On behalf of the worldwide football family, I would like to extend mycondolences and deepest sympathy to you and the people of Poland, particularly the families and close friends of President Kaczynski, his wife and all those who lost their lives, at this harrowing time, and wish you strength and fortitude for the challenging days that lie ahead.
