

# **Chick Lang, Premier Jockey Of 1921, to Ride for Cosden**

J. S. Cosden, the wealthy oil man and turfman, yesterday purchased from James Arthur the latter's contract for the services of Chick Lang, the jockey. The deal, which is said to have cost Mr. Cosden a sum approximating \$25,000, gives that sportsman a strong pair for work in the saddle, as Clarence Kummer was already riding for him. Lang was a premier jockey of the American turf last year. He accepted 762 mounts, won with 192 of them, placed 177 more and ran third 129 times. His winning percentage was .19. In New Orleans during the Winter and this Spring in Maryland the boy's work was sensational, and Mr. Arthur had refused several high offers for the young Canadian.
