Outline Description

It is noted that round about the year 1575, there as already an existence of a chapel in this area. The chapel, at first, was dedicated to St Bartholomew, indeed the side street leading to Xewkija is San Bert street.

Property Description


The chapel fell into disrepair that it was closed in 1674. It was reopened again in May of the same year when Notary Gio Paolo di Lorenzo saw to its repairs.

The chapel differs a lot from what it used to be. At one time, there was a parvis in front of the chapel which was turned into a porch in 1700. Unfortunately both the porch and the parvis were torn down when the street was winded. The dedication was also changed to the Madonna of Mercy.

Access to this chapel is via five steps. The well proportioned front façade is restrained classical with a pair of Doric pilasters carrying an entablature and a triangular pediment. The frieze on the entablature is decorated with triglyphs and circular mouldings to the metopes, with the insegna of the Madonna in the centre of the pediment. The pediment is surmounted by a central bell tower that has arched openings on each face, flanked by pilasters and crowned by simple entablatures with small, triangular pediments.

The main door is located in the centre of the elevation, squared headed with a simple, moulded stone surround. Above the door, the façade is pierced by a blind circular window.
