

Rice Trophy for Brooklyn Chess Club.

TRENTON FALLS, N. Y., July 24.—C. S. Howell of the Brooklyn Chess Club carried off the premier honors at the annual tournament of the New York State Chess Association, which closed here to-day. Howell's victory gives his club permanent possession of the Isaac L. Rice Trophy, donated to the association by Mr. Rice in 1902, the Brooklyn club now having won the trophy three times. Howell won the trophy tourney in the year the cup was first competed for, and two years later F. J. Marshall of the Brooklyn club captured it. This year Howell follows up his first success by emerging from the tourney half a point ahead of Leon Rosen, the Rice Chess Club representative. S. T. Sharp, who played for the Mercantile Library Chess Association of Philadelphia, was placed third, and Eugene Delmar, representing the Empire State, remained in last place.
