

Roe Highway and Kalamunda Road Interchange

Principal Shared Path (PSP) extension from Berkshire Road to Maida Vale Road

Construction of Principal Shared Path extension to begin in July 2019

In March 2019, the State Government committed \$2.75 million to complete the Principal Shared Path (PSP) network for pedestrians and cyclists along Roe Highway. The existing PSP on the eastern side of Roe Highway will be extended from its current end point at Berkshire Road to Maida Vale Road, where it will adjoin another new PSP, to be constructed as part of the Roe Highway and Kalamunda Road Interchange project.

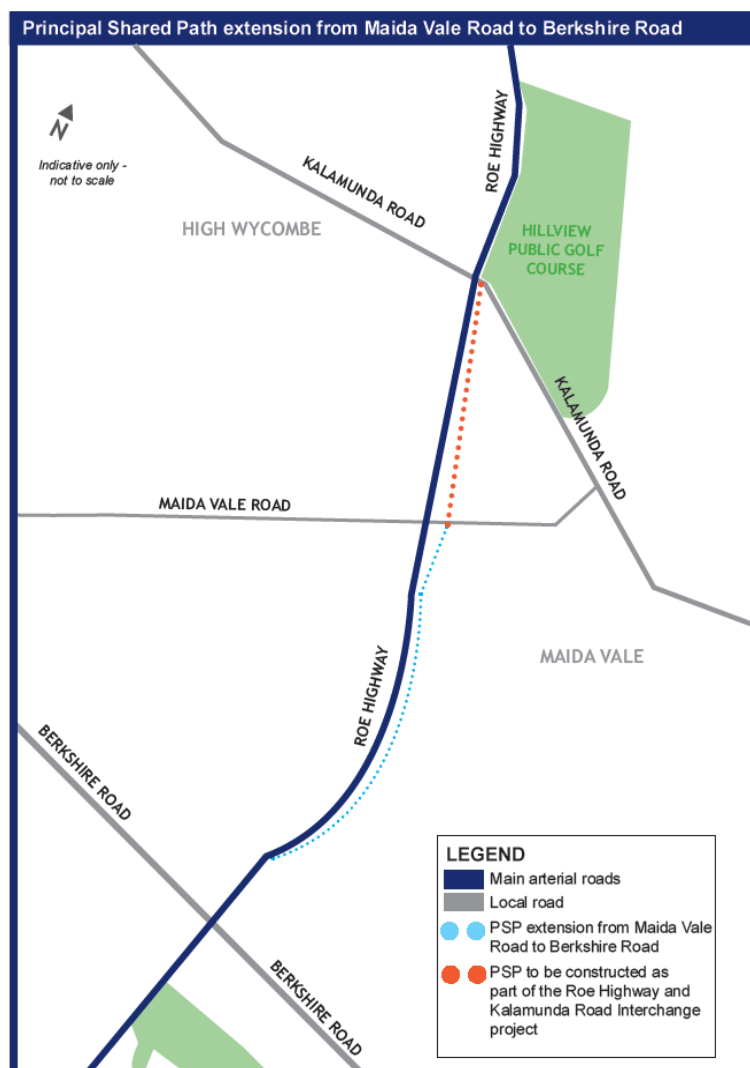
Just over three kilometres of additional PSP will be constructed by the two projects, improving connectivity between Forreestfield, Maida Vale and High Wycombe.

Surveying activity – June 2019

Our contractor for these works, Georgiou Group, is currently undertaking pre-construction surveying work along the length of the proposed alignment between Berkshire Road and Maida Vale Road. This activity is essential to finalising the design, in particular, aligning the path to retain as much established vegetation as possible. These works are non-intrusive, however, local residents may notice contractor personnel on foot, as well as light vehicles, in the area.

Construction

Construction of the PSP will quickly follow, with works expected to take approximately six months to complete. During this time, activities will comprise vegetation clearing, earthworks, pavement construction, lighting installation and asphalt surfacing. Advanced communication and notice of works will be shared with the community and local residents on an ongoing basis.



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Impacts on noise levels

Upon completion, it is unlikely that the new PSP will change noise levels for local residents between Berkshire Road and Maida Vale Road. This is because there are no modifications to Roe Highway included as part of the works in this location. In addition, a smooth asphalt surface will minimise any noise generated by bicycle tyres. As no significant

change to noise levels is expected, additional noise walls will not be constructed in this location.
