

# HOLY CROSS TRIUMPHS OVER FORDHAM'S ELEVEN

## Visitors Win Second Football Game by Score of 15 to 6.

### BIG CROWD AT POLO GROUNDS

#### Gargan's Long Run the Spectacular Feature of Contest—Victors Outplay Fordham.

Holy Cross defeated Fordham on the Polo Grounds before a good-sized crowd of enthusiastic followers of the two Catholic elevens yesterday afternoon for the second time this season by a score of 15 to 6. The first game, played on election day, resulting in a victory for Holy Cross by a score of 8 to 5, left neither team satisfied with the issue, and yesterday's match was arranged for a more clear-cut decision. The Holy Cross team won out in the last five minutes of the game by scoring two touchdowns, from neither of which they were able to kick goals. They had made one score in the first half, but Fordham, by a touchdown and goal, led at the end of the half by a score of 6 to 5.

The game was marred by penalties, which were constantly inflicted for holding and other fouls. Holy Cross was the principal offender. During the second half Scanlon of the Worcester team was put off the field for abusive language directed against the umpire, but no penalty was inflicted for the offense. Penalties and fumbling undoubtedly checked the visitors in the first half.

At the very start of the game following an exchange of kicks, a fumble gave Fordham the ball in midfield, but she could not gain. Then after she had kicked the ball down to Holy Cross's eighteen-yard line, Siskind blocked her return kick, and Fordham had the ball twenty yards from a score. Only five yards could be gained, and Fordham tried a forward pass, but the ball was thrown beyond the goal line, and went to Holy Cross as a touchback.

On an exchange of kicks Holy Cross tried to rush out from its twenty-yard line, advancing steadily to midfield. There a penalty checked it, but an end run overcame it. A forward pass, followed by an end run, took the ball to the twenty-yard line, where a drop kick failed. On the kick out H. Gargan picked up a fumble by the Holy Cross back, and ran fifty-five yards for a touchdown.

The score awoke Holy Cross. Getting the ball in midfield a twenty-eight-yard run carried it to the twenty-five-yard line, where an instant later another run took it twelve yards nearer the goal. Siskind was hurt and retired, and Holy Cross began to plow straight through the line, four yards at a time, until they had the ball behind the posts for a touchdown. The half ended just after they missed a hard try at goal.

Following the kickoff Holy Cross got the ball on Fordham's forty-yard line on a fumble. A plunge through tackle advanced twenty yards, but holding followed and a forward pass failed, giving Fordham the ball on their twenty-eight-yard line. A poor kick gave Holy Cross another chance, and a forward pass brought the ball to the twenty-five-yard line. A try at goal from the field was blocked, however, and Fordham was saved again.

But as soon as Holy Cross regained the ball on the kick they came right back on delayed passes and quarter back runs only to lose the distance on penalties, until they were set back by a kick to their twenty-five-yard line. Time was getting short when Geary cleared the end for thirty-five yards. A centre plunge added ten more. Then Geary again cleared end for ten and followed it by another twelve-yard charge. Then on the twenty-yard line Fordham was penalized, and O'Donnell was sent over the line for a touchdown.

From Fordham's kickoff Geary and Scanlon between them brought it back to midfield on end plays. Then O'Donnell on a forward pass gained fifteen yards. Centre plunges advanced fifteen more, and another forward pass landed the ball on the ten-yard line, from where Smith carried it over before time expired. The players were sorely handicapped at the end of the game by the crowd which overran the field and refused to be quelled by the police. The line-up follows:
