meeting, on 6 December 1956, the Council decided that the tenth anniversary of the Council should be celebrated at the twenty-second session. In that connexion, the Secretariat was requested to devote special attention, in some of the important documents relating to the world economic situation and the development and co-ordination of the economic, social and human rights programmes and activities of the United Nations and the specialized agencies, to developments over the last ten years. The Secretary-General was also requested to consider the possibility of issuing a bro-chure which would mark the occasion and bring the work of the Council to the attention of the public. It was understood that these decisions of the Council should not involve any additional expenditure or any lengthening of the twenty-second session.

Basic programme of the Council for 1956

At its 898th meeting, on 8 December 1955, the Council worked out its basic programme for 1956 and considered the provisional agenda for its twenty-first session drawn up by the Secretary-General.* The Council decided to request the Secretariat, after consultation with members of the Council and specialized agencies, to establish the dates for opening debate on items allocated to the twenty-first session.
