A paper read to the Keswick Literary & Scientific Society on March 29th, 1880 (it must have been a long but interesting evening) containing an account of Woodford's immediate antecedents & life. He was commissioned in the Grenadier Guards in 1800 & saw active service at the Siege of Copenhagen in 1807, then in the Peninsula 1808-14 (DAQMG & ADC to Moore at Corunna, when he had his horse shot under him, & AQMG under Wellington at battles of Nive, Nivelles &c., afterward in the Waterloo campaign). Includes some extracts from his letters written during these campaigns & concludes with an autobiographical memorandum by his elder brother, Gen. Sir Alexander Woodford, & various other documents. Commissioned 1800, 52nd Light Infantry; served Corunna campaign as ADC to Sir John Moore in the Light Div. & subsequently in the Peninsula with the 52nd L.I. until appointed to command the undisciplined 71st L.I. after the Battle of Toulouse. Definitive contemp. Biography. (Burgoyne (1782-1871) was commissioned in the Royal Engineers in 1798, served in the Peninsular War (Badajoz, Salamanca, Vitoria &c.) & the war of 1812 in America (New Orleans &c.). As Inspector-Gen. of Fortifications, he was sent to Turkey in 1853 to examine the coming seat of war. He remained with Raglan's HQ as an adviser (& de facto 2 i/c) until in Nov. 1854 he was made scapegoat for the failure to conquer Sebastopol before the onset of winter & returned home. Dalhousie was Governor-General of India from 1848: supervised ops. in the 2nd Sikh War & annexed the Punjab in 1849 then Pegu in 1852. Informative depiction of life in camp & on the march with the army of Scindia, first published in 1813. The editor opined that Capt. (later Colonel) Broughton's "literary power was small, & he constantly forgot the maxim which he probably learnt at Eton, 'the half is more than the whole,'" but by that very fault he left a very full account & "The existing generation in India, safe under the aegis of British power, is apt to forget how hideous was the state of things which prevailed before we struck up the swords of all combatants & commanded peace. Those to wish to know from what they have been saved, can hardly do better than run through Colonel Broughton's pages." A collation of the distinguished North-West Frontier commander's (founder of Brownlow's Punjabis in 1857) papers, letters & thoughts: all but six of the 40 chapters relate to NWF warfare & Afghanistan, notably the author's recollections of Umbeylah, 1863 (8pp.), extracts from Despatches from that campaign (18pp.) & material on many others inc. the NWF in 1895, 1897 & 1908, the Afghan War 1878, &c. Also opinions on military training, Indian policy & military affairs, &c. Some had been published in various journals & The Times newspaper, but some new material, including unpublished letters to The *Times*, is included. Rare memoirs. including First Afghan War when he headed the party that blew up the Kabul Gate at Ghaznee; then in 2nd Sikh War 1848-49 (Chillianwala, Gujerat &c.), Burmese War 1852 & various 'Minutes' on matters from the organisation of irregular forces in the Indian

Army to the mounting of the campaign in Abyssinia 1868. He was killed in an accident in 1871 when, in an elephant howdah the beast passed under a low gateway & he was crushed to the ground. Buckland (Dictionary of Indian Biography) wrote: "No officer in India at the time had a greater reputation for experience, high principles, force of character; he held strong views & expressed them strongly." Classic work on this turbulent era in Anglo-Indian frontier history: Edwardes, then 30 years old, commanded a large irregular force in a successful campaign against Mulraj & his rebels, defeating them in the field & holding on until the arrival of Gen. Whish who completed the operations with the capture of Multan. Later red cloth, retaining sp. panels & decorative portions of front boards, fldg. map from end-pocket of Vol. I retained by a band at end of Vol. I in this rebound copy, which is generally sound but for heavy staining to the first 10 or so leaves of Vol. II. It appears to have been privately produced In The Field in a limited edition of 115 copies. The fine printing quality & heavy paper stock are suggestive of the involvement of a British military press: this possibility being backed up by Woog's connections including Lt.-Gen. Sir John Asser, GOC, L-of-C, & the first subject of the collection. The first twenty-three plates are of British officers of the Depot; the remaining seven are of attached French officers (including the final plate, a self portrait). Each plate except one (No. 18, Maj. Sir F.E.W. Hervey-Bathurst, the MLO) is accompanied by a decorative scroll/rhyme leaf, the amusing & evidently apposite rhymes by Lt.
