

Norwegian Flag Law Stands.

STOCKHOLM, Oct. 13.—The Posttninggen publishes a protocol of the proceedings at a recent Council of State, during which King Oscar declared that he regretted the resolution of the Norwegian Storthing in introducing a purely Norwegian flag, in view of the fact that the emblem of union in the flag implied equal rights for both Sweden and Norway. As, however, the resolution had been passed thrice, his Majesty said he could not refuse to sanction the promulgation of the new flag law, in accordance with the Constitution.
