Marv Levy General Manager

22nd NFL Season 13th with the Bills

▼ Marv Levy returned to the Bills organization this past January as General Manager, a position he has never held in his 50+ years in football, but one in which he is very familiar. During his Pro Football Hall of Fame coaching tenure in Buffalo, Levy worked very closely with general managers Bill Polian and John Butler and learned many of the nuances of the position.

Levy's return to the Bills family came about when Ralph Wilson called his good friend seeking advice in his search for a new general manager. After a brief discussion of possible candidates, the Bills owner asked the magical question, "What about you, Marv, coming back as general manager?" At that point, Mr. Wilson had found his new general manager and much of the credibility of the Buffalo Bills rich tradition had returned home

Levy's storied Bills coaching career began on November 3, 1986 when he took over for Hank Bullough. During the next 12 seasons Levy directed the Bills to four consecutive Super Bowl appearances, four AFC titles and six AFC East crowns. The Bills were the winningest AFC team in the 1990's and Levy remains ranked as the 13th all-time winningest coach in NFL history with 143 career victories (not including 11 playoff wins).

On his way to becoming the winningest coach in Bills history, Levy was named Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1995 by UPI and AFC Coach of the Year in 1993. His 123 victories makes him the only Bills coach to eclipse the 100-win mark.

Levy was a standout running back and a sprinter on the track team at Coe College, where he was a Phi Beta Kappa graduate in 1950. He earned a master's degree in English History from Harvard University in 1951. As a native of Chicago, the die-hard Cubs fan graduated from Chicago's South Shore High School and upon graduation in 1943 enlisted in the Army Air Corps and served from 1943 until early 1946. Marv and his wife Mary Frances (Fran) have one daughter, Kimberly, who works in Chicago.

▼ Russ Brandon was appointed Executive Vice President of Business Operations in late January of 2006. He joins General Manager, Marv Levy in overseeing the front office operations at One Bills Drive and will report directly to Bills President Ralph Wilson, Jr.

At the time of Brandon's appointment Mr. Wilson noted, "During his tenure here with the organization Russ has not only brought great vision to the marketing of the organization he has also developed and fostered the trust of the business community. His hard work and relationship skills have helped us develop a strong base of strategic business and community partners. In his new role, Russ will continue to develop and foster programs that help us connect with our fans and partners."

Brandon previously served as the team's Vice President of Business Development and Marketing from January of 1999 through January 2006. He and his staff have been credited with the development of the team as a regional franchise and forming strategic alliances with key business partners. Additionally, he and his staff developed numerous brand building, community, stadium and ticketing initiatives while overseeing major growth within many business-to-business platforms.

Brandon is a member of the NFL Marketing Committee and the NFL Best Practices Committee, assisting in the development of new league business strategies. Brandon's success in the sports business field has been recognized with numerous awards and in 2001 he was the recipient of Street and Smith's Sports Business Journal's Forty under 40 award.

In 1999, Brandon and his staff finalized the foundation of the regionalization plan by relocating Buffalo Bills Training Camp to St. John Fisher College in Pittsford, New York. The new layout and location provided the perfect blend of fan interaction and training accommodations. While at St. John Fisher College, the Bills have continually ranked among the NFL's best in training camp attendance.

Brandon joined the Bills in November of 1997 as Executive Director of Business Development and Marketing after earning a World Series ring as a member of the Florida Marlins front office. He began his sports business career as a member of the Rochester Red Wings (Triple A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles) serving in many capacities, including assistant general manager.

The native of East Syracuse, New York, is also involved in regional and league initiatives. He is a member of the Board of Trustees at St. John Fisher College and serves on the board at the Buffalo Niagara Partnership.

Brandon was a four-year letterman in baseball and football at St. John Fisher College and graduated with a degree in communications. He was inducted into his alma mater's Sports Hall of Fame in 2004. He and his wife, Amy, have three children, sons RJ and Jack and daughter, Grace. They reside in Williamsville, New York.



Jim OverdorfVice President of Football Administration

▼ With the changes following the 2005 season Jim Overdorf was promoted to the position of Vice President of Football Administration and took on more responsibility in the administrative aspects of the football side of the organization. Whereas he had worked in past years with the general manager in negotiating player contracts, Overdorf is now the Bills point person in this important area.

In addition to contract negotiations, one of Overdorf's key responsibilities lies in the area of the NFL's salary cap. An ever-changing and complicated issue, a thorough understanding of the salary cap is an important element in operating in today's world of professional football and the Bills have an extremely qualified salary cap administrator in Overdorf.

Overdorf continues to handle various administrative business matters and also works in conjunction with the corporate office in Detroit. Those duties include, but are not limited to, coordinating team travel, workers compensation and various other general office and legal operations.

Overdorf was promoted Vice President/Business Administration in March of 2000 after having served as Director of Business Operations for eight years. He was involved in all player contract negotiations and salary cap dealings in his role of assisting the general manager.

He served as the business manager prior to 1993 and joined the club as a training camp intern in 1986. During that time, he worked in public relations, scouting and the ticket office while gaining admission to the New York State Bar (1988). He is a member of the NYSBA. Overdorf earned a B.A. degree in political science from Eckerd College and a J.D. from Drake Law School and was a member of the school's rugby team. He and his wife Michele have one daughter, Katie.

▼ Dick Jauron's coaching career traveled fullcircle when he was named the Buffalo Bills' 14th head coach on January 23, 2006. Jauron began his coaching career as a Bills defensive assistant coach in 1985 and 21 years later he returns to Western New York to embark on a new challenge in his first season as the head coach of the Bills.

Bills general manager Marv Levy noted Jauron's knowledge of the game as well as his teaching skills as the top reasons why Jauron will lead the Bills in a winning direction as the head coach.

"We selected Dick because we felt that he was the best head coach and the man who was going to direct our team and put it all together in a winning way," Levy said. "I liked very much Dick's beliefs on the structure of our team and his role as the head coach. He is a great teacher and gets along with everyone in the organization. He is a straight shooter, he is honest and has the respect of his players."

Jauron enters his tenure as Buffalo's head coach with over two decades of NFL coaching experience and most recently finished the 2005 season as the interim head coach of the Detroit Lions after spending close to all of 2004 and the majority of 2005 as the Lions defensive coordinator.

Before joining the Lions prior to the 2004 season, Jauron had spent the previous five seasons as the head coach for the Chicago Bears, where he was the 2001 Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year. That season, he led the Bears to a 13-3 record and their first NFC Central division championship since 1990. Jauron joined George Halas and Mike Ditka as the only coaches in franchise history to reach 13 wins in a single season and the sixth Bears coach to string a six-game winning streak together during the season.

The 2001 Bears were known for their clutch play as they accumulated five second-half come-frombehind victories and an 8-0 record in games decided by seven points or less. The Bears defense ranked first in the NFL in points allowed and second in rushing yards allowed.

The Bears' run in 2001 was established by a strong finish to end the 2000 season. Playing the league's strongest schedule, Jauron's team finished 5-11; however, Chicago capped off the 2000 campaign with a 4-4 record in the final eight games. Four of those victories down the stretch came against playoff-bound or playoff-contending teams (Indianapolis, Tampa Bay and Detroit). Jauron also guided the Bears to a road victory at Green Bay for the second consecutive year, becoming the first coach in Bears history to record consecutive wins in his first two games at Green Bay (1999 and 2000).

During Jauron's five seasons in the Windy City, the Bears were represented in the Pro Bowl each year by a combination of eight different players, which included KR Jerry Azumah, WR Marty Booker, KR Glyn Milburn, C Olin Kreutz (three times), LB Brian Urlacher (four times), DT Ted Washington, S Larry Whigham and T James Williams.

As head coach, Jauron compiled a career coaching record of 36-49 (.423).

Prior to his stint in Chicago, Jauron served as the defensive coordinator for the expansion Jackson-ville Jaguars from 1995-98, helping lead the team to three playoff appearances in four years, including the AFC Championship game in 1996 and the AFC Central division title in 1998.

From 1986-94, Jauron coached the defensive backs for the Green Bay Packers under three different head coaches (Forrest Gregg, Lindy Infante and Mike Holmgren). While in Green Bay, he worked on a coaching staff with former Lions Head Coach Steve Mariucci and current New York Giants Head Coach Tom Coughlin. Jauron was instrumental in the development of Packers All-Pro S LeRoy Butler, who went to four Pro Bowls in his career. Jauron's coaching career started in 1985 with the Buffalo Bills, also as a defensive backs coach.

Jauron was drafted in the fourth round of the 1973 draft by the Detroit Lions and also by the St. Louis Cardinals in the June Major League Baseball draft in 1973. He spent his first five NFL seasons with the club. He started at free safety as a rookie and was a Pro Bowl selection in 1974 after leading the NFC in punt return average (16.8). Jauron has the fifth longest interception return, a 95-yard touchdown, in Lions franchise history against Chicago on November 18, 1973. He played the final three seasons of his career with the Cincinnati Bengals, and finished with a career tally of 26 interceptions and two touchdowns. After retiring from the NFL, Jauron worked two years for Nautilus Sports Medical Industries before launching his coaching career.

A graduate of Yale University with a bachelor's degree in history, Jauron holds several school rushing records, including consecutive 100-yard rushing games (16). He spent much of his childhood in Rensselaer, Ind., where his father was the head coach at St. Joseph's College. A three-sport standout at Swampscott (Mass.) High School, Jauron was named one of the top 10 prep athletes of the 20th Century in the state of Massachusetts by the Boston Globe.

Jauron and his wife, Gail, have two daughters, Kacy and Amy.
