ACCUSED MEN ARE SILENT

The six news print paper manufacturers and Alexander Smith, a Chicago banker associated with them, who were indicted on Thursday will appear before Judge Cushman of the Federal District Court on Tuesday and plead to the charge of violating the Sherman anti-trust law by combining to raise the price of news print paper.
