Although only one record item of the 176.1 D was available in the National Archives, the Order of Battle of the German Army (Washington, March 1945), the general officer personnel files, situation maps of Lage West, and manuscripts in the Foreign Military Studies series were used for the fragmentary unit history.

Manuscripts in the Foreign Military Studies series, prepared by former German officers for the Historical Division, Headquarters U.S. Army, Europe, between 1945 and 1959, contain references to the $176 . I D$ as follows:

Albert Canal, Sep 1944: MS B-362 (176th Infantry Division, Part I) and
