FOREWORD

The Afghan population who arrived in Pakistan post 1979 have de-facto been considered prima-facie refugees fleeing conflict and persecution. There had been no comprehensive registration of Afghans in Pakistan nor they were covered in the last national population and housing census of Pakistan conducted in 1998. As such there has been a lacuna in base line data for the Afghan population.

2. The present Tripartite Agreement signed by the Government of Pakistan with Government of Afghanistan and UNHCR in March, 2003 will expire in March, 2006 and there is a need for credible profile information on Afghan population in Pakistan for future planning leading to comprehensive and durable solutions.

3. The Government of Pakistan thus proposed to conduct a Census and Registration of Afghans in Pakistan. UNHCR deployed technical missions to Pakistan for technical consultations to develop a proposal on Census and Registration. Based on the discussions with the UNHCR technical missions a working group comprising members from the Government of Pakistan (Ministry of SAFRON / CCAR / PCO), Government of Afghanistan and UNHCR was formed to examine and recommend methodology, time frame etc. for the exercise. After having detailed discussions and interaction with the Afghan population / elders and Provincial Governments, it was decided to carry out the exercise in phases. (i.e. Pre-Mapping of Afghan population, conducting Census, followed by Registration of the population)

4. The Afghans who came to Pakistan as of December, 1979 were kept in camps near to the bordering areas but with the passage of time due to economic and social reasons they have moved to other parts of the country in urban as well as in rural areas.

5. To locate and identify the residences / abodes of Afghans, a pre mapping exercise was carried out in January, 2005 through visits of PCO personnel to Districts and Tehsils. Pre-mapping forms were filled for each union council / village (lowest administrative unit in urban and rural areas) with the help of local councilors and the same information was plotted on census maps which were provided to the enumeration staff for census in February – March, 2005.

6. The Census of Afghans living in Pakistan was carried out from 23rd February, 2005 to 11th March, 2005 all over the country except in Northern Areas (Gilgit, Sakardu) due to law and order situation.

7. An extensive publicity & Mass information campaign through T.V and posters/leaflets was conducted from Jan 2005 onward. The Census operation was monitored by national and international agencies and all of them have acknowledged creditability of the exercise. The bench mark data obtained through the census and published in this report will provide base line for a comprehensive and durable solution of Afghan problem to the Government of Pakistan, Government of Afghanistan and UNHCR.

8. The Ministry of SAFRON, Government of Pakistan is thankful to the UNHCR for providing technical and financial support without which it was difficult to complete the census with success.

Executive Summary

Following 18 months of planning through a working group comprising the Government of Pakistan (GoP), the Government of Afghanistan (GoA) and United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), a proposal for the census and registration of Afghans in Pakistan was developed in mid-2004. Based on this proposal, UNHCR signed a Memorandum of Understanding¹ with the GoP represented by the Ministry of States and Frontier Regions (SAFRON) and the Chief Commissionerate for Afghan Refugees (CCAR) in December 2004.¹

A phased approach to the project was agreed, and four subsequent phases were adopted

- Phase 0** Planning - overall strategy and implementation methodology, training, pre-mapping and fund raising
- Phase 1** Census - House to house enumeration, data entry and publication of results
- Phase 2** Census analysis, biometrics feasibility study, and
- Phase 3** Registration. An operational plan instituted for Phase1² and census conducted within a 13 day period countrywide, *by and large*³ according to the process agreed between the parties.

This report focuses on the completed Phase 1: the Census phase.

The Registration phase is subject to joint GOP / UNHCR analysis of data collected during the census, a feasibility study on biometrics, and further planning with the Government of Pakistan, as stipulated in Annex 1 of the MOU. A working group with the Governments of Pakistan and Afghanistan and UNHCR will develop a detailed registration proposal after an in-depth analysis of the census data.

Census Methodology

The country-wide census of Afghans in Pakistan was conducted from 25th February to 11th March 2005. It involved 312,000 person hours calculated at 3,143 staff (enumerators + supervisors working 8 hours for 13 days). They collected information from all locations in Pakistan. A census form jointly designed with the GoP became the main tool upon which the enumerators and supervisors were trained to collect the agreed information⁴ following training-of-trainer sessions in all provinces and districts hosting Afghans. A subsequent operational plan formed the *modus operandi* of the census. Daily counts of persons enumerated at each block/cluster/district were relayed to provincial hubs and then forwarded to the capital on a daily basis throughout the data collection period.

Target Population

As outlined in the MoU, the census covered “all Afghans who arrived in the country after 01 December 1979 and currently residing in different parts of Pakistan. Any person who produced a validly obtained Pakistan identity card (NIC) was not covered in the exercise”. The MoU also stipulated that participation in the exercise was mandatory for the above mentioned target population and those who did not participate and who were unable to demonstrate compelling circumstances for not doing so would be subject to national laws.

Supervision and Monitoring

UNHCR and CCAR staff supervised the Government's census implementing agency Population Census Organization (PCO) throughout the country. PCO / CCAR federal staff supervised provincial staff who in turn managed district teams working under GoP District Coordination Officers (DCO)⁵. All disbursements to PCO were released through CCAR.

Monitoring Mechanisms

UNHCR staff monitored the census process throughout the country, and systemic checks and balances were introduced to ensure the credibility of the data collection and data entry processes.⁶

The name of the head of household and spouse, family/gender and under age five composition by residence in Pakistan (province, district, sub-district/tehsil) and origin in Afghanistan (Province & district), by gender, ethnic composition, year of first arrival, source of livelihood in Pakistan (self employed, employed, dependant, daily wage and other), intention to return to Afghanistan by the end of 2005; if not - principle reasons (security, shelter, personal enmity, lack of livelihood and other) were collected.

The census of Afghans, undertaken in all locations in Pakistan, shows that 548,105 Afghan families, comprising 3,049,268 individuals currently reside in Pakistan. This census presents the clearest quantitative and qualitative demographic data to date on Afghans in Pakistan.

The numbers may be surprising to some, considering the return of over 2.3 million Afghans since March 2002, the implication being that more than 5 million Afghans were in Pakistan at the time of the fall of the Taliban.





The reason for such numbers might include

1. **Demographic increase caused by an estimated annual population growth of more than 3%.** A 3% growth rate for a population of 3 million would result in an increase of over 91,000 people in one year. Over a decade, the population would increase by more than one million people. The large influx between 1979 and 1980 of more than 1.5 million people - is likely to have resulted in a higher than normal birth rate in the early 1980s - a common phenomenon following times of duress. This would have caused a subsequent natural spike around the time of the millennium.
2. **Urbanization of the Afghan caseload in Pakistan, particularly after 1995 due to cessation of food assistance to the camp population.** The urban population of Afghans in Pakistan has remained largely unknown to any reasonable level of accuracy until this recent census.




At the time of finalising this report, more than 125,000 Afghans have voluntarily returned to Afghanistan since the census was conducted.

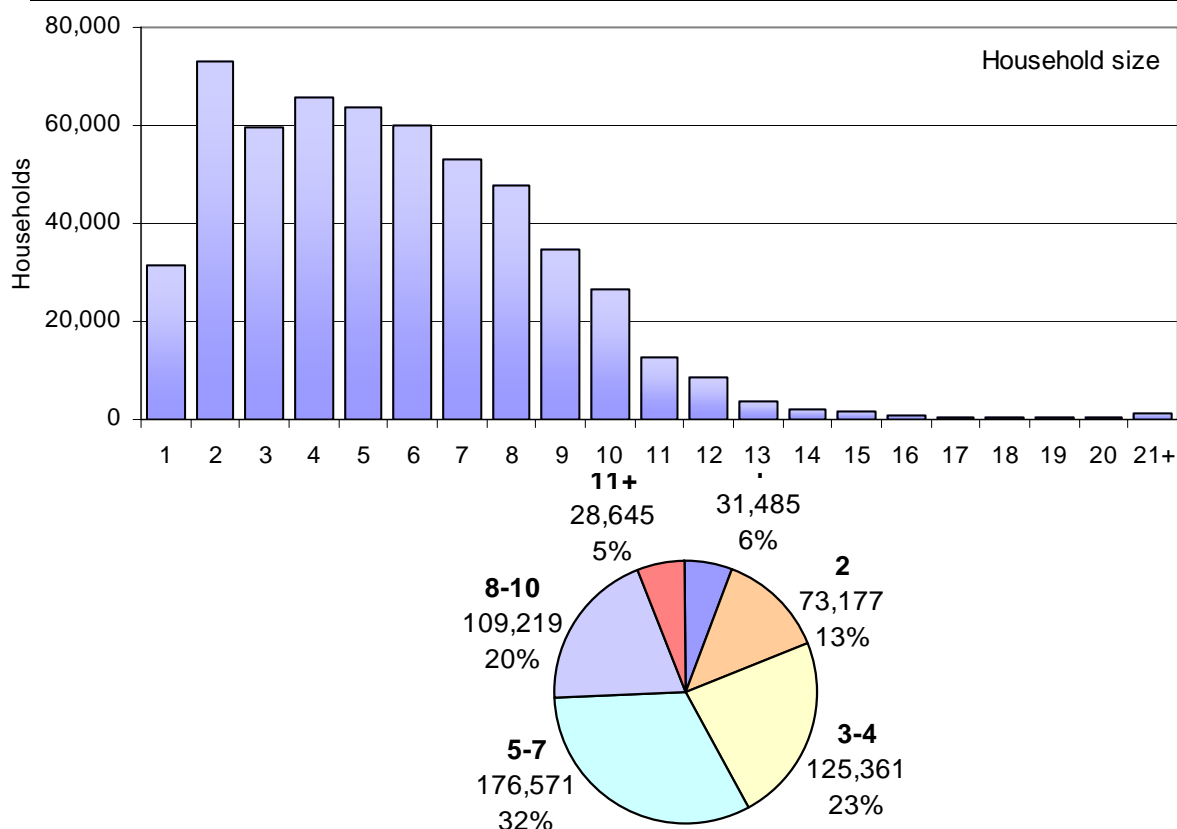

1. Family Size

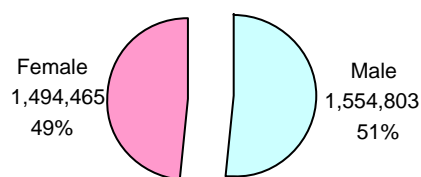

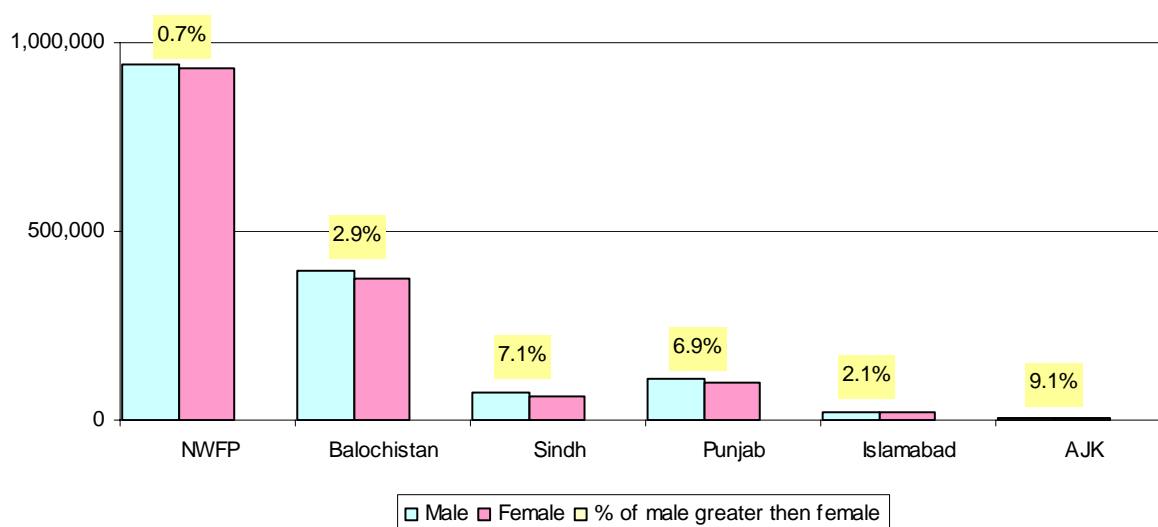

4. Age

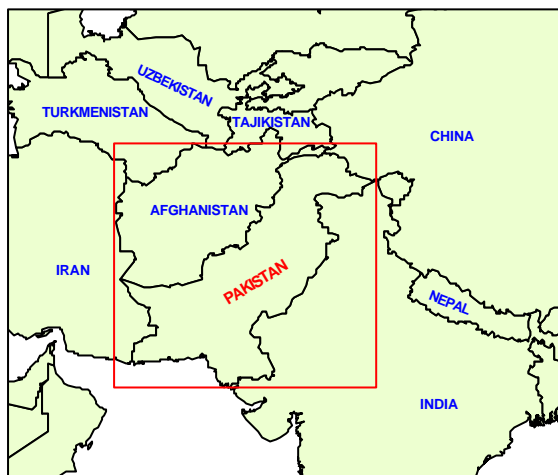
The census shows a young population, as anticipated. Some 19 percent of Afghans in Pakistan are under the age of five, compared to about 14.8 percent of Pakistan's population in this age group. This demographic profile, underlines the fact that much of the Afghan population was born in exile, points to the considerable challenge ahead for any Afghan government to provide schools and employment for returnees.

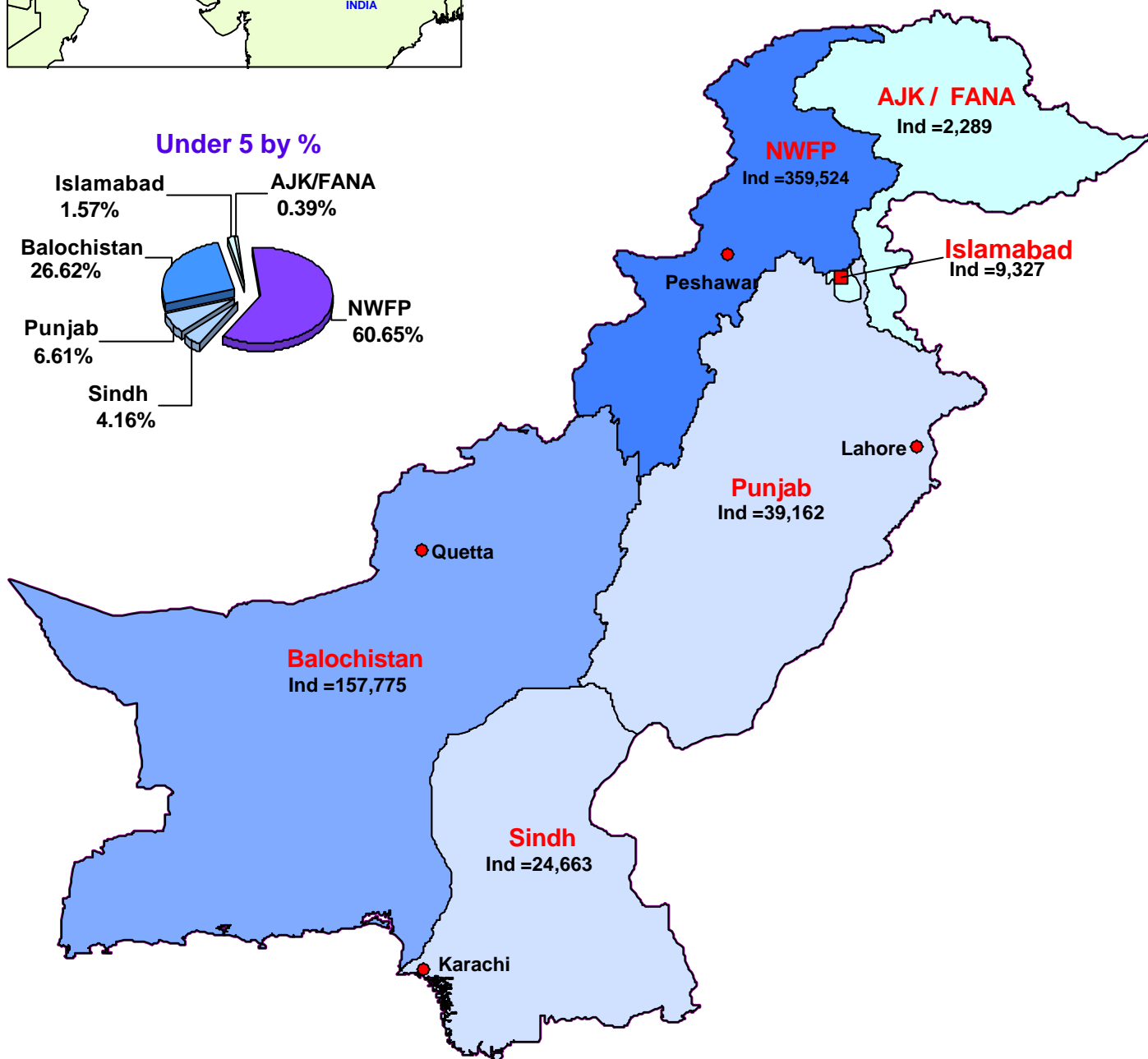
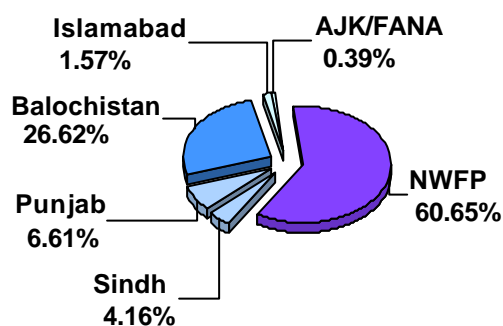

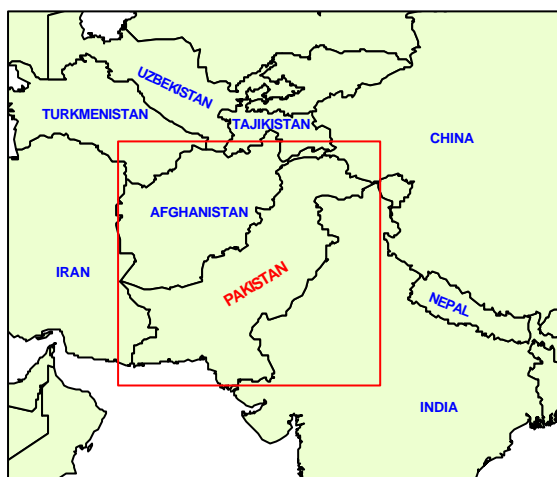

Census of Afghans in Pakistan : District of Residence & Children Under Age Five

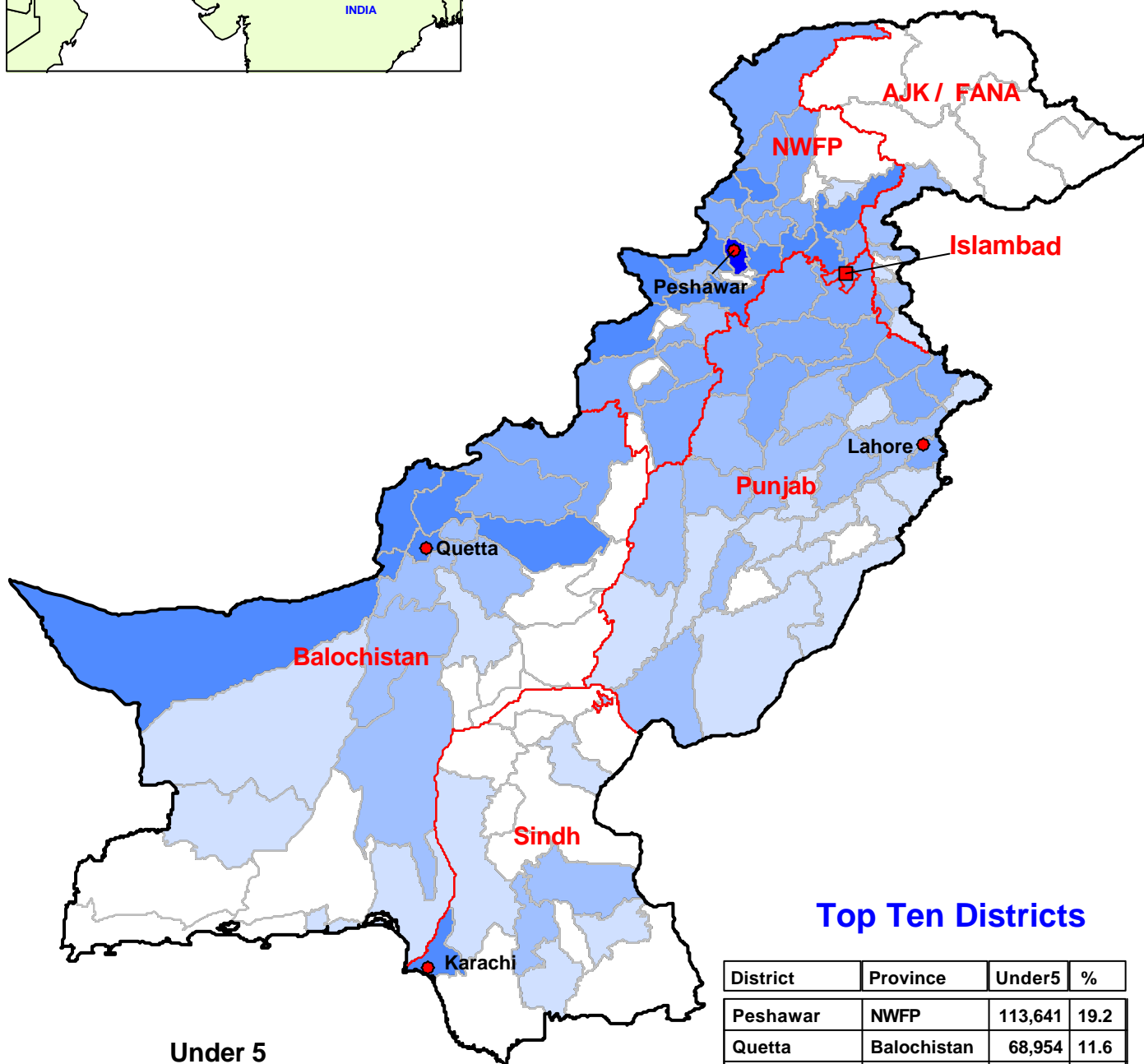

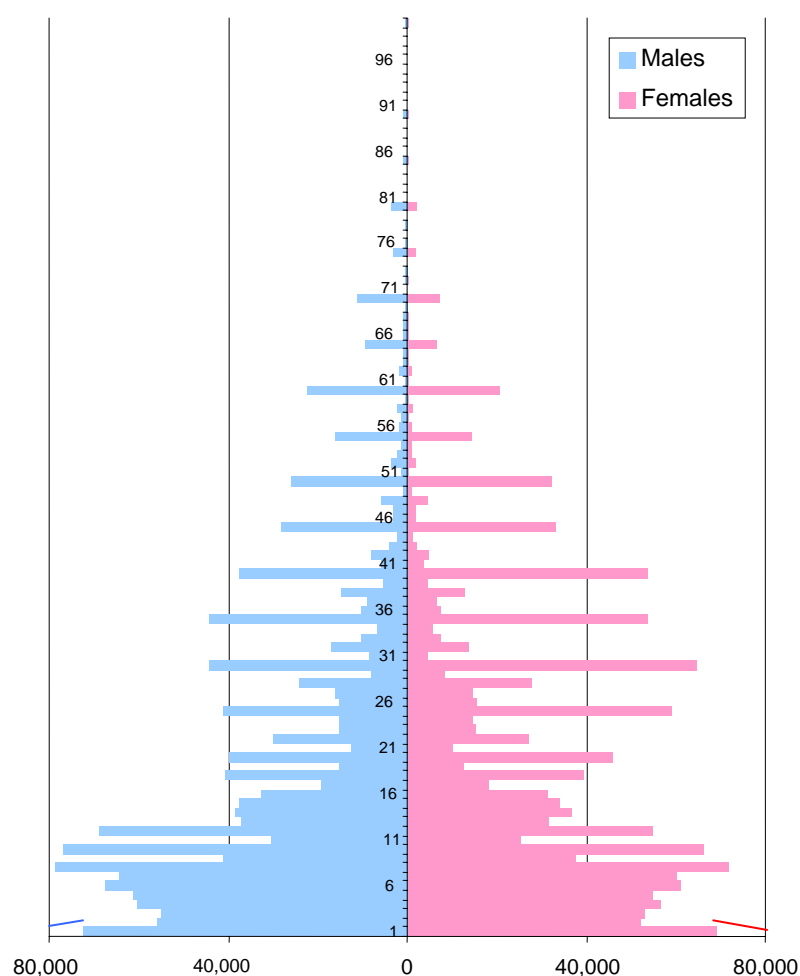

5. Age Group Estimates

Age/gender ratios based on 2004 repatriation data for 383,598 individuals were used to extrapolate a detailed year-by-year profile of Afghans in the census.

Based on this extrapolation, it is estimated that over 55% - more than 1.7 million - of the Afghan population in Pakistan is under the age of 18. There are more females than males in the 18-59 age range, a statistic that may require verification; generally there are fewer females than males in almost every age group for Afghans.

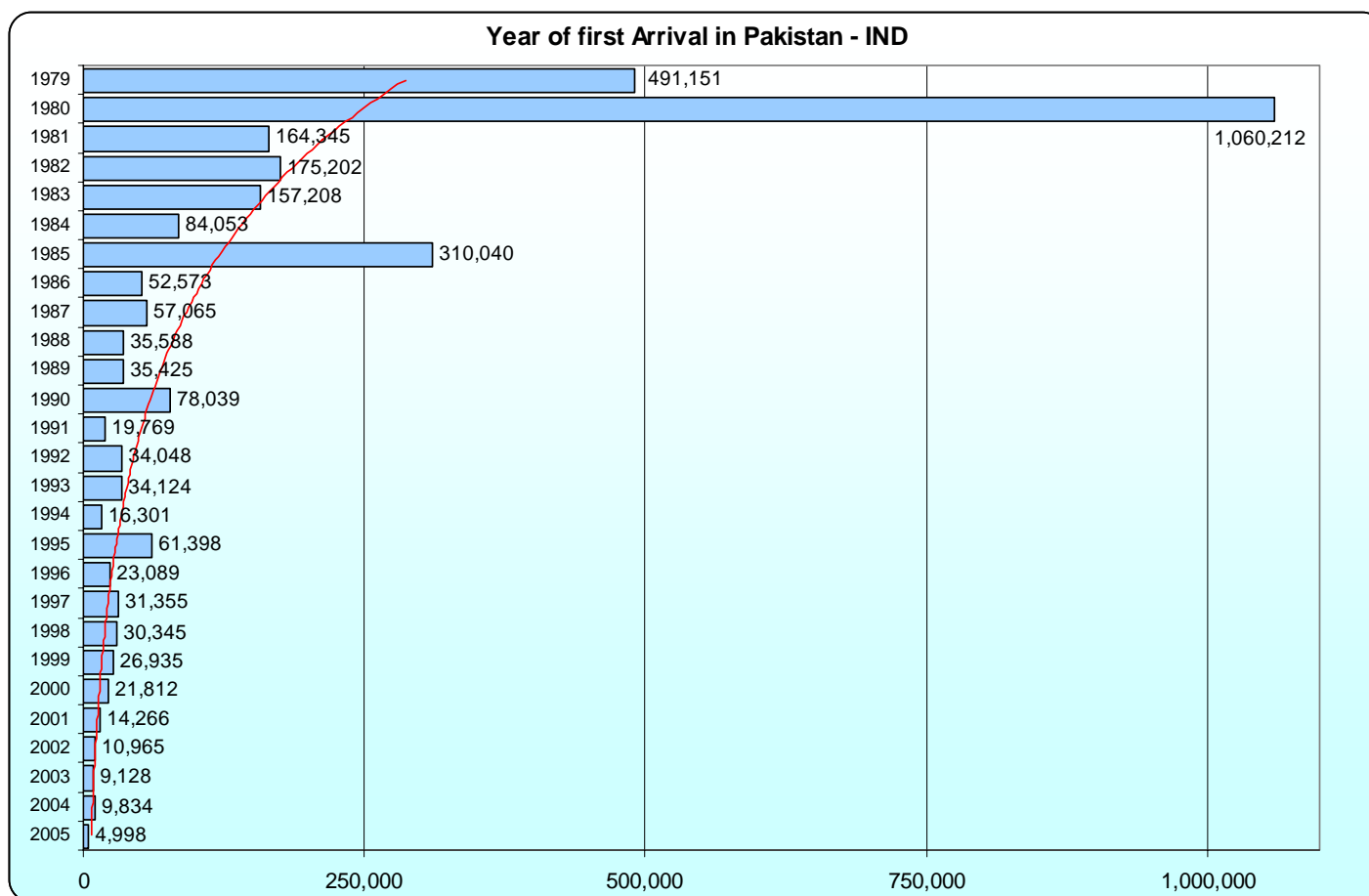

6. Year of First Arrival in Pakistan

The largest number of Afghans – 35% - have been in Pakistan since 1980, when the Soviet invasion triggered mass movement over the border. Another bulk appears in 1985, when the war was very intense and the Afghan countryside was becoming depopulated. A third influx occurred in 1990, when the Soviet withdrawal from Afghanistan was followed by a stepped-up mujahadeen drive to oust the government they left behind. The number of minorities to arrive rose over time, especially in the late 1990s when the Pashtun-dominated Taliban were persecuting other ethnic groups.

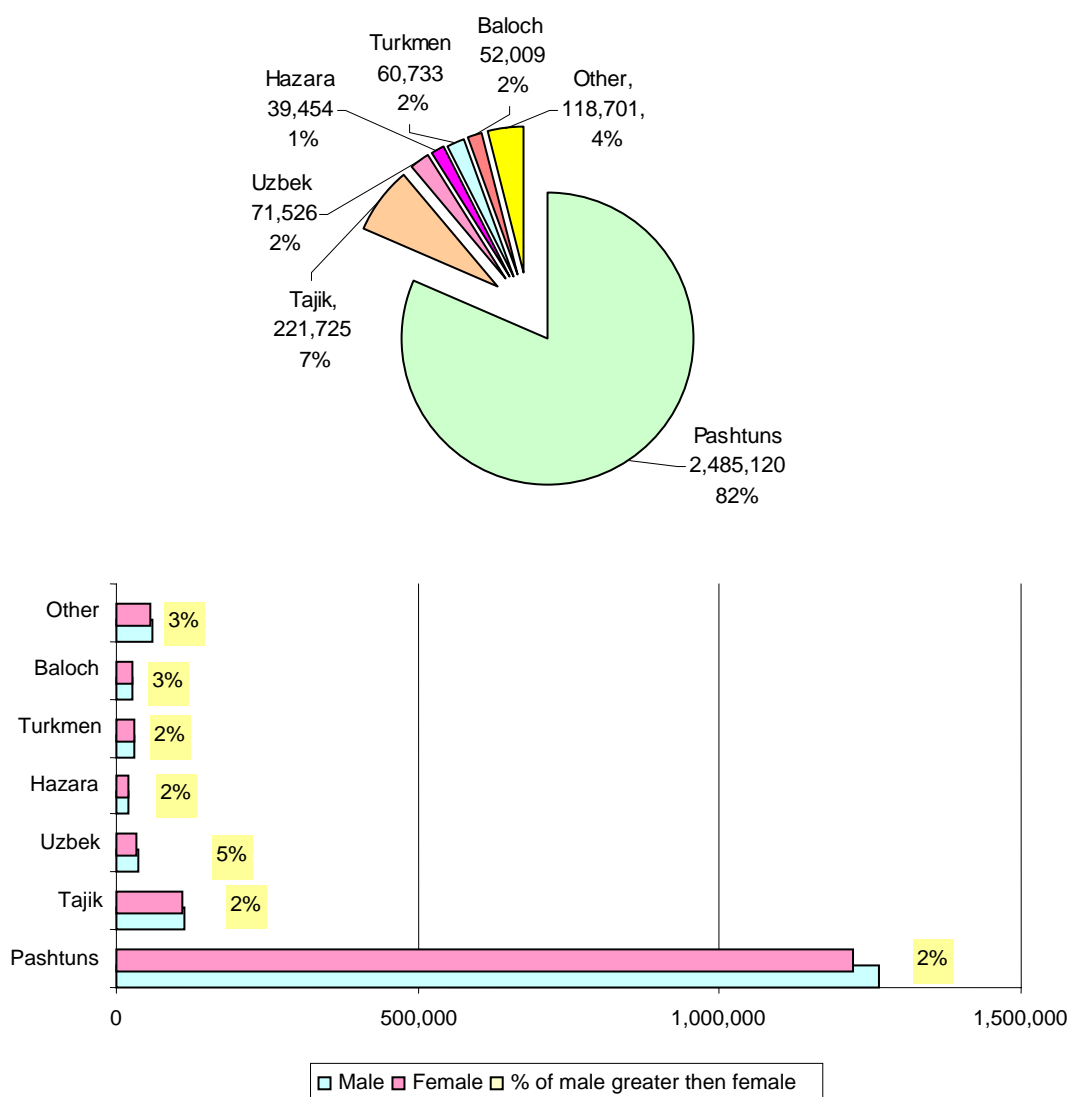

7. Ethnicity

Pashtuns form the overwhelming majority of Afghans in all areas of Pakistan, with 81.5 percent of the total. After that come Tajiks at seven percent, Uzbeks, Turkmen and Baloch at two percent each and one percent Hazara. The percentage of Pashtun might have increased following the overthrow of the Taliban government in Kabul.

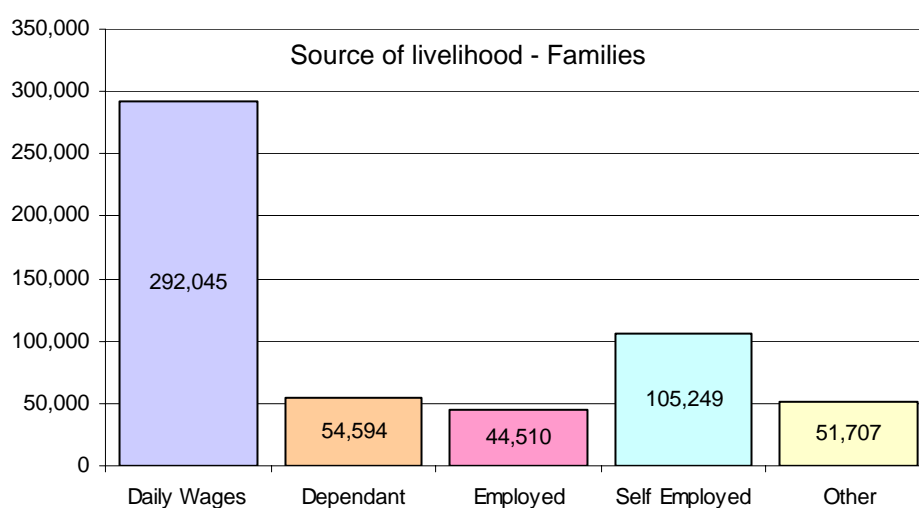
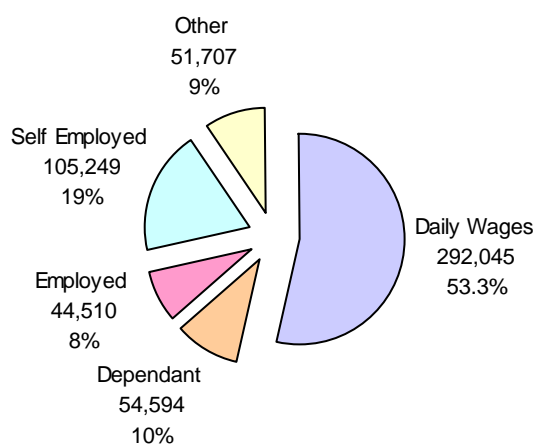

8. Livelihood

Source of livelihood, gathered from the head households, shows the overwhelming majority of households - 53 percent - report living on daily wages. This may even understate the situation, because some of the 19 percent households who reported being self-employed may include Afghans living off of casual labour. Only eight percent reported to be employed. However, ten percent were dependent on income earned outside their family units.

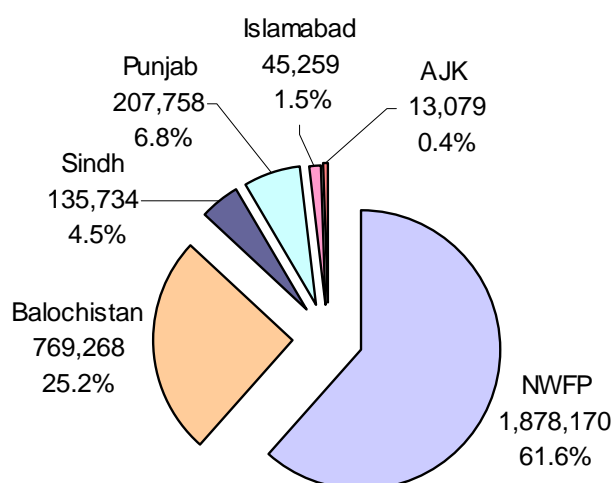
9. Province of Residence in Pakistan

Afghans in Pakistan are concentrated near their country of origin, with nearly 87 percent residing in the two Pakistani provinces bordering Afghanistan; North West Frontier Province (NWFP) and Balochistan. Because the population of Pakistan is concentrated in the provinces of Punjab and Sindh, the Afghan population has a disproportionate impact in the border provinces. If population ratios in Pakistan provinces have not changed since the 1998 national census, Afghans in Punjab would constitute a mere 0.24 percent of the Pakistani population, but in Balochistan would be equivalent to 10 percent of the Pakistanis. In NWFP, Afghans would equal 7.6 percent of the Pakistani population. In particular districts, Afghans would form an even higher portion of the total population. This uneven distribution makes their presence, and both negative and positive effects, much more visible to the Pakistani population in particular areas.

The census also shows the presence of larger families among Afghans in Balochistan, with each family averaging 6.7 people. In contrast, NWFP, host to most of the Afghans, shows an average family size of 5.3 people. The overall average of 5.6 people per family is a marked fall from 6.3, which was considered the family size norm for Afghans in Pakistan by studies carried out in the 1980s

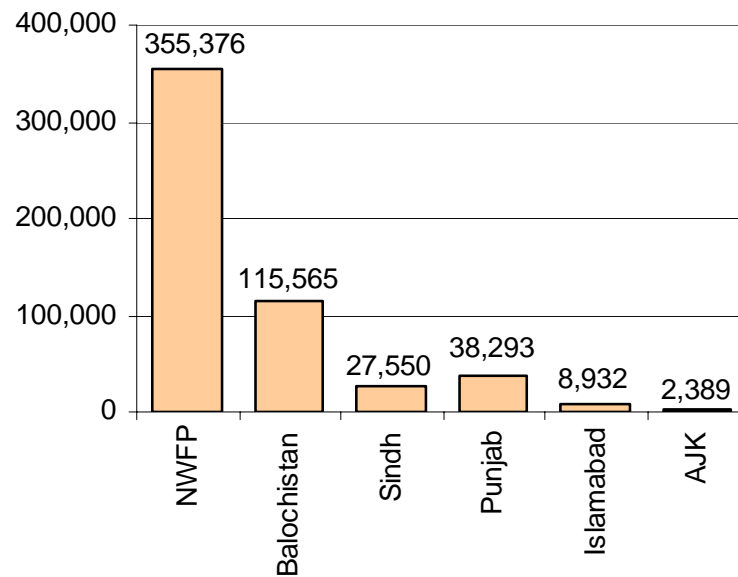
The Afghan presence in Sindh, mainly concentrated in Karachi, has reduced markedly because of repatriation over the past three years. Afghans now form a relatively small part of the urban population that has been estimated at some 14 million people.

Province of residence in Pakistan and origin in Afghanistan



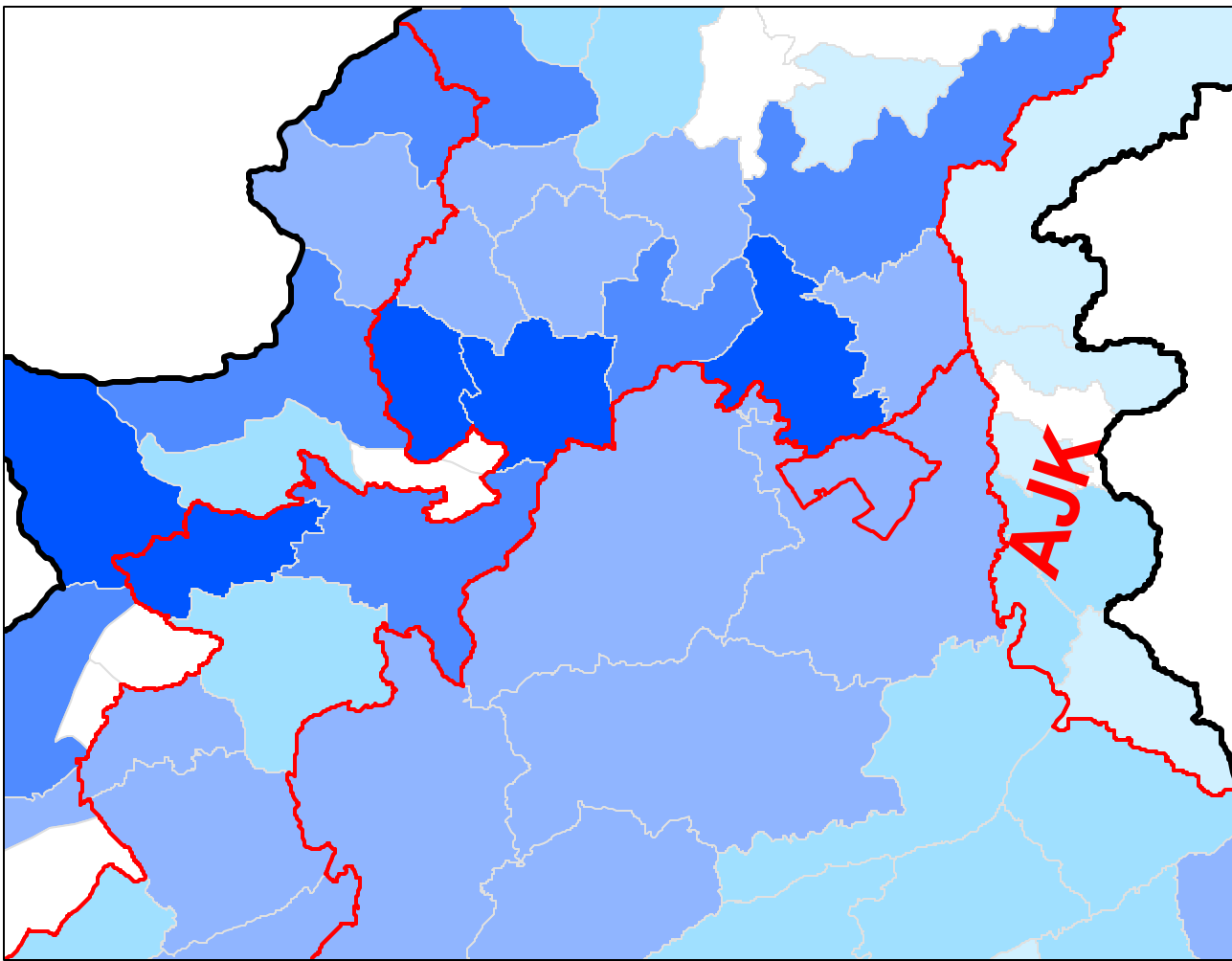
11. Top 5 Districts of Residence in Pakistan

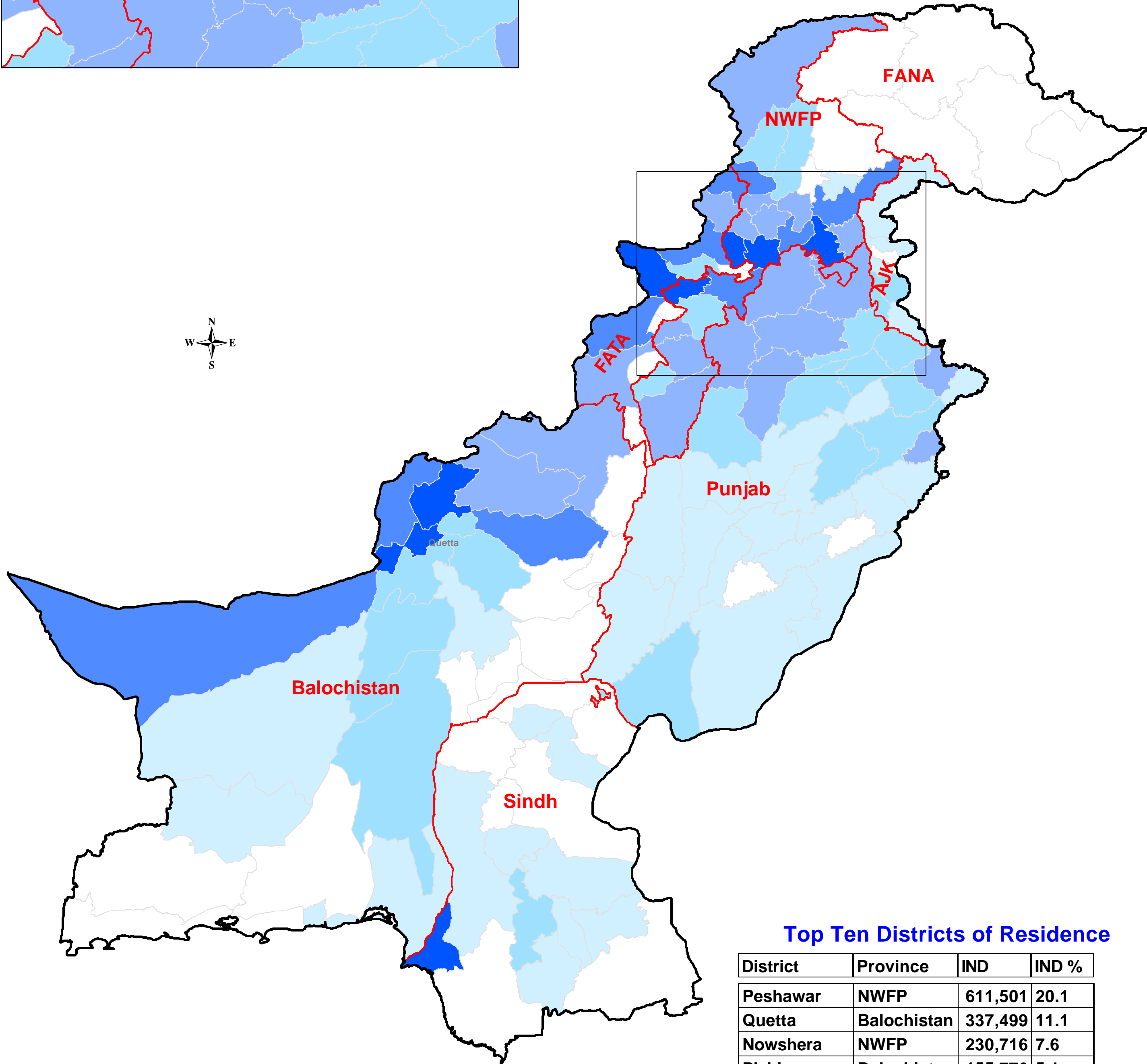
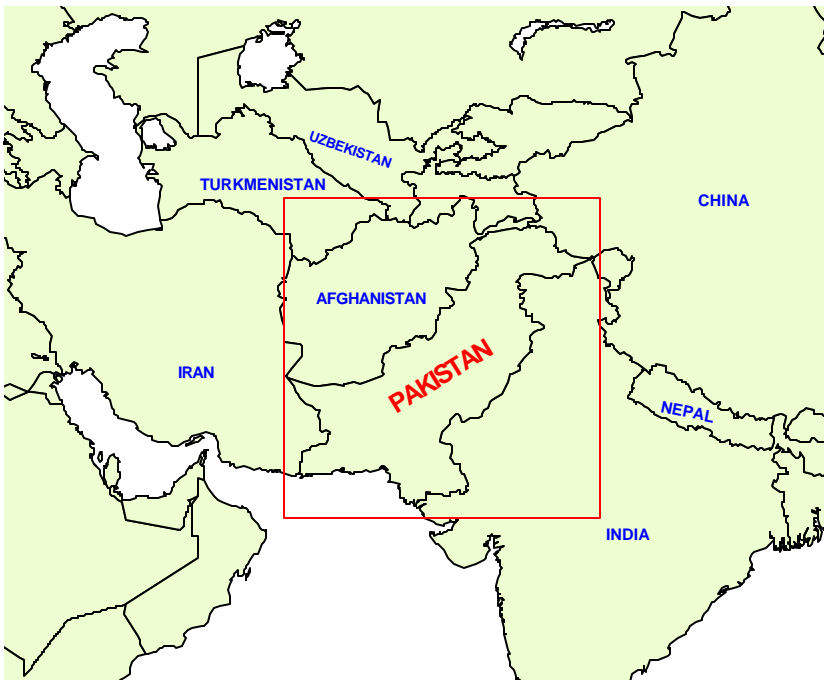
Census of Afghans in Pakistan : District of Residence

Top 13 Camps with Populations more than 2% of the total Camp Population

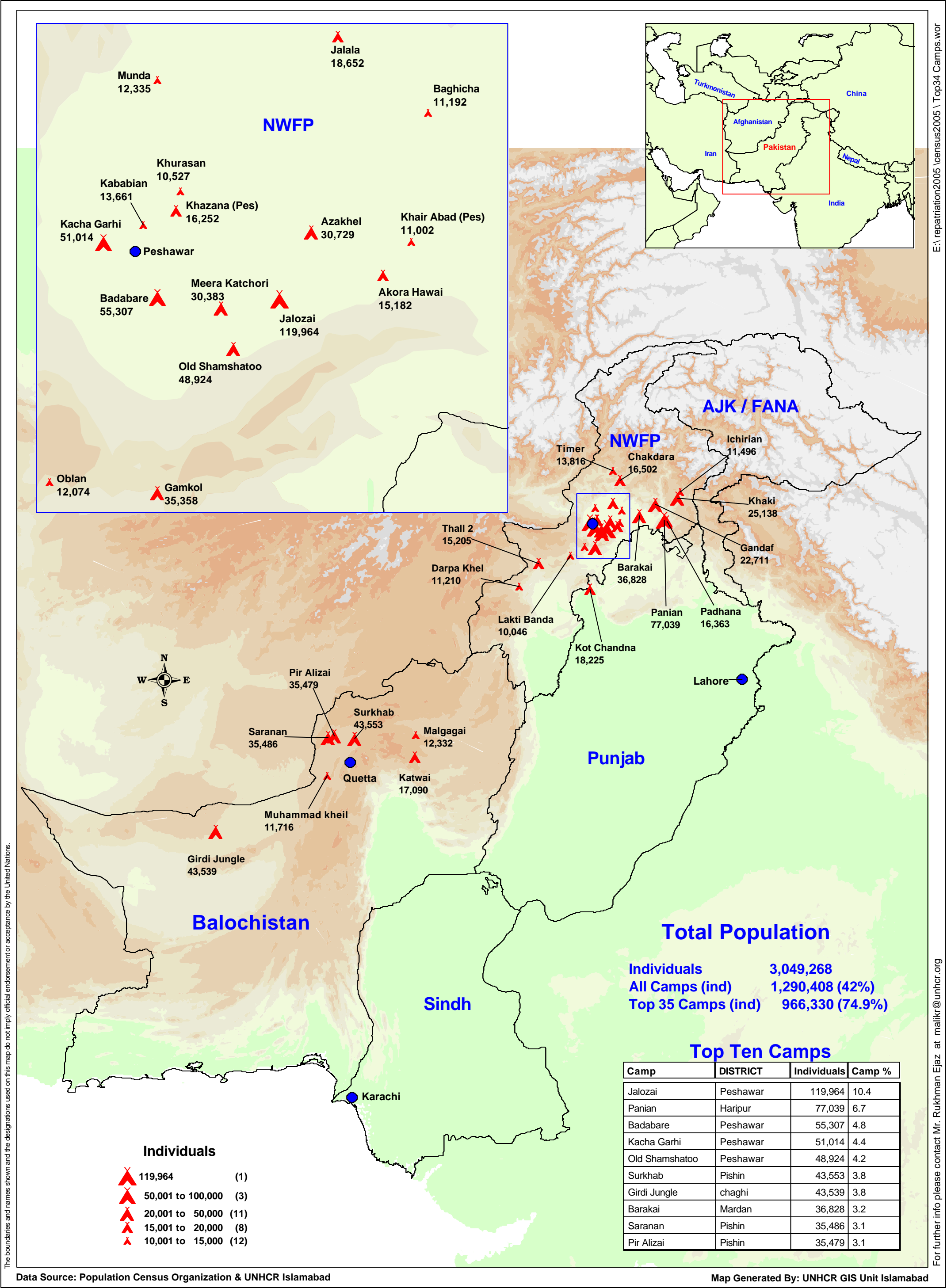


Top 35 Camps with Populations more then 10,000 Individuals



Census of Afghans in Pakistan : Top 35 Camps by Province of Residence

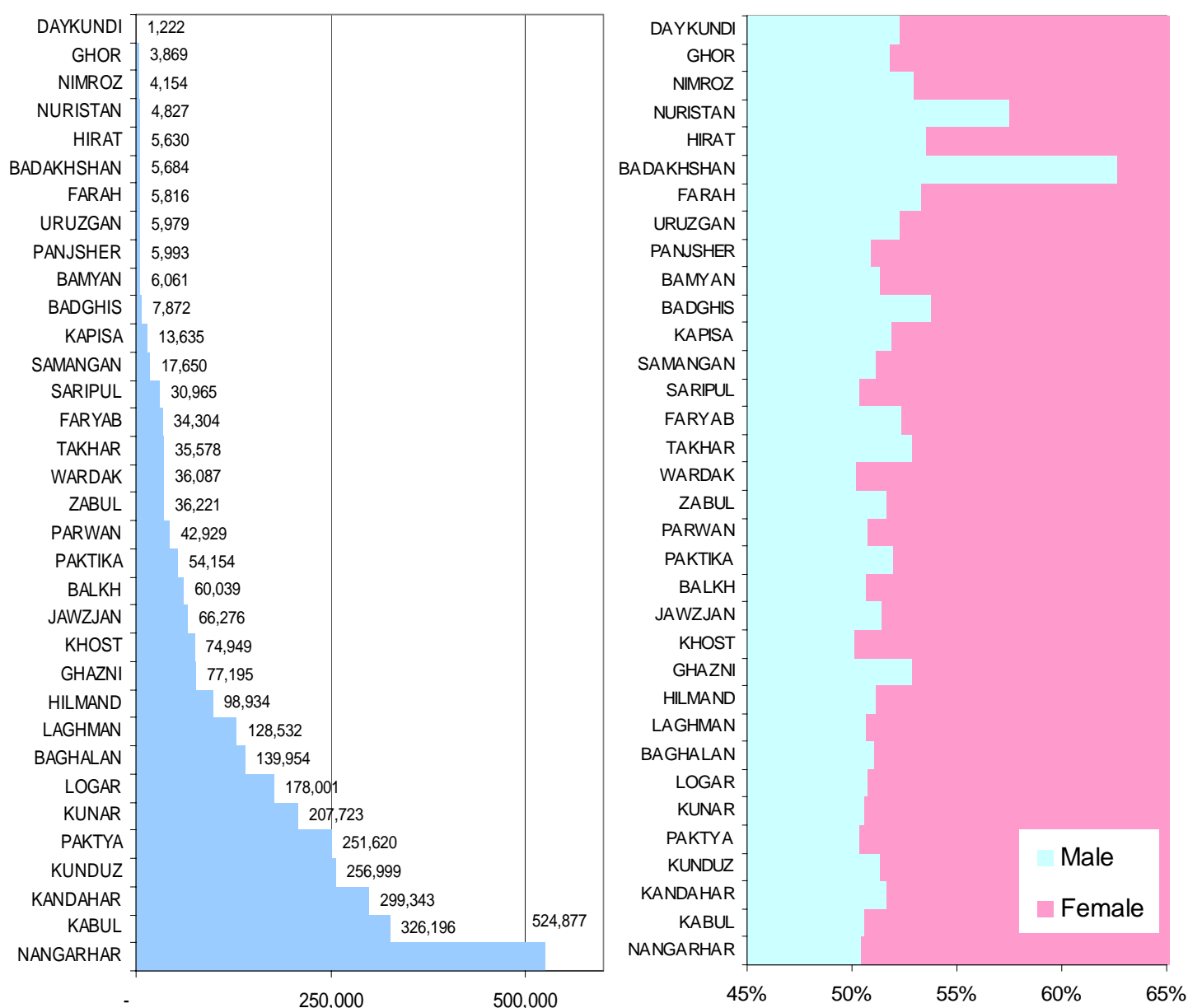

28. Province of Origin in Afghanistan

Most Afghans report they originate from provinces near the border with Pakistan, with 41 percent originating from the eastern provinces. Nangarhar, the first province on route from North West Frontier Province (NWFP) to Kabul, is the home of more than 17 percent of all Afghans in Pakistan. Most of these Afghans now live in NWFP. Likewise, the large number of Afghans originating from Kandahar province are concentrated in Balochistan. Border areas have traditionally seen considerable population movements between the two countries, even before the last 25 years of conflict.

But large numbers also originate from the northern provinces of Afghanistan despite heavy repatriation to the area since 2002, spread across all areas of Pakistan. In NWFP there are also substantial numbers from the central provinces of Afghanistan, which includes Kabul. Although there is already concern at the high numbers of people who have returned to the capital, more than 326,000 Afghans since 2002 - nearly 11 percent of all in Pakistan at the time of the census originate from Kabul province. The return of these people would provide a further challenge to authorities striving to provide services to the crowded capital.

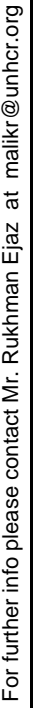

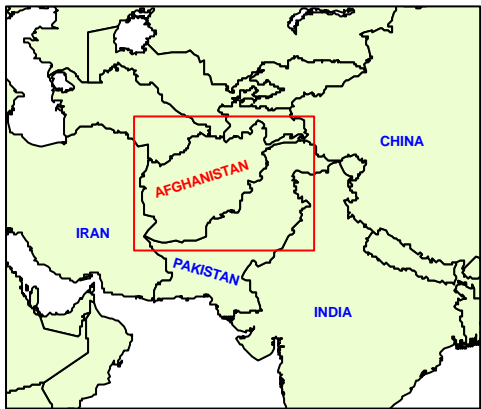

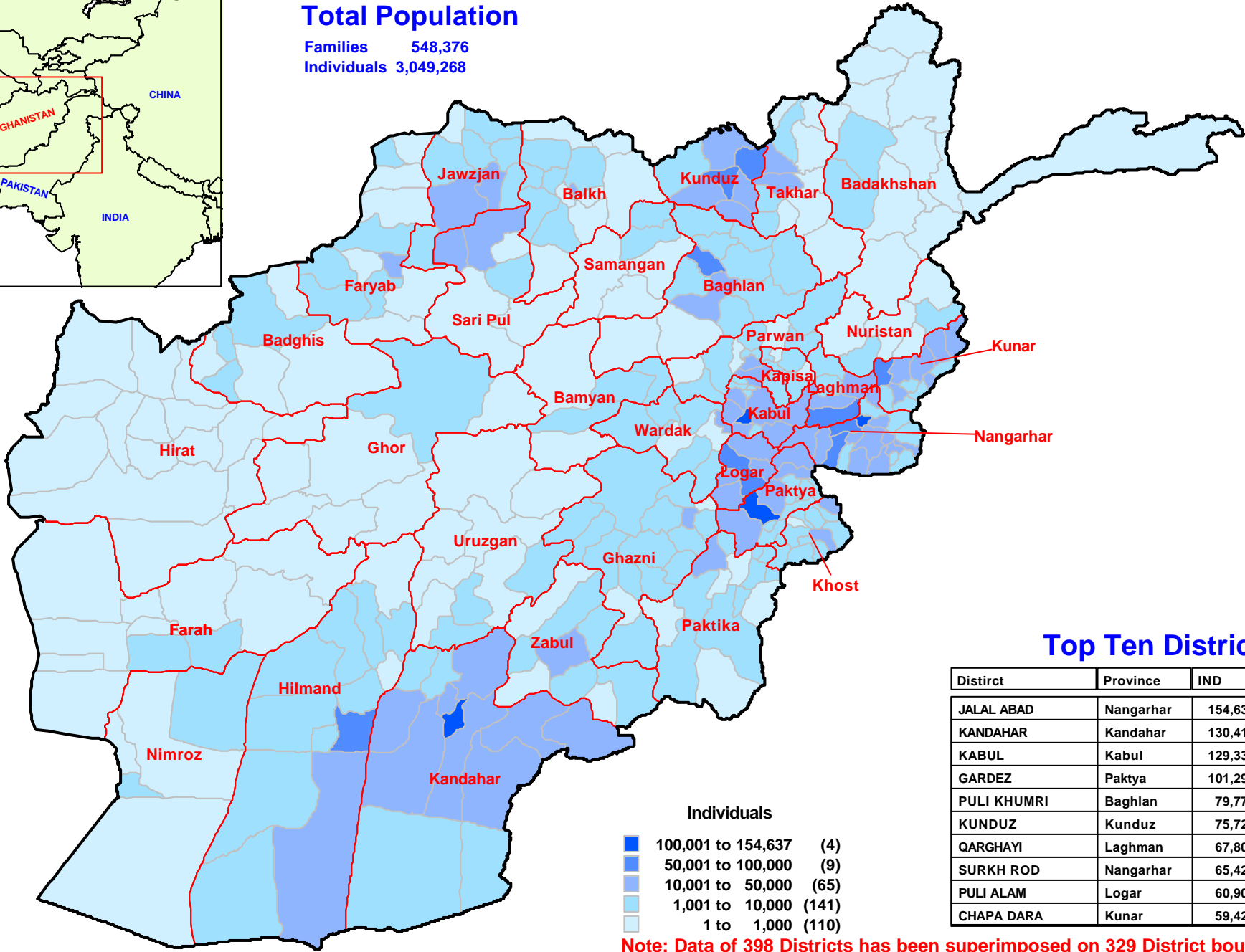
Census of Afghans in Pakistan : District of Origin

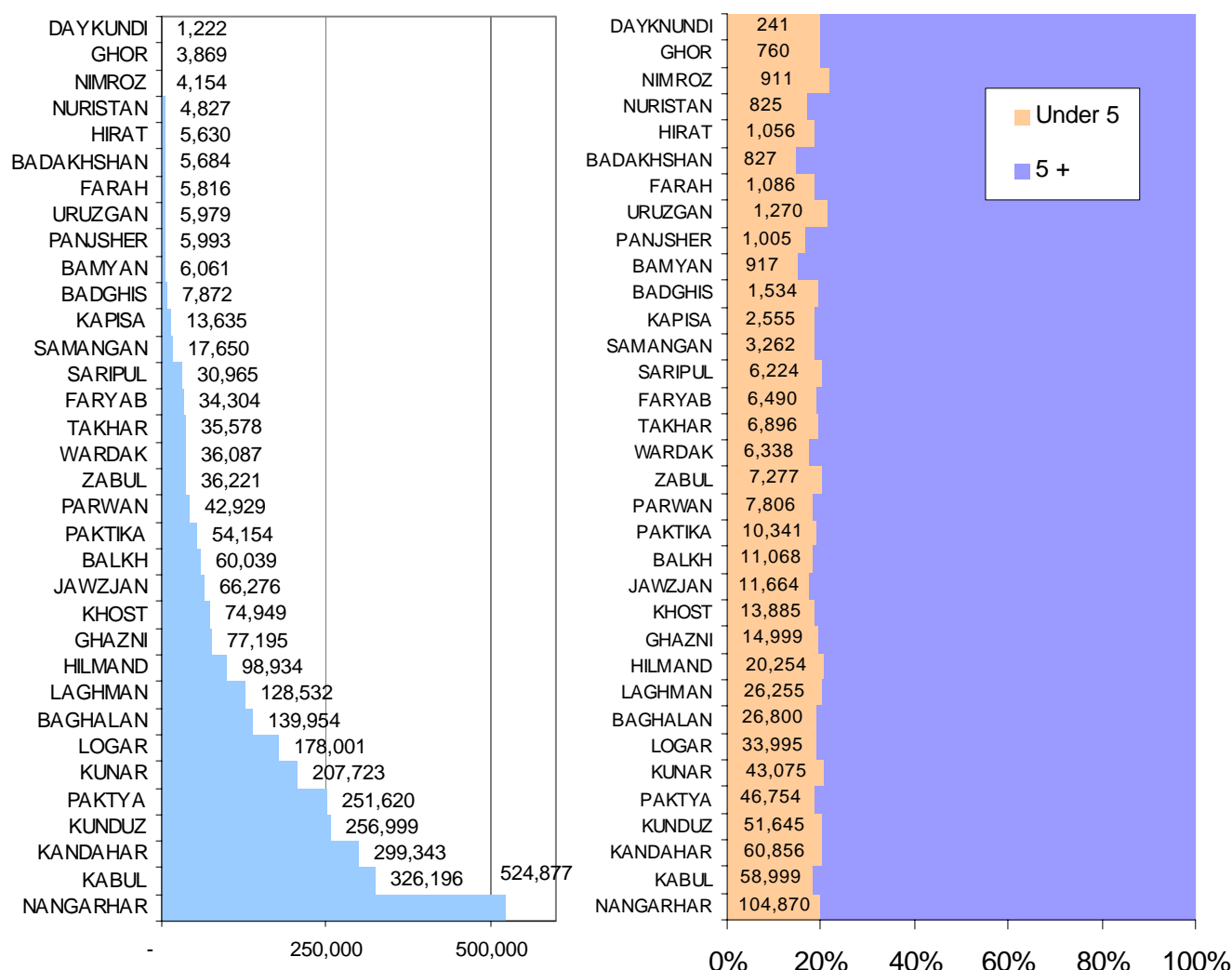

31. Age by Province of Origin in Afghanistan

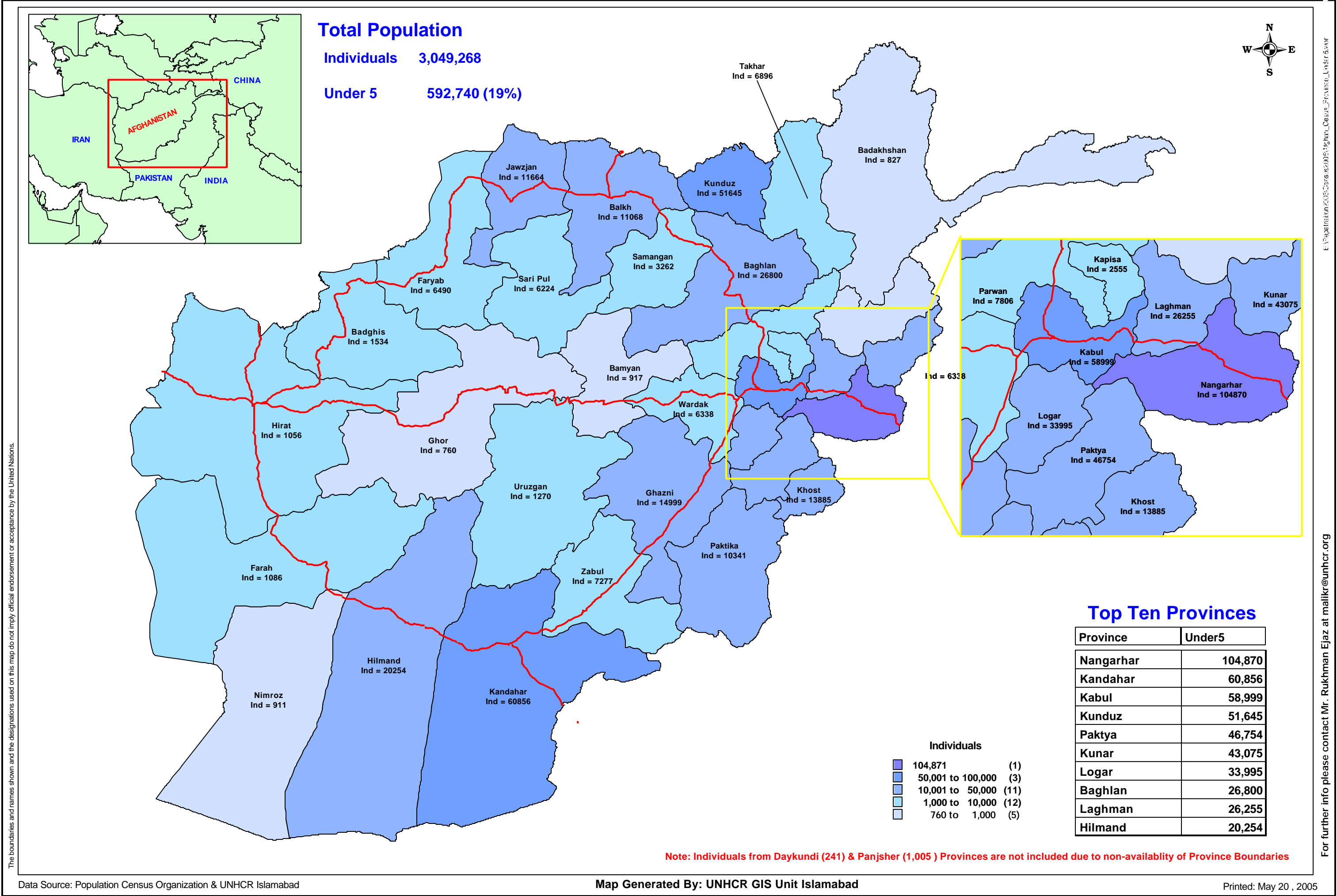


In numeric terms, the majority of Afghans in Pakistan under the age of 5 are from Nangarhar (104,870 under 5s), Kandahar (60,856), Kabul (58,999) and Kunduz (51,645). The smallest groups of under 5s originate from Daykundi (241), Ghor (760) and Nuristan (825). The average number under 5s per province of origin in Afghanistan is 17,434.

In percentage terms, the majority of Afghans in Pakistan under the age of 5 originate from Nimroz (22%, 911 under 5s), Uruzgan (21%, 1,270), Kunar (21%, 43,075) and Hilmand (20%, 20,254). The minority of Afghans in Pakistan under the age of 5 are from Badakshan (15%, 827), Bamyan (15%, 917) and Panjshir (17%, 1,005). The average percentage of under 5s is 19.4%.

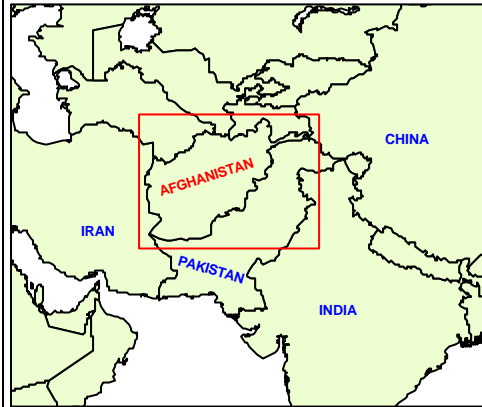
Census of Afghans in Pakistan : Province of Origin and Childern Under Age Five

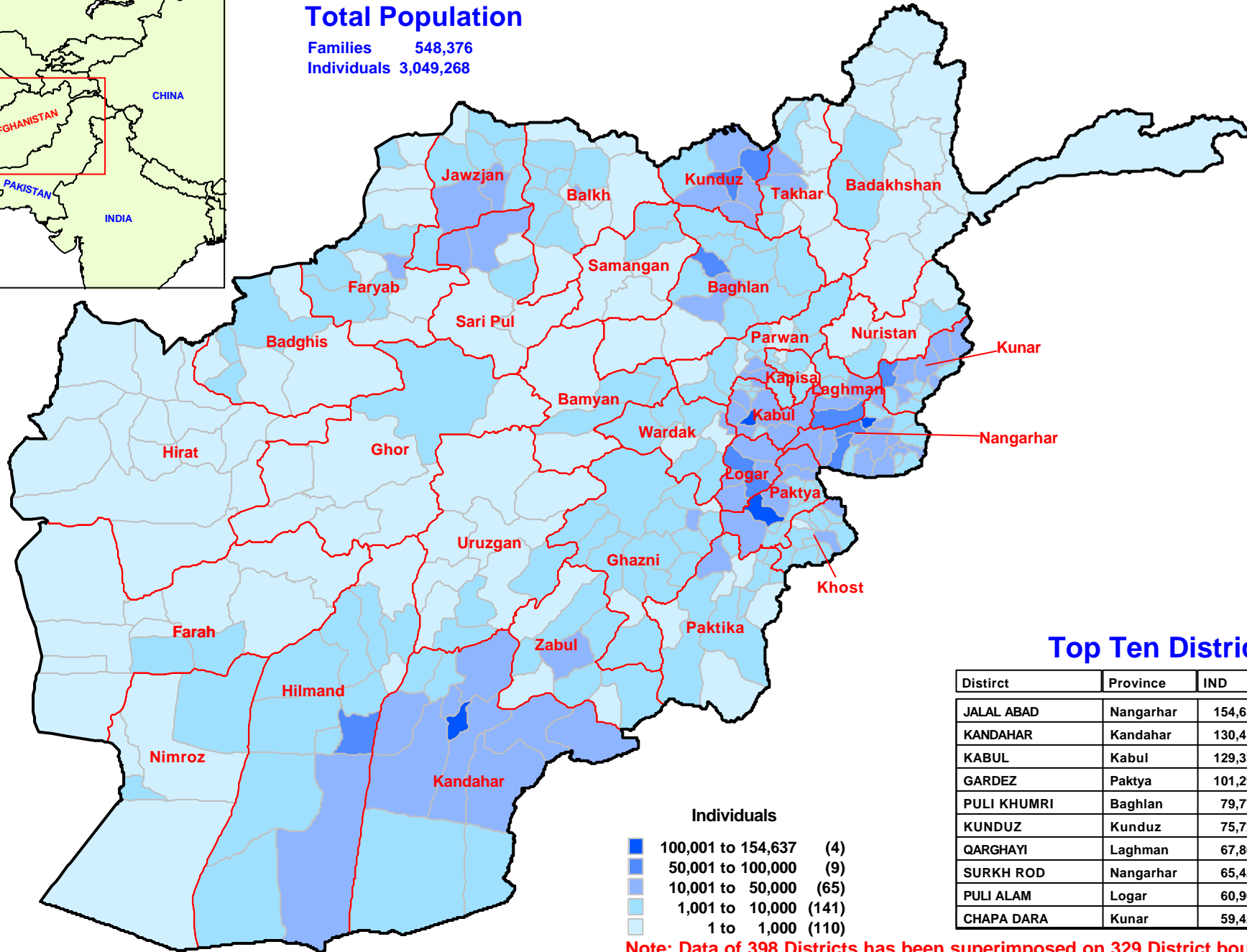
Census of Afghans in Pakistan : District of Origin

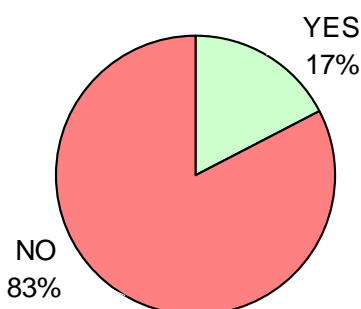

32. Intending to Return to Afghanistan by end of 2005

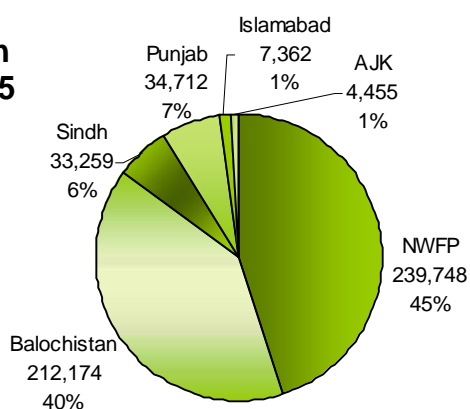
About 17 percent of Afghans, 531,710 individuals, intend to return to Afghanistan this year. Although there may be a tendency among Afghans to think what government census takers want to hear, it is not far in excess of the 400,000 individuals that UNHCR forecasts will repatriate in 2005. However, there are marked regional variations, with only 13 percent of Afghans in NWFP indicating they will repatriate this year while 28 percent in Balochistan intend to go home.

Even if the number reporting intention to return materializes, more than 2.5 million Afghans are likely to be in Pakistan when the Tripartite Agreement ends in March 2006. Discussions already underway between UNHCR and the Government of Pakistan are focused on finding ways to manage this population until they repatriate to Afghanistan.

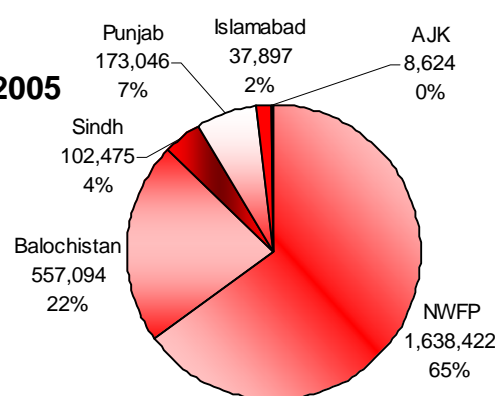

From a national perspective, 45% of the 531,710 Afghans who intend to return to Afghanistan by the end of 2005 are in NWFP. 40% are in Balochistan, 6% in Sindh, 7% in Punjab and 1% each in Islamabad and AJK.

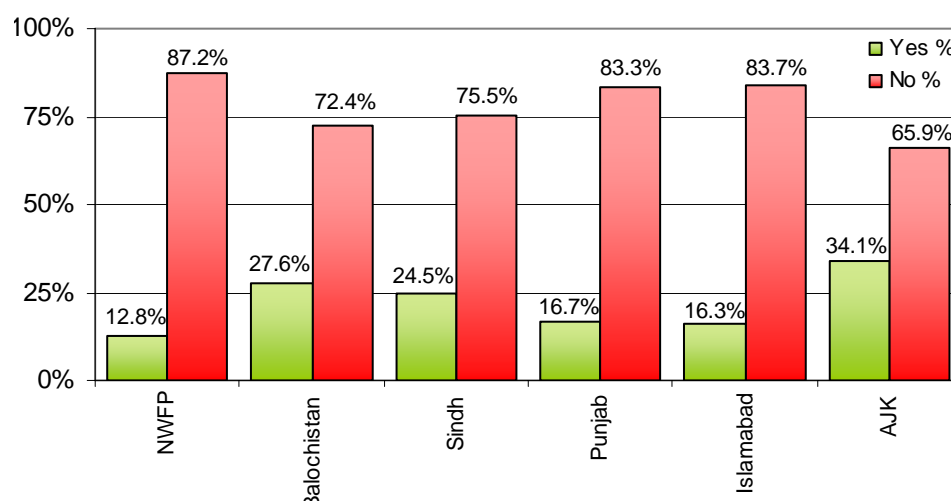
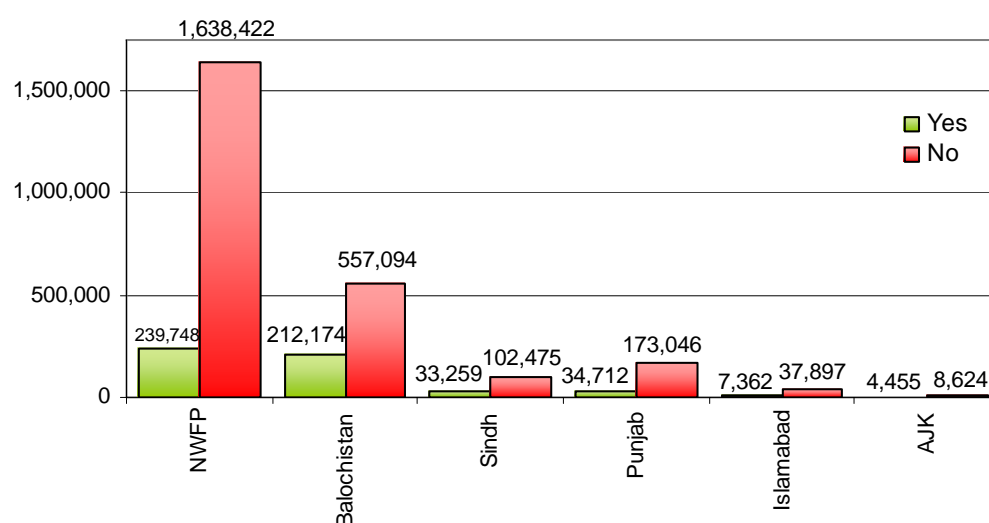
Of the 2,517,558 Afghans who do not intend to return to Afghanistan by the end of 2005, 65% are in NWFP, 22% are in Balochistan, 4% in Sindh, 7% in Punjab, 2% in Islamabad and a negligible amount in AJK.

33. Intending to Return to Afghanistan by end 2005 and Province of Residence in Pakistan

Around 17% of all Afghans residing in Pakistan intend to return to Afghanistan by the end of 2005. Province level responses from AJK (34%), Balochistan (27.6%) and Sindh (24.5%) show a significantly higher return potential than average - when responses are compared by percentage. Punjab and Islamabad reflect the average, whereas NWFP returns are likely to be lower by percentage.

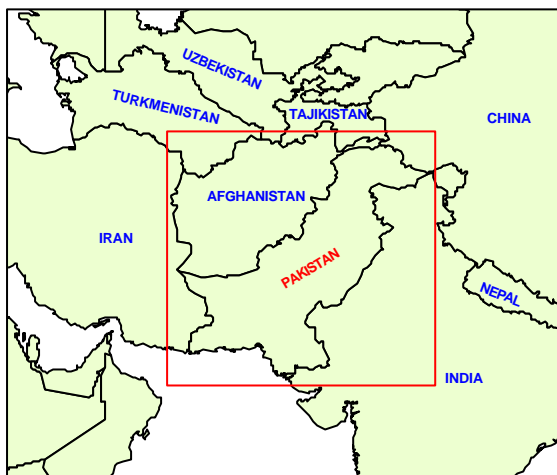
Intention to return by numbers (not percentages), results are dominated by NWFP. We can anticipate that 45% (239, 748) of returns will originate from NWFP in 2005. 40% of returns are likely to come from Balochistan, with the other 15% of returns deriving from the remaining parts/provinces in Pakistan.

Census of Afghans in Pakistan: Province of Origin and Intending to Return by end 2005

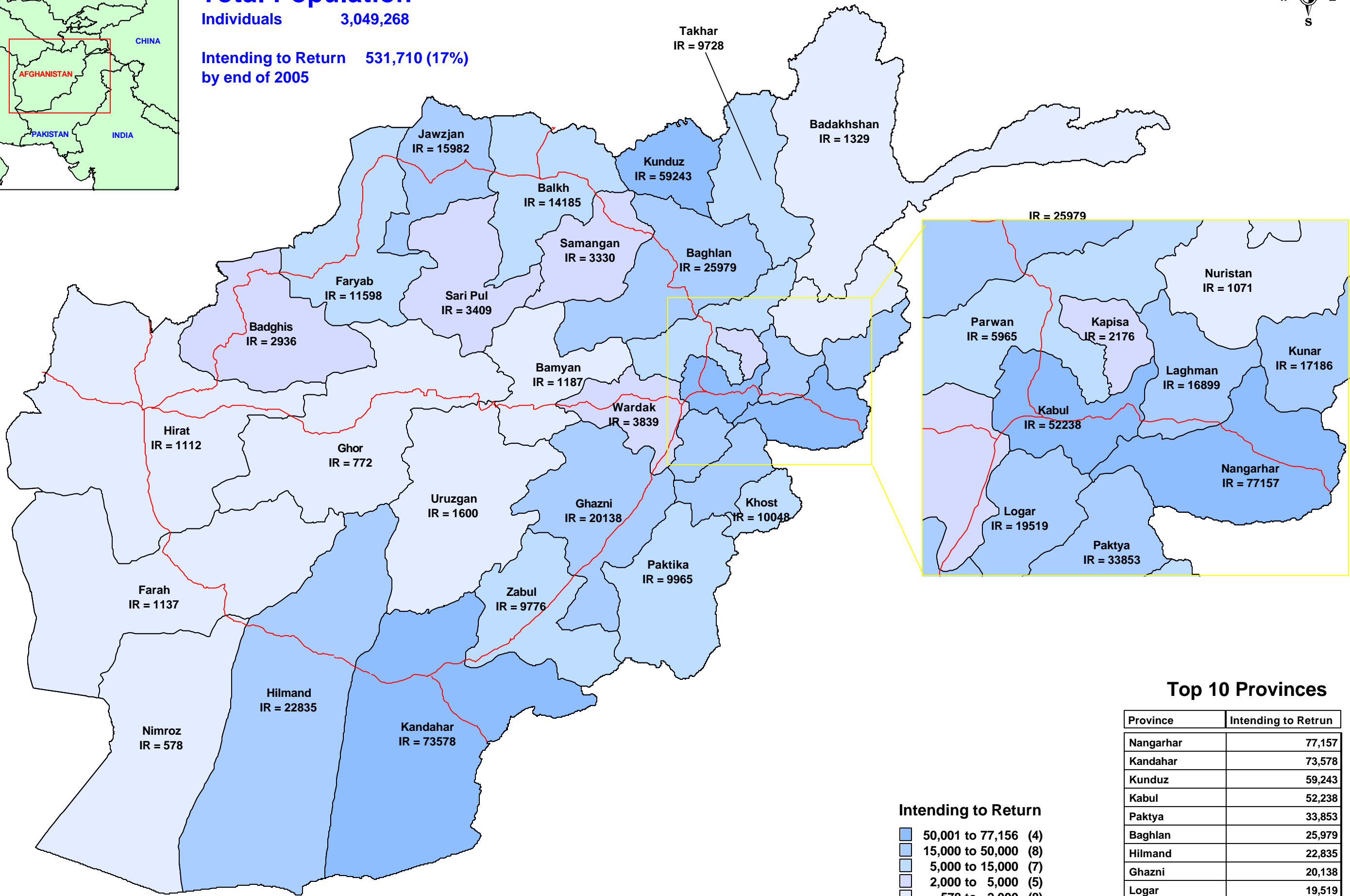

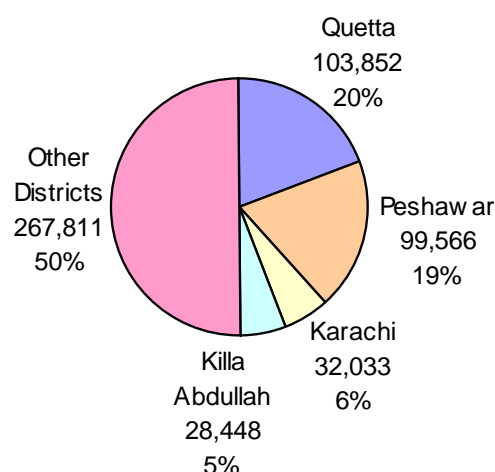

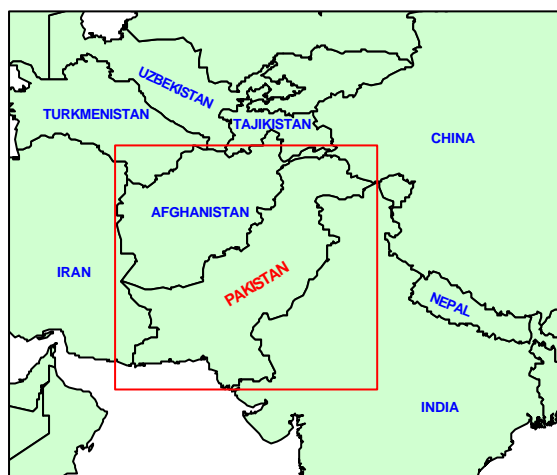

Census of Afghans in Pakistan : District of Residence - Intending to Return by end 2005

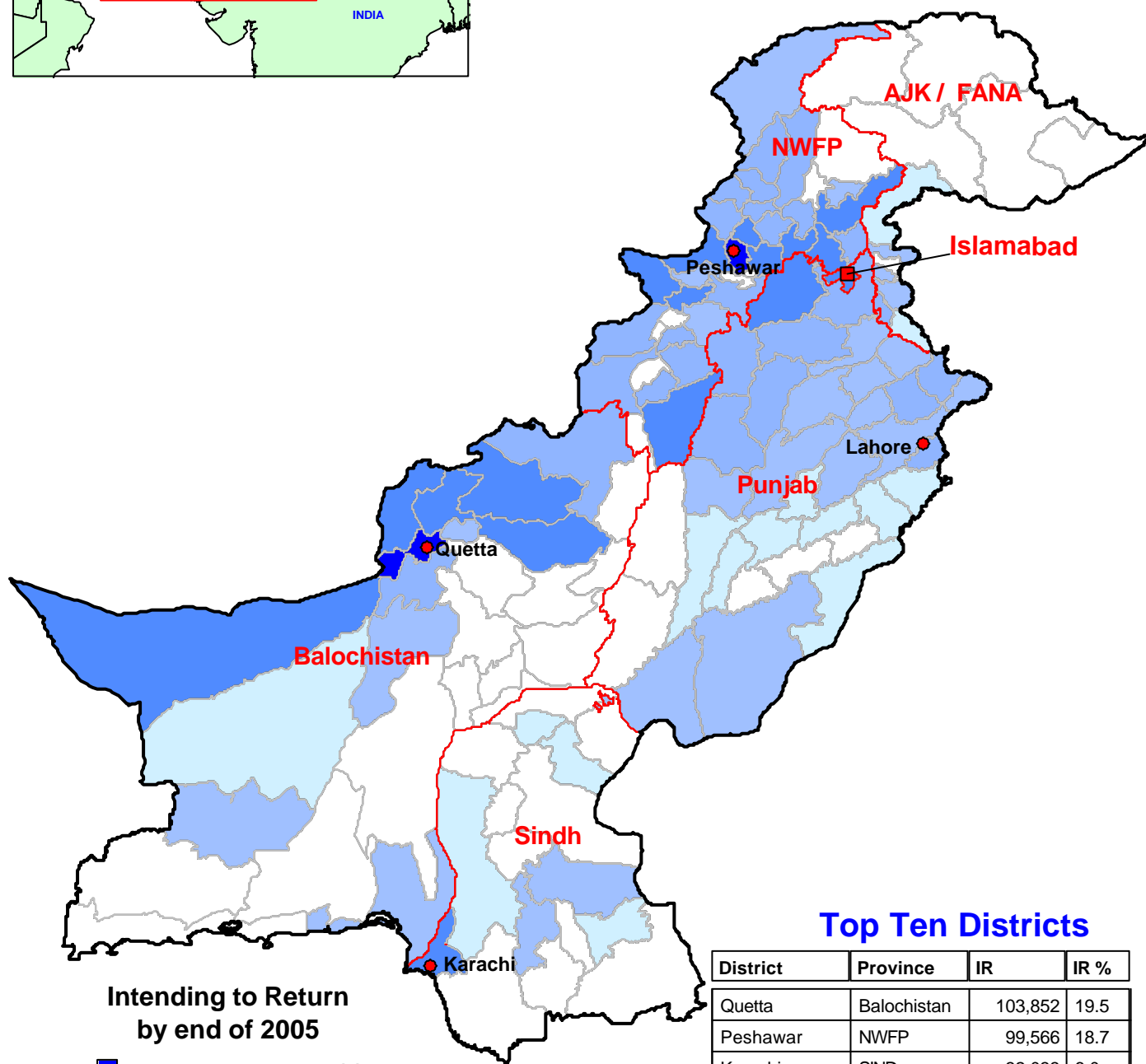

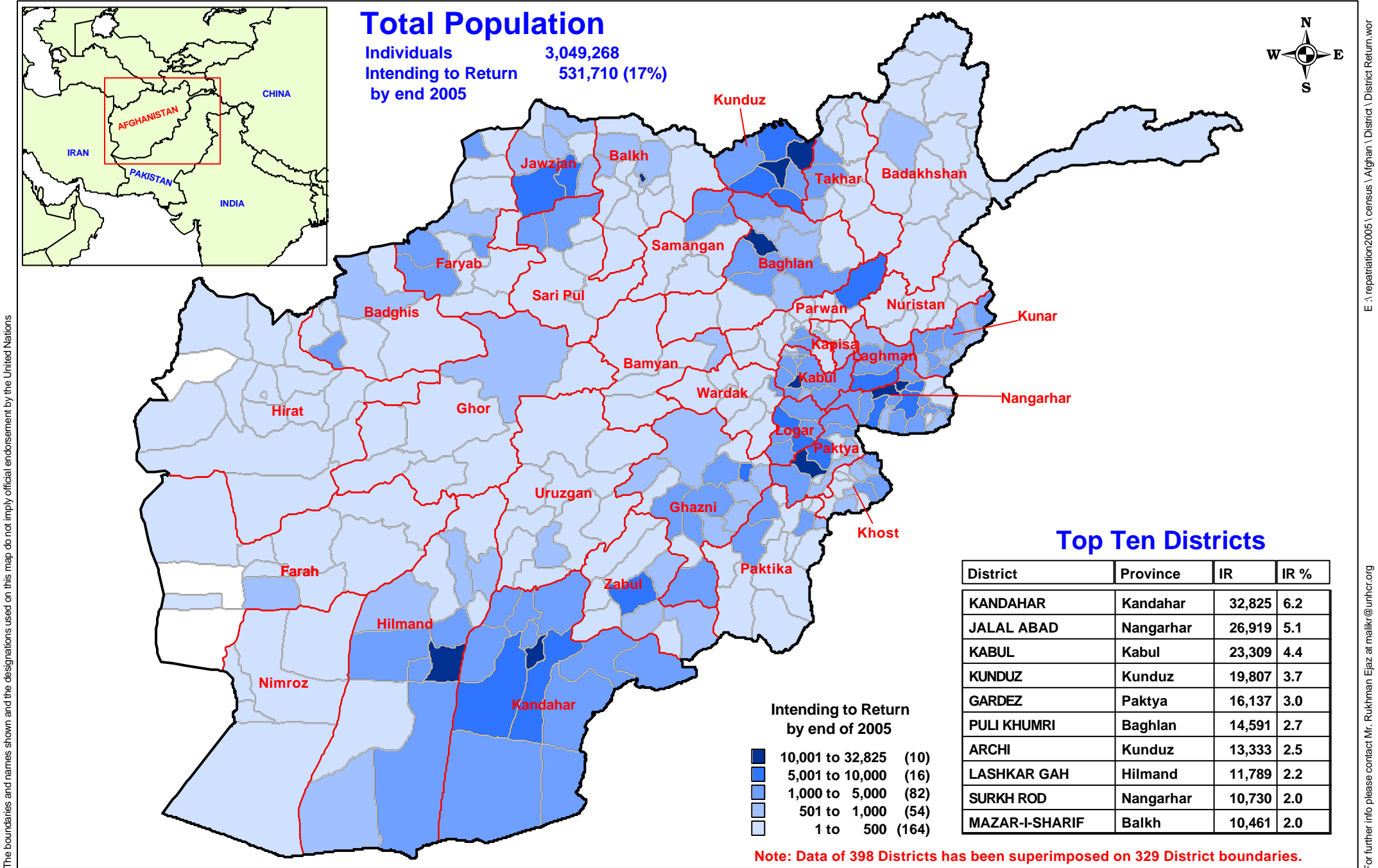

Reasons given for not repatriating indicate positive news. In the early years of the voluntary repatriation programme, insecurity was cited as a major reason for not returning home. Now only 18 percent cite insecurity, rising to 21 percent if personal enmity is added to the total. Security and political stability have clearly improved.

Instead, the reasons given for staying in Pakistan underline the need for economic development in Afghanistan. Lack of shelter in Afghanistan is cited by 57% of all those intending to remain in Pakistan beyond this year. A further 18% say the lack of livelihood in Afghanistan will keep them in Pakistan. Those who have been in Pakistan longest are most likely to have shelter and employment, which they might not have back in Afghanistan.



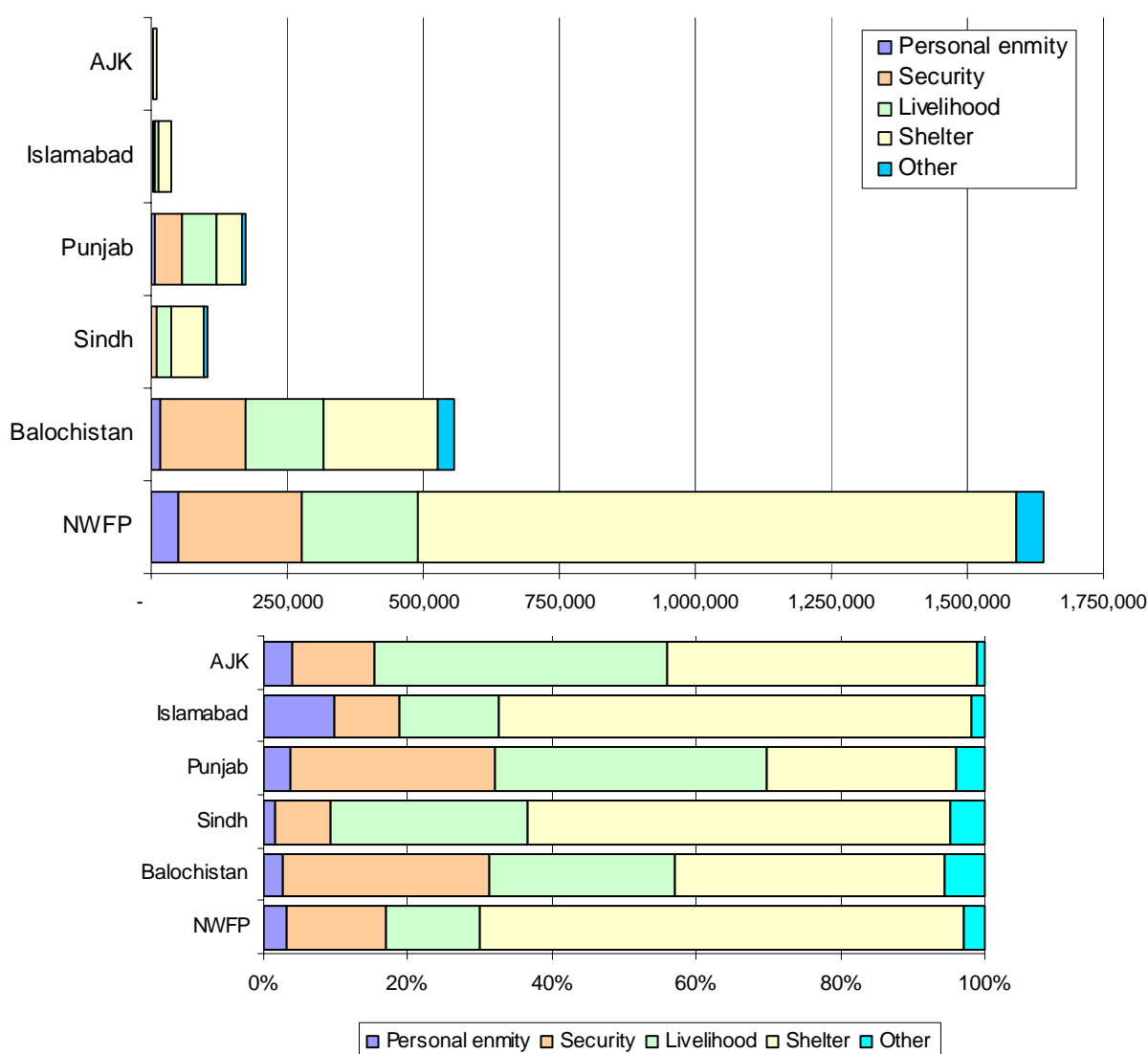
Reason for not intending to return by end 2005 - Individuals

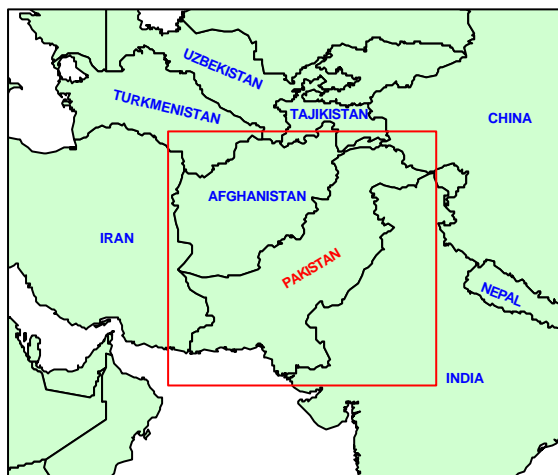

There is considerable variation of reason for not intending to return to Afghanistan in different parts of Pakistan. In Punjab, Afghans cite lack of livelihood in Afghanistan as the main impediment to return, followed by concerns about security and then shelter. Only 14 percent of Afghans in NWFP cite security concerns blocking their returns, while 28% in Balochistan do. In contrast, 38% in Balochistan say a lack of shelter prevents repatriation, while 67% in NWFP gave it as their reason for staying.

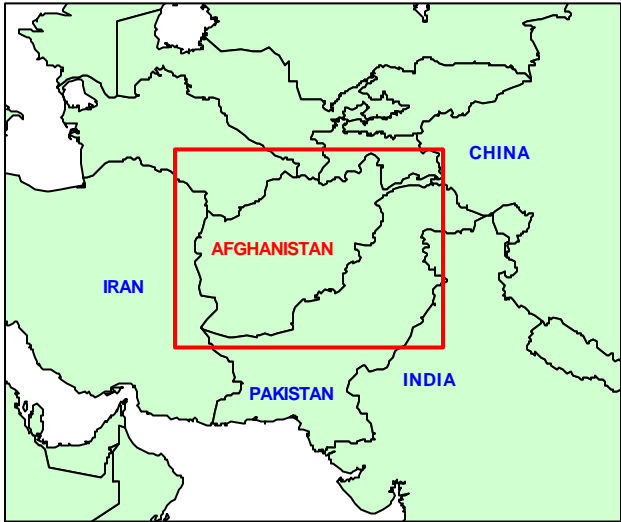


In numbers, the largest number of Afghans not intending to return to Afghanistan by the end of 2005 due to security reasons are from Kandahar (52,290, 11.7%), Nangarhar (44,197, 9.9%), Kunduz (40,230, 9.0%) and Kabul (38,299, 8.6%). Provinces of origin citing livelihood as barriers to return are Kandahar (63,853, 13.9%), Nangarhar (62,528, 13.6%), Kabul (47,165, 13.3%) and Kunduz (40,706, 8.9%). For shelter, high provinces are Nangarhar (314,951, 21.9%), Kabul (171,299, 11.9%), Paktya (146,239, 10.2%) and Kunar (110,155, 7.6%). For personal enmity, Nangarhar (14,368, 18.3%), Kunar (8,592, 10.9%), Kabul (8,303, 10.6%) and Kandahar (6,137, 7.8%) rank the highest provinces of origin. Other reasons are most prevalent in Kandahar (13,551, 14.6%), Nangarhar (11,676, 12.6%), Kabul (8,892, 9.6%) and Kunduz (7,689, 8.3%)

In percentages, security is cited as the major barrier to return in 2005 to Sari Pul (73%), Nimroz (41%), Day Kundi (39%) and Badghis (38%). Livelihood is the main constraint to returning to Farah (38%) Uruzgan (35%), Zabul (33%) and Hirat (31%). People cite shelter as the main barrier for return in Wardak (71%), Nangarhar (70%), Paktya (67%) and Logar (67%). Personal enmity dominates the percentage response from Khost (7%) Nuristan (7%), Badghis (7%) & Farah (7%). Other reasons are barriers for Afghans to return to Badakshan (17%), Nuristan (11%) and Daykundi (8%).

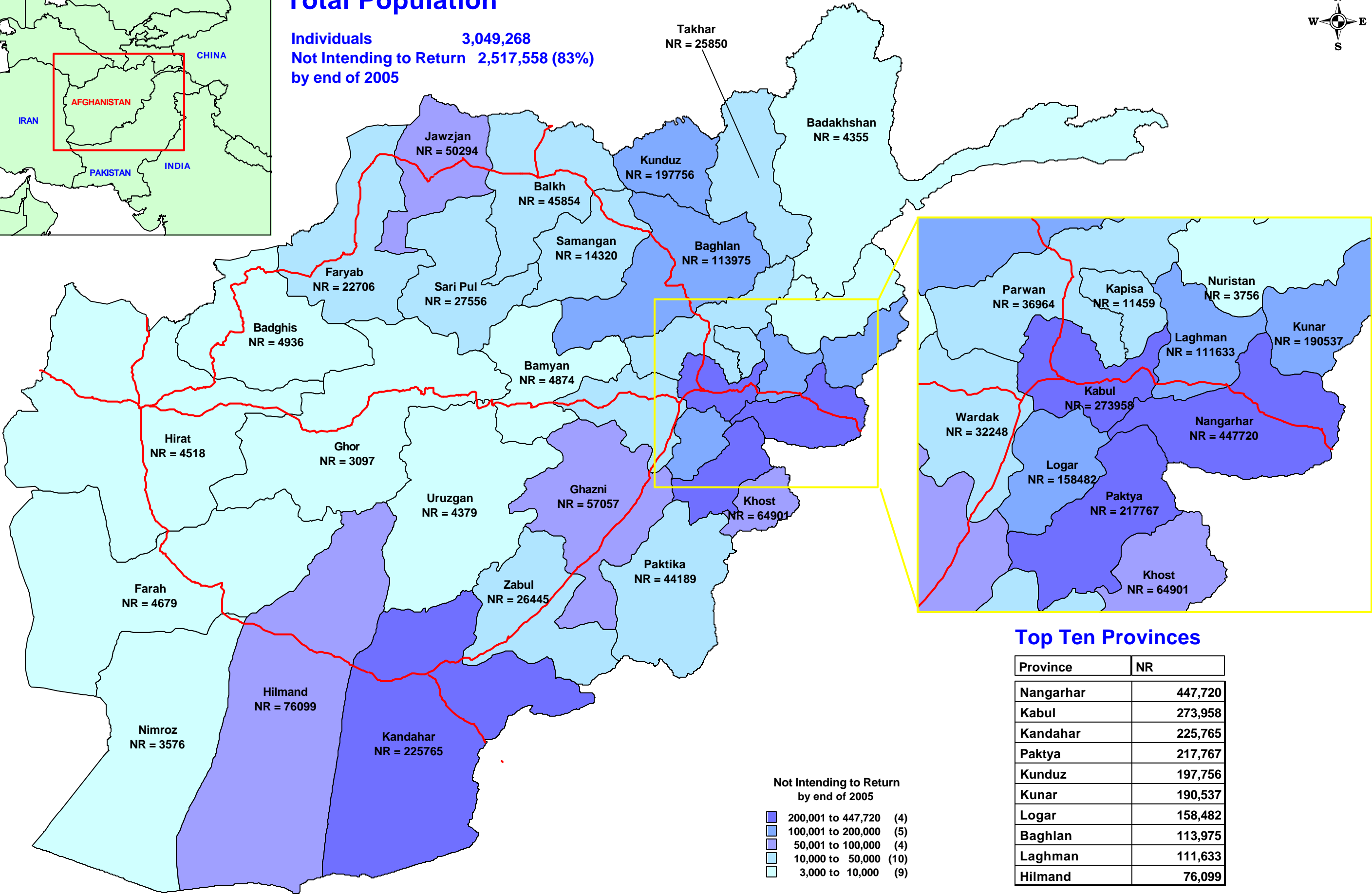

Intending to Return to Afghanistan by end 2005 and Year of First Arrival in Pakistan

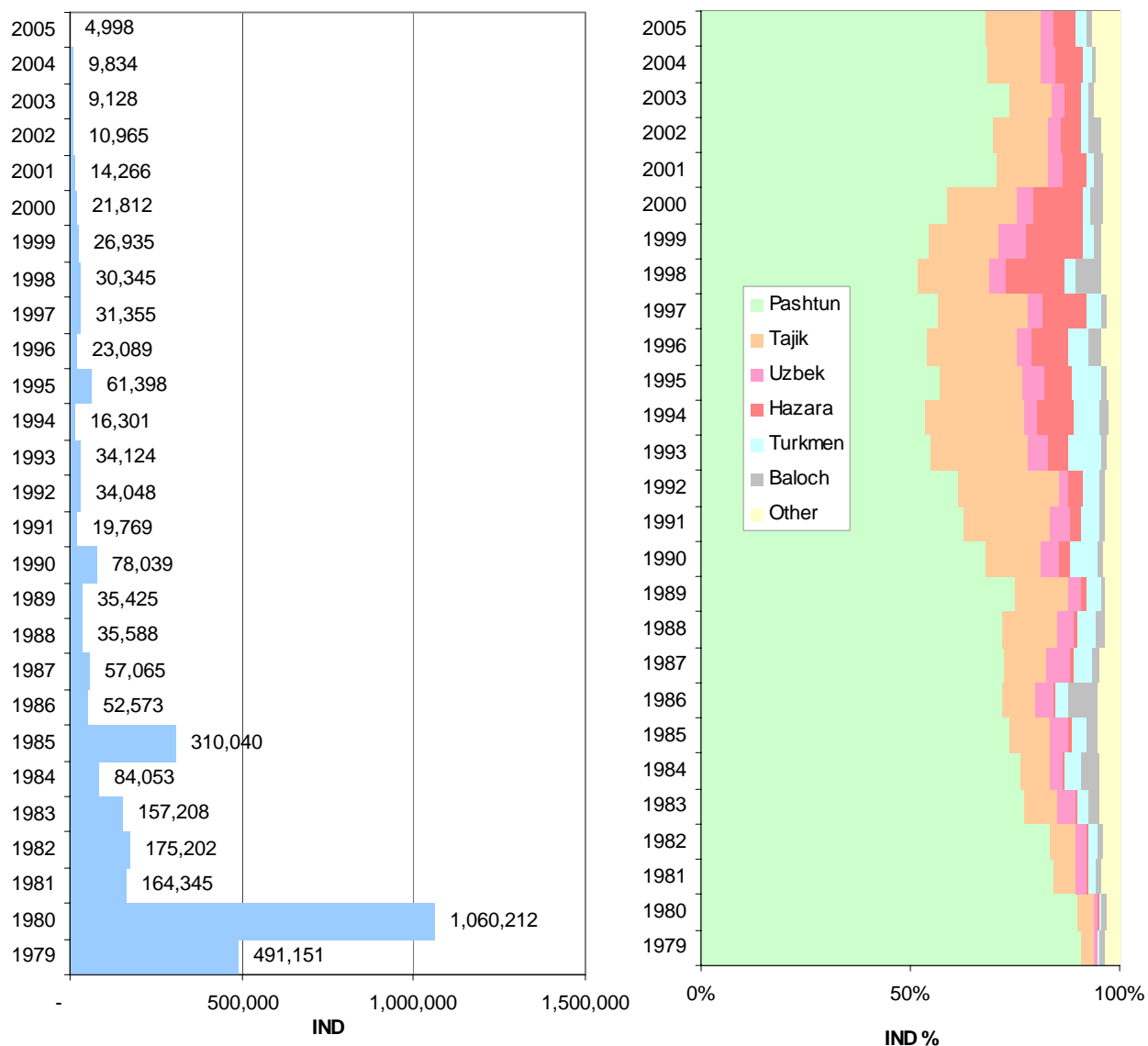

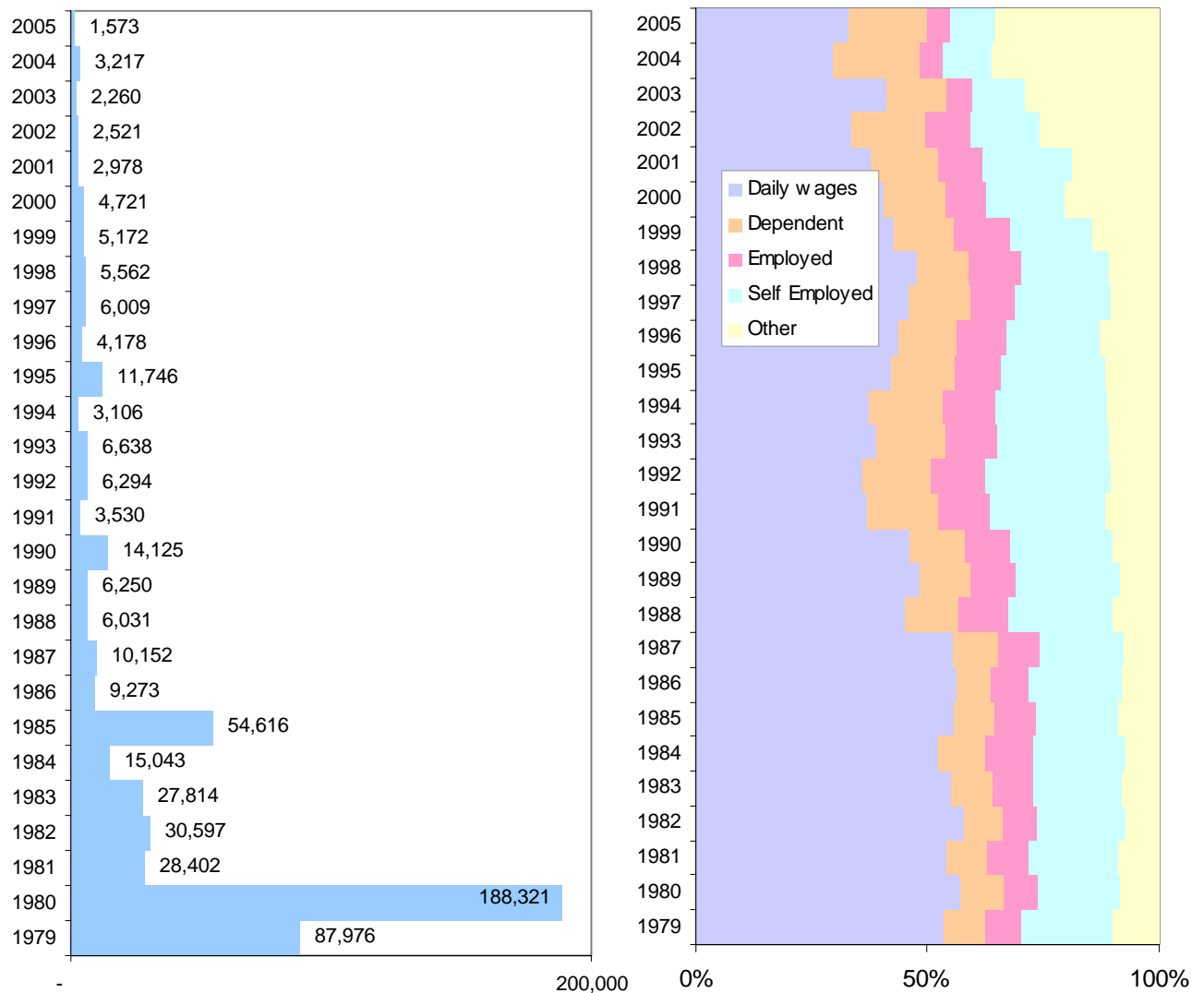

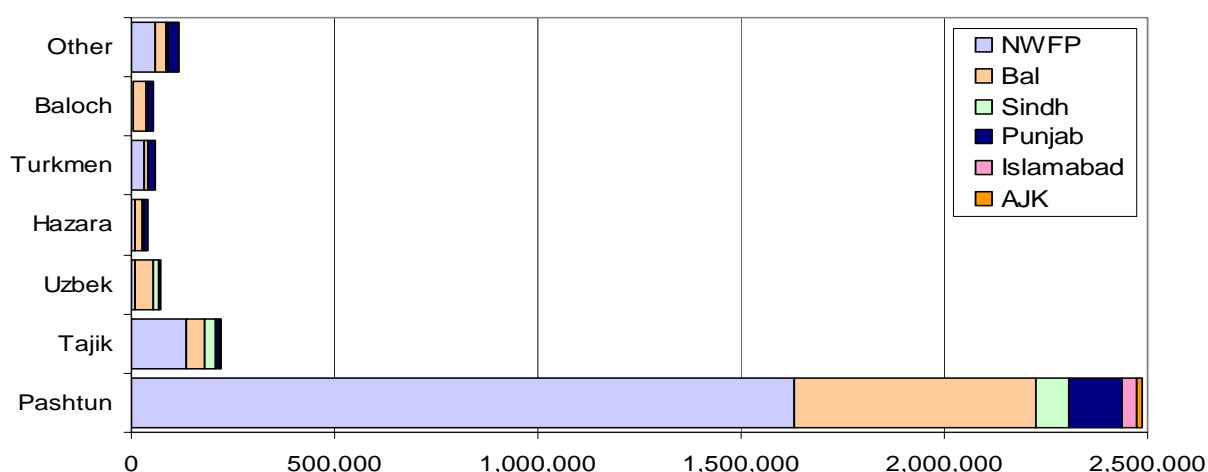
Livelihood and Year of First Arrival in Pakistan - Families



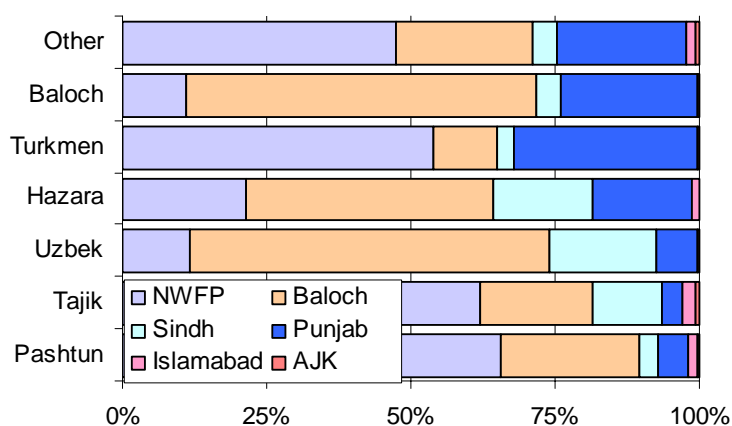

Although Pashtun Afghans dominate national figures, the percentage of minorities varies greatly across the country. NWFP has the highest percentage of Pashtun Afghans, 87 percent of the Afghan population, while Balochistan shows a more varied composition: 78 percent Pashtun, six percent Uzbek, six percent Tajik, four percent Baloch and one percent Turkmen. Sindh, with Pakistan's commercial capital Karachi, shows the most mixed population: 59 percent Pashtun, 20 percent Tajik, 10 percent Uzbek, five percent Hazara, two percent Baloch and one percent Turkmen. Punjab, with Pakistan's commercial capital Karachi, shows the most mixed population: 59 percent Pashtun, 20 percent Tajik, 10 percent Uzbek, five percent Hazara, two percent Baloch and one percent Turkmen. Islamabad and AJK show very low percentages of minorities.

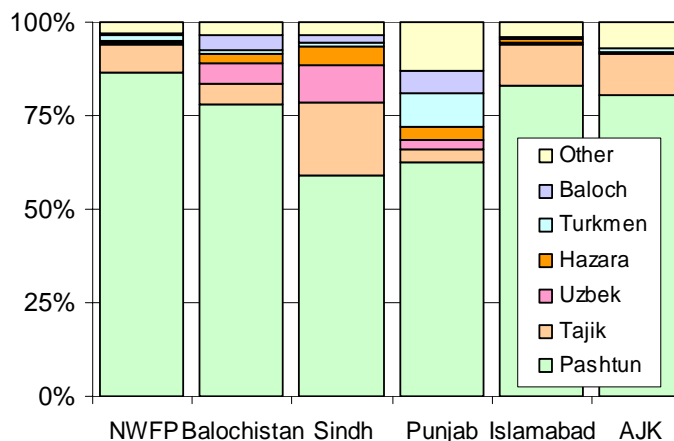

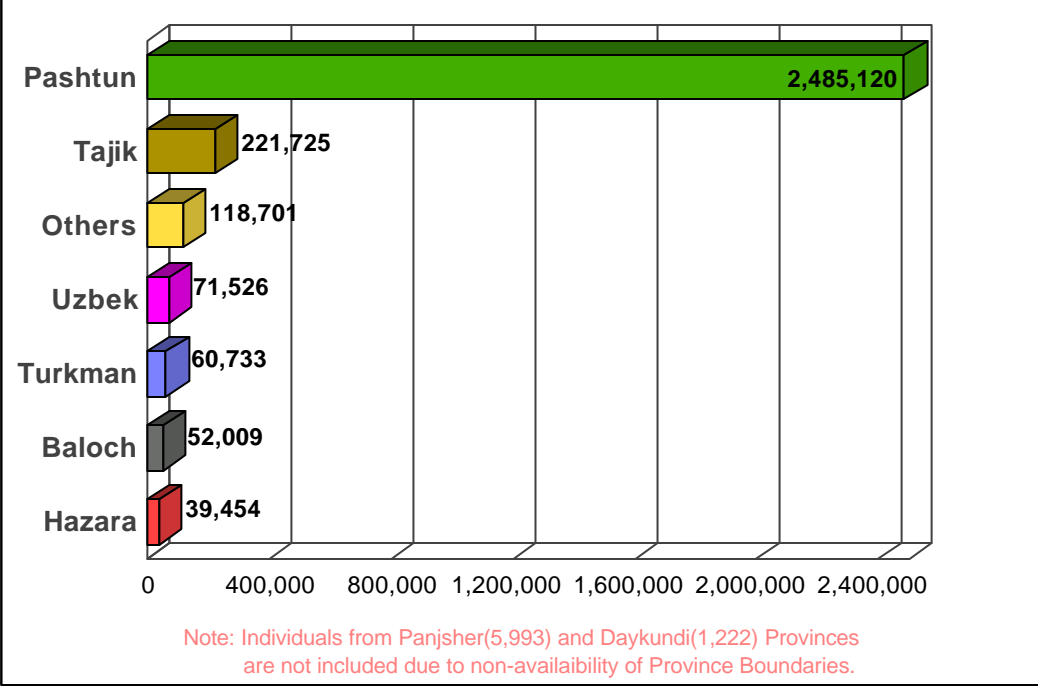
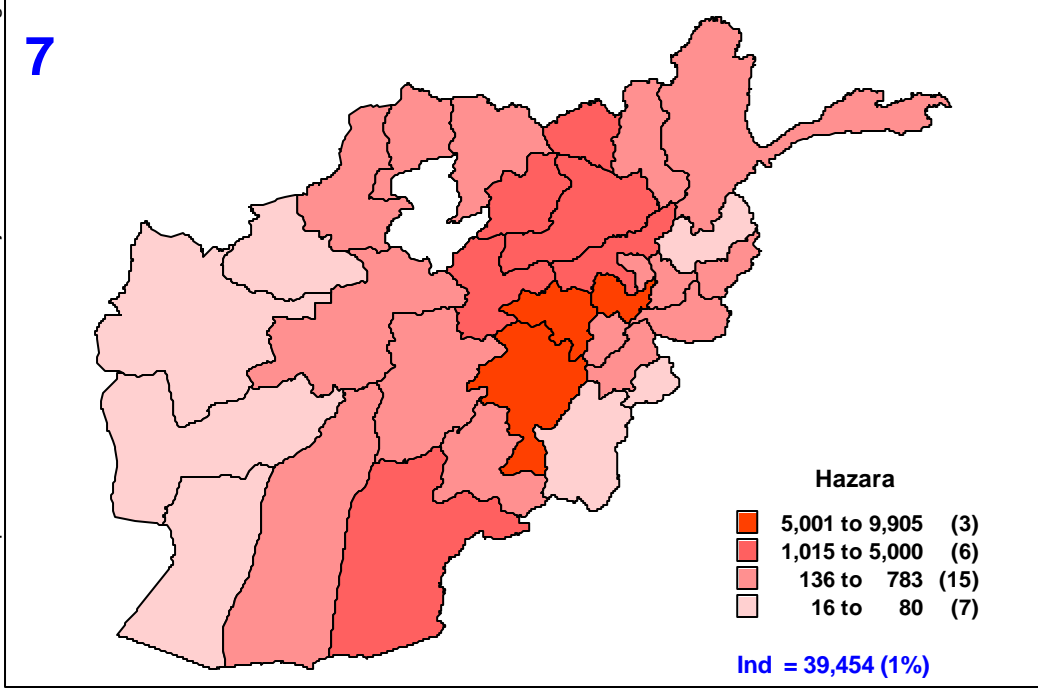
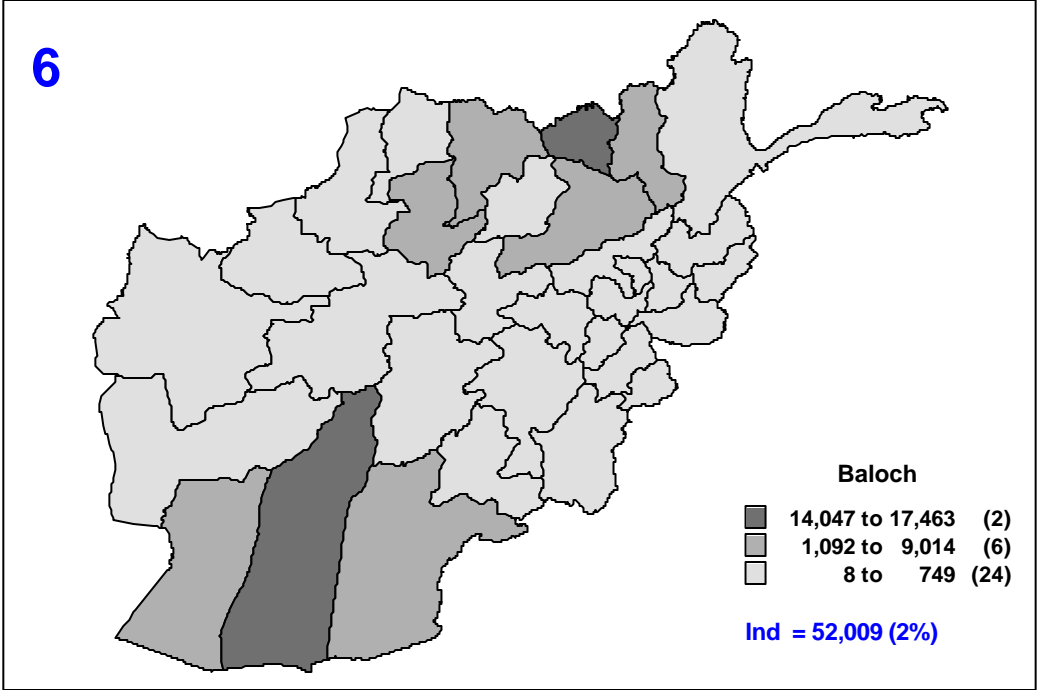
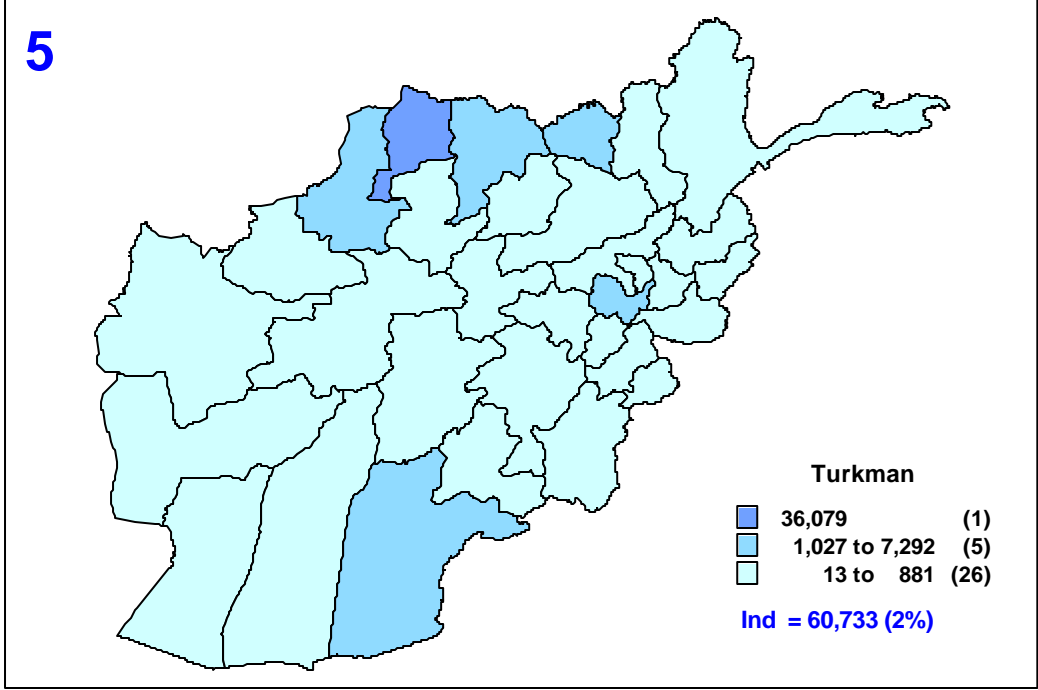
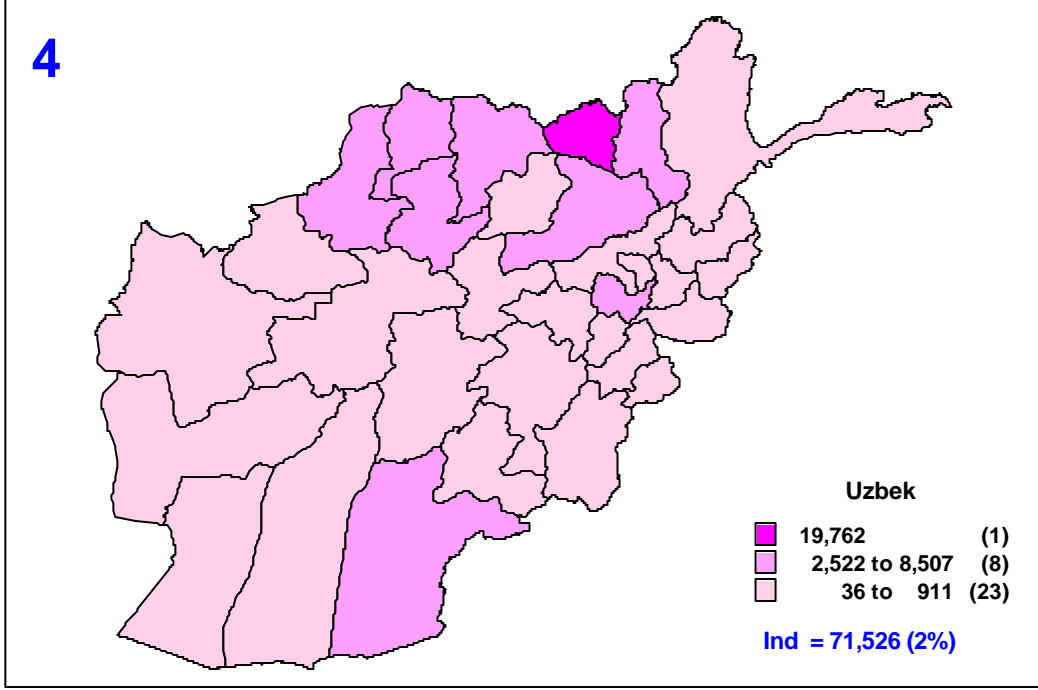
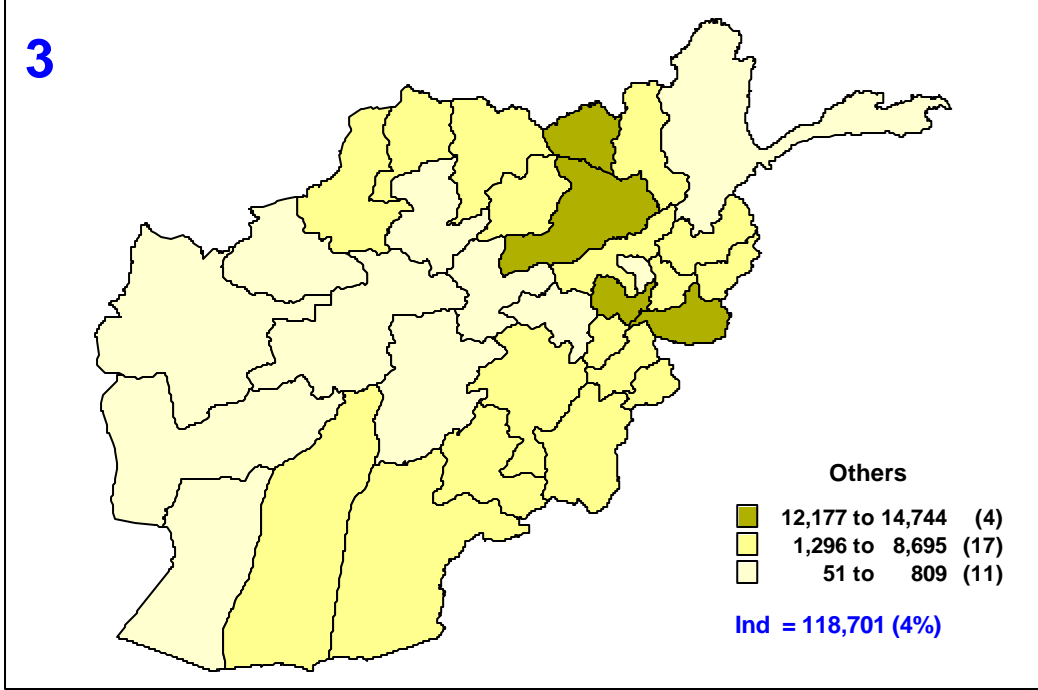
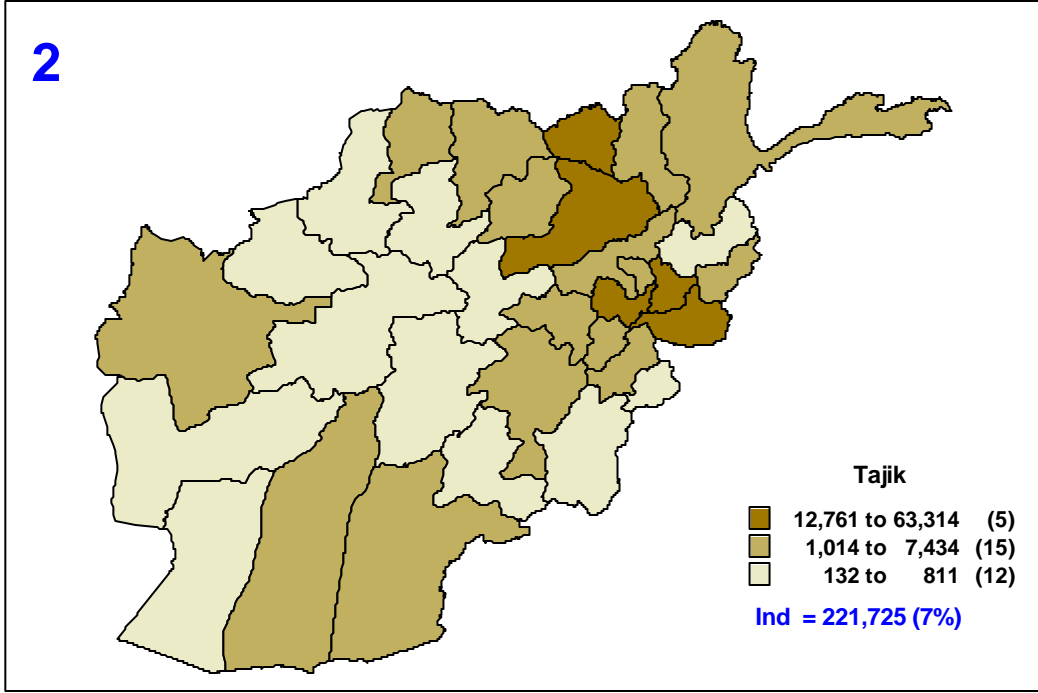
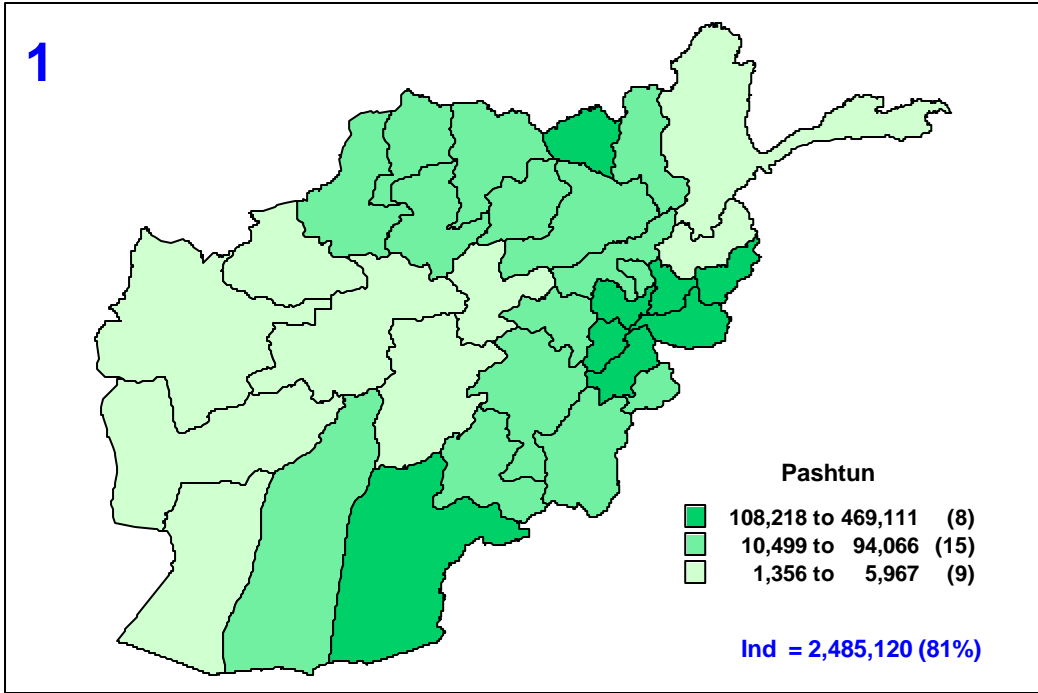


In numbers, Pashtuns in Pakistan predominantly originate from Nangarhar (469,111), Kandahar (270,535), Paktya (238,915) & Kabul (237,561). **Tajiks** are most common from Kabul (63,313), Nangarhar (38,302), Kunduz (22,919) and Baghlan (22,017). **Uzbeks** are mostly from Kunduz (19,762), Balkh (8,507), Baghlan (7,094) and Jawzjan (6,759). **Hazaras** are primarily from Ghazni (9,904), Kabul (6,275), Wardak (6,094) & Bamyan (3,025). Jawzjan (36,079), Faryab (7,292), Kunduz (94,641) & Balkh (3,730) are the most common provinces of origin for **Turkmen**. The **Baloch** in Pakistan are mostly from Kunduz (17,463), Hilmand (14,047), Kandahar (9,014) and Nimroz (1,632) which 'Other' ethnic groups come from Nangarhar (14,744), Kabul (13,084), Kunduz (12,845) and Baghlan (12,177).

In percent, Pashtuns dominate the statistics for Khost (96%, 72,065 ind), Kunar (96%, 199,580), Paktya (95%, 238,915) and Zabul (94%, 33,973). They are least from Panjsher (16%, 977), Badakshan (26%, 1,463) and Nuristan (28%, 1,356). **Tajiks** are dominant in Panjsher (74%, 4,426), Badakshan (53%, 3,004), Kabul (19%, 63,313) and Hirat (18%, 1,014). **Uzbeks** are more prevalent - in percentages - from Takhar (15%, 5,384), Balkh (14%, 8,507), Daikundi (12%, 142) and Jawzjan (10%, 6,759). **Hazaras** are mostly prevalent from Bamyan (50%, 3,025), Daikundi (18%, 217), Wardak (17%, 6,094) and Uruzgan (13%, 782). For **Turkmen**, Jawzjan (54%, 36,079), Faryab (21%, 7,292), Balkh (6%, 3,730) and Panjsher (3%, 188) are significant locations. Nimroz (39%, 1,632), Hilmand (14%, 14,047), Daikundi (14%, 168) and Kunduz (7%, 17,463) are important locations for Baloch. Large percentages of other ethnic groups appear in Nuristan (61%, 2,933) - Samangan (15%, 2,665), Baghlan (9%, 12,177) and Faryab (9%, 2,964).

49. Kuchis

The census shows 16 percent of all Afghans reporting themselves as Kuchis, a group presenting specific problems for repatriation. Most of them arrived in the early 1980s, like other Afghans and in the meantime their nomadic lifestyle has largely disappeared. Even if the climate recovered and they still have the required skills, they often no longer have their livestock and the population has likely grown beyond the level that can be sustained in their old way of life. Most are in NWFP but a considerable group lives in Punjab, where they form 40 percent of the province's 207,758 Afghans. The 28,946 Kuchis in Sindh comprise 21 percent of that province's Afghans.

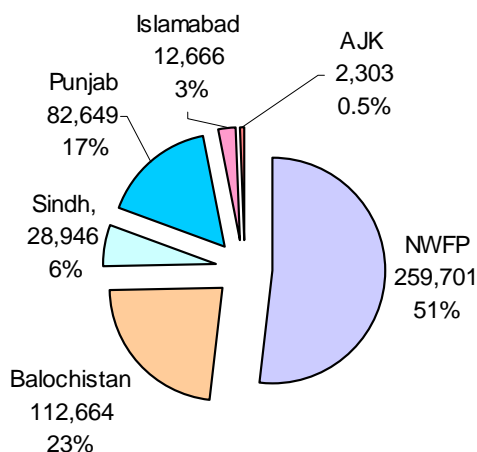
Kuchis show an even greater dependence on daily wages - 61 percent of the Kuchi population, with only five percent saying that they are employed. But they showed only a slightly greater intention to repatriate, with 79 percent saying they would not go back this year. Their reasons for not repatriating were similar to the rest of the Afghan population in Pakistan, with 52 percent citing lack of shelter at home, 21 percent saying there was insufficient security and 20 percent reporting they would have no livelihood in Afghanistan.

Province of origin of Kuchis is similar to the pattern for the Afghan population in Pakistan. Logar goes from 7th place for the general population to 1st place for Kuchis. Kabul remains in second place, as Kandahar came down from 3rd place for the general population to 7th place for Kuchi province of origin.

Intention to Return

20.6 % (102,558) of Kuchis have no intention to return in 2005. Personal enmity is less of an issue for the Kuchis than the general population (2.8 & 3.1 %), security concerns are slightly higher (20.9% for Kuchis, 17.8% for general Afghan population), shelter is of high concern for Kuchis (52.3 % in comparison with 18.2%) while other is about the same (3.6% for Kuchis, 3.5% for the general Afghan population).

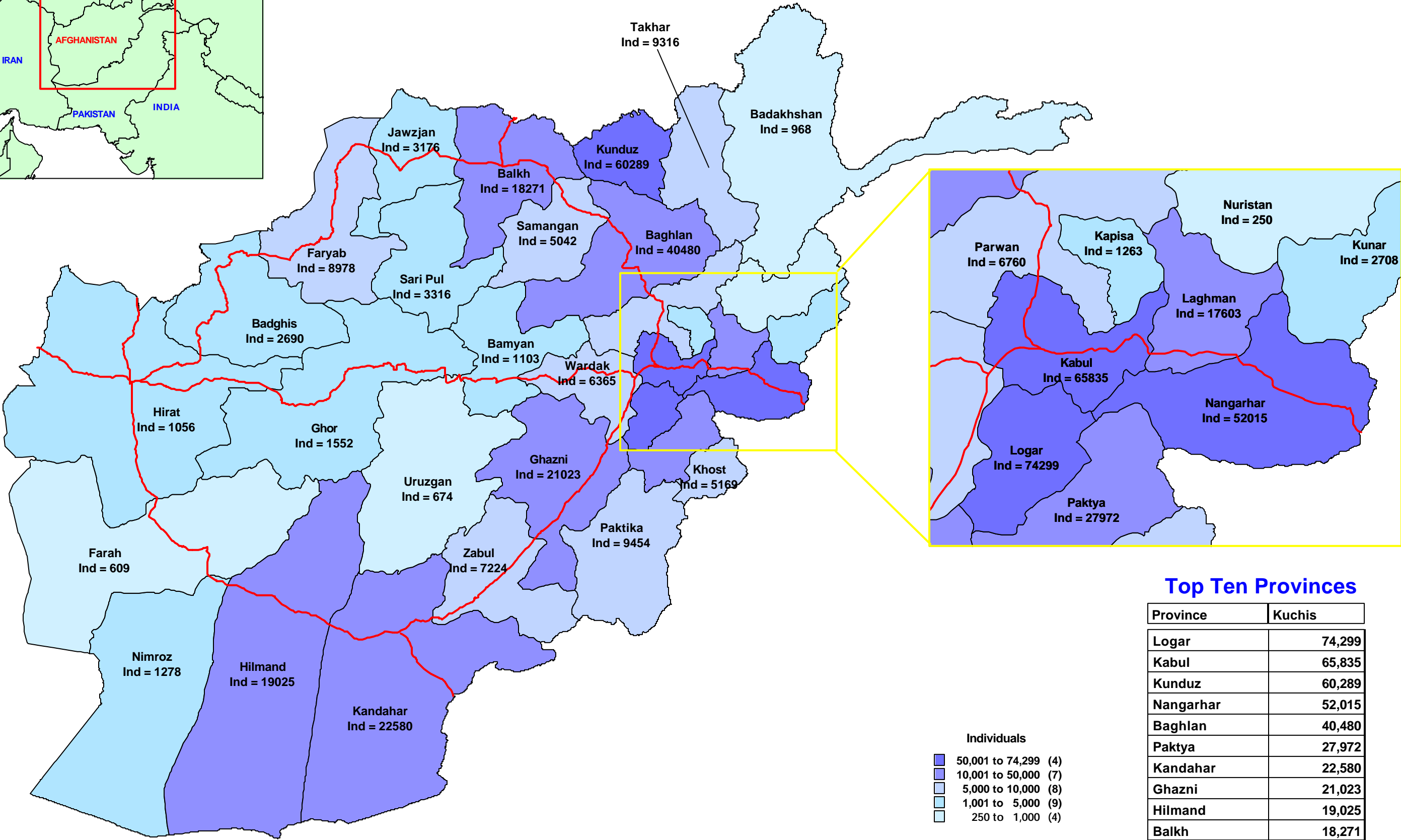

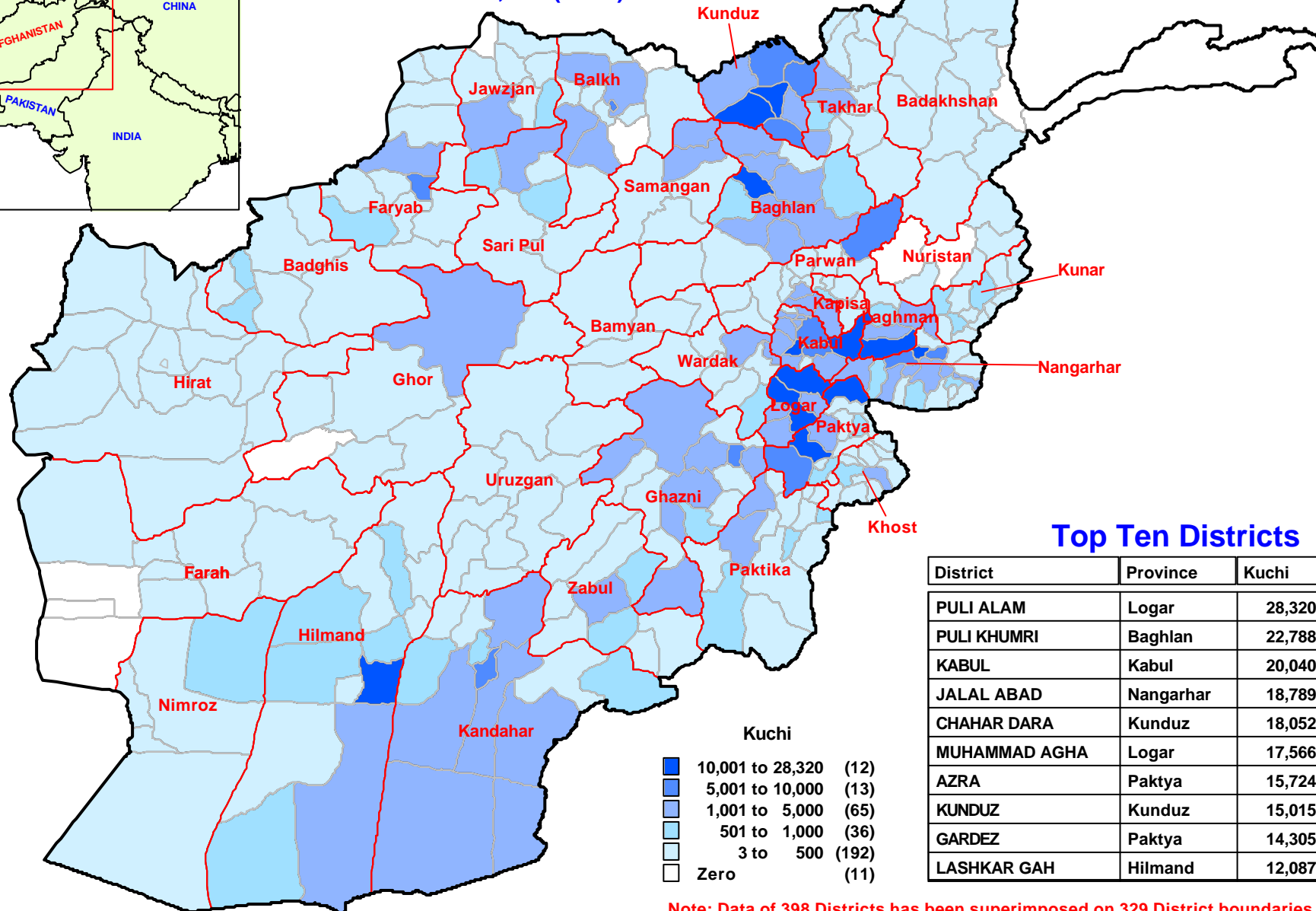
