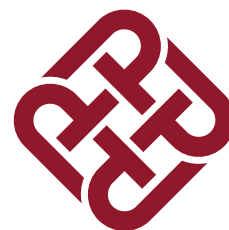

## Message from the Chief Editor (Bosco Lau 劉若山)

2017 is a significant year for us. It is not only the year when we celebrate 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, it also marks the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our PolyU (Australia) Association.

Our Association was inaugurated in Sydney back in 2012, with the presence of PolyU's former president, Prof. Poon Chung-kwong. Since then Prof. Poon had visited Australia 4 more times until his formal retirement from the PolyU. The new and current President of PolyU, Prof. Timothy Tong has also paid 5 visits to Australia since 2009. Besides the two Presidents, many other senior members of the PolyU had visited us on various occasions, they include Vice Presidents, staff of the PolyU Alumni Affairs & Development Office (AADO) and others. Numerous alumni members of our Association had also visited the PolyU and attended activities such as the PolyU 70<sup>th</sup> and 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration events, Homecoming Carnivals, Greening Hong Kong by PolyU Alumni events and Open Days for new buildings established at the PolyU campus. I, for example, have visited the PolyU at least once a year since 2003.

Besides these visits, our close ties with the PolyU can also be seen through:

- 1) Sponsorship of a tree, one chair and name plates [our Association has sponsored a tree - The Golden-leaves Fig Tree (黃金榕), a chair at the PolyU's Jockey Club Auditorium and several name plates]
- 2) Donations from several alumni individuals through auctions, sponsorship of name plates and offer of scholarships
- 3) Coordination of social and site visits by various study groups from the PolyU, including MBA Study Groups, a study group from the Department of Applied Social Science, etc.
- 4) Communication with PolyU students who are in Australia on exchange student programme or temporary work placement (e.g. answering their queries and inviting them to attend our activities)
- 5) Participation in PolyU Global Alumni Leaders Forums by some of our members.
- 6) Establishing links with other overseas alumni associations of the PolyU, e.g. I have met some alumni of the PolyU Singapore Association a few times during my trips to Singapore, Pauline Tsang's Sydney visit when she was President of the PolyU Eastern Canada Association, etc.



In Sydney our Association also works closely with the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office Sydney and we encourage our members to support their organised activities. On two occasions - the dupliCITY (映双城) Exhibition – a photo exhibition by Polytechnic Design graduate Alex Ma (馬耀平) in 2012 and the “Chinese Painting with Love” artwork exhibition by Cammy Chan (陳少琼) in 2017 were both organised by our Association with the exhibitions held at Hong Kong House, a venue provided by HKETO.

I feel proud to be an active and supportive member of our Association. I am one of the longest-serving committee members of the Association - a committee member since its inauguration in 2002 and once the President of the Association from 2003 to 2007. Our Association is well respected in the community, some of the reasons being:

- 1) A good number of our members are community leaders representing associations ranging from social groups, aged care/special care/charity groups, alumni associations of other universities, etc.; many local alumni are active in supporting community affairs.
- 2) Support on fund raising to aid victims of natural disasters and charity organisations [with the generous support of our alumni and their friends we had successfully raised funds to help victims of Boxing Day tsunami, Sichuan earthquake and Victoria bush fire, and made donations to RIDCB (Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children), CPA (Chinese Parents Association – Children with Disabilities) and DAPA (Differently Abled People Association), etc.].

Our Association had held various functions in the past. Alumni events held in Sydney include annual general meetings with dinner, Chinese New Year dinners, social lunches/dinners, one-day outing tours, tours to Melbourne, special fund-raising events, health seminars, etc. Our Melbourne alumni also hold annual dinners, yum-cha lunches and outing events from time to time. Since 2011 I had also travelled to Brisbane about once or twice a year and had been to Perth twice. During these trips I often took the chance to meet up local alumni there and communicate with them on PolyU and Association affairs.

From 2016, active members of the alumni associations of “4U” – HKU, CHUK, PolyU and HKBU are met every quarter in Sydney, with gatherings organised by the respective alumni associations in turn. During these gatherings like yum-cha, we often have special guest speakers talking on specific topics, and we communicate about affairs happened in Hong Kong and Australia. We have also supported specific functions run by other alumni associations, e.g. visits to Australia by the Vice-Chancellor of CUHK and the President of HKBU. We had run some sport events jointly, and in August 2007 we held a joint dinner to farewell Mrs. Jenny Wallis, who was about to retire from her job as Director of the HKETO at the time.

This year (2017) we have alumni from Sydney and Melbourne travelling to Hong Kong in late November/early December to attend the PolyU 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration events including the gala dinner on December 7. Prior to that we will be celebrating the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our Association with alumni dinners organised in both Sydney and Melbourne in October.

To summarise our Association is proud to have been running for 15 years to-date connecting PolyU alumni living in Australia with the PolyU and related parties, and have also been able to make contributions to the PolyU and some charities of good causes. We will continue to do that and grow our alumni network in the future.



# Introducing Our Australia Association

理大澳洲員生會之誕生 (二〇〇二年六月)

陳潔民 (已故)

在二零零零年的十一月，畢業了四十年的機械和生產工程系的同學，自美、加、澳洲返港，回母校共同慶祝畢業四十週年，被邀請出席十二月八日舉行的校友離校銀禧紀念晚宴。席間校長潘宗光教授鑑於旅居澳洲員生數日不斷增長，建議籌備成立理大澳洲員生會，目的是讓居於澳洲的校友和前教職員，能與母校繼續保持聯繫和加強兩地溝通。

在二零零一年的三月，五位校友在前理工會計系教職員周秀霞女士引導下，初次在悉尼一酒樓會面，組成了一個六人籌備工作小組。小組成員包括有周秀霞、(61年)生產工程系陳潔民、(73年)紡織系張國華、(81年)電腦資訊系蔡慧薇和電子工程系周伯漢及(97年)土木工程系施培坤等人。在同年八月，通過成立[香港理工大學澳洲員生會籌備委員會]，邀得其他前理大師生加盟。參與工作小組成員，亦增添至十五人，包括有前理工應用物理系主任 Dr. Charles Martens 及理大中文及雙語學系講師張繼沛，並推選了周秀霞和吳步雲為籌委會正副主席。

整整的一年裡，籌備工作小組不斷努力，聯絡已分散澳洲各地之員生，起草會章，收集和整理員生的資料，建立互聯網頁等事務。在二零零二年一月廿三日，終於成功在澳洲新南威爾斯省註冊為一非牟利社團組織。繼加拿大(東西)兩岸之後，成為理大海外之第三個員生會。適逢今年是香港理工大學建校六十五週年的大日子，澳洲員生會的誕生，剛好是這羣旅居澳洲之員生，對母校一個特別的賀禮。

在二零零二年裡，理大舉辦了一連串之紀念活動，籌委會委託留港的員生，代表出席三月十五日之理大建校六十五週年紀念活動開幕，及三月十七日在香港舉行之理大校友嘉年華會。代表亦同時參與該日理大海外員生會主辦之攤位，介紹本會之成立及為理大澳洲員生會招收會員，更協助加拿大(東岸)員生會為母校義賣籌款。三月十九日，理大校長在李嘉誠樓設宴招待，並介紹其辦公室內之設施及一同與海外員生會代表拍照留念。在本會代表留港期間，理大校友事務及拓展處處長及該處全人，曾給與本會多方面協助，更為澳洲員生會設計及訂製了一面美麗而兼有代表性的旗幟，員生會全人專此致以衷心感謝。

五月五日，是剛誕生了的理大澳洲員生會一個重要的日子，為了應付[第一次週年大會]這個日子的來臨，籌備委員會工作小組早在年初即開始分配工作，包括尋找適當聚會地點、佈置場所、派發開會宣傳、準備茶點、編印出席會員名牌及員生登記表格、徵收會費等事項。全體義務工作小組，不畏疲勞，日以繼夜協助處理會務，深表欽佩。籌備委員會主席更親手造了個非常美麗的意見箱，收集出席員生的意見。

週年大會當天，籌備委員會工作小組，很早便到會場佈置，更有籌委會員攜眷出席，幫助佈置場地、煲茶燒水、分配座椅、招待嘉賓、及為大會拍攝等。值得陳述的是當日出席大會之員生與家屬，非常踴躍，比預先估計人數還多，員生皆來自悉尼各區，而且全數即時申請成為會員，其中五份之一員生，更申請為永久會員。目前會員有來自其他省份，包括有西澳、維多利亞及昆士蘭省。

當天，推選了第一屆會長周秀霞、副會長吳步雲、秘書盧紀維、財務陳潔民、會籍幹事周伯漢、資訊事務幹事蔡慧薇、編輯及公關幹事劉若山、特別事務幹事李曉民、康樂幹事邱玉蓮等及顧問 Dr. Charles Martens 等人。

會長簡報了理大澳洲員生會成立之經過，亦致詞歡迎出席之嘉賓及當選之幹事。同時宣報已恭請了理大校長和校友事務及拓展處處長，於二零零二年十月十二日，到悉尼主持理大澳洲員生會成立典禮及邀請了加拿大(東西)兩岸會長，出席這次慶典。典禮之安排及詳細情形，將會另行通知，歡迎各地員生，踴躍參加，出席這次盛會。

今次員生會之能夠在短短的十個月內順利誕生，除了有賴各籌委會會員通力合作外，更獲母校全人在精神及財政上鼎力支持和鼓勵，終於趕得及在母校建校六十五週年裡，成功在澳洲註冊，成為全球香港理工大學第三所海外員生會。值得一提會長周秀霞女士，在籌備成立員生會期間，處處表現出其卓越之領導才能。之前，周會長已曾在澳洲曾當過其他香港大學校友會之籌備工作，經驗豐富。今次當選為會長，實屬眾望所歸。員生會亦獲校友羅堅律師加盟，擔當榮譽法律顧問。亦獲遠在維省投身於會計及公司秘書之劉淑嫻女士相助，兩位在員生會草擬會章過程中，提供過不少之專業知識和法律程序。張繼沛亦為員生會贊寫過不少中文宣傳稿件，中文網頁版，及處理所有中文文書。Dr. Martens 學識廣博，具豐富的工作組織經驗，在參與籌備工作過程中，亦提供過不少寶貴意見，解答會章內之難題，並協助書寫英文稿件及來往書信。其餘籌委會內之校友，均各展所長，分工合作，不畏勞苦與艱辛，收集和整理員生資料，建立互聯網頁及員生資料庫等事項。他們一顆熱誠參與之精神，為理大澳洲員生會奠下日後發展的基礎。

## Current and Past Presidents of the Association

**Jeffery TSE JP (謝志輝) - President (2015-2017)**

當中學畢業後，我在政府部門做文員，有安定的條件下當然日間工作，晚上讀書。我哥哥提議我讀「土木工程」因建築行業是長期有的，就此開始我七年的工業學院課程。在政府工作，只要你肯增長自己的學歷，自然一步一步提升自己的職位。所以當時我由文員晉升到建築署的技術員，工作與學習更加配合，我最後學的是「結構工程」。但當時完成的只是「Higher Certificate」，但兩年後「理工學院」提升為「理工大學」，我也收到由理工大學給我的提升成真的「Degree」。

可是，我曾試再想向上考做「工程師」，但我的喜好是電腦，始終沒有考取工程師試。反而再度從新到澳洲讀電腦，用一年半時間取得一個 Computer Science 碩士學位。從此，我轉行做電腦主管。在這些年頭，輾轉亦轉過多份工作，由管理人轉成銷售員，以前人人看我的面口，轉變後便要滿足客戶需求，感覺不好受；因為這大改變，我對人的態度亦改善。從而使我找到做人真正意義。



我像大多數的移民一樣，為了兒子的未來，貿然放棄香港的事業，進入這個陌生的國家。當時初到澳洲，找工作非常困難。後來找到一份在龍寶山賣福地的工作，生活較為穩定。職業需要，便接觸到老人中心。我發覺很多老人，要的不是「風光大葬」，而要的是在有生之年，能「快快樂樂」地過得有意義便滿足了。就因這樣，我決定為社群做一點有意義的事。有太太和兒子支持下，積極做義工，我的家庭因此變得更和諧。我抱著這精神，為不同的社團工作，至今我仍然繼續幫「照顧者」，「長者」，「殘障者」，當然理工大學所有員生。我常常覺得自己是一隻「螢火蟲」，將一點點的光帶到每一個角落。令到人人也有正面態度，生活得更有意義，更加快樂。

## Hugh LEE OAM, JP (李曉民) - President (2013-2015)

八月份我於葉坪會所 (Epping Club) 舉行了七十歲生日慶祝晚宴，是夜承蒙各政商和社區朋友及親人等二百多位嘉賓撥冗光臨，使我萬分感動。正所謂「酒債尋常行處有，人生七十古來稀」，所以我打算待太太年底退休後，亦減少前線社區工作，退居幕後，趁身體狀態尚可，將會安排多些時間出國旅遊，享受人生。

回想二十七年前剛移民澳洲之際，初來乍到，尋工不易，沒辦法之下唯有留下兩名兒子於此讀書，自己則返回香港打拼攢錢，直到居留簽證不能再續便決定返回澳洲，從此落地生根，時維一九九七年。

居澳初年無所事事，空閒時便到依士活高齡會當義工，歷任秘書、副會長及會長等職位至今，亦算是為香港移民作出了一些貢獻。因為高齡會會員眾多，故區內的懷德醫院邀請我加入病人權益諮詢會，及後再加入新州多元文化醫療服務委員會及聯邦政府之醫療服務委員會，於此對澳洲之醫療服務水平加深認識，不禁引以自豪。

居澳期間我也曾與兩位教友投資開設餐館，可惜短短三個月便虧蝕了大部分積蓄。朋友們的馬後砲建議是不熟不做。牧師說：「你們在教會都是天使，但在現實金錢世界中便變成魔鬼了」。

說到底都還是擔任義務工作較好，因為沒有多大的利害衝突，大家能互助互勵，發揮所長，為同一社團謀福利，滿足感油然而生。故此我於十五年前參與成立理工大學澳洲員生會，並曾於 2013-2015 年度擔任會長。

在這裏沒工資的工作不愁找不到，最近十年我便參與了以下團體的義務工作：

## **Dr. CHOW Sau-har, Sarah (周秀霞) - President (2002-03), Founding President and Hon. President**

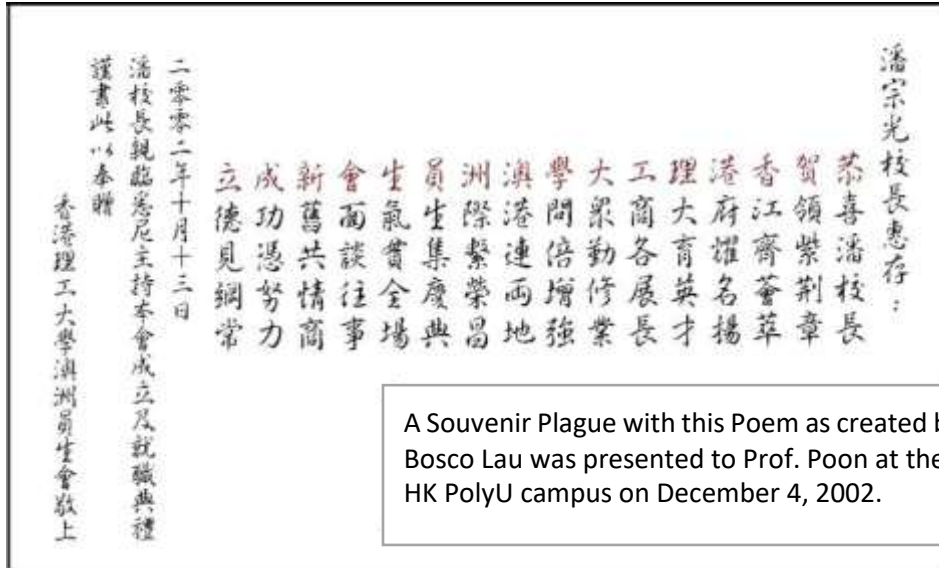

Here we take a look at the Changing Times of our University dated back to 80 years ago when Hong Kong established its first ever technical school – the Government Trade School in Wanchai



**1937** - Founding of the Government Trade School in Wanchai, the first government-funded, post-secondary technical institution in Hong Kong



**1947** -The School was renamed the Hong Kong Technical College after World War II

**1957** -The Hong Kong Technical College moved to its new premises in Hung Hom



**1972** -The Hong Kong Polytechnic was formally established

**1994** - The Institution assumed full university status, with its name changed to The Hong Kong Polytechnic University





**1997** - Introduced the “Preferred Graduate” Development Programme to encourage students to gain workplace exposure



**1997** - The first mainland training outpost established in Hangzhou, Zhejiang to gain workplace



**1999** - Establishment of the School of Professional Education and Executive Development (SPEED) to foster lifelong education



**2000** - Inauguration of the Institute for Enterprise (IfE) to provide professional services for business and industry



**2001** - Set up Hong Kong Community College to offer an expanded range of Associate Degree programmes

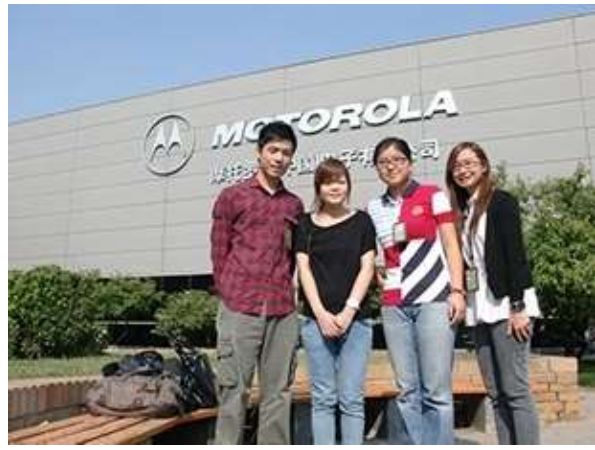


**2004** - First local tertiary institution to set foot in the National University Science and Technology Park of the Virtual University Park in Shenzhen





**2005** - First State Key Laboratory for Chinese Medicine and Molecular Pharmacology



**2005** - Full-time undergraduate students are required to complete the mandatory Work-Integrated Education



**2006** - Collaborative agreement with the Lunar Exploration Programme Centre of China National Space Administration in support of the lunar exploration projects

**2010** - Collaborative agreement with the China Academy of Space Technology to establish a Joint Laboratory in Precision Engineering for Space Applications



**2011** - Sichuan University – The Hong Kong Polytechnic University Institute for Disaster Management and Reconstruction



**2011** - Hotel ICON (唯港薈), a teaching and research hotel wholly-owned by PolyU was officially opened





**2012** - Partnership with Boeing Company to establish Hong Kong's first Aviation Services Research Centre



**2012** - With the launch of the four-year university curriculum in Hong Kong, PolyU has been the first local university requiring all undergraduate students to complete a credit-bearing Service-Learning subject



**2013** - Established the Research Institute for Sustainable Urban Development



**2014** - Official opening of the Jockey Club Innovation Tower (創新樓)



**2015** - Two Hong Kong Branches of Chinese National Engineering Research Centres were set up at PolyU to develop technologies in rail engineering and steel construction



**2016** - Hong Kong's first University-Government-Industry Consortium for Sustainable Urban Development



**2016** - PolyU continues to deliver more than 160 programmes renowned for their diversity and professionalism

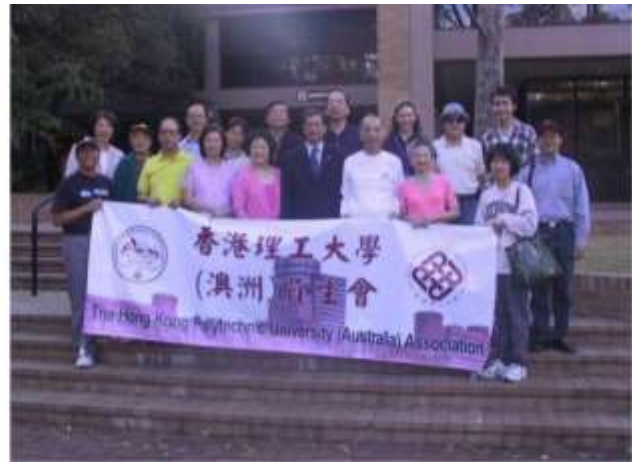

|    | <p><b>1937 (13/12/1937) – Nanking Massacre</b></p> <p>The <b>Nanking Massacre</b> was an episode of mass murder and mass rape committed by Japanese troops against the residents of Nanjing (then spelled Nanking), then the capital of the Republic of China during the Second Sino-Japanese War. The massacre occurred over a period of six weeks starting on December 13, 1937, the no. of deaths was estimated to be 40,000 to 300,000.</p>   |
|   | <p><b>1947 (19/07/1947) – Aung San</b></p> <p>Bogyoke (Major General) <b>Aung San</b> (昂山) was assassinated on July 19, 1947 at age 32. Aung San served as the 5th Premier of the British Crown Colony of Burma from 1946 to 1947. Initially he was a communist and later a social democratic politician. He was known as a revolutionary, nationalist, and as the founder of the Tatmadaw, and is considered the Father of the Nation of modern-day Myanmar. He is the father of Aung San Suu Kyi (昂山素姬), a Nobel Peace Prize winner and currently a State Counsellor of Myanmar and Leader of the National League for Democracy.</p>  |
|  | <p><b>1957 (08/02/1957) - John von Neumann</b></p> <p><b>John von Nuemann</b> (died on February 8, 1957 at age 53) was a Hungarian-American mathematician, physicist, inventor, computer scientist, and polymath. He made major contributions to a number of fields, including mathematics (functional analysis, ergodic theory, geometry, topology and numerical analysis), physics (quantum mechanics, hydrodynamics, and quantum statistical mechanics), economics (game theory), computing (Von Neumann architecture, linear programming and self-replication) and statistics. His theories had significant impact to later computer design and DNA study.</p>  |
|  | <p><b>1967 (25/08 &amp; 27/08/1967) - Lam Bun and Brian Epstein</b></p> <p><b>Lam Bun</b> (林彬) was a radio commentator at Commercial Radio Hong Kong who was fiercely critical of leftists. He was assassinated on August 25, 1967 at age 37 during the Hong Kong 1967 riots, becoming an icon of freedom of speech in Hong Kong. He was burnt alive to his death. A leftist group was reported to have claimed responsibility for the assassination but no one was ever arrested.</p> <p><b>Brian Epstein</b> was the Manager of The Beatles until his death on August 27, 1967. Brian was instrumental in helping the world's best-selling pop band secure a record contract and catapulting them to international superstardom in the early 1960s. A heavy gambler, secret homosexual and drug user, Brian died of an accidental drug overdose on at the age of just 32.</p> |

He died at age 88.</p> <p><b>Liberace</b> (born Władziu Valentino Liberace) was an American pianist, singer and actor. In his popular years he was the highest-paid entertainer in the world. He died of AID-related disease at age 67.</p>  |

He was the paramount leader of the People's Republic of China from 1978 to 1989. He was responsible for economic reforms and an opening to the global economy, making him one of the most influential world leaders in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. He died at age 92.</p> <p><b>Princess Diana</b> (born Dianna Frances Spencer) was the first wife of Charles, Prince of Wales, Diana remained the object of worldwide media scrutiny during and after her marriage, which ended in divorce in August 1996. Media attention and public mourning were extensive after her death in a car crash in Paris on August 31, 1997 and subsequent televised funeral. She died at age 36.</p> <p><b>01/07/1997 - The transfer of sovereignty over Hong Kong from the United Kingdom to the People Republic of China.</b></p> |
|    | <p><b>2007 (27/12/2007) - Benazir Bhutto</b></p> <p><b>Benazir Bhutto</b> was the 11<sup>th</sup> Prime Minister of Pakistan and the leader of the centre-left Pakistan Peoples Party. She was the first woman to head a Muslim majority nation. While she has been celebrated as a triumph for women in the Muslim world and for fighting against Islamic extremism, she is accused of corruption and bad governance. She was assassinated in December 2007 at age 54.</p>  |
|    | <p><b>2017 (20/01/2017) - Donald Trump</b></p> <p>Donald Trump was inaugurated as the 45<sup>th</sup> President of the United States on January 20, 2017. Donald is also a businessman, television personality and politician. He is regarded as the most controversial American president in history because he had made a lot of infamous remarks about women, Muslims and illegal immigrants, etc.</p>  |

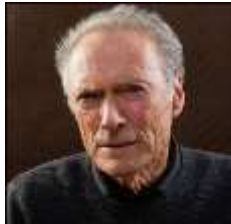

| Sidney Poitier<br>KBE (20/02/1927)   | 90  | The first Bahamian and African-American to win an Academy Award for Best Actor ( <i>Lilies of the Field</i> ), best known for his role in <i>To Sir, With Love</i> .   |
| Harry Belafonte<br>(01/03/1927)  | 90  | An American singer, songwriter, actor, and social activist, one of the most successful African-American pop stars in history and the "King of Calypso". His album <i>Calypso</i> (1956) is the first million-selling LP by a single artist   |
| Fats Domino<br>(26/02/1928)  | 89  | An American pianist and singer songwriter. 5 of his records released before 1955 sold over a million copies and he had 35 records in the US Top 40. His best-known song is the 1956 <i>Blueberry Hill</i> .  |
| Burt Bacharach<br>(12/05/1928)   | 89  | An American composer, songwriter, record producer, pianist, and singer. A six-time Grammy Award winner and three-time Academy Award winner, Burt partnered with Hal David won numerous composer awards.  |

| Berry Gordy Jr.<br>(28/11/1929)  | 87  | An American record producer and songwriter. He is best-known as the founder of the Motown record label and its subsidiaries. | Morgan Freeman<br>(01/06/1937)   | 80 | An American actor, producer and narrator. Won a Academy Award as Best Supporting Actor in <i>Million Dollar Baby</i> and appeared in many box office hits including <i>Glory</i> , <i>Seven</i> , <i>The Dark Knight</i> , <i>Wanted</i> and <i>RED</i> .  |
| Dustin Hoffman<br>(08/08/1937)   | 80 | An American actor and a director, with a career in film, television, and theatre since 1960. Dustin has been known for his versatile portrayals of antiheroes and vulnerable characters. In 1967 his acting in <i>The Graduate</i> brought him to fame. He won the Academy Award for Best Actor in twice for <i>Kramer vs. Kramer</i> (1980) and <i>Rain Man</i> (1989). |

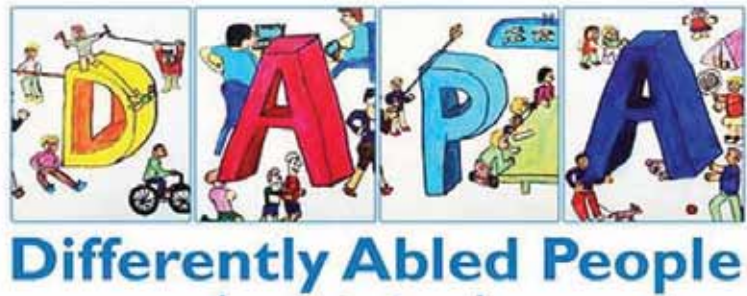
Besides international artists, we do have a number of famous Hong Kong artists who have had very successful acting, singing and producing careers and some of them are even active today.
