

News In Brief

Salem M. P. Church, one of the appointments of Warwick Circuit, of which Rev. C. M. Cullum is pastor, located in Appoquinimink Hundred, which has closed for two months on account of improvement, reopened Sunday, by an all-day meeting. Preaching in the morning by Rev. T. O. Crause, D. D., of Washington, D. C.; in the afternoon by Rev. C. R. Strausberg, of Cecil county, and in the evening by Dr. Crause. This church has been repainted, new pulpit furniture and carpets and a new fence around the cemetery.

The canning of herring roes is a new industry on the Susquehanna, which promises to assume large proportions in the future. On Coulthart & Hogan's float all of the roes were canned this year, and on another float Capt. Geo. L. Mitchell established a small packing factory and 1,700 cases of No. 2 cans were packed. The limit of edible delicacies to be found in the Chesapeake will never be reached, and no one will ever be able to prepare them for a fastidious public as Maryland cooks.—The Aegis.

Business men from every part of Delaware are signing petitions praying the Pennsylvania Railroad Co. for better service. What is desired is a more rapid schedule that will enable the people to travel up and down the State in less time than is now required.
