Competition Regulations The tournament will be played in full accordance with the BWF General Competition Regulations (GCR) as well as the Instructions of the Badminton Europe Circuit. In the events of any dispute, the Referee's decision shall be final.

Events

Men's and Women's Singles (32 in main draw), Men's and Women's Doubles (32 in main draw), Mixed Doubles (32 in main draw)

It is required that every event in a particular BEC Elite Circuit tournament has at least 8 competitors (i.e. actual competitors, not merely entries). If the required number of competitors is not met, this particular event shall not count towards any ranking.

In accordance with regulation 9.4 in BWF Statutes, Section 5.3.3.1: World Ranking System, an event must contain at least one entry from a Member Association other than the hosting Association. If an event does not contain at least one entry from a Member Association other than the hosting Association, this particular event shall not count towards any ranking.

BADMINTON EUROPE is not liable for any costs incurred by third persons (players, coaches, umpires, team managers etc.) because of an event not having enough competitors to count for the rankings.

Provisional Schedule

23/11/19: 1000hrs: 4 courts: Quarter-finals (all events)

23/11/19: 1700hrs: 2 courts: Semi-finals (all events)

24/11/19: 1200hrs: 1 court: Finals (all events)

This schedule is provisional and subject to change depending on entries received and approval of the referee and Chair of the BADMINTON EUROPE Circuits Commission. The final frame schedule shall be made at least 20 days before the start of the tournament and shall be published on the organiser's website.

Competitors must be ready to play 20 minutes before their scheduled time. Players not ready to play at the scheduled time will be disqualified. Alterations to the competition schedule due to Television coverage are possible and will be announced by the Referee as soon as it is known. Warm-up on court is limited to 2 minutes.

Players shall not plan their departure less than 2 (two) hours after their last match is planned to conclude. If a player is unable to compete due to early departure, he/she will be penalised by removal of Elite Circuit ranking points and shall not be awarded prizes or prize money. BADMINTON EUROPE shall propose to BWF that the gained BWF ranking points are also removed.

Entries

Players must have a BWF ID-number to be able to enter and all entries must be made by using the BWF Online Entry System:

If a player does not have an ID number, please contact the BWF office well in advance of the tournament to obtain one.

Entries must be submitted no later than Tuesday 22 October 2019 at 2359 BWF HQ-time (1559 GMT). No late entries will be accepted.

Compliance with GCR 7.9: "In making or authorising entries, the Member concerned is reconfirming its acceptance, and acceptance by the Players being entered, of the BWF's regulations and Disciplinary processes."

Entry fees

Singles: £45 per player, Doubles: £40 per player in each event

The Member Association that enters a player into a Circuit tournament is responsible for paying the entry fees for that player. The entry fees become due if a player is entered and has not been withdrawn by the Member Association by midnight local time on the closing date.

Please note: all bank charges are the responsibility of the person paying the entry fee.

The entry fees will not be refunded in the case of a withdrawal. For all the withdrawn players the Organizers' can invoice the entry fee to the relevant Member Association. If no payment has been received after the deadline has passed the organizers will forward the invoice with the registration of deliverance and the copy of the original entry together with the original invoice to BADMINTON EUROPE.

If a player/pair is listed on a "Waiting List", no entry fee is to be paid before being promoted to the Main Draw or Qualification draw. Before such a promotion takes place, the organizers must have this promotion confirmed by the association/associations of the respective player/pair. Only when this confirmation has been given, the player/pair is considered as an entry.

Organizers are allowed to refuse entries if players have outstanding fees from a previous year. No alteration, except withdrawal, can be made to the entries after the close of entries in accordance with BWF General Competition Regulations 7.10.

Any withdrawal after the Monday immediately preceding the draw, for any reason whatsoever, renders the Member Association concerned liable to an amount of US\$ 150 for the inconvenience caused by the withdrawal (as defined in BWF General Competition Regulations).

Any player not showing up at the tournament, without having been withdrawn in advance, renders the Member Association concerned liable to an additional amount of US\$ 500,00 for the inconvenience caused by the "no show" (as defined in BWF General Competition Regulations).

Presentations	<p>During the presentation ceremonies, players may wear tracksuits, but headgear, rackets and racket bags are not permitted. No other form of advertising will be permitted. This will be strictly enforced.</p> <p>The presentation to winners and runners-up will take place immediately after each final match. Players are reminded when booking flights home on Sunday that the finals may not finish until 1800hrs, depending on the start time, and also that they may be selected for dope testing – they should therefore book their flights accordingly. Players shall not plan their departure less than two (2) hours after their last match is planned to conclude.</p>
Medical Services	<p>A doctor will be available in the Emirates Arena at pre-arranged times. Appointments should be made through the Championships Office. A physiotherapist will be available to give assistance with injuries during the period of the Championships. Contact the Championships Office at the venue for full details. For incidents outside of the playing Arena it is recommended that appropriate insurance be obtained.</p>
Doping control	<p>Doping control in badminton, in accordance with BWF Anti-Doping Regulations, is conducted out-of-competition and in-competition with the collection of urine and/or blood samples.</p> <p>Athletes are responsible for any substance found in their body. Clothing & advertising	<p>Colour, design, lettering and advertising on clothing shall be regulated by BWF General Competition Regulations § 20 to 24. Any breach of these regulations will be forwarded to BWF.</p> <p>It is mandatory that partners in doubles wear the same colour of the T-shirt and shorts/skirts at all time during play in both the qualification and the main draw. Failing to do so shall result in an administrative fine of 100,00 EUR.</p>
Visas	<p>If your players and officials require a visa to enter the United Kingdom, we can provide a letter of invitation to assist. Please provide us with the necessary information by returning the enclosed form no later than Monday 14 October 2019. UK Border Agency state that most decisions on VISA applications are made within 3 weeks, but the earlier you apply the more likely you are to receive a decision in time for you to travel. Please note, the letter of invitation we provide does not guarantee entry into the UK and the final decision is made by the UK Border Agency. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that they apply for their visa in sufficient time. Any issues with the visa application need to be dealt with directly, by the applicant, to the Embassy who is dealing with your application. We accept no responsibility for withdrawals made due to late or unapproved visa applications. Where required, special delivery costs to post letters of invitation will be recharged to your Association.</p>

Please do not make payment directly to the hotel. Official transport will be available between the Emirates Arena and the official hotel provided the hotel booking has been made with Crème Conferences. Accreditation

Badminton Integrity

Section 2.4 of the BWF Statutes (Code of Conduct in Relation to Betting, Wagering and Irregular Match Results) relates to anti-corruption and anti-match manipulation, and this code applies to all participants at this tournament.

To protect the integrity of BWF sanctioned tournaments, participants are not allowed to bet in any way on badminton matches, respect the principle of fair play, and shall not attempt to influence the course or result of a game or match.

Every person has an obligation to report to the BWF any approaches by anyone to gather inside information or to change the outcome of a matches.

Cancellation

The organising Member Association can cancel a tournament in case of force majeure. Such cancellation must be announced at least 15 days before the start of the tournament. BADMINTON EUROPE is not liable for any costs incurred by third persons because of a cancellation of a tournament.

Insurance

The Organisers decline responsibility and covering of costs for possible injuries or other damages. It is up to participants to insure themselves.

Member Association and/or Organiser may be liable for claims originating from the damages incurred by the participants and/or any other persons, arising from or in connection to the particular BEC Elite Circuit tournament, according to local Law. BADMINTON EUROPE is not liable for any such claims, actions, damages, costs or expenses of any nature whatsoever, including but not limited to injury or loss to person or property, arising out of or in any way related, directly or indirectly, to the particular BEC Elite Circuit tournament. It is recommended that Member Associations and/or Organisers purchase a proper Insurance Policy that would cover their potential legal liability.
