

SYRACUSE, N. Y., Nov. 19.—Theodore E. Hancock, Attorney General of New York State from 1894 to 1899 and for years leader in the Onondaga County Bar Association, died today after a long illness. He was born in Oswego in 1849, and was graduated from the Wesleyan University and the Columbia College Law School. He started his law practice in Onondaga and was twice elected District Attorney.

Carleton Sprague, Secretary of the Western Union Telegraph Company, died yesterday afternoon after a week's illness at his home, 130 East Sixty-seventh Street, in his fifty-ninth year. He was born in Buffalo and graduated from Harvard University in 1881. Mr. Sprague was a member of the Century and Harvard Clubs in this city and a founder of the Saturn Club of Buffalo. He leaves a wife and a brother, Henry W. Sprague, lawyer, in Buffalo, and two sisters, Mrs. Walter Cook and Mrs. E. M. Cook of New York.
