New SolTrans Route 82 to Replace WETA's Route 200 Late Night Trips

Effective Monday, January 2, 2017 Visit soltransride.com for routes and details

Solano County Transit (SolTrans), in partnership with the Solano Transportation Authority (countywide planning agency that is funding the service with Regional Measure 2 bridge toll funding), is implementing a new Solano Express commuter bus line, Route 82, effective January 2, 2017. The new SolTrans route will provide direct service between the temporary Transbay Terminal in downtown San Francisco (200 Folsom Street, San Francisco 94105) and the Vallejo Ferry Terminal (289 Mare Island Way, Vallejo 94590).

Route 82 will complement enhanced ferry service that the Water Emergency Transportation Agency (WETA) is implementing on January 1, 2017 for their customers traveling between Vallejo and San Francisco. The increased number of ferry trips will replace Route 200 bus service on weekdays, except for the last, scheduled trips that currently depart Vallejo at 9:30 p.m. and San Francisco at 10:30 p.m. The Route 82 will fill this gap and meet the needs of customers who utilize those last trips of the day and need a direct ride between Vallejo and San Francisco.

On weekdays, the outbound Route 82 trip will depart the Vallejo Ferry Terminal at 9:30 p.m. and transport riders directly to San Francisco. The inbound trip from the temporary Transbay Terminal will depart San Francisco at 10:30 p.m., serve the El Cerrito Del Norte BART Station, the Vallejo Transit Center, and the last destination on the Route will be the Sereno Transit Center. The Adult Fare for a one-way trip will be \$10.00.

Solano County Transit (SolTrans) has been the public transportation provider for south Solano County since July 2011. SolTrans provides local and regional fixed routes, complementary paratransit, dial-a-ride service, and subsidized taxi programs. The agency is a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) that is governed by a six-member Board of Directors, composed of two representatives from the cities of Benicia and Vallejo, Solano County's representative on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), and a representative from the Solano Transportation Authority.
