Topic: Police-Reported Violent Crimes, 2017

Released by Statistics Canada December 5, 2018

Background: In 2017, the number of police-reported victims of violent crime in Nunavut was

2,786. As is the case with violent crime overall, the territories have consistently recorded the highest rates of police-reported violence against women. The rate of violent crime against women in Nunavut (**9,301** per 100,000 females) was

nearly 10 times higher than the rate for Canada.
