

FIFA Commercial Public Viewing Licence Fee

The fee applicable to a Commercial Public Viewing Licence, when issued by FIFA, is calculated in accordance with the spectator capacity of the location(s) where the event(s) is staged <u>and for the duration of the whole event</u>.

Should an Exhibitor apply for multi-location event or for more than one event the fee will be calculated as the sum of the different fees applying to each of the selected locations and according to their respective spectator capacities.

FIFA will donate all fees collected from Commercial Public Viewing Licences to a charity of its choice, further details of which will be made available in due course. FIFA will not waive the payment of such a licence fee for commercial public viewing events run for charity purposes.

The fee set out below is a minimum figure only as all Fees shall be paid to charity by FIFA. Optional additional fees may be given.

Non-Commercial Public Viewing Event (as defined in the FIFA Regulations for Public Exhibition): No Fee payment is required.

The Fee shall be due and payable immediately upon receipt of a request for payment from FIFA which details the account to which payment of the Fee shall be made by the Exhibitor and/or which contains details for payment of the Fee by way of credit card.

All payment details will be made available to the Exhibitor via email by FIFA once an online licence request has been submitted and FIFA has assessed the accuracy of such a request.
