FIFA Data Protection Summit

Dear Sir or Madam,

As you may well be aware, the new EU data protection framework, the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), was introduced over a year ago and applies to organisations in all EU member states and to entities outside the EU alike if they fall under the extraterritorial scope of the GDPR. Also, many other countries have implemented similar or even stricter laws with regard to data protection.

Since the GDPR has implications for FIFA but also for its stakeholders and the confederations, FIFA is launching an initiative to share its experiences and challenges with regard to the implementation of the GDPR with representatives of member associations, leagues, clubs and players' unions. Furthermore, FIFA is also interested in learning how you and other football stakeholders took on the challenge and what you did in order to comply with this new set of rules.

The FIFA Data Protection Summit shall give football stakeholders the opportunity not only to share their experiences and learn from each other, but also to set the foundation for future collaboration.
