UN warns on reprisals

Evacuation of Aleppo at risk amid clashes

ALEPPO, Syria, Dec 14, (Agencies): Shelling and air strikes sent terrified residents running through the streets of Aleppo on Wednesday as a deal to evacuate rebel districts of the city was in danger of falling apart.

The agreement reached Tuesday was meant to pave the way for thousands of civilians and rebel fighters to evacuate Syria's second city, scene of some of the worst fighting in more than five years of war.

But cold and hungry civilians who had gathered before dawn to evacuate were instead plunged back into a familiar nightmare.

"Bombing is ongoing, no one can move. Everyone is hiding and terrified," activist Mohammad al-Khatib told AFP from inside the city.

"The wounded and dead are lying in the street. No one dares to try and retrieve the bodies.

The evacuation, agreed under a deal brokered by Russia and Turkey, had been due to begin at 5:00 am (0300 GMT) but was delayed, with buses parked outside rebel-held areas left waiting

Following several hours of quiet, fighting then erupted anew in the ravaged city, with Syria's regime, the rebels and their foreign allies trading accusations of blame.

As booms of air strikes and artillery fire rang out, an AFP correspondent in rebel areas saw panicked civilians running in the streets to find shelter, some hiding in the doorframes of damaged buildings.

The correspondent saw several wounded civilians, as well as a regime tank turning its cannon towards opposition-held districts and opening fire.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights reported "very intense clashes on every front line" and said at least two people had been killed in rebel areas.

State television said rebel rocket fire on government-controlled areas had

also resumed, killing at least seven people.

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said he would speak with Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin later in bid to rescue the deal.

"The situation on the ground is very fragile and complicated," he said.

Moscow, a staunch ally of President Bashar al-Assad, said Damascus resumed its assault on Aleppo after rebels violated the ceasefire.

Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said Moscow expected rebel resistance in the city to end in the next "two to three days"

Rebels and a source close to the regime told AFP that the evacuation had been suspended after objections from the Syrian government.

The source said Damascus objected to the number of people leaving, claiming rebels had sought to raise it from 2,000 to 10,000.

But Yasser al-Youssef, a political official from the Nureddin al-Zinki rebel group, said the regime and its ally Iran were trying to add "new conditions" to the agreement.

"They want to link this deal to other issues, including the areas of Fuaa and Kafraya," he added, referring to two government-held Shiite-majority villages in northwestern Syria that are under rebel siege.

Turkey too accused Assad's regime and its supporters of blocking the deal. French President Francois Hollande

joined Washington's call for international observers to be sent in to oversee the evacuation.

Hollande said those trapped by the fighting should "be evacuated in a dignified and safe manner, under the supervision of international observers and in the presence of humanitarian organisations.³



Techies vow no Trump aid to track Muslims

WASHINGTON, Dec 14, (RTRS): More than 100 employees of technology companies including Alphabet Inc's Google, Twitter Inc and Salesforce pledged on Tuesday to not help US President-elect Donald Trump's administration build a data registry to track people based on their religion or assist in mass deportations.

Drawing comparisons to the Holocaust and the internment of Japanese Americans during World War II, the employees signed an open letter at neveragain.tech

rebuking ideas floated by Trump during the campaign trail. The protest comes a day before several technology company executives are due to meet with the real-estate developer in New York City.

"We are choosing to stand in solidarity with Muslim Americans, immigrants, and all people whose lives and livelihoods are threatened by the incoming administration's proposed data collection policies", reads the letter,

The participants from most ministries have proven that they were capable of producing effective measures to counter negative messages on social media via spreading awareness on the vital issue through personal accounts and other applications, Chulick affirmed

"Kuwait has an important leading role in helping to host such an event like Tech-Camp," she said.

Participants from the private sector also showed great interest in combating terrorism through social media outlets like Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, and Snapchat, she added Kuwait's keenness on being part of the giodal fight against terror ism is very important, said the US diplomat, adding that this threat was becoming part of an international issue that needed to be addressed promptly. "If we are going to com-bat online radicalization in our communities, we need to involve the full support from your communities. We need every voice," said Chulick, adding "I have said in the Tech-Champ workshop that we as individuals should be responsible in what we say in public and on social networks... To check the content of what we receive and what we watch... It is our responsibility first, we should start with ourselves then spread these ideas to other individuals." She emphasized "The United States has an obligation to continue its fight against terrorism on social media and by continuing more Tech-Camps and workshop in many regions to spread more awareness." "I believe that the problem of using social network in promoting violence and terrorism is an ongoing problem and we have an obligation to fight such radical movements that are spreading rapidly around the world." In her closing statements, Chulick encouraged Kuwaiti youth to continue posting information and updates on their activities, stay engaged, and carry on collaborating with one another, affirming that "All young people have a vital role. They are the most credible voice to confront false narratives aiming to target their peers and their communities.'

He was also anoted that since 1992, the consecutive parliaments failed to realize the aspirations of Kuwaitis due to lack of understanding of the real sense of democracy. "The previous parliaments were dissolved due to the attitude of some MPs who seek to create problems, foment discords and aggravate conflicts between the legislative and executive authorities. Indecent and insulting remarks do not help democracy," he added.

Describing the National Assembly speaker as the "safety valve of de-mocracy in Kuwait," Al-Enezi pointed out the speaker enjoys support of all segments of the society, thus, he can handle tough issues easily.

He warned that failure to tackle the unemployment issue in the nick of time could harm society because it might prompt some people to commit crimes.

Among the bills he supported were women's political rights, State budget, Municipality, establishment of an Islamic body to develop and regulate the private sector, direct foreign investment, banning eavesdropping and segregation in private universities.

Statement

On the fuel price increase and the need to grant financial support to citizens, Al-Enezi said he trusts the ability of Kuwaiti authorities to find an appropriate solution. He admitted he doesn't know details of the expected solution, "but we want to emphasize that there is flexibility on the part of the government with more than 70 percent sign of a breakthrough.'

He also underscored the importance of treating citizens fairly, adding they should not bear the consequences of the government's way of dealing with the current economic situation.

After filing his nomination papers for the December 2012 election, he spoke passionately about the people's right to choose new parliamentarians and that they will always be loyal to the ruling family.

He claimed the opposition forces are misleading the public by raising doubt on the government's ability, just to serve foreign agendas and personal interests. "Kuwaitis will not accept a ruler other than Al-Sabah. Most members of the Majority Bloc have good intentions for Kuwait, but three or four of them are trying to put the country on the stage of repression and arrests which are basically the ambitions

Al-Harbi made his remarks to reporters on the sidelines of a ceremony to receive well-wishers of his new ministerial post, reiterating his keenness to exert all efforts to reduce crowd congestion at hospitals and attain justice and equal opportunities for all.

He also mentioned his meeting with the council of undersecretaries, during which they reviewed measures of rebuilding trust in Kuwait's health care and ways to reduce the need to re-open emergency clinics at hospitals, adding that among the number of solutions proposed during the meeting was building two mini-hospitals in each health area. 1,500 heaters were handed out to the internally displaced persons of Mosul and residents of Khazir camp in eastern Mosul.

This is the second time in less than a week that heaters have been distributed to internally displaced Iraqis, Consul-General Dr. Omar Al-Kandari told KUNA, reiterating Kuwait's keenness on providing various aid to the displaced Iraqis, particularly the new ones who are desperate for heating sources in light of current cold and freezing weather.

These humanitarian aid are part of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah's humanitarian initiatives as the Humanitarian Leader to alleviate the suffering of the Iraqi people, Al-Kandari noted.

He also affirmed Kuwait's continuation to secure and meet the needs of displaced Iragis, and support them through all means in order to protect them from the cold weather, pointing out the consulate's plan to provide winter necessities for over 50,000 displaced persons. (KUNA)

"We will continue working with WHO to help people in places where the need is greatest." WHO estimates that some 40, 000 civilians will need trauma care due to Mosul military operations.

WHO recently delivered life-saving medicines and medical supplies and kits inside Mosul. The shipment which provided materials to treat almost 13, 000 patients, include chronic disease medicines, antibiotics and supplies to treat trauma injuries. However, more supplies and services are needed as the conflict continues, the statement concluded.

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

DUBAI, Dec 14: During the first session of the Arab Strategy Forum, held in Dubai, Dr Natalia Tamirisa of the International Monetary Fund says the regional economic landscape in 2017 is likely to vary widely across Arab countries. She noted that "there would be discussions around regional economic predictions, conflicts and oil prices, all of which constitute drivers for these countries.²

Dr Tamirisa grouped the Arab countries into three categories: countries experiencing conflict, such as Syria, Iraq, Yemen and Libya; oil-exporting countries, such as the Gulf Cooperation Council countries and Algeria; and oil-importing countries, such as Egypt, Tunisia, Lebanon, and Morocco.

Dr Tamirisa explained the grave difficulties faced by She pointed out that this burden should be shouldered by the global community, and not solely by these neighbouring countries. Priority must be given to saving human lives and providing economic necessities, a responsibility for the whole world, she noted, and not just this region.

The IMF stated that the agreement between OPEC members and non-member oil-producing countries has resulted in a rise in oil prices, although these are not expected to return to the \$100 per barrel prices, but rather will fluctuate between \$50-60 per barrel.

Prices

Oil-producing countries -GCC countries and Algeria will see a drop in oil prices and may have to face the possibility of economic stagnation in the medium term. This will require budget adjustments and more concerted efforts toward economic diversification. Dr Tamirisa also indicated that measures which oil-producing countries have been implementing, such as costcutting and budget-rational-

isation could have negative

Governments should consider developing sectors such as tourism, industry and transport, among others. Many have made significant progress by decreasing subsidies for electricity and fuel and launching projects aimed at economic diversification, a feat not easily attained, and one which requires spending reform.

Advantage

Oil-importing countries like Egypt, Lebanon, Tunisia and Morocco should take advantage of low oil prices to implement integral economic reforms, noted Dr Tamirisa.

Egypt and Tunisia have already seen promising progress, but Tunisia and Lebanon still need to lower their public debt, implement additional economic reform and empower the private sector. She further recommended that Tunisia and Lebanon create more job opportunities for youth to avert a potential rise in unemployment, if economic diversification is not implemented. LJUBLJANA, Slovenia, Dec 14, (KUNA): The Republic of Slovenia is keen on developing relations with the GCC countries, especially Kuwait, said Karl Erjavec, Slovenian Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Tuesday.

Speaking to KUNA on the sidelines of the two-day Slovenian-GCC conference, Erjavec said that this will not be the last meeting of this kind to be held in Slovenia, stressing that his country was looking forward for future events aimed at boosting cooperation between the two sides.

The current meeting will look into all suitable measures to enhance cooperation between the GCC and Slovenia, said the minister.

Slovenia, as part of the EU, is willing to boost ties with the Gulf States, said Erjavec who alluded to the 25th meeting of the EU and GCC Foreign Min-

isters back in July. The Foreign Minister said that the EU, as one of the strongest partners to the GCC bloc, had signed several agreements to strengthen commercial and economic ties, revealing that the two sides signed an agreement back in April 2016 to boost economic relations.

Relations

On relations with Kuwait, Slovenian Minister said that holding dialogue with the Gulf state was within his country's top priorities.

Previous agreements signed between Slovenia and Kuwait had provided solid grounds for the two nations to pursue more cooperation in the near future, said the minister who commended the Kuwaiti participation in the current Slovenian-GCC conference.

Kuwait and Slovenia currently focused their cooperation within the commercial level, said Minister Erjavec who hoped that the two countries will increase their commercial exchange from the 2015 sum of 14.2 million euro.

The Minister took the chance to invite Kuwaitis and GCC business personnel to invest in his country, revealing that the health tourism sector was one of the major business attractions in Slovenia. Meanwhile, Erjavec touched on the issue of Kuwait's bid for a non-permanent seat as representative of Asia and the Pacific in the UNSC for 2018-19, saying that the strong bilateral relations will reflect positively on Slovenia's stance on the issue.

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

Al-Hajraf, speaking at a forum, said the authority, during the same period of time, issued sukuks (Islamic bonds), estimated at USD 700 million, adding that "issuance of other bonds worth USD two billion is under examination." He affirmed determination to implement the strategy to reach the level of emerg ing markets, through issuance of regulations for the market makers and post trade rules, latter of which to be in operation early 2018, in addition to privatizing the bourse (Boursa Kuwait)..

'Washington stumbles in Syrian crisis'

'Russian bear back with bang'

"THE strong move by the Russians in Syria reflects a new reality which was not thought of by the Western camp allied with America, not even the Americans themselves, who are precisely following up the course of the situation of the Russians inside," columnist Dr Yaqoub Al-Sharrah wrote for Al-Rai daily.

"It is thought for some time that the Russians are preoccupied with their internal problems, especially with regard to the security situation on the border with states which have broken away after the perestroika revolution which ended the Cold War, and the fall of the Berlin Wall and the German unity.

"It was also thought that Russia shall devote much time to cope with the enormous changes inside Russia and the world in order to meet the demands of the 'New Era' which is characterized by democracy and capitalist competition and openness to the world.

"Russia was beginning to set the stage for a completely different era, so it deliberately does its best to avoid the collision with the Americans in an attempt to calm the situation and solve the problems.

"The gradual moves have made the Russians more reassured about security, strengthened the relationship with neighboring countries for fear of their quest to join the European camp, and build relationships with other countries like America and its European allies.

"The Russians monitoring the role of the Americans in international affairs has increased over the past two decades, especially with regard to the global events in which America plays a role, such as the case in the 'Arab Spring.

"The results of the Russian follow-up of the US behavior proved that Moscow's impartiality has reflected negatively on its international standing, and gave an impression of weakness. Add to this there is

no fear if America or its allies tried to interfere in other countries, especially the US interference in Iraq after its liberation from Saddam's clutches and his regime, as well as in Libya and now in Syria.

"In this context and because of the above, the Russians have to show its position is strong and is determined to confront the United States of America in Syria, although the latter is an old ally of Russia and both coun-

tries are tied with a signed a security agreement.

'The Russian moved fast to 'contain' the Syrian crisis, won the admiration of the world simply because it aimed to prevent US forces from entering Syria, and forced the US Navy, which had moved into the Mediterranean Sea to halt its movement.

"Russia's actions have been characterized by good preparation, planning, determination and investment in military, political and economic factors to confirm that it is also a superpower and ready to confront the US even if it meant use of force.

'This Russian position on Syria has made Washington stumble in its policies towards the Arabs on one side and Syria on the other, which has suffered from wars launched by factions and terrorists.

"Indeed, the Syrian case has proved America's weakness and confusion in its foreign relations with the international community, especially with its allies, and made it appear unreliable and easy to give up on its agreements as a result of the severe divisions between the two parties, Democrats and the Republicans, and the different interests and deep differences between the influential parties and political currents. "It is enough that a man like (Donald) Trump who does not represent the Republican Party ran for the presidency, turning the balances and principles of the Republican Party upside down, especially because of his radical and racist ideas, not to mention his poor relationship with countries. "If the Russians have a direct role and interests in Syria, the consensus is moving towards more and more of their power and influence in the world over time after they demonstrated to the world their strength in Ukraine, and their resistance to the US-European economic blockade. "This Russian power is also manifested by activating the relationships with other countries such as Turkey, Egypt, Iran and others which prove that the US is not the only superpower but equally strong is the Russian bear which seeks to restore its glory and influence and in various parts of the universe, meaning to say it will not remain a mere spectator in the eyes of the world given the influential US policies which have negatively affected Russia's interests and its relations with other States.'

"The standard of education in the country is deteriorating and I have no clue why the government refuses to take Singapore as a model of education, which reduces the number of books for pupils with a greater understanding.

"Over the years the economic concept 'bad money drives out good money' and this is our reality, that is to say the bad and corrupt remain in office at the expense of good honest people.

The presence of unqualified people at the helm of affairs in companies and other establishments is enough reason for the escape or expulsion of good elements. It has been observed that a number of inefficient employees and officials is growing in our country, in institutions, companies and factorsies.

"The government did not find a solution to the unemployment of Kuwaitis youth while the number of expatriates is increasing. The government's performance is bad in many areas. Although we have a lot, we lack conscientiousness, loyalty and familiarity with the successful experiences of other countries."

"At the heart of optimism, it's also important to be a bit pessimistic on the appointment of specific ministers in the newly formed Government that include a few former ministers," columnist *Khaled Ahmad Al-Tarrah* wrote for **Al-Qabas** daily.

"I was happy with reappointment of HH the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak who is known for honesty and good reputation. I also felt happy with the rejection of some ministers who were considered heavy burden on the Premier. Although Sheikh Mubarak had been patient with them to the end despite their inefficiency, I am not too surprised about the newly formed government due to interfer-ences that affected free selection of the Prime Minister.

'On top of the list of crises-making ministers is the Minister of Finance who is responsible for the economic document that led government into a narrow dark endless tunnel. Even as the document had the headline of reform, it was devoid of any economic or political reform in reality. Referendum conducted to assess public opinion regarding the document was out of context and too shallow.

"Minister of Justice was also a failure due to his controversial constitutional and political affairs. It is appropriate for the Prime Minister to have a look at the minister's previous TV interviews. The Minister of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs as well as the State Minister for Municipality had a unique situation. In 2014, he called for ban on the symposium of poet Jalal Al-Deen Al-Roumi, although he died 273 years ago. Hopefully, the Minister changed his sources of information to avoid such situation in future, while he managed the Ministry of Awqaf and Municipality.

"Minister of Šocial Affairs and Labor, the State Minister for Planning and Development attained no success in planning or dealing with NGOs. There are many scenarios to support my claim, citing cancellation of the Writers Forum in support of the inhabitants of Aleppo".

"It seems the appointment of non-Kuwaitis in government sector is not fraught with violations, especially as the issue is covered with a strong wall of

"A Kuwaiti diplomat told me that Kuwait was offering development assistance to one of the East African community, and that an African official told him: 'This is a beautiful thing that you offer us electricity generators while there are power cuts in Kuwait. The friend said he then felt some embarrassment and he began to sweat," columnist former Kuwaiti Ambassador Ahmad Al-Dawas wrote for Al-Seyassah daily.

"One of the examples of the poor performance of our government is clear when it contracted with the Turkish and local contractors to construct part of a building at the Kuwait International Airport that cost the state one billion dinars instead of making use of the high quality European experience. Look at Dubai or Abu Dhabi airports and you feel you are at a European airport.

'Why does our government sign agreements with China? It is true that China is the second biggest world economy, but the large number of Chinese factorsies is not a sign of excellence and quality products. Do we look for cheap labor or good quality products?

"Take for example, benefitting from the German, Norway and British experience in the solar panel industry and wind energy. One of the countries have put fans in the sea close to the beach so as not to obstruct the interests of the people on the mainland. America finally managed to manufacture these panels and put them by the roadsides.

"When we were in the elementary school stage in the 'old' (I am talking of Kuwait 50 years ago) before Kuwait's independence Brazil succeeded in building the city of 'Brasilia that had no traffic lights, so why our government did not benefit from this idea which we have explained in more than one article and we will continue to write about it again.

"With regard to the development of the country, the government can resort to Estonia, located off the Baltic Sea, which is e-government in almost everything, such as online voting in the general elections,

protection from Civil Service Commission that is now waging war against the national workforce with neglect," Zayed Al-Zaid wrote for Al-Nahar daily.

"We have been watching the commission approve the appointment of non-Kuwaitis into the ministries and other government agencies, which opens the door on both sides for the appointment of non-Kuwaitis. The most dangerous aspect is that the commission legitimizes the illegitimate and unconstitutional action. The commission gives the ministries and government agencies indulgence of legitimacy to appoint non-Kuwaitis, especially those in the cadre of consultants.

"This is happening at a time when Kuwait boasts of a large number of highly educated, experienced and competent citizens that are still ignored by the commission. The commission shuts the door in the faces of Kuwaitis. Who are those benefiting from this action?

"The current National Assembly started off on a wrong footing. The signal sent during the first session indicates dispute is at sight whether for justifiable reason or not", Talal Al-Saeed wrote for Al-Seyassah daily.

"The bone of contention obvious during the session did not deserve any disagreement. Some of them wanted to deprive a section of Kuwaitis - the lawmakers - the right of performing parliamentary duties by not voting on the item one of the session. This issue led to a commotion that nearly ended the session.

"It took intervention of reasonable lawmakers before the strained nerves were calmed. What exactly did the rabble rousers want even in the first session? Why were they rushing into hurly-burly, threats and intimidation? What message were they trying to pass to Kuwaitis who were watching the inaugural session? We can sum up the answers for those questions in one sentence — "We Are Here"!"

"The recent GCC Leaders Summit in Manama, the visit of Saudi King to Kuwait, and inflammatory incidents in the region attract significant and legitimate questions on the need for an Arabian Gulf Confederacy after over thirty five years of the existence of GCC," "Fahad Abdul-Rahman Al-Me'jal wrote for Al-Seyassah daily.

"Just as the majority of GCC citizens perceive today, a confederacy has become extremely necessary, especially as the regional challenges could extend to other regions and countries. On 19th September 2011, King Abdullah Bin Abdul-Aziz called for transformation of the Gulf Cooperation Council to a confederation. The call was made over five years ago while the region continues to witness serious disputes, fierce wars and divisions that could precipitate dangers in the future, and the Gulf countries may not escape.

"With the current political phenomenon in the region, the talk about confederation has become a necessity, although it used to be an ordinary suggestion for several years. The GCC countries are now facing challenges related to the national security, identity and wealth, in addition to its political and geographical location".



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Rollback eyed on petrol prices

New Parliament urged to work on reducing flat rent

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 14: In this week's Arab Times online poll, readers weighed in on the issues they would like the newly elected Members of Kuwait's National Assembly to tackle. Half of the respondents would like to see apartment rents regulated.

Kuwaiti voters cast their ballots to elect 50 lawmakers on Nov 26. 50 percent of voters would like for more controls on apartment rent according to considerations of size and locality. "I think most people are concerned with what hits their wallets the hardest. For many families, housing in Kuwait is the biggest expenditure and the costs seem to exorbitant. I think it would benefit us greatly if apartments were regulated according to the size, locality and features offered", a reader commented.

"We've been reading news reports of committees being formed to look at this issue. But so far nothing has been done. Apartments keep shrinking in size while taking a larger chunk of my salary. I think the Parliament has the authority to bring about fast change in this regard, I hope this new Parliament looks into it", another respondent shared.

12 percent of poll voters called for a roll back on increased petrol prices. "I was very unhappy with the government's decisions to increase the price of petrol. I hope the new Parliament reinstates the subsidy and does not increase prices for water, electricity and other resources as well", a reader told the Arab Times.

"The austerity measures adopted by the old Parliament is the cause many of them have lost their seats in this election. A lot of the new members campaigned against these fiscal measures and won. People in Kuwait have been enjoying subsidies for so long now, they do not want any cut backs. Plus there is a general view that the funds sourced through this measure will be mismanaged", a young Kuwaiti professional shared.

25 percent of respondents felt that the Parliament should work towards ending the 'Wasta' system in Kuwait. "I think most of Kuwait's endemic problems will be solved if wasta and corruption are targeted. The government should implement strict laws against the practice and automate government services for greater transparency", another reader remarked.

6 percent of voters felt that the lawmakers should prioritise control and better medical facilities. "The hospitals in some governorates are in a very bad state. I hope the government will prioritise health and invest more in this sector which seems to be getting neglected of late", a reader pointed out.

Only 4 percent hoped that the new Parliament would scrap the DNA law. "I think the DNA law is the most dangerous law that is not getting enough media attention. It is a threat to everyone's privacy and the new Parliament needs to reverse the decision", a concerned voter stated.

3 percent of voters felt that all new traffic laws should go through Parliament's approval. "The recent action taken by the MoI of removing license plates would have been met with resistance if it had come up in Parliament and it could have been better thought out and fine-tuned. Another positive aspect of traffic policies passing through the Parliament will be that the public will be aware of it rather than being surprised by the cops."

them. What other kind of truth is there? In the past, the church has been harsh on those it deemed morally wrong or sinful.

'Today, we no longer judge. Like a loving father, we never condemn our children. Our church is big enough for heterosexuals and homosexuals, for the pro-life and the pro-choice! For conservatives and liberals, even communists are welcome and have joined us. We all love and worship the same God.'

He added: 'The church has witnessed important developments, and today is the religion of the modernists. He said it was time to give up on intolerance and recognize that religious truth changes and evolves; they are not absolute or carved stone above.

The Pope also said: Through acts of love and affection, we can make a nonbeliever acknowledge God and then free his soul and make him an active participant in the redemption of mankind.

He added: 'When we spread love and beauty in the world, we touch God and recognize Him.

The Bible is a beautiful sacred book, but as a whole like old great books, there are some parts that need to be reviewed to fit with the message of love and truth according to our new understanding.

The Pope concluded: 'We will begin in the nomination of women cardinals and bishops and priests. I hope one day in the future to have a woman Pope to open doors for women as they are opened to men.'

Cleric Rifai accused of violating nationality law

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 14: Lawyer Mohammad Abbas has submitted a petition at the Public Prosecution against a cleric Fuad Al-Rifai, accusing the latter of violating the national unity law.

He based his accusation on blogs and video clips posted on social media that can be regarded as malicious against Kuwaiti Shiites and their faith.

In the petition, Lawyer Abbas accused the cleric of posting statements wherein he described Hussainiyat as an innovation and stressing that every innovation amounts to straying from the right path and that straying leads to hell. He said Hussainiyat is a place where pious people gather and discuss the life history of the Holy Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), his family and disciples. He stated that Shiites in Kuwait also use it as places for festivities, adding some of them are over 100 years old and represent an age-long tradition in the society.

Lawyer Abbas stressed that Article 1 of Law No. 19/2012 criminalizes any form of agitation and incitement of public through any means. He also cited Article 29 of

Law No. 31/1970 with amended provisions in the penal law concerning hatred and disdain towards any sect, initiating sectarian or tribal crises, and publishing ideologies to encourage racial, class or group discrimination.

Woman gets custody: The Family Court presided over by Judge Meshal Al-Sneedah has granted a woman the custody of her two children and ordered her estranged husband (the father of the two children) to pay monthly expenses of KD 130 for the care of both children starting from the date the lawsuit was filed. The court also ordered the man to pay the housemaid's monthly wage of KD 70 from the same date and the recruitment cost of KD 500, as well as monthly rent of KD 120 from the same date and the legal fees.

The plaintiff counsel Lawyer Mohammad Khalil Al-Qattan who filed the case on behalf of his client, said she was married to the defendant and had two children with him. She is currently nursing the children to which she has legitimate right. However, the estranged husband refused to pay for their expenses despite his financial stability and comfortable lifestyle.

Perry likely a boost for oil

Former SEAL tapped to head Interior Dept

BILLINGS, Mont, Dec 14, (Agencies): Rep. Ryan Zinke of Montana made no secret of his ambitions to join a Donald Trump Cabinet, and yet his nomination as interior secretary is in some ways an unlikely fit for the retired US Navy SEAL.

Zinke, 55, was an early supporter of the president-elect and publicly expressed his interest in a Cabinet post when Trump visited Montana in May.

Like other Western states, Montana's wide-open, rugged landscape has a huge federal presence. The Interior Department and other US agencies control almost a third of its land and even more of the underground "mineral estate" that holds vast amounts of coal, oil and natural gas

As with several other Trump Cabinet nominees, Zinke has advocated for increased energy drilling and mining on those lands and expressed skepticism about



the urgency of climate change. The Republican lawmaker also has been a vocal supporter of keeping public lands in the government's hands. That's a central political issue in Montana, where hunting and fishing access is considered sacrosanct. The president-elect's son Donald Jr. is an avid hunter and

was in Montana on a hunting trip last month. That may have

Perry given Zinke an advantage over another lawmaker Trump was said to have considered for the Interior post, Rep. Cathy McMorris Rodgers, R-Wash. She wrote on Facebook Tuesday that it had been an "honor" to be invited to meet with Trump.

Zinke met Monday with Trump in New York, according to two people with knowledge of the matter. A person close to Zinke confirmed the Tuesday offer.

He hadn't yet accepted when he left Tuesday for his home in the mountain town of Whitefish, Montana, according to two of those people. All three spoke on condition of on anonymity because they were not authorized to discuss the transition process publicly.

Energy development, land management and hunting fall under the Interior Department's jurisdiction. However, those were second-tier issues for Zinke during his successful re-election campaign this fall against Democrat Denise Juneau.

In interviews with The Associated Press during that campaign, Zinke repeatedly identified his top priorities as national security, more thorough vetting of refugees to screen out terrorists, the repeal of the Affordable Care Act and improving the US economy.

Perry worry for environmentalist: US Presidentelect Donald Trump on Wednesday formally named former Texas governor Rick Perry to lead the Department of Energy, adding to the list of oil-drilling advocates skeptical about climate change filling out his Cabinet selections.

The choice of Perry, first disclosed on Monday, is likely to further worry environmentalists concerned about the incoming Trump administration's impact on the climate, while an eager energy industry ready for expansion welcomes the selection.

In a statement from Trump's transition team, the president-elect cited Perry's tenure leading Texas, a leading oil-producing state and the nation's second most populous one, from 2000 until 2015.

"Rick Perry created ... a business climate that produced millions of new jobs and lower energy prices in his state, and he will bring that same approach to our entire country as secretary of energy," Trump said in the statement.

Perry, a one-time presidential rival of Trump who unsuccessfully sought the Republican nomination in 2016 and 2012, in the statement welcomed the planned nomination to serve under Trump, who takes office Jan. 20. His selection is the latest indication that Trump may be friendly toward the fossil fuel industry even as an overwhelming majority of scientists believe carbon dioxide emissions from burning oil, gas and coal are a significant contributor to global climate change, causing higher sea levels, drought and more frequent violent storms.

Trump, to host Silicon Valley's elite: US Presidentelect Donald Trump, who has made no secret of his disdain for the titans of Silicon Valley, will host executives from top technology companies for a meeting at his Manhattan tower on Wednesday.

Tech luminaries, including Apple Inc Chief Execu-tive Tim Cook, Facebook Inc Chief Operating Officer Sheryl Sandberg and Tesla Motors Inc Executive Elon Musk, will seek to find common ground on economic issues at the roundtable even as much of the industry remains angered by the Republican president-elect's harsh rhetoric on illegal immigration, hostility to free trade and public broadsides against the industry.

Leon says trump risks blame: Former CIA director Leon Panetta said on Wednesday that President-elect Donald Trump risked being blamed after any potential attack on the United States if he refused to receive more regular intelligence briefings.

U.S. officials told Reuters that Trump is receiving an average of one presidential intelligence briefing a week - far fewer than most of his recent predecessors - but that his deputy Mike Pence gets briefings around six days a week.

Panetta, a former Democratic Congressman who served as CIA director and defense secretary in President Barack **Obama's first term, told the Arab Strategy** Forum, a conference sponsored by the gov-ernment of Dubai, that Trump's aversion "can't last."

"I've seen presidents who have asked questions about whether that intelligence is verifiable, what are the sources for that intelligence, but I have never seen a president who said, 'I don't want that stuff.' Panetta said.

"If we endure another attack and the intelligence officials had indications or information regarding that attack and the president did not want to listen to that, for whatever reason, the responsibility for that attack would fall on the president.

In an interview with Fox News on Sunday, Trump said he found the intelligence briefings repetitive and that he already understood potential threats.

"You know, I'm a smart person. I don't have to be told the same things in the same words every single day for the next eight years," Trump said.

Panetta said Trump should heed the view of US intelligence agencies that Russia had interfered in the presidential election through cyberattacks

"When it comes to Russian interference in our last campaign, 17 intelligence agencies agree that Russia is involved in that effort.

I think the President would do well to say we ought to find out what Russia's role was, we ought to investigate it and ensure that it never happens again."

The CIA reportedly believes Russian hacking was aimed at boosting Trump's candidacy - an assessment not shared by the FBI, which along with other U.S. agencies has concluded that Russian cyberattacks sought generally to undermine the election.

He made the trip, they claim, after communicating online for several months with el-Gammal, who also visited the Queens apartment el-Goarany shared with a younger brother.

Lawyers for el-Gammal suggest he did so willingly.

Pensioners meanwhile worry they may have to return to Britain's stretched health system, another example of unintended Brexit consequences rippling across Europe.

A return of ailing pensioners to Britain would threaten to further strain its National Health Service (NHS) where patients can wait for hours in hospital corridors before they are treated - not an outcome envisaged by Brexit campaigners.

The Brexit campaign had argued the NHS would benefit from a break with the EU, saying funds no longer spent abroad on EU projects could be freed up to boost health funding at home.

Spain is the most popular European retirement destination for Britons, home to around 300,000. Around a third of them are aged over 65. Together, Spain and Portugal account for almost a quarter of all Britons living in Europe, U.N. data shows.

In total, more than 1 million Britons live in Europe, and over 3 million EU citizens in Britain - potential bargaining chips in the upcoming divorce between London and Brussels.

British Prime Minister Theresa May has pushed for an "early resolution" to the anxiety facing foreign residents. But EU leaders have ruled out talks on mutual residence rights until she triggers the exit process under Article 50 of the EU treaty.

Greater

Britain is by far the biggest user of Spain's statefunded, universal health care system amongst foreign nationals, social security figures show, running up a bill over three times greater than the next biggest users, the French, last year.

Britons cost Spain 285 million euros (\$304 million) in health care last year, including tourists and pensioners and accounting for nearly half of Spain's total spend on foreign European Union nationals.

This dwarves the cost of Spaniards' medical care in Britain of less than 150,000 euros last year - or just 0.05 percent of Britons' cost to Spain, according to Spanish social security data. Spaniards living in Britain tend to be of working age.

Under rules governed by European law, Spain and Britain compensate each other for their citizens' medical care bills. This more or less covers costs on an annual basis, Spanish social security figures from the last nine years show.

A British government spokeswoman said nothing had yet been decided on the future of reciprocal healthcare arrangements, adding that Britain remained a full EU member with all the accompanying rights until exit negotiations were concluded.

EU proposes new rules: The European Commission proposed new rules on Tuesday on what social benefits governments must pay to citizens from other EU states - a key for people concerned about immigration and "benefit tourism".

The package of measures, delayed by nearly a year as Brussels hoped to avoid Britain voting to leave the EU, is designed to clarify rights of EU expatriate workers and states' obligations on unemployment benefits and social security.

The new rules will confirm a series of EU court decisions that backed mainly rich northwestern states in rejecting "benefit tourism" by poor Europeans who did not look for, or find, work after arriving.

"To sum up in one word, it is about fairness," said EU Commissioner for employment and social affair Marianne Thyssen.

Under the proposal, jobseekers will be able to take unemployment benefit with them to a different country for six months, rather than three.

Economically inactive people would, however, not be able to claim social security benefits abroad, setting out that freedom of movement of workers is not a full right to reside for everyone.

One element on which former prime minister David Cameron had secured a promise of change before the Brexit vote is absent. States will continue to have to pay full benefits to children of EU expatriates working in their countries, even if those children live in other countries with lower allowances and living costs.

Thyssen said the payment for such exported benefits was less than 1 percent of

Johnson pokes fun at PM: British

Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson has publicly poked fun at Prime Minister Theresa May, telling dozens of foreign ambassadors she was so cosmopolitan that she sported leather trousers like German "lederhosen"

Johnson, known in Britain and beyond for his often outlandish persona and dishevelled mop of platinum hair, said his country would not turn its back on the world after Brexit and cast the United Kingdom as a cosmopolitan consumer of

imports. "We are gluttons in this country for imports. We buy huge quantities of stuff, particularly of course from our friends in the European Union, as of course we shall continue to do so when we do that great free trade deal," he told ambassadors.

Johnson quipped that Britain had even managed to export Brexit campaigner Nigel Farage, who enjoys a friendship

miership and the world's fifth largest economy.

"It is absolutely right that we do not set out at this stage every single detail of our proposed negotiating strategy, because that would be the best way to get the worst possible deal for Britain," May told parliament when asked whether she had a coherent plan.

May attends an EU summit in Brussels on Thursday but she has not been invited to a dinner where leaders of the other 27 EU member states will discuss their approach to Brexit.

Britons' vote to leave the bloc has opened a huge number of questions including whether exporters will keep tariff-free access to the single European market and British-based banks will still be able to serve continental clients, not to mention immigration and the future rights of the many EU citizens already living in the United Kingdom.

Demands

Brexiteers say there is little point laying out detailed demands as, with France and Germany due to hold elections next year and the future of a new Italian government uncertain, it is still unclear who will be in power in Paris, Berlin and Rome.

Another unknown is how Donald Trump, who once said Brexit was wonderful, could affect the divorce proceedings after he becomes US president next month.

Behind the secrecy, though, there are signs of muddle.

When May pushed for informal negotiations with German Chancellor Angela Merkel at a Nov. 18 meeting in Berlin, Europe's most powerful leader blocked the attempt, according to people involved with the negotiations.

After months of refusing to speculate about Britain's negotiating position, Brexit Secretary David Davis told parliament this month - almost in passing - that he would consider making payments to the EU to get access to markets, a move that sent sterling up almost 2 cents on the day.

The government fought and lost a legal challenge in the High Court

Speaking to the Lords' EU Justice Sub-Committee, Bermann said the French community has "a lot of questions" about the consequences of Britain's June referendum to leave the European Union.

"It is worried because of the great uncertainty about its future in the UK: its members have invested a lot in this country, both personally and professionally.

"It is also worried, because in the aftermath of the referendum some French nationals were subjected to negative or aggressive language,' Bermann said in comments published in the House of Lords report.

The French ambassador said she and her colleagues had received testimonies of such abuse following the Brexit vote, coming after decades of Britain being seen as "a success story in terms of dynamism and respect for others'

Bermann estimated 300,000 French people were living in Britain and said some were ready to change their plans after the referendum.

"Some of them told me that before 23 June they felt like Londoners and now they feel like foreigners, which is different. "Many express a sense of sad-

ness and are waiting for answers," she said.



Romanians living there. In its assessment the House of Lords committee said the government had a moral duty to provide clarity to EU citizens in Britain.

"The government is under a moral obligation to provide certainty and legal clarity to all EU nationals working, living and studying in the UK, who contribute so significantly to the economic and cultural life of the UK. It should do so urgently, the report said.

It further called on the government to explain its actions to combat xenophobia, while also warning that EU workers filled gaps in the labour market that cannot be filled by British workers.

The longer their future is uncertain, the less attractive a place to live and work the UK will be, and the greater labour market gaps will be," the committee said.

Prime Minister Theresa May has repeatedly said she wants to protect the status of EU nationals already living in Britain, although she has stopped short of guaranteeing their rights.

The premier has promised to start the two-year negotiating period to leave the EU -- by triggering Article 50 of the EU's Lisbon Treaty -- by the end of March 2017.

Disaster boat skipper jailed

Uncertainty for Calais kids on UK 'transfers'

PARIS, Dec 14, (AFP): France on Tuesday denied reports that Britain has stopped taking in migrant children relocated from Calais, saying London has taken in over 450 minors since the "Jungle" camp was razed and that the transfers were "going well".

The French interior ministry said Britain had accepted 866 unaccompanied minors since the start of 2016, 468 of whom were whisked across the Channel after the sprawling Jungle was demolished in late October.

"The cooperation is going well," the ministry said, denying reports that Britain had pulled up the drawbridge on children who had travelled to Calais in the hope of reaching England.

French authorities in October cleared the squalid



camp near Calais port and moved the thousands of migrants -- mostly Afghans, Eritreans and Sudanese -- who had been living there to shelters nationwide. They included around 1,900 minors.

Britain, which had already begun taking some of the children, assured at the time it would take hundreds more, without committing to an exact figure.

Goodwill

Last week, British immigration minister Robert Goodwill said his government had welcomed over 750 children -- a figure lower than that given by the French.

A spokeswoman for Britain's Home Office interior ministry told AFP Tuesday the transfer of Calais children was "continuing" but declined to say how many would be admitted.

"The first phase of transfers has concluded but that is not the end of the process. More eligible children will be transferred from across Europe in the coming months," she said.

Of those children given shelter so far, "many" had joined family members, she said.

Admission

Last month, Britain tightened the admission criteria for unaccompanied migrant children without family in Britain, saying the child must be 12 or under, or run a high risk of sexual exploitation.

The threshold for Syrian and Sudanese children was lower, with children of up to 15 years declared eligible.

A spokeswoman for Safe Passage, a charity that supports refugees coming to Britain, said: "Our understanding is that the transfers have stopped at 750.

Although the government said the transfers are ongoing, these are on a "child-by-child" basis, the spokeswoman said, with each case potentially taking "months" to process.

Before the Jungle was cleared, French President Francois Hollande had appealed to Britain to fulfil its "moral duty" towards migrants trying to reach Britain, where many have contacts or speak the language.

Dozens of migrants have died trying to climb onto trucks heading to Calais port to cross to England. French charities have warned that a closure of Britain's asylum channels could see children once again put their lives on the line.

The extension of the state of emergency had already been proposed on Dec 10 by France's new prime minister, Bernard Cazeneuve. Political parties are keen to show they are getting a grip on the threat of attacks as France prepares for presidential elections in 2017. France's upper house Senate will also review the measures on Thursday. The socialist government imposed the state of emergency – which gives police extended powers to search and arrest - in November last year after attacks by Islamist militants in Paris that killed 130 people. The state of emergency, which was originally due to end in mid-January, has already been extended four times because the government considers that the risk of armed attacks by Islamist militants remains high.

Genevieve Jacques, head of the migrant charity Cimade, said she feared they would run away from the migrant shelters back to Calais and called on France to "take a tougher tone" with Britain.

France and Britain have tried to make the Calais site less attractive for migrants, erecting a wall that officials said late Monday had been completed.

The four-metre-high (13-foot) wall runs along a kilometre-long stretch of the main road leading to Calais port, next to the area that used to house the sprawling camp.

The concrete barrier -- estimated to cost 2.7 million euros (\$3 million) -- aims to prevent new arrivals stowing away on trucks bound for Britain.

An Italian court ruled Tuesday that the captain of a migrant boat that sank in 2015, killing up to 900 people, was responsible for the disaster, the Mediterranean's worst since World War II.

Judges in the Sicilian port city of Catania ordered Mohammed Ali Malek, a Tunisian national, to serve 18 years in jail for multiple manslaughter, human trafficking and causing the tragedy after the packed boat capsized after colliding with a freighter coming to its

Syrian Mahmoud Bikhit, accused of being his first mate, was handed a five-year sentence for his role in the tragedy off the Libyan coast. Italian forensic scientists spent months sorting through decomposed body parts to count the victims.

The men were ordered to pay nine million euros (\$9.5 million) each in compensation.

Both had claimed they were simple migrants and had been made to steer the boat by the real traffickers.

But survivors told investigators that Malek, who had lived in Italy in the past, was the captain. And that it was his lack of sailing skills that caused the deadly collision.

"I spent two years and six months in Italy and I have a young son with an Italian woman: I want to marry her and recognise the baby," Malek told the court in a plea before the verdict.

"It's the truth. I've always told the truth. Just as I immediately gave (police) my real name, and told them I was a passenger," he said.

The boat was carrying people largely from The Gambia, Senegal and Mali, as well as Bangladesh, the Ivory Coast and Ethiopia. Only 28 survived.

Up to 900 people were packed into the 27-metre (90-foot) boat when it left Libya.

While prosecutors have put the number of victims at around 700 because there are 700 body bags, forensic scientists who examined the remains put the number at closer to 900, saying many bags contained pieces of more than one person.

Malek's lawyer Massimo Ferrante told AFP his client had been "naturally shocked by the verdict, but told me he wants to fight"

They will be appealing, he said.

Firefighters who recovered the mangled bodies from the rotting ship said they had been "packed in like on the trains for Auschwitz".

The Sicilian court heard from a survivor who lost relatives on the night of the April 18-19 wreck.

The vessel sank in pitch darkness after running into the Portuguese freighter King Jacob which had raced to its rescue, the collision sending its passengers over to one side and causing the vessel to tip over.

EU to overhaul jobless benefits:

The European Commission on Tuesday proposed to overhaul rules on benefits for EU migrants in a bid to quell rising antiimmigration sentiment in Europe after the shock Brexit vote.

The new proposal by European Social Affairs Commissioner Marianne Thyssen comes six months after Britain voted to quit the EU on a wave of anti-migrant anger and allegations of benefit tourism by EU citizens living in Britain.

"We need labour mobility to help restore economic growth and competitiveness. But mobility needs to be based on clear, fair and enforceable rules," Thyssen said in a statement.

This proposal "safeguards free movement and protects citizens' rights, while strengthening the tools to address possible abuse," she added.

Under the proposals from by the Commission, the EU's executive arm, EU citizens would have to work at least three months in a new bloc country before being able to claim full unemployment benefits.

As the rules now stand, migrants can claim previous work in another EU country when calculating jobless benefits in a new one. Critics say this creates an incentive for benefits tourism.

Also in the proposal, workers living in one EU country and crossing daily into another for work will receive unemployment benefits from where they work instead of where they live.(AFP)

Fugitive ex-Syrian diplomat held:

A former Syrian diplomat convicted in absentia of a brutal rape in Switzerland in 2001 has been arrested in Versailles, France, living under a false identity as a refugee, the Geneva prosecutor's office said on Wednesday.

The man, whose name was not revealed, was sentenced to 13 years in prison for the 1997 rape of a 60-year-old woman that amounted to torture. The Geneva court cited the "unbearable severity" and perversity of his acts against the woman he had met at a spa.

Previously accredited as a Syrian diplomat to the United Nations in Geneva, he had been living in Versailles "under a new identity, with the status of a politi-cal refugee" before his arrest on Tuesday, the prosecutor's statement said. (RTRS)





France will postpone a proposed Middle East peace conference in Paris to January next year, Voice of Palestine radio reported on Wednesday, with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu refusing to participate and US attendance in doubt.

France has been trying to persuade Netanyahu, who has repeatedly rejected the conference proposal, to meet with Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas in the French capital to try to revive moribund peace talks between the two sides.

Voice of Palestine radio quoted Palestinian Ambassador to France Salman El Herfi as saying that Paris had informed the Palestinians of its delay to the peace conference until January "to make better preparations".

'Long arm' of Turkish state: The Netherlands said on Wednesday it would challenge every instance of the "long arm" of Ankara extending to its territory, after a report the Turkish embassy had sent home a list of Dutch Turks who might have sympathized with July's failed coup.

The Dutch foreign minister summoned Turkey's ambassador in The Hague after a report in De Telegraaf newspaper citing Yusuf Acar, who is both a diplomat and the chairman of the Dutch arm of Turkey's Directorate of Religious Affairs, as acknowledging he had compiled the list of "Gulenists"

Ankara accuses supporters of exiled cleric **Fethullah Gulen** of backing the short-lived coup in which over 240 people were killed. In Turkey, over 100,000 people have been detained, suspended or sacked from judiciary, media and civil service and tensions have spread within the 500,000 Dutch-Turkish community, with some suspected Gulenist sympathizers facing death threats.

In a statement, Dutch Foreign Minister Bert Koenders said the Telegraaf report was "worrying."

"We're going to ask for clarification about this," Koenders said.

"In addition, we are going to engage with the Turkish authorities and the Diyanet organization in Ankara. That's part of our policy of challenging every incident that concerns the "long arm" with our Turkish counterparts.'

Acar told De Telegraaf that he had assembled the list from publicly available sources in his capacity as an employee of the Turkish Embassy, and not as leader of the religious affairs directorate, the Divanet.

Koenders said that "if true, that means the combination of a diplomatic status with

While most of the insurgents' attacks have mainly targeted police and military in northern Sinai province, the jihadists have also targeted security forces and government officials in Cairo.

The attacks have worsened since the July 2013 ouster of Islamist president Mohamed Morsi. The ouster was led by Sisi, who was defence minister at the time.

Following the deadly dispersal by security forces of two pro-Morsi protest camps in Cairo in August 2013, mobs attacked more than 40 churches nationwide, as well as dozens of schools, houses and businesses belonging to Copts.

South seas turbulent US will challenge aggressive China

SYDNEY, Dec 14, (AFP): The United States will keep challenging Beijing's "assertive, aggressive behaviour in the South China Sea", the US Pacific commander said Wednesday, as tensions between two powers rise over comments by Donald Trump.

Admiral Harry Harris, head of the US Pacific Command, warned Washington would not accept Chinese control of the region, despite Beijing's rapid development of artificial islands capable of hosting military planes.



He remarks come as Beijing reacted angrily after Trump, the US President-elect, broke convention by speaking directly to Taiwanese leader Tsai Ing-wen — and suggested Washington could jettison decades-old Washington's "One China policy". The "One China policy" is a

diplomatic compromise allowing the US to do business with both China and Taiwan while only recognising Beijing diplomatically.

Trump

"We will not allow the shared domains to be closed down unilaterally, no matter how many bases are built on artificial features in the South China Sea," Harris said.

"We will cooperate where we can but we will be ready to confront where we must."

China insists on sovereignty over virtually all the resource-endowed South China Sea, despite rival claims from its Southeast Asian neighbours.

Recognise

But Washington has repeatedly said it does not recognise the claims, and has regularly sent warships into the strategically vital area to assert the right to freedom of navigation.

"Should others (countries) signal in this way in freedom of navigation operations? I think so, but that is again up to each individual country to make that decision," the admiral told Australian think-tank the Lowy Institute in Sydney. "The US fought its first war following our indepen-

dence to ensure freedom of navigation, and we did that when we were weak and small," he added.

"This is an enduring principle, and one of the rea sons our forces remain ready to fight tonight."

Harris added that Washington would not make Australia choose between its traditional ally, the United States, and rising world power China.

"Australia is more than capable of chewing gum and walking at the same time, and so we're not asking you to make a choice," he said.

A UN-backed tribunal ruled in July in a case brought by the Philippines that any extensive claims to the sea had no legal basis and that China's con-struction of artificial islands in disputed waters was illegal.

Australia's Foreign Minister Julie Bishop said last month that Canberra and Jakarta were considering joint patrols in the disputed region. The Australian navy has already conducted joint exercises in the South China Sea with India and the US.

President says he may not be around till end of term personally killed people: Duterte

MANILA, Dec 14, (Agencies): Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte has said he personally killed suspected criminals when he was mayor of a southern city to set an example for police.

Duterte made the comments in a speech late on Monday night to businessmen as he discussed his campaign to eradicate illegal drugs, which has seen police and unknown assailants kill thousands of people since he became president on June 30.

After speaking about police killing suspects during the current crime war, Duterte said he led similar efforts when he was mayor of Davao, the major southern city that he ruled for most of the previous 20 years.

"In Davao I used to do it personally. Just to show to the guys (police) that if I can do it why can't you," Duterte said in his speech at the presidential palace.

But he easily won presidential elections in May after promising to rollout his Davao law-and-order policies across the nation.

He pledged that 100,000 people would die in the crackdown and that so many bodies would be dumped in Manila Bay that fish there would grow fat from feeding on them.

Since taking office in late June, police have reported killing 2,086 people in anti-drug operations. More than 3,000 others have been killed in unexplained circumstances, according to official figures.

Law

Duterte, who will be 77 at the end of his six-year term in 2022, is the oldest person to be elected president in the Philippines since the post-war period.

He added that he had "found out very late" that he did not need the presidency at his age.

"It's not a question of having regrets, none at all, because I entered into it," he said, before adding:

"I realize now - I do not need it at this time of my life. But I tell you, I take pleasure at the end of the day, that's the only consolation, I have a job, I am doing something right."

Duterte had told the business leaders on Monday that he had no fear of being removed from power or assassinated because of opposition to the rising death toll in his anti-drugs campaign. "Oust me - good; assassinate me better; I have this migraine every day," he said. "I have a lot of issues with my spine. What I have is really Buerger's disease. It's an acquired thing that you get from smoking, because of nicotine.' Doctors had advised surgery on his spine, he said, but his wife, a nurse who used to work in the United States. did not agree because "a lot of operations for the spine went wrong". He added: "If you guys see me always in a sad mood, I am actually pushing a nerve here to relieve the pain," and touched the right side of his face. Presidential spokesman Ernesto Abella said the health issues had not affected Duterte's work, dismissing the remarks as "Nothing serious' Duterte no longer smokes or drinks alcohol. But Duterte missed some events during meetings of the ASEAN grouping of South East Asian nations in Laos in September and last month's Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation summit in Peru, due to migraine attacks and a bad stomach. Duterte on Tuesday announced the distribution of 2 billion pesos' (\$40 million) worth of medicines to poor families afflicted by illness, and to drug-dependent individuals at rehabilitation centres.

Marines suspended flights of their Osprey aircraft in Japan on Wednesday as anger mounts over an accident that saw one of the hybrid planes crash off the southern island of Okinawa.

The incident came at a delicate time, with Tokyo and Washington pushing to build a new airbase on Okinawa despite local opposition against the heavy US military presence there and concerns by residents about the Osprey.

The MV-22 Osprey, a so-called tiltrotor plane that can carry 24 troops, is half helicopter half turboprop and boasts the manoeuvrability of a chopper and the speed and range of a fixed-wing aircraft.

But a series of accidents mostly in the United States involving the plane have prompted protests by Okinawa residents.

The crash happened overnight after the aircraft damaged one of its propellers during an aerial refuelling drill with another plane around 10:00 pm Tuesday (1300 GMT), according to Marine Lieutenant General Lawrence Nicholson.

The Osprey pilot guided the violently shaking aircraft to shallow waters near US Marine base Camp Schwab, and conducted "a controlled landing" in the water to reduce injuries to crew and avoid flying over Okinawan residential areas, he told reporters.

Nicholson said that investigations were under way and flights would not resume until he was satisfied with the results of the reviews.

He stressed, however, that the incident was not due to a mechanical problem with the aircraft.

'Shadowy' doctors visited Park: South Korea's embattled president was visited by "shadowy" doctors who injected her with human placenta extract, a parliamentary inquiry into a growing corruption scandal heard Wednesday.

The ongoing, two-month hearing is seeking to get to the bottom of a scandal that triggered mass nationwide protests and led to lawmakers voting to impeach Park Geun-Hye last Friday.

Park stands accused of colluding with her longtime friend Choi Soon-Sil to strong arm donations from large companies worth tens of millions of dollars.

The scandal raised questions as to what extent the friend influenced the president's personal life, as it emerged that Park had sought treatment from doctors who were not part of her official medical staff but had ties with Choi.

The two doctors - who treated Choi for years testified that they had visited Park at her residence multiple times, often without the presence or knowledge of the presidential medical team.

One of them said he had given Park a series of injections containing human placenta extracts and vitamins, widely used as an anti-ageing treatment or for detoxification in South Korea.

He later became a member of the presidential medical team.

The other doctor, who runs a plastic surgery clinic in the affluent Seoul district of Gangnam, testified that he had visited Park multiple times since 2013 to handle her "skin troubles."

He however denied that he had performed cosmetic procedures on Park as lawmakers grilled him with past photos of small bruises on the president's face, which he said were possibly traces of wrinkle filler needles.

Chinese Muslim website down: A

popular website for Chinese Muslims has been inaccessible since Saturday after a critical letter addressed to Chinese President Xi Jinping was posted in one of its forums

Users of China Muslim Net, one of China's main websites carrying material by and about the Hui, a large and relatively well-assimilated community of China's Muslims, say they have been unable to access the website since Saturday.

A critical open letter addressed to Xi had been uploaded in a discussion forum on the site hours before it became inaccessible.

Young, internet-savvy Hui consider the website to be an important forum for discussing matters relating to their religious practice.

Chinese officials recently said that religious extremism had begun to spread to central China from the violence-prone far western region of Xinjiang, mostly populated by ethnic Uighurs, who make up another large portion of China's Muslims.

China's constitution guarantees religious freedom, but rights groups say the officially atheist ruling Communist Party seeks to restrict religious practice, especially for Muslims. The Chinese government strongly denies such charges.

The reason for the website's inaccessibility was not clear.

The internet address for China Muslim Net on Wednesday showed a message saying the website was under maintenance.

The Cyberspace Administration of China, the government's internet regulator, did not reply to requests for comment on Wednesday. Messages and calls to the website's chief executive went unanswered.

A copy of the critical letter posted on the site, and seen by Reuters, called for the release of a student named Kwong Pyong who the letter said has been unreachable since October, shortly after he shared photos online of a satirical T-shirt with a message likening President Xi to Hitler.

The student said he planned to wear the shirt in public.

Shortly after the letter was posted, a scholar at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences, Xi Wuyi, shared a screenshot of it along with other China Muslim Net content on her Weibo account, saying that the

Duterte, 71, also responded to criticism from human rights groups and US President Barack Obama about his anti-crime tactics, vowing he would not be intimidated by their criticism into stopping.

Rights groups have previously accused Duterte of running vigilante death squads in Davao that killed more than 1,000 suspected criminals, including children accused of petty crimes.

Duterte has variously denied and acknowledged involvement in the

Dian Yulia Novi and her husband Nur Solihin were among four suspected militants arrested on Saturday after police detected their plot to bomb a guard-changing ceremony at the presidential palace. A neighborhood on the outskirts of Jakarta was evacuated after a bomb was found.

The former migrant worker said in an interview with TVOne that she learned about jihad on social media. She was influenced by articles from an Islamic website and Aman Abdurrahman, a radical cleric serving a nine-year sentence.

Court orders action on child drug abuse

NEW DELHI, Dec 14, (Agencies): India's top court on Wednesday ordered the government to come up with a plan to tackle child drug abuse, acting on a petition from Nobel Peace laureate **Kailash Satyarthi**'s child rights group.

With government figures showing almost one in five addicts in India is under 21, the Supreme Court said more needed to be done to educate young people about the dangers of substance abuse in India



The court ordered New Delhi to "evolve a national action plan within six months to combat drug abuse amongst school children".

It said the government should conduct a national survey to determine how widespread the problem was, and include education about drugs in the school curriculum.

Satyarthi

"Trafficking and drug abuse, inherently linked to each other, are the most prevalent forms of organised crime in the world," said Satyarthi in response to the judgement.

"This petition was filed to ensure that children are provided with a better, more healthy childhood," he said in a statement.

Filed

Satyarthi's Bachpan Bachao Andolan (Save Childhood Movement) filed the petition before the Supreme Court in 2014.

It asked the court to order the government to create rehabilitation centres in each district of India, with a special wing for children.

It also urged a national action plan on substance abuse, to include counselling and rehabilitation.

Experts say peer pressure and academic stress are driving children as young as 11 to drugs. Almost one in five of India's drug and alcohol

addicts are under the age of 21, according to a 2013 report by the National Commission for the Protection of Child Rights.

Nearly five percent are aged between 12 and 17 years, the report found.


India arrests central bank official: Indian investigators arrested a central bank official Tuesday for allegedly illegally exchanging old bills worth some 15 million rupees (\$222,000) for new ones as the country faces a cash crisis.

The arrest comes at a time when many Indians are struggling to find the cash to buy food following the government's shock move last month to withdraw high-denomination 500 and 1,000 rupee banknotes from circulation in a bid to tackle tax evasion.

Threat 'stalls' homecoming

NGALA, Nigeria, Dec 14, (Agencies): Seen from above in a helicopter, the straight white walls of Ngala camp in northeast Nigeria carve a misshapen star out of the dry brown scrub.

There are 55,000 people living in tents and straw huts inside the geometric garrison, protected from Boko Haram jihadists by the mili-

tary. Though the city of Ngala is less than a kilometre away, these people can't go back to a normal life. Boko

Haram is still here, the only thing we can do is wait for

food," said Aishi, a 50-year-old woman with deep lines in her tired face.

Over the past year, Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari's government has made repeated announcements that Boko Haram is close to being defeated and that thousands of people are returning home.

"They are done for," said Buhari early this month. "The security situation in Nigeria had improved significantly.

But many reclaimed towns, like Ngala, are charred, looted ruins still vulnerable to Boko Haram attacks.

Supporting

So the people live in the guarded camps, cut off from any means of supporting themselves and dependant on external aid, while international humanitarian organisations warn of an impeding famine.

"Here we can't do anything, we can't leave the camp because Boko Haram will attack us," said Abdullahi Asuha, a traditional chief.

"Boko Haram has plundered our crops, our herds and burned our land.

Authorities estimate that 3,000 people have come to the Ngala camp in the past month, seeking shelter and food in a devastated region.

Today virtually all of Nigeria's northeast is under military control.

Signs of the seven-year Boko Haram war that has killed over 20,000 people and displaced more than 2.6 million are everywhere.

'Drive' drags down Nepal's economy: India's scrapping of high-value bank notes last month has dragged down economic growth in neighbouring Nepal with trade, remittances and tourist numbers all down, BMI Research, a group company of the Fitch rating agency, said on Wednesday.

BMI has revised down its forecast for landlocked Nepal's economy, saying that India's demonetisation could shave Nepal's growth down to 2.2 percent for this fiscal year to July 2017, from an earlier estimate of 2.5 percent.

Nepal's \$21 billion economy was already suffering with growth at less than 0.8 percent in the 2015-16 fiscal year after earthquakes in 2015 that killed about 9,000 people.

"The disruption in funds from India is likely to weigh on ongoing reconstruction efforts," the research agency said in a report, adding that Nepal's economy was heavily reliant on India for trade, jobs and aid.

Pellets blind hundreds of Kashmiris: Indian authorities call the shotgun shells filled with hundreds of small metal pellets a "non-lethal" weapon for crowd control, but that does not make them harmless. They've inflicted a permanent toll on hundreds of Kashmiris hit by them.

Their faces are scarred. Their eyes are damaged or simply gone, replaced with prosthetics. And their psychological wounds run deeper still.

"What I miss most is being able to read the Holy Quran," says Firdous Ahmad Dar, 25, a Kashmiri man who lost vision in both eyes after being shot with the pellets during an anti-India protest in the troubled Himalayan region.

The pellets have been in use here since 2010. Soldiers are trained to fire the shotguns below protesters' waists, causing immense pain but - in theory – no permanent injuries. But a police official acknowledged that the rules are "more or less not followed because of the intensity of stonethrowing protests." The officer spoke on condition of anonymity in keeping with department policy.

1st VP denies abusing rival:

Afghanistan's First Vice-President Abdul Rashid Dostum denied on Tuesday accusations that he had beaten and abducted a political rival and threatened him with sexual violence, in a case that sparked Western calls for a full and fair investigation.

Dostum, a former warring faction commander with a fearsome reputation and a lingering power base in northern Afghanistan, was witnessed by hundreds of people, according to The New York Times, beating and then ordering his men to detain Ahmad Ishchi at a public sporting event in late November.

Ishchi was once a member of the same political faction as Dostum but later fell out with him.

Reuters has been unable to confirm independently the accusations made by Ishchi against Dostum.

"He (Ishchi) was detained by Afghan security forces for allegations of funding the opposition and having a hand in repeated security issues," a spokesperson for Dostum said in a statement, denying any physical or sexual abuse had taken place.

"For some time there has been a destructive movement by some unknown circles against the First Vice President," it added. Afghan President Ashraf Ghani's office

promised a thorough investigation of Ishchi's accusations.

While imprisoned by Dostum's men, Ishchi told Reuters he was repeatedly beaten, including by rifles, and threatened with sexual violence

After being held by men loyal to Dostum for five days, Ishchi said he remained for another 10 days with security forces who provided medical aid. Pledging an investigation into Ishchi's claims, Afghan presidential spokesman Haroon Chakhansori said: "For the Afghan government nobody is above the law. Rule of law and accountability begins in the government itself and we are committed to it." (RTRS)

Rohingya heart of crisis

YANGON, Dec 14, (RTRS): As Myanmar's army was stepping up an anti-insurgency operation in the country's northwest in October, senior officers cancelled talks with their Bangladeshi counterparts, straining ties with a key potential ally in dealing with the violence on their border.

The cancelled meetings, revealed in documents seen by Reuters, are the latest on a long list of failed initiatives to improve relations between fractious neighbours who both see the largely stateless Muslim Rohingya at the heart of the crisis as

the other nation's problem. Bangladeshi diplomats say the abrupt cancellation of the talks, planned for mid-October, reflected Myanmar's reluctance to deepen bilateral ties and press ahead with talks on security cooperation and the establishment of border liaison officers.

"Those two documents are incredibly important, particularly given the situation we're dealing with right now, but we've hit a wall," said a senior Bangladeshi official, who did not want to be identified because of the private nature of the exchanges.

Myanmar officials did not comment on the meetings.

Defusing the deep-seated mistrust between the two countries is crucial both to improving the plight of the Rohingya minority and curbing the insurgency Myanmar's government says it is fighting in the northwest, diplomats and analysts say.

The military cited "unforeseen commitments" as a reason to cancel the nearly week-long talks scheduled in Bangladesh from Oct. 16.

The letter was sent four days after nine Myanmar police officers were killed in attacks on border posts. Since then, security forces have flooded northern Rakhine, hunting a Rohingya insurgent group the government says was responsible.

Five days later, the head of the Myanmar police division against transnational crime also pulled out of talks with the Bangladeshi border guard force planned for Oct. 25-27 in Dhaka. citing the security situation in Rakhine.

Soldiers also seized the headquarters of the national elections commission and sealed it off just hours before the mediation delegation representing regional bloc ECOWAS touched down in the tiny riverside nation.

Jammeh, who has ruled Gambia since taking power in a 1994 coup and is accused of widespread rights abuses, initially conceded defeat to his main challenger, Adama Barrow. But in a dramatic about-face that drew international condemnation he then rejected the poll results last Friday.

JOHANNESBURG: South Sudanese rebel leader Riek Machar, who fled to Democratic Republic of Congo in August after fierce fighting, is being held in South Africa to stop him stirring up trouble, diplomatic and political sources said on Tuesday.

Removing Machar from circulation would be a blow to his rebel SPLA-IO faction in its three-year war with President Salva Kiir's mainstream SPLA, and could sway a conflict the **United Nations** fears is tilting towards genocide.

Over a million people have fled the world's youngest nation since conflict erupted in late 2013 when Kiir, an ethnic Dinka, fired Machar, a Nuer, as his deputy.

20-yr spending freeze OK'd:

Brazil's Senate approved Tuesday a 20-year freeze on government spending billed as the centerpiece of austerity reforms aimed at restoring economic health to the troubled Latin American giant. The upper house voted 53 to 16 to

lock in the spending ceiling.

Center-right President Michel Temer says tough measures are needed to get Brazil's finances back under control, but his austerity policies have prompted violent protests and were criticized last week by a UN expert as

"a historic mistake." Police were out in force in the capital Brasilia to protect government

buildings from demonstrators during the upper house vote, which was wrapped up unexpectedly quickly.

Luis Jorge, a union leader who had come for the protests, expressed anger at the Senate for voting "before we could demonstrate. That makes us very angry.

However, hundreds of people, many with their faces covered, clashed with police later Tuesday. Security forces fired tear gas to try to disperse the crowd.

A bus was burned during the demonstration, which drew about 2,000 people, police said. The police operation in the capital ended with 100 arrests, officials said. In Sao Paulo, left-wing protesters attacked the headquarters of FIESP, the country's main industrial association, before being driven back.

The vote means that the spending cap is now mandated by the constitution, serving as the central plank in Temer's bid to "transform" the broken economy, which is in deep recession. (AFP)

Fast-track reforms approved: Colombian judges Tuesday approved special fast-track procedures to imple-

ment the government's contested peace accord with leftist FARC rebels which aims to end half a century of conflict. The government says the fast-track

reforms are needed to see through the peace deal before a fragile ceasefire collapses. Constitutional court judges voted

eight to one in favor of the measure, the court said. The decision gives the green light

to President Juan Manuel Santos to use accelerated legislative procedures to pass the various reforms included

in the peace accord through Congress, where his side holds a majority. Under the deal, the Revolutionary

Armed Forces of Colombia, or FARC, must demobilize and surrender their weapons within six months.

The FARC will relaunch as a political party and its members will receive an amnesty or non-custodial sentences -- the most contested part of the accord.

Santos's opponents argue the deal grants impunity to rebels guilty of war crimes. (ÅFP)

History ... hurricanes Florida's 'shipwreck' an unparalleled find

MIAMI, Dec 14, (AFP): Treasure hunters have apparently found the 500-year-old remains of a naval expedition led by a colonizer who could have changed Florida's history, making it French-speaking at least for a while. The big question is if the shipwreck is that of "La Trinite," the 32-gun flagship of a fleet led by Jean Ribault, a French navigator who tried to establish a Protestant colony in the southeast US under orders from King Charles IX. They probably are, say authorities in Florida, the French government and independent archeologists. And if they in fact are, this is an unparalleled find, said John de Bry, director of the Center for Historical Archeology, a not-for-profit organization.

before Charles IX; and a stone monument with the French coat of arms that was to be used to claim the new territory. The remains are "consistent with material associated with the lost French Fleet of 1565," said Meredith Beatrice, director of communications with the Florida Department of State.

Attack

In 1565, Ribault set sail from Fort Caroline, today Jacksonville, to attack his arch-enemy, the Spaniard Pedro Menendez de Aviles, who had been sent to Florida by King Philip of Spain to thwart French plans to set up a colony.

But Ribault got caught in a hurricane, which destroyed "La Trinite" and three other galleons and ended French dreams of claiming Florida.

Ribault and hundreds of other French Huguenots were massacred by Menendez de Aviles.

"If the French had not been driven south and ships sunk by the hurricane, we would have a totally different story," said de Bry. "Florida could have been speaking French for a number of years.'

In modern day Florida, archeologists and historians have been looking for this shipwreck for years.

Two years ago, an expedition from the state-run St. Augustine Lighthouse Archaeological Maritime Program gave it a shot but found nothing.

Marine archeologist Chuck Meide, who led that try, said "this is one of the most important shipwreck discoveries we have had in Florida.

The find was finally made in May of this year by a treasure hunting firm called Global Marine Exploration.

Precisely where has not been disclosed.

"It is not advisable," said French consul general Clement Leclerc.

"This is potentially a major discovery and we think it deserves a scientific and rigorous analysis and exploitation, because we think it should be later presented to the general public given its historical interest," he told AFP. Pokemon get you on the Go: It has been hailed as a revolutionary way to get people moving, using smartphones to pursue cartoon creatures through city parks and streets on foot, instead of taking the car or metro.

But has Pokemon Go made people more active and healthy? A study Wednesday reported mixed success.

In the first week of playing the game, people took 955 additional steps per day on average - equalling nearly half the World Health Organization's recommended physical activity level, researchers found. But this soon petered out, with activity

levels "back to pre-installation levels" of around 4,250 steps per day by week six of playing the game which has become a global phenomenon

"The results suggest that the positive health impact of Pokemon Go is moderate and diminishes after six weeks of playing, said a statement from the Harvard TH Chan School of Public Health, whose researchers conducted the study. The team measured daily walking

among a group of 1,182 adults aged 18-35 in the United States. All used an iPhone 6 smartphone, which automatically records the number of steps you take while carrying the device.

They compared the average number of steps taken per day for four weeks prior to downloading Pokemon Go, and for six weeks thereafter.

Pokemon Go is an augmented reality game which uses overlaying graphics to get people chasing cute cartoon creatures that appear in their vicinity, as seen through their phone camera.

The game has been downloaded over 500



NASA troubleshooting problem:

NASA's Mars rover Curiosity has halted its trek up a mountain filled with potentially habitable niches for life while engineers troubleshoot a problem with one of its key instruments, scientists said on Tuesday.

Curiosity landed on Mars four years ago to determine if the planet most like Earth in the solar system ever had the ingredients for life. To answer the question, Curiosity has been drilling into rocks and chemically analyzing the samples.

Drilling operations have been suspended however due to a suspected problem with the instrument's motor, project scientist with NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory Ashwin Vasavada told reporters at the American Geophysical Union conference in San Francisco. The problem first appeared about a week ago, Vasavada said. Project engineers thought they had resolved it, but the problems cropped back up, he said.

"If we can't move the drill bit down, there's no drilling," Vasavada said. "There isn't any way to sugar-coat that one."

The problem comes as scientists are beginning to glimpse a history of Mars replete with life-friendly, water-rich environments and intriguing chemistry, including the first detection of the element boron. (RTRS)

Al Massad's 'Blessed Benefit' a jailhouse comedy

LOS ANGELES, Dec 14, (RTRS): Jordanian producer-director Mahmoud Al Massad is no stranger to the Dubai Film Festival. His documentaries "Recyle" (2007) and "This Is My Picture When I Was Dead" (2010) both premiered in the fest's Muhr competition. This year he returned to the competition with fiction feature "Blessed Benefit," an ironic comedy set mostly in a Jordanian prison.

Asked why he decided to move into fiction, Al Massad says he doesn't think there is any difference between fiction and documentary films, in that they both basically tell a story. He says the only difference is the approach he takes. "In fiction, you work on a script, and in documentary you work on following of daily events back and forth to create the full story," he notes. And which approach does he prefer? "It's hard to say, because I love both," he answers.

The inherent risk in making a documentary, of course, is that the story might take an unplanned course. "In fiction, you have no limit to what you can create and you are in control of the outcome," Al Massad notes. "The tough part, after writing a good script, is finding the right character or person to deliver the message of the story.

In "Blessed Benefit" the lead character is played by Ahmad Thaher, whose real-life story inspired the film.

Al Massad says he's known Ahmad for over two decades and always dreamt of making a film about him "because he's such an interesting and very positive character, no matter what comes his way or happens around him.

In real life Ahmad, who worked as a contractor, has spent three

months in prison "for taking 1800 Jordanian dinars (about \$2,540.00) and not delivering the job he was asked to do from a client," Al Massad notes. That is exactly what happens in the film.

Comfortable

One of the ironies of "Blessed Benefit" is that the character played by Ahmad eventually finds himself more comfortable and free inside the prison than in his everyday life. So, what sort of reputation do Jordanian jails and Jordanian police actually have?

"The police are friendly and helpful," says Al Massad. "In terms of prisons, I have visited and scouted several in Jordan and I noticed how they treat prisoners humanely, unlike what we see or hear of in other countries worldwide," he adds.

Most of the cast are non-professionals.

Working with them was very challenging, but "they were very eager to be part of the film and this is why I believe they brought honesty into their performance," he notes.

Besides the 'blessed benefit' of being in jail, another comic element of the film are visualizations of Ahmad's nightmares while behind bars. Shooting them required a lot of preparation "in order for them to have the same look as the rest of the film," Al Massad recounts. With his cin-ematographer they decided to shoot these scenes in sequential order so they could begin with a realistic feel and subsequently veer into fantasy.

Al Massad, who lives in the Netherlands, moved back to Jordan to make "Blessed Benefit." He'd always wanted to return to his country but, despite the boost that Naji Abu Nowar's Oscar-nominated Theeb has supposedly given Jordanian cinema, his return home actually coincided with decreasing opportunities for filmmakers in the region.

"There are less than a handful Arab funds left to support filmmaking," he laments.

Nevertheless, Al Massad already has a new project in the works. He is working on an new narrative feature project for the international market which he hopes to shoot in Dubai, where the story takes place.

• Rogue One: A Star Wars Story' seemed suspicious on paper, like any film saddled with the dreaded "spinoff" label. For a while all the odds looked stacked against it too - reshoots, script changes and a director in Gareth Edwards whose last blockbuster "Godzilla" had visual flair but no humanity, not to mention the fact that the film would be asking us to learn a dozen new characters with strange names, none of which were Skywalker or Solo. And of course as with any franchise there's that ever-present knowledge that, in some ways, this is another line-item on a corporate profit sheet.

As it turns out, those should-be liabilities were only assets in the end. "Rogue One" is a bold and stirring adventure film that will have both fans and casual observers spellbound. It is easily the most exciting blockbuster in recent memory this side of "Mad Max: Fury Road," and that includes "The Force Awakens," which now looks lazy and bloated with sentimentality and fan service in comparison to the subversive ingenuity of "Rogue One."

How refreshing it is to have a truly contained film that doesn't have any objective beyond the story at hand. There is nothing to advance, nothing to tease, no "maybe we'll find answers in the next movie in 2 years" here. It is just allowed to be what it is, which is an intense and visually engrossing powder keg of a film.

It's a simple idea, really: Who are the rebels who stole the plans for the Death Star? That pivotal action kicked off the original "Star Wars" and it's pretty inherently dramatic.

Loosely, "Rogue One" is rooted around the plight of Jvn Erso, whose father Galen Erso (Mads Mikkelsen) is a scientist who once worked for the Empire. He gets drawn back in by the ambitious Orson Krennic (Ben Mendelsohn) to help finish the Death Star, leaving Jyn, played by Beau and Dolly Gadsdon as a young girl, and Felicity Jones as an adult, to survive on her own. Jyn is sort of raised by a rebel extremist in Saw Gerrera (an over-the-top Forest Whitaker), but much of this is left both unseen and unexplained.

What we know is she's a child of war, and an almost apathetic one at that, until she's rescued from imprisonment by a group of rebels hoping her familial connec-

"Sherlock Holmes 3," is writing the screenplay. While "Suicide Squad" received

'Rogue' dark, exhilarating blast

Characters

The real feat of "Rogue One" is that Edwards and screenwriters Chris Weitz and Tony Gilroy create a world with actual stakes, making the audience feel for and worry about characters we've just met. It doesn't rely on decades old nostalgia, although there is a bit of that too in mostly unobtrusive ways. There's also some CGI that veers pretty dramatically into the uncanny valley. But like the somewhat slow and disjointed beginning, eventually it all just washes over you, especially as the riveting action kicks in, taking you from the trenches to space and back again. The only downside of the thrilling battles in the third act is that it means less time with the leads - especially Jones, Luna and Mendelsohn, whose performances make up for the script's occasional deficiencies.

"Rogue One: A Star Wars Story" is one of the best Star Wars films ever made. Only time will tell if it will surpass "The Empire Strikes Back" as the franchise standard bearer. There's a compelling case to be made.

On screen, the names Leia, Amidala and Rey are as instantly recognizable and known as any others – and none were ever just playing "the girl."

With this now 39-year-old tradition in mind, "Rogue One: A Star Wars Story" introduces a new heroine to the ranks – Jyn Erso, an abandoned child of war who must decide what she believes in as the world devolves

into chaos. Director Gareth Edwards talked about developing the character and settling on the idea that "Jyn isn't just a woman - she's a person.'

"I wanted to make a character that I would want to be. Not to fancy her or want to marry her, but want to be her. It was just a cool person," Edwards continued.

He and the team at Lucasfilm settled on English actress Felicity Jones, 33, to play the part. Already an Oscar nominee for her portrayal of Jane Hawking in "The Theory of Everything," Jones had been making a name for herself in smaller projects, like the indie romance "Like Crazy." But recently, she's been dipping her toes in larg-er-scale films, like "The Amazing Spider-Man" sequel.

Lucasfilm head Kathleen Kennedy was drawn to Jones's ability to bring a sense of gravitas and importance to everything, while also exhibiting a "real whimsy."

"For years I've been constantly looking for these kinds of parts and these kinds of films and the opportunity to make it on such a large scale was pretty hard to turn down, said Jones, who also appears in the upcoming fantasy tale "A Monster Calls" and opposite Tom Hanks in "Inferno."

Jyn, unlike the other classic "Star Wars" heroines, gets the full weight of an origin story in "Rogue One," out Friday. Her father, Galen Erso (Mads Mikkelsen), is a scientist who once worked for the Empire. left that life behind and, at the beginning of the film, gets drawn back in to help finish the Death Star – leaving his young daughter behind to fend for herself.

As an adult, she's forced to confront her past in various ways, especially when she becomes entangled with the rebel alliance.

"I like her determination," Jones said, "She doesn't let go of something until she succeeds. She is very, very focused and tenacious in the face of when she's set a task."

Jones trained intensively to portray this hardened fighter working closely with stunt teams who she said spent hours humoring her need to practice constantly. Fittingly, her costume is not a fussy dress or a metal bikini, but rather one of a warrior.

"Jyn is someone who's had to survive on her own and at any moment she's going to have to be running away from someone, she's going to have to defend herself physically," Jones said. "She has really built a little shell around herself, so her costume had to reflect the needs of her life and unfortunately she's not going to that many parties." (AP)


Cinematography race wide open Academy disqualifies Arrival, Silence scores

By Kristopher Tapley

Three original scores – "Arrival", "Manchester by the Sea," and "Silence" – were conspicuous by their absence from the list of eligible contenders released by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences Tuesday. That's because they were disqualified by the organization.

On "Arrival," the Academy's music branch ruled unanimously that voters would be influenced by the use of borrowed material in determining the value of Johann Johannsson's original contributions to Denis Villeneuve's alien invasion psychodrama.

Per Rule 15 II E of the Academy's rules and eligibility guidelines, a score "shall not be eligible if it has been diluted by the use of pre-existing music, or it has



been diminished in impact by the predominant use of songs or any music not composed specifically for the film by the submitting composer."

The only pre-existing music in the film is an emotional piece by composer Max Richter called "On the Nature of Daylight," which also featured prominently in Martin Scorsese's "Shutter Island." It was determined that there

would be no way for the au-dience to distinguish those cues, which bookend the film, from Johannsson's score cues.

Process

A Paramount source said original compositions constitute 86 percent of the film's soundtrack. There is no appeals process and the branch's decisions on these matters are final.

Richter is actually eligible himself for two original scores, "Miss Sloane" and "Morgan."

Johannsson has been nominated twice, for "The Theory of Everything" and "Sicario." His original contribu-tions to "Arrival" are noteworthy as part of an increased blurring of the line between music and sound design in film music. For "Arrival," he told Variety in an inin film music. For "Arrival," he told Variety in an in-terview that he recorded to a 16-track tape loop for a vaguely analog quality, capturing acoustic sounds from cello, piano, and wind instruments, along with vocals. "What you're hearing is very old-fashioned, in a way," Johannsson said. "It's layers and layers and lay-ers of piano — but without the attack. It's like piano wire You're hearing just the sustain of the piano."

wire. You're hearing just the sustain of the piano."

Pre-existing music also diminished Lesley Barber's original contributions to Kenneth Lonergan's "Man-chester by the Sea": The film's soundtrack features a number of classical compositions throughout.

"It certainly comes as a disappointment to learn that my score to 'Manchester by the Sea' was deemed in-eligible by the Academy," Barber said in a statement to Variety. "In the making of this film, our director decided early on to use certain pieces of music from the classical repertoire as part of the music blend in the film. While I understand that this might be confusing to Academy members in their consideration of what is mine, it was obviously not the basis upon which music was chosen for the film. While I accept the Academy's decision, I also support my director's decision to use these pieces and I'm also very proud of the substantial contribution (referenced correctly in many reviews)

'Collateral Beauty' a drama of parental grief Smith channels personal grief

NEW YORK, Dec 14, (Agencies): Will Smith had already begun researching his role for "Collateral Beauty" when he learned that his father was terminally ill.

Smith said at the film's world premiere in New York on Monday that he had to channel the emotions of that tragic news into a demanding film role. Smith's father, Willard Carroll Smith Jr, died on Nov 7.

"My father was diagnosed and given six weeks, so you know, to be hit with that in the process and then what we decided to do was just use the preparation of the character to actually deal with what my father was experiencing," Smith said. "It became our way of saying goodbye, essentially. It was a really beautiful confluence of art and life. Smith stars in the film as a father who suffers a great tragedy and begins to question the point of existence. "It is such a beautiful concept. It's a guy that experiences a loss and gets furious at the universe, and writes these letters to Love, Time and Death, and his mind is so twisted that he mails the letters. And then, Love, Time and Death respond. You know, it's that beautiful Christmas twist to it, but dealing with real issues,' Smith said. The film also stars Helen Mirren in the role of Death. She admitted to loving the script, and felt it shared the same vibe as Christmas classics like "It's a Wonderful Life" and "A Christmas Carol." "There was something very, very true in the center of it. And kind of as a Christmas movie, you know it's kind of a pretty cool Christmas gift of a movie," Mirren said. Edward Norton, who plays

The Academy, in its rules and eligibility guidelines, specifically defines an original score as "a substantial body of music that serves as original dramatic underscoring and is written specifically for the motion picture by the submitting composer." There is, however, no objective metric by which to determine what is and is not "substantial," beyond the collective opinion of branch members.

This year's original score Oscar winner was Ennio Morricone for Quentin Tarantino's "The Hateful Eight."

After an unprecedented dominance of the field by DP Emmanuel Lubezki, who won the cinematography Oscar three years in a row for "Gravity", "Birdman." and "The Revenant." this year's competition in the cinematography category appears to be wide open.

Contenders range from extraordinary technical achievements ("Billy Lynn's Long Halftime Walk", "The Jungle Book") to more indie-flavored human stories shot by relative newcomers ("La La Land", "Lion," and "Arrival").

Such perennial candidates as Lubezki ("Knight of Cups"), **Roger Deakins** ("Hail Caesar!"), **Tom Stern** ("Sully"), and Robert Richardson ("Live by Night") should not be counted out, but the field is more unpredictable than it has been in several years.

John Toll's astonishing visuals for "Billy Lynn," director Ang Lee's bold foray into high frame rate, high dynamic range 3D, will garner significant consideration in spite of the film's mixed reaction thus far from the public. The cinematography community is always watching in anticipation for the latest tech breakthroughs, and Toll, a master visual artist, may have shown them the first steps to the future.


Meanwhile, Bill Pope's work on the lush imagery of "The Jungle Book" involved groundbreaking levels of collaboration with visual effects pros and other digital artists. As with "Gravity", "Life of Pi," and "Avatar," a nomination here would likely spark controversy given the gray area between the two fields. Janusz Kaminski ("The BFG") may be similarly situated.

On the other end of the tech spectrum is "Silence," for which Rodrigo Prieto and Martin Scorsese returned to 35mm film in the anamorphic format to envelope viewers in 17th century Japan.

"Marty and I immediately agreed that we wanted 'Silence' to be on film," Prieto says. "Film has incredible color depth for nature, which surrounds these missionary priests, and for skin tones. I love playing with film, bending and twisting the negative to achieve different textures.'

Three-time Oscar winner ("The Aviator", "Hugo", "JFK") Richardson was nominated last year for "The Hateful 8," in which he resurrected the widescreen Ultra Panavision 70 film format. A nomination for "Live by Night" would be his 10th, tying him with Conrad Hall and leaving only Deakins and a handful of golden-era DPs with more.

On "Live by Night," Ben Affleck's Prohibition-era tale, the cinematographer felt the story and shooting style would benefit from large-format digital. He shot with a combination of Arri Alexa 65 - a camera formerly on the bleeding edge but fast becoming a standard tool and Panavision lenses, some with older glass. (RTRS)

NEW YORK: The comic book heroine Wonder Woman has been abruptly fired from her honorary ambassador job at the United Nations following protests from both inside and outside the world organization that a white, skimpily dressed American prone to violence wasn't the best role model for girls.

Rheal LeBlanc, head of press and external relations, said Tuesday the appointment of Wonder Woman as an Honorary Ambassador for the Empowerment of Women and Girls would end this week, a move that come less than two months after a splashy ceremony at the UN, which attracted actresses Lynda Carter, who played Wonder Woman in the 1970s TV series, and Gal Gadot, who has taken on the role in the forthcoming "Wonder Woman" film.

Critics said the appointment was tone deaf at a time when real women are fighting against sexual exploitation and abuse, and that there were plenty of real heroines that could be the face for gender equality. At the time of the appointment, there was no indication it would end so quickly. (AP)

LOS ANGELES: Recently launched Cristal Pictures is developing and fully financing a science-fiction disaster movie with the working title "Imago" as a Chinese coproduction.

Cristal has bought the "Imago" pitch from writing partners Adam Robitel (director of the upcoming "Insidious: Chapter 4") and Gavin Heffernan ("The Taking of Deborah Logan"). The duo is writing the screenplay in which near-future scientific experiments to reverse global warming backfire with unimaginable consequences.

Beijing-based producer and Cristal Pictures founder Chris Liu said "Imago" represents the first big budget sci-fi disaster movie to be made in **China** as an official Chinese co-production. Plans are to cast Western as well as Chinese actors with shooting on location in and around Hong Kong.

It asks a lot of an audience to sit through a drama about a parent grieving over the loss of a child. The subject is rough - and beyond that, it has a vast potential for programmed pathos and fake sentiment. That's part of the miracle of "Manchester by the Sea." Braithwaite dead at 104

Award-winning writer Hazzard dies aged 85

NEW YORK, Dec 14, (AP): Shirley Hazzard, an award-winning novelist who wrote of love affairs disrupted and intensified by age, distance and war, has died at age 85.

Hazzard had been in failing health and died Monday at her home in Manhattan, according to her friend Frances Alston. The Australian-born Hazzard had lived in New York City for decades, but also had spent time in Hong Kong, Britain, New Zealand and Italy, an international perspective shared by her characters.

She was a writer of pre-digital tastes who composed on a yellow legal pad and had no interest in computers or even an answering machine. Her novels, too, had a vintage wealth of detail and in-



trospection that led to comparisons to Henry James and some criticism that the sophistication of her prose interfered with the enjoyment of the narrative.

Peers and awards judges recommended her highly. The Transit of Venus, published in 1980, won the National Book Critics Circle prize. Hazzard also was

Hazzard

a three-time National Book Award finalist and won in 2003 for "The Great Fire." Her other books included the short story collections "Cliffs of Fall" and "People in Glass Houses." Hazzard also wrote a memoir about her friend Graham Greene, "Greene in Capri," and two books about the United Nations, where she worked in the 1950s: "The Countenance of Truth" and "The Defeat of an Ideal.'

Rare

Rare was the happy marriage or simple romance in a Hazzard book. From early stories such as "A Place in the Country" to the novel "Bay of Noon," she wrote of strained and cold relationships and the inevitable search for outside comfort. True passion was often forbidden. Hazzard acknowledged that "The Great Fire," about a tender affair between a young Australian woman and a British soldier in World War II, was based on her own youthful romance that her parents had ended.

The author did find love in New York in 1963 when she met author and translator Francis Steegmuller at a party hosted by novelist Muriel Spark.

Hazzard, the daughter of a diplomat, was born in Sydney in 1931 and lived throughout Asia as a young woman. "The Great Fire" was inspired partly by people she knew in the late 1940s in Hong Kong, where she helped monitor the civil war in China on behalf of British intelligence.

"The literary atmosphere of that office – British officers, linguists, young veterans who were almost innately charged with literary reference - was joyful," she later told The Paris Review. "For the first time, I could share literature with delight and freedom.

Hazzard never attended college, but compensated with the very finest self-education - reading and travelling constantly. In her early 20s, she joined the United Nations and spent a decade in the General Service division, which she would jokingly call "the dungeon." She did at least have spare time to work on writing. An early short story was accepted by The New Yorker, and "Cliffs of Fall" was published in 1963 to encouraging reviews. "Bay of Noon," released in 1970, found a new readership 40 years later. It was shortlisted for the Lost Man Booker Prize, established for fiction from 1970 that, because of rule changes at the time, was not eligible for the 1970 or 1971 Booker award.

Beloved TV dad 'Growing Pains' star Thicke dies

LOS ANGELES, Dec 14, (Agencies): Alan Thicke, a versatile performer who gained his greatest renown as the beloved dad on a long-running sitcom, has died at age 69.

Carleen Donovan, who is a publicist for Thicke's son, singer Robin Thicke, said the actor died from a heart attack on Tuesday in Los Angeles. She had no further details.

Thicke was a Canadian-born TV host, writer, composer and actor well-known in his homeland before making his name in the United States, most notably with the ABC series "Growing Pains."

On that comedy, which aired from 1985 to 1992, Thicke played Dr Jason Seaver, a psychiatrist and fatherknows-best who moved his practice into his home so his wife could go

back to work as a reporter. Along with his clients, he had three (later four) kids under foot, including his oldest son, Mike, played by breakout heart-throb Kirk Cameron, who served as a constant source of comedic trouble for the family.

Born in Ontario, Canada, in 1947, Thicke was nominated for three Emmy Awards for his work in the late 1970s as a writer for Barry Manilow's talk show, and later for a satirical take on the genre in the variety show "America 2-Night."

He composed several popular theme songs, including the origi-nal theme for "The Wheel of Fortune" and other shows including "The Facts of Life" and "Diff"rent Strokes.'

Virtual

Perhaps his boldest assault on the US market was as a virtual unknown taking on the King of Late Night, Johnny Carson. "Thicke of the Night" was a syndicated talk-musicand-comedy show meant to go headto-head against NBC's "The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson.'

It premiered in September 1983 with great fanfare, boasting an innovative format and regulars including Richard Belzer, Arsenio Hall, Gilbert Gottfried and Fred Willard. But all too quickly, it was evident that Carson wasn't going to be dethroned, and the ambitious "Thicke" disap-peared into the night after one season. In the 1990s and beyond, Thicke stayed busy as a celebrity TV host and with guest shots on dozens of series, including "How I Met Your Mother" and, this year, the Netflix series "Fuller House" and the NBC drama "This Is Us." Celebrities who had crossed paths with Thicke, whether through music, acting or simply as friends, expressed their sorrow at news of his death. "I grew up watching him and got to know him through Robin. He was always so kind to me," John Legend posted on Twitter. "You were a part of my family and hockey family. You will be greatly missed. My heart hurts,' Candace Cameron Bure tweeted. "RIP dear friend and gentleman," posted Marlee Matlin. Thicke's fellow Canadians also responded quickly. William Shatner tweeted that he was saddened by his friend's loss, and singer Anne Murray's Twitter post said she was "shocked and devastated," recalling him as a friend as well as a writer and producer of many of her TV specials. The Edmonton Oilers also weighed in.

E.R. Braithwaite, the Guyanese author, educator and diplomat whose years teaching in the slums of London's East End inspired the international best-seller "To Sir, With Love" and the popular Sidney Poitier movie of the same name, has died at age 104.

Braithwaite's companion, Ginette Ast, told The Associated Press that he became ill Monday and died at the Adventist HealthCare Shady Grove Medical Center in Rockville, Maryland.

Focusing

Schooled in Guyana, the US and Britain, Braithwaite wrote several fiction and nonfiction books, often focusing on racism and class and the contrast between first world and colonial cultures. He was regarded as an early and overlooked chronicler of Britain from a non-white's perspective, his admirers including the authors Hanif Kureishi and **Caryl Phillips**.

He also served in the 1960s as the newly independent Guyana's first representative at the United Nations and later was ambassador to Venezuela. Upon his 100th birthday, he received an honorary medal from his native country for lifetime achievement.

Guyana President David Granger on Tuesday remembered Braithwaite as "an eminent Guyanese and distinguished diplomat."

To Sir, With Love," his first and most famous book, was published in 1959. The autobiographical tale about how a West Indian of patrician manner scolded, encouraged and befriended a rowdy, mostly white class of East End teens, who in turn softened him, was an immediate success and a natural for film. Poitier played Braithwaite (renamed Thackeray) in the 1967 release and the pop star Lulu was featured as one of the students. The title song, performed on screen and on record by Lulu, became a No. 1 hit.

Audiences loved the movie, but critics found it too sentimental: Braithwaite agreed. He criticized director-screenwriter James Clavell for downplaying the author's interracial romance with a fellow teacher and said Poitier's performance was too light-hearted.

"The movie made it look like fun and games," he later observed.

One former student, Alfred Gardner, would allege that Braithwaite himself sanitized his life. In the self-published memoir "An East End Story," Gardner described Braithwaite as a cold and rigid man who "struck fear into us by favouring corporal punishment."

"A Seat at the Table." Other top nominees include Chance the Rapper and Kendrick Lamar, with four bids each.

The Russian dance genius, who had revolutionised ballet with his choregraphy for Stravinsky's "Rite of Spring" while he was still in his early twenties, went slowly mad after his former lover, the impresario Serge Diaghiley, cut him lose.

Diaghilev had bedded Nijinsky and made him the leading man of his legendary company the Ballets Russes after spotting the 19-year-old prodigy at the Mariinsky theatre in St Petersburg in 1908.

Scandalous

Now more than a century later, Wilson has dramatised Nijinsky's searing and scandalous diaries, in which he excoriated Diaghilev.

It is, as Baryshnikov admits, a dance show in which he doesn't actually dance.

"It's more body language, it's not really dance," said the man once described by the New York Times critic Clive Barnes as "the most perfect dancer I have ever seen".

His face whited up, and wearing top hat and tails on stage, Baryshnikov has lost none of his charisma.

The former star of Russia's Kirov Ballet and later American Ballet Theatre, who still does his bar exercises every morning, said "Nijinsky was always important for me" - even though physically the two are very different.

Baryshnikov said Nijinsky was "a kind of universal actor. At that time, the level of male dance was not of the highest level, it was the ballerinas and divas" like Anna Pavlova that dominated,

"Then suddenly this very strange creature arrived, not very tall, not very beautiful in fact, with a kind of heavy musculature but of extraordinary strange proportions."

Nijinsky did not have "a classical body. It was very developed and at the same time very soft, very ambivalent sexually, and he was mesmerising to watch, every role was so different. He was a true cameleon.'

Baryshnikov, who has mostly lived

Nijinsky's wife Romola as well as his

two daughters Kyra and Tamara.

"She is now 96 years old, she lives in Arizona and she is remarkable a 96-year-old young woman really."

While Baryshnikov says he was moved by playing such a great artist losing his mind, he does not blame Diaghilev for Nijinsky's fate.

"I don't know what would have happened if he had stayed with Diaghilev and the Ballets Russes. Probably it was genetic. His brother went to an asylum and his mother later on, and his daughter Kyra, who I knew at the end of her life," also suffered from mental illness, he said.

But the fascination with the early 20th century's greatest dancer who descended into madness at only 29 endures.

"He wrote the diary in six weeks, and then nothing. He retreated into darkness and silence into the end of his life," Baryshnikov added. Nijinsky died aged 61 in London.

For his own part, Baryshnikov does not miss dancing with the world's best ballet companies – "there's life also beyond that" - and claims he wants "to retire one day".

NEW YORK: Jake Gyllenhaal and Annaleigh Ashford will star in a Broadway revival of the musical "Sunday in the Park with George."

In an email, Loring described Thicke's passing as "a shock. We were all just together for Thanksgiving. He was funny, talented and deeply devoted to his family."

Somethin' different gardening

Landscape designers in cities are creating quieter living spaces by using trees to mute loud noises like sirens and air brakes. andscape designers in cities are creating It's called "soundscaping," and it aims to restore peaceful, natural sounds like wind whispering through leaves, birds chirping or rain dripping from branches.

Massive walls are often installed to quiet freeway noise in major cities, but there are more aesthetic ways to handle it," said Tim Moloney, who teaches landscape design at the University of Missouri. "Use vegetation for minimizing the background clatter."The denser a tree's lower branches, the better it masks or deflects bothersome noise, Moloney said. Evergreens are the preferred vegetative sound barriers because they are densely branched and are attractive year-round. Ideally, shrubs would be a major component of any green muting mix.

"The thing with shrubs is you don't have the height of a tree but they grow more

quickly," Moloney said. "Along with density, choose vegetation having desirable landscape qualities fruit, flowers, canopy shapes, fragrance and fall colors. And for best results, plant them on an earthen berm."

Urban noise has become so annoying in many places that soundscaping has grown into a popular landscape-design specialty, Moloney said.

"The first line of defense is buffering," he said. "That overshadows background noise just by virtue of proximity. Add a screen of vegetation and then look for other options. Perhaps the soothing sounds of a waterfall or a stream." Healthy urban forests make for healthier neighborhoods and improve quality of life, said R.J. Laverne, an arborist and urban forester with The Davey Tree Expert Co. in Kent, Ohio.

"Trees give us green spaces that get us outside, where we're more likely to walk and get exercise," he said. "They also help reduce stress levels. We can concentrate better and feel less fatigue.'

Trees also improve air quality. "Trees absorb many of the air pollutants through their foliage," Laverne said. "They provide a place for the particulate matter to stick. It's the stuff floating through the air we inhale that aggravates our lungs.

The cooling shade from trees also provides economic benefits, Laverne said: "Among other things, we don't have to run our air conditioners as much.'

One challenge facing soundscapers in urban areas: There often isn't enough space for planting trees and shrubs between the noise source and homes, especially for trees with low-hanging foliage.

"But if you have a dense enough tree canopy, it doesn't have to be designed as a physical wall," Laverne said. "Foliage, branches and trunks do a pretty good job of dispersing sound energy, especially in the high frequency ranges. "Sound waves travel horizontally," he said. "When foliage reflects it in different directions, it's diminished. Sounds aren't as loud." (AP)

Police detective Karen Pirie returns in 'Out of Bounds'

Fisher's 'Princess Diarist' doesn't dish enough

Fincess Diarist' (Blue Rider Press), by Carrie Fisher

"I've spent so many years not telling the story of Harrison and me having an affair on the first 'Star Wars' movie that it's difficult to know exactly how to tell it now," Carrie Fisher announces on page 49 of her brisk but vague new memoir, "The Princess Diarist."

"Excellent, here we go," any solid fan of the real "Star Wars" movies (certainly not the prequels) will think, settling in for the literary equivalent of an ice-cream sundae of the more offbeat flavors.

But Fisher, who accepts that she will be known as Princess Leia until the end of time, lets the reader down. Having waited 40 years to publish what one expects to be a dishy tellall about the romance behind the iconic movie of a generation (that generation mournfully sandwiched between the baby boomers and millennials), the actress, writer and raconteur only offers a few wisps of the goods.

Fisher blames her hazy recall of the behindthe-scenes affair with Harrison Ford on the potent marijuana they smoked on their lost weekends between scenes. She also decides that "with uncharacteristic reservation and scruples that I quash any details" of their first weekend together. Sex is private, she says.

No problem, but she also draws the curtain over the interesting bits: their chemistry, their conversations, her point-blank impressions of

a man poised to become one of Hollywood's biggest stars.

Or maybe we're supposed to believe, as she insists, that Ford just didn't talk a lot when they were together. In any case, we are left with a few interesting glimpses wrapped around excerpts of the diaries Fisher says she kept while shooting "Star Wars" and recently discovered. Even the diary bits are not very revealing, being the moody musings, including poetry, of a young woman on the cusp of 20 years old.

It's clear from the final two chapters of the book, one of them titled "Leia's Lap Dance," that Fisher published this book with making money in mind. Her closing meditation on fame leaves Ford and the affair far behind. However, many "Star Wars" fans will read this book anyway or likely did so the instant it appeared

"Out of Bounds" (Grove Atlantic), by Val McDermid


Another case also occupies Karen's time — the alleged suicide of Gabriel Abbott, who lived in Kinross. The Abbott case isn't Karen's, but she becomes nearly obsessed with finding out if his death was in any way linked to the death of his mother, who was killed in a plane crash decades earlier.

The caseloads help distract Karen from her grief over the death of Phil Parhatka, a fellow detective who was killed in the line of duty. She loved Phil and longs to discuss every investigation, twist and theory with him. When not at work, she drinks and walks the streets and neighborhoods of Edinburgh at night to ease her insomnia.

Karen is easily the smartest person in the room. She often infuriates her bosses, who grudgingly acknowledge that her insight and intelligence gets the job done.

McDermid balances the intense character studies in "Out of Bounds" with an inside view of the Scottish legal system and again shows

Versatility key in modern rec room

When asked to build a luxury home for a house tour this year, designer Kenyon Woods opted to include a rec room - but not the rec room of his childhood.

Unlike old-time rec rooms with their wood paneling, ceiling tiles, box TVs and cast-off furniture, this one measures about 800 square feet on the main floor, with space for watching TV, shooting pool, rock climbing and more.

"Media rooms used to be off by themselves," said Woods, owner of Authentic Custom Homes in Oklahoma City. "I'm tired of the theater or game room being separated. Today, families want to be together" even if they're doing different activities.

Recreation rooms of all shapes and sizes are popular in new homes, according to a recent survey by US Houzz and Home, an online

source of interior design photos and decor ideas. Gaming and entertainment spaces, gyms and playrooms were among the top uses for rec rooms, it said.

Clients often want "several different areas in one large, open space," agreed Kristen DuChemin, design director for the Columbus, Ohio, homebuilder Romanelli & Hughes.

Recession

For some, that means adding game tables like foosball, shuffleboard, air hockey and billiards. Chance Pack, spokesman for game manufacturer Valley Dynamo in Richland Hill, Texas, says sales of game tables, which dipped during the recession, have seen an uptick as the home-building industry rebounds.

Parents and grandparents like gaming tables, he said, because they are interactive and intergenerational, luring kids away from electronics and into family activities.

"People are really focused on the entertainment aspect of their home," Pack said.

All seven homes constructed for the Street of Dreams Home Tour included recreation rooms, said Elisa Milbourn, director of education and special events for the Central Oklahoma Home Builders Association in Oklahoma City.

Furniture makers have responded with multi-functional pieces that aim to get the most out of a space, said Patricia Bowling, a spokeswoman for the American Home Furnishings Alliance, in High Point, North Carolina. Portable high-top tables with stools have become popular, she said.

"Whether entertaining means kids' birthday parties or adult parties, furniture is an affordable alternative to the expense of built-ins,' she said. "A portable provides a serving coun-

ter, sitting/dining space, storage and more." Kitchen islands also are playing a role in rec rooms, she said. They can provide seating or a flat surface for serving food, and have space to store games or dishes. If there isn't space for an island, a beverage cart can be useful, Bowling said.

"You can use them as a nightstand next to a bed or in the kitchen or outfitted as a bar. You move it around as needed," she said.

Minneapolis interior designer Billy Beson also recommends tables with built-in game boards, and bean-bag chairs, which are great for TV viewing and can easily be moved when not in use. Keeping a space flexible is a priority, he said.

'The rec room is back and definitely here to stay," he said. "There's a need for that space to watch a movie, play a game or have a party."







Fox to air '24' in 160 countries

BBC & ITV partner for US streaming service BritBox

LOS ANGELES, Dec 14, (RTRS): For nearly as long as the BBC and ITV have made their programming available for Brits to stream. there have been American viewers seeking various tech workarounds to gain access to those streams. Those efforts are about to be rendered moot — for a fee. British rivals BBC Worldwide and ITV are teaming up to tap into the US streaming marketplace with the forthcoming ad-free streaming subscription video on-demand (SVOD) service BritBox.

"The BBC and ITV are the two most prolific content producers and broadcasters in British television — both known for their unrivaled, ground-breaking shows," said Ann Sarnoff. president, BBC Worldwide North America. "BritBox will offer a streaming experience like no other, with thousands of hours of programs across a wide variety of genres.'

AMC Networks, which operates BBC America as a joint venture with BBC Worldwide, will be taking a non-voting minority stake in the service.

BritBox will launch in the first quarter of 2017 in the US; details about price will be revealed then. At the start, the service will premiere dramas like "New Blood," "In the Dark," and "Silent Witness," in addition to hosting a library of classics like "Pride and Prejudice," "Fawlty Towers," and "Upstairs Downstairs." Certain current U.K. series, like "EastEnders" and "Emmerdale," will be available for US customers to stream as early as 24 hours after they appear on British airwaves

BritBox will theoretically compete with RLJ Entertainment's Acorn TV SVOD service, which since 2011 has offered a fairly wide array of British series like "Poirot" for the price of \$4.99 a month, or \$49.99 for a year. In October, AMC Networks invested \$65 million in RLJ Entertainment.

"The BBC and ITV each have a long history of creating spectacular premium content and some of the most iconic shows on television,' said Josh Sapan, president and CEO of AMC Networks. "We are delighted to expand our current partnership with BBC Worldwide and view this investment as a strategic opportunity for AMC Networks to participate in a digital platform dedicated to offering shows of the highest quality."

SNL Kagan estimates that the US streaming market will be worth \$8 billion by the end of 2016, which explains the presence of AMC Networks' fingers in several different streaming pies. In 2015, AMC Networks betalaunched Shudder, a horror-specific streaming service that costs \$4.99 a month (or \$49.99 for a year). (Shudder was initially powered by the tech behind SVOD service DramaFever, which was acquired by Warner Bros. earlier in 2016.) AMC Networks also has SundanceNow, an SVOD service dedicated to documentaries and indie films and series, like French-language spy drama "The Bureau."

Fox Networks Group will air "24: Legacy,"

the next chapter in the Emmy Award-winning action series from 20th Century Fox Television and Imagine Television, in more than 160 countries, after the show's Feb 5 premiere on Fox in the US

The series will air day-and-date — or at least within 24 hours of the US - across the majority of Fox's territories. This is an established part of the studio's international marketing strategy for viral, high-profile series, such as "The Walking Dead," "Outcast," and "Wayward Pines."

Peter Rice, Fox Networks Group chairman and CEO, said: "The '24' franchise is a true cultural phenomenon and we are excited to allow fans in these 160 countries to experience the next installment all at once. At a time when media is instantaneous and global, viewers around the world will now experience, in real time, the events of this series, which invented real-time storytelling."

The "24" franchise, which premiered in 2001, has been nominated for 73 Emmy awards, winning for drama series in 2006. Over eight seasons, lead actor Kiefer Sutherland took seven Emmy nominations and one win for lead actor in a drama series. The most recent chapter in the franchise, "24: Live Another Day," a 12-episode event series that premiered in 2014 on Fox, won three Emmy awards.

The long-awaited launch date for Amazon Prime Video in India is expected to be announced Wednesday in Mumbai.

It had been widely expected that the streaming service would launch at the time of India's biggest holiday period, the Diwali festival in October, but that did not materialize.

In the meantime, however, Amazon India has been signing deals for existing and yetto-be-produced films with Bollywood studios Dharma Productions, T-Series and Vishesh Films. Among the films included in the deals are Dharma's "Ae Dil Hai Mushkil," Vishesh's "Jannat" and "Hamari Adhuri Kahaani", and T-Series' "Simran.'

The service is also expected to announce local non-feature film content. A series titled "Power Play," about illegal betting in cricket, is already in production with Excel Entertainment, though Amazon has not officially confirmed this yet. Another show set in the gang world of small-town north India is expected to begin soon. Amazon executives were busy finalizing deals with a number of local content producers last month at India's annual Film Bazaar, in Goa.

Zika can keep growing in infant brains even after birth

NEW YORK, Dec 14, (Agencies): US researchers have found evidence of the Zika virus replicating in fetal brains for up to seven months after the mother became infected with the virus, and they showed the virus can persist even after birth, according to a study published on Tuesday.

The findings confirm earlier observations from case studies suggesting that the mosquitoborne Zika virus can grow in fetal brains and women's placentas.

"Our findings show that Zika virus can continue to replicate in infants' brains even after birth, and that the virus can persist in placentas for months — much longer than we expected," Julu Bhatnagar, lead of the molecular pathology team at CDC's Infectious Diseases Pathology Branch and the study's lead author, said in a statement.

The findings help explain how the virus causes devastating birth defects and pregnancy losses even if a woman had only a minor illness. Last month, the World Health Organization declared that Zika no longer constitutes an international emergency, but stressed the need for a long-term effort to address the virus, which has been linked to thousands of birth defects and neurological complications.

For the study, CDC researchers tested tissues from 52 patients with suspected Zika virus infection, including brain tissues from eight infants who had microcephaly and later died. They also tested placental tissues from 44 women -22 of whom delivered apparently healthy babies and 22 whose pregnancies ended in miscarriage, abortion, stillbirth or who delivered babies with microcephaly. Zika has been shown to cause microcephaly, a rare birth defect in which infants are born with undersized heads and brains, which can cause life-long disability.

The researchers found Zika genetic material in fetal brain tissue and placentas more than

HTLV-1 virus more deadly for men

Sneaky virus 'goes easy on women to infect kids'

PARIS, Dec 14, (AFP): At least one kind of virus has become less lethal when targeting a woman to ensure she does not die before it can infect her offspring, according to a study released Tuesday.

For years, scientists assumed that the HTLV-1 virus — which can cause leukaemia among other illnesses — was more deadly for men because women had a stronger immune system, at least for that particular bug.

But new evidence, published in the journal Nature Communications, shows the virus has adapted through evolution to take advantage of an opportunity that males cannot offer.

"The reason why these illnesses are less virulent in women is that the virus wants to be passed from mother to child," explained Vincent Jansen, co-author of the study and

seven months after the mothers contracted the virus. In one case, they also found evidence of the virus growing in an infant with microcephaly who died two months after birth.

Of the eight infants who had microcephaly and later died, all tested positive for Zika. The mothers of all eight of these infants contracted Zika during the first trimester of pregnancy, adding to prior evidence that Zika is most dangerous early in pregnancy.

"We don't know how long the virus can persist, but its persistence could have implications for babies born with microcephaly and for apparently healthy infants whose mothers

A virus replicates only inside the living cells of other organisms, including plants, animals and bacteria.

Viral diseases range from the common cold to smallpox, hepatitis, dengue, Ebola, measles and AIDS. They kill millions of people every year.

Half of all US infants up to 12 months old are enrolled in the program.

The rate of youngsters at risk for obesity fell during the study, from almost 15 percent in 2010 to 12 percent overall in 2014, researchers from the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported Tuesday in the journal Pediatrics.

The rate declined in all ages studied. It was lowest — about 8 percent in 2014 — for the youngest infants, from 3 to 5 months, versus almost 15 percent among toddlers.

The results were unexpected, given rising rates earlier in the decade, said CDC researcher

David Freedman, the lead author.

"People are thrilled," he said. Freedman said reasons are uncertain for the decline, but it came amid changes designed to improve nutrition and health in food packages, including more whole grains, fruits and vegetables. Also, breast-feeding among participating women increased in 2009 and that can protect against obesity.

The results echo a reported decline in older children in the program, referred to as WIC for women, infants and children. Also previous CDC data showed a similar decline in all US youngsters from 2 to 5 years old, from about 14 percent in 2004 to 9 percent in 2014, coinciding with national campaigns targeting childhood obesity. Obesity rates tend to be higher in children from low-income families including WIC participants.

Dr David Ludwig, director of obesity prevention at Boston Children's Hospital, called the results encouraging but said, "It's too soon to tell whether these new data represent a statistical fluke or evidence of real progress with the pediatric obesity epidemic. "The researchers analyzed WIC survey data from 2000 to 2014 involving almost 17 million infants and young children. Rates increased early on, then remained stable from 2004 to 2010 until the decline.

Doctors don't usually describe babies as obese, but measure their risk using a weightfor-length ratio. Those with a high ratio, generally heavier than 95 percent of their peers, face an increased chance of becoming obese later on.

Whether the decline has continued is uncertain and the study didn't track infants to see if they became overweight or obese later on.

According to the CDC, US obesity rates total almost 18 percent among all 6- to 11-year-olds and nearly 21 percent among 12- to 19-yearolds

OPEC signals larger 2017 oil surplus

Hedge funds wrong-footed

Saudi engineers big shift in crude market sentiment

LONDON, Dec 14, (RTRS): Saudi Arabia has transformed sentiment in the oil market by assembling an unprecedented coalition of oil producing countries to agree output cuts in 2017.

Saudi officials have obtained pledges from OPEC members to cut production by almost 1.2 million barrels per day and from non-OPEC members by an extra 560,000 bpd during the first half of 2017.

In the process, Saudi negotiators wrong-footed many hedge fund managers, who had established large short positions in futures and options last month expecting there would be no deal or only a very weak one.

Hedge fund managers increased their short positions in the three main crude futures and options contracts by more than 200 million barrels between Oct 18 and Nov 22 amid scepticism about any deal.

But as negotiators narrowed their differences and then announced a deal among OPEC members nearly all those positions were closed: shorts were reduced by 174 million barrels in just two weeks between Nov 22 and Dec 6.

Saudi Arabia thus executed a successful short squeeze (whether that was the intention or not) and forced crude prices higher as bearish fund managers were forced to buy back their lossmaking short positions.

Hedge funds in turn fuelled the rally by opening an extra 154 million barrels of crude long positions over the last four weeks, including 94 million barrels opened the week after the OPEC deal was announced. The hedge fund community has therefore pivoted from a relatively bearish position on Nov 15 (when funds held a net long position of just 422 million barrels) to a bullish one on Dec 6 (with a record net long position of 895 million barrels)

OPEC producers better off and helps vindicate the deal.

Oil exporters are less likely to cheat if the deal delivers the promised significant improvement in revenues, at least at first.

All the components for a successful deal to restrict oil output, cut excessive stockpiles, and drive crude prices higher have fallen into place.

Market conditions and price movements resemble those during previous successful deals in 1999/2000 and 2008/09.

The International Energy Agency assesses the OPEC and non-OPEC agreements could move the crude market into a deficit of 0.6 million bpd during the first half of 2017, if they are implemented fully.

Full compliance is unlikely. Energy professionals expect OPEC countries to achieve only around half of the promised cuts. But the assessment gives some indication of how much noncompliance could be tolerated before the deal unravels.

The challenge for the Saudis now is to keep the hedge fund managers on side to avert a sell off that could push prices lower again.

Many funds appear to follow momentum-based strategies (buying when prices are rising and selling when they are falling).

So the very large concentration of hedge fund long positions has created significant downside price risk if prices stop rising and start to pull back. To keep the funds bullish, the Saudis need to turn the OPEC and non-OPEC agreements into a evidence of a real reduction in crude supplies and a drawdown in stocks. Saudi Arabia and a number of other exporting countries have already begun to notify refiners shipments will be cut in January, with news leaked to the media. Since stockpiles are most transparent and reported with the highest frequency in the United States, it would make sense to engineer a reduction in shipments to the United States and try to cut stocks on US territory. Nothing succeeds like success. Saudi Arabia needs clear evidence the deal is working to keep the hedge funds long and prices high, which in turn will encourage compliance with the deal, at least in the early stages. The biggest risks come from non-compliance by OPEC members or Russia; a sharp rise in shale output; rising production from uncapped producers Libya and Nigeria; a drop in oil demand; or a fall in crude prices themselves. If oil prices start falling, many hedge funds with long positions may be tempted to reduce them and take some profits. The risks from all these sources are considerable and are likely to increase over time; any one of them could cause the OPEC and non-OPEC agreement to unravel if the gains from cooperation start to fade.

Russian producers agree to cut oil output but details elusive

LONDON, Dec 14, (RTRS): OPEC on Wednesday signalled a growing oil supply surplus next year unless members implement their deal to curb output from record levels and outside producers also deliver on cutback pledges made at the weekend.


The Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries pumped 33.87 million barrels per day (bpd) last month, according to figures OPEC collects from secondary sources, up 150,000 bpd from October, OPEC said in

a monthly report.

OPEC's own figures show the group's output has continued to rise, adding to a global glut, ahead of the January start of its first supply cut agreement since 2008. This could raise questions about its ability to comply fully with the deal.

But OPEC was hopeful that supply curbs pledged by Russia and other non-members at the weekend, in addition to its own reductions, will tackle the surplus and support prices, which at \$55 a barrel are still half the level of mid-2014.

The non-OPEC cuts should help to "accelerate the reduction of global inventories and bring forward the rebalancing of the oil market to the second half of 2017," OPEC said in the report

Russian giant to develop to major oil fields

To speed it up, OPEC last month finalised a plan to cut output by about 1.20 million bpd from Jan 1 to 32.50 million bpd. On Saturday, non-member countries pledged curbs of around 560,000 bpd in the first such move since 2001.

The report is the latest to show output hitting new peaks. The November OPEC production figure is the highest since at least 2008, according to a Reuters review of past OPEC reports.

OPEC's figures show more than twothirds of November's extra barrels came from Libya and Nigeria, both of which are exempt from cutting output because their production has been curbed by conflict. Total output is 1.37 million bpd above the new target. In the report, OPEC raised its forecast of non-OPEC supply slightly in 2017 to 300,000 bpd, although it said the forecast was under review following Saturday's meeting. With the demand for OPEC crude in

2017 expected to average 32.63 million bpd, the report indicates there will be an average surplus of 1.24 million bpd if OPEC keeps output steady. Last month's report pointed to a 950,000 bpd surplus.

OPEC did not give a detailed forecast of the outlook if all parties cut supply as promised. The International Energy Agency said on Tuesday the market could show a shortfall of 600,000 bpd early next year in this scenario.

Meanwhile, Russia's energy minister said on Wednesday he had reached a framework agreement with oil companies on how to implement an output cut, but the producers said there were still details to be worked out.

There are doubts that Russian oil companies, with their own interests and plans, will be able to hammer out a joint strategy

Brent prices have been jolted up from less than \$45 per barrel in mid-November to over \$55 in recent trading.

And Brent time spreads, seen as an indication of the expected supply-demand balance, have strengthened, though most of the tightening has come after the first half of 2017.

The abrupt shift in sentiment has led many analysts to conclude OPEC has returned to its former role as an active market manager after a number of years as a passive onlooker.

OPEC's return may be overstated. As in the past, the key role has been played by Saudi Arabia, in conjunction with its close allies, with Riyadh persuading other producers to lend symbolic support.

Nonetheless, Saudi Arabia has succeeded in banishing the bearishness that haunted the oil market over the last six months and converting most hedge fund managers into oil bulls.

OPEC chief hails Tillerson pick for secretary of State

WASHINGTON, Dec 14, (AFP): The head of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries on Tuesday hailed US President-elect Donald Trump's nomination of ExxonMobil CEO Rex Tillerson to be the next secretary of State.

"It's an understatement to say that Rex is more than qualified to occupy this very important office, particularly at these challenging times," OPEC Secretary-General Mohammad Sanusi Barkindo said.

Barkindo was speaking at a forum on the global outlook for oil at the Center for Strategic and International Studies, where Tillerson is a member of the board of trustees.

Trump earlier Tuesday unveiled Tillerson as his pick for the top American diplomat, drawing sharp criticism because of the oil executive's close ties to Russian President Vladimir Putin as well as his lack of experience in public service. But Barkindo said Tillerson "will be a great asset to the incoming administration," and called the appointment "well-deserved."

In a bid to end a global supply glut, which had sent prices tumbling over the summer, OPEC in November agreed to cut output by 1.2 million barrels per day. And 11 non-OPEC members on Saturday also agreed to cut production by more than a halfmillion barrels per day.

Iran signs two oil deals with Gazprom

TEHRAN, Dec 14, (AFP): Iran signed preliminary agreements with Russia's Gazprom on Tuesday to develop two major oil fields in the latest of a flurry of deals with foreign firms, local media reported.

The deals open the way for Gazprom to carry out studies at the Cheshmekosh and Changouleh fields near the border with Iraq, according to the Shana news agency, which is linked to the oil ministry. That adds to five other oil fields that have already been earmarked for Russian firms Lukoil, Tatneft and Zarubezhneft.

The latest deal was signed by Russian Energy Minister Alexander Novak, who is visiting Tehran with a 500-strong business delegation.

'Living will' lacking

US puts 'limits' on Wells Fargo

WASHINGTON, Dec 14, (AFP): US banking regulators Tuesday said they are prohibiting Wells Fargo from opening new international branches until it fixes continuing deficiencies in its bankruptcy plan.

The so-called "living will" is required of all large US banks to ensure that in the event they need to declare bankruptcy, they can be dismantled in an orderly fashion without the kind of upheaval seen during the 2008 financial crisis, that endangers the broader financial system.

The Federal Reserve and Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ruled that Wells Fargo failed to provide a sufficient fix in two areas of its plan despite multiple tries.

As a result, the bank will not be able to open any foreign branches, nor will it be able to acquire any non-bank subsidiaries, the agencies said.

Wells Fargo, already suffering from a scandal over thousands of bogus accounts opened to boost its business, has until March 31 to submit a revised plan to fix the deficiencies identified in its living will. If the bank fails to fix the plan to the

satisfaction of regulators within two years, it may be required "to divest certain assets or operations to facilitate an orderly resolution of the firm in bankruptcy," the regulators said in a statement.

In a statement, Wells Fargo said it was "disappointed" with the agencies' determination, but remained "committed to strengthening and enhancing its resolution planning processes."

Russia and Iran have had difficult relations in the past, but now find themselves close military allies in their support for Syrian President Bashar al-Assad, and keen to deepen their economic relationship.

Iran has announced a slew of energy deals with foreign firms in recent weeks, despite uncertainty around the incoming US administration of Donald Trump, who has vowed to take a more confrontational stance towards Tehran. Last week, Anglo-Dutch giant Shell signed an initial accord to explore two of Iran's largest oil fields at South Azadegan and Yadavaran, as well as the Kish gas field.

That followed an initial deal with France's Total last month to develop part of the South Pars gas field - a project worth an estimated \$4.8 billion.

But doubts persist over how these deals will be financed so long as Iran remains frozen out of the international finance system by continuing US sanctions. The Iranian government also faces push-back at home from hardliners opposed to handing major energy deals to foreigners. The paramilitary Revolutionary Guards, which controls vast swathes of the energy sector, said in October that it was shameful for Iranian firms to be subordinated to foreigners.

The government has countered that Iran's dilapidated energy infrastructure urgently needs an infusion of foreign cash, technology and know-how.

to cut the country's production, which has reached a post-Soviet high of more than 11 million barrels per day (bpd).

Russia as well as other non-OPEC and OPEC producers have agreed to slash output by almost 1.8 million bpd to fight global oversupply, which has hammered the price of oil, the chief commodity export for Moscow and some other developing countries.

Of that, Russia has pledged to cut output by 300,000 bpd to 10.947 million bpd in the first six months of 2017.

"We agreed that the reduction will be in proportion to the production volumes (of each company)," Energy Minister Alexander Novak told reporters after meeting 12 oil producers that account for around 90 percent of Russian output.

This is the first such deal between the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and Russia since 2001, when Moscow agreed to cut oil exports by 150,000 bpd — a promise it later reneged on due to rising oil prices.

5 ways to lower your tax bill now

NEW YORK, Dec 14, (AP): Many people don't think about their taxes until springtime, but putting it off could mean owing more.

If you want to try to lower your tax bill, the important date isn't in April - it's Dec. 31. Tax pros say you still can make a few money-saving maneuvers before the calendar seals the fate of your 2016 return.

Make A Donation

Last-minute charitable contributions can be tax-deductible - even if you make them on a credit card, according to Christi Bender, a certified public accountant in Phoenixville, Pennsylvania. The date of paying off the card balance isn't a factor.

Beware that donations can take time to process.

"The day after Christmas is pretty much your last day to deal with charitable contributions, even on the credit card," Bender says. "You want to make sure it hits the current statement.'

Offset capital gains

If you'll have capital gains to reckon with, consider selling off some underperformers in your portfolio, says tax adviser Grant Keebler of Keebler & Associates in Green Bay, Wisconsin.

The IRS lets investors use some capital losses to offset taxable capital gains, which means, for example, a \$4,000 loss you take on a stock by Dec. 31 might effectively cancel out \$4,000 in capital gains during the

Donating appreciated assets such as stocks to charity also could help avert capital gains tax, Keebler notes. Giving away \$1,000 worth of stock that you bought for \$100 could garner a \$1,000 donation write-off, for instance, and save you from paying capital gains tax on the \$900 profit you would have made from its sale.

Get out of the office

year.

End-of-year business travel and even working from home could lower your tax bill if you work in a city with a wage tax, Bender says. Philadelphia, for example, has a tax of up to 3.9 percent on wages, commissions and other compensation earned inside the city limits. Nonresidents pay the tax only when they are working inside the city limits.

"If you live in the burbs but you work in Philly, if you have a calendar that says you worked remotely, (and) it's a significant enough number of days, we can get Philadelphia tax refunds for the days that they withheld city wage tax but you weren't in the city," Bender explains. Payroll departments often incorrectly withhold the tax on days employees work remotely, she says, so it's worth checking your city's rules and your W-2.

Track the days you worked outside the office. Many people don't do it, "but they do when they realize that it's worth 4 percent" of what they made that day, she says.

Stoke your savings

If you haven't already, consider maxing out the contribution limit on a traditional IRA (in 2016, it's \$5,500 if you're under 50 and \$6,500 if you're older) if you're eligible to deduct all or part of your contributions, says Robin Baum, a CPA and managing partner at accounting and consulting firm Zinner & Co. in Beachwood, Ohio. Whether you can deduct those contributions is a function of income and other factors.

And here's some other good news: You can make contributions to an IRA for the prior year until the current year's tax-filing deadline. That means IRA contributions for 2016 can be made all the way up to the April 2017 filing deadline.

Stay away

Retirees who split their time between homes in different states may be able to cut their tax bills by spending the last few days or weeks of the year in the state with lower taxes, Keebler says. The rules can be complex, but living in a particular state for more than half the year often dictates whether that state can tax certain types of income.

"We hear these horror stories from people where if they would have spent another week in Florida they wouldn't have to pay New York City taxes," he says. "And if the clients had known that, they would have been happy to do that. They had no idea.'

GM first to deliver mid-priced, all-electric car

General Motors began deliveries Tuesday of the first all-electric car model aimed at the middle market, getting a head start on Tesla Motors and other competitors

GM delivered the Chevrolet Bolt EV to three customers in California, including one in Fremont, where Tesla has a big factory.

The Bolt can travel up to 238

miles on a full charge. It lists for \$37,495, but consumers are eligible for clean fuel tax credits of up to \$7,500, GM said.

GM plans to accelerate deliveries of the Bolt next year as part of its campaign to reposition itself as a mobility company of the 21st century.

Tesla also is working on an all-electric Model 3 aimed at the middle market, but it is not

expected to hit the market until the end of 2017. Tesla's higherend Model S already is available but the price starts at \$68,000.

Other manufacturers also are working on comparable all-electric models, including Ford, whose sedan is called the "Model E" and Fisker, led by Henrik Fisker, who previously designed cars for BMW and Aston Martin. (AFP)

Industrial production drops in November

US retail sales slow in Nov; producer prices rise

WASHINGTON, Dec 14, (Agencies): US retail sales barely rose in November as households cut back on purchases of motor vehicles, suggesting some loss of momentum in economic growth in the fourth quarter.

Other data on Wednesday pointed to steadily rising inflation pressures, with producer prices notching their largest increase in five months in November. The moderation in retail sales came after two straight months of strong gains. With incomes rising and household wealth at record highs, the cool-off in retail sales is likely to be temporary.

Against the backdrop of a tightening labor market and perking inflation, the Federal Reserve is expected to raise interest rates later on Wednesday. The US central bank hiked its overnight benchmark interest rate last December for the first time in nearly a decade.

"There is still strong support for consumer spending, namely steady job growth and wages heading higher. Santa will still be coming to town this year." said Jennifer Lee, a senior economist at BMO Capital Markets in Toronto.

Retail sales edged up 0.1 percent last month after rising 0.6 percent in October, the Commerce Department said. Sales were up 3.8 percent from a year ago. Excluding automobiles, gasoline, building materials and food services, retail sales also nudged up 0.1 percent last month after gaining 0.6 percent in October.

These so-called core retail sales correspond most closely with the consumer spending component of gross domestic product. Economists had forecast overall retail sales increasing 0.3 percent and core sales also gaining 0.3 percent last month.

In a separate report, the Labor Department said its producer price index for final demand increased 0.4 percent last month, the largest gain since June, after being unchanged in October. In the 12 months through October,

the PPI rose 1.3 percent, the biggest gain since November 2014. The PPI rose 0.8 percent in the 12 months through October.

A 0.5 percent increase in the cost of services accounted for more than 80 percent of the rise in the final demand

PPI last month. The increase, which followed a 0.3 percent decline in October, was the largest since January. With producer prices pushing higher, overall inflation is expected to steadily move toward the Fed's 2 per-

cent target. The dollar fell to a session low against the yen on the retail sales data, while prices for longer-dated US government bonds rose. US stock index futures fell slightly.

The softer-than-expected retail sales

numbers last month suggest a slowdown in consumer spending in the fourth quarter, which could see economists trim their GDP forecasts for the period. Still, consumers should continue to support the economy in the fourth quarter.

The Atlanta Fed is forecasting GDP rising at a 2.6 percent annualized rate in the fourth quarter. The economy grew at a 3.2 percent pace in the third quarter. Last month, auto sales fell 0.5 percent, the largest decline since March, **Brexit endangers US-UK trade**

LONDON, Dec 14, (RTRS): Brexit could hit trade relations between Britain and the US, with nearly 40 percent of American firms considering moving their British office to the EU and two-thirds saying the vote is impacting investment choic-

es, according to a survey. Food and beverage, life sciences and financial services firms were most likely to consider relocating whilst aerospace firms were the least likely, the survey by law firm Gowling WLG said. Nearly all the 533 companies

surveyed said they would require some third-party support to deal with the transition as Britain leaves the European Union, potentially risking part of the close transatlantic relationship between the two nations.

"The strong UK-US trade rela-tionship that has been carefully nurtured over the past fifty years is in serious jeopardy," said Bernardine Adkins, the firm's Head of EU, Trade and Competition. "Concerns that Brexit will have

an effect on current investment mean this needs decisions addressing now, not later," she said.

But US fast-food chain McDonald's said last week that it would move its international tax base to Britain from Luxembourg after coming under increased scrutiny from European Union regulators over its tax arrangements in the small country. President-elect Donald Trump

has also hailed Brexit and said that Britain would not be "back of the queue" for a bilateral trade deal with the United States, opposing comments made by President Obama ahead of the referendum.

British ministers have been meeting top executives from a range of key sectors in recent months as they prepare for formal divorce talks which are due to begin by the end of March.

Total output is 0.6 percent lower

after increasing 0.5 percent in October. Sales at building material stores rose 0.3 percent.

Meanwhile, industrial output fell in November, marking the third decline in the past four months and erasing the slight gain in October, the Federal Reserve reported Wednesday.

The Industrial Production index fell 0.4 percent in the latest month, after a 0.1 percent rise in October, dragged down by another big decline in utilities and a slight dip in manufacturing.

The inaugural Locomore train left the southwestern city of Stuttgart at 07:00 am (0600 GMT) Wednesday, passing through Frankfurt and Hanover before pulling into Berlin some six and a half hours later.

With just one Stuttgart-Berlin return service a day to start with, compared to the over 700 daily long-distance journeys run by Deutsche Bahn, Locomore founder and director Derek Ladewig knows he barely qualifies as a rival.

But he is hoping to win over Deutsche Bahn customers with budget ticket prices and lure environmentally-conscious travellers from more polluting forms of transport.

"We are offering a new service to compete with the car, the plane, the long-distance bus as well as Deutsche Bahn," Ladewig told AFP.

Locomore, which bills itself as the world's first crowdfunded train line, owes its start-up capital entirely to online supporters who chipped in more than 600,000 euros (\$640,000) in less than a year to get the project on the rails.

Renovated

Many of the contributors bought vouchers that can now be traded for tickets, as well as souvenirs such as mugs and T-shirts in the firm's distinctive orange hue - a nod to the vintage origins of Locomore's renovated carriages from the 1970s.

In a slight first-day hiccup, the train suffered a 40-minute delay on departure, but made up the time en route and even arrived at Berlin's main station early.

"Congratulations @locomore! Arrived in Berlin Hbf 5 minutes ahead of schedule," tweeted rail expert Mark Smith of the influential Seat61 blog, describing the train as "old-school comfort, done well".

The 600-kilometre (370-mile) trip from Stuttgart to Berlin takes slightly longer than with Deutsche Bahn, but Locomore hopes to make up for that by promising its ticket prices will always be cheaper than those of its competitor.

Locomore charges 22 euros for a Stuttgart-Berlin ride in January, compared with 115.90 euros on Deutsche Bahn -- although the latter's journey is roughly an hour shorter, and it offers prices as low

Competitors

The state firm has more competitors on the regional transport networks, where its market share falls to 72 percent, according to Mathias Lahrmann of the BSL transport consulting agency.

Locomore is not the first private company to try to go up against the rail operator, but those efforts have gained little traction.

Veolia Verkehr, a subsidiary of France's Transdev, abandoned its loss-making Interconnex service in 2014, leaving just the Hamburg-Cologne express (HKX), launched in 2012, to offer an alternative.

"Locomore could invigorate the market with its innovative ideas," said Lahrmann. But "like HKX, it only serves a niche market", he added.

Lahrmann said it was difficult for new companies to get a foot in the door in the long-distance rail business.

There are no state subsidies available, and prospective operators are expected to reserve their slots years in advance as well as source their own trains.

Locomore has opted to rent its trains and drivers from other companies while employing its own on-board personnel and handling ticket sales.

Ladewig has calculated that at least half of Locomore's seats need to be filled to cover costs and be able to branch out to other lines in the future.

Achieving that will be no mean feat, as even Deutsche Bahn last year registered an occupancy rate of just 50.9 percent on its longdistance trains.

"It's not easy to be profitable, but it's possible," said BSL consultancy's Lahrmann.

With more than 10,000 tickets already sold and its trains promising to be "pretty full" over the coming weekends, Locomore's Ladewig is banking on the upcoming Christmas holidays to keep his ambitious plans on

(**RTRS**): The US Federal **Reserve** raised interest rates by a quarter point on Wednesday and signaled a faster pace of increases in 2017 as the Trump administration takes over with promises to boost growth through tax cuts, spending and deregulation.

WASHINGTON, Dec 14,

The rate increase, regarded as a virtual certainty by financial markets in the wake of a string of generally strong economic reports, raised the target federal funds rate 25 basis points to between 0.50 percent and 0.75 percent.

"In view of realized and expected labor market conditions and inflation, the committee decided to raise the target range," the central bank's policy-setting committee said in its unanimous statement after a two-day meeting.

"Job gains have been solid in recent months and the unemployment rate has declined," the Fed said, noting that market-based measures of inflation compensation had moved up "considerably."

More significant was a fresh batch of Fed policymaker forecasts that indicated the current once-a-year pace of rate increases will accelerate next year.

With President-elect Donald Trump planning a simultaneous round of tax cuts and increased spending on infrastructure, central bank policymakers shifted their outlook to one of slightly faster growth, lower unemployment and inflation just under the Fed's 2 percent target.

The Fed's median outlook for rates rose to three quarter-point increases in 2017 from two as of September. That would be followed by another

three increases in both 2018 and 2019 before the rate levels off at a long-run "normal" 3.0 percent.

That normal level is slightly higher from three months ago, a sign that the Fed feels the economy is still gaining traction.

The Fed continued to describe that pace as "gradual," keeping policy still slightly loose and supporting some further improvement in the job market. It sees unemployment falling to 4.5 percent next year and remaining at that level, which is considered to be close to full employment.

Fed Chair Janet Yellen was scheduled to hold a press conference at 2:30 pm ET (1930 GMT) to elaborate

on the decision.

US bond yields had already begun moving higher following the election and as expectations of the Fed rate increase solidified. By the start of this week, trading in fed funds futures assigned a greater than 95 percent likelihood to a rate hike, according to data compiled by the CME Group.

All 120 economists in a recent Reuters poll had expected a rate hike on Wednesday.

In the weeks following Trump's Nov. 8 victory, Fed policymakers have said his proposals could push the economy into a higher gear in the short run. Even though the details of the Republican businessman's plans remain uncertain, Wednesday's statement marked a rare case in the postcrisis era in which the Fed moved its interest rate outlook higher.

Risks to the outlook remain "roughly balanced" between factors that could slow or accelerate the economy beyond what the central bank anticipates, the Fed said, no change from the November assessment.

The rate increase was the first since last December and only the second since the 2007-2009 financial crisis, when the Fed cut rates to near zero and deployed other tools such as massive bond purchases to stabilize the economy.

Trial of Lagarde hears that payout decision was rushed through

PARIS, Dec 14, (RTRS): A French ex-treasury official told a court trying IMF chief Christine Lagarde for negligence on Wednesday that he had been shocked at how quickly the government had given up on contesting a huge state payout to business tycoon Bernard Tapie in 2008.

Lagarde, 60, faces charges, which she denies, of being negligent when, as French finance minister, she approved a payout to Tapie in a rare out-of-court settlement which cost the French taxpayer 400 million euros (\$425 million).

The prosecution alleges Lagarde showed negligence, leading to misuse of public funds, by accepting too easily a costly arbitration settlement with Tapie and not contesting it to the benefit of the state.

Lagarde withstood aggressive questioning on Tuesday at a special court in Paris which hears cases involving government ministers. The IMF managing director faces up to a year in jail and a fine of 15,000 euros if convicted.

A maximum sentence could raise questions about her ability to hold on to her job at the Washington-based International Monetary Fund, where her French predecessor Dominique Strauss-Kahn resigned in 2011 over a sex scandal.

Evidence from Bruno Bezard, a trea-

sury official involved in the case at the time, painted a picture of cronyism and string-pulling in Tapie's links with the government under Nicolas Sarkozy's presidency from 2007 to 2012.

He told the court on Wednesday that he was aware of "curious relationships" at the Finance Ministry at the time and suggested Tapie himself had had the run of the place.

"I recall that my employees would meet Monsieur Tapie in the ministry corridors which was rather unexpected,' said Bezard, who headed a body regulating state corporate holdings which opposed a private settlement with Tapie.

The case dates back when Tapie

sued the state for compensation after selling his stake in sports company Adidas to then state-owned Credit Lyonnais in 1993.

He accused the bank of defrauding him after it resold its stake for a much higher price. With the case stuck in the courts, the two sides agreed to a private settlement and a 403 million euro payout to Tapie. Lagarde approved the settlement.

Asked whether he was shocked by the speed of the arbitration ruling in Tapie's favour, Bezard replied: "I was more shocked by the speed with which we gave up on contesting it than by the speed of the arbitration decision.'



China bank lending heads for record as Nov new loans rise

BEIJING, Dec 14, (RTRS): Chinese banks extended 794.6 billion yuan (\$115.10 billion) in new yuan loans in November and look set to lend a record amount this year as Beijing boosts the economy to meet growth targets despite worries about the risks of prolonged debt-fuelled stimulus.

Lending continued to be driven by consumer loans, primarily home mortgages, despite a series of measures rolled out by the authorities to cool surging home prices and avoid property bubbles.

Off-balance sheet lending also unexpectedly spiked in November, raising concerns of tighter liquidity if regulators crack down on the shadow banking sector, economist David Qu at ANZ said.

New bank loans rose to a record 11.6 trillion yuan in the first 11 months of the year, according to Reuters calculations based on central bank data, and have handily surpassed the levels of China's massive credit-led stimulus during the global financial crisis in 2009.

But analysts said the increase in November was partly seasonal, as outstanding yuan loan growth held steady at 13.1 percent by month-end on an annual basis, unchanged from October.

Corporate loan growth remained weak in November, increasing by only 165.6 billion yuan. That pointed to subdued credit demand from companies and a preference by banks to lend to households, as mortgages are usually considered higher quality assets, said Nomura economist Yang Zhao. "With the preparty market acading

"With the property market cooling down, I would expect that loan growth faces downward pressure next year. I don't think there is a fundamental improvement in investment demand by corporates," said Yang.

Mid-to long-term loans to households rose to 569.2 billion yuan, or 71.2 percent of all loans, up from September's 66.5 percent, though analysts said it might take a few months to know how tighter restrictions will impact mortgages.

Analysts polled by Reuters had expected new lending to have risen to 720 billion yuan from October's 651.3 billion yuan.

Broad M2 money supply (M2) grew 11.4 percent from a year earlier, central bank data showed on Wednesday, slightly below forecasts.

Outstanding loans had been forecast to rise 13 percent, while money supply was seen up 11.5 percent.

China's total social financing (TSF), a broad measure of credit and liquidity in the economy, hit the highest level since March on a big jump in shadow banking. TSF rose to 1.74 trillion yuan in November from 896.3 billion yuan in October, with about half of the increase coming from shadow lending.

Asian envoys urge Trump to rethink on TPP trade deal

WASHINGTON, Dec 14, (Agencies): US-allied Asian ambassadors on Tuesday urged President-elect Donald Trump to reconsider his opposition to the Trans-Pacific Partnership trade agreement and keep the US engaged in Asia.

Ambassadors from Australia, South Korean and Singapore made the appeal at a Washington think tank.

The Obama administration championed the trade pact which was signed by 12 nations in February but has run into a wall of congressional and public opposition.

Trump has vowed to withdraw from TPP on his first day in office, calling it a "disaster" for American jobs. Australian Ambassador Joe Hockey said, "America has to engage with Asia if it is going to be great," because that's where most global economic growth is happening.

happening. "The fact that the US was very involved in leadership of it (TPP) then could not deliver and has chosen now not to deliver is hugely damaging to the United States' reputation in Asia," Hockey said.

He said that in the meantime, Asian nations are focusing on an alternative trade pact supported by China, the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership. South Korean Ambassador Ahn Ho-young acknowledged that antitrade and globalization sentiment had surged during the US election but said that in the long-term, all nations benefit from trade liberalization.

He said South Korea wants to join TPP if it progresses.

The three envoys steered clear of the controversy over Trump's recent pronouncements on China and Taiwan.

Singaporean Ambassador Ashok Mirpuri said that US global leadership is needed in the Asia-Pacific, but Southeast Asian nations also want calm between the US and China.

Meanwhile, Japan and the European Union are holding lastditch talks this week to try reach a broad free trade agreement by the end of the year, Japanese government officials said.

The two-way trade talks have taken on greater significance after US President-elect Donald Trump said Washington would withdraw from the Trans-Pacific Partnership, a 12-nation deal Prime Minister Shinzo Abe has said is key to his reforms and once a pillar of Washington's pivot to the Asia-Pacific. The Bank of Japan's Tankan report — a quarterly survey of more than 10,000 companies that is the broadest indicator of how Japan Inc. is faring — showed a reading of 10 among major manufacturers, rising from six in its previous report.

A positive figure means companies are on average optimistic.

The October-December reading marked the first on-quarter improvement since last year's April-June report.

Confidence among small-and midsized firms also strengthened in the latest reading, while companies also said they planned to boost capital spending, although the pace was weak. The report offered some good news

for Japan's sputtering economic recovery. Last week, the government downoraded its estimate for third-quarter

graded its estimate for third-quarter growth to 0.3 percent, from an initial 0.5 percent reading. The BoJ's report is likely to take

BRUSSELS, Dec 14, (AFP): Eurozone finance ministers on Wednesday suspended debt relief for bailed-out Greece after Greek Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras hiked spending for pensioners, angering austerity champion Germany.

The setback echoed the worst setbacks of the Greek debt crisis as the eurozone and the International Monetary Fund battle over how far to push Athens on implementing more tough policy reforms.

Leftist premier Tsipras on Thursday made the surprise one-off payout to 1.6 million low-income pensioners, along with a sales tax break for islands sheltering thousands of migrants.

Tsipras' critics at home immediately denounced it as an electoral ploy but the premier said "Europe owes a debt" to the islands that are on the frontline of the migrant crisis. Eurozone finance ministers however said the measures could violate the terms of Greece's third bailout, agreed in July 2015 after six months of bitter talks that nearly saw Athens crash out of the euro.

"The institutions have concluded that the actions of the Greek government appear to not be in line with our agreements," said a spokesman for Eurogroup chief Jeroen Dijsselbloem, the head of the 19-nation eurozone club which oversees Greece's massive 86-billion euro bailout.

There is "no unanimity now for implementing short-term debt measures," he added.

The Athens stock exchange index lost over three percent in response to

the announcement which came after Berlin expressed its firm opposition to the extra spending by Tsipras.

"If the rescue programme is going to be deemed a success, it is imperative that measures are not taken unilaterally," a spokesman for the German Finance Ministry said in response to the 617-million-euro package.

Berlin asked that the institutions overseeing the bailout -- the European Commission, the ECB and the eurozone's ESM bailout fund -- review the measures and suspend the hard-won and very modest debt relief measures.

Greece's debt totals more than 300 billione euros, equal to 180 percent of total annual economic output and compared with the European Union's ceiling of 60 percent.

FOX suing Bangkok Bank

Asia confidence slips

Firms fret about sluggish demand, political uncertainty

KUALA LUMPUR, Dec 14, (RTRS): Confidence in Asia toward business conditions over the coming six months dropped in the final quarter of 2016 to its lowest level in a year as firms fretted about sluggish demand in a persistently lowgrowth economic environment, a Thomson Reuters/ INSEAD survey found.

Firms also flagged political uncertainty as a key near-term risk, including that brought by the election of Donald Trump to the US presidency — an outcome some cited as a key risk in the same survey three months prior.

The Thomson Reuters/INSEAD Asian Business Sentiment Index, representing the half-year outlook of 118 firms, fell to 63 from 68 in the September quarter, although it remained above the 50 mark separating optimism from pessimism. "The fall in the business sentiment index confirms what we have seen over the past few years: The world economy is growing but in a way that looks suboptimal," said Singapore-based economics professor Antonio Fatas at global business school INSEAD. "It seems very difficult to regain a high state of confidence."

Asian companies are particularly reliant on demand from China where slowing economic performance has been the main cause for concern over the past few years. But in recent weeks, political worries have come to the fore.

Trump has advocated more UScentric trade relations and the cancellation of the Trans-Pacific Partnership trade pact. He has also vowed to repatriate jobs such as in the outsourcing industry which flourishes in the Philippines, where new president Rodrigo Duterte is known for anti-American rhetoric.

In South Korea, lawmakers have voted to impeach President Park Geun-hye over an influence-peddling scandal after weeks of protests, while in India, Prime Minister Narendra Modi abolished 86 percent of the country's cash overnight to tackle corruption.

Firms have to navigate such events "with the possibility of either 'muddling through' as we have managed to do over the last two years or hitting a wall because one of these uncertain events turns negative," said Fatas.

Thomson Reuters and INSEAD polled firms across Asia from Nov. 28 through Dec 9. Of 118 respondents, just over 42 percent were positive toward business prospects over the next six months, 41 percent were neutral and 16 percent were negative.

Respondents included Australia's Transurban Group, India's Reliance Industries Ltd, PT Telekomunikasi Indonesia (Persero) Tbk, Japan's Asahi Group Holdings Ltd, Korea Aerospace Industries Ltd and the Philippine National Bank.

Firms in Australia were the most positive with their subindex of 86 although that was still 2 points lower than three months prior. Only Singaporean firms were negative with a subindex of 46, albeit an improvement from the 38 of September.

Sentiment tumbled the most in the

usually upbeat Philippines, to 70 from 94. Though optimistic, the subindex compared with that economy's average of 91 over the survey's seven-year life.

Sentiment fell in China, to 80 from 90, in India to 70 from 75 and in Thailand to 60 from 72. But in South Korea it rose to 57 from 50 despite the political turmoil.

"Outside of Thailand, we expect to see a slower pace of economic growth in our main markets in Asia-Pacific, including Australia, China and Singapore in the near term," said Chairman and Chief Executive William Heinecke of Thai hotelier and retail distributor Minor International PCL.

Heinecke also said his company expected global tourism to be resilient in the current climate, and that the retail food service industry would be stable in its key markets.

By sector, the retail and leisure subindex fell to 56 in the fourth quarter from 68 in the third. Household, food and beverage firms were the most optimistic at 79, up from 72, whereas those in the autos sector were the most pessimistic at 40 from 60. SEOUL, Dec 14, (RTRS): South Korea aims to vault from laggard to leader in the renewable energy industry, as Seoul prepares to hook the country's tech giants up to nearly \$40 billion in public funds in a bold plan to become a new global leader in green power.

Amid questions over the future of clean energy in the United States under President-elect Donald Trump, as well as China's appetite for cutting fossil fuel reliance, Seoul is accelerating into battery and 'smart' grid technology vital to store and transmit power whose generation changes with the weather.

Fresh from unveiling a 42 trillion won (\$37 billion) support package, Seoul said last month it now aims to double the amount of green energy it produces by 2025 — 10 years ahead of previous plans. As well as cutting overwhelming reliance on coal and nuclear power, the plan aims to tap into the prowess of Korean tech leaders like Samsung — previously focused on consumer electronics — to build a major new export industry.

"South Korea definitely has the potential when it comes to clean tech because of government incentives but also the already established companies there," said Vishal Sapru, Program Manager, Power

Quality/Power Supplies at consultancy Frost & Sullivan. "They are strong contenders when it comes to utility-scale storage ... They have the bandwidth to meet aggressive demand."

The push by Asia's 4th-largest economy comes as global climate change treaty commitments dovetail with a race among the world's tech firms for new revenue streams while growth in goods like smartphones slows. The International Energy Agency now sees 28 percent of the world's power being generated from renewable sources by 2021, up from 23 percent in 2015.

Firms from General Electric to Europe's ABB are eyeing growth in smart grids and batteries — and have a head start. But by combining the power transmission know-how of its state utilities with private sector expertise in batteries and power controls, South Korea is well placed to gain ground, industry executives say.

"One of Korea's strengths is IT technology, particularly semiconductors and battery," said Lee Jeong-min, a senior manager of energy storage systems sales team at Hyosung Corp . "If we link them together with new energy business, we can catch up."

Hyosung is among several private firms partnering with state utility Korea Electric Power Corp (KEPCO) to develop smart grid and energy storage systems at home and in international markets.

KEPCO is now working on some 40 overseas energy and power distribution projects. It agreed in November with the US state of Virginia to develop 10 energy projects, echoing similar deals it has agreed with Canada's Ontario state as well as Dubai.

"We play our role in operating the power grid and leading new businesses, while private sector partners do their part by making products and supplying them," Hwang Woohyun, vice president of KEPCO, told Reuters in an interview.

To help extend Korean companies' global reach, KEPCO plans to invest 8.3 trillion won in collaborative programmes by 2020. Meanwhile partner Samsung SDI is eying 3 trillion won in investments on battery development by 2020.

TCS ousts Mistry from board Exports, tourism fight to recover one month after NZ quake

MUMBAI, Dec 14, (AFP): India's Tata has ousted Cyrus Mistry as a director of its cash cow IT business Tata Consultancy Services as the Indian conglomerate steps up its purge of its former chairman.

TCS said in a statement late on Tuesday that shareholders had voted overwhelmingly at an extraordinary general meeting in India's commercial Mumbai to dump Mistry from its board.

In the statement to the National Stock Exchange of India it said that Mistry is "hereby removed from the office of Director of the Company with effect from the date of this meeting". in October as chairman of Tata Sons, the holding company of India's most famous family conglomerate -- the \$103 billion steel-to-salt Tata Group. Other group companies including Indian Hotels Co Ltd, Tata Steel, Tata Motors, and Tata Chemicals are scheduled to hold EGM's in the next week to decide MisWELLINGTON, Dec 14, (RTRS): Parts of New Zealand's key export industries and its vital tourism sector are battling to get back on track a month after a deadly earthquake rocked the nation, crippling roads and slowing shipping.

At one of the country's main ports in Wellington, 'no-entry' signs dot parts of the site hit by liquefaction, cracking or buckling, hampering shipments of items like meat and farm produce to destinations including China and Australia.

While 150 km away in the resort town of Kaikoura, often touted as the nation's whale-watching capital, restaurants and hotels lie nearly empty as

the roads that once carried in busloads of tourists through steep mountains remain closed.

Wellington's port and Kaikoura are at the forefront of fallout from the Nov. 14 quake, which New Zealand's central bank has initially estimated will cost the NZ \$250 billion (\$180 billion) economy up to NZ \$8 billion.

"We are important to the regional economy, so it is important to resume (full) operations soon," said Derek Nind, CEO of CentrePort Wellington, the port in the country's capital which lies about 480 km from the epicentre of magnitude-7.8 temblor that killed two "We need to think how we build resilience into our ports. I am trying to get world experts to help us on that."

Nind added that the port, which handled trade worth NZ \$3.3 billion in 2015, was unlikely to run at full throttle until April, although it did manage to partially resume some operations in the days after the quake.

Major problems at the site include container shipping and cold storage that remain out of bounds, while Nind's own office is also in a no-go zone.

Nind said it was not yet possible to assess how much business would be

One sign of progress comes as the port says its key log shipping operations are "back to normal" in December after they were hit the month before.

That is good news for companies that rely on the port as one of the main shipping points for New Zealand's rapidly growing forestry industry, its third-largest export earner behind dairy and meat.

"November will probably be our weakest month on calendar, although things have started to flow back now," said Steve Wilton, CEO of Masterton-based Forest Enterprises Ltd, the nation's No.1 Forestry in-

EGP weakens to almost 19 per dollar

The Egyptian pound weakened on Wednesday as banks paid more to buy dollars from clients in an effort to attract dollar liquidity into the banking system, but volumes remain low.

The dollar was being sold for almost 19 pounds per dollar on Wednesday, strengthening from around 18.4 earlier in the day.

Banks are now buying dollars from clients at rates ranging from

18.2 per dollar to 18.89 per dollar. "There is not enough dollar

volume being supplied, so that causes the price to rise sharply," said one banker. "Banks are trying to raise the

prices they buy dollars at to attract clients to sell," he added. Egypt's central bank abandoned its currency peg of 8.8 pounds to the US dollar on Nov.3 in a move it hopes will unlock currency inflows and bring back foreign investors who were driven away after a 2011 uprising. Under the currency peg, dollar supplies were rationed

by the central bank, forcing businesses to go to the black market for foreign currency. Bankers say it will take time for those dollars to be absorbed into the banking system after the float. (RTRS)

Kuwait stocks tread water; volume jumps

Gulf bank gains 10 fils; Ooredoo flat

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 14: Kuwait stocks trod water on Wednesday as the market took a breather after four-day gains driven by bullish sentiment over the output deal by oil producers. The bourse inched 0.36 pts higher in choppy trade to 5,671.98 even as the board remained broadly mixed.

The KSX 15 dropped 8.75 pts to 8,86.78 points trimming the month's gains to 2 points while weighted index eased 2.64 points. The volume turnover meanwhile rebounded to hit a fresh multimonth high. 289 million shares changed hands — a 43 pct surge from the day before

In the individual shares. National Bank of Kuwait slipped 10 fils to 650 fils after trading over 1 million shares and Gulf Bank climbed 10 fils with a volume of over 9 million. Kuwait Food Co (Americana) was down 20 fils at KD 2.600.

Zain dropped 10 fils to 425 fils taking the month's gains to 25 fils while Wataniya Telecom (Ooredoo) stood pat at KD 1.140 off early highs. Kuwait Telecommunications Co (VIVA) was flat at KD 0.920 and logistics major Agility followed suit.

Kuwait Finance House dipped 10 fils erasing Tuesday's gains while Gulf Bank of Kuwait added 10 fils. The company has recorded a net profit of KD 32.80 million and earnings per share of 11 fils in the Jan-Sept period up from net profit of KD 29.62 million and earnings National Industries Group, the flagship company of the Kharafi Group, eased 2 fils to 124 fils while Gulf Cable was unchanged at 385 fils. Heavy Industries Engineering and Shipbuilding Co clipped 2 fils and Kuwait Foundry Co followed suit to wind up at 176 fils.

Jazeera Airways fell 10 fils to close at KD 0.770 whereas ALAF-CO held ground at 220 fils. Kuwait National Cinema Co paused at KD 0.960 and KCPC took in 2 fils before settling at 170 fils. ACICO Industries Co stagnated at 270 fils.

Boubyan Petrochemical Co rose 10 fils and Equipment Holding Co edged 1.5 fils higher to 46.5 fils. Humansoft Holding Co and Combined Group Contracting Co were flat at KD 2.260 and KD 0.620 respectively

Investors cautious ahead of likely Fed rate cut

Gulf stock markets pull back

DUBAI, Dec 14, (RTRS): Stock markets in the Gulf retreated on Wednesday in shrinking trading volumes as investors turned cautious ahead of the US interest rate hike and guidance from the US central bank expected late in the day.

Petrochemical shares, which have been dragging Saudi Arabia's main index lower over the last two sessions, fell further. The main index lost 0.6 percent and all but one of the 14 listed petrochemical producers fell. PetroRabigh dropped 3.3 percent.

Many analysts think the Saudi market's uptrend is not reversing but stocks may take an extended breather following a stellar performance over a six-week period which took the index to a one-year high earlier this week.

Wednesday marked the market's second consecutive day of shrinking trading volume. The 2017 budget, expected to be announced late this month, looks likely to include more domestic fuel subsidy cuts, which is prompting some investors to cash out of domestic demand-focused shares for now.

Electronics and bookstore retailer Jarir fell 1.3 percent.

In Egypt, the main index pulled back a further 0.6 percent with selling pressure escalating in the final hour of trade.

Losers outnumbered gainers 24 to

five with Orascom Telecom, the most heavily traded share, slumping 5.2 percent. Shares in the conglomerate have been beaten down 20 percent since the company said its chief executive, billionaire Najuib Sawiris, announced early this month that he would step down.

The company did not give a reason for his departure, and analysts said the uncertainty had hit investor sentiment hard.

"Saying they are shutting down banking operations in North Korea and that their long-time CEO is leaving in one month's time has left investors feeling battered," said a Cairo-based equity analyst.

Dubai's index fell for a second straight day, dropping 1.2 percent to 3,584 points. It retreated below major technical resistance on its August peak of 3,624 points.

Trading volume shrank by roughly a half from the previous day's very large amount. Most activity focused on midsized speculative shares, suggesting local short-term traders were the main players and that foreign investors, who had been active buyers in previous days, had pulled back.

Builder Drake & Scull, the most heavily traded stock, fell 1.8 percent. Union Properties lost 1.7 percent.

Profit-taking also hit Abu Dhabi, dragging the index down 0.9 percent. Telecommunications operator Etisalat fell 1.3 percent and First Gulf Bank dropped 1.9 percent.

Qatar's main index, which had outperformed its regional peers on Tuesday, retreated 0.4 percent. Commercial Bank lost 3.1 percent to 32.40 riyals on the first day of trading of its rights issue, which will end on Dec. 28. The bank is offering new ordinary shares at 25.50 riyals each.

PM May condemns UK's rail strike

British Prime Minister Theresa May condemned as "appalling" a rail strike that left hundreds of thousands of London commuters facing a second day of travel chaos on Wednesday.

Speaking in parliament, she urged the two sides to find a solution to avoid prolonging Britain's worst rail disruption for two decades. Passengers trying to get to London from the southeast struggled to get to work as drivers on Southern Rail — part of the country's biggest rail franchise — continued a 48-hour stoppage over a dispute about whose job it should be to open and close the train doors. May called for an end to the action as Southern and the drivers' union Aslef met for talks at the conciliation service Acas before more stoppages planned for Friday and in January.

"This is an appalling strike," she said. "We've seen driver-only operated trains on rail networks in the UK for decades. I hope that the talks at Acas are going to lead to an end to this strike.

"There is only one body responsible for the current strike, that is Aslef," she added. Wednesday's talks have not yet involved the other main rail union, the RMT, which represents conductors, and is also involved in the dispute. It is planning strikes on the Southern network next week. (RTRS)

Sri Lanka to sell loss-making port to China

Sri Lanka hopes to sell part of its loss-making \$1.4 billion harbour to a Chinese company in January to help pay off crippling debts, the ports minister said Wednesday.

The new government secured a \$1.5 billion bailout from the International Monetary Fund in June after facing a balance of payments crisis and has also negotiated cheaper funding from international lenders. Ranatunga said the Chinese

ALGIERS: Algeria's state energy company Sonatrach has won an international arbitration case over a contract dispute with Tunisian firm Medex Petroleum North Africa. Sonatrach said on Tuesday.

Sonatrach launched the arbitration claim in 2015 to cancel contracts with Medex over the exploration and development of the southeastern fields of Bourarhat North and Erg Issaouane, the Algerian firm said in a statement.

Sonatrach said the decision would allow it to reclaim full control of the two fields, which have a combined daily production of 15,500 barrels of oil, 3.7 million cubic meters of gas, 8.680 million barrels of condensate, and 500 tonnes of LPG (liquefied petroleum gas). (RTRS)

Actelion late Tuesday confirmed the negotiations with Johnson & Johnson had been broken off. It added, however. that it was in talks "another party regarding a possible strategic transaction." It gave no further details. (AP)

The announcement is due at 2:00 pm ET (1900 GMT), followed by Yellen's news conference 30 minutes later.

"As is the case with most Fed 'pressers', it will mainly involve deciphering the Feds verbal gymnastics while looking for a smoking gun - tonight's smoking gun will be in the form of a hawkish or dovish Fed lean.

Global equities and the dollar have rallied in the five weeks since Donald Trump won the US election, with traders betting his plans for big spending, tax cuts and deregulation will fan already healthy economic growth.

Oil prices fell on Wednesday following a reported rise in US crude inventories and as OPEC signalled a growing crude surplus next year unless production cuts are implemented.

International Brent crude futures were down 82 cents at \$54.90 per barrel at 1334 GMT, while US West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude oil futures were down 92 cents at \$52.06 a barrel.

Traders said the price falls followed an industry report of surprise increases in US crude inventories.

Data from the American Petroleum Institute showed US crude inventories rose by 4.7 million barrels in the week to Dec. 9, compared with analysts' expectations for a 1.6-million-barrel decline. Official inventory data from the US Energy Information Administration will be released later on Wednesday.

The Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries on Wednesday signalled a growing oil supply surplus next year unless members implement their deal to curb output from record levels and outside producers also deliver on cutback pledges made at the weekend.

In a monthly report, OPEC said that without cuts the 2017 overhang would reach 1.24 million bpd, about 300,000 bpd higher than the forecast in its previous report.

OPEC pumped 33.87 million bpd last month, according to figures OPEC collects from secondary sources, up 150,000 bpd from October.

Saudi Ênergy Minister Khalid al-Falih said on Wednesday it would take some time for the market to recover after the deal between OPEC and rival producers to limit supplies.

Gold hovered at slightly firmer levels on Wednesday as investors kept to the sidelines, confident that the US central bank would raise interest rates but unsure about what guidance it would give for next year.

Saudi rejects interference in Yemen: King Salman

RIYADH, Dec 14, (Agencies): Saudi Arabia is determined to prevent external "interference" in neighbouring war-torn Yemen, King Salman said in an annual address on Thursday.

He did not explicitly refer to the kingdom's regional rival Iran but Saudi officials have accused Tehran and the Lebanese Shiite militant group Hezbollah of aiding rebels in Yemen.

Since March 2015, Saudi Arabia has itself led an Arab coalition conducting air strikes against the Shiite Houthi rebels and providing other assistance to local forces in support of President Abed Rabbo Mansour Hadi.

"We will not accept any interference in the internal affairs of Yemen", King Salman said in an address opening a new session of the Shura Council, an appointed body which advises cabinet.

Salman said his country will neither accept that Yemen "becomes a base or a point of passage for whatever state or party to menace the security or the stability of the kingdom and of the region".

The Saudi-led coalition intervened after Houthi rebels allied with elite members of the security forces loyal to Yemen's former president Ali Abdullah Saleh seized the capital Sanaa and overran other parts of the country.

The rebels have killed at least 110 civilians and soldiers in rocket fire and skirmishes along the Saudi frontier. They have also fired longer-range ballistic missiles over the border at Saudi Arabia

Tehran has repeatedly denied sending arms to Yemeni rebels.

Meanwhile, the leader of Yemen's rebel Houthi government on Wednesday accused Britain of war crimes by supplying weapons that Saudi-led forces were using to "bomb the people".

Abdel Aziz bin Habtoor said Britain had "sold cluster bombs to Saudi Ara-

bia" that it knew would be dropped on Shiite Houthi rebels fighting the internationally-recognised, Saudi-backed administration of President Abed Rabbo Mansour Hadi.

"I don't think they are guilty of war crimes, I believe so," he told broadcaster Sky News. "They are participating in the bombing of Yemen people." In response to a parliamentary ques-

tion about the allegations, Prime Minister Theresa May told MPs that Britain had a "very strict regime for export licences in relation to weapons".

"We exercise that very carefully, and in recent years we have indeed refused export licences in relation to arms, including to Yemen and Saudi Arabia," she added.

"Where there are allegations of breaches of international humanitarian law, then we require those to be properly investigated.

The United States on Tuesday blocked the transfer of precision munitions to ally Saudi Arabia, amid anger about the civilian death toll from the kingdom's bombing campaign in Yemen.

'This reflects our continued, strong concerns with the flaws in the coalition's targeting practices and overall prosecution of the air campaign in Yemen," said the White House.

Eleven headless bodies have been dumped in a nature reserve in the southern Yemeni port city of Aden, a local news website reported on Wednesday.

The Aden al-Ghad news website quoted a security source in the city as saying that the male bodies were found on Tuesday evening in the al-Hiswa reserve, west of Aden.

It was not immediately clear who killed the men and why, but Aden al-Ghad said the condition of the bodies suggested they had been dumped there more than a month ago.

Yemen's second largest city has been suffering from lawlessness, as armed groups including Islamic State and al-Qaeda continue to maintain influence nearly a year and-a-half after supporters of President Abed Rabbo Mansour Hadi, backed by Arab coalition troops, drove the Iran-aligned Houthis out.

Moreover, hundreds are spent on crippled development projects without any return, or holding anyone accountable for violation of contract. With the contractor being above the law, some government employees, who received bribes, allow the value of contracts to exceed millions just for kickbacks which are 'haram'. Nevertheless, the issue is that those people misbehave because they know nothing will be done to them.

The opinion on government's inability to take reasonable measures with regard to financial reforms is supported by Fitch Ratings. A newly elected member of the Parliament criticized the ratings and asked Fitch not to interfere in Kuwait's internal affairs because, according to him, "The people of Kuwait know best about their issues," vowing to vote against the financial and economic reform document

ernment to Kuwaitis. Chief Executive Ahmed al-Saleh, who signed the deal in Kuwait City with a senior MCC official, said the contracting company would design, build, equip and maintain the two hospitals, which will be located in Al-Jahra and Al-Ahmadi districts. (RTRS)

Commenting on the issue, MP Jamaan Al-Harbash said Syria sent 500,000 martyrs who are waging war against Russia. He believes the war in Syria is aimed at preventing Palestine and the people of Aleppo from following the stance of Kuwaitis. "The Parliament was hijacked for three years but the free people (opposition) are now back at Abdullah Al-Salem Hall. We call on the government to expel the Russian ambassador. Kuwaitis should make room to raise funds for the people of Syria," he added.

MP Marzouq Al-Khalifa underscored the need for a unified GCC position to cut ties with Russia, while urging the Interior Ministry to facilitate the entry of Syrians who have families in Kuwait.

It was unclear how many civilians remained in rebel territory, after an estimated 130,000 fled to other parts of Aleppo during the government advance.

More than 465 civilians, including 62 children, have died in east Aleppo during the assault, the Observatory said Wednesday in a new toll.

Another 142 civilians, among them 42 children, have been killed by rebel rocket fire on government-held zones in the same period, the monitor said.

Meanwhile, UN war crimes investigators said on Wednesday the Syrian government had the main responsibility for preventing any attacks and

Another witness, Sarmad Raad, found recalling the killing nearly unbearable.

"I shut down," the 26-year-old said, "I just lost my mind."

The AP interviewed dozens of residents who have left Mosul since Iraqi troops began retaking outlying districts last month. They described life in a city that has been virtually sealed off from the outside under the rule of the Islamic State group. They spoke from Mosul's edges and from the refugee camps that are their homes for the foreseeable future, even as smoke rose and artillery boomed from nearby front lines.

The Senate voted 169-99 Wednesday, a day after the confidence measure easily passed parliament's lower chamber.

Gentiloni now heads to the first major international meeting of his premiership - Thursday's European Council summit - with Parliament's backing and his gov-ernment in place. (AP)

HARTFORD: Connecticut-based Sikorsky Aircraft Corp has agreed to settle wrongful death and negligence claims in a lawsuit filed over the 2014 crash of a Navy helicopter that killed three of the five crew members on a training exercise off the coast of Virginia.

Sikorsky has reached a "settlement in principle" with the widows of the three crewmen and a survivor of the crash who filed the lawsuit in federal court in Connecticut last year, according to court documents obtained by The Associated Press. (AP)





In each case, East opened one heart, South overcalled one spade, and West bid two diamonds. At both tables, North jumped to four spades (pre-emptive), whereupon both Easts bid five notrump. This was the Grand Slam Force; it agreed on diamonds as the trump suit and directed West to bid seven diamonds if he had two of the three top trump honors.

Both Souths passed, and both Wests duly bid seven diamonds. The grand slam in diamonds (worth 2,140 points) would undoubtedly have been made, but at each table, North, showing complete faith in the opponents' bidding, sacrificed at seven spades. This was doubled and went down five — 1,400 points — at both tables. So in the end, the hand was a total washout!

Eventually, one team, from Texas, triumphed over the other, from Washington, D.C., by the smallest margin possible. The final score in the 64-deal match was 100 International Match Points to 99, an extremely low score for that number of deals. Indeed, the bridge played by both teams, as illustrated by the deal shown, was magnificent.

In a move detailed on Wednesday, NZR as agreed to boost its player payment pool by \$70 million from \$120 million to \$190 million over the next three years.

WELLINGTON, New Zealand, Dec 14,

The boost recognizes increases in sponsorship and broadcast revenue, including an estimated \$40 million windfall from next year's British and Irish Lions Tour, and is designed to protect New Zealand's leading players from raids by overseas clubs.

Read comes off contract next year and is poised to announce a new deal through the 2019 Rugby World Cup which could take him through the \$1

million barrier.

Former captain Richie McCaw and star flyhalf Dan Carter are thought to have earned more than \$1 million from salaries and endorsements but Read's seven-figure payment would be salary alone, before other earnings.

Many players will benefit as New Zealand Rugby has set aside \$24.8 million for top-ups to players salaries from Super Rugby and provincial contracts, an increase of \$8.9 million on the previous collective. Player revenue-sharing amounts to around

36.5 percent of NZR's income from broadcasting and sponsorship.

"We're really pleased to be in a position where the game has grown its revenue overall," contracts manager Chris Lendrum said. "This collective was

about delivering to the players their fair share of that money because they've been so important earning it and then determining what the most efficient way to spend all that money was."

Raiders owner Mark Davis, who is dissatisfied with the team's aging Coliseum stadium in Oakland, has for much of this year pursued a possible move to Las Vegas.

But officials in Oakland want to keep the Raiders, who moved to Los Angeles in 1982 before returning to Oakland in 1995 Their vote on Tuesday represents their most significant step to date to give the team a new home. Retired NFL player Ronnie Lott is leading an effort to raise money to build a \$1.3 billion stadium in Oakland, a city of more than 400,000 people across the bay from San Francisco.

The Oakland City Council voted to pursue negotiations with Lott's group, according to local station KGO-TV, Indonesian Olympic Committee and the OCA.

The Director General of the OCA. At the ribbon-cutting ceremony, the OCA's Hon. Life Vice President, Wei Jizhong, said it was a very significant moment for the OCA and Jakarta.

"The preparations for the Asian Games are going smoothly, so we need close cooperation and close communication," said Wei.

The OCA representative office is located at Plaza Âsia in the Senayan district of the capital, close to the Gelora Bung Karno sports complex – the focal point of the 18th Asian Games.

It will be under the control of the OCA Vice President in charge of the 18th Asian Games, Mrs Rita Subowo, who said the Indonesian Olympic Committee and government had enjoyed close cooperation with the OCA since hosting the inaugural Asian Beach Games at Bali in 2008.

"Hopefully, after the Asian Games in 2018, Indonesia will be able to go to the next step - the World Beach Games and, who knows, the Olympic Games,' said Mrs Subowo.

On behalf of the government, Deputy IV of the Ministry for Youth and Sport, Gatot S. Dewa Broto, thanked Mrs Subowo for providing the office space and said it would lead to more intensive cooperation with less than one and a half years to go until the 18th Asiad, which will run from August 18 to Sept 2, 2018. A tour of the offices followed the ribbon-cutting ceremony, and a press conference brought the inauguration to a close

Speaking at the press conference, Indonesian Olympic Committee and INASGOC President Erick Thohir said the new office showed the commitment of the OCA to the success of the Asian Games.

NEW DELHI, Dec 14, (AFP): A rampant India will look to create history in the fifth and final Test against England from Friday by piling more misery on Alastair Cook in what could be his last outing as the tourists' skipper.

After completing an innings victory in the fourth Test on Monday in Mumbai, Virat Kohli's men will become the first Indian team to go unbeaten in 18 matches by avoiding defeat in the series finale in Chennai.

The majestic Kohli, who is in the form of his life after striking his third double century of the year, is no mood to ease up on their beleaguered visitors.

After putting the outcome of the series beyond doubt, Kohli said India would now "really express ourselves fully" in Chennai and hope to make it 4-0 against opponents who had been something of a bogey team.

LONDON, Dec 14, (AFP): Britain's heavyweight world champion Anthony Joshua says beating Ukrainian veteran Wladimir Klitschko in their mouthwatering showdown for the IBF and WBA crowns next April would entitle him to be called a legend.

The 27-year-old 2012 Olympic champion — who defended his IBF title successfully last Saturday against American journeyman Eric Molina — will face off against Klitschko on April 29 at Wembley Stadium and said the bout could be a life-changing experience for him. "A knockout is the cherry on top but to win, whichever way, is very possible," said Joshua at a press conference also attended by

Klitschko at Wembley on Wednesday. "This is a fight that can change one from

NEW YORK, Dec 14, (AP): A person with knowledge of the meeting says baseball owners have ratified the sport's new collective bargaining agreement by a 29-1 vote.

Speaking on the condition of anonymity because no announcement was made, the person says Tampa Bay Rays managing general partner Stuart Sternberg was the lone dissenting vote during the telephone meeting Tuesday. Sternberg declined comment in an email to the AP. Players also had been scheduled to hold a ratification vote.

The five-year deal was agreed to Nov 30, about 3-ó hours before the expiration of the previous contract.

The agreement raises the luxury tax thresholds, increases some of the tax rates, imposes a hard cap on signing bonuses for international amateurs and bans smokeless tobacco for players who do not already have major league service.

Thousands mark Sounders' victory

SEATTLE, Dec 14, (AP): Brian Schmetzer hopped off the trolley carrying the MLS champions along their celebration route, and joined fans carrying banners and following the procession.

Schmetzer grew up a fan of the original Seattle Sounders, played for the earlier incarnation of the Sounders and now as coach has led them to their first MLS Cup championship.

It felt only right to be with the fans. "It's just the way I am," Schmetzer said. "I like being with the fans. I'm a fan, I was

a fan for a long time. So it was just natural." Seattle feted the new MLS champions on Tuesday with a jubilant march through downtown Seattle, concluding with a rally at Seattle Center, just steps from where the first incarnation of the Sounders debuted in 1974 at Memorial Stadium as part of the NASL.

After eight years of regularly being regarded as the most successful expansion franchise in MLS history, the Sounders finally reached the pinnacle of the league by defeating Toronto 5-4 on penalty kicks last Saturday night in Canada.

Three days later, the scope of what the Sounders accomplished was driven home by the thousands of blue- and rave greenclad fans that lined the streets. Fans chanted, clapped and showed appreciation for the club that brought the city just its fifth championship in a major professional sport in the past half century, joining the Seahawks, two titles by the WNBA Seattle Storm and the Super-Sonics.

"It was way more than I imagined. Our fans continue to surprise me," Seattle's Jordan Morris said. "We couldn't have done this without them this whole season. There were a lot of downs in a tough season and they stuck by us through it all and that ended with a championship.

It was the second straight year the MLS champions were paraded through the streets of a Northwest city, with Seattle following up on the title won a year ago by Cascadia rival Portland. While Seattle has won four U.S. Open Cup titles and a Supporters'



Nation finally waking up to the most popular sport on planet

India inspired by Iceland in grassroots expansion

GENEVA, Dec 14, (RTRS): The size of the task facing Dutchman Piet Hubers when he agreed to help develop grassroots soccer in India quickly became apparent with one simple comparison.

Hubers discovered there are more full-sized pitches in his home town of Wijchen, which has a population of around 40,000, than in the whole of Mumbai, which has more than 20 million inhabitants.

"That makes it very challenging," he told Reuters in an interview held at the International Sports Convention in Geneva.

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Iceland, who reached the quarter-finals of Euro 2016, are a good guide to what can be achieved.

"I use Iceland very much as an example," said Hubers. "They invested a lot of money in facilities, in halls, in artificial pitches but also in coaches

"It's mandatory that every coach is qualified otherwise you can't even coach a youth team and that in my opinion is one of the basics of the success of Icelandic football."

Cricket-loving India is a sleeping giant as far as football is concerned.

The national side are 137th in the world rankings and, on the only occasion they qualified for the World Cup in 1950, pulled out without kicking a ball.

However, the country of 1.3 billion is finally waking up to the most popular sport on the planet.

The Indian Super League (ISL) is in its third season and Kushal Das, secretary general of the All India Football Federation, has said the country is aiming to qualify for the 2026 World Cup.

Hubers, a former defender for Dutch top-flight club NEC Nijmegen, believes that developing the sport at grassroots level is fundamental to India's plans. "The more players you

get into the system, the better the quality will be at the top," he said.

lionaire Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Industries and Rupert Murdoch's Star India

TV, have their own grassroots programme of which Hubers is technical director.

The most talented players are selected for a residential programme, based near Mumbai, known as Young Champs.

Started in 2014, the scheme's first target is to give 500,000 children between the ages of six and 14 the chance to play football and get coaching.

Hubers said finding spaces to play was one of the major challenges in India's teeming cities

Nacional's players reacted furiously after Hungarian referee Viktor Kassai referred to the new technology in Osaka following complaints from the Kashima bench protesting that Daigo Nishi had been tripped on the half hour mark.

Shoma Doi made history by converting the penalty before Yasushi Endo added a cheeky back-heeled goal and substitute Yuma Suzuki completed the rout late on, Suzuki striking a Cristiano Ronaldo-style pose in celebration.

The Antlers, who become the Japanese team to reach the final, face either Ronaldo's Real Madrid or, in the event of a seismic shock, Mexico's Club America for the title of the world's best team on Sunday. Those two sides meet in Yokohama on Thursday.

The country had previously suffered under a one-year ban from international events imposed by world soccer body FIFA.

The AFF Suzuki Cup is the first international tournament for Indonesia after the ban was lifted in May. The second leg of the final will be played on Saturday in Thailand, which has won the AFF Suzuki Cup four times.

The deferred prosecution agreement with Torneos, whose former chief executive pleaded guilty last year to engaging in schemes to bribe soccer officials, was approved by US District Judge Pamela Chen at a hearing in federal court in Brooklyn.

Under the deal, Torneos agreed to forfeit \$89 million and pay a \$23.76 million penalty. Prosecutors charged it with one count of wire fraud conspiracy, which will be dropped if it abides by the agreement's terms for four years.

Outside of court, Ignacio Galarza, the company's general manager, said he welcomed the agreement, which is the first with a company in the FIFA corruption probe.

"Today is a great day for us as we start to leave this investigation behind," Galarza told reporters.

In a statement, Brooklyn US Attorney Robert Capers said the company cooperated and is "being given a chance to change the way the business of soccer is done in the future."



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Gabon ready to host CAN

LIBREVILLE, Dec 14, (AFP): Gabon insists it is ready to host the African Cup of Nations despite concern about the state of preparations amid political instability just one month ahead of the opening ceremony.

The CAN is due to run from Jan 14 to Feb 5 next year but was thrown into doubt after violence broke out following President Ali Bongo's controversial re-election in August.

Call for Africa's showcase football tournament to be moved to a different country were heard following rioting after the vote whose outcome is still contested.

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
