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## SCHOOL

Saint Mary's College High School was founded in San Francisco in 1863 and has been conducted by the De La Salle Christian Brothers (Lasallians) since 1868. In 1927 the school moved to its current location in Berkeley. Saint Mary's educates in the tradition of Saint John Baptist de La Salle, who founded the Christian Brothers in 1680 in France. De La Salle founded his teaching order to serve the poor. This preferential option for serving economically disadvantaged students continues to this day. Forty percent of Saint Mary's students receive financial aid annually. Saint Mary's operates as one of seventeen autonomous high schools in the Lasallian District of San Francisco New Orleans. Originally an all-boys school, Saint Mary's became coeducational in the Fall of 1995. Saint Mary's students reflect the social, ethnic, religious, and economic diversity of the San Francisco Bay Area. Its college-preparatory curriculum is complemented by a full program of co-curricular organizations and clubs; programs for dance, drama, music, and visual arts; an interscholastic athletics program of ten sports and twenty-five teams; and an active student government. On average, ninety-four percent of Saint Mary's graduates attend college and seventy percent earn college degrees.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 300 credits are required for graduation.
- Students study 5 courses per term ( 15 per year); each 10 -credit course is completed in two twelve-week terms.
- Students may place in second- or third-year Math, World Language, and/or Visual/Performing Arts classes in the ninth grade.

## Programs Inspired by Mission and Other Distinctive Educational Features

- Students are required to complete three five-credit Epistemology (Theory of Knowledge) courses, one per year in grades, 9, 10, and 11, from the Philosophy Department.
- In addition to World History \& U.S. History, students are required to take at least one five-credit upper-division history course chosen from African History, East Asian History, Islamic History, Latin American History, and American Social History in order to "see the world through other eyes."
- Enrichment Week is a week of alternative education offered every March, when faculty lead students in a variety of enrichment opportunities, including the arts, cooking, technology, outdoor adventures, service learning, immersions, and international travel.
- The school's Lasallian Days, offered each term, and bi-monthly C-Block sessions provide training opportunities for students in decision-making, Social Emotional Learning, spiritual development, and college \& career preparation.
- Service Learning is incorporated into the curriculum throughout all grade levels.
- Qualified students have the opportunity participate in a variety of advanced offerings, including UC Berkeley's Academic Talent Development Program, UC Berkeley's summer courses, and community-college courses.
- Every Fall and Spring all students participate in a test-retest program using The College Board's suite of standardized tests (PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, PSAT, SAT) in order to analyze student academic strengths and areas of growth and assess the strength of the school's academic program.
