Phuket tops HIV/AIDS statistics

PHUKET has the highest number of new cases of people with HIV/ AIDS in the country, Dr Narinrat Pitchayakamint, chief of the Phuket Provincial Health Office, has confirmed.

The news follows a report by the Public Health Ministry released on November 30, he said.

The report shows that from 1989 to November 30, 2010, a total of 7,061 people in Phuket have been reported as having HIV, and 3,946 have developed AIDS.

A total of 1,712 people in Phuket have died from the condition during the period.

However, Dr Narinrat pointed out that the statistics reflected that Phuket has a registered population of over 300,000, but in reality there were more than 500,000 people on the island today.

Most of those registered as having AIDS were between 25 and 39 years old, and most were low-wage workers and maids, Dr Narinrat said.

"We continually campaign for people to protect themselves from the disease – that's very important in Phuket," he said.

Thai Hua to open international school

PHUKET Thai Hua School has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Huaqiao University to build a new Chinese International School on the island.

The school will be the first of its kind in Southern Thailand.

The name of the school has yet to be announced, but it will be located on 13 rai behind the existing Thai Hua School campus, located off Wichit Songkram Road in Phuket Town.

The land for the project was donated by Phuket's renowned Ekwahnit family.

Huaqiao University, in China's Fujian province, will manage the new school and provide teaching

In Phuket to sign the MoU on behalf of the Chinese university was its president Qiu Jin.

Signing on behalf of Thai Hua School was its alumni club president, Sombat Atiset, who is providing 200 million baht in funding for the project.

With 33 classrooms and other facilities, the school will have ca-

pacity for 1,000 upper-secondary school (M4-M6) students, who can register either as daystudents or as boarding school students.

The school plan features seven main buildings: an administration building, classroom block, gymnasium, auditorium, and separate dormitories for female students, male students and teaching staff. Additional facilities will include an outdoor sport field and basketball

Mr Sombat said construction is expected to be completed in time for the new school to open for the start of the 2013 academic year.

Mr Sombat is also president of

the Lock Sien Kok Foundation that aims to improve Thai-Sino ties.

The school will establish Phuket as the center of Chinese language education in the south of Thailand, he said.

It would also prove to be a great benefit to the island's tourism industry, he added.

The school will be the first international school in the region with a curriculum in a language other than English.

Its establishment represents the growing influence of the Chinese language as a means of communication in the global economy, Mr Sombat said.

"The Chinese are becoming more powerful. For a long time we have been thinking of ways to improve Chinese-language skills and cultural ties among local youths.

"To establish a Chinese international school here is the answer.

"After graduation students will be able to continue their education at a university in China without wasting one or two years completing a Chinese-language course," he said.

Tsunameter deployment to start this week

A MISSION to launch two new tsunami direct-detection units off Thailand's Andaman coast is scheduled to set off from Phuket this week.

Somsak Khaosuwan, Director of the National Disaster Warning Center (NDWC), confirmed the launch mission will depart from the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC) pier at Panwa Cape on Saturday.

Installation of the Italian-built buoys should be completed by Wednesday if all goes according to plan, he said.

One of the new EnvirTech "tsunameter" units will be deployed about 248 kilometers west of Phuket. The other will be set further north, about 240 kilometers west of the Surin Island chain.

EnvirTech technicians will join NDWC officers to install the units, which comprise highly-sensitive pressure sensors that sit on the seabed as well as surface buoys that transmit via satellite real-time data about the thickness of the water column above them.

The ship carrying the tsunameters arrived this week from Thailand's Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Center in the

Gulf of Thailand.

The exact locations for the units will be determined based on sea conditions during the installation mission and other factors, Mr Somsak said.

The spacing of the units is intended to ensure adequate response time to ensure a safe evacuation in the event of a tsunami originating west of Phuket or further to the north along the Sunda Trench, he said.

When the buoys are operational, the NDWC plans to launch a website where the public will be able to monitor real-time water depth data from the units online.

Villagers continue to fight after a dry decade

AFTER 12 years of suffering water shortages, villagers from Baan Saiyuan in Rawai last week filed their latest complaint with the Governor's Office in the hope of finally ending their water woes.

The villagers' problems began in 1998, when a developer levelled all the trees on a nearby hillside. The work affected a small dam the village depended on to divert fresh water to their community.

Fad Minmong, 61, said, "The dam was in the forest about half a kilometer from our village. It was the main water supply for our village for ages, but then a developer cut down the trees on 25 rai further up the hill.

"Even though the destruction of the forest has stopped, it still affects us. Sometimes when it rains the dirt soils the water stored behind the dam, causing muddy water to flood our village.

"The problem is that the big trees were cut down. The forest is recovering, but the young trees are too small to have much effect,"

Mr Fad explained that the villagers, representing some 400 households, had tried to solve the problem on their own

"We really want to grow more trees in the forest, but we can't because the investor claims the land belongs to him. Some of us have been sued for trespassing on his land and destroying his property. So we stopped doing anything because we don't want trouble," he said.

The complaint filed with the Governor's Office asked for a clear ruling on whether the dam was on private land or protected forest land.

"What we really need is for the Forestry Department to mark which land is national forest and which land belongs to the developer," Mr Fad said.

The village elder added that the never-ending fight to protect the village's main water source had left him feeling dejected. "My friend who always fought beside me has already died of old age," he said.

"We have filed letters of complaint at Provincial Hall about this problem many times throughout the terms of three [previous] Phuket governors, but we have yet to receive any response.

Vice-Governor Nivit Aroonrat closed his meeting with the villagers, saying, "I will ask related officers to inspect the area and report to me, as the problems of local people are important. Then we will move quickly to resolve the problem."

Pobpol Sirilucksanapong, chief of the Forestry Department's For-Resource Managing Coordinating Center in Phuket, said his office would have to coordinate with the Land Office to confirm which land had titles.

Kata Royal Condo enters mediation

REPRESENTATIVES of the Kata Vice-Governor Nivit Aroonrat Royal condominium project met top local officials last week to discuss changes to the project's master plan.

The changes are being negotiated in order to acquiesce to some local villagers who have complained that the completed building will obstruct views of Koh Pu (Crab Island) from Patak Road and other parts of the nearby area.

The condo project is about 1.5 kilometers inland, while Koh Pu is about a kilometer offshore.

Despite a special Provincial Hall committee approving the project, found himself heading the meditation meeting, alongside Karon Mayor Thawee Thongcham.

Also present were representatives of the Phuket Provincial Public Works and Town & Country Planning Office. Karon Public Works Director Wanchai Saeton said, "What we got in the meeting is not the final answer. They just offered an alternative.

"Once they finish the [reworked] master plan, I have to let the local villagers who objected to the original plan see it and ask them to agree to the changes."

'Mangrove road' gets green light

CONSTRUCTION of the Klong Koh Pee Road project moved a step closer to becoming a reality when Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha last week confirmed the Special Committee on Environment had given the plan the green light.

The road – first proposed 15 years ago and staunchly championed by former Governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop – had been held up by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MNRE) following their rejection of the project's Environmental Impact Assessment.

The key sticking point was the use of a 600-meter stretch of protected mangrove forest to complete the road.

The approval by the MNRE follows the notification allowing Phuket province to be the sole exception to the nationwide ban on using mangrove forest land.



The flyover, if the budget is approved, will cut across 600m of mangroves.

Under the new regulation, mangrove forest land in Phuket may be used for projects that bring "public benefit".

The road will greatly reduce commuting time between much of the island and Saphan Hin, which is home to a large park, two schools and a university.

A budget of 140 million baht has

been requested for the project. Although the governor still has to meet the Chief of the Department of Rural Roads on December 8 for budget approval, the process is expected to be a mere formality.

If the budget is passed, construction is due to begin in the middle of next year and be completed by the end of 2012.





New bus station not ready to roll

MORE than a year after the new Phuket bus terminal was completed, no date has been set for its opening and the project remains in budgetary and bureaucratic

The handover ceremony for 128-million-baht facility was held December 4 last year.

Bus stations in Thailand are usually run by the local administrative bodies, but Rassada Municipality said it was "not ready" to operate the station.

After the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization also turned down the offer to operate the station, the Land Transport Office had no choice but to run it by itself.

In early August, Phuket Land Transport Office chief Kanok Siripanichkorn said his agency hoped to have the station running by October 1.

But a new obstacle came later that month, when local residents staged a protest after learning that all off-island buses would have to do U-turns on busy Thepkrasattri Road.

The residents feared a traffic nightmare would ensue and complained that no public hearing had been held for the project.

Representatives of all parties later that month agreed that a set of traffic lights should be installed near the Vanich Mansion to enable

buses to begin their U-turns from the left lane, but the controversial plan is still under review by the Highways Department.

Caddie gunned down

caddie at the Mission Hills golf club in Phuket was killed by single gunshot to the back of the head on December 8.

Local villagers discovered her body before dawn on an access road about 200 meters from the golf course in Pa Khlok.

An eyewitness told police he was riding a motorbike along the road earlier that morning and saw Ms Amornrat talking with a man.

By the time he passed by again,

No bullet casings were found at the scene, but police estimated the caliber of the bullet to be .22 inches.

Ms Amornrat's body was taken to Thalang Hospital.

Police are now awaiting the results of the post mortem examination in order to confirm the cause of death and gain other information that might be helpful in their investigation.

Traffic claims another life

NANTAWAN Suebsa, 33, was killed instantly on Tuesday night at the entrance to the Anuphas Manorom housing estate, in front of Promphan supermarket on Chao Fa West Road.

Witnesses said she was waiting for traffic to clear before turning right into the estate when a Subaru sedan driven by Niphon

Itthipon, 37, slammed into the back of her motorbike.

She suffered a severe head injury and both her legs were broken.

Mr Niphon presented himself to police that night. He was charged with reckless driving causing death and released on 100.000-baht bail.

Police prep for 'Seven Days of Danger'

PHUKET officials are getting ready for the annual "Seven Days of Danger" road safety campaign, this year to run from December 29 through January 4.

The target for the Phuket Road Safety Operation Center is a 5% decrease in road deaths over the seven days.

Last year during the "Seven Days of Danger" there were 86 road accidents, resulting in eight deaths and 92 injuries.

This year there will be eight main police checkpoints.

In Muang District, the two main checkpoints will be at Moom

Muang Market (near Phuket Villa California) and at the entrance to the Boat Lagoon.

In Kathu, checkpoints will be operating at Thung Thong Police Station on Phra Baramee Road, at the Sirirat Road junction at the southern end of Patong, and at the police box on Rob Koh Road near Phuket FantaSea.

In Thalang, the checkpoints will be at Tah Chat Chai, in front of Srisoonthorn Tambon Administration Organization on Thepkrasattri Road, and in front of Cherng Talay Police Station.

However, Phuket City Police Superintendent Wanchai Akpornpit said, "If people continue to drink and drive, accidents will occur no matter how hard police try to catch them."







Gruesome offering for pig-headed spirits

DESPERATE villagers in Prachuap Khiri Khan province tried an unusual rain-making method last week after two years of drought ruined their coconut harvests.

Instead of appealing for the cloud-seeding techniques famous across the land, they instead decided what was needed was an offering of 249 severed pig's heads to the spirits of the land.

Despite parts of the country experiencing the worst floods in decades, there has been very little rain in Tap Sakae district for two years, leaving the villagers' coconut trees are almost barren of fruit.

It has also been very hot, attracting various kinds of insects that eat what coconuts the trees do produce.

Many of the trees are dying and even though the price of coconuts has reached around 25 baht each, the villagers have none to sell.

But local people think they know what caused their misfortune. Around two years ago, contractors built a bridge over nearby Khao Laan Canal. The builders made an offering to the guardian spirits of the area, and

asked that there be no rain while they built the bridge.

When they finished, the contractors forgot to redeem their vow, and the village has suffered drought since.

On December 4, villagers placed 249 severed pig's heads on the bridge and held a ceremony to annul the contractors' request.

In attendance were Wanit Pakkingmueang, president of the National Coconut Association of Thailand, and Tap Sakae District Chief Rutprateep Thampheepat.

The villagers invited all the guardian spirits of the land, including the canal spirit, the marsh spirit, the swamp spirit, the mountain spirit, the port spirit and Mother Earth herself. In return, they asked the spirits to let it rain and to banish the coconut-eating insects. - Khao Sod

Transient arrested for arson

A HOMELESS man living under a telephone exchange box near Phuket Town has confessed to setting ablaze five cars last month, say police.

Presented to the press last week was Sangworn Toe-udtha, 37, from Phang Nga, who is now facing charges of five counts of arson.

Officers on patrol recognized Mr Sangworn, who was standing by the side of Yaowarat Road near Tesco-Lotus.

His face closely resembled that of the man captured on CCTV footage setting a car alight last month, police said.

The officers inspected his bag and found three lighters, a pair scissors and a screwdriver.

This inspired the officers to search where Sangworn lives under the DTAC telephone exchange container near Darasamut Junction, just down the road.

Among his belongings, the officers found blue pants matching those worn by the arsonist caught on CCTV.

They also found two section of motorbike tire inner tubes and a piece of black insulation rubber.

The officers brought Mr Sangworn to Phuket Town Police

Station for further questioning, during which he confessed to setting five cars on fire in early November, police said.

He set pieces of rubber tires alight and placed them on the front wheel on the victims' cars, which matched a consistent factor in five car arson attacks in Phuket Town last month, police

Mr Sangworn apparently confessed that he was drunk when he set each of the cars alight.

The first of the five car fires was on November 2, when Suthida Srisamutr, 57, found her car ablaze in front of her house on Satun Road at about 11:30pm.

The next night, between midnight and 12:45am, three cars were set alight on Patipat Road; one belonging to Ekkarat Liangpaisarn, 62; another Chairat Saritdisuk, 56; and the third to Bunchana Kettirka, 44.

The midnight arson attacks abated until November 10, when Patcharin Kongpetr, 31, from Songkhla, was roused to find her car on fire on Phang Nga Road around 1am.

Soi Dogs moves to high-tech

AT THE Soi Dog Foundation (SDF) clinic in Phuket, every day presents new challenges. Life for the veterinarians is not simply a matter of vaccinating and sterilizing street dogs and cats.

Until now, diagnosis and treatment of dogs and cats has been extremely difficult work because veterinarians have been forced to rely on their clinical experience and guesswork. Animals can't tell the doctor what is wrong or describe their symptoms, so modern medical testing equipment is desperately needed.

But thanks to a few caring people, the tide is turning for SDF and the island's long-suffering dogs and cats. Recently six generous expats witnessed first-hand the good work the foundation does and have pitched in to help provide funding for modern medical

Wayne and Sonya Klapko donated a heart monitor that SDF veterinarians have already been trained to use. One of the Klapko's dogs suffers from an endocrine disorder called Cushing's disease and had to be taken to Bangkok every month for monitoring. With the heart monitor, SDF vets have been able to treat the disease and their pet now has a new lease of life. The machine was given in gratitude for the treatment provided.

to be sterilized quickly and safely between neutering and spaying operations at the foundation's mobile clinics, eliminating the need to send them back to the SDF center each night. Until their generous contribution was made, it was virtually impossible for SDF clinics to work at more remote locations, such as Koh Lanta. Having the autoclave on site allows the clinics to sterilize many more animals in a day than they could before.

Clive, who formerly owned a medical equipment company in Australia, is now looking to source other equipment for the foundation.

Most recently, John Satomi

Higgs bought two brand-new blood analysis machines: a Vet Autoread Hematology Analyser, in-

the biggest killer of dogs and cats on Phuket. These machines allow speedy and accurate diagnosis of a wide range of the conditions they spread.

John and Satomi bought the machines for SDF in honor of their two deceased, but still deeply missed, Labrador Retrievers Alpha and Jupiter. These two male siblings the couple shared their lives with while living in Singapore.

Bred in the Australian city of Perth, Alpha led an active life for six years, enjoying running and

swimming. The couple were devastated when someone poisoned him.

The source and type of poisoning were never identified due to the lack of appropriate testing equipment.

Alpha died a horrible death after suffering for days while undergoing whatever tests and treatments vets could provide at the time.

He enjoyed the long walks and the beaches until an inoperable growth on the spinal cord caused him to became paralyzed from the mid-spine down at the age of 10.

Undeterred, Satomi sourced a dog cart from the US. The wheeled cart supported his hind quarters, allowing him to get around again by pulling himself along with his front paws. Jupiter enjoyed a further four years

of active life until passing away of old age at 14.

John and Satomi are also giving SDF Jupiter's cart. "We hope that his wheels will be useful to a soi dog in the future, if the need arises," John said.

The two new machines will arrive in January and the company supplying them will deliver demonstration models to the clinic during December.

The SDF has cancelled their sterilization schedule on that day so all staff can be trained in using both machines.

The machines will be named Jupiter and Alpha, in honor of the two dogs whose love, loyalty and sense of fun meant so much to the Higgs.

John and Gill Dalley, directors of Soi Dog Foundation, expressed their deep thanks to the six expats for their outstanding generosity and support for the SDF's work.

"These machines will help immensely in the treatment of animals here," said Mr Dalley. "Next year will see us push ahead with plans to create Thailand's largest and most modern animal hospital outside of the universities.

"First phase work on a dedicated cat facility will also start in the new year, thanks to a generous grant from a foundation based in Switzerland," he added.







Nation marks HM birthday

THAILAND held lavish festivities last Sunday in celebration of the 83rd birthday of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej, the world's longest-reigning monarch.

HM The King, who has been hospitalized for more than a year, used a rare public appearance to urge Thais to "perform your duty to the best".

Thousands flocked to the banks of the Chao Phraya river to enjoy firework displays and floating lanterns on hundreds of illuminated boats that cruised up and down the river.

In the morning, His Majesty granted a public audience to members of the royal family, the military, the Cabinet and high-ranking officials at Amarinthara Winitchai Throne Hall in the Grand Palace.

In his speech, His Majesty urged all Thais to do their duty to the best of their ability – for the

sake of peace, security and happiness.

His Majesty thanked well-wishers for their blessings on his birthday after HRH Crown Prince Maha Vajiralongkorn read out a statement in honor of HM The King.

"I would like to thank all of you for gathering here to give me sincere birthday wishes," His Majesty said.

"Our country has been prospering and peaceful for a long time because we adhere to our nation and join hands to perform our duty by giving the utmost priority to public interests.

"As a result, I would like to ask all of you to be prudent and to keep your determination to perform your duty in line with your reasons for the sake of peace and security and sustainable happiness of our people," His Majesty said.

Leaks reveal US pressure over Bout

TWO diplomatic cables leaked by whistle-blowing website WikiLeaks have revealed the extent of US pressure on the Thai government to extradite alleged Russian arms dealer Viktor Bout.

The leaked cables also show that diplomats had alleged that Bout's Russian supporters paid witnesses to give false testimony at his extradition hearing.

American agents posing as Farc rebels arrested Bout in a sting operation at a Bangkok hotel in March 2008 after he allegedly agreed to sell them millions of dollars of weapons.

On February 12, 2009, the US ambassador in Bangkok, Eric John, voiced his concerns about the case in a meeting with Thai Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva.

He warned that the extradition proceedings had become "tainted

as a result of the efforts by Bout's associates to bribe Thai officials".

Ambassador John said the Americans had uncovered several examples of influence and corruption. These included the false testimony by a witness and "evidence of bribery schemes gathered throughout the world".

Shock suicide live on internet

A YOUNG Thai woman this week hanged herself live on the internet while her 25-year-old boyfriend and other internet users looked on.

Nichakorn Srisawat, 24, from Nakhon Sawan, hanged herself with a bedsheet tied to a ceiling fan in her Bangkok apartment after her boyfriend told her he wanted to end their relationship.

The webcam, attached to the computer, was turned in the direction of Ms Nichakorn's body.

When police arrived, the computer was still logged onto the controversial Camfrog video chat network, showing Ms Nichakorn had argued with her boyfriend.

Ms Nichakorn's boyfriend, Theerawat Jeeraphapjaroen, told police he had met her on Camfrog and the two had been dating for about a month.

He said Ms Nichakorn was bad-tempered and prone to stress. They had started arguing after her ex-boyfriend had asked to get back together with her.

On the day of the suicide, Mr Theerawat said he told Ms Nichakorn he wanted to split up with her. She reportedly replied that she had no reason to go on living without him.

Camfrog became infamous in Thailand after young Thai women reportedly used it to strip off for money during sex chats with strangers.

Rotary joins anti-polio effort

PHUKET Rotary Clubs are joining the Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) in the local effort to eradicate polio.

Rotarians will lend a hand at the PPHO's upcoming mobile polio vaccination clinics to be held across the island as part of National Immunization Day for Polio Eradication on December 15.

On the day, free polio vaccinations will be available at all government hospitals from 9am to 4pm and at all government schools from 9am to midday.

The PPHO will also send mobile clinics to administer free vaccinations at foreign worker camps and all foster homes on the island.

Ornnida Puttarak, a Public Health official at Vachira Phuket Hospital, told the Gazette, "We have not had any reported cases of polio for over eight years. We have been very good in keeping the disease in check."

However, she warned that was no reason for health officials to let their guard down. "For countries categorized 'at risk of infection', outbreaks of the disease have been found in neighboring countries.

"There are many migrant children here [in Phuket] who may have brought the disease with them, and this may spread to lo-

cal children," she said.

As a precaution, the PPHO will freely vaccinate all children under 15 years old, Ms Ornnida explained.

If parents had any doubt as to whether their children had been vaccinated, then do it again, she advised

"There are no adverse effects of being vaccinated again," Ms Ornnida said.

What is Polio?


Poliomyelitis (polio) is a highly infectious viral disease that mainly affects young children. The virus is transmitted through contaminated food and water, and multiplies in the intestine, from where it can invade the nervous system.

Symptoms include fever,

headache, vomiting, stiffness in the neck, and pain in the limbs. In a small proportion of cases, the disease causes paralysis, which is often permanent.

Polio can only be prevented by immunization.

CONSTRUCTION of the new international school with a Chinese-language curriculum [see page 1] is good news for Phuket. It will provide an important new option for parents who want to position their children to tap the potential of the world's most-populous nation and its robust economy.

Educational options in Phuket have grown in leaps and bounds over the past two decades with the introduction of four international schools using English-language curricula and a fifth under construction in Kathu.

The desire of Phuket parents to provide international-standard education for their children, one with strong emphasis on learning a foreign language, comes as little surprise given the dismal failure of the Thai government educational system in this regard.

Despite the obvious need for Englishspeaking staff to meet the needs of Phuket's large and fast-growing tourism economy, management at most state-run schools on the island continues to labor under a bureaucratic mindset that promotes parrot-like regurgitation over independent thought, crowd control over creativity.

Debit cards for foreigners?

I currently have two savings accounts with Kasikorn Bank. Is it possible to get a visa debit card – not *credit* card – from the bank?

I have been a customer with the bank around 10 years and work abroad, and so I do not have a work permit for Thailand. What documents would I need?

Janejira Thawan at the Kasikorn Bank call center replies:

As long as you have a savings

account with Kasikorn Bank, you can apply for a Visa Debit Card at any branch of Kasikorn Bank.

Please bring your passport (original, not a photocopy) and the bankbook for the account you want to have the debit card issued

It costs 100 baht to apply for a debit card, 100 baht to replace a lost debit card and 200 baht a year to maintain a debit card.

However, to keep your account active and as part of the conditions for opening a savings account with us, you must process at least one transaction through the account every six months.

If no transactions are made through the account over any sixmonth period, the bank will automatically deduct 50 baht from the account in order to keep it active.

If the account is not used for 12 months, the bank will automatically close the account.

The danger of jet-skis Tread warily in

FIRST PERSON

I WAS present when the Chinese couple rented the jet ski. We agreed on 1,500 baht for half an hour, and I asked one of my staff to teach the Chinese man how to operate it.

When the couple headed out to sea on the jet-ski, the man was driving, with the woman sitting on the back. They were told what time they were due to return and to use Patong Towers as a landmark to find their way back.

I didn't see exactly what happened. For 10 minutes the couple disappeared from view, so I asked my staff to go out on another jetski to find them. My staff found the jet-ski stuck on a rock. There was no sign of the couple.

Later a friend told me about the accident, that the couple had slammed into a catamaran, resulting in their deaths.

We had instructed the man on how to operate the jet-ski; he seemed quite capable of driving it.

The jet-ski key was given to the man, but after the accident the key was found strapped to the woman's wrist. It is possible the couple switched seats so he could teach his partner how to drive the jet-ski.

Passengers of a yacht anchored near the scene of the accident told police the couple drove straight into the middle of the catamaran at about 60 knots.

This is my first experience of such a serious accident, where both people on the jet-ski have been killed.

Most jet-ski accidents happen because clients do not listen to us.

Foreigners rent jet-skis and race against each other. During high season there can be up to three jet-ski accidents every day.

Unlike a few years ago, tourists are no longer scared of riding jet-skis. They go much farther out to sea, even though some cannot ride the jet-ski very well.

The first thing we always do is teach clients how to ride the jetski correctly for five minutes by riding out to sea with them. We teach them important things such as: how to start and stop the engine, how to speed up and slow down, and how to turn left and

We always tell them where they shouldn't go and the location of dangerous rocks.

All the regulation details for hiring a jet-ski is in the agreements everybody must sign before renting one. I urge people to read through the agreement and listen to our warnings.

We explain to every client not to leave Patong Bay on the jet-ski, because if they do we will not be able to see them if they get into

We check every 10 minutes to make sure the jet-ski is in view. If it goes out of view we send staff out to find it.

The future of MICE

HUMAN resources shortages may be an obstacle to the growth of the Meetings, Incentives, Conventions and Exhibitions (MICE) industry in Phuket and Thailand. Universities and other educational institutes are being engaged to tackle the problem.

Akapol Sorasuchart, president of the Thailand Convention and Exhibition Bureau (TCEB) says that MICE is a rapidly growing sector in the Thai tourism industry, with annual growth rates of around 20% per year, and a yearly income of up to 45 billion baht.

However, the labor market has found it hard to keep up with this rapid growth and demand, particularly in the supply of personnel with good knowledge of the industry. Entrepreneurs in the industry have warned that the growth of MICE may be hindered in the near future because of serious shortages of qualified personnel.

Mr Akapol said that there are not many

experts on MICE to be found in the labor market as most Thais still do not have a clear idea of the industry, and education in the field is limited.

To tackle this problem, the TCEB has joined hands with Prince of Songkla University (PSU) to create a MICE tourism curriculum.

According to *The Nation*, PSU Director of MBA Tourism Management Assistant Professor Kaedsiri Jaroenwisan and the TCEB signed a Memorandum of Understanding in August. Since then Prof Kaedsiri has been drafting the curriculum, which is to be offered at undergraduate level with a bachelor's degree qualification upon completion. Prof Kaedsiri believes the course should be ready to launch in 2012.

He said students graduating from this course will have a profound understanding of the industry and the different functions of services before, during and after the events take place. They will also be trained

in marketing and other factors related to the industry. It is being considered whether foreign languages, such as Chinese and German, should be offered as optional subjects.

In October this year, the cabinet approved plans for a long awaited International Convention and Exhibition Center (ICEC) to be built in Mai Khao, with construction likely to get underway by mid 2012. When completed, the 2.6 billion baht center is likely to attract more MICE travellers to Phuket, which will increase demand for local staff with the necessary management skills to work in the MICE industry.

Although no statistics are available specifically for Phuket, TCEB figures show that last year foreign participants visiting Thailand for corporate meetings spent around 15,000 baht each per day, up 10% from their average spending in 2008.

The average length of stay for each participant last year was 5.66 days, up from 4.86 days in 2008

Looking offshore for attractive returns

OFFSHORE portfolio bonds (OPBs) are one of the most attractive, yet misunderstood, financial products available to expat investors.

They should not be confused with government bonds, such as US Treasuries or UK Gilts, which are completely different financial instruments.

OPBs are offered by world-renowned companies such as Friends Provident International, Generali and Royal London 360. In essence, an OPB provides a tax wrapper for investments held within the bond.

This is particularly favorable for Phuket-based expats in avoiding tax on capital gains and income.

Most expats set up their offshore bonds in UK dependent territories, such as the Isle of Man, Guernsey or Jersey. These jurisdictions benefit from strong governments, strong regulatory control and inves-

tor protection measures.

There are several myths surrounding offshore portfolio bonds. Here are some of the more common assumptions:

Offshore investment is for the very wealthy only. The minimum investment into an offshore bond can be as low as about 470,000 baht but typically starts from about 2.3 million baht. Thousands of expats use them every year. They are commonly used in planning to mitigate inheritance tax,

capital gains tax and income tax.

Offshore investment is based in questionable tax havens. The members of the Association of International Life Offices, such as Friends Provident International and Generali, operate from some of the world's most highly-regulated jurisdictions. The Isle of Man, Jersey and Guernsey are all on the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) approved "white list".

Offshore investment is all

about tax evasion. The use of offshore bonds should not be confused with "aggressive" or complex taxavoidance schemes. Offshore bond customers are ordinary law-abiding citizens, not tax evaders.

Offshore investment is exotic and risky. Offshore bonds offer access to all the UK household name fund managers and funds, with a full range of risk profiles from lower risk cash funds through to specialist funds.

In addition, investors can choose funds that are not domiciled in sterling, thereby providing a high degree of diversification.

The benefits of investing through OPBs are numerous. In particular:

Virtually tax-free growth. Often referred to the "gross-up" effect, investment in an offshore bond grows virtually free of income tax and capital gains tax charges unlike, for example, UK Unit Trusts.

No capital gains tax. Fund switches made within an OPB do not trigger a capital gains tax liability. Such switches within a portfolio of onshore unit trusts or direct equities would incur a capital gains tax charge in the year they were made. Offshore bonds offer a more tax efficient structure for active, or passive, investment management.

Regular withdrawals. Investors can take a regular income from their offshore bond on a quarterly, half-yearly or yearly basis.

Inheritance Tax Planning. Structuring your assets through an offshore bond held in trust can mitigate, or avoid altogether, taxes due when transferring wealth.

Outside of an offshore bond, assets above the zero tax band (currently 15.2 million baht, or UK£325,000 for British citizens) that are not held in trust will be subject to inheritance tax of 40% for UK nationals.

Non UK status. As offshore bonds are not UK-based investments, this can help you mitigate UK tax bills if you are a UK expat.

In short, offshore portfolio bonds offer a very attractive way to hold your investments in a taxefficient form.

For long-term expats who are not planning on returning to the UK, the offshore route is particularly appealing. In addition, by structuring the investment in the bond as a trust, the potential liability to inheritance tax can be mitigated or completely removed over time.

Pimex on track for another record year

Tehran the latest direct link

LAST week, Mahan Air began nonstop regular flights from Tehran to Phuket, making it the first airline to do so from the Middle East.

The Iranian company will operate the route with its Airbus A300-600 aircraft, with 243 seats. As this newspaper went to print, the inaugural flight was due to arrive in Phuket on December 7.

Mr Kosol Surinandha, Managing Director of MyAviation Company, the sales agent for Mahan Air in Thailand, said that the first flight to Phuket was fully booked.

Phuket will be Mahan Air's sec-

ond destination in Thailand, and its 16th internationally. Mahan Air already operates eight flights per week between Tehran and Bangkok, and is hoping to increase to nine soon.

According to Mr Kosol, Mahan Air plans to initially operate one flight per week between Phuket and Tehran, but will expand the service to twice weekly by February 2011.

The airline's target is to operate as many as three services per week between Tehran and Phuket, when the approvals are obtained from Thai government departments.


IF WATCHING a raving narcissist on a quest to find herself over two hours sounds like fun to you, then you might like this film.

When Elizabeth Gilbert's postdivorce soul searching memoir Eat Pray Love was released in 2006 women everywhere gushed about how they identified with Liz's issues, and the book was profound and life-changing.

I haven't read it, but if it is anything like the cliched catchphrase marathon that the film adaptation is, I worry about womankind.

The storyline goes something like this: Liz (Julia Roberts) wants a baby, then Liz doesn't want a baby. Liz quits her marriage to be independent. Liz immediately falls into the arms of another man, before leaving him as well. Liz goes to Italy to eat, India to pray and Bali to love (note how all these destinations exist to serve Elizabeth, queen of the world). Liz decides she does not want to be independent anymore. She wants to sail off into the sunset with a hunky Brazilian (Javier Bardem) she met in Bali. The End.

The plot is full of themes popular to a modern audience, including love, identity and self-help. And it

had real potential to impart the same wisdom that so many found in the book, if executed properly.

Director Ryan Murphy uses beautiful cinematography to portray the romanticized globe through which Roberts trots. Ironically however, the montages of food and people she encounters along the way end up being more interesting than when she opens her mouth.

Though many people can relate to Liz's journey, unfortunately her expressed thoughts are, well, full of it, rather than insightful.

Julia Roberts' acting is not to blame for this, her performance, as always, is pretty but bland. The script is the real culprit here.

With gems like "believe in love again," "be careful what you wish for" and "let it be" the dialogue sounds more like a journey through song titles than self discovery.

Throw in patronizing and ste-

reotypical portrayals of each culture Liz visits and any potential for the movie to be enlightening is butchered completely.

The Italians are all hand-waving gluttons, the Indians are all devout and obedient and the Indonesians are apparently all borderline mentally deranged. Nice.

All the while, the oh-so culturally adept journalist Liz befriends them all (they all speak perfect English) for the time she needs them and then moves on to the next batch of friends, awaiting to serve her social needs.

One scene illustrates this particularly well. When trendy New Yorker Liz is staying in an Indian ashram and opting into Hinduism for a couple of months, she befriends a young Indian girl who is fated to an arranged marriage. Liz's flippancy is unintentionally highlighted against this girl, who at her young age is experiencing some genuine emotional torment.

When Liz attends her wedding, instead of feeling empathy for the miserable bride, she is bored and reminisces about her own wedding.

Never mind the poverty, war and injustice other people have to endure, Liz's problems are all consuming – she is approaching middle age, and doesn't know what she wants.


It is safe to say that some will find the lead character a tad irritating, which is a disaster since she is the movie's focal point.

There are some saving graces. There is a bit where a young athletic Australian gets his bum out, and there is also one part where Roberts is meditating and an elephant randomly walks up to her, extending its trunk. For a brief moment you think it might slap her in the face, but alas, it is just the usual friendly gesture elephants in India casually do to visiting strangers, of course.

These scenes of relief are few and far between, on the whole, I would advise that if you have an ounce of integrity do not subject yourself to this film.

If, however, you are also fickle and self-obsessed, then go for it, you'll love it and it will probably be "life-changing".



IF THERE'S a dress code at Opus One, we're not sure what it is but we're certain it's not what we arrived in.

Something black, dashing and looks expensive would fit the mold here, so maybe leave the scuffed shoes and old T-shirt at home.

Located up three dizzying flights of stairs at the top of The Plaza Surin, Opus One French bistro-lounge is not hard to find. It is however, quite a find, and occupies a twilight zone in Phuket's dining scene. It's hard to pigeon-

Straightforwardly French, this place has the glitz of a cocktail lounge without the pretentiousness that usually goes with it. It's plush yet homely, cozy yet grandiose.

Opus One is anything but runof-the-mill, and since opening eight months ago has etched out a niche as a trendy but affordable bistro with expats and tourists.

While many come here to eat, others come to drink.

There's no ocean view, no beach in sight and it really doesn't feel like you're in Phuket at all.

It's more like a cocktail lounge you'd find in the city. You keep expecting people in suits to in walk carrying newspapers under their arms and whining about how late their train was. They don't, and we are still in Phuket.

There's no room for kitsch decor and paraphernalia here.

The expansive open-air dining area is wrapped head-to-toe in opulence: art deco paintings, heavy-set leather armchairs, a gleaming gold record player, plush handmade cushions and expensive-looking trinkets.

Lighting in the restaurant is dim,

but a few pools of light cast on strategically arranged pockets of tables and chairs make you feel like you are in a Film Noir movie

The resident mixologist wearing tailored suit pants and a silk shirt – black, of course – is busy making sure the bar's heavily stocked assortment of spirits are polished and lined up perfectly.

He rubs down a few big names: Glenmorangie, Singleton, Glenfiddich 12 years (all 320 baht per glass).

Then he aligns the real stars: Macallan 12 years and Laphroaig 10 years (340 baht).

Cocktails are also a specialty here and with over 50 to choose from, you can't go wrong.

"We try to give our customers choice in everything we do. We pride ourselves on our classic French cuisine and cocktail and drinks menus," says Managing

> Director Angkana Jamsrikaew.

> As friends of Angkana arrive all dressed in black elegant evening wear - we are greeted by French Executive Chef Coste Camille.

> He too, is dressed in black, is polite, helpful and full of praise for

Angkana's bistro vision.

For entrees, order the Croque Monsieur with Mixed Salad (280 baht), or the Atlantic Smoked salmon (320 baht), a wondrously malleable hunk of fish, and a safe bet for satisfaction.

We eye the Australian Black Mussels cooked in white sauce, served with French fries (480

baht), being served to the blonde and smart shirt at the next table.

They dip freshly baked breads studded with rock salt into their steaming bowl as they mop up juices from the dish. It looks sublime, but we are more than content with our salad and salmon choices.

For mains: Try the Stewed Burgundy Beef with mashed potatoes (580 baht) and you'll exhale a few sounds of pleasure.

Exquisitely presented, succulent meat matched perfectly with puffs of light whipped potatoes.

My fish-eating vegetarian partner opts for the Norwegian Salmon "a la plancha" with light creamed spinach and shaved Parmesan (360 baht). She, too, makes noises of approval. Waitresses and waiters are all

friendly and conform to the theme of sartorial splendor exuded from the decor at Opus One. Staff aren't over-attentive and

allow diners just the right amount of time and space to relax with the menu.

For desserts order the Sorbet Colonel, Lemon Sorbet topped

Dirt riding down south

Discover roads less traveled, nature and adrenaline-fueled fun on two wheels.

A THAI woman whizzing by on a Honda Wave scooter may be an everyday sight, but when Janram Troisfontaine kick-starts her Kawasaki KLX250, all heads turn.

Janram, better known as "Peung," is one of few female dirtbike enthusiasts in Southern Thailand and the driving force behind Thailand Off-Road Adventures – a company specializing in off-road motorcycle and cycling trips.

Peung, a seasoned rider, has mapped an extensive network of trails in the south including Phuket, Surat Thani, Nakhon Si Thammarat, Krabi and Phang Nga.

Her tours are suitable for both cyclists and motorcyclists of all ability levels.

Junior-size dirt bikes allow little ones to follow in their parents on tours.

From coastal roads to jungle trails, riders and cyclists follow narrow dirt tracks meandering

through thick jungle and hillside plantations, and speed across mountain streams.

It's no easy ride: hairpin bends, slippery mud and sheer drops send adrenalin levels soaring.

Contrary to the off-road dirt biking reputation as high impact, Janram's tours are badged "ecofriendly".

All riders are briefed before setting out.

'We remind them that nature was here first, and that they should always respect the environment and local communities," Peung says.

While the tour company offers set packages, ranging from day rides to eight day off-road adventures, trips can also be customized to suit all.

Off-road cycling is also an option with Peung's company, although a reasonable level of fitness is needed.

Most cycle tours available in the south include mountain bikes, multi-lingual guides, meals,

refreshments and first-aid supplies in the price.

Accommodation, transfers and support vehicle are also included in trips lasting more than one day.

Exploring the region by bicycle is the ultimate eco-friendly travel experience.

Amazing Bike Tours are also a popular choice, and offer a variety of tours – and starting next year, boat and bike adventures.

On this tour, guests cycle through the countryside by day followed by evening cruises aboard a traditional Chinese junk.

The charming junk, known as The June Hong Chian Lee, was built in Penang in 1962 for charcoal transportation and has starred in many movies including The Man with the Golden Gun, Swiss Family Robinson and Shanghai.

After spending the night on the

boat on the Andaman Sea, cyclists wake up to a new adventure each morning. Koh Yao Noi and big sister, Koh Yao Yai are the first stops, and other destinations include Koh

Lanta, Koh Phi Phi and Krabi Town. This trip is a must for keen

cyclists and a great mix of endurance and relaxation.


One of Thailand's champion cyclists, Samai Klinruk, says there are still plenty of off-road adventures to be found in the south.

This Krabi-born cyclist has won many prestigous titles, including a royal championship presented by HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn.

"Visitors can learn about local life in the south and interact with people and the local culture," he said.

"This can be fascinating for newcomers, as they can gain a lot of valuable knowledge about Thailand and insight into its people."

Looking Back

SIAM faced a long list of crises in the early 1800s. In 1809 King Rama I, founder of Bangkok and a distinguished military commander, fell ill and died suddenly.

The Burmese saw this as an opportunity to gather their army of more than 10,000 men and a large navy to prepare for invasion of Siam once more.

The larger part of the Burmese army headed towards Thalang, as Phuket was then called. The townspeople of Thalang, outnumbered and low in supplies, retreated behind the temporary safety of the town walls, as Thalang Town was then the capital of the island.

When the Burmese finally crossed the channel and landed on Phuket, they laid siege to Thalang.

In the war that followed, Siam asked the Malay state of Kedah to send troops to Thalang in order to help the Siamese drive the Burmese from the island. Kedah,

which was under Siamese hegemony, could not refuse.

Sultan Ahmad Tajuddin, the ruler of Kedah, appointed his naval commander to sail his ships to Thalang and join the war on Siam's side. The fleet soon set sail towards Thalang with a Kedah army on board.

an unknown chronicler in the court of Kedah wrote an extensive account of the Thai-Burmese war and Kedah's military involvement. The historical poetry is today known as the Syair Sultan Maulana. Together, the Malay Syair and the Bangkok annals tell an intriguing story of the brave efforts to save Thalang from the destructive hands of a powerful enemy.

According to the Syair, the newly crowned King Rama II appointed Prince Maha Senanurak to lead a large Siamese army south in an expedition to drive the in-

The Siamese, divided into several forces but totaling more than 10,000 soldiers, travelled by land and sea. One of the armies, commanded by Chao Phraya Yommarat reached the city of Nakhon Sri Thammarat. There, Chao Phraya Yommarat ordered Phraya Tainam to lead the army across the peninsular to relieve Thalang.

Meanwhile in Thalang, the townsfolk had been fending off Burmese assaults on the town's fortifications and were proving a dire obstacle for the invaders.

The Burmese general anticipated heavy losses in taking the town by force, and decided to try another strategy: He ordered the Burmese

stockpile to be burnt and feigned a retreat back to their ships.

The whole of Thalang rejoiced, believing that the enemy had left. The governor let his people to leave the safety of their fortified town walls to gather supplies.

A few days later, the Burmese fleet returned and landed at Cape Yamu. By this time Phraya Tainam had reached Trang and had managed to build more than 80 ships to carry his troops across the bay to Phuket.

As Phraya Tainam's fleet neared Chanak Island, they heard shouts and the beating of Burmese war drums in the distance, where the Burmese were landing.

Phraya Tainam ordered his fleet to steer towards Cape Yamu, where the Siamese fleet encountered the Burmese.

Phraya Tainam ordered his men to immediately engage the enemy. Initially, the Siamese gained the upper hand in the ensuing battle. The Burmese ships lacked artillery because they had just landed all their cannons on Phuket.

Outgunned and heavily battered, the Burmese fleet began to retreat.

But Siamese fortunes turned when an artilleryman on Phraya Tainam's lead warship neglected to make sure the lid of a gunpowder barrel had been closed properly.

Disaster followed. Sparks from the firing guns set the contents of the barrel alight. A terrific explosion followed, blasting the commander's ship to splinters and killing every soldier on board, including Phraya Tainam.

Worse still for the home fleet, sparks and flames from the burning ship flew in all directions, igniting gunpowder barrels on neighboring ships. Soon, several warships in the Siamese fleet were exploding in succession.

The naval battle at Cape Yamu proved a disaster for the Siamese war effort. It prevented them from landing any troops on Phuket. With their commander dead and morale shattered, Phrava Tainam's fleet had to sail back to safe territory.

After the incident, no further expeditions were taken by this fleet to relieve Thalang. In the next Looking Back column, find out what fate lay ahead for Thalang Town.





Karon power cables going underground

UNSIGHTLY and at times dangerous overhead power cables are instead being laid underground along the two-kilometer stretch of road along the Karon beachfront.

Karon Mayor Thawee Thongcham said the work on Karon Beach road is a pilot project that will eventually lead to overhead power cables being installed underground throughout Karon Municipality.

If successfully done, it could become a model project for other municipalities in Phuket to follow. "Karon is an attractive tourist beach with a beautiful ocean view, tall trees and hillside scenery, but like many other attractions in Phuket it is marred by ugly power cables that run alongside its roads," said Mr Thawee.

"The plan to put electricity cables underground has been an important agenda for a long time. We have been pushing for the project to happen for over 10 years and have petitioned for the required budget on many different levels," Mr Thawee said.

When the budget was finally approved earlier this year, the municipality decided to start with Karon Beach. Of the three beaches

in Karon Municipality's ambit – Karon, Kata and Kata Noi – it posed the least engineering challenges in moving the power lines underground.

However, the project proved more difficult than expected because of the different government departments and private companies involved, said Mr Thawee. These include telecom giants TOT, TT&T and CAT, all of whom run telephone lines overground.

"We secured an overall budget of 45 million baht for the first phase of the project...The electricity authority was allocated 25 million baht from the total budget. They will take care of the planning and engineering works. The municipality received a 20 million baht budget to do its part," Mr Thawee explained.

The two-kilometer stretch along Karon Beach is just the first phase of the project.

"We plan to lay power lines underground in Kata and Kata Noi as well. I think the overall budget we will need to rid Karon of overhead power cables will be over 200 million baht, which is quite a lot of money. That is why we cannot do it all at once," Mr Thawee said.


The Karon beach road project is expected to be completed

by February next year.

The next area to be targeted is likely to be the road along Kata Noi Beach, since it is a small area and thus requires a smaller budget, Mr Thawee explained.

There are also hotel operators in the area willing to contribute funds to the public construction budget, he added.

The final phase of the project will therefore be Kata Beach, which will most likely be left to last because it is a large area, with more engineering complications and potential problems that may arise with local business operators affected by the construction.

Learning from property cycles of decades passed



THOSE of us of a certain age have come to appreciate that learning from the past is never a bad idea. Those around Southeast Asia in the 1990s witnessed the region virtually burst at the seams with new property developments.

Bolstered by a "golden age" of rises in the stock market, appreciating currencies and the resulting property market boom, a generation of *nouveau riche* was born.

Budding entrepreneurs and strong conglomerates enjoyed home-field advantage with access to credit, connections to land-owners and the ability to manoeuvre the political landscape to push development projects through.

It was a Field of Dreams "build it and they will come" mentality until the market crashes of 1997 – the "Asian contagion".

Welcome to 2010, and round two of the "tiger economy's" fight for success.

As Asia is leading the world out of the 2008 global economic crisis, many are asking the question: "Are the good times here to stay?" In other words, "Has the region learned from its mistakes in the first round of the 'fight' which saw it knocked down to the mat?"

The playing field is much different now than it was in the 1990s. At that time, the West was leading the world with its quest for dominance in all things military and economic.

Now it is the East that is poised for global leadership with China and India behind the wheel.

Although the sub-prime mortgage crisis in the US sparked

decreases in oil prices, a hedge fund "Houdini act" plunging UK and Euro currencies and a global recession, Thailand is experiencing a reverse trend.

Despite a series of political hijinks – which have been all-toowell documented in the media – Thailand has seen a skyrocketing domestic property market, massive liquidity in firms listed on the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET), and a "rubber-band effect" of recovery, even seeing growth in the personal holdings of highnet-worth individuals.

Today, as we start what looks to be a new economic cycle, the sustained period of overbuilding, primarily in Bangkok, has reached a critical point.

Both established properties and new developments are carrying significant amounts of debt. The Bangkok "syndrome" is having a trickle-down effect on resort destinations including Phuket, Koh Samui and Chiang Mai.

The hospitality industry is continuing to push the limits with entrepreneurs developing even more hotels in virtually every part of the country.

As Thailand struggles to recover momentum in the tourism industry, it is faced with the likelihood that a mass model for development has to be adopted in order to tap into new demand and increase in numbers of tourists.

It's a tricky issue, as even growth for growth's sake – without a mass model – can be sustained for long periods of time, causing significant damage in the long term.

The most profound effect on hospitality investment is that business decisions are not based on sound financial logic.

Rather than making an economically wise investment, prospective hotel owners often want to develop a new property as a showpiece or legacy – leaving existing hotels out to pasture.

So, we have arrived at a crucial point and have to start asking the question: "When is enough, enough?"

Curbing Thailand's enthusiasm for new hotels is not going to be easy, but it is – and must stay – on the government's agenda.

Greater incentives for redevelopment such as zoning and tax incentives for upgrading existing properties are a logical starting point.

While 1997 seems like a long time ago, it remains a painful memory of just how things can, and often do, go wrong.

Getting your money in the bank

Property Legal

MANY foreigners in Thailand want to open and maintain a bank account, to either facilitate business activities or just for convenience when visiting.

Generally, the opening and maintenance of both Thai baht and foreign currency bank accounts by foreigners in Thailand is allowed, but is subject to conditions prescribed by the Bank of Thailand.

In theory, the conditions applying to foreigners opening bank accounts may be clearly regulated in laws and regulations, however, in practice, a foreign applicant may experience that it can be a time consuming and confusing challenge.

The reasons for this may vary but generally derive not only from language barriers between Thai bank employees and foreign customers, but also from different banks with differing policies on this issue.

Sometimes it becomes even more confusing when different bank employees in the banks' separate branches, or even within same branch, interpret or apply regulations differently.

This means that in practice one foreigner may experience the bank account opening process in Thailand as straightforward and simple, while others may have difficulties, or even be refused by one bank, but allowed by another.

The amount and nature of the

documentation required when applying for a bank account normally depends on the type of account you wish to open, and, in addition, your immigration status.

If the applicant is visiting Thailand as a tourist, working in Thailand and holding a valid business visa, or maintaining permanent residence makes a lot of difference to the process.

In general, applying for a Thai bank account becomes less complicated if the applicant is able to demonstrate with acceptable documentation that he or she is legally

working or maintaining permanent residence in Thailand. For such applicants, additional banking services are usually also available.

Upon provision of all required documentation to the satisfaction of the bank employee in charge, the applicant is required to deposit a minimum amount into the bank account as part of the opening process.

The amount may vary, mainly depending on the type of bank account requested. In case of a Thai Baht Savings Account, a minimum deposit of 500 baht is usually sufficient.

Upon completion of the Thai Baht Savings Account opening process, a debit (ATM) card may be issued which allows the account holder to withdraw funds from cash machines.

The opening of a bank account usually requires the personal presence and signature of the applicant.

Nevertheless if a foreigner encounters difficulties opening a bank account, they may wish for professional assistance from, for example, a law firm, in which case their attendance is recommended.

Next on the list of Phuket's Top 20 flowers is the stunning *Solandra*, an angel trumpet variety.

AN ALL-time favorite flower for many is datura suevolens, now known in up-to-date gardening books as the brugmansia, or its common nickname angel's trumpet. In Thailand it is known as *lam pong*.

While it is very tempting, it can unfortunately not go into the Top 20 list for one simple reason – it doesn't relish Phuket's climate. On the slopes of Doi Inthanon near Chaing Mai, the angel's trumpet grows everywhere.

Rarified, mountain air habitats

suit the blossom. Brugmansias do not like excess humidity, and in any case, Phuket is a tad too hot for them.

The Top 20 spot this week goes to another shrub with trumpetshaped blooms called Solandra or the cup of gold.

The Brugmansia deserves honorable mention, simply due to its stunning looks. Its exotic, pendulous trumpets are truly spectacular. Often six to eight inches long, the paper-thin blooms droop elegantly from arching gray-green foliage.

One cultivar, plena, has wider, bell-like flowers that may exceed a foot in length.

Maybe the best place in Phuket for your angel's trumpet is in a pot. It is certainly a favorite for containers, both on patios as an accent plant, and in living rooms, where it

always attracts attention. Two provisos though: It is highly poisonous, and it needs to be handled with care, since its branches are remarkably brittle. So the closest alternative, and this week's entry to the Top 20 has got to be Solandra grandiflora, or tuay tong,

Incidentally, this genus also includes the deadly nightshade.

Solandra, also known familiarly as the chalice vine or cup of gold, is a better garden choice than brugmansia because it is less fastidious and usually a more prolific bloomer.

a member of the same fam-

ily, and also from the Americas.

But be warned: It is a vine, and for this reason will definitely require some support if you want it to climb rapidly.

The aerial rootlets will attach themselves to anything in its vicinity, and so this plant is best placed against a wall, trellis or arch.

As a consequence, it will spread rapidly along a wall, maybe extending more than 10 meters. Don't, for example, make the mistake of planting one in an open bed next to the swimming pool.

It blooms beautifully, but is really too heavy and cumbersome for its situation. Extra staked support is advised.

But the flowers are magnificent. The Latin epithet grandiflora is well deserved.

Like those of the *brugmansia*, the blooms are trumpet-shaped, but they are heavier, more fleshy, and if anything, even more dramatic than those of the angel's trumpet.

Usually a deep cream, the chalice-like blooms have fluted edges, and are scored inside with 10 dark lines. Everything about this shrub is alluring – from the vase-like, sealed buds to the glossy, evergreen leaves.

To counterbalance this fleshiness, the flowers exude a delicate, lemony fragrance.

Once established, the chalice vine is easy to cultivate. It can be propagated from heeled cuttings, and has the merit of blooming several times a year. It will tolerate severe pruning and will flower on new growth.

The only real problem is that it is a real heavyweight and will need support. If you happen to see one around, it will, inaudiably, be blowing its own trumpet.

Made of iron

Favorites land Ironman titles in emphatic style

FORMER US Navy lieutenant Timothy O'Donnell was crowned inaugural Ironman 70.3 Asia-Pacific Champion at Laguna Phuket Resort on Sunday after a dominant performance in the men's race.

In the female category it was all smiles for Caroline Steffen as she landed top honors to cap off a superb year in which she has won four triathlon titles.

O'Donnell, 30, started the men's race as hot favorite and produced a clinical



last week's Laguna Phuket Triathlon champion, Italian Massimo Cigano. Hideo Fukui of Japan finished third.

First out of the water following the 1.9km swim, O'Donnell extended his advantage during the punishing 90km cycle, before pushing himself through the 21.1km for winning time of 03:59:42.

The champion, who finished third behind German Michael Raelert at the Ironnan 70.3 World Championship earlier this year, was delighted to end 2010 with a victory, while also full of praise for the grueling Phuket Ironman course.

"It is a great course and it was a real pleasure to be out there racing. The cycle was tough. There is some pretty stiff hills out there. When you are barely breaking four hours you know it's a hard course," said the

champion, before adding "it was a lot of fun to end the season with such a unique race."

O'Donnell's win comes less than a month after his partner, Australian Mirinda Carfrae, was crowned Ironman World Women's Champion in Hawaii.

In the Ironman women's section, Swiss star Steffen powered her way to a commanding victory to make up for the

disappointment of finishing second to Carfrae at the World Championships.

Steffen, nicknamed "Xena", was embroiled in a titanic battle with last weekend's Laguna Phuket winner Belinda Granger during the bike section of the course, but managed to pull away from the chasing pack during the run.

Her winning time 04:20:13 was almost five minutes ahead of second placed Melissa Rollison of Australia, who overhauled Granger late on to claim runner-up spot.

"I'm thrilled to win such a fantastic challenge. It's such an exciting course with unique features, like the bike bridge and the swim in both sea and across fresh water – it's just an amazing place to compete in triathlon," said Steffen.

The 50-strong professionals were joined at Laguna Phuket by over 800 amateur athletes from 51 countries, all racing for a share of the \$75,000 prize purse.

The first Thai male finisher was Jaray Jearani, while first Thai female was Mayuree Maidaeng.
