GABRIEL BARRE (Co-Director/Choreographer) is an internationally acclaimed director who most recently directed the new musical Amazing Grace on Broadway at the Nederlander Theatre. He also co-created the new musical Magic To Do with Stephen Schwartz and Mark Hartman for Princess Cruises. In Prague, Czech Republic, he directed another original musical, Carmen, now seeing a revival after its four year sold out run. His credits in the United States include the New York productions of The Wild Party by Andrew Lippa (nominated for 13 Drama Desk

Awards and 5 Outer Critics Circle awards, both including Best Director and for which he won the Calloway Award), Summer of 42, Stars in Your Eyes, Honky-Tonk Highway, John & Jen and Almost, Maine. He directed the U.S. and Canadian tour of Pippin, as well as the national tour of Rodger and Hammerstein's Cinderella, starring Eartha Kitt. His regional theatre credits include Private Lives at Seattle Repertory Theatre, Tom Jones, Camelot and the world premiere productions of Memphis, at the North Shore Music Theatre in Boston and at Theatreworks in California; Sweeney Todd, Finnian's Rainbow, Houdini and many other new musicals at the Goodspeed Opera House; Stand By Your Man at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville; Hay Fever and Pericles at the Shakespeare Theatre of New Jersey; Little Shop of Horrors and Flower Drum Song at the American Musical Theatre of San Jose; as well as Tommy, Hair and Lovers Labours Lost at the Connecticut Repertory Theatre. As an actor, he has been nominated for a Tony Award as Best Actor in a Musical and appears often in film and on TV.



JENNIFER PAULSON-LEE (Co-Director/Choreographer) - Ms. Paulson-Lee has enjoyed a 25+ year career throughout the USA, Europe, Japan and Canada spanning Broadway, Off Broadway, Radio City, Classical Opera, Television and Film, while often developing new works. Currently running on 3 vessels for Princess Cruises is Magic To Do. a new musical revue of Stephen Schwartz songs with Director Gabriel Barre and Musical Director Mark Hartman. She has worked with notable theatres including Lincoln Center's Vivian Beaumont, The York

Theatre in NYC, LA's Mark Taper Forum and The Wallis, Paper Mill Playhouse, Goodspeed Opera House, McCarter Theatre, Shakespeare Theatre of New Jersey, Utah's Pioneer Theatre, The Melting Pot and Bay Street Theatre to name a few. Classically trained in dance and Meisner acting technique, she has also worked with several distinguished directors and choreographers of our time including Susan Stroman, Scott Ellis, Darko Tresnjak and the legendary Jerome Robbins.



CONSTANTINE KITSOPOULOS (Music/Conductor) has made a name for himself as a conductor whose musical experiences comfortably span the worlds of opera and symphony, where he conducts in such venues as Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall and Royal Albert Hall, and musical theater, where he can be found leading orchestras on Broadway. He serves as Music Director of the Festival of the Arts BOCA, an extraordinary multi-day cultural arts event for South Florida, and was most recently appointed Artistic Director of the OK Mozart Festival, Oklahoma's

premier music festival, where he led his second season this past June. From 2008 – 2014 Kitsopoulos served as Music Director of the Queens Symphony Orchestra. In addition to his ongoing Music Director commitments, in the 2014/15 season Kitsopoulos led the New York Philharmonic in holiday subscription concerts following a notable debut last season. He returns to the symphony orchestras of San Francisco, New Jersey, Houston and North Carolina, and makes debuts with the Florida Orchestra, San Antonio Symphony, Louisville Orchestra and Toledo Symphony. A frequent guest conductor at Indiana University, he leads Menotti's Last Savage and Rodgers and Hammerstein's South Pacific this season. Highlights of recent seasons include appearances with Baltimore, Colorado, Detroit, Milwaukee and Pittsburgh symphony orchestras, as well as the Calgary Philharmonic, National Arts Centre Orchestra and the New York Pops Orchestra at Carnegie Hall.
