ANNUAL BANK ELECTIONS.

Complying with the provisions of the National Banking law, the stockholders of all National banks held their annual meetings yesterday and elected Directors for the ensuing year. Elections were also held in many State banks. There were very few changes in the Boards of Directors in this city, and none of much importance, although one was not without significance. William P. St. John, who resigned from the Presidency of the Mercantile National bank during the last campaign, retired from the directorate of that bank and of the Second National bank. Eben B. Thomas, President of the Erie Railroad Company, was elected to succeed him at the Mercantile bank, and Henry T. Carey filled the place made vacant by his retirement from the Second National. Another vacancy in the same directorate, caused by the death of A. B. Darling, was filled by the election of H. Blanchard Dominick.

Daniel S. Lamont, the Secretary of War, was elected a Director of the National Union Bank, in place of C. H. Payne. George G. Allen was elected to the directorate of the Third National Bank, in place of Gen. T. B. Woodward, who died last year. At the Seventh National Bank, John A. Sullivan replaced H. A. Rogers.
