The problems facing the youth of today have a lot to do with us, the adults on this island who make the economy run. Teenare pregnancy, single

narenthood, lack of family values and morals, excessive materialism. prostitution, alcohol and drug abuse, etc., are all issues among the wouth today because society as a whole allowed it to come to that Consequently, there is no policy in the world that can provide a quick fix solution. A change in social behaviour in the community is what is ultimately needed. It's point to take some time and effort, but the neonle of St. Maarten are soins to have to re-establish certain norms and do so the only way youngsters really learn: By example

In that they will need midance from their leaders, not just those we elect to office, but also those who through their actions or functions are in positions to act as agents of change, such as labour unions or private businesses and their associations. The idea that somebody else, be it sovernment, the notice or whatever, has to deal with the problem will get us nowhere

This newspaper is willing to do its part and in that regard respectfully asks the cooperation of the religious leaders, whom many believe too often are either quiet about developments in society or limit their messare to their direct followers. There is a clear need for more spiritual ruidance and the local places of worship, especially his consecutions

like the Bartists, the Methodists and the Roman Catholies, need to step up to the plate. Most of all, however, it is in the mirror that the answer to most of the wouth's problems can be found. We, the adult population of St.

Maarten, need to take a long, hard look at the way we act and do things on this island.

Without a noticeable change in our attitude, one must fear no youth notice in the world is noine to do much good. As the saving goes: to better the world, start with yourself.


