NOTE.—Captain William Lonsdale (formerly of the 4th Regiment) was appointed Police Magistrate of the District of Port Phillip on the 9th September, 1836, and assumed office on the 29th of the same month. In that capacity he was in charge of the District until the appointment of Mr. O. J. La Trobe as Superintendent. Subsequently, Captain Lonsdale acted as Superintendent during the temporary absence of Mr. La Trobe, who was called on to administer the Government of Tasmania, from the 13th October, 1846, to the 25th January, 1847.

(1) Died at this date.—(2) Succeeded to the title of Viscount Canterbury in December, 1869.—(3) Sir G. F. Bowen absent on leave from the 31st December, 1874, to the 14th January, 1876.—(4) Sir Henry B. Loch absent on leave from 9th March to 17th October, 1889.—(5) Date of appointment. Sir W. F. Stawell never acted after his appointment as Lieutenant-Governor. He died on the date given in the next column.—(6) The Earl of Hopetoun absent on

leave from the 25th January until the 12th May, 1893; and from the 27th March, 1895, until his resignation on the 12th July, 1896.
