# **Country Achieves A Balancing Act With Nominee List For Upcoming Grammys**



Everything in moderation.

That ancient advice usually focuses on restraint, but it also suggests a balancing act. It's an ideal that undergirds country

music's presence on the 62nd annual Grammy Awards ballot. Finalists will be recognized Jan. 26, with the show airing on CBS.

Country veterans Tanya
Tucker and Reba McEntire are
balanced among the finalists by
newcomers Ashley McBryde and
Tyler Childers. Glossy duo Dan +
Shay counters rough-edged rebel
Eric Church. Reliable hitmaker
Blake Shelton shares ballot
space with critical darlings
Pistol Annies.

Nashville is represented by a mix of ages, flavors and styles among its nominees. And, at a time when country radio and streaming playlists are under fire for under-representing women in their programming, there's a healthy gender balance among Grammy finalists. That remains true despite a new lawsuit filed by ousted Recording Academy president/CEO Deborah Dugan

that charges representatives of the organization with <u>sexual</u> <u>harassment and discrimination</u>.

Despite that executive controversy, the academy's

ballot represents country in a manner similar to a good 401(k) portfolio: Voters invested in a range of music, maintaining the kind of balance that individual artists often seek in their own repertoire.

"I think your songs need to be as different as your artists are," says songwriter **Bobby Pinson**, who co-wrote Church's best country song nominee "Some of It." "And I think your artists are different at times than they are on a different day."

The Grammys are often populated by songs of weight and importance, more so than the media that often exposes the music. Tucker's "Bring My Flowers Now," with its stark acceptance of mortality, brings power and clarity to the song of the year category. Little Big Town's "The Daughters," with a thoughtful eye toward gender parity, is a fiercely significant

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cultural statement up for best country duo/group performance. And the **Maren Morris** and **Brandi Carlile** collaboration "Common," with its gentle recognition of political polarization, calls listeners to meet in the middle when it's most important.

Most of Nashville's creative community hopes to balance both meaning and money. And it's that idealist belief that music can change the world that often informs the Academy's nominations process.

"It really comes down to just making great music, music that is important, music that says something, music that touches people," says chapter board president **Jennifer Hanson**, a singer-songwriter in her own right ("Beautiful Goodbye," "Country Strong"). "A lot of the songs and albums recognized this year do that."

Though it's easy to get caught up in the gravitas of the typical Grammy nomination, the Academy's ballot is never all social commentary and big life statements. **Miranda Lambert**'s breezy "It All Comes Out in the Wash" is a finalist for best country song in 2020, throwing a little levity against those more overtly deep topics. **Billy Ray Cyrus**' collaboration with **Lil Nas X**, "Old Town Road," may not be changing the world, but it's still catchy enough to merit a record of the year nomination.

"When's the last time you mentioned Billy Ray Cyrus and Grammys in the same sentence?" asks Cyrus rhetorically. "It was 25 years ago. So for me, this is the greatest time of my life. I never dreamed that I'd get to ride this ride again and see the power of a song very similar in its own way to 'Achy Breaky Heart.'"

"Achy Breaky" was, of course, an intentionally goofy piece. **Don Von Tress** purposely wrote it with a bare-bones riff and a singsong melody, and it became a controversial part of country music's history, a multiplatinum success story that many in the business despised. It was extraordinarily simple, not all that different in that respect from the uncomplicated "three chords and the truth" that formed country's foundation or from the high-energy beats that signaled a musical revolution in the '1950s and '60s.

"Everybody in the business right now owes **Chuck Berry** and **Carl Perkins** and **Elvis** and **The Beatles**, all these guys that was on the crown age of rock'n'roll," says Cyrus.

In fact, most artists who've achieved some sort of longevity have done so with a mix of good-time simplicity and meaningful music. **Brooks & Dunn** and **Luke Combs**, who share a nomination for best country duo/group performance with a new version of "Brand New Man," have both built their identities on that all-important balance. Combs' ballad "Beautiful Crazy" offsets the thump in "Beer Never Broke My Heart." Brooks & Dunn's tearinducing "Believe" inspires the soul while the grinding "Rock My World (Little Country Girl)" motivates the feet.

On occasion, an act such as Pistol Annies even finds ways to pair light-sounding audio with provocative lyrics. Lambert and her bandmates, **Ashley Monroe** and **Angaleena Presley**, are up for best country album with *Interstate Gospel*, continuing their tradition of biting, white-trash satire.

"It's just making light of the truth a little bit," says Lambert, while the band cites **John Prine** and **Roger Miller** as inspirations. "We write a lot about real hard things, but it's OK to have humor in that. It's the only way to survive some of it."

That balance of surface amusement and deep observation might be the best way to look at the breadth of the titles and the creative talents that country — and Nashville at large — supplied to this year's Grammy list. The hypnotic sweetness in **Thomas Rhett**'s "Look What God Gave Her" — the first single from his best country album nominee *Center Point Road* — provides a light optimism in a period where it's easy to feel heavy. By contrast, **For King & Country**'s collaboration with **Dolly Parton**, "God Only Knows," explores the dark secrets and broken spirit that punctuate nearly everyone's journey. In the running for best contemporary Christian music performance/song, it's an inward-facing title that encourages the listener — sonically and in the accompanying video —to find balance with the outer world.

"Putting out the videos has allowed me to find a lot more grace for myself and for other people," says songwriter **Josh Kerr** ("Dibs," "My Girl"), who co-wrote it. "It is hard to think someone might be going through something that I'm not [aware of], because it's easy to make life all about me, me, me, you know. And that's kind of a step out and a challenge to be better and be more aware."

It's part of the balancing act that great music, Grammy-worthy music, encourages.  $\bullet$

## Dan + Shay & Justin Bieber's '10,000 Hours' Clocks In At No. 1 On Country Airplay, Leads All Four Song Charts



**Dan + Shay** and **Justin Bieber**'s "10,000 Hours" (Warner Music Nashville/WAR) ascends 2-1 in its 16th week on *Billboard*'s Country Airplay chart (dated Jan. 25), reigning with a 3% increase to 36.5 million audience impressions in the week ending Jan. 19, according to Nielsen Music/MRC Data.

Dan + Shay, the duo of **Dan Smyers** and **Shay Mooney**, adds their seventh

Country Airplay No. 1, while pop superstar Bieber banks his first.

The song was written by Dan + Shay, Bieber, Jason "Poo Bear" Boyd, Jessie Jo Dillon and Jordan Reynolds, and produced by Smyers. (Dan + Shay are co-managed by Jason Owen and Bieber's manager, Scooter Braun.)

Dan + Shay first led Country Airplay with "Nothin' Like You" for a week in December 2015, followed by "From the Ground Up" (one, September 2016), "How Not To" (one, July 2017), "Tequila" (two weeks, July 2018), "Speechless" (four, December 2018-January 2019) and "All to Myself" (one, August 2019). "Hours" marks the pair's fourth consecutive No. 1. The act first charted on Country Airplay with debut single "19 You + Me," which reached No. 11 in April 2014.

As "Hours" leads Country Airplay, it tops the airplay-, streaming- and sales-based Hot Country Songs chart for a 15th week; Country Streaming Songs for a 10th frame, drawing 15.2 million U.S. streams in the week ending Jan. 16; and Country Digital Song

Sales for a sixth week, with 9,000 downloads sold in the same span. Thus, the track dominates all four of *Billboard*'s country song charts at the same time.

"When I got the news that '10,000 Hours' is No. 1 on all four charts simultaneously, my mind was truly blown," says Smyers. "We know that it takes the support of a lot of people to make the stars align like this, and we're incredibly grateful for every bit of it."

The quadruple command is a first for a duo. **Florida Georgia Line** previously came closest to the feat among twosomes, having led all but Country Digital Song Sales with "Meant to Be" (with **Bebe Rexha**) on April 28, 2018, and "H.O.L.Y."

on Aug. 6, 2016; in both cases, the songs ranked at No. 2 on the sales survey while leading the other three tallies.

"Hours" is the sixth song to top all four song charts concurrently, following **Luke Combs**' "Beautiful Crazy" (for four weeks in 2019), **Sam Hunt**'s "Body Like a Back Road" (three, 2017), **Keith Urban**'s "Blue Ain't Your Color" (one,

2017), **Jason Aldean**'s "Burnin' It Down" (two, 2014) and **Luke Bryan**'s "Play It Again" (two, 2014).

Combs, meanwhile, is the only artist to lead those four charts at the same time with one song while also ruling Top Country Albums; during the four-week domination of "Beautiful Crazy," parent LP *This One's for You* led the album survey for three frames. (For a week in 2017, **Kane Brown** paced all five charts, although thanks to two songs — "What Ifs," featuring **Lauren Alaina**, and "Heaven" — and his self-titled LP.)

"Hours," which has been promoted to country and pop radio, concurrently returns to its No. 5 high on the Adult Top 40 airplay chart and becomes Dan + Shay's second top 10 on Adult Contemporary (after "Speechless") and first on Mainstream Top 40, lifting 11-10 on each ranking.

NEW TOP 10s Gabby Barrett's maiden Hot Country Songs entry, "I Hope" (WMN/WAR), becomes her first top 10, climbing 12-10. It jumps 7-2 on Country Digital Song Sales, up 24% to 6,000 sold, and 24-22

on Country Airplay, gaining by 14% to 9.7 million impressions. It also sports 7.7 million U.S. streams.

The 19-year-old, who finished third on ABC's *American Idol* in 2018, scores the first debut Hot Country Songs entry by a woman unaccompanied by any other act to hit the top 10 since October 2017, when **Carly Pearce**'s launch single, "Every Little Thing," reached the region, eventually peaking at No. 5 (and topping Country Airplay).

Plus, **Kane Brown** adds his fifth Country Airplay top 10 as "Homesick" (Zone 4/RCA Nashville) pushes 11-9, up 5% to 23.9 million in audience. ●

#### **RANKINGS**

Country Airplay is ranked by total audience impressions for the week ending Sunday based on monitored airplay of 148 stations by Nielsen Music. Audience totals on the chart are derived, in part, using certain Nielsen Audiocopyrighted Persons 12+ audience estimates (under license © 2020, Nielsen Audio). The list of all Country Airplay chart reporters can be viewed on Nielsen Music's platforms.

#### **BULLETS**

 Awarded on Country Airplay to titles gaining audience or remaining flat from the previous week. A song will also receive a bullet if its percentage loss in audience does not exceed the percentage of monitored station downtime for the format. Titles that decline in audience but increase in detections will also receive a bullet if the total audience erosion for the week does not exceed 3%.

#### TIFS

On Country Airplay, if two songs are tied in total audience, the song with the larger increase in audience is placed first.

#### **RECURRENTS**

On Country Airplay, descending titles below No. 10 in either audience or detections are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks, provided that they

are not still gaining enough audience points to bullet or if they rank below No. 10 and post a third consecutive week of (non-bulleted) audience decline, regardless of total chart weeks.

#### **HOT SHOT DEBUT**

Awarded to the highest-ranking new entry on Country Airplay.

#### **MOST ADDED**

The total number of new adds officially reported to Billboard by each reporting station, or by an automatic-add threshold (seven plays for the first time in a chart tracking week, according to Nielsen Music) for stations that do not report adds.

#### MOST INCREASED AUDIENCE

Most Increased Audience on Country Airplay lists the songs with the greatest week-to-week increases in total audience.

#### **AIRPOWER**

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles ranking inside top 20 in plays and audience rankings for the first time, with increases in both plays and audience.

#### **BREAKER**

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles achieving airplay (at least one detection) at 60% of reporting stations for the first time

#### COUNTRY RADIO CHIPPED, ZINGED

Country radio took it on the chin over the last week, inside the office and outside in the court of public opinion.

First, iHeartMedia dismissed dozens of programmers, personalities and production staffers on Jan. 14 across multiple genres and markets, a sweeping blow that one source characterized as a "bloodbath" in the original *Billboard* story.

A day later, TBS' Full Frontal With Samantha Bee put the genre's underrepresentation of females in the spotlight, calling out broadcasters for their role in "sexism and country music." During an interview with CMT senior vp music strategy and talent Leslie Fram, correspondent Amy Hoggart twisted the knife: "Why is radio still a big deal in country? Like, do you guys still use rotary phones?"

Both moments signal a shrinking importance for radio as a medium. Hoggart's dig underscored increasing public perception that commercial terrestrial radio — which celebrates its 100th anniversary this year — is a dinosaur platform. People do still use it, of course, but the growth of digital media has chipped away at radio's importance, as it has for traditional print media.

Likewise, the iHeart firings emphasize a similar recalibration in the nation's largest radio chain. The company made those cuts in context of a self-identified "technology transformation." The firm is investing more heavily in digital technologies, data, artificial intelligence and podcasts, and continuing an already established trend: replacing even more local terrestrial talent with national shows.

With Country Radio Seminar looming Feb. 19-21 in Nashville, broadcasters find themselves with much to discuss: How does a 20th-century technology compete successfully two decades into the 21st century? And how do 20th-century attitudes about women's place in the format impact the appearance that the medium is engaged in backward thinking as consumers move forward?

"Ask yourself this question, which is 'What do you want your daughter to know about herself?' "Brandi Carlile said in the Full Frontal piece. "If you can't get that from country music, if you can't get that from country radio, it's a problem."

Surprise! The Grand Ole Opry planned a welcome party for **Gene Watson**, whose Jan. 17 appearance on the **WSM-AM** Nashville show brought an invitation from **Vince Gill** to become the newest member of the club. Watson already had delivered his former hits "Sometimes I Get Lucky and Forget" and "Nothing Sure Looked Good on You" before Gill asked him to join the Opry. Watson closed his set with his signature "Farewell Party." An official induction date has not yet been announced.



**Luke Combs** will add another major accomplishment to his list of career achievements when he performs Feb. 1 on NBC's venerable *Saturday Night Live*. Other country acts who've appeared in the last two years include **Chris Stapleton**, **Kacey Musgraves** and **Thomas Rhett**. Also taking key TV roles in the coming weeks are **Reba McEntire**, who guests on a February edition of the CBS sitcom *Young Sheldon*, and **Chase Rice**, who will provide music—and, perhaps, some drama—during the Jan. 27 telecast of ABC's *The Bachelor*.

Luke Bryan steadily has branded his identity with such singles as "Country Man," "What Makes You Country" and "Huntin', Fishin' and Lovin' Every Day." Looks like he's continuing that trend with his next album, Born Here, Live Here, Die Here, set for release on April 24. Adding to the effect, he has labeled his next concert run the Proud to Be Right Here Tour, launching May 28 in Cincinnati. Other new projects of note include Phil Vassar's Stripped Down (released Jan. 17), The SteelDrivers' Bad for You (due Feb. 7), Tenille Townes' Road to the Lemonade Stand EP (Feb. 7), Kim Richey's A Long Way Back: The Songs of Glimmer (March 27), Ashley McBryde's Never Will (April 3) and John Anderson's Years (April 10).

Merle Haggard and Willie Nelson's "Pancho and Lefty," a classic Townes Van Zandt story song, is a new addition to the Grammy Hall of Fame, bringing Nelson's total number of entries to six and Haggard's to three. Patsy Cline's "Walkin' After Midnight" likewise becomes her third Grammy Hall induction. Three other country singles are also part of the 2020 class: The Stanley Brothers' "I'm a Man of Constant Sorrow," The Chuck Wagon Gang's "I'll Fly Away" and Blind Alfred Reed's "How Can a Poor Man Stand Such Times and Live." 

## Hello, Darlin': Midland Brings Back 'Cheatin' Songs' For A New Generation

As Jan. 1 rode in, **Midland** started the new year in an unusual location: singing for nearly 86,000 hockey fans at the Cotton Bowl during the pregame ceremony for the NHL Winter Classic in Dallas.

"It was cold as hell outside," lead singer **Mark Wystrach** says. "But a hell of a way to start 2020."

The temperature was perhaps appropriate, given that the band performed its new single, "Cheatin' Songs." It's a topic rife with chill-inducing aspects:

deceit, betrayal, rejection and jealousy. But it's also familiar—many, if not most people, know how it feels to get cheated on.

"I almost think that everybody does at some point," says guitarist **Jess Carson**.

The prevalence of cheating and the emotions it stirs up has made it a core country topic through the decades. "Slipping Around," a No. 1 1949 duet by Margaret Whiting and Jimmy Wakely, is widely regarded as country's first successful song of infidelity, and it has been followed through the years by such notable titles as Hank Williams' "Your Cheatin' Heart," Carrie Underwood's "Before He Cheats" and Shania Twain's "Whose Bed Have Your Boots Been Under?"

The '70s and early '80s were particularly prosperous for the genre — exemplified by **Moe Bandy**'s "It's a Cheating Situation," **The** 

Amazing Rhythm Aces' "Third Rate Romance" and Johnny Duncan's "Thinkin' of a Rendezvous"—though Randy Travis' "On the Other Hand," in which the singer uses his wedding ring to symbolically thwart temptation, tilted the genre's pendulum toward faithfulness.

The hook in Midland's single — "She's bringin' back cheatin' songs" — manages to recognize both a personal affair and the sweep of country's history while sounding like it fits 2020.

"What makes that song so interesting is the DNA of it, but also what makes it so dynamic is that it's a brand-new kind of cheating song," suggests Wystrach. "It exists in a modern time. It's kind of a reflection of what's happening today."

The original idea was not Midland's, but it clearly suited the band. Songwriter-producers **Shane McAnally** ("Nobody But You," "Mama's Broken Heart") and **Josh Osborne** ("One Man Band," "Body Like a Back Road") developed the hook circa 2017 and held it until their next writing session with Midland, which was already well down the road toward completing its first album.

"I do remember working on the idea a little one day at the office 'cause it was just the two of us," says Osborne. "We sort of sketched out the framework of the chorus and decided that when we started writing with them again we would pitch that idea to them."

But they gave two group members a preview even as they continued recording for the *On the Rocks* album.

"Jess and I took a carride with Shane and Josh to get some tacos or something down the street from Blackbird [Studios], and Josh sang us that line," recalls bassist **Cam Duddy**. "We were all really excited just to find time to sit down and figure it out."

That moment came roughly two years ago, when McAnally and Osborne flew out to central Texas to write with the band at Duddy's home. They made it a point to spin the theme in an uncommon direction.

"We kind of wanted to do a cheating song where the woman's got all the power," explains Wystrach.

Not that that's unprecedented. **Barbara Mandrell**'s 1973 single "The Midnight Oil" is considered the first song to flip the gender stereotype,

creating unintended synergy in the "Cheatin' Songs" chorus, which longs for a fool-around storyline "circa 1973." Bandy's "She's Not Really Cheatin' (She's Just Gettin' Even)" and **Vern Gosdin**'s "If You're Gonna Do Me Wrong (Do It Right)" similarly found a female stepping out on her mate.

The five writers gave "Cheatin' Songs" an early-'80s country-soul feel, referencing "Tight Fittin' Jeans" in the chorus — "The king of country-funk, to me, was **Conway Twitty**," notes Wystrach — and they incorporated images

from classic cheating plots, such as smokefilled clothing, removing a wedding ring and one familiar alliteration: "She's lyin' with him, and she's lyin' to me."

When they built the bridge, they widened the focus to look at the trend line of adulterous country music. And yet, "Cheatin' Songs" still walks a fine line between its salute to an old-school topic and its embrace of a personal issue.

"I don't like songs about songs," proclaims Duddy. "I kind of find them annoying. This one just seemed to dodge the tropes of that and still [be] its own song first. It's a song about a woman as opposed to a song about a song."

When they brought "Cheatin' Songs" into the studio with co-producer Dann Huff (Kane Brown, Riley Green), Midland collectively widened the early-'80s influence a bit, with Duddy and session drummer Greg Morrow

anchoring a Ronnie Milsap/blue-eyed soul feel.

"When we found that pocket, that groove, that interplay, with the funk that Cameron was doing on bass with the drums, that's when everybody kind of was locked in, and we built it really from there," recalls Wystrach.

With Carson and Duddy both playing on the cut, they framed the instrumentation around Wystrach's lead part during the tracking session and left the harmonies for later.

"You don't really have takes to waste," says Carson. "You might do four full-band takes of that song and that's it, so for me, I'm focusing a lot on my performance. I'm always paranoid of, like, you get home and you hear a mix of the song and you don't like your guitar part. What are you going to do? Fly back to Nashville and cut just your guitar part?"

They addressed those harmonies later, Duddy supplying the high voice and Carson staking out the middle tones that fill out the vocal texture. Wystrach immersed himself in the retro aspects of his part.

"I don't know how to say this without sounding kind of like a nerd, but I felt the spirits of Conway and the old-school kind of Nashville sound that was really important to me growing up," he says. "I was having almost like a fantasy while I was singing that song, being picked up by those kind of spirits."

Midland and crew thought "Cheatin' Songs" was the most radio-friendly track on the *Let It Roll* album, released by Big Machine on Aug. 23, 2019.

"It gets stuck in your head," says Wystrach.

Naturally, it garnered the most attention once the project hit the market, and it was issued to terrestrial radio via PlayMPE on Dec. 3, tagged with a Jan. 20 add date. While it may tip a Stetson to a previous era's country themes, the behaviors in "Cheatin' Songs" remain relevant in 2020. And, thanks to technology, so does the song's musical roots.

"We live in this kind of constant nostalgia, unlike the generations before us," says Duddy. "It's because of cameras built into our phones and because of access to catalogs on Spotify now and affinity for old clothing and stufflike that. Our generation is probably in a constant state of nostalgia, and that is what the music sounds like for us."

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## 29 Years Ago Mike Reid Took A 'Walk' To No. 1

In 1991, the former Cincinnati Bengals defensive tackle ruled Hot Country Songs On Jan. 23, 1991, Mike Reid's "Walk on Faith" climbed 2-1 on Hot Country Songs for its first of two weeks on top. Co-written with Allen Shamblin, the song became Reid's second of eight entries and his lone leader as an artist. It followed "Old Folks," a duet with Ronnie Milsap, which reached No. 2 in 1988.

Born in Aliquippa, Pa., Reid became a star athlete for the Penn State Nittany Lions and in 1970 was drafted in the first round by the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals. He played five seasons in the league before leaving to concentrate on music full time. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1987.

Before being signed to Columbia Records as an artist in 1990, Reid was already a successful songwriter. Among his No. 1s for other acts are Milsap's "Lostin the Fifties Tonight" (1985), Alabama's "Forever's As Far As I'll Go" (1991) and Tim McGraw's "Everywhere" (1997).

Now 72, Reid was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame in 2005. In 2012, he released the LP New Direction Home.
