
SENATOR PARSONS DEAD.

Both Houses at Albany Will Adjourn
as a Mark of Respect.

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Jan. 30.—Senator Cornelius R. Parsons died at 1:30 o'clock this afternoon at his residence, after a long illness, from a complication of diseases, aged fifty-eight. The Senator had suffered for years from acute stomach trouble, which increased in violence until the end. He was born in the town of York, Livingston County, May 22, 1842, and in 1867, when but twenty-five years old, was elected a member of the Common Council of this city, and had almost continuously since that time occupied public office in a constantly widening sphere of usefulness.
