

Brig. Gen. F. A. Smith Dies.

Brig. Gen. Frederick Appleton Smith, U. S. A., retired, died early last evening of heart disease at his home, 300 West 106th Street.

General Smith was 72 years old and was graduated from West Point in 1873. He served in the Nez Perce Indian War in 1877, in the Bannock Campaign in 1878, and in the Spanish-American War, and later in the Philippines. In 1908 he was made a brigadier general and retired May 15, 1913.

Rudolf Bauerkeller.

Rudolf Bauerkeller, who died Friday at the Flower Hospital after an operation, had been concert master of the New York Symphony Orchestra and a first violinist of the National Symphony. He lived at 22 East Sixtieth Street. Born in 1879 at Manchester, England, he studied music in Germany and played in various cities of England and the Continent. He came here about fifteen years ago and for a time gave violin lessons at Saratoga, becoming an American citizen while living there. He founded the Ensemble Society in this city for the promotion of chamber music.

Emile Baumgarten.

Emile Baumgarten, head of the interior decorating firm at 715 Fifth Avenue, founded by his brother, William, in 1891, died yesterday morning at his home, 157 West Fifty-seventh Street, after a brief illness. Born in this city in 1865, he was graduated from Yale in 1886, and then studied at the Beaux Arts in Paris.

GEORGE EUGENE DEWEY, for more than fifty years a wine merchant in this city and President of the firm of H. T. Dewey & Sons Company, died on Friday at his home, 651 Putnam Avenue, Brooklyn, in his seventy-ninth year. He was born in Fort Wayne, Ind., and served in the Civil War.

COLONEL EDWARD LIVINGSTON PRICE, 76 years old, former City Counsel of Newark, died yesterday morning at his home, 112 Bruen Street, Newark, of heart disease, following a year's illness. He had practiced law in Newark since 1866 and was a former Chairman of the Essex County and State Democratic Committees.

Lieutenant JOHN RYAN of the Police Department, on which he served forty-one years, before retiring in 1916, died yesterday at the Neurological Hospital, aged 65. He lived at 237 East Sixtieth Street.
