Evangelia Tastsoglou, Ph.D., born in Piraeus, Greece, is Professor and Chair in the Department of Sociology and Criminology, Saint Mary's University, Halifax and the leader of the "Gender / Immigrant Women" research domain in the Atlantic Metropolis Centre of Excellence (AMA) for research on migration and diversity. Her publications are in the areas of gender and international migration; Greek migration; migration and globalization; Canadian immigration; (im)migrant and minority women and citizenship; intersections of ethnicity / race, gender and class; multiculturalism and anti-racism. Publications include numerous articles in Canadian and international journals, book chapters, research reports and two books on Women, Migration and Citizenship: Making Local, National and Transnational Connections (Ashgate Publishers, 2006, co-edited with Alexandra Dobrowolsky) and Gender and International Migration: Focus on Greece, special volume of the Greek Review of Social Research (E.K.K.E., Athens, 2003, co-edited with Laura Maratou-Alipranti).
