

Ambassador Andrzej Kasprzyk has served since July 1996 as Personal Representative of the OSCE Chairperson-in-Office on the Conflict Dealt with by the OSCE Minsk Conference. He is mandated to assist the Chairperson and the Minsk Group Co-chairs and leads a team which supports him in monitoring the Line of Contact and Armenian-Azerbaijani border.

A career diplomat, Mr. Kasprzyk joined the MFA of Poland in 1975. In 1983, he was posted to the Polish Embassy in Havana, where he served as cultural attaché for four years. Following four years in the press department in Warsaw, he

was posted in 1991 to Harare as Head of the Polish Embassy, accredited also in Malawi and Zambia. In 1995, Mr. Kasprzyk returned to Warsaw to serve on the MFA's Economic Co-operation Committee.

He served from 1973-74 as a member of the International Commission for Control and Supervision in South Vietnam and, in 1989, as a member of the UN team tasked with oversight of elections for a constituent assembly in Namibia.

Mr. Kasprzyk holds an MA in Economics and International Relations from the Main School of Planning and Statistics, Warsaw (now the Warsaw School of Economics). He is married and has one son and one daughter.
