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Country Artists As Emotionally Torn By Impeachment As Their Fan Base



Lee Greenwood might need to rewrite "God Bless the U.S.A." Nearly three years into a divisive presidency, the 53rd annual Country Music Association Awards coincided with the start of impeachment hearings on Nov. 13. Judging from the reaction of the genre's artists, the opening line in Greenwood's chorus-

"I'm proud to be an American"-is still a prominent belief. But "I'm frustrated to be an American" is hard on its heels as a replacement.

An unscientific red-carpet poll of the creative com-

munity about the hearings found a wide range of awareness, from Rosanne Cash, who said she was "passionate" about watching them, to a slew of artists who barely knew they were happening. But the biggest bloc of acts - including Michael Ray, Kathy Mattea and LOCASH - are worn-down, abused patriots who want to stay abreast of the country's future but are challenged emotionally by the flood of falsehoods and the competing narratives that emanate from the capital.

"It's the weirdest, weirdest emotion," said Ingrid Andress. "This country is – phoof. Help us."

Country music, more than any other genre, is closely associated with the heartland, and one of the basic tenets in the format is the bond between artist and fan, often cemented because performers frequently reflect the lifestyle and core values of the audience. Thus, those artists' viewpoints seem relevant in the current climate, and it's particularly discouraging that they have a difficult time even settling on reality.

"It's he said/she said," said LOCASH's Chris Lucas. "I don't know who to believe or what to believe. There's two sides, and the two sides have figured out how to work [the media].'

Cash's father, Johnny Cash, was an outspoken supporter of inclusive values, challenging the ruling class in his 1970 single

"What Is Truth." Just two years later, Rosanne campaigned as a teenager for Democrat George McGovern in his bid to unseat Richard Nixon in the White House, and she has consistently stood up for progressive policies and politicians

"I've always been interested [in politics]," she said. "My dad was the first radio operator to tell the brass that [Russian dictator Joseph | Stalin was dead. I mean, it's just kind of hardwired in my family that we really care about these things."

Crystal Gayle, by contrast, played rallies for George H.W. Bush during the 1988 election, and though she acknowledged wide dissatisfaction with President Donald Trump, she took issue with the impeachment track.

"I just wish they'd leave everything alone and start doing the business we put them in there to do," she said. "To me, vote him out in a year. Why go through all this?'

But messiness is part of democracy, and America seems to need a good impeachment-level clash about every 20 years. Sen. **Joe McCarthy** — whose attorney, **Roy Cohn**, would go on to advise Trump — whipped up fears that Russian-bred Communists had infiltrated the intelligence community in the 1950s before he was censured and died in disgrace. Nixon resigned in 1974 after a failed robbery by Republican operatives at the Watergate Hotel led to a coverup and likely impeachment. **Bill Clinton** survived a 1998 impeachment that followed lies about a sexual relationship. The current mess has seen Trump — viewed by 65% of Americans as dishonest, according to a Quinnipiac poll — repeatedly engage or encourage foreign powers to influence U.S. elections on his behalf.

Media and marketing strategies have matured over time, and the rise of Fox News and other conservative media have created a rift in America's beliefs.

"I remember watching the Watergate hearings when I'd come home from school in the afternoons," says Mattea, "but it seems so much more amped up now. I have to pick and choose when and how and what to watch and listen to. I want to get the information, but I don't want to stew in it like a tea bag. I don't think it's good for me. I have to wait till I'm feeling resilient."

Some younger artists — such as **Morgan Wallen**, **HARDY** and **Russell Dickerson**, who does not even have a cable subscription — adamantly avoided the hearings. **Jimmie Allen** saw more value in being a father than tuning in to a process he can't control.

"I'm not a judge, I'm not a jury in this case, so my input or my thoughts on what's happening right there does not affect the outcome," he said. "Do I watch this? Or do I go hang with my son?"

Songwriter **Shane McAnally** ("One Man Band," "Get Along") is similarly encouraged by his kids to turn off the news, though he has become addicted to the drama.

"What they've done so well — and to the dismay of probably the rest of us — is they've made it so sensational that it feels like you're watching fiction," said McAnally.

But the truth is that two polarized tracks have pulled well-intentioned Americans in the heartland into separate corners where they have a difficult time understanding — or trusting — each other.

"We [should] look at each other as brother and sister and just respect other views," said Ray. "You don't have to agree with me, and I don't have to agree with you, but we can still go have a beer together and hang out and that thing. That's what we need to get back to."

Whether or not "I'm proud to be an American" ever rings as true again as it has before, the issues of the current moment are certain to affect the nation's future.

"We're in a critical crisis in this nation's history," said Rosanne Cash. "How could you not pay attention? When your grandkids ask you what you were doing during this time, you want to at least say, 'I paid attention.'"

No matter how much attention we pay now, the era is likely to reverberate for decades.

"It's like a mystery novel — 'What happened today?' " said Maren Morris. "I can't wait to see the movie."

Lady Antebellum Sails Onto Top Country Albums; Keith Urban, Dan + Shay And Justin **Bieber Add Top 10s**



Lady Antebellum's Ocean debuts at No. 2 on Billboard's Top Country Albums chart (dated Nov. 30) with 29,000 equivalent album units earned, including 21,000 in album sales, during its first week, ending Nov. 21, according to Nielsen Music.

URBAN RENEWAL Keith Urban earns his 39th Hot Country Songs top 10 as "We Were" (Hit Red/Capitol Nashville) lifts 12-10, marking his first top 10 since "Blue Ain't Your Color" led the tally for 12 weeks, becoming his 16th

Released Nov. 15 and produced by Dann Huff, Ocean is the trio's first album for BMLG Records, which is part of Big Machine Label Group.

Ocean is Lady A's 10th top 10 on Top Country Albums, with all 10 having debuted in the tier. The act boasts five No. 1s on the tally, with Ocean following the group's Heart Break, which debuted at No. 1 in July 2017 (53,000 equivalent albums; 47,000 sold).

Lady A, comprising Charles Kelley, Hillary Scott and Dave Haywood, first crowned Top Country Albums with its debut self-titled set, which opened at the apex with 43,000 copies sold in May 2008. Need You Now followed in 2010 with 481,000 sold in its first frame, marking Lady A's biggest sales week to date. The set ruled Top Country Albums for 31 weeks, the 10th-longest command in the chart's history and second-best among groups after the Dixie Chicks' Fly, which dominated for 36 frames starting in 1999.

Lady A led Top Country Albums again with Own the Night (2011) and Golden (2013). The holidaythemed On This Winter's Night peaked at No. 2 in 2012 and 2014's 747 took off at its No. 2 high.

Meanwhile, Ocean's lead single, "What If I Never Get Over You," pushes 8-6 on Country Airplay, up 6% to 25.7 million audience impressions in the week ending Nov. 24. On the airplay-, streaming- and sales-

based Hot Country Songs chart, the track holds at its No. 7 high, also totaling 5.5 million U.S. streams (up 30%) and 7,000 sold.

The group performed the song with pop singer-songwriter **Halsey** at the Country Music Association (CMA) Awards on Nov. 13 in a medley with the latter's current single, "Graveyard."

and longest-leading No. 1, starting in November 2016. (In between the two

tracks, he charted five entries that peaked between Nos. 11 and 38.)

"We" reaches the region with 4 million streams (up 32%) in the week ending Nov. 21 after Urban performed it at the CMA Awards (Nov. 13); it also rises 5-4 on Country Airplay, up 2% to 28.2 million in radio reach.

Urban rattled off 38 consecutive top 10s on Hot Country Songs through "Blue" (counting titles in lead roles officially promoted to country radio, excluding holiday fare), a streak that started with his second entry and first top 10, "Your Everything," which peaked at No. 4 in 2000.

TOP 10(000) Dan + Shay and Justin Bieber's "10,000 Hours" (Warner Music Nashville/WAR) enters the Country Airplay top 10 (12-10), gaining by 12% to 21.5 million impressions.

The collaboration is Dan + Shay's seventh Country Airplay top 10, a total that includes six No. 1s, starting with "Nothin' Like You," which led the list for a week in December 2015. The pair's most recent leader, "All to Myself," topped the Aug. 24 chart.

Pop superstar Bieber collects his first Country Airplay top 10 in his first visit. (The ballad also bullets at No. 12 on Adult Pop Songs, No. 15 on Pop Songs

and No. 16 on Adult Contemporary.)

The track tops Hot Country Songs for a seventh week, as it likewise controls Country Streaming Songs for a seventh frame (15.8 million U.S. streams) and places at No. 2 on Country Digital Song Sales (10,000 sold), which it led for two weeks.

'OLD TOWN' GETS NEW KUDOS

"Old Town Road" continues to bring the horsepower on the awards circuit. After the Lil Nas X-Billy Ray Cyrus collaboration took the musical event honor at the Country Music Association Awards on Nov. 13, the duo racked up three Grammy Award nominations on Nov. 20 — including record of the year — and claimed an American Music Award on Nov. 24.

The attention underscores how perceived walls between musical styles continue to erode. Controversial from the outset, "Old Town Road" snagged its CMA Award as a country project, but received the AMA trophy in the rap/hiphop category. Its three Grammy nominations are in pop and all-genre fields.

It was hardly the only connector between the competing awards shows. **Dan + Shay** pocketed two victories at the AMAs — favorite country duo or group and favorite country song for "Speechless" — then snagged Grammy nominations in parallel categories for the same song. Likewise, former country act **Taylor Swift** picked up artist of the decade and five additional trophies for her work in the last year at the AMAs, while she made the Grammy ballot in three pop categories.

The Lil Nas X/Cyrus combo, which pairs a rookie with a veteran who won his first awards 27 years ago, laid out a cross-generational theme that was apparent on both lists, too.

At the AMAs, **Kane Brown**'s trophy for favorite country male represented a win for younger acts, while **Carrie Underwood**'s double victory — favorite country female and favorite country album for *Cry Pretty* — was a nod to stability. It gave her 15 career wins at the AMAs, including seven as a country female and six in the country-album arena.

That played out even more dramatically at the Grammys. The CMA's new artist of the year, **Ashley McBryde**, claimed two nominations, alongside nods for new-generation talents **Tyler Childers** and **Luke Combs**. On the opposite end, **Tanya Tucker** — who snared her first hit in 1972 — tallied four nominations on a list that also featured Country Music Hall of Fame members **Willie Nelson**, **Brooks & Dunn**, **Dolly Parton**, **Vince Gill** and **Reba McEntire**.

MUSIC NOTES

With the focus on albums receding, it's not surprising that this year's holiday songs are mostly individual tracks and EPs, with a bundle of covers in the mix. **Thomas Rhett** offers a new title, "Christmas in the Country," alongside a remake of "The Christmas Song." J.T. Hodges, who will appear in the Lifetime movie *Christmas Stars* on Dec. 13, assembled the six-song EP All Through the Night: A Christmas Collection. Chase Bryant, fresh from a role in Lifetime's *Christmas as Graceland: Home for the Holidays* (Nov. 23), served up "We Wish You a Merry Christmas" and



the Elvis Presley title "Blue Christmas." Temecula Road reimagines Alabama's "Christmas in Dixie," and two Universal Music Group acts freshened up a couple of pop chestnuts: Adam Hambrick takes a blue-eyed-soul turn on Stevie Wonder's "What Christmas Means to Me," and Clare Dunn gives an energetic read of Elton John's "Step Into Christmas."

Garth Brooks has friends in mobile places: He has partnered with Zynga for a two-week promotion that connects the *Words With Friends* virtual game with a sweepstakes surrounding his new vinyl/CD box set, *Legacy*. Through Dec. 8, the competition is a gateway for daily giveaways, while the game's onscreen tiles embed the individual letters on game pieces that feature a faux platinum album and Brooks' "g" logo. Brooks takes on a larger game board — an NFL gridiron — on Feb. 22 when he plays Detroit's Ford Field, where he sold a reported 70,000 tickets in 90 minutes.

Asleep at the Wheel co-founder Ray Benson provided a key voice when the PBS series *Country Music: A Film by Ken Burns* explored **Bob Wills** and western swing. Benson's entourage celebrates its 50th anniversary in 2020, and the group is planning a series of shows with members from the original lineup: vocalist Chris O'Connell, drummer Leroy Preston, steel guitarist Lucky Oceans and pianist Floyd Domino. The performances will be filmed for a forthcoming documentary, and a reunion album with the original cast is due in the fall, produced by Americana figure Buddy Miller.

Singer-songwriter Austin Jenckes will host a benefit for mental health organization John's Toast at Nashville's City Winery on Dec. 2. The guest list includes The Cadillac Three frontman Jaren Johnston; new artists Lauren Jenkins, Alex Hall and Sarah Allison Turner; and songwriters Jonathan Singleton ("Beer Never Broke My Heart"), Tammi Kidd Hutton ("Probably Wouldn't Be This Way") and Lynn Hutton ("Cold One").

Mitchell Tenpenny Enlists Duo Seaforth For A Quirky Collaboration

Christmas comes but once a year.

Except, of course, for two-time Canadian Country Music Association female artist of the year **Meghan Patrick**, whose boyfriend, **Mitchell Tenpenny**, is willing to celebrate the holiday twice a year — or even three times in three minutes. That idea, "Christmas in July," is something he promises in the chorus of "Anything She Says," a blue-eyed-soul single that became the name of

a 14-date fall tour with Australian duo **Seaforth** that wraps at Webster Hall in New York on Dec. 15. "Christmas in July" might seem unattainable, but it's worth trying to create for the right woman.

"It's just a line, a funny, quirky line," says Tenpenny. "You know, give her something that's impossible. Anything she says."

Released to terrestrial radio by River House/ Columbia Nashville through PlayMPE on Oct. 28, "Anything She Says" is loaded with random stuff an infatuated man might do for the woman he loves: get her waffles at 2 a.m., cancel his plans or take her to the beach and get a sunburn while she tans. Oddly enough, if the couple hit the beach in Seaforth's Aussie homeland during December, they could get that burn in what would feel like Christmas in July, since the holiday comes in the midst of Australia's summer.

"It's the polar opposite thing," says Seaforth's **Tom Jordan**. "You see Christmas movies and stuff, and it all seems like winter — Christmas bells and sleigh bells and everything. It seems in my head, from a movie standpoint, it should be in winter but we get up and go to the beach."

Seaforth is just as invested as Tenpenny in "Anything She Says," since Jordan and bandmate **Mitch Thompson** co-wrote it, and they trade vocals with Tenpenny on the single, which was originally — at least in Tenpenny's mind — intended as a Seaforth song. Tenpenny regularly writes several times a

month with Andy Albert ("Good Girl," "She's Got a Way With Words") and Jordan M. Schmidt ("God's Country," "We Back"), and in February they hosted Seaforth at Schmidt's Tree Vibez office in Nashville's Hillsboro Village.

Jordan ran about 40 minutes late after scheduling a haircut at the same time, and when he arrived, the other four had already mapped out a portion of the chorus and were refocused on the opening verse.

"It started as, 'My girl, she likes to dance, she loves to make friends' — that's when Tom came in, and we all started brainstorming more," recalls Thompson.

In the process, they discovered that the "anything she says" phrase at the end of the chorus dovetailed nicely if they changed the "my girl" opening phrase to "she says," and it became a repeating theme that tied a bow on the whole thing.

The verses used syncopated phrases and rhythms, smoothing into a straightahead production in the chorus to create some variation as the song progresses.

"After that chorus, when it drops right back into that other groove, it gives your brain a little time to rest," says Tenpenny. "That's something we always love doing."

The finishing touch came with the bridge, where the singer has a chat with his girlfriend's father. Albert slipped in the line "put a diamond on her hand," jumping up and simulating that engagement moment as they briefly changed a light-hearted song into one with just a tinge of seriousness.

"That's what you would want your girlfriend to hear, that it's not just get-

render ny



ting drunk and getting waffles," says Thompson. "There's a different side." Schmidt oversaw a demo with Jordan playing a few guitar parts while Sea-

forth traded the vocal leads — Jordan handling verse one and the bridge, Thompson taking the chorus and verse two. Then came a gentleman's game of chicken. Tenpenny assumed Seaforth would record "Anything She Says," since that's who they wrote it for, but the duo kept thinking Tenpenny should do it.

> "We kind of texted each other back and forth for weeks," says Thompson. "Like, 'Hey, man, you going to cut the song?' And he'd reply, 'You guys cut it, you guys cut it.'"

> Tenpenny's manager, 11/10 Management owner Kristen Ashley, broke the stalemate, convincing Tenpenny to take it on. He wedged in a visit to the Southern Ground recording studio during a one-day stay back in Nashville in the midst of a packed summer tour schedule. Even though they had discussed it, Schmidt didn't know they were recording "Anything She Says" until Tenpenny texted him just before the session that they should cut that song first.

> "I do remember thinking, 'I don't know how the hell we're going to make this digestible to a country listener,' because the demo is pretty poppy and not what you would expect from a typical country song," says Schmidt. "But once we got the band on there, once we were in the studio and hearing it with real drums, all that stuff kind of came together."

> Also assisting the sound was a trick from Florida Georgia Line road guitarist Tyler "Taco" Chiarelli, who employed a wah pedal that gave it a squeezed, aural component.

> "That guitar part to me is so signature and standout," says Jordan. "Every time I hear it, it kind of just makes me feel good."

> Schmidt took the whole holiday idea further, overdubbing two shakes of jingle bells behind the words "Christmas in July" each time the phrase

appears.

"That could get corny, but I made sure in the mix that it's almost like you don't know if you just heard what you heard," says Schmidt. " 'Did I just hear jingle bells with "Christmas"? Yes, you did, but not too overtly."

Once the label heard Tenpenny's version, Columbia suggested a collaboration with Seaforth, and Schmidt made Tenpenny the primary voice, with Thompson on verse two and Jordan singing the bridge.

When the Anything She Says Tour started in Nashville, Seaforth emerged during Tenpenny's set to perform the song live for the first time, with a blowup doll — affectionately named Judy — in hand. The crowd was already familiar with the song through streaming, and fans sang the words with a ferocity Seaforth had not previously experienced before with a new song. Before the show ended, they signed the blow-up doll and gave her away, though they would repeat that ritual every successive night on the tour.

"I think there's a case of Judys," Thompson says with a laugh.

"Anything She Says" has already piled up 13 million streams, hit No. 1 in the countdown on SiriusXM's The Highway and garnered exposure at such key stations as **WUSN** Chicago, **WIL** St. Louis and **WDAF** Kansas City, Mo.

"It's so refreshing with people singing that song back again," says Tenpenny. "I didn't think it was going to be a song for me, and it's a big song for us now, especially in our live set. It has been incredible."

It's the Christmas gift that keeps on giving.

RANKINGS

Country Airplay is ranked by total audience impressions for the week ending Sunday based on monitored airplay of 149 stations by Nielsen BDS. Audience totals on the chart are derived, in part, using certain Arbitron Inc. copyrighted Persons 12+ audience estimates (under license © 2019, Arbitron Inc.) Country Indicator is tabulated using reported playlists and Nielsen BDS-monitored airplay at 109 stations, ranked by total plays.

BULLETS

• Awarded on Country Airplay to titles gaining audience or remaining flat from the previous week. A song will also receive a bullet if its percentage loss in audience does not exceed the percentage of monitored station downtime for the format. Titles that decline in audience but increase in detections will also receive a bullet if the total audience erosion for the week does not exceed 3%. Bullets are awarded on Country Indicator to titles gaining plays or remaining flat from the previous week.

TIES

On Country Airplay, if two songs are tied in total audience, the song with the larger increase in audience is placed first. On Country Indicator, if two songs are tied in total plays, the song with the larger increase in plays is placed first.

RECURRENTS

On Country Airplay, descending titles below No. 10 in either audience or detections are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks, provided that they are not still gaining enough audience points to bullet or if they rank below No. 10 and post a third consecutive week of (non-bulleted) audience decline, regardless of total chart weeks. On Country Indicator, descending, non-bulleted titles below No. 10 are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks or if they post a third consecutive week of decline in plays after 10 weeks.

HOT SHOT DEBUT

Awarded to the highest-ranking new entry on Country Airplay and Country Indicator, respectively.

MOST ADDED

The total number of new adds officially reported to Billboard by each reporting station, or by an automatic-add threshold (seven plays for the first time in a chart tracking week, according to Nielsen BDS) for stations that do not report adds.

MOST INCREASED AUDIENCE/ PLAYS

Most Increased Audience on Country Airplay and Most Increased Plays on Country Indicator list the songs with the greatest week-to-week increases in total audience or plays, respectively.

AIRPOWER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles ranking inside top 20 in plays and audience rankings for the first time, with increases in both plays and audience.

BREAKER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles achieving airplay (at least one detection) at 60% of reporting stations for the first time.
