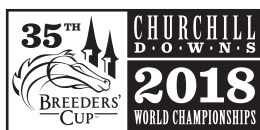

Pre-Entry of Championships

Breeders' Cup Limited (BCL) reserves the right to refuse the pre-entry or subsequent entry of any horse, in BCL's sole discretion, for any reason, including, but not limited to, situations where any connection (e.g., owner, trainer, jockey) of such horse has engaged or may have engaged in conduct, or become the subject of a regulatory or law enforcement inquiry or action alleging conduct that is unlawful, unethical or which may otherwise compromise the integrity of the Breeders' Cup World Championships (BCWC).

In addition, BCL may, in BCL's sole discretion, refuse the pre-entry or subsequent entry of any horse that has tested positive for any anabolic steroid or other ARCI prohibited substance in out-of-competition testing conducted in connection with BCL's Breeders' Cup Challenge Series in the year of the Championships or similar testing conducted by Breeders' Cup Limited.

Pre-Entry Fee Requirements

In order to be eligible for **entry** in the Breeders' Cup World Championships, horses must **pre-enter** by 12 noon (local time at designated place of pre-entry) on Monday, October 22, 2018. A **maximum of two races** can be designated at the time of pre-entry. Pre-entry must be accompanied by payment of all applicable fees. Pre-entry fee amounts are listed on individual race pages 19-32.

All horses must be nominated to the Breeders' Cup in order to participate. Non-nominated race horses may be nominated on or before the pre-entry deadline. For more information, see page 15 of this guide.

Note: If a horse is pre-entered for more than one race, the required pre-entry payment must be for the race of greatest value regardless of whether that is the race of first choice. A maximum of **two** choices may be declared at the time of pre-entry.

Mutuel Entries (Coupling)

In all Breeders' Cup World Championships races, all starters shall be considered a separate betting interest irrespective of a common owner or trainer.

Non-Nominated Horses

Horses of Racing Age Nomination

Horses of Racing Age that in their year of conception were **sired by stallions properly nominated** to the Breeders' Cup, European Breeders' Fund or BCL/EBF Common Fund programs or sired by stallions nominated to the International Stallion program in 2011, may be nominated to the Breeders' Cup program by payment of a fee of **\$100,000 (U.S.)**. Nominated Horses of Racing Age are eligible during their entire racing careers for Breeders' Cup World Championships races, or any other Breeders' Cup purses or awards programs for which they otherwise qualify. In such cases, the person nominating the horse would be eligible to receive the foal nominator award in respect of the Horse of Racing Age.

Horses of Racing Age that in their year of conception were **sired by stallions that were not properly nominated** to the Breeders' Cup, International Stallion, European Breeders' Fund or BCL/EBF Common Fund programs, may be nominated to the Breeders' Cup program by payment of a fee of **\$200,000 (U.S.)**. Nominated Horses of Racing Age are eligible during their entire racing careers for Breeders' Cup World Championships races, or any other Breeders' Cup purses or awards programs for which they otherwise qualify. In such cases, the person nominating the horse would be eligible to receive both the foal nominator award and stallion nominator award in respect of the Horse of Racing Age.

Refund of Horses of Racing Age Nomination

Horses of Racing Age nomination fees are not refundable except in the event the nominated horse is scratched after pre-entry to a Breeders' Cup World Championships race in the year the horse was nominated because of sickness or disability certified by the track or state veterinarian or pursuant to veterinary certification acceptable to Breeders' Cup Limited, in BCL's sole discretion, and such determination shall be final.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Horses of Racing Age nomination fees made prior to August 1, 2018 are non-refundable for any reason.

Travel Awards

All Championships starters that are based outside of Kentucky will receive a \$10,000 (US) travel award if stabled at a North American location or a \$40,000 (US) travel award from outside of North America. Any determination of eligibility for receipt of travel awards shall be made by BCL in its sole discretion and such determination shall be final. After starting, the travel award will be deposited in the owner's horsemen's account at Churchill Downs.

Breeders' Cup Condition of Entry

As a condition of entry for any BCWC race, no horse within six months of the BCWC shall test positive for any anabolic steroid or any other prohibited substance described under the ARCI prohibited substance list. Any horse testing positive for anabolic steroids or other ARCI prohibited substances in a BCL out-of-competition test sample during the six-months prior to the BCWC will be ineligible to participate in BCWC.

Breeders' Cup Out-of-Competition Testing

Breeders' Cup Limited will be conducting out-of-competition (OOC) testing on all 2018 Challenge winners and any other possible starters prior to the Breeders' Cup World Championships. This testing is separate from any testing the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) may perform. The Breeders' Cup OOC testing will be performed by the The Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Laboratory at UC Davis. Routine testing at the Maddy Lab meets or exceeds the protocols established by TOBA and required by Breeders' Cup World Championships to ensure that the highest possible level of testing is performed on all samples.

The primary focus of OOC testing for the Breeders' Cup World Championships will be for Epogen, darb-EPO, and other blood doping agents and certain animal venoms, growth hormones and the beta-2 agonists ractopamine and zilpaterol, anabolic steroids as well as any other drugs or medications prohibited by KHRC regulations. Out-of-competition testing may be conducted at any time. Racing officials from other state jurisdictions and internationally will be asked to assist BCL and/or the KHRC in obtaining blood samples for OOC testing. Horses must be timely produced for testing if requested. A horse may be prevented from entering unless the owner and trainer comply with any pre-race testing request. A horse

testing positive in the six months prior to the BCWC for anabolic steroids, Epogen, darbEPO or other blood doping agents or other ARCI prohibited substance will be prohibited from entering the BCWC races in the same calendar year.

Final Stage – Entry Procedures, closing 10 am, October 29

Entries for all Breeders' Cup World Championships races will close promptly at 10:00 am (EDT) on Monday, October 29, 2018, in the Breeders' Cup Racing Office at Churchill Downs only. At the time of entry a maximum of fourteen horses and two also-eligibles may be accepted for entry in each race based on the order of preference in the rankings established at pre-entry, except for the Juvenile Turf Sprint which will start twelve. Scratch time for all Championships races to be contested on both Championships Friday and Championships Saturday will be 8:00 am (EDT) on Friday, November 2, 2018.

Entry Fees:

Entry fees are payable to Churchill Downs, Inc. Entry fee amounts are listed on individual race pages 19-32.

Also-Eligible Horses

There may be up to two (2) also-eligible horses for each Championships race, excluding the Juvenile Turf Sprint which will carry a total of (4) also-eligible horses. The also-eligible horses will be designated in accordance with the Breeders' Cup Racing Directors/Secretaries Panel's order of preference for each Championships race that is oversubscribed at the time of pre-entry. See Field Selection System on page 33.

Minimum Entry Qualifications for Breeders' Cup World Championships Runners

Breeders' Cup World Championships Eligibility Rule:

Non-starters will not be allowed to pre-enter any BCWC race. All pre-entered horses must have made at least one official start in a race.

The following is for any 3-year-old and older horse that has broken its maiden. Any horse that has started for \$15,000 or less and has not won for \$20,000 or more in the previous two (2) years or has not finished second, third, fourth or fifth for \$20,000 or more since running for \$15,000 or less is not eligible to be pre-entered, to be entered or to run in a Breeders' Cup World Championships race.

The following is for any maiden 3-year-old or older, which has started in a Maiden Claiming race of \$32,000 or less.

Maidens that have started in a maiden race of \$18,000 or less will not be eligible. Maidens that have started in a maiden race of \$32,000 or less at ANY TIME and have not finished second, third, fourth or fifth in a maiden race greater than \$18,000 within their last four starts will not be eligible. Horses must start in at least four maiden claiming races for this rule to apply.

Refund of Pre-Entry or Entry Fees

Pre-entry and entry fees for nominated horses are nonrefundable except in the event of sickness or disability certified by the track or state veterinarian, or by veterinary certification acceptable to Breeders' Cup Limited, in BCL's sole discretion and such determination shall be final, or in the event a horse is not selected by the Racing Directors/Secretaries Panel to enter the race of first choice or in the event a horse does not draw into the body of the field at scratch time or the horse is scratched by the Stewards.

Should a pre-entry fee be paid of greater amount than that required for a designated race, the excess balance will be refunded or may be applied to entry fee requirements for the race actually entered. (For example, if a pre-entry fee of \$50,000 is paid in anticipation of entering the Breeders' Cup Turf and the horse is actually entered in the Breeders' Cup Mile instead – requiring a \$30,000 pre-entry fee – then the excess \$20,000 may be applied to the fees due at the time entries are taken.)

Purse Distributions are Noted on Race Conditions

- Note 1** Owners' purse distribution will be based on official order of finish.
- Note 2** All unpaid travel awards will remain the property of Breeders' Cup Limited.
- Note 3** Owner/nominator must ensure that BCL has current contact information for the owner/nominator. BCL will make reasonable efforts to locate owners/nominators to pay awards. If BCL does not locate an owner/nominator for the payment of an award and the owner/nominator does not claim the award within three (3) years from the date of the race upon which the award was determined, the owner/nominator forfeits all claims to the award and it reverts to BCL.
- Note 4** Purse distributions noted on race conditions apply to races with five (5) or more starters.

Nominator Awards

Horses that finish first through fourth in any Breeders' Cup World Championships race will earn a foal nominator award and it will be paid to the person who nominated the horse. A stallion nominator award will be paid to the person who nominated the sire of the horse to Breeders' Cup. Stallion nominator awards will not be paid to EBF nominated stallions who are not BCL nominated. Stallion nominator awards will be paid to nominators under the International Breeders' Cup program in accordance with the rules of that program and a copy of these rules may be obtained by calling Breeders' Cup Limited at (859) 514-9423.

The announced guaranteed purse of each Breeders' Cup World Championships race will not be increased by pre-entry or entry fees collected prior to race day. Nominator awards are not included in the guaranteed purse. Nominator awards will be paid directly by Breeders' Cup Limited.

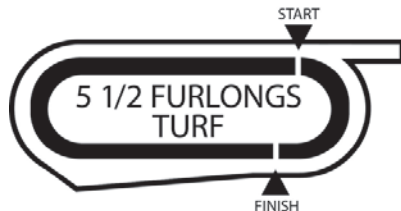

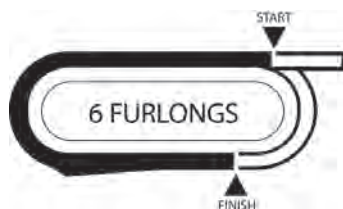

Breeders' Cup Field Selection System (For Races That Oversubscribe)

A maximum of 14 starters are allowed in each of the 14 Breeders' Cup World Championships races with the exception of the Juvenile Turf Sprint which will start twelve. Breeders' Cup Limited has adopted a field selection system to select runners in the event fields are oversubscribed. **This system ranks horses in order of preference based upon (i) wins in Breeders' Cup Challenge races, (ii) a point system and (iii) the judgment of a panel of racing experts.** The first two criteria will assign a maximum of seven horses (or all Challenge winners) for fields limited to 14 starters and a maximum of six horses (or all Challenge winners) for fields limited to twelve starters. The field selection system will be implemented, as necessary, following the taking of pre-entries on October 22, 2018 to officially rank the oversubscribed fields. The Racing Directors/Secretaries Panel (the "Panel") will rank all the horses pre-entered in the oversubscribed races as described below. After pre-entry, any vacancies in the fields will be filled by horses in order of panel preference.

Breeders' Cup Graded Stakes Points

Specific point values are assigned to first-, second- and third-place finishes in stakes throughout the United States and/or Canada from January 1 through the pre-entry deadline date of October 22, 2018 that have been granted graded status by the American Graded Stakes Committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and/or by the Jockey Club of Canada. International Group races outside of the U.S. and Canada have no point value.

Based on this system, win, place and show horses in Grade I stakes earn ten, six and four points, respectively. The top three finishers in Grade II stakes earn six, four and two points, respectively, and in Grade III races the points earned are four, two and one, respectively.

Breeders' Cup Graded Stakes Points

Grade III	4	2	1

Except for the five two-year-old Championships races, Graded Stakes points for dirt races will be the only points considered for horses pre-entered in dirt Championships races and Graded Stakes points for turf races will be the only points considered for horses pre-entered in turf Championships races. All Graded Stakes points will be considered for the five two-year-old Championships races.

NOTE: Challenge wins or Graded Stakes points will have no bearing on ranking after pre-entry selection.

Selection Procedures

In the case of an oversubscribed 14- or 12- horse field, the first horse(s) selected will be the winner(s) of Breeders' Cup Challenge races in the corresponding Breeders' Cup Championships division. If there are less than seven Challenge winners, the next horses will be ranked at pre-entry based on the total number of Graded Stakes points they have collected during the year until a maximum of seven or six horses have been ranked based on Breeders' Cup Challenge races and Graded Stakes points. All horses will need to accumulate a minimum of six (6) points in American and/or Canadian Graded Stakes races to be considered to receive an automatic selection on points in any Championships race with the exception of the five Juvenile races. In the five Juvenile races, horses will need to accumulate a minimum of four (4) points in American and/or Canadian Graded Stakes races to be considered to receive an automatic selection on points.

The horses remaining after the first seven or six (or all Challenge winners, whichever is greater) in oversubscribed fourteen or twelve horse fields at the time of pre-entry will be ranked in order of preference by the Panel. The Panel will be free to establish its own criteria or ranking so that high-quality horses of demonstrated ability will have the opportunity to participate in Championships races regardless of earlier participation in graded events.

Horses will be allowed to pre-enter a maximum of two races. The races in which the horse pre-enters must be designated in order of choice at the time of pre-entry on October 22, 2018. Performance in Breeders' Cup Challenge races and points earned in American Graded Stakes races and/or Canadian Graded Stakes races have no bearing on a given Championships race field unless the race is oversubscribed (more than fourteen or twelve pre-entered).

Once a horse has been ranked among the first 14- or 12-horses in its race of first choice at pre-entry, its ranking in its race of second choice will be based first on whether it won a Breeders' Cup Challenge race in the Championships division of the second choice and then on the judgment of the Panel regardless of the number of points earned in American and/or Canadian Graded Stakes races. If a horse is not ranked among the first fourteen or twelve horses in its race of first choice and it did not win a Challenge race in its Championships division of second choice, then its points earned in American and/or Canadian Graded Stakes races will be utilized for ranking in its race of second choice.

Ties at Pre-Entry

In the event more than fourteen or twelve horses are pre-entered in a particular Championships race and two or more horses are tied for the seventh or sixth highest number of American and/or Canadian Graded Stakes races points at the time of pre-entry, the Panel shall decide in its sole discretion which of those horses shall be the seventh or sixth highest point earner. Horses not selected shall then be ranked in order of preference by the Panel at its discretion.

Pre-Entry Rankings

The Panel will issue a list of all horses ranked in order of preference for each Championships race that is oversubscribed at the time of pre-entry. After pre-entry, any vacancies in the fields of oversubscribed races will be filled by horses in the Panel's order of preference as determined at pre-entry.

The office is located on the west side of the Paddock/Toteboard building, adjacent to the paddock in the Clubhouse area.

No purse money will be released until a final report from the testing laboratory has been received confirming that all samples have passed. If a report of a suspicious finding is received, purse money will be available as provided in 810 KAR 1:026 section 28, unless otherwise directed by Breeders' Cup Limited.

Owners and trainers are required to file their complete address information, U.S. Tax Reporting Number, jockey fees and all fees for stakes engagements no later than one hour prior to the first race on the day of the race. In the event the parties reach an agreement with respect to the fee paid the jockey, said agreement or contract must be signed by all parties and delivered to the Horsemen's Bookkeeper prior to the running of the race in question. If no contract or written agreement is submitted prior to the race in question, the Horsemen's Bookkeeper shall debit the owner's account in accordance with the fee scale set forth in the Kentucky Rules of Racing.

Note | United States Non-Residents – The Internal Revenue Service requires that the racetrack withhold 30 percent on any purse paid to a non-resident of the United States in the absence of a Form W8BEN or W8ECI placed on file with the Horsemen's Bookkeeper. Forms are available through Breeders' Cup Limited or the International Racing Bureau.

Signed W-9 Forms must be in the office of the Horsemen's Bookkeeper prior to any purse money being distributed.

The 2018 Breeders' Cup Challenge Series is a "Win & You're In" program. With 85 races selected worldwide across every Championships division, owning a Breeders' Cup nominated runner is more important than ever.

In 2018, any nominated horse that wins a Challenge race will receive:

- An automatic starting position in the corresponding Championships race.
 - Pre-entry and entry fees paid.
- A nominator award of \$10,000 to the person nominating the foal or Horse of Racing Age.

All Championships starters will receive:

- A travel allowance of \$10,000 for North American runners (if stabled outside of Kentucky) and \$40,000 for international runners will be awarded when they start in the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

Breeders' Cup Challenge Series: Win and You're In, presented by America's Best Racing on NBC Sports

This year's Breeders' Cup Challenge Series, now in its fifth year on NBC and NBCSN, features a schedule of 11 live programs featuring 17 qualifying races and other major stakes on the road to the Breeders' Cup World Championships. Churchill Downs is the home of this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships, November 2-3, which also will be televised live by the NBC Sports Group.

Breeders' Cup World Championships offer 14 Championships races and \$30 Million in purses and awards each year. When combined with the Challenge program benefits, it makes millions in purses and awards available for Breeders' Cup nominated horses each year. All horses must be nominated in order to compete in the Championships.

In the event a designated Breeders' Cup Challenge turf race (Turf Sprint, Juvenile Turf, Juvenile Filly Turf, Juvenile Turf Sprint, Filly and Mare Turf, Turf or Mile Division) is taken off the turf, due to unsafe racing conditions, the horse that wins the "off the turf" race will NOT receive an automatic qualifying position and will NOT receive the starting fees (the total of pre-entry and entry fees) to enter the Breeders' Cup World Championships in the applicable Turf Division race; provided, however, that Breeders' Cup Limited may, at its option, reinstate the "Win and You're In" status of the "off the turf" race. The decision to take a Breeders' Cup Challenge Division turf race off the turf course is under the sole discretion of the racetrack/racing association, not Breeders' Cup Limited.

All Challenge winners are subject to out-of-competition testing. All runners are subject to out-of-competition testing by the KHRC and/or BCL. See rules beginning on page 87. No runners may compete if they have tested positive for anabolic steroids or other ARCI prohibited substances in the six months prior to the BCWC.

Important Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Requirements and Pertinent Regulations

The following guidelines are designed to help expedite your licensing and registration procedures on arrival in Kentucky. This information is not meant to replace or modify the applicable KHRC statutes and regulations, but to serve as a reference. In the event of a discrepancy in the information below and KHRC statutes or regulations, KHRC statutes and regulations govern. A complete set of the statutes and regulations can be found on the KHRC website. <http://khrc.ky.gov>.

Licenses

Note: Only individuals can be licensed by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. No horse may be entered or raced in the Commonwealth of Kentucky unless the owner and each of the part owners has been granted a current license, except no more than five (5) individuals may be licensed as owners of a single horse as indicated below on page 48 (see joint ownership, 810 KAR 1:007, Section 4). All individuals whose names appear in the race day program must hold a current license.

How to Obtain a License

There are five ways to obtain your Kentucky Horse Racing Commission license.

1. Go to the live meet track license office.
2. Go to the KHRC office located at the Kentucky Horse Park.
3. Mail your application along with the fee to the central office.
4. Fax your application along with a credit card number to the central office or live meet track to Fax (859) 202-3510.
5. E-mail your application along with credit card information to KHRClicensing@ky.gov.

Faxed license applications are accepted at both the central office and the live meet track with a license fee credit card payment option. There is an additional \$4 administrative fee for all credit card payments.

Print one of the licensing applications and complete all fields of the application. Please remember to sign and date your application and to include an e-mail address. An incomplete application will delay your licensure.

KHRC accepts cash, checks, money orders or credit card payments. There is a \$4 administrative fee on all credit card payments and there is a \$20 fee on all returned checks. Credit cards accepted are:

Visa, American Express, MasterCard, Discover

Remember that all stable employee applicants must have their applications signed by the trainer or assistant trainer for whom they work.

LICENSING/INSURANCE

810 KAR 1:025 Section 17. Temporary Licenses.

(1) (a) Only an owner is eligible for a temporary license.

(b) A horse in a trainer's care shall not start in a race unless the owner has a current license or has an application for a temporary license, "Temporary Owner's License Application," (KHRC 25-02 (01/10), on file with the commission.

(c) A licensed trainer may apply for a temporary license on behalf of an owner for whom the licensed trainer trains.

(d) The commission may refuse the license if the applicant fails to supply a name, Social Security number, and mailing address for a temporary license.

(e) A temporary license shall be valid for no more than thirty (30) days from the date of issuance and shall automatically lapse the 30th day pending completion of all licensing procedures.

(f) Upon expiration of the thirty (30) day temporary license, the owner's license shall be suspended or the owner's horses shall be ineligible to race in Kentucky pending completion of all licensing procedures.

(g) Completion of all owner licensing procedures shall extend the owner's license to the end of the calendar year.

(h) If a temporary license expires prior to completion of all owner licensing procedures, the applicant shall pay an additional licensing fee.

(2) An owner shall not be eligible to be issued more than one (1) temporary license in any calendar year.

(3) A temporary license shall not be valid for claiming.

Photos

All applicants wishing access to the stable area must have a current KHRC license photo ID. Photos will be taken at KHRC licensing office and issued on site.

Insurance

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) requires that a signed written binder of Worker's Compensation or a Certificate of Insurance verifying proper coverage for their employees be in their file before a trainer's license can be issued or a horse permitted to start. 810 KAR 1:008 Section 3(2).

LICENSING/INSURANCE

International and/or out-of-state coverage is acceptable. All such coverage must be endorsed and notarized with wording which specifies that coverage is provided within the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Telegrams or verbal contact will not suffice. Horsemen shipping from out of state are advised to bring such Worker's Compensation documents for filing with the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

No trainer's licenses will be issued without required proof of insurance.

Ownership Disclosure 810 KAR 1:007 Section 3.

(1) Licensed owners and licensed trainers shall be held jointly responsible for making a full disclosure of the entire ownership of each horse in their care.

(2) Disclosure under this section shall identify in writing all persons who directly, or indirectly through a lien, lease partnership, corporate stockholding, syndication, or other joint venture, hold any present or reversionary right, title, or interest in and to such horse, and those persons who by virtue of any form of interest may exercise control over or benefit from the racing of the horse. The degree and time of such ownership held by each person shall also be designated.

(3) Disclosure under this section shall be made when registering each horse with the racing secretary upon arrival on association grounds or at time of entry whichever event occurs first and shall be revised immediately upon any subsequent change in the ownership.

(4) Disclosure under this section together with all written agreements, and affidavits setting out oral agreements, pertaining to the ownership of or rights to a horse, shall be attached to the registration certificate for the horse and filed with the racing secretary, who shall be responsible for the care and security of all papers while the horse is located on association grounds.

(5) Disclosure under this section is made for the benefit of the public and all documents pertaining to the ownership or lease of a horse filed with the racing secretary shall be available for public inspection.

(6) The stewards shall review the ownership of each horse entered to race to insure that each registration certificate is properly endorsed by the transferor to the present owner. The stewards may determine the validity for racing purposes of all leases, transfers, and agreements pertaining to ownership of a horse and may call for adequate evidence of ownership at any time. The stewards may declare ineligible to race any horse, the ownership or control of which, is in question.

Joint Ownership. 810 KAR 1:007 Section 4.

(1) No more than five (5) individual persons may be licensed as owners of a single horse.

(2) If more than five (5) individual persons own interests in a single horse, through a partnership, corporation, syndication, or other joint venture, then those individual persons may designate in writing a member of the partnership, corporation, syndicate, or joint venture to represent the entire ownership of and be responsible for the horse as the licensed owner.

LICENSING/INSURANCE

(3) An agreement under this section or lease, shall accompany the application for an owner's license. Each person designated as representing the entire ownership of a horse shall be licensed.

(4) The commission may deny, suspend, or revoke the license of any owner whose ownership of a horse is qualified or limited in part by rights or interests in or to the horse being held or controlled by any other individual person or persons who would be ineligible to be licensed as an owner.

Badges

Owners, trainers and their employees are to wear identifying badges on their outer clothing at all times while in the stable area. Trainers are to submit a badge list of his/her owners to the KHRC and the Stable Office.

Admittance to the Churchill Downs stable area is restricted to owners, their guests, trainers and their employees, racing officials and the working press upon presentation of proper credentials.

No visitors are permitted in this area except with authorized passes issued by the Churchill Downs Stable Office or Breeders' Cup Limited.

National Racing Compact

The National Racing Compact was created as an independent, interstate entity, composed of pari-mutuel racing regulators from participating states, which has been empowered to set standards for individual licenses, accept applications and fingerprints, analyze criminal history information and issue a national license, which will be recognized by all member states and other states that may elect to recognize the license. Participants need only to complete one license application and provide one set of fingerprints instead of duplicating the licensing process in each state. Once approved for the national license, a participant then pays only a participation fee in each state in which the national licensee wishes to race. Good in 24 jurisdictions: Arizona, *Arkansas, California, Delaware, Florida, Kentucky, *Illinois, *Indiana, *Iowa, Louisiana, Maryland, *Michigan, Nebraska, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, *Ontario, *Pennsylvania, *Texas, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia and *Wyoming.

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Permitted Race Day Medications: (see page 91 for further details)

Furosemide may be used under the following circumstances:

- (a) Furosemide shall be administered at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission by the KHRC Veterinarian, by a single intravenous injection, not less than four (4) hours prior to post time for a race in which the horse is entered.
- (b) The furosemide dosage administered shall not exceed 500 mg (10 ml), nor be less than 150 mg (3 ml).
- (c) There is a \$20 fee for raceday furosemide administration.

No other injections are permitted within 24 hours of a race.

NO PRIVATE VETERINARIANS ARE ALLOWED TO ADMINISTER FUROSEMIDE ON RACE DAY.

Note: All runners are subject to out-of-competition testing by the KHRC and/or BCL. See rules beginning on page 87. No runner may compete if they have tested positive for anabolic steroids or other ARCI prohibited substances in the six months prior to the BCWC.

Note: All Championships starters traveling to Kentucky from a location outside of North America will receive a US \$40,000 travel award.

International Air Transportation

Breeders' Cup Limited in conjunction with Mersant International will help coordinate flight arrangements for horses pre-entered in the Championships. The aircraft will likely depart Friday, October 26, from a city to be determined, depending on the location of the participants, and will arrive in Kentucky that evening at Louisville International Airport, which is approximately 10 minutes from Churchill Downs. After the mandatory 42 hours quarantine, the horses will be able to train Monday, October 29. Breeders' Cup will provide a travel award of \$40,000 (US) for each starter that travels to Kentucky to compete in a Breeders' Cup World Championships race from a location outside of North America. This award will be distributed when purses are approved for payment and will be deposited into the owner's account at Churchill Downs.

Horses pre-entered in a Breeders' Cup World Championships race have first preference on the arranged flights over horses on the also-eligible list or horses nominated for undercard stakes at the host track.

Due to space limitations on the arranged flights, trainers are not guaranteed passage for any grooms regardless of the numbers of runners. Professional grooms will accompany the runners.

Quarantine

Horses arriving from foreign countries (with the exception of countries in South America and South Africa) by charter or scheduled aircraft will be flown directly to Louisville International Airport. The horses will be escorted by United States Department of Agriculture personnel to the USDA quarantine facility in barns 45 & 48 (see stable map on page 147) at Churchill Downs where a federal veterinarian will test horses under conditions that apply at the time of arrival.

INTERNATIONAL RUNNERS

All required testing procedures will be expedited but horses will not be able to clear quarantine before 42 hours after arrival at the quarantine facility. The quarantine facility contains a walking area satisfactory for horses to utilize prior to being released from quarantine.

After negative test results are received and a mandatory 42 hours have passed, the horses will remain in barns 45/48, which will then be dedicated as the isolation barns for purposes of permitting horses released from quarantine to meet re-entry requirements into their respective countries.

All horses arriving on any chartered or commercial aircraft must be pre-blood tested for all United States import requirements at the National Veterinary Services Laboratories (NVSL) in Ames, Iowa prior to departure in order to be permitted access to the quarantine barns at Churchill Downs.

Only those horses pre-entered in one of the Breeders' Cup World Championships races or nominated for Churchill Downs' additional stakes races will be permitted in the quarantine barn. In addition, only those horses traveling with a groom will be permitted in the quarantine barn.

Breeders' Cup Limited and/or Churchill Downs reserve the right, in their sole discretion, to refuse the shipping and/or entry of any horse into the private quarantine barns at Churchill Downs.

Since the quarantine barns are established on a temporary basis and contain only four units, specific shipping dates will be established. Owners and trainers and/or their appointed agents should contact Mersant International, Ltd. at (718) 978-8200 to coordinate arrivals.

The USDA veterinarians in charge are Dr. Kandace DeBolt and Dr. John Hollis. They will be available to assist owners and trainers whenever possible. Private veterinarians will be on call 24 hours a day.

Insurance

Trainers shall maintain at all times general liability insurance with coverage no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. Trainers shall also maintain at all times Workers' Compensation Insurance covering all personnel employed as required by the Statutes and Administrative Regulations of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Trainers shall, prior to admission to Churchill Downs' facilities and at any time upon request by Churchill Downs, furnish a certificate(s) evidencing proof of insurance coverage in accordance with the requirements set forth herein. Responsibility for the maintenance of appropriate horse mortality or other equine insurance vests with the Trainer and/or Owner(s), as the case may be as agreed between those parties. Consultation with a competent insurance advisor is strongly recommended. Failure to maintain adequate insurance may subject Trainer and/or Owner(s) to multiple and substantial risks, including being excluded from Churchill Downs' premises. Owner(s) and Trainer indemnify and hold Churchill Downs harmless against any claims, liabilities, judgments, or costs (including attorney fees) arising out of the Trainer and/or Owner(s)'s failure to obtain insurance as appropriate and required by law.

Imported Horses – Workout Requirement

Any horse imported from a country that has no provisions for timed workouts and is entered in a stakes within 7 days of clearing USDA quarantine and runs within 9 days will not be required to have a published workout if they have not started in the past 30 days.

Safety vests and helmets are required for all jockeys, trainers, exercise riders and pony persons while riding or exercising horses.

Paddock Schooling

There will be three schooling days during racing, Sunday, October 28, Wednesday, October 31 and Thursday, November 1. Breeders' Cup will implement a ranking system to award schooling spots during live racing. Breeders' Cup World Championships starters receive preference. Submit your requests to the Paddock Judge, Sue Brewster at (502) 638-3816 (AM) or (502) 636-4477 (PM) by Saturday, October 27.

During training hours, the paddock will be open every morning from 5:15 to 10:00 am. Horses wanting to go into the paddock after training hours will be allowed from 10:00 to 10:30 am Mon/Tues only by entering through the paddock gap. No paddock schooling on Championships Friday or Championships Saturday.

Gate Schooling of International Horses

The Starter, Scott Jordan, (502) 291-9901 (Cell), and his assistants will school every day during Breeders' Cup World Championships week from 7:30 am to 9:30 am from the main track (1/4 pole) and at the 7/8 pole (standing only).

All international trainers will be required to meet the Starter, Scott Jordan, (502) 291-9901 (Cell). The purpose of this visit is to make the Starter aware of any special needs of the horse. Please contact the Starter upon arrival on the grounds to make these arrangements.

Microchipping/Tattoo Requirements

Horses imported from foreign countries to run in Breeders' Cup World Championships races are required to be microchipped. It is recommended that this be done prior to the horse arriving at Churchill Downs. The Jockey Club Registrar will be at Churchill Downs to expedite the registration of all horses shipping in from overseas. All domestic horses must be tattooed or microchipped.

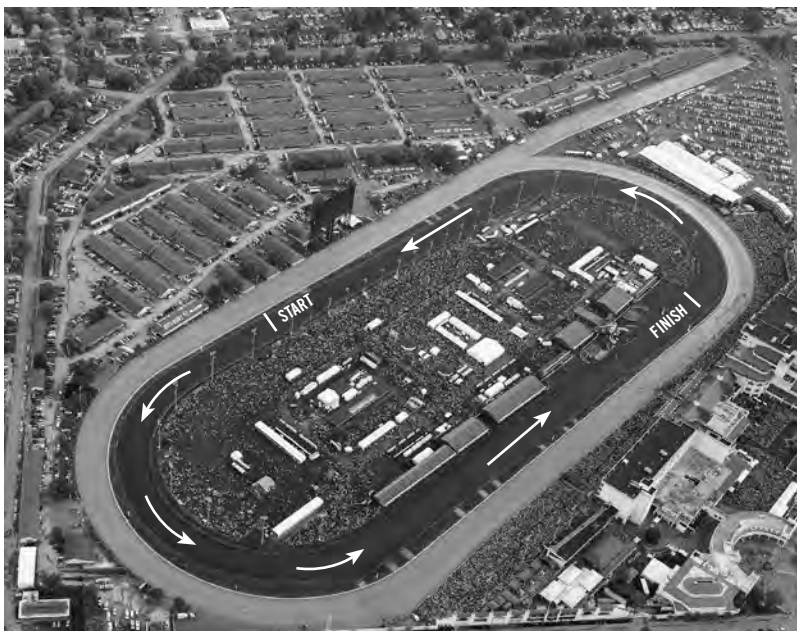

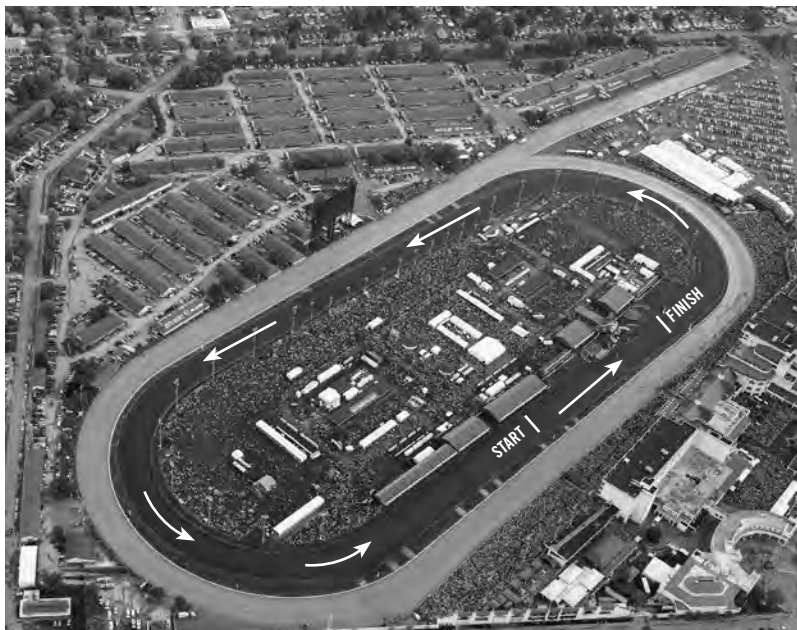

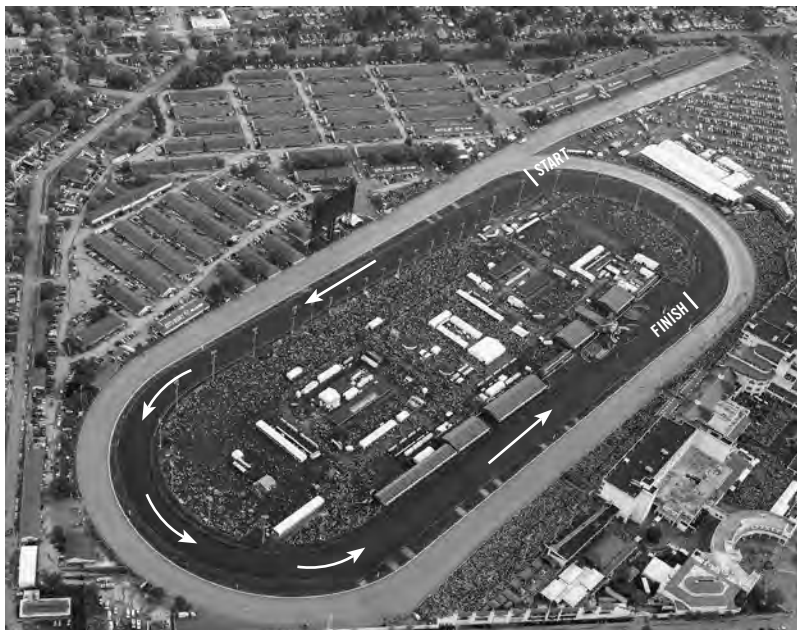

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STABLING & TRAINING

Stalls/Stabling

Breeders' Cup World Championships horses will be stabled in designated Breeders' Cup barns throughout the stable area of Churchill Downs. Please contact Steve Hargrave, Stable Superintendent, (502) 636-4490 (Stable Office) or (502) 541-8818 (Cell), at your earliest convenience for stall locations. A complete list will be available in the Breeders' Cup Racing Office. The USDA Quarantine/Isolation facility will be barns 45 & 48.

Stable Personnel

Tack rooms, sleeping accommodations and bathroom facilities are available within the Churchill Downs barn area. Requests for stabling and accommodations for stable personnel should be made to Steve Hargrave, Stable Superintendent, (502) 636-4490 (Stable Office) or (502) 541-8818 (Cell), as early as possible.

Stable Equipment

Horsemen shipping to Churchill Downs are reminded that they must provide stable equipment and utensils, including webbing, buckets, feed tubs, hay nets, pitchforks, screweyes, etc.

Notice of Arrival

At least 48 hours prior to arrival, horsemen shipping in to Churchill Downs should advise Steve Hargrave, Stable Superintendent, (502) 636-4490 (Stable Office) or (502) 541-8818 (Cell), of estimated time of arrival and any requirements concerning special bedding, feed or bottled water, which he will arrange.

Requirements for Entry of Horses Into Stable Areas

After consulting with the Kentucky State Veterinary Office, the following are required for any horse including ponies to gain entrance onto Churchill Downs grounds.

All horses, including lead ponies, seeking entrance into our stable area(s) shall be accompanied by:

- (1) a current negative EIA (Coggins) Test dated less than one year prior to date of arrival, and listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), which has been signed and dated within seventy two (72) hours prior to arrival by a licensed veterinarian.
- (2) a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), which has been signed and dated within seventy-two (72) hours prior to arrival by a licensed veterinarian.
- (3) record of vaccination against Equine Herpes Virus Type 1 (EHV-1) by a licensed veterinarian a minimum of fourteen (14) days, and no more than one hundred twenty (120) days of entry into our stable area(s). Once a horse receives the initial EHV-1 vaccination it only needs to be re-vaccinated every one hundred twenty (120) days, hence if you vaccinated your horse last

January then vaccinate it again 120 days later. The minimum fourteen (14) day vaccine requirement applies to horses that had NOT been vaccinated for EHV-1 within the past one hundred twenty (120) days. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) shall indicate the date of the vaccination, the specific vaccine product, vaccine lot number, and vaccine expiration date, used to vaccinate each horse.

PLEASE PROVIDE ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR ANY HORSE(S), INCLUDING LEAD PONIES, STABLED ON CHURCHILL DOWNS' GROUNDS TO THE STABLE OFFICE IMMEDIATELY UPON YOUR ARRIVAL. THE STABLE OFFICE CAN BE REACHED AT (502) 636-4490. THANK YOU FOR YOUR COOPERATION.

Equine Herpes and Strangles are contagious equine diseases, which continue to be a concern in the United States. These requirements have been taken to safeguard all horse(s). Horsemen are asked to maintain temperature charts on all of their horses, and to report immediately any temperature 1.5 degrees above the animal's normal at-rest temperature to their veterinarian and Steve Hargrave, Churchill Downs Stall office at (502) 636-4490 immediately. Your cooperation is appreciated.

*Health requirements are subject to change without advance notice.

Horse Identification

810 KAR 1:012 allows identification via an "electronic registration system," as defined, such as InCompass. Optionally, foal certificates may be placed on file in the Racing Office prior to entry time. Foal certificates must bear the names of the current owner(s). No horse shall be permitted to start that has not been fully identified.

Mandatory 72 Hour Ship In Requirements

All horses who have drawn into the body of a Friday Championships race must be on the grounds of Churchill Downs by 10:00 am (EDT), Tuesday, October 30, 72 hours prior to first post. All horses who have drawn into the body of a Saturday Championships race must be on the grounds of Churchill Downs by 10:00 am (EDT), Wednesday, October 31, 72 hours prior to first post. All also-eligibles for Friday or Saturday Championships races should be on the grounds by Noon (EDT), Thursday, November 1, and will be subject to surveillance prior to arrival at Churchill Downs.

STABLING & TRAINING

Training Schedules

The Churchill Downs barn area is now open until the end of the Fall Meet.

Main Track (during Breeders' Cup World Championships week)

The main track will be open for training each morning from 5:15 am to 10:00 am. A special training window for Breeders' Cup Championship runners only will be open between 7:30 am to 7:45 am.

The main track will break at 7:00 am to 7:30 am and 8:30 am to 9:00 am each morning, with the exception of Friday, November 2, and Saturday, November 3.

Training hours for the main track for Friday, November 2, will be 5:15 am to 6:45 am and Saturday, November 3, weather permitting, will be 5:15 am to 6:45 am.

Horses galloping on the track at less than a two-minute gallop will be required to stay 25 feet from the inside rail.

The outrider will give instructions as to the proper lane of traffic for entering and exiting the track.

There will be outriders on the track every day to provide assistance; if at any time they can be of assistance, do not hesitate to call them. Please follow orders and directions of the outriders. Anyone observed to be excessively using their riding crop will be referred to the Stewards for possible disciplinary action.

Paramedic services will be parked at the 5/8 pole every day. Horse Ambulance will be parked near the 5/8 pole.

Turf Course (during Breeders' Cup World Championships week)

Prior to October 28, the turf course will allow training on Tuesday, October 23. The turf course will again be open on Sunday, October 28 and daily thereafter, from 9:35 am to 10:00 am during Breeders' Cup World Championships week for training only for horses pre-entered in one of the seven Breeders' Cup turf events and Churchill Downs turf stakes. Trainers of all horses so qualified must request their slips from the Churchill Downs Racing Secretary or the International Racing Bureau. **TURF SLIPS MUST BE REQUESTED 24 HOURS IN ADVANCE.**

Horses enter the turf course at the top of the backstretch between the 5 1/2 & 3/4 poles on the track, across from barn 18 gap.

On Friday, November 2, the turf course will be open from 7:00 am to 7:30 am only to Breeders' Cup entrants. No turf training on Saturday, November 3.

STABLING & TRAINING

Equipment (810 KAR 1:012 Horses)

Bandages

Only bandages approved by the official veterinarian shall be used on a horse during a race, and all other leg coverings shall be removed as soon as the horse arrives in the saddling paddock.

Blinkers and Cheek Pieces

Permission for a horse to add blinkers or cheek pieces to his equipment or to discontinue the use of them must be approved by the Starter before being granted by the Stewards.

Shoes

Front Shoe (Dirt)

810 KAR 1:012 Section 11. The following shall not be used on the front horse shoes for racing or training on all racing surfaces at Churchill Downs: Horse shoes (racing plates) that have toe grabs, bends, jar calks, stickers, or any other traction device. Wear plates with a height no greater than two (2) millimeters may be used.

Hind Horse Shoes (Dirt)

Any hind shoe with a turndown of more than one-quarter inch (1/4") will not be allowed on the dirt course.

Front AND Hind Shoes (Turf)

Only Queen's Plate or Queen's Plate XT will be allowed on the turf course.

Bar shoes may be used for racing only with permission of the Stewards.

Workout Identification

All Breeders' Cup World Championships horses entering the track for training shall be identified by name, type of workout, distance, name of trainer and shall wear the Breeders' Cup-provided saddle towels. Failure to report this information to the gap attendant will be referred to the Stewards. Breeders' Cup World Championships horses are required to wear their personalized workout towels when training with no exceptions. **Trainers who fail to send their runner to the track in the Breeders' Cup-provided workout towel will forfeit their complimentary seating on the days of the Championships.**

Workout Requirements

A horse that has not started in the past forty-five (45) days shall not be permitted to start unless it has at least one (1) published workout within twenty (20) days of the race at a distance satisfactory to the Stewards of the meeting.

Any horse imported from a country that has no provisions for timed workouts and is entered in a stakes within 7 days of clearing USDA quarantine and runs within 9 days will not be required to have a published workout if they have not started in the past 30 days.

STABLING & TRAINING

Paddock Schooling

There will be three schooling days during racing, Sunday, October 28, Wednesday, October 31 and Thursday, November 1. Breeders' Cup will implement a ranking system to award schooling spots during live racing. Breeders' Cup Championships starters receive preference. Submit your requests to the Paddock Judge, Sue Brewster at (502) 638-3816 (AM) or (502) 636-4477 (PM) by Saturday, October 27 by Noon (ET).

During training hours, the paddock will be open every morning from 5:45 am to 10:00 am. Horses wanting to go into the paddock after training hours will be allowed between 10:00 am to 10:30 am Monday and Tuesday only by entering through the paddock gap. No paddock schooling on Championships Friday, November 2, or Championships Saturday, November 3.

Starting Gate Schooling

The Starter, Scott Jordan, (502) 291-9901 (Cell), and his assistants will school every day October 22 to November 3 from 7:30 am to 9:30 am from the gate located near the 1/4 pole and at the 7/8 pole (standing only).

Security

Security for the stable area will be provided on a 24-hour basis by Churchill Downs. Any special security needs should be addressed to the Breeders' Cup Racing Office. Breeders' Cup World Championships horses will be under Breeders' Cup Equine Security Team surveillance 72 hours out from first post time on November 2-3. Friday runners watch begins Tuesday. Saturday runners watch begins Wednesday.

Stable Area Guest Pass

Admittance to the stable area is restricted to owners, their guests, trainers and their employees, racing officials and the working press upon presentation of proper credentials.

No visitors are permitted except with authorized passes issued by the Stable Gate Office.

The Breeders' Cup Racing Office will issue stable area guest passes upon request to the guests of Breeders' Cup World Championships owners and trainers.

Health & Safety

Safety Helmet and Vests

In accordance with 810 KAR 1:009 and 810 KAR 1:026 - All individuals mounted on a horse or stable pony in the stall areas and on Keeneland premises shall wear a properly secured safety helmet at all times, which helmet shall have a tag, stamp or similar identifying marker indicating that it meets one of the following safety standards:

STABLING & TRAINING

- (a) ASTM International Standard, ASTM F1163-04a;
- (b) British Standards, BS EN 1384:1997 or PAS 015:1999; or
- (c) Australian/New Zealand Standard, AS/NZS 3838:2006.

All individuals mounted on a horse or stable pony in the stall areas and on Keeneland premises, all assistant starters and any person handling a horse in a starting gate shall wear a properly secured safety vest at all times, which vest shall have a tag, stamp or similar identifying marker indicating that it meets one of the following safety standards:

- (a) British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA):2000 Level 1;
- (b) Euro Norm (EN) 13158:2000 Level 1;
- (c) ASTM International Standard, ASTM F2681-08;
- (d) Shoe and Allied Trade Research Association (SATRA) Jockey Vest Document M6 Issue 3; or
- (e) Australian Racing Board (ARB) Standard 1.1998.

Riding Crops

In accordance with 810 KAR 1:012 Section 11. Equipment.

- (9) (a) Any riding crop may be subject to inspection and approval by the stewards or the clerk of the scales to ensure conformity with the specifications of paragraphs (c) through (e) of this subsection.
- (b) Only riding crops meeting the specifications of this subsection, including the mandatory shock absorbing characteristics, may be used in thoroughbred racing and training.
- (c) A riding crop shall have a:
 - 1. Maximum weight of eight (8) ounces;
 - 2. Maximum length, including flap, of thirty (30) inches; and
 - 3. Minimum diameter of the shaft of three-eighths (3/8) inch.
- (d) 1. The only additional feature that may be attached to the riding crop is a flap that shall have a:
 - a. Maximum length from the end of the shaft of one-half (1/2) inch; and
 - b. Maximum width of one and six-tenths (1.6) inches, with a minimum width of eight-tenths (0.8) inch;
- 2. The flap from the end of the shaft shall not contain any reinforcements or additions;
- 3. There shall not be binding within seven (7) inches of the end of the flap;
- 4. The contact area of the shaft shall be smooth, with no protrusion or raised surface, and covered by shock absorbing material throughout its circumference; and
- 5. The flap shall have similar shock absorbing characteristics to that of the contact area.
- (e) A riding crop shall not have:
 - 1. Stingers or projections extending through the hole of a popper; and
 - 2. Any metal parts.

STABLING & TRAINING

Water Hoses

All hoses in the barn area must be fitted at all times with a working nozzle, such that water will not flow from a hose unless the nozzle is engaged.

Heat Lamps

Heat lamps are prohibited at all times in the stall areas.

Dogs

No dogs are allowed in the Churchill Downs barn area.

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RACE DAY PROCEDURES

Race Day Assembly Policy

In order to expedite the transit of horses from the barn area to the paddock for saddling, Breeders' Cup requires that all horses assemble 40 minutes to post in the Mile Chute (enter at the 3/4 gap). Upon arrival at the chute, the horse identifier will verify each horse's identity and the Association Blacksmith will examine each horse's shoes. At approximately 30 minutes to post, horses shall proceed to the paddock (in program number order) along the outer rail of the track.

Change of Equipment

Trainers must be consistent in the use of equipment (e.g., blinkers, screens, closed cups, cheek pieces, cornell collar). Permission to change that equipment must be obtained from the Stewards and must be obtained before entry time. All equipment changes must be declared at entry. All articles of equipment in which a horse races must be in proper position when the horse leaves the paddock for the post.

All horses will carry their equipment to post.

Pony Persons and Grooms

All grooms and handlers should be neatly dressed when taking horses to the paddock. Jackets will be provided by the Breeders' Cup Racing Office prior to the Breeders' Cup World Championships and must be worn by the groom, hotwalker and exercise rider when bringing the horse to paddock on race day. Pony riders taking horses to the post in the public parade on Championships days must wear saddle towels, cap covers and jackets provided from the Breeders' Cup Racing Office and must keep themselves and their mounts well-groomed and their tack clean. It is requested that pony riders wear khakis and white shirts on each Championships day. **Ponies will not be allowed on the turf course.**



A **Breeders' Cup Best Turned Out Award Presented by Adequan**, will be decided before each Championship race and awarded to the groom of the Best Turned Out horse prior to the running

of their race. The winning grooms will receive a customized blanket and \$500 cash prize for their accomplishment.

RACE DAY PROCEDURES

Scratches

Scratch time for Breeders' Cup World Championships Friday and Breeders' Cup World Championships Saturday will be 8:00 am (EDT) on Friday, November 2. Please see section on Refunds of Horses of Racing Age Nominations, page 16, and refunds of pre-entry and entry fees on page 18.

810 KAR 1:027 Entries, subscriptions and declarations.

Section 15. Scratches.

(1) Scratches shall be irrevocable and shall be permitted under the conditions established in this section.

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a horse may be scratched from a stakes race for any reason at any time until four (4) hours prior to post time for the race by obtaining approval from the stewards. Upon receiving a scratch from a stakes race, the racing secretary shall promptly notify the stewards and pari-mutuel manager, and shall cause public announcement of the scratch to be made.

(b) If a list of also-eligible horses has been drawn, scratches shall be filed at the regular scratch time as posted by the racing secretary. Thereafter, a horse shall not be scratched unless:

1. A valid physical reason exists; or
2. The scratch is related to adverse track conditions or change of racing surface.

Paddock Passes

Individual paddock passes will be required for all 14 of the Breeders' Cup World Championships races. Championship Paddock passes will be issued only through the Breeders' Cup Racing Office located near the track kitchen at Churchill Downs beginning Wednesday, October 31, 7:00 am (EDT) at (859) 514-9422. All persons accompanying a horse to the paddock must be issued a paddock pass.

Jockeys

In the Commonwealth of Kentucky, unless otherwise stated, for purses \$100,000 or more, jockeys shall be paid 10% of Win Purse, 5% of Place Purse, 5% of Show Purse, 5% of Fourth Place Purse and all others \$110 per mount. For a complete set of KHRC rules concerning jockeys, please refer to 810 KAR 1:009. Jockeys and apprentices. The following provisions are contained in 810 KAR 1:009.

From 810 KAR 1:009. Section 10. Duty to Fulfill Engagements.

Every rider shall fulfill his duly scheduled riding engagements, unless excused by the stewards due to circumstances under which a jockey could not reasonably be expected to be physically present at the required time. A rider shall not be required to ride a horse he believes to be unsound, nor over a racing strip he believes to be unsafe, except if the stewards find a rider's refusal to fulfill a riding engagement is based on a personal belief unwarranted by the facts and circumstances, the rider may be subject to disciplinary action.

RACE DAY PROCEDURES

Section 12. Weighing Out.

- (1) Each rider engaged to ride in a race shall report to the clerk of scales for weighing out not more than one (1) hour and not less than fifteen (15) minutes before post time for each race in which he is engaged to ride, and when weighing out, the rider shall declare overweight, if any.
- (2) (a) A rider shall not pass the scale with more than one (1) pound overweight, without consent of the owner or trainer of the horse he is engaged to ride; and
(b) A rider shall not pass the scale with more than five (5) pounds overweight.
- (3) A horse shall not be disqualified because of overweight carried.

Section 14. Attire.

- (1) Upon leaving the jockey room to ride in any race, each rider shall be neat and clean in appearance and wear the traditional jockey costume with all jacket buttons and catches fastened.
- (2) Each jockey shall wear:
 - (a) The cap and jacket racing colors registered in the name of the owner of the horse he is to ride;
 - (b) Stock tie;
 - (c) White or light breeches;
 - (d) Top boots;
 - (e) A safety vest and safety helmet that meet the standards set forth in subsections (4) and (5) of this section; and
 - (f) A number on his right shoulder corresponding to his mount's number as shown on the saddle cloth and daily racing program.
- (3) The clerk of scales and attending valet shall be held jointly responsible with a rider for his neat and clean appearance and proper attire.
- (4) A jockey mounted on a horse or stable pony at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission shall wear a properly secured safety helmet at all times. If requested by a commission official, the jockey shall provide sufficient evidence that his helmet has a tag, stamp, or similar identifying marker indicating that it meets one of the following safety standards:
 - (a) ASTM International Standard, ASTM F1163-04a;
 - (b) British Standards, BS EN 1384:1997 or PAS 015:1999; or
 - (c) Australian/New Zealand Standard, AS/NZS 3838:2006.
- (5) A jockey mounted on a horse or stable pony at any location under the jurisdiction of the commission shall wear a safety vest at all times. If requested by a commission official, the jockey shall provide sufficient evidence that his safety vest has a tag, stamp, or similar identifying marker indicating that it meets or exceeds one (1) of the following safety standards:
 - (a) British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA):2000 Level 1;
 - (b) Euro Norm (EN) 13158:2000 Level 1;
 - (c) ASTM International Standard, ASTM F2681-08;
 - (d) Shoe and Allied Trade Research Association (SATRA) Jockey Vest Document M6 Issue 3; or
 - (e) Australian Racing Board (ARB) Standard 1.1998.

RACE DAY PROCEDURES

Section 15. Advertising.

- (1) A jockey shall not wear advertising or promotional material of any kind (whether for a nonprofit or for-profit entity) on clothing within one (1) hour before or after a race, unless:
 - (a) 1. The material advertises or promotes the Jockey's Guild in the form of the picture of a jockey's boot or the picture of a wheelchair, with no additional picture or logo;
 2. The material advertises or promotes the Permanently Disabled Jockey's Fund in the form of the pictures of its logo, with no additional picture or logo; or
 3. The picture or logo has previously been approved by the current owner, association, and the stewards under the process set forth in this administrative regulation, and this approval is reflected in the commission's official records;
 - (b) The material complies with the size restrictions of subsection (2)(b) of this section;
 - (c) The material meets the advertising standards listed in subsection (2) of this section;
 - (d) Written approval by the following is submitted to the commission:
 1. The managing owner of the horse, or authorized agent of the managing owner who acts with actual authority and has been specifically authorized in writing to sign the written approval on behalf of the managing owner. Written authorization shall be evidenced by completion and return to the commission of the "Authorized Agent License Application" form. If the owner is a business entity, in lieu of filing the "Authorized Agent License Application" form, the owner may file duly adopted resolutions of the business entity authorizing the agent to act on its behalf and remit the twenty-five (25) dollar license application fee;
 2. The jockey riding the horse or the authorized agent of the jockey who acts with actual authority and has been specifically authorized in writing to sign the written approval on behalf of the jockey. Written authorization shall be evidenced by completion and return to the commission of the "Authorized Agent License Application" form;
 3. The licensed racing association, which shall grant approval if it reasonably determines the material meets the standards in subsection (2)(a) of this section; and
 4. The stewards, who shall grant approval if they reasonably determine the material meets the standards in subsections (2)(b) and (3) of this section; and
 - (e) Written approval required pursuant to subsection (1)(d) of this section is evidenced by completion and return to the commission of the "Request to Wear Advertising and Promotional Materials" form. The form shall be completed and submitted to the stewards not later than 5 pm two (2) days prior to the day of the race in which the advertising and promotional materials will be worn. Other forms of approval shall not be accepted by the commission.
- (2) Advertising or promotional material displayed on jockey clothing shall:
 - (a) Not compete with, conflict with, or infringe upon sponsorship agreements applicable to the racing association race or to the race meet in progress; and
 - (b) Comply with the following size restrictions:

RACE DAY PROCEDURES

1. A maximum of thirty-two (32) square inches on each thigh of the pants on the outer side between the hip and knee and ten (10) square inches on the rear of the pant at the waistline at the base of the spine;
 2. A maximum of twenty-four (24) square inches on boots and leggings on the outside of each nearest the top of the boot; and
 3. A maximum of six (6) square inches on the front center of the neck area (on a turtleneck or other undergarment).
- (3) A sponsorship shall not be permitted by a person or entity whose message, business reputation, or ongoing business activity may be considered as obscene or indecent to a reasonable person.
 - (4) (a) The party presenting the advertising or promotional opportunity to the owner and jockey (including without limitation, the owner and jockey) shall disclose in writing all material terms, including financial, regarding the advertising or promotional opportunity to the owner and the jockey;
(b) The division of proceeds from any advertising or promotional material placed in accordance with this administrative regulation shall be subject to agreement between the owner and the jockey;
(c) The agreement between the owner and jockey shall be made in writing on the "Owner/Jockey Advertising and Promotional Materials Agreement" not later than 5 pm two (2) days prior to the day of the race in which the advertising and promotional materials will be worn;
(d) Other forms of agreement or contract shall not be used; and
(e) Any party who fails to comply with this or any other provision provided in this administrative regulation may be subject to penalties by the commission in accordance with KRS Chapter 230 and 810 KAR Chapter 1.
 - (5) As a condition for approval of advertising or promotional material, either the owners, the stewards, or the licensed racing association may require a personal viewing of the proposed material as it is to be displayed, to determine that the requirements of this section are met.
 - (6) The sponsor of a licensed racing association race or race meeting may display advertising or promotional material on an association saddlecloth if it does not interfere with the clear visibility of the number of the horse.
 - (7) Advertising content other than that approved in this administrative regulation shall not be permitted.
 - (8) This administrative regulation shall not infringe upon or limit the common law rights of a racing association to eject or exclude persons, licensed or unlicensed, from association grounds, or to apply the association's internal rules regarding other forms of advertising not addressed in this or any other applicable statute or administrative regulation, if the internal rules have been previously filed with and approved by the commission or its authorized representative.

RACE DAY PROCEDURES

Section 13. Wagering

A rider shall not place a wager, cause a wager to be placed on his behalf, or accept any ticket or winnings from a wager on any race except on his own mount, and except through the owner or trainer of the horse he is riding. The owner or trainer placing wagers for his rider shall maintain a precise and complete record of all of these wagers, and the record shall be available for examination by the stewards at all times.

810 KAR 1:012. Section 11. Equipment

- (1) Riding crops and blinkers shall be used consistently on a horse.
- (2) Permission to change use of any equipment used on a horse from its last previous start shall be obtained from the stewards.
- (3) A horse's tongue may be tied down during a race with a clean bandage or gauze.
- (4) A horse's bridle shall not weigh more than two (2) pounds.
- (5) Bits shall be of a metallic alloy base of stainless steel or aluminum and may be encased in rubber, plastic, or leather.
- (6) War bridles and bitless bridles shall not be used.
- (7) Bar shoes may be used for racing only with permission of the stewards.
- (8) Any goading device, chain, spurs, electrical or mechanical device, or appliance, except for a riding crop, that may be used to alter the speed of a horse shall not be used on a horse in a race or workout.
- (9) (a) Any riding crop may be subject to inspection and approval by the stewards or the clerk of the scales to ensure conformity with the specifications of paragraphs (c) through (e) of this subsection.
(b) Only riding crops meeting the specifications of this subsection, including the mandatory shock absorbing characteristics, may be used in thoroughbred racing and training.
(c) A riding crop shall have a:
 1. Maximum weight of eight (8) ounces;
 2. Maximum length, including flap, of thirty (30) inches; and
 3. Minimum diameter of the shaft of three-eighths (3/8) inch.
(d) 1. The only additional feature that may be attached to the riding crop is a flap that shall have a:
 - a. Maximum length from the end of the shaft of one-half (1/2) inch; and
 - b. Maximum width of one and six-tenths (1.6) inches, with a minimum width of eight-tenths (0.8) inch;
 2. The flap from the end of the shaft shall not contain any reinforcements or additions;
 3. There shall not be binding within seven (7) inches of the end of the flap;
 4. The contact area of the shaft shall be smooth, with no protrusion or raised surface, and covered by shock absorbing material throughout its circumference; and

RACE DAY PROCEDURES

5. The flap shall have similar shock absorbing characteristics to that of the contact area.
- (e) A riding crop shall not have:
 1. Stingers or projections extending through the hole of a popper; and
 2. Any metal parts.
- (10) (a) The following shall not be used on the front shoes of thoroughbred horses while racing or training on any racing surface:
 1. Horse shoes (racing plates) that have toe grabs;
 2. Bends;
 3. Jar calks;
 4. Stickers; and
 5. Any other traction device worn on the front shoes of thoroughbred horses.
- (b) Wear plates with a height no greater than two (2) millimeters may be used on the front shoes of thoroughbred horses while racing or training.
- (11) Indiscriminate or brutal use on a horse of a riding crop or any other equipment, as determined by the stewards, at any time on the grounds of a licensed racing association or training center under the jurisdiction of the commission shall be prohibited.

The Stewards must approve all advertising and promotional materials by 5:00 pm two (2) days prior to the day of the applicable race. Forms on pages 140-141.



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Permitted Race Day Medications: (see page 91 for further details)

Furosemide may be used under the following circumstances:

- (a) Furosemide shall be administered at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission by the KHRC Veterinarian, by a single intravenous injection, not less than four (4) hours prior to post time for a race in which the horse is entered.
- (b) The furosemide dosage administered shall not exceed 500 mg (10 ml), nor be less than 150 mg (3 ml).
- (c) There is a \$20 fee for race day Furosemide administration. This is deducted from the horse owner's account by the horsemen's bookkeeper.

No other injections are permitted within 24 hours of a race.

Note: All runners are subject to out-of-competition testing by the KHRC and/or BCL. See rules beginning on page 87. No runner may compete if they have tested positive for anabolic steroids or other ARCI prohibited substances in the six months prior to the BCWC.

MEDICATION, TESTING & SAFETY

Breeders' Cup Prohibited Substances Rule

For any horse participating in a Breeders' Cup World Championships race that is found by the racing regulatory agency in the jurisdiction where the race is conducted to have tested positive for any substance listed under Class 1 or Class 2 in the *Association of Racing Commissioners International Uniform Classification Guidelines for Foreign Substances* or to have violated the anabolic steroid rule in effect where the race is conducted, in addition to any penalties imposed by the racing regulatory agency in the jurisdiction, the following sanctions shall be imposed:

- (i) the horse shall be disqualified to last in the race and any purse earned by the horse shall be forfeited and redistributed in accordance with the revised order of finish;
- (ii) in the event of a first violation of the prohibited substance rule in a Breeders' Cup World Championships race, the horse's trainer and all horses directly or indirectly in such trainer's care shall be ineligible to participate in the Breeders' Cup World Championships races conducted in the year immediately following the final determination that such trainer's horse violated the prohibited substance rule;
- (iii) in the event of a second violation of the prohibited substance rule by a trainer in a Breeders' Cup World Championships race, the trainer and all horses directly or indirectly in such trainer's care shall be ineligible to participate in the Breeders' Cup World Championships races conducted in the two years immediately following the final determination that such trainer's horse violated the prohibited substance rule a second time;
- (iv) in the event of a third violation of the prohibited substance rule by a trainer in a Breeders' Cup World Championships race, the trainer and all horses directly or indirectly in such trainer's care shall be ineligible to participate in all Breeders' Cup World Championships races conducted for the remainder of such trainer's life following the final determination that such trainer's horse violated the prohibited substance rule a third time.

Convicted Trainers Rule

No person may participate as a trainer of a horse pre-entered or entered in a Breeders' Cup World Championships race if that person, during the twelve months preceding the World Championships, has been found by any racing regulatory agency, whether a governmental agency or a non-governmental regulatory body, to have violated a racing regulation prohibiting or involving the possession or use of any substance listed under Class 1, carrying Category "A" or "B" penalties, or Class 2, carrying a Category "A" penalty, in the *Association of Racing Commissioners International Uniform Classification Guidelines for Foreign Substances* or a racing regulation prohibiting the possession or use of steroids and the appeal periods for such finding shall have expired or all appeals, if any, will have received final disposition (a "Drug Conviction").

A person associated with a trainer who has a Drug Conviction in the twelve months preceding the World Championships may not participate as a trainer of a horse that was in the care, custody and control of the convicted trainer at the time of the Drug Conviction and that is pre-entered or entered in a race during the next World Championships. A person is associated with a trainer if such person

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was an assistant to, or employee of, the trainer or related to the trainer by blood, or by marriage or domestic partnership, or who is related by blood to the spouse or domestic partner of such trainer at the time of the Drug Conviction and has assumed the responsibility of the care, custody and control of all or any of the horses that were in the care, custody and control of the trainer at the time of the Drug Conviction.

A horse that has a positive test result for any substance listed under Class 1, carrying Category “A” or “B” penalties, or Class 2, carrying a Category “A” penalty, in the Association of Racing Commissioners International Uniform Classification Guidelines for Foreign Substances or a racing regulation prohibiting the possession or use of steroids that leads to a Drug Conviction shall not be eligible to participate in the Breeders’ Cup World Championships races immediately following the Drug Conviction.

In the event a trainer has two Drug Convictions after May 1, 2012, such trainer may not participate as a trainer of a horse pre-entered or entered in a World Championships race during the next two Breeders’ Cup World Championships following the second of the two Drug Convictions.

In the event a trainer has three or more Drug Convictions after May 1, 2012, such trainer may not participate as a trainer of a horse pre-entered or entered in a World Championships race during any Breeders’ Cup World Championships following the date of the third Drug Conviction.

Breeders’ Cup Out-of-Competition Testing

Breeders’ Cup Limited will be conducting out-of-competition (OOC) testing on all 2018 Challenge winners and any other possible starters prior to the Breeders’ Cup World Championships. This testing is separate from any testing the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) may perform. The Breeders’ Cup OOC testing will be performed by the The Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Laboratory at UC Davis. Routine testing at the Maddy Lab meets or exceeds the protocols established by TOBA and required by Breeders’ Cup World Championships to ensure that the highest possible level of testing is performed on all samples.

The primary focus of OOC testing for the Breeders’ Cup World Championships will be for Epogen, darb-EPO, and other blood doping agents and certain animal venoms, growth hormones and the beta-2 agonists ractopamine and zilpaterol, anabolic steroids as well as any other drugs or medications prohibited by KHRC regulations. Out-of-competition testing may be conducted at any time. Racing officials from other state jurisdictions and internationally will be asked to assist BCL and/or the KHRC in obtaining blood samples for OOC testing. Horses must be timely produced for testing if requested. A horse may be prevented from entering unless the owner and trainer comply with any pre-race testing request. A horse testing positive in the six months prior to the BCWC for anabolic steroids, Epogen, darbEPO or other blood doping agents or other ARCI prohibited substance will be prohibited from entering the BCWC races in the same calendar year.

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Breeders' Cup Condition of Entry

As a condition of entry for any BCWC race, no horse within six months of the BCWC shall test positive for any anabolic steroid or any other prohibited substance described under the ARCI prohibited substance list. Any horse testing positive for anabolic steroids or other ARCI prohibited substances in a BCL out-of-competition test sample during the six-months prior to the BCWC will be ineligible to participate in BCWC.

Drug Testing

Out-of-Competition Testing (810 KAR 1:110)

The KHRC has authorized “out-of-competition” blood testing of horses for Erythropoietin (“EPO”), Darbepoetin (“DPO”), other blood doping agents, venoms and other substances. “Out-of-competition” testing may be conducted at any time. KHRC regulations provide that every horse eligible to race in Kentucky is subject to testing and no owner, trainer or other person having the care of a horse shall refuse to submit it for testing when directed by the Chief State Steward, the KHRC Executive Director or their designees.

Pursuant to 810 KAR 1:110, if a designated horse is located in another jurisdiction, the KHRC may select a veterinarian from another racing commission or regulatory entity to collect the samples for out-of-competition testing. Other jurisdictions across the USA and Internationally will assist the commission in obtaining blood samples for “out-of-competition” testing. Horses must be timely produced for testing if requested under this regulation. If a horse tests positive for the prohibited substances described above, the owner and trainer are notified of the test results, the horse is placed on the veterinarian’s list and a hearing will be scheduled. The regulation also prohibits possession of the foregoing substances on racetrack grounds. If a violation is determined, serious penalties may be imposed, including fines and suspension or revocation of licenses. Please refer to the KHRC regulation 810 KAR 1:110 regarding out-of-competition testing on the KHRC website.

810 KAR 1:110. Out-of-competition testing.

Section 2. Prohibited Substances and Practices.

(1) The following shall be a violation of this administrative regulation:

- (a) The presence in, or administration to, a horse, at any time, of blood doping agents including: erythropoietin, darbepoetin, hemoglobin-based oxygen carriers, or any other substance that enhances the oxygenation of equine body tissue;
- (b) The nontherapeutic administration to, a horse, at any time, of whole blood or packed red blood cells;

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- (c) The presence in, or administration to, a horse, at any time, of naturally produced venoms, synthetic analogues of venoms, derivatives of venoms or synthetic analogues of derivatives of venoms;
- (d) The presence in, or administration to, a horse, at any time, of growth hormones;
- (e) The possession of erythropoietin, darbepoetin, hemoglobin-based oxygen carriers, naturally produced venoms, synthetic analogues of venoms, derivatives of venoms, synthetic analogues of derivatives of venoms, or growth hormones on the grounds of a licensed association or a training facility under the jurisdiction of the commission; and
- (f) The possession at any time of whole blood or packed red blood cells on the grounds of a licensed association or a training facility under the jurisdiction of the commission by anyone other than a licensed veterinarian rendering emergency treatment to a horse located on the grounds of the association or training facility. The attending veterinarian shall notify the commission veterinarian of the intent to administer whole blood or packed red blood cells prior to his or her collection or possession of the whole blood or packed red blood cells.
- (g) The use of a hyperbaric oxygen chamber shall not be a violation of this administrative regulation.

Section 3. Out-of-Competition Testing.

- (1) Any horse eligible to race in Kentucky shall be subject to testing without advance notice for the substances specified in Section 2 of this administrative regulation. A horse is presumed eligible to race in Kentucky if:
 - (a) It is under the care, custody, or control of a trainer licensed by the commission;
 - (b) It is owned by an owner licensed by the commission;
 - (c) It is nominated to a race at an association licensed pursuant to KRS 230.300;
 - (d) It has raced at an association licensed pursuant to KRS 230.300 within the previous twelve (12) calendar months;
 - (e) It is stabled on the grounds of an association licensed pursuant to KRS 230.300 or a training facility subject to the jurisdiction of the commission; or
 - (f) It is nominated to participate in the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund.
- (2) A horse subject to testing under subsection (1) of this section may be designated for testing by the executive director, the chief state steward, or their respective designee.
- (3) A horse designated for testing under this section shall be subject to testing for the substances described in Section 2 of this administrative regulation.
- (4) An owner, trainer, or any authorized designee shall fully cooperate with the commission veterinarian, or his or her designee, by:
 - (a) Locating and identifying any horse designated for out-of-competition testing;

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(b) Making the horse available for the collection of the specimen at an agreed upon stall or other safe location; and

(c) Observing the collection of the specimen.

1. If the owner, trainer or their authorized designee, is not available to observe the collection of the specimen, the collection shall be deferred until the trainer, owner, or their authorized designee, becomes reasonably available, but the collection shall occur no later than six (6) hours after notice of intent to collect a specimen from a horse is received.

2. If the collection does not occur within the time provided for in this subsection, any horse that is designated for testing may be barred from racing in Kentucky and placed on the veterinarian's list, 810 KAR 1:018, Section 18, and the steward's list, for a period of 180 days and the owner and trainer of the horse may be subject to the penalties described in Section 8 of this administrative regulation.

(5) If the owner, trainer, or any authorized designee fails to cooperate or otherwise prevents a horse from being tested, the horse designated for testing shall be barred from racing in Kentucky and placed on the veterinarian's list, 810 KAR 1:018, Section 18, and the steward's list, for 180 days, and the individual or individuals responsible for the failure to cooperate or prevention of the horse from being tested shall be subject to the penalties described in Section 8 of this administrative regulation.

(6) A horse that is barred from racing in Kentucky and placed on the Veterinarian's List and the Steward's List pursuant to subsection (5) or (6) of this section shall remain barred from racing and shall remain on the veterinarian's list and the steward's list:

(a) Upon sale or transfer of the horse to another owner or trainer until the expiration of 180 days; and

(b) Until the horse is determined by the commission to test negative for any substance described in Section 2 of this administrative regulation and is approved for racing by the commission veterinarian and the chief state steward.

Important Information for Horsemen

Prior to the pre-entry deadline of October 22, if you have any questions concerning any medication rules or veterinary issues, please contact KHRC chief veterinarian Dr. Bruce Howard at (859) 983-0971 or KHRC equine medical director Dr. Mary Scollay at (859) 246-2040 or (859) 489-7677.

- KHRC veterinarians will perform in-stall inspections and on-track observations of Breeders' Cup World Championships contenders during training hours in the days preceding the event. Trainers having specific scheduling requests should contact Dr. Bruce Howard at (859) 983-0971 (Cell).

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- On Friday, November 2 and Saturday November 3 pre-race exams will begin at 5:00 am
 - Trainers are requested to have horses' legs clean and open for the exam.
 - A horse may not be placed in ice or cold water bandages until after undergoing its pre-race exam.
- KHRC veterinarians administer raceday Salix (furosemide). This administration is performed between 4 ½ and 4 hours prior to the horse's scheduled post time. Please have an attendant with the horse during this period; an unattended horse will not be treated. The fee of \$20 for Salix administration is processed through the Horsemen's Bookkeeper's office.
- Trainers are reminded that Salix is the only injection a horse may receive within 24 hours of a race.
- On race day, blood samples for TCO₂ analysis will be collected from horses in their stalls in the 30 minutes prior to their departure for assembly in the mile chute (enter at the 3/4 gap).
- Trainers should be mindful that over-the-counter nutritional supplements, homeopathic remedies, and herbal preparations are not regulated by the FDA. There is considerable risk in administering these substances in proximity to a race as they may contain prohibited substances with no notice on the product label.
- For horses receiving anti-ulcer medications, trainers are advised to perform daily administrations in the afternoon (and no less than 24 hours prior to the horse's scheduled post time). The horse may then receive its race day anti-ulcer medication after racing and without interrupting its treatment schedule. (Administration of anti-ulcer medication on the morning of a race will result in a positive test [Class D medication violation]).

Section 5. Antiulcer Medications. The following antiulcer medications may be administered orally, at the dosage stated in this section, up to twenty-four (24) hours prior to the race in which the horse is entered:

- (1) Cimetidine (Tagamet®): 8-20 mg/kg;
- (2) Omeprazole (Gastrogard®): 2.2 grams; and
- (3) Ranitidine (Zantac®): 8 mg/kg.

KHRC Medication Rules & Regulations

The Breeders' Cup World Championships will be run in accordance with the rules of racing of the Commonwealth of Kentucky as promulgated by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. A summary of medication rules will be found below. A complete listing may be obtained at www.khrc.ky.gov.

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Note | If there is any discrepancy between the medication rules as set forth below and the KHRC statutes and regulations, the KHRC statutes and regulations shall govern. KHRC statutes and regulations can be accessed on the KHRC website <http://khrc.ky.gov>.

810 KAR 1:018. Medication; testing procedures; prohibited practices. (Excerpts)

Section 2. Use of Medication.

(1) Therapeutic measures and medication necessary to improve or protect the health of a horse shall be administered to a horse in training under the direction of a licensed veterinarian.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in Sections 4, 5, 6, and 8 of this administrative regulation, while participating in a race, a horse shall not carry in its body any drug, medication, substance, or metabolic derivative, that:

- (a) Is a narcotic;
- (b) Could serve as an anesthetic or tranquilizer;
- (c) Could stimulate, depress, or affect the circulatory, respiratory, cardiovascular, musculo-skeletal, or central nervous system of a horse; or
- (d) Might mask or screen the presence of a prohibited drug, or prevent or delay testing procedures.

(3) Therapeutic medications shall not be present in excess of established threshold concentrations set forth in this administrative regulation. The threshold for furosemide is set forth in Section 6 of this administrative regulation. The thresholds for permitted NSAIDs are set forth in Section 8 of this administrated regulation.

(4) A substance shall not be present in a horse in excess of a concentration at which the substance could occur naturally if it affects the performance of a horse. It shall be the responsibility of the commission to prove that the substance was in excess of normal concentration levels.

(5) It shall be prima facie evidence that a horse was administered and carried, while running in a race, a drug, medication, substance, or metabolic derivative thereof prohibited by this section if:

- (a) A biologic specimen from the horse was taken under the supervision of the commission veterinarian promptly after a horse ran in a race; and
- (b) The commission laboratory presents to the commission a report of a positive finding.

(6) The commission shall utilize the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Uniform Drug, Medication, and Substance Classification Schedule as provided in 810 KAR 1:040, for classification of drugs, medications, and substances violating this administrative regulation. Penalties for violations of this administrative regulation shall be implemented in accordance with 810 KAR 1:028.

Section 3. Treatment Restrictions.

(1) Except as provided in Section 4 of this administrative regulation, a person other than a veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine in Kentucky and licensed by the commission shall

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not administer a prescription or controlled drug, medication, or other substance to a horse at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission.

(2) The only injectables allowed within twenty-four (24) hours prior to post time of the race in which the horse is entered shall be furosemide, as set forth in Section 6 of this administrative regulation.

(3) Except as provided by subsection (5) of this section, a person other than a veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine in Kentucky and licensed by the commission shall not possess a hypodermic needle, syringe, or injectable of any kind at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission.

(4) A veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine in Kentucky and licensed by the commission shall use only single-use disposable needles and syringes, and shall dispose of them in a container approved by the commission veterinarian.

(5) If a person regulated by the commission has a medical condition that makes it necessary to have a needle and syringe at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission, the person shall request prior permission from the stewards and furnish a letter from a licensed physician explaining why it is necessary for the person to possess a needle and syringe. The stewards may grant approval for a person to possess and use a needle and syringe at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission, but may also establish necessary restrictions and limitations.

(6) A commission employee may accompany a veterinarian at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission and take possession of a syringe, needle, or other device used to administer a substance to a horse.

Section 4. Certain Permitted Substances.

Liniments, antiseptics, antibiotics, ointments, leg paints, washes, and other products commonly used in the daily care of horses may be administered by a person, other than a licensed veterinarian if:

(1) The treatment does not include any drug, medication, or substance otherwise prohibited by this administrative regulation;

(2) The treatment is not injected; and

(3) The person is acting under the direction of a licensed trainer or veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine in Kentucky and licensed by the commission.

Section 5. Antiulcer Medications.

The following antiulcer medications may be administered orally, at the dosage stated in this section, up to twenty-four (24) hours prior to post time of the race in which the horse is entered:

(1) Cimetidine (Tagamet®): 8-20 mg/kg;

(2) Omeprazole (Gastrogard®): two and two-tenths (2.2) grams;

(3) Ranitidine (Zantac®): eight (8) mg/kg; and

(4) Sulcrafate: 2-4 grams.

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Section 6. Furosemide Use on Race Day.

- (1) Furosemide may be administered, in accordance with this section, to a horse that is entered to compete in a race.
- (2) The commission veterinarian shall administer furosemide prior to a race.
- (3) Furosemide may be used under the following circumstances:
 - (a) Furosemide shall be administered at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission, by a single intravenous injection, not less than four (4) hours prior to post time for the race in which the horse is entered.
 - (b) The furosemide dosage administered shall not exceed 500 mg, nor be less than 150 mg.
 - (c) The specific gravity of a post-race urine sample shall not be below 1.010. If the specific gravity of the post-race urine sample is determined to be below 1.010, a quantification of furosemide in blood serum or plasma shall be performed. If a horse fails to produce a urine specimen, the commission laboratory shall perform a quantification of furosemide in the blood serum or plasma specimen. Concentrations above 100 nanograms of furosemide per milliliter of blood serum or plasma shall constitute a violation of this section.

Section 7. Furosemide Eligibility.

- (1)
 - (a) A horse shall be eligible to race with furosemide if the licensed trainer or a licensed veterinarian determines that it would be in the horse's best interests to race with furosemide. Notice that a horse will race with or without furosemide shall be made at the time of entry to ensure public notification, including publication in the official racing program.
 - (b) It shall constitute a violation of this administrative regulation if notice is made pursuant to this section that a horse will race with furosemide, and the post-race urine, blood serum or plasma does not show a detectable concentration of furosemide in the post-race urine, blood serum or plasma.
 - (c) Horses eligible for furosemide and entered to start may be monitored by a commission-approved representative during the four (4) hour period prior to post time of the race in which the horse is entered.
- (2) After a horse has been determined to no longer be required to receive furosemide, the horse shall not be eligible to receive furosemide unless the licensed trainer or a licensed veterinarian determines that it would be in the horse's best interest to race with furosemide and the licensed trainer or a licensed veterinarian complies with the requirements of this section.

Section 8. Permitted Non-steroidal Anti-inflammatory Drugs (NSAIDs).

- (1) One (1) of the following NSAIDs may be used by a single intravenous injection not less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to post time for the race in which the horse is entered if the concentration in the horse's specimen does not exceed the following levels when tested post race:
 - (a) Phenylbutazone - not to exceed two (2) micrograms per milliliter of blood serum or plasma;
 - (b) Flunixin - not to exceed twenty (20) nanograms per milliliter of blood serum or plasma; and

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- (c) Ketoprofen - not to exceed ten (10) nanograms per milliliter of blood serum or plasma.
 - (2) NSAIDs, including the permitted NSAIDs, shall not be administered within twenty-four (24) hours prior to post time for the race in which the horse is entered.
 - (3) (a) The use of any NSAID other than the permitted NSAIDs, and the use of multiple permitted NSAIDs shall be discontinued at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to post time for the race in which the horse is entered.
 - (b) A finding of phenylbutazone below a concentration of one-half (.5) microgram per milliliter of blood serum or plasma shall not constitute a violation of this section.
 - (c) A finding of flunixin below a concentration of three (3) nanograms per milliliter of blood serum or plasma shall not constitute a violation of this section.
- (4) A horse that has been administered an NSAID shall be subject to collection of a biologic specimen under the supervision of the commission veterinarian to determine the quantitative NSAID level present in the horse or the presence of other drugs in the horse.

Section 9. Anabolic Steroids.

- (1) An exogenous AAS shall not be present in a horse that is racing. The detection of an exogenous AAS or metabolic derivative in a post-race or a pre-race sample after the horse has been entered shall constitute a violation of this administrative regulation.
- (2) The detection in a post-race sample of an endogenous AAS or metabolic derivative where the concentration of the AAS, a metabolite, a marker, or any relevant ratio as has been published in peer-reviewed scientific literature deviates from a naturally occurring physiological level shall constitute a violation of this administrative regulation. The following shall be deemed to be naturally occurring physiological levels:
- (a) Boldenone (free and conjugated):
 - 1. In male horses other than geldings - 15 ng/ml in urine or 200 pg/ml in blood serum or plasma; and
 - 2. In geldings and female horses, boldenone shall not be permitted.
 - (b) Nandrolone (free and conjugated):
 - 1. In geldings - 1 ng/ml in urine or 50 pg/ml in blood serum or plasma;
 - 2. In fillies and mares - 1 ng/ml in urine or 50 pg/ml in blood serum or plasma; and
 - 3. In male horses other than geldings - 45 ng/ml of metabolite, 5 α -estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol in urine or a ratio in urine of 5 α -estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol to 5 α -estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol of >1:1.
 - (c) Testosterone (free and conjugated):
 - 1. In geldings - 20 ng/ml in urine or 25 pg/ml in blood serum or plasma; and
 - 2. In fillies and mares - 55 ng/ml in urine or 25 pg/ml in blood serum or plasma.
- (3) In accordance with this subsection, a horse may receive one (1) therapeutic AAS.
- (a) The therapeutic AAS shall be given for the sole purpose of treating an existing illness or injury having been diagnosed by the regular attending veterinarian. An owner or trainer who is

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uncertain about whether a particular purpose is considered to be therapeutic shall consult with the commission prior to administration.

(b) The horse shall be ineligible to race in Kentucky until all of the following have occurred:

1. A minimum of sixty (60) days has passed since the administration of the therapeutic AAS to the horse;
2. A relevant specimen is taken from the horse;
3. The sample is tested for AAS by a laboratory from the approved list established by the commission at the expense of the owner of the horse; and
4. The commission has received a report from the laboratory of a negative finding regarding the sample.

(c) A report from the commission laboratory of a negative finding in a pre-race sample does not provide a safe harbor for the owner, trainer, veterinarian or horse. A report from the commission laboratory of a positive finding in a post-race sample shall be treated as a violation of this administrative regulation even if there was a negative finding by the commission laboratory in a pre-race sample.

(d) Procedures for administration of therapeutic AAS.

1. A Therapeutic AAS shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
2. Other treatment methods shall be investigated prior to considering the use of therapeutic AAS.
3. Medical records for the horse shall document:
 - a. Consideration of alternative treatment methods; and
 - b. The necessity for administering the therapeutic AAS.

(4) The administering veterinarian shall record on the Therapeutic AAS Administration Form the following information:

- (a) The therapeutic AAS administered, the amount in milligrams, route, and site of administration;
- (b) The date and time of administration;
- (c) The name, age, sex, color, and registration certificate number of the horse to which the therapeutic AAS is administered; and
- (d) The diagnosis and justification for administration of the therapeutic AAS to the horse.

(5) The Therapeutic AAS Administration Form shall be signed by the veterinarian administering the medication.

(6) The Therapeutic AAS Administration Form shall be delivered electronically to the commission equine medical director within seventy-two (72) hours after administration. If the Therapeutic AAS Administration Form cannot be delivered electronically, the veterinarian shall file the form with the equine medical director in person or through the mail. The submitting veterinarian shall confirm receipt by the equine medical director.

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- (7) Substances referred to in subsections (1) and (2) of this section are “Class B” drugs. A positive test for an exogenous AAS or for an amount of an endogenous AAS in excess of a concentration referred to in subsection (2) of this section shall be subject to the penalties referred to in 810 KAR 1:028.
- (8) (a) The detection of a therapeutic AAS or metabolic derivative in any sample in excess of a threshold level set forth in subsection (2) of this section shall constitute a violation.
(b) Each separate therapeutic AAS detected in excess of a threshold level shall constitute a separate violation.
- (9) The trainer and veterinarian for the horse shall be charged accordingly and shall be subject to penalties for a violation of this administrative regulation.
- (10)(a) A claimed horse may be tested for the presence of an AAS if the claimant requests the test when the claim form is completed and deposited in the association’s claim box. The claimant shall bear the costs of the test. The results of the test shall be reported to the chief state steward.
(b) If a test is positive, the claim may be voided at the option of the claimant and the claimant shall be entitled to return of all sums paid for the claimed horse, expenses incurred after the date of the claim, and the costs of testing.
(c) If the test is negative, the claimant shall reimburse the entity paying for the testing or the prior owner for the cost of the testing.
(d) While awaiting test results, a claimant:
1. Shall exercise due care in maintaining and boarding a claimed horse; and
2. Shall not materially alter a claimed horse.
- (11) The gender of the horse from which a post-race biologic specimen is collected shall be identified to the commission veterinarian and the testing laboratory.
- (12) Only a licensed veterinarian may possess or administer a therapeutic AAS.

Section 15. Trainer Responsibility.

- (1) A trainer shall be responsible for the condition of a horse in his or her care.
- (2) A trainer shall be responsible for the presence of a prohibited drug, medication, substance, or metabolic derivative, including permitted medication in excess of the maximum-allowable concentration, in horses in his or her care.
- (3) A trainer shall prevent the administration of a drug, medication, substance, or metabolic derivative that may constitute a violation of this administrative regulation.
- (4) A trainer whose horse has been claimed shall remain responsible for a violation of this administrative regulation regarding that horse’s participation in the race in which the horse is claimed.
- (5) A trainer shall be responsible for:
(a) Maintaining the assigned stable area in a clean, neat, and sanitary condition at all times;

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- (b) Using the services of those veterinarians licensed by the commission to attend to horses that are on association grounds;
- (c) The proper identity, custody, care, health, condition, and safety of horses in his or her care;
- (d) Promptly reporting the alteration of the sex of a horse to the horse identifier and the racing secretary;
- (e) Promptly reporting to the racing secretary and the commission veterinarian if a posterior digital neurectomy (heel nerving) is performed on a horse in his or her care and ensuring that this fact is designated on its certificate of registration;
- (f) Promptly reporting to the racing secretary the name of a mare in his or her care that has been bred and is entered to race;
- (g) Promptly notifying the commission veterinarian of a reportable disease or communicable illness in a horse in his or her care;
- (h) Promptly reporting the serious injury or death of a horse in his or her care at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission to the stewards and the commission veterinarian and ensuring compliance with Section 22 of this administrative regulation and 810 KAR 1:012, Section 14, governing postmortem examinations;
- (i) Maintaining a medication record and medication status of horses in his or her care;
- (j) Promptly notifying the stewards and the commission veterinarian if the trainer has knowledge or reason to believe that there has been an administration to a horse of a drug, medication, or other substance prohibited by this administrative regulation or has knowledge or reason to believe that a prohibited practice has occurred as set forth in Section 20 of this administrative regulation;
- (k) Ensuring the fitness of every horse in his or her care to perform creditably at the distance entered;
- (l) Ensuring that every horse he or she has entered to race is present at its assigned stall for a pre-race soundness inspection as prescribed by 810 KAR 1:024, Section 4(1)(d) and (l) and 4(2);
- (m) Ensuring proper bandages, equipment, and shoes;
- (n) Ensuring the horse's presence in the paddock at least twenty (20) minutes prior to post time, or at a time otherwise prescribed, before the race in which the horse is entered;
- (o) Personally attending in the paddock and supervising the saddling of a horse in his or her care, unless an assistant trainer fulfills these duties or the trainer is excused by the stewards pursuant to 810 KAR 1:008, Section 3(6); and
- (p) Attending the collection of a biologic specimen taken from a horse in his or her care or delegating a licensed employee or the owner to do so.

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Section 17. Veterinary Reports.

(1) A veterinarian who treats a horse at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission shall submit a Veterinary Report of Horses Treated to be Submitted Daily form to the commission veterinarian containing the following information:

- (a) The name of the horse treated;
- (b) The type and dosage of drug or medication administered or prescribed;
- (c) The name of the trainer of the horse;
- (d) The date and time of treatment; and
- (e) Other pertinent treatment information requested by the commission veterinarian.

(2) The Veterinary Report of Horses Treated to be Submitted Daily form shall be signed by the treating practicing veterinarian.

(3) The Veterinary Report of Horses Treated to be Submitted Daily form shall be on file not later than the time prescribed on the next race day by the commission veterinarian.

(4) The Veterinary Report of Horses Treated to be Submitted Daily form shall be confidential, and its content shall not be disclosed except in the course of an investigation of a possible violation of this administrative regulation or in a proceeding before the stewards or the commission, or to the trainer or owner of record at the time of treatment.

(5) A timely and accurate filing of a Veterinary Report of Horses Treated to be Submitted Daily form by the veterinarian or his designee that is consistent with the analytical results of a positive test reported by the commission laboratory may be used as a mitigating factor in determining the appropriate penalties pursuant to 810 KAR 1:028.

(6) A veterinarian having knowledge or reason to believe that a horse entered in a race has received a drug, medication, or substance prohibited under this administrative regulation or has knowledge or reason to believe that a prohibited practice has occurred as set forth in Section 20 of this administrative regulation shall report this fact immediately to the commission veterinarian or to the stewards.

(7) A practicing veterinarian shall maintain records of all horses treated and of all medications sold or dispensed. The records shall include:

- (a) The name of the horse;
- (b) The trainer of the horse;
- (c) The date, time, amount, and type of medication administered;
- (d) The drug or compound administered;
- (e) The method of administration; and
- (f) The diagnosis.

(8) The records shall be retained for at least sixty (60) days after the horse has raced and shall be available for inspection by the commission.

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Section 20. Other Prohibited Practices.

- (1) A drug, medication, or substance shall not be possessed or used by a licensee, or his designee or agent, to a horse within a nonpublic area at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission:
 - (a) The use of which may endanger the health and welfare of the horse; or
 - (b) The use of which may endanger the safety of the rider.
- (2) Without the prior permission of the commission or its designee, a drug, medication, or substance that has never been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration (USFDA) for use in humans or animals shall not be possessed or used at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission. The commission shall determine whether to grant prior permission after consultation with the Equine Drug Research Council.
- (3) The following blood-doping agents shall not be possessed or used at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission:
 - (a) Erythropoietin;
 - (b) Darbepoietin;
 - (c) Oxyglobin®;
 - (d) Hemopure®; or
 - (e) Any substance that abnormally enhances the oxygenation of body tissue.
- (4) A treatment, procedure, or therapy shall not be practiced, administered, or applied which may:
 - (a) Endanger the health or welfare of a horse; or
 - (b) Endanger the safety of a rider.
- (5) Extracorporeal Shock Wave Therapy or Radial Pulse Wave Therapy shall not be used unless the following conditions are met:
 - (a) A treated horse shall not race for a minimum of ten (10) days following treatment;
 - (b) A veterinarian licensed to practice by the commission shall administer the treatment;
 - (c) The commission veterinarian shall be notified prior to the delivery of the machine on association grounds; and
 - (d) A report shall be submitted by the veterinarian administering the treatment to the commission veterinarian on the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Veterinary Report of Horses Treated with Extracorporeal Shock Wave Therapy or Radial Pulse Wave Therapy form within twenty-four (24) hours of treatment.
- (6) Other than furosemide, an alkalinizing substance that could alter the blood serum or plasma pH or concentration of bicarbonates or carbon dioxide in a horse shall not be used within twenty-four (24) hours prior to post time of the race in which the horse is entered.

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(7) Without the prior permission of the commission veterinarian or his designee, based on standard veterinary practice for recognized conditions, a nasogastric tube which is longer than six (6) inches shall not be used for the administration of any substance within twenty-four (24) hours prior to post time of the race in which the horse is entered.

(8) A blood serum or plasma total carbon dioxide (TCO₂) level shall not exceed 37.0 millimoles per liter in a horse; except no violation shall exist if the TCO₂ level is found to be normal for the horse following the quarantine procedure set forth in Section 21 of this administrative regulation.

(9) A blood gas machine shall not be possessed or used by a person other than an authorized representative of the commission at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission; and

(10) A shock wave therapy machine or radial pulse wave therapy machine shall not be possessed or used by anyone other than a veterinarian licensed by the commission at a location under the jurisdiction of the commission.

Section 21. TCO₂ Testing and Procedures.

(1) (a) The stewards or commission veterinarian may order the pre-race or post-race collection of blood specimens from a horse to determine the total carbon dioxide concentration in the blood serum or plasma of the horse. The winning horse and other horses, as selected by the stewards, may be tested in each race to determine if there has been a violation of this administrative regulation.

(b) Pre-race testing shall be done at a reasonable time, place, and manner directed by the chief state steward in consultation with the commission veterinarian.

(c) A specimen consisting of at least two (2) blood tubes shall be taken from a horse to determine the TCO₂ concentration in the blood serum or plasma of the horse. If the commission laboratory determines that the TCO₂ level exceeds thirty-seven (37) millimoles per liter, the executive director of the commission shall be informed of the positive finding.

(d) Split sample testing for TCO₂ may be requested by an owner or trainer in advance of the collection of the specimen by the commission veterinarian; however, the collection and testing of a split sample for TCO₂ testing shall be done at a reasonable time, place, and manner directed by the commission veterinarian.

(e) The cost of split sample testing, including the cost of shipping, shall be borne by the owner or the trainer.

(2) (a) If the level of TCO₂ is determined to exceed thirty-seven (37) millimoles per liter and the licensed owner or trainer of the horse certifies in writing to the stewards within twenty-four (24) hours after the notification of the test result that the level is normal for that horse, the owner or trainer may request that the horse be held in quarantine. If quarantine is requested, the licensed association shall make guarded quarantine available for that horse for a period of time to be determined by the stewards, but in no event for more than seventy-two (72) hours.

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- (b) The expense for maintaining the quarantine shall be borne by the owner or trainer.
- (c) During quarantine, the horse shall be retested periodically by the commission veterinarian.
- (d) The horse shall not be permitted to race during a quarantine period, but it may be exercised and trained at times prescribed by the licensed association and in a manner that allows monitoring of the horse by a commission representative.
- (e) During quarantine, the horse shall be fed only hay, oats, and water.
- (f) If the commission veterinarian is satisfied that the horse's level of TC02, as registered in the original test, is physiologically normal for that horse, the stewards:
 - 1. Shall permit the horse to race; and
 - 2. May require repetition of the quarantine procedure set forth in paragraphs (a) through (f) of this subsection to reestablish that the horse's TC02 level is physiologically normal.

810 KAR 1:012. Horses

Section 4. Denerving.

- (1) A horse on which a neurectomy has been performed shall have that fact designated on its registration certificate, racing permit, or entry in the electronic registration system. It shall be the joint responsibility of the practicing veterinarian who performed the operation and the trainer of the denerved horse to ensure this fact is correctly designated.
- (2) A horse whose ulnar, radial, or median nerve has been either blocked or removed (known as high nerved), or whose volar or plantar nerve has been blocked or removed, shall not be entered or raced in this state.
- (3) A horse that has had a posterior digital neurectomy (known as low nerved), may be permitted to race if the denerving has been reported by the trainer to the stewards, and the horse has been approved for racing by the commission veterinarian prior to being entered for a race.
- (4) If a horse races in violation of this administrative regulation and participates in the purse distribution, then a protest shall not be considered unless submitted in writing to the stewards within forty-eight (48) hours after the race.
- (5) If a horse races in violation of this administrative regulation and is claimed, then a protest shall not be considered unless the successful claimant submits a protest in writing within forty-eight (48) hours requesting the claim be voided. If the claim is voided, the horse shall be returned to the owner who started the horse in the race, and the claim price shall be returned to the claimant.
- (6) A list of all denerved horses shall be posted in the racing secretary's office. Only horses that have in fact had a neurectomy shall be so reported.

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Section 10. Serviceable for Racing.

A horse shall not be entered or raced that:

- (1) Is not in serviceable, sound racing condition. The stewards may at any time require a horse on association grounds to be examined by a qualified person;
- (2) Is posted on a veterinarian's list, stewards' list, or starter's list, or is suspended, in any racing jurisdiction;
- (3) Has been administered any drug in violation of 810 KAR 1:018;
- (4) Is blind or has seriously impaired vision in both eyes;
- (5) Is not correctly identified to the satisfaction of the stewards; or
- (6) Is owned wholly or in part by or is trained by an ineligible person.

Section 12. Sex Alteration.

Any alteration in the sex of a horse shall be reported by the horse's trainer to the racing secretary and The Jockey Club promptly. The alteration shall be noted on the horse's registration certificate, racing permit, or entry in the electronic system.

MEDICATION, TESTING & SAFETY

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Withdrawal Guidelines

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General Notice

Unless otherwise specified in these withdrawal guidelines or the applicable regulations and statutes, the following withdrawal guidelines are voluntary and advisory. The guidelines are recommendations based on current scientific knowledge that may change over time. A licensee may present evidence of full compliance with these guidelines to the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (the “Commission” or “KHRC”) and the stewards as a mitigating factor to be used in determining violations and penalties.

These withdrawal interval guidelines assume that administration of medications will be performed at doses that are not greater than the manufacturer’s maximum recommended dosage. Medications administered at dosages above manufacturer’s recommendations, in compounded formulations and/or in combination with other medications and/or administration inside the withdrawal interval may result in test sample concentrations above threshold concentrations that could lead to positive test results and the imposition of penalties. The time of administration of an orally administered substance, for the purposes of withdrawal interval, shall be considered to be the time of complete ingestion of the medication by the horse via eating or drinking.

In addition to the requirements contained in KRS Chapter 13A, the KHRC shall give notice of an amendment or addition to these withdrawal guidelines by posting the change on the KHRC website and at all Kentucky racetracks at least two weeks before the amendment or addition takes legal effect.

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Withdrawal Guidelines

- 1) Furosemide shall be administered pursuant to 810 KAR 1:018 for Thoroughbreds; 811 KAR 1:090 for Standardbreds; and 811 KAR 2:096 for Quarter Horse, Appaloosa, and Arabians.
- 2) The following substances may be administered or applied up to the scheduled paddock time of the race in which the horse is to compete:
 - Topical applications such as liniments, leg paints, salves, and ointments which may contain antibiotics or DMSO, but do not contain steroids, anesthetics, or any other prohibited substances.
- 3) The following substances may be administered up to 24 hours prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete as long as their use follows the general notice on page 1 of these withdrawal guidelines:
 - Antibiotics (except those containing prohibited drugs such as Procaine);
 - Antiprotozoals (i.e. ponazuril [Marquis®] toltrazuril [Baycox®], sulfamethoxazole/pyrimethamine [Daraprim®], etc.);
 - Anti-Ulcer and Gastro-Protective Medications (specifically Omeprazole [Gastrogard®], Cimetidine, Ranitidine, and Sucralfate);
 - Antifungal Agents (specifically Griseofulvin and Ketoconazole);
 - Certain Inhalation Agents (specifically cromolyn sodium [Intal®], and acetylcysteine [Mucomyst®]) that do not exhibit bronchodilator properties;
 - Electrolytes, Vitamins and Minerals (IV, IM or oral), and/or other oral supplements/nutrients not containing drugs;
 - Hyaluronic Acid (Legend®) IV;
 - Misoprostol;
 - Non-Androgenic Reproductive Hormones (HCG, Regumate®, GnRH, etc.);
 - Polysulfated glycosaminoglycan (Adequan®) IM; and
 - Propionibacterium acnes suspension (Eqstim®), or comparable immunostimulants.
- 4) Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs):
 - A) ELECTED NSAID: The applicable regulations require compliance with the following: only one of the following three NSAIDs may be administered up to the manufacturer's maximum labeled dosage until 24 hours prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete as long as their use follows the general notice on page 1 of these withdrawal guidelines and the requirements of 810 KAR 1:018 for Thoroughbreds; 811 KAR 1:090 for Standardbreds; and 811 KAR 2:096 for Quarter Horse, Appaloosa, and Arabians:
 - Phenylbutazone (Butazolidin®) 4.4 mg/kg (Intravenous Only)
 - Flunixin Meglumine (Banamine®)* 1.1 mg/kg (Intravenous Only)
 - *NOTE: While flunixin administration is permitted up to 24 hours prior to the scheduled post time, a withdrawal interval of 32 hours is recommended.

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- Ketoprofen (Ketofen®) 2.2 mg/kg (Intravenous Only).

B) The following withdrawal intervals shall be observed for all NSAIDS, except for the one selected in 4A above, for administration prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete as long as their use follows the general notice on page 1 of these withdrawal guidelines:

- Flunixin Meglumine (Banamine®) 1.1 mg/kg IV 48 hrs
- Phenylbutazone (Butazolidin®) 4.4 mg/kg IV 48 hrs
- Ketoprofen (Ketofen®) 2.2 mg/kg IV 48 hrs
- Diclofenac Sodium Topical (Surpass® Cream) 48 hrs
Single 5" application
- Firocoxib* (Equioxx®) 0.1 mg/kg
Single oral or IV dose 48 hrs
Repeated daily administration 14 days

5) The following substances may be administered up to 48 hours prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete as long as their use follows the general notice on page 1 of these withdrawal guidelines:

- Acepromazine (Promace®) IV at 0.05 mg/kg;
- Beta-2 agonists by inhalation (terbutaline, salmeterol, fenoterol);
- Butorphanol (Torbugesic®) IV at 0.1 mg/kg;
- Corticosteroids by inhalation (Azmecort®, Beclovent®);
- Dantrolene (Dantrium®) oral at 500 mg total dose;
- DMSO IV, oral, topical up to 60 ml;
- Ergot Alkaloids (Ergonovine, Methergine, etc.);
- Flumethasone (Flucort®) 5 mg IV;
- Glycopyrrolate (Robinol®) IV, 1 mg total dose;
- Guaiacol Derivatives (Guaifenesin);
- Ipratropium;
- Isoxsuprine;
- Methocarbamol (Robaxin-V®)—Single IV or oral dose at 15 mg/kg;
- Pentoxifylline (Trental®);
- Prednisolone—oral at 1 mg/kg;
- *Procaine penicillin IM at 17 mg/kg; and
- Xylazine—IV.

*Mandatory treatment reporting and race day surveillance as described in Threshold section (page11).

6) The following substances may be administered up to 72 hours prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete as long as their use follows the general notice on page 1 of these withdrawal guidelines:

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- Albuterol (Proventil®) - via inhalation at 720 mcg;
 - Detomidine (Dormosedan®) 40 mcg/kg, sublingually;
 - Dexamethasone (Azium®) - oral, IV, IM at 0.05 mg/kg;
 - Lidocaine—subcutaneous at 200 mg total dose;
 - Mepivacaine (Carbocaine®) Subcutaneous at 0.07 mg/kg;
 - Romifidine (Sedivet) 50 mg IV dose; and
 - Tripeleminamine HCl 400 mg IM dose.
- 7) The following substances may be administered up to 96 hours prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete as long as their use follows the general notice on page 1 of these withdrawal guidelines:
- Hydroxyzine (Atarax);
 - Pentazocine;
 - Phenytoin (Dilantin); and
 - Pyrilamine.
- 8) The following substances may be administered up to 7 days prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete as long as their use follows the general notice on page 1 of these withdrawal guidelines:
- Betamethasone—Intra-articular (IA) at 9 mg total dose in a single articular space;
NOTE: Withdrawal time should be increased for use of betamethasone products with a ratio of >1:1 betamethasone acetate to betamethasone sodium phosphate. Intramuscular administration is associated with a substantially longer withdrawal time.
 - Fluphenzine Decanoate (Prolixin®);
 - Isoflupredone (Predef 2x®)—IA at 20 mg in a single joint space or 10 mg subcutaneous;
 - Methylprednisolone (Depo-Medrol®)—IA at a total dose of less than 100 mg in a single articular space;
NOTE: Intramuscular administration is associated with substantially longer withdrawal times and is not recommended. The RMTC study administered 100 mg to a single joint. Concentrations in 2 of the 16 study horses did not fall below 100 pg until 10 days post administration.
 - Reserpine (Serpasil®); and
 - Triamcinolone (Vetalog®)—IA at 9 mg total dose in a single articular space.
NOTE: Intramuscular administration is associated with a substantially longer withdrawal time.
- 9) The use of an extra corporeal shock wave therapy or radial pulse wave therapy machine must be done under current KHRC regulations and may be performed until 10 days prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete.
- 10) The following substance may be administered up to 14 days prior to the scheduled post time of

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the race in which the horse is to compete as long as its use follows the general notice on page 103 of these withdrawal guidelines:

- Clenbuterol (Ventipulmin™) orally up to 0.8 mcg/kg twice daily.

11) The following substances may be administered up to 60 days prior to the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete as long as their use follows the general notice on page 103 of these withdrawal guidelines, and the applicable provisions of 810 KAR 1:018 for Thoroughbreds; 810 KAR 1:090 for Standardbreds; and of 811 KAR 2:096 for Quarter Horse, Appaloosa, and Arabians:

- Anabolic Steroids (Limited to Boldenone, Testosterone, and Nandrolone).

12) Any horse that has been treated with therapeutic medications found in sections 6 through 10 of this document may, at the trainer's request and expense, and on permission of the Commission veterinarian, have samples of blood and/or urine collected by the Commission veterinarian for analysis by the Commission authorized laboratory prior to entry to race in the state of Kentucky. As a condition of this elective testing, the trainer will be required to disclose the date and time, dose, and route of administration of the substance for which clearance testing is requested. A report from the commission laboratory of a negative finding in this pre-race, elective testing does not provide a safe harbor for the owner, trainer, veterinarian or horse. A report from the commission laboratory of a positive finding in a post-race sample shall be treated as a violation of KHRC regulations even if there was a negative finding by the commission laboratory in the clearance testing sample.

Breeders' Cup Pre-Race Inspections

Breeders' Cup Limited and the KHRC have assembled a team of impartial, experienced regulatory veterinarians that will be conducting a series of physical inspections as well as observing each horse under tack during the week preceding the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

Horses will be inspected on multiple occasions in the days preceding their Championship races.

The cooperation of the horsemen in scheduling and having horses available and prepared (no bandages) will aid these team members in their task. If you would like to schedule the visit in advance, please contact KHRC Chief Veterinarian, Bruce Howard, DVM at (859) 983-0971 (Cell).

Race Day Inspections

The Horse Identifier and the Horseshoe Inspector shall examine each horse immediately prior to its race. No horse shall be eligible to start in a race and shall be scratched by the Stewards if it is found not to be in serviceable, sound racing condition, not properly identified or improperly shod.

Racing Soundness Examination

On race day, each horse shall be examined in the morning by a KHRC veterinarian for racing soundness. This examination will include observing the horse move at a trot. An attendant must remain with the horse until the examination has been completed. The Stewards may exclude the horse from racing if the KHRC Veterinarian finds the horse is not in serviceable, sound racing condition. Additional information regarding this exam will be provided to each trainer.



MEDICATION, TESTING & SAFETY

Post-Race Drug Testing

Industrial Laboratories is the official lab of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. Routine testing at the lab meets or exceeds the protocols established by TOBA and required by Breeders' Cup World Championships to ensure that the highest possible level of post-race testing is performed on all samples. Industrial Laboratories is one of 10 laboratories accredited to RMTC racing laboratory standards.

Blood and/or urine samples shall be taken from the first four finishers in each Breeders' Cup World Championships race and any horse at the discretion of the Stewards. Every horse within the enclosure or entered in any race is subject to such tests, and no owner, trainer or other person having the care of a horse shall refuse to submit such horse for testing when directed by the stewards or the Official Veterinarian.

For each horse tested, one portion of the test sample, called the split sample, shall be preserved by the KHRC. The split sample shall be available for testing in the event of a positive test.

Regulations related to post-race testing can be found at 810 KAR 1:018 and 810 KAR 1:130.

Blood, urine, saliva or other specimens may be taken at the direction of the stewards at any time.

The Breeders' Cup World Championships Trophy



The Breeders' Cup World Championships Trophy is an authentic bronze reproduction of the original Torrie horse that was created in Florence by Giovanni da Bologna in the late 1580s. The horse is an ecorche, showing the muscles of the animal in detail. Its original purpose is unknown, though it may have been made as a study for the equestrian statue of Duke Cosimo I of Florence, cast in 1591. It reveals the influence and example of Leonardo da Vinci.

The most recent monumental equestrian sculpture in Florence, before that of Duke Cosimo I, had been da Vinci's never-completed monument to Giangiacomo Trivulzio. The Torrie horse bears a close relationship to several drawings by da Vinci related to this project in the collection of Her Majesty the Queen at Windsor. Other artists, too, knew and learned from da Vinci's study of the horse, but none came so close as Giovanni da Bologna to his vision of the beauty of the animal celebrated by art and science together. The original ecorche bronze horse of Giovanni da Bologna is in the Museum of Fine Arts at the University of Edinburgh in Scotland. The Edinburgh horse was acquired by Sir James Erskine of Torrie from the Villa Mattei in Rome, probably in 1803. He bequeathed it to the University of Edinburgh with the rest of his collection of old master paintings and bronzes, and it came into the possession of the University in 1836.

The Breeders' Cup Trophy was cast from the original and was directly supervised and approved by the University of Edinburgh for the use of Breeders' Cup Limited. The largest version of the trophy is permanently owned by the Breeders' Cup and will be displayed at Churchill Downs this year. Replicas are presented to the owners and breeders of the winners of each of the Breeders' Cup World Championships races every year. Trophies also are presented to the winning trainer and jockey.
