The University

Western Washington University is a public, comprehensive university with a national reputation for academic excellence, dedicated to providing the highest quality undergraduate education in the Pacific Northwest. A Western education offers students the opportunity to develop active learning skills to last a lifetime and serves them well in today's pluralistic, changing and highly technical world.

While large enough to offer students a range of top quality programs, Western remains small enough to focus its resources on the needs of individual students as they build career skills on the sound foundation of the arts, humanities, sciences and professional studies.

The campus

Western's main campus on the western slope of Sehome Hill has been called a "jewel of a university." It offers a magic blend of art and nature with views of Bellingham Bay and the San Juan Islands to the west and a panoramic vista of the city of Bellingham. Some campus locations also offer scenic views of Mount Baker and Washington's Cascade Range to the east and the Canadian Cascades to the north. The campus is just minutes by bus from downtown Bellingham as well as the city's historic Fairhaven district, and its proximity to both locations also puts it within easy walking distance. Western's main campus and the adjacent Sehome Hill Nature Reserve encompass 216 acres near the heart of Bellingham. Counting Lakewood Recreation Center and Boathouse, the Shannon Point Marine Center in Anacortes, and the Viqueen Lodge, Western properties occupy 300 acres.

Students

Nearly 15,000 students call Western home during each academic year, starting in late September and continuing through June. A third of Western's students reside in on-campus residence halls. Western offers something for every student, with more than 100 cultural, academic, recreational, religious, social and political clubs and organizations as well as multiple venues for the performing arts and extensive opportunities for community service.

Academic programs and degrees

Western is organized into a graduate school and seven undergraduate colleges: the College of Business and Economics, the College of Fine and Performing Arts, Fairhaven College, the College of Humanities and Social Sciences, Huxley College of the Environment, the College of Sciences and Technology, and Woodring College of Education.

GENERAL INFORMATION

WWU ATHLETICS

In 2011-12, approximately 300 students are participating in 15 varsity sports at Western, six for men and nine for women. Western has been an official member of NCAA Division II since September 1998.

In 2010-11, Western placed seventh among 310 NCAA Division II schools in the Sports Director's Cup national all-sports standings, the second-highest finish in school history. The Vikings were sixth in 2009-10 and 10th in 2008-09. Western has had eight straight Top 50 finishes and been among the Top 100 in each of its first 13 seasons as a NCAA II member.

Western has won seven straight Division II national titles in women's rowing from 2005 to 2011. The Vikings are the first NCAA school in any division to achieve that distinction.

Besides being first nationally in rowing in 2010-11, the Vikings were sixth in women's outdoor track, ninth in men's cross country and 10th in women's cross country. They also were 11th in women's golf, 21st in men's indoor track, 28th in men's outdoor track and 31st in women's indoor track. Western reached the West Regional semifinals in volleyball. The Vikings also got to regionals in women's basketball and softball, and placed sixth at the super regional in men's golf.

The 2010 NCAA graduation rate study showed that 69 percent of Western student-athletes receive their degrees in six years or less based on the Federal Graduation Rate formula, a rate the same as that of the full student body. This is 13 percentage points higher than the average for NCAA Division II schools nationally and 15 points higher than the average for the nine U.S. schools in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference.

Using the NCAA Academic Success Rate, which includes all freshman student-athletes from the fall of 2003 and also accounts for student-athletes who transfer into or out of the institution, Western posted an 85 percent success rate, compared to the NCAA II national number of 73 percent. The average ASR of the nine U.S. GNAC schools was 77 percent.

In 2010-11, Western won its third straight and seventh overall Great Northwest Athletic Conference All-Sports championship, taking league titles in volleyball, men's golf and women's golf, and the regular-season crown in women's basketball. The Vikings, who won the Northwest Collegiate Rowing Conference championship, placed second in men's and women's cross country, men's and women's outdoor track, men's indoor track and softball.

And Western student-athletes also were involved in community projects during the 2010-11 school year, raising nearly \$9,000 for The American Cancer Society Relay for Life, and \$2,000 for the PeaceHealth Cancer Center in Bellingham.

Western placed second nationally in volleyball in 2007, and reached the national semifinals in men's basketball in 2001 and women's basketball in 2000.

Western ranks among the top 15 in women's basketball victories among all four-year schools with that program making 11 NCAA tournament appearances in 12 years. The Vikings had the fourth-longest league volleyball winning streak in NCAA II of 57 from 2002-04. Western, which won the NAIA national softball title in 1998, had a 38-game victory string in women's soccer from 1982 to 1984.

FACILITIES

Athletic facilities on Western's campus include Sam Carver Gymnasium, a softball complex, artificial-surfaced Viking Field, and a six-lane all-weather rubberized track.

Carver Gym, completed in 1962, has five basketball courts, including a main gym which seats 2,534 spectators. It also has a swimming pool, handball courts, the Parberry Strength and Fitness Center, and convertible facilities for volleyball, which includes a SportCourt.

Men's and women's soccer matches are held at Orca Field (FieldTurf) on the campus of Whatcom Community College. Track meets take place at Bellingham's Civic Stadium, built in 1961, with an addition in 1971 and a complete renovation in 2006. It has covered seating for 4,000 spectators and lights for night use. The track is an eight-lane, 400-meter oval.

Softball contests take place at a facility completed in 1999 with seating for 500.

Rowing events are held on Lake Samish. Cross country meets takes place at Lake Padden Park, and golf competition at the Bellingham Golf and Country Club.

VIKINGS FIGURE TO BE STINGY

The foundation of the Western Washington University women's soccer team will be built on its defense in 2011.

The Vikings return eight starters from a team that was 10-4-4 and finished fourth in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference at 7-4-3. Leading those returnees is the heart of a defense that allowed just 10 goals in those 18 games.

Coach Travis Connell (9th year) also believes the Vikings have more depth than a year ago, saying as many as 20 players could contribute.

"Last year we couldn't recover from the injuries we had," said Connell. "Now, some of our returning players have stepped up and are ready to contribute, and all five of our freshmen could play some role. I'm far more confident in our depth this year."

Anchoring the defense are two seniors. Alicia Patten has started 51 games in her career, earning second-team Daktronics all-region and first-team all-GNAC honors at center back each of the last two seasons. Emily Warman has 32 career starts. The 2009 NCAA II national champion in the indoor track and field triple jump, she's versatile enough to play either center back or outside back.

"Alicia is a good leader, she played just about every minute last year, and Warman is one of the best athletes in the entire country," said Connell.

Two sophomores also return after seeing extensive action as freshmen. Kayla Russ started 12 games at center back, and outside back Brina Sych scored two goals and earned honorable mention all-GNAC status despite injuries that hampered the last half of her season.

Sophomore outside back Diana Pollock is coming off a very good spring, and freshmen Brianna Jones and Katherine Miccile also figure to see time.

Behind them in goal is junior Jamie Arthurs. Arthurs played every second of last season, posting a 0.52 goals-against-average, the second-best in school history, including a school-record tying 11 shutouts. A second-team all-GNAC selection, she ranked 13th nationally in NCAA II in save percentage at .886.

"She's coming off a great year," Connell said of Arthurs. "She saved us numerous times, and she's got a strong relationship with the back line, they communicate well."

Leading the central midfield is senior Justina MacDowell, a second-team all-GNAC selection last season. She had a goal and an assist as a junior. MacDowell will be joined by either senior Kelly Cates, who started three games last year, or freshman Kim Cooper.

In the wide midfield spots, seniors Emily Frankland and Katie Griffith figure to be the starters. Frankland, who missed last season with a knee injury, has 13 goals, seven of them game winners, and eight assists in her career.

Frankland has also spent time at forward, and many of the players slated to play up front are also comfortable in the midfield. Joana Houplin started every game last year, and had three goals and four assists, and junior Megan Chapin had a goal and three assists in the first nine games before having her season end with a knee injury. They, along with freshman Taylor Abrass, give Western an element of speed up front that the Vikings have lacked in recent seasons. Western's top returning scorer, however, still provides a more physical target player - sophomore Kristen Maris, who had four goals and two assists last season.

"Chapin, Houpin, Abrass, Frankland, all of them are just burners," said Connell. "We have a ton of pace up front. We'll be able to stretch the field, and to pressure the opposition backs more."

"Our challenge will be to find a way to score goals. It was a strength last year, but we've lost our top two scorers."

The Vikings reached the regional finals of the NCAA Division II National Tournament in 2007, but have come up short of a post-season berth the last two years. A GNAC championship would be one route to that goal, but Western will also open the season with a stern regional test, playing host to defending national runner-up UC San Diego on Sept. 1. That's followed up by another regional battle against Chico State on Sept. 3.

"We get to test ourselves right off the bat," said Connell. "We're playing at home, which is great, but the first weekend is massive for us."

HALL OF FAME

NATIONAL HALL OF FAME

Six Western coaches and athletes are members of the NAIA National Hall of Fame.

SAM CARVER

Known as the "Father of Western Athletics," Sam Carver was a standout student-athlete at the school in 1912 and 1913. Shortly after, he became coach of nearly every Western sport.

Carver coached six sports at Western, including baseball for 10 years, basketball for 19 years, football for 14 years, golf for 22 years, tennis for 18 years and track & field for 22 years. He also was director of athletics for 18 years.

The current home of Viking basketball is named for Carver, who was inducted in 1957.

HERBERT HEARSEY

Western's faculty athletic representative for 25 years, Herb Hearsey was instrumental in developing the bulk of the eligibility rules used by the NAIA.

Hearsey helped write the constitution and bylaws of the Evergreen Conference which was formed in 1948. He also was secretary of the NAIA National Eligibility Committee.

A professor of library science and associate director of Wilson Library during his 34 years at Western, Hearsey was inducted in 1975.

LYNDA GOODRICH

One of just three women's basketball coaches in the NAIA to reach 400 career victories, Lynda Goodrich continues to leave her mark on athletics as an administrator.

A 1966 graduate of Western, Goodrich returned to the school to coach basketball in 1971. Over the next 19 seasons, she compiled a 411-125 record, guiding the Vikings to five national tournaments.

Currently Western's director of athletics, Goodrich was inducted in 1986.

CHARLES LAPPENBUSCH

The developer of the "straight-line philosophy," Charles Lappenbusch was a member of Western's physical education department for 42 years.

Lappenbusch was athletic director for 30 years and coached five sports. His most notable coaching achievements came in football, where he guided the 1938 squad to a 7-0-0 record, the only undefeated, untied season in the team's history.

Lappenbusch, who had an overall record of 81-64-17 in football, was inducted in 1961.

JO METZGER

A forward on the women's basketball team from 1977-81, Jo Metzger is the only Western athlete in the NAIA Hall of Fame, being inducted in 1992.

Metzger was one of only 30 finalists for the Wade Trophy, which goes to the nation's top female collegiate basketball player, in both 1980 and 1981. She also received first-team AIAW Division II All-America honors in 1981.

Metzger was a four-time league and region all-star. She held 15 school records at the end of her career, including the career scoring mark of 1,990 points.

Metzger is the only Western player to lead the team in scoring four times and is the only Viking ranked among the school's Top 10 career leaders in points, rebounds, assists, steals and blocked shots.

CHUCK RANDALL

As the Western men's coach for 18 seasons, Chuck Randall compiled an impressive 275-186 record.

Randall's teams had winning records in his first 11 seasons, but the best campaign was 1971-72, when the Vikings went 26-4 and reached the quarterfinals of the NAIA National Tournament. He also coached the baseball team to two national appearances.

Randall invented the first breakaway rim and founded the first basketball camp in the western United States.

Called the "Coaches' Coach" because so many of his players became coaches themselves, Randall was inducted in 1985.

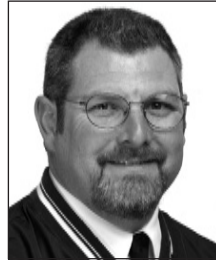
