A MESSAGE FROM FR. MURRAY

Happy New Year! We begin this civil new year immersed in the Christmas season. Although many want to start putting their trees out on the curb and storing away the Christmas ornaments, wreaths and decorations in the attic, **we can continue to say** "Merry Christmas" until next week, when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord.

We are celebrating the great moments of the beginning of the life of Jesus. We are celebrating, like new parents, the birth of a new life and the newness of it does not immediately diminish. I remember



when my nieces and nephews were born, the excitement and the traveling to where they were, and waiting to "behold them" and hold them (my mother's skills as a champion arm wrestler were in full use, nobody got those babies out her arms without her permission). Our task this week, in the context of the Gospel of Matthew, like the wise men who came in search of the Savior, even in his infant form, is to always go in search of Jesus.

One mystery has always been that they didn't bring pampers or toys or things even for Joseph and Mary. Rather, they brought gifts that signaled what kind of life Jesus was going to have, and what he as going to do. Something about encountering this baby directed them to change the direction of their lives and follow the light that led them to Christ. It is a good message for us, too, as the new year begins. After their encounter with Jesus, they consciously decided to avoid evil and went home by a "different way".

This can also be our experience. **Each time we truly encounter Christ (in the Eucharist) we are encouraged to "go home by a different way."** We are called to be a people who see Jesus in others, the poor, the refugee, the disenfranchised, the sick, etc. Serving others is a way of imitating the wisdom of the magi or the wise men.

When I was a kid, at my church we had great productions of this scene and the Christmas pageant. I have fond memories of using my father's bathrobe, a decorated hockey stick for a walking staff and a box of chocolate gold coins to present to Jesus (luckily the procession started at the beginning of Mass or I am sure that Jesus would have received less gold at the presentation).

Thanks you to all those who have had a part in making the seasons of Advent and Christmas so special here at MQOA. From the beginning with the giving trees, the Christmas walk, the bazaar, the pageant, the music and all you faithful ministers at our Masses. Thanks to all of you. This is what the Church is — the people of God gathered around the altar — worshiping, praising, remembering the mighty truth and glorious that God Loves us.

UN MENSAJE DEL PADRE MURRAY

¡Feliz Año Nuevo! Comenzamos este nuevo año civil inmerso en la temporada navideña. Aunque muchos quieren empezar a poner sus árboles en la acera y guardar los adornos navideños, coronas y adornos en el desván, **podemos seguir diciendo "Feliz Navidad"** hasta la próxima semana, cuando celebramos el bautismo del Señor.


Celebramos los grandes momentos del comienzo de la vida de Jesús. Estamos celebrando, como nuevos padres, el nacimiento de una nueva vida y la novedad de ella no disminuye de inmediato. Recuerdo cuando nacieron mis sobrinas, la emoción y el viaje a donde estaban, y esperando a "contemplarlos" y mantenerlos (las habilidades de mi madre como luchador del brazo del campeón estaban en pleno uso, nadie consiguió a esos bebés fuera de sus brazos sin su permiso). **Nuestra tarea esta semana, en el contexto del Evangelio de Mateo, como los hombres sabios que vinieron en busca del Salvador, incluso en su forma infantil, es ir siempre en busca de Jesús.**

Un misterio siempre ha sido que no traen Pampers ni juguetes ni cosas para José y María. Más bien, trajeron regalos que señalaban qué clase de vida iba a tener Jesús, y qué iba a hacer. Algo sobre encontrar a este bebé les dirigió a cambiar la dirección de sus vidas y a seguir la luz que los condujo a Cristo. Es un buen mensaje para nosotros, también, a medida que comienza el nuevo año. Después de su encuentro con Jesús, decidieron conscientemente evitar el mal y se fueron a casa por un "camino diferente". Esto también puede ser nuestra experiencia. **Cada vez que nos encontramos con Cristo (en la Eucaristía) nos anima a "ir a casa de una manera diferente".** Estamos llamados a ser un pueblo que ve a Jesús en los demás, los pobres, los refugiados, los marginados, los enfermos, etc. Servir a los demás es una forma de imitar la sabiduría de los magos o de los sabios.

Cuando era niño, en mi iglesia tuvimos grandes producciones de esta escena y el desfile de Navidad. Tengo buenos recuerdos de usar el albornoz de mi padre, un palo de hockey decorado para un bastón y una caja de monedas de oro de chocolate para presentar a Jesús (por suerte la procesión comenzó al principio de la Misa o estoy seguro de que Jesús habría recibido menos oro en la presentation).

Gracias a todos aquellos que han tenido un papel en hacer las temporadas de Adviento y Navidad tan especial aquí en MQOA. Desde el principio con los árboles que dan, el paseo de Navidad, el Bazar, el desfile, la música y todos ustedes ministros fieles en nuestras Misas. Gracias a todos ustedes. **Esto es lo que la iglesia es — el pueblo de Dios se reunió alrededor del altar — adorando, alabando, recordando la poderosa verdad y gloriosa que Dios nos ama.**


